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

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

of the

One Hundred and Eleventh Annual Session of The Missouri Conference

Bishop Paul W. Milhouse, Bishop of the Southwestern Area, officially opened the 111th session of the Missouri Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church (former Evangelical United Brethren Church) at 7:30 p.m. Sunday, May 26, 1968, in the Crandall United Methodist Church in Trenton.

The Bishop led in prayer. Rev. Paul Walters, local church choir director, and the choir, led the congregation in singing, "O Worship the King". Mrs. Opal Blair was organist.

Rev. G. D. Hammontree, local pastor, read the 100th Psalm and led in prayer. He then welcomed the visitors to Trenton.

The offering was received.

The choir, with Edgar Ishmael, soloist, rendered a beautiful number, "He Loves Even Me".

Bishop Milhouse delivered the Episcopal Address after reading from the first chapter of Acts. Jesus gave help to his disciples in their time of transition, just before His ascension, and we can receive help from this. Jesus calls us to walk into the future, not to live in the past. "Ye shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you". Jesus wants us to seek the Holy Spirit. We must face the future with faith and belief that the power is in God, and not in us.

The service of Holy Communion was led by Bishop Milhouse, assisted by Dr. C. H. Crandall, Superintendent of Missouri Conference; Rev. James Crawford, Rev. Orland Moyer, Rev. Wilford Marrs and Rev. Lowell Newland.

The benediction was led by Bishop Milhouse, followed by the singing of "God Be With You" by the congregation.

MONDAY, MAY 27, 1968, 9:00 α.m.

Dr. C. H. Crandall called the conference to order.

Rev. John B. Morgan led the congregation in singing "Love Divine". Mrs. Dorsey Levell served as organist.

Dr. Crandall read from the 6th chapter of Ephesians.

Mrs. Sensintaffar called the roll of the delegates. The alternate delegates were duly seated. There were 17 delegates present.

The roll call of ministers was taken with 14 Active Elders, 1 Superannuated Elder, 1 Supernumerary Elder, 4 Active Probationers and 1 Ministerial Student answering "present".

John B. Morgan asked that his name be referred to the Committee on Ministerial Relations.

Mrs. Leslie (Margaret) Sensintaffar was elected secretary.

The first 5 rows of pews were named to constitute the conference bar.

Dr. and Mrs. J. I. La Favre of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Rev. S. W. Nesmith, Kansas Conference, and Rev. and Mrs. Sidney Davis and family of Oklahoma Conference were introduced.

Bishop Milhouse explained some of the actions of the General Conference and read parts of the new discipline of the United Methodist Church relative to the stand of the church on tobacco and alcoholic beverages.

Rev. A. E. Foust and Ross Harmon were appointed monitors and distributed "The Proposed Plan and Basis of Union", followed by a discussion. (See Page 19).

A standing vote on union was taken with 31 "for" and 4 "against".

The following names were referred by Dr. Crandall to the Committee on Ministerial Relations: John B. Morgan, C. E. Kinney, Bennie Ross Harmon, Don Sensintaffar, C. H. Crandall, Roy James, Roger Crossgrove, Lewis Comwell, and Everett D. Houghton, Sr.

Following a short break, Dr. J. I. La Favre gave the presentation on Benevolent Homes. He is superintendent of Western Home in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. It is not what we will lose but what we can give in Union that counts. There will be a Christmas Offering again this year to go to the benevolent homes.

Rev. and Mrs. G. D. Hammoniree gave testimony in regard to the benevolent homes and described some of their visits to several of the homes.

Rev. Sidney Davis, Trustee to Flatrock Children's Home, told some interesting things about it.

The following committees were appointed by Bishop Milhouse:

Nominating Committee — Rev. James Crawford, Rev. Harold Spradling, and Rev. Wilford Marrs.

Ways and Means Committee — Mr. Cecil Desper, Rev. Hammontree, Dr. Crandall, Mr. Elmer Weilbrenner, Mr. Russell White.

Committee on Claimants — Mr. Desper, Rev. Marrs and Dr. Crandall.

Bishop Milhouse presented one of his books, "Doorways to Spiritual Living", to each one at conference.

The minutes of the Council of Administration were read and approved. (See Report No. 1)

Motion that the union of the Adrian E. U. B. Church and Adrian Methodist Church be approved and that the church lots be transferred with the congregation to the United Methodist Church. Seconded. Carried.

