

STABILITY

Congregation-wide Goal:

10% of members spending 10 hours per month serving as reading tutors in school and community programs








LITERACY IN ARKANSAS

62% of Arkansas' children completing 3rd grade are BELOW proficient in reading.

In some Arkansas school districts that number is as high as 97% of students not reading proficiently in the 3rd grade.





THREE WAYS TO ENGAGE IN LITERACY MINISTRY

In some of the lowest income communities, there is **one book** for every 300 children. In middle-income communities, there are 13 books per child.








WAYS TO INCREASE ACCESS TO BOOKS



- Send books home with meals and food boxes.
- Set up a Little Free Library near where kids live.





IN-SCHOOL TUTORING


- Connect to the literacy specialist, reading coordinator, or counselor at your local school.
- Set goals, recruit volunteers, and get trained.
- Get to reading!





OUT-OF-SCHOOL LITERACY PROGRAMS

- Connect with your local library.
- Offer a week-long reading camp during summer.
- Have reading time at your community meal.
- Offer after-school tutoring where kids live and play.