Motion that the trustees be authorized to negotiate the sale of the Adrian parsonage. Seconded. Carried.

Motion that the conference instruct the trustees to transfer the oil wells in Louisiana back to the Jennings and Roanoke Churches. Seconded. Carried. (See Page 28).

MONDAY, MAY 27, 1968, 2:30 p.m.

Rev. Don Sensintaffar led the congregational singing, followed with prayer by Rev. A. E. Foust.

The report of the combined meeting of the Board of Ministry and Ministerial Relations was read. It is hereby adopted. (See Report No. 2)

The following transfers were granted to the Missouri East Conference of the United Methodist Church: R. E. Johnson, E. J. Miller, Lowell Newland, Harold E. Spradling and Bertha M. Rush.

Bennie Ross Harmon was granted a transfer to North Arkansas United Methodist Conference.

Bennie Ross Harmon was questioned publicly and granted a Probationers License to preach.

The Brookfield Congregation requested permission to sell their parsonage and use the money to replace it, either at the time of sale or to hold in escrow for as long as 2 years. This was granted.

The ministers' records were officially endorsed to be turned over to the Pension Board.

The Conference authorized the Board of Trustees to transfer the property of the Brentwood-Springfield Church to the Local Board of Trustees.

Dr. Crandall introduced Mrs. King Lowry of the Otterbein-Princeton Church, and told about the actions of that church. Motion that the Conference secure an attorney to help get a settlement on the Otterbein property. Seconded. Carried.

Motion that the present Board of Trustees remain in office until all property matters in the conference are settled. Seconded. Carried.

Rev. Morgan read the report of the Statistician. See Report No. 10).

Motion that we request the General Board of Missions to continue the allocation of our appropriation until the end of 1968. Seconded. Carried.

Motion that the secretary be authorized to have the journal printed to include the action taken today. Seconded. Carried.

Rev. Dorsey Levell and Rev. Vernon Taylor were appointed a committee to read the minutes.

The Resolutions Committee was appointed, Rev. R. E. Johnson and Rev. Orland Moyer.

Following a short recess Rev. James Crawford led the congregation in singing.

The report of the Nominating Committee was read. These people are elected to these committees and commissions by vote. (See Report No. 3).

The report of the Committee on Resolutions was read. It is hereby adopted. (See Report No. 4)

The report of the committee on Ways and Means was read. It is hereby adopted. (See Report No. 5)

Mr. Cecil Desper read the Treasurer's Report. It is hereby adopted. (See Report No. 7) $\,$

The Conference authorized the continuation of Mr. Desper as Treasurer until he has closed all business and met our obligations.

The report of the Committee on Claimants was read. It is hereby adopted.

Each church that is in arrears in its payment of Christian Service Fund is urged to "pay up".

The pastoral assignments of our churches will be announced at Missouri West Conference and Missouri East Conference.

Motion to adjourn at the close of tonight's session. Seconded. Carried. Dismissed with prayer by Bishop Milhouse.

The Crandall United Methodist Church in Trenton was named in honor of Dr. Crandall who preached here for several years. It was during his stay here that the present building was erected.

Proposed Plan and Basis of Union

Proposed Plan and Basis of Union of the Missouri Conference, Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Missouri West Conference, The Methodist Church.

WHEREAS, The Missouri Conference of the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Missouri West Conference of The Methodist Church, having operated in the same general geographical area and having inherited similar spiritual and cultural backgrounds were integral parts of those denominations at the time of their union on April 23, 1968, at Dallas, Texas.

THEREFORE, we, the members of the Consultation on Union of the Missouri Conference of the Evangelical United Brethren Church and the Missouri West Conference of The Methodist Church, having been delegated the responsibility of preparing a basis for bringing the said Conferences into a single organized body, hereby declare the following agreement to be our Plan and Basis of Union.

I. DECLARATION OF UNION

The Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church shall be organically united into one Conference, which Conference shall be the legal and ecclesiastical successor to these two uniting Conferences, under and in accordance with this Plan and Basis of Union, and with the Plan and Basis of Union and the Discipline of The United Methodist Church.

II. NAME OF THE CONFERENCE

The name of this united Conference shall be the Missouri West Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. In adoption of the name the Missouri Annual Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and the Missouri West Annual Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church have not and are not surrendering any rights, interest or title in and to their respective names which by long and honored usage have become a part of the history and records of the said uniting Conferences but all such rights, interests and titles are specifically reserved against the claims of all persons, associations or organizations whatsoever, other than the said united Conference.

III. BOUNDARIES OF THE CONFERENCE

The boundaries of the united Missouri West Conference of The United Methodist Church shall be the same as those of the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist), namely; "Western Missouri through the counties of Putnam, Sullivan, Linn, Chariton, Howard, Cooper, Moniteau (part), Morgan, Camden, Laclede, Wright, Douglas, Ozark."

IV. CHURCHES OUTSIDE CONFERENCE BOUNDARIES

Churches of the Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church, located geographically outside the boundaries of the Missouri West Conference of The United Methodist Church, shall become a part of the Conferences within whose geographical bounds they are presently situated, namely: Kirksville, Brashear, Fulton and Barker Churches shall become a part of the Missouri East Conference of The United Methodist Church; the congregation of Wye, Arkansas shall become a part of the North Arkansas Conference; the congregations at Roanoke and Jennings, Louisiana shall become a part of the Louisiana Conference.

V. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

In acknowledgement of and in agreement with the Plan and Basis of Union and the Discipline of The United Methodist Church all rights and obligations of the two uniting Conferences shall become the rights and obligations of the united Conference, as follows:

- A. The financial obligations of the Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and of the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church shall become the financial obligations of the united Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church.
- B. The Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) and the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) shall be represented by lay and clerical members on the major boards, commissions and committees of the united Missouri West Conference of The United Methodist Church.
- C. The ecclesiastical orders and status accorded to the ministerial members of the Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) and of the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) shall be recognized and accepted by the united Missouri West Conference of The United Methodist Church. Each minister shall be assured of all rights and privileges which he had in either of the uniting Conferences.
- D. Dr. C. H. Crandall shall continue as District Superintendent with coordinating and liaison responsibilities until the date of his retirement, January 1, 1969.
- E. All pension obligation and credit accrued to ministerial members, their widows and dependent children and other conference claimants and assumed by the Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) and by the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) shall be assumed by the united Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church.

VI. MODE OF PROCEDURE TO EFFECT UNION

- 1. This Plan and Basis of Union shall be submitted to the 1968 sessions of each of the uniting Conferences meeting separately for approval by a "Yes" and "No" vote.
- 2. Each Conference shall adopt the proper resolution authorizing the transfer of title of all property and legal documents to the united Missouri West Conference of The United Methodist Church.
- 3. When an affirmative vote is granted by both Conferences the Uniting Conference shall be convened by the presiding Bishop on May 28, 1968, at Central Methodist College, Fayette, Missouri. The Uniting Conference shall adopt the attached Resolution and Enabling Act.
- 4. It is agreed that after the Uniting Conference it will be necessary to allow a period of time to permit orderly transition of the present treasurers' operations and budgeted apportionments into the new structures; such transition to be completed by January 1, 1969.

RESOLUTION AND ENABLING ACT TO BE ADOPTED BY THE UNITING CONFERENCE, MAY 28, 1968

WHEREAS, the Missouri Annual Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and the Missouri West Annual Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church by their separate vote have adopted the Plan and Basis of Union prepared jointly by the committees appointed by such Conference respectively, and

WHEREAS, this special uniting session of the said uniting Annual Conferences is now in session at Central Methodist College, Fayette, Missouri, on the twenty-eighth day of May, 1968.

Now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED that the Missouri Annual Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and the Missouri West Annual Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church are now and shall hereafter be one Annual Conference known as the Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church is hereby declared to be and is the legal and ecclesiastical successor of the said Missouri Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church and all assets, including property, real and personal and mixed, gifts, donations, legacies, bequests, devises, absolute or in trust of every kind, nature and description whatsoever and wheresoever situated be and the same is hereby declared to be, and that same is hereby automatically vested in the Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church without further act or deed, and the said Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church be and it is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to administer any trust fund heretofore held by either or both of the said Annual Conferences in accordance with the provisions under which such trust funds have been received and administered by such uniting Conference or Conferences.

RESOLUTION: TRANSFER OF CHURCH PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Missouri Annual Conference (former Evangelical United Brethren) of The United Methodist Church and the Missouri West Conference (former Methodist) of The United Methodist Church are being united to form one Annual Conference to be known as the Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent and desire of this Annual Conference to take all steps necessary and/or proper to effect such union and to transfer properties, assets, and authority to the said united Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS, THE MISSOURI ANNUAL CONFERENCE, AS FOLLOWS:

That all assets, including property, real and personal and mixed, gifts, donations, legacies, bequests, devises, absolute or in trust, and all authority and power now vested in this Annual Conference or its agencies and instrumentalities, including any corporations, Boards of Trustees, associations, committees, commissions or other bodies within this Annual Conference, unless ortherwise ordered or provided for in and subject to the Plan

and Basis of Union adopted by the aforesaid two former Annual Conferences for the uniting into one new Annual Conference; and if the Plan and Basis of Union is incomplete in respect to any such property then said property shall be transferred in harmony with the spirit and purpose of said Plan and Basis of Union as may be ordered by the Bishop and District Superintendents of the Missouri West Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church acting as an adjourned session of this Annual Conference and all such agencies, boards, committees, commissions, corporations, associations and other bodies within this Annual Conference or affected by said union are herewith requested and directed to take such steps as may be required to accomplish the purpose and intent of this resolution. The duly constituted officers and agencies of the two former Annual Conferences and of the new Annual Conference are further authorized and directed to follow such procedures as are necessary and/or proper to accomplish the objectives of this resolution; and all such boards of trustees, corporations, boards commissions, agencies and instrumentalities shall be and are hereby continued in existence until such transfer of all said assets and property have been finally consumated and completed. The Bishop of The United Methodist Church for the Missouri Area, together with the District Superintendents of the Missouri West Conference shall be and are hereby authorized and empowered to meet on call of the Bishop to act as adjourned meeting of this Annual Conference and when meeting as such shall be and are authorized and empowered to exercise all of the powers of this Annual Conference to transfer, conserve, and save any and all such assets and property of every character and description and take such action as may be required to authorize and direct the transfer of any such property to the proper board, agency, corporation, or instrumentality of the new Annual Conference to save said assets and property for the use and benefits of The United Methodist Church; and to do all such other things as may be necessary to fully and completely effect the purposes of this resolution.



BASIS OF UNION FOR MISSOURI CONFERENCE CHURCHES

I Churches - Missouri West

- 1. Beginning June 1 pay Service Fund to Missouri West Treasurer.
- 2. June 1 December 31 pay same monthly quotas.
- 3. Missouri West Treasurer to distribute money received to proper funds for statistical purposes.
- 4. Missouri West treasurer to pay:
 - a. June 1 December 31 to Dr. Cawley Stine, Dayton, Ohio, Missouri Conference quota for General Church causes.
 - b. June 1 December 31 (perhaps for quadrennium) Westmar College, Missouri Conference pledge of 50c per member per year.
- 5. Churches pay amount equal to 9% of pastor's salary to Missouri West Pension Plan beginning June 1.
 - Pay 5 months (January 1 May 31) to E. U. B. General Pension Board.
- 6. Pastors pay (or church) 3% Pension assessment for 5 months (January May 31) to General E. U. B. Board of Pensions.
- Pastors receive pension credit on Missouri West Conference plan from June 1. Pastor's credit to June 1, 1968 be established on basis of service record to that date.
- 8. Missouri E. U. B. Conference will request Mission Board appropriation to continue through December 31.
 - Missouri West Treasurer send Missouri East Conference Treasurer the amount appropriated to Kirksville mission.
- 9. Missouri West Conference to be declared the legal and ecclesiastical successor of the Missouri Conference of the Evangelical United Brethren Church.
- Missouri West Treasurer to pay Springfield pastor's mission support salary and house payments to December 31.
- 11. Missouri West Treasurer to pay Supt. Crandall's salary June 1 December 31 from funds received from E. U. B. churches.

- 12. Dr. C. H. Crandall to continue as a Superintendent through December 31, 1968. Retirement approved as of January 1, 1969.
- 13. E. U. B. appointments to be listed with the Missouri West appointments in the proper districts.
- 14. E. U. B. representatives of churches going to Missouri East will not need to attend Missouri West Conference.
- 15. Missouri West Conference to become the legal and ecclesiastical successor of Missouri Conference (E. U. B.)

NOTE: New United Conference act on transfer of churches to Missouri East, North Arkansas and Louisana.

II. Churches - to Missouri East.

- 1. Continue paying same Christian Service Fund quota through December 31.
- 2. Payment of Service Fund to be made to Missouri East Conference. Treasurer to credit the churches for proper funds for statistical purposes.
- 3. Missouri East Treasurer to pay Kirksville pastor's mission support salary.
- 4. Missouri East Treasurer transfer to Missouri West Treasurer June 1 December 31, the total Christian Service Fund received from E. U. B. churches.
- Churches pay 9% pension requirements to Missouri East Treasurer beginning June 1.
 Pay 9% pension for January to May 31, to General E. U. B. Pension Board.
- 6. Pastors (or churches) pay 3% pension requirement to E. U. B. General Board January 1 May 31.
 Pay 3% to Missouri East Treasurer beginning June 1.
- 7. Pastors' service credit up to June 1, 1968 be established on basis of service records. Service credit at Missouri East Conference rate beginning June 1, 1968.
- 8. Westmar College pledge of 50c per member be paid to Westmar beginning January 1, 1969. (June 1 December 31 will be paid by Missouri West Conference from funds transferred to Missouri East.)

III. Wye Church - North Arkansas

- 1. Wye Church to continue paying Christian Service Fund at present rate.
- 2. Pay Service Fund to North Arkansas Treasurer who will, for statistical purposes, make proper distribution to funds.
- 3. North Arkansas Treasurer to transfer to Missouri West Conference Treasurer, total Service Fund received from Wye Church to December 31, 1968.
- 4. Pension 9% payment to go to North Arkansas Conference Pension Fund.

IV. Louisiana Churches - Louisiana Conference

1. Same arrangement with Louisiana Conference as for Wye Church with North Arkansas Conference.

V. Churches from Kansas Conference to Missouri West Conference.

- 1. June 1 to December 31, churches to pay monthly Christian Service Fund to Missouri West Conference Treasurer. He is to distribute proper credit to various funds included in present EUB Christian Service Fund. Beginning January 1, churches will pay to same funds as present Methodist churches, and according to the same factor or decimal.
- 2. Missouri West Conference Treasurer will transfer to the Kansas EUB Conference Treasurer, the total amount of Christian Service Fund received from the churches of the Kansas Conference for June & July.
- 3. Missouri West Conference Treasurer will send to Dr. Cawley, H. Stine, 601 West Riverview Avenue, Dayton, Ohio, from August 1 through December 31, the Kansas churches' share of the Kansas EUB Conference apportionment for general causes.
- 4. Churches to pay an amount equal to 9% of pastor's salary to General Board of Pensions at Dayton, Ohio, for January 1 through May 31, and pay it to the Missouri West Conference Pension Fund beginning June 1. The pastors' 3% must follow the same pattern.
- 5. Ministers' Pension credits at Missouri West Conference rate to begin June 1.

RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER OIL WELLS

The Board of Trustees, moreover authorizes, directs and empowers the Rev. Claude H. REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

- 1. We recommend that the money on time deposit at Trenton National Bank be withdrawn and be deposited in the current operating account of the Conference.
- 2. All monies in the church treasurers (except WSWS) funds be transferred to the Conference Treasurer.
- 3. That seven months payments be made on Springfield parsonage at \$134.99 per month, by July 1, 1968.
- 4 That \$500. be paid to the South Eagle Church plus an additional \$250. as a grant.
- 5. That the delegates expenses to the General Conference, not paid by the General Church, be allowed and that delegates expenses to the Judiciary Conference be paid.
- 6. That moving expenses of \$300. to the Springfield Church be allowed.
- 7. That \$1,000. be paid to Bishop Frank for salary subsidy for Springfield church.
- 8. Pay whatever is required into the pension fund to bring the pension payment to a minimum of \$30. per year of service.

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your request, we have made an eximanation of the cash and other records of the Missouri Conference Evangelical United Brethren Church for the period January 7, 1967 to January 6, 1968. Our report, together with statement of cash receipts and disbursements is herewith submitted.

We confirmed the balances in the bank as of January 6, 1968 by comparing a certificate received from the Trenton National Bank, Trenton, Missouri, with the stated book balance. All recorded cash receipts were verified in total and traced to the depositary.

Cash disbursements were verified by tracing them from the check register to the bank. All such disbursements totals in check register were proved. All monies disbursed on behalf of the home in Springfield, Missouri, were checked to the loan account pass book. This liability including interest on such loan, is being paid each month on a basis of \$134.99. Balance on principal at the close of the period under review amounted to \$9,991.84.

A savings account was created on February 26, 1966 in the amount of \$8,000.00 with the Trenton National Bank, Trenton, Missouri. It has a balance at the close of the period under review of \$8,602.86, having earned \$602.86 interest from February 26, 1966.
