## STANDING RULES

1. *Nominations.* The presiding elders shall be a standing committee on nominations, and shall nominate all members of the quadrennial boards and annual committees; also the Conference Treasurer.

2. *Undergraduates.* Undergraduates who remain in the same class more than two successive years will be discontinued or located unless they are in school. Extraordinary circumstances and a two-thirds vote of the Conference will be necessary to override this rule.

3. *Conference Program.* The pastor-host of the Conference, the presiding elder in whose district the Conference session is held, and the chairman of the Committee on Evangelism, shall constitute a Committee on Conference Program. This Committee shall arrange, not less than sixty days before the Conference meets, for all preaching or other inspirational services, and select the speakers for each service. The program made by this committee shall be subject to revision as the exigencies of any situation may require or the Conference direct.

4. *Conference Treasurer.* The Conference shall elect quadrennially a Conference treasurer who shall give bond to the Board of Trustees in such sum as the Conference may determine, and who shall receive and disburse such funds as the Conference may direct. The premium on the treasurer's bond shall be paid out of the Conference expense fund.

5. *Auditing Accounts.* The books of the Conference treasurer and of the treasurer of each Conference Board shall be audited annually within sixty days after the adjournment of the Conference session, by a qualified public accountant, such accountant to be employed by the Secretary of the Conference and paid out of the Conference expense fund. The reports of the accountant shall be filed with the Conference Secretary, and the results thereof published in the Conference Journal.

### 6. Financial and Statistical.

(1) All assessments for Conference claims and all reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars with no columns for cents.

(2) Each pastor shall settle with the Conference treasurer, and turn over his statistical reports with the treasurer's receipt attached, the first day of the Conference.

(3) The presiding elder will furnish the statistical secretary with all assessments on pastoral charges not less than sixty days before the annual Conference meets.

7. *Conference Claimants.* The Board of Finance shall co-operate with the Board of Trustees in securing homes for Conference Claimants and additional donations to the Conference Superannuate Endowment Fund. Such homes and funds shall be held in trust by the Board of Trustees.

8. *Memoirs of Preachers' Wives.* Memoirs of preachers' wives who have died shall be read at the Memorial session of the Conference and published in the Conference Journal, and preachers' wives shall be invited to take part in the Memorial session.

9. *Conference Expense Fund.* The Budget Committee shall make an assessment for a Conference expense fund to cover the cost of all clerical work necessary in preparing Conference records, printing and distributing the Conference Minutes, for preserving Conference records and documents, and all legitimate expenses incurred by the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer in carrying out the orders of the Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall be custodian of this fund which shall be paid out on the order of the Conference Secretary.

10. *Reports and Resolutions.* All reports, resolutions and other papers intended for publication in the Conference Minutes shall be typewritten and in triplicate.

11. *History Commission.* There shall be a self-perpetuating History Commission composed of five clerical members of the Conference, one of whom shall be the Secretary of the Conference, whose duty it shall be to collect and preserve biographical data of clerical members of the Conference, data of all kinds that promise to be of historical interest and value, the Conference records, and other documents of historical value. The Commission shall make a quadrennial report to the Conference at the session next following the General Conference.

12. *Lay Representation.* Lay representation in District Conference shall consist of four members elected by the Quarterly Conference of each pastoral charge. Alternate delegates shall be elected by the Quarterly Conference.

13. *Repealed.* All actions and parts of actions of the Conference, which may be construed as standing rules, which were taken prior to the annual session of 1928, and which are not contained in, or are in conflict with the foregoing rules are hereby repealed.

14. These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided that the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing a day before the vote is taken.

**AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY REPORT**

During the past year, the American Bible Society distributed more than 7,200,000 volumes, over 4,250,000 of these being distributed in about forty foreign countries. In the United States, over 65,000 copies of the New Testament were distributed to the enrollees of the C. C. C. Camps, and 3,887 embossed volumes were distributed to the blind, these latter being sold at only a fraction of the cost. In spite of adverse political and military conditions in many lands, distribution abroad was well maintained; even in China circulation was greater than that of any previous year.

The work of translation and revision goes on, Scriptures now being available in 972 different languages and dialects. New publications include portions in Ponape, Navaho, New Turkish, Ibanag, etc., while the new Standard Braille Bible has been completed and selected Scripture passages have been made available in "talking book" form.

The Rev. J. J. Morgan, Secretary of the Southwestern District, has reported to your Board that a total of 289,879 volumes was distributed the past year in Texas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Louisiana—an increase of 4,179 over the total for the previous year. In spite of limited funds, numerous grants were made, including Scriptures to blind persons, C. C. C. Camps, penitentiaries, rural Sunday Schools, Daily Vacation Bible Schools, Rescue Homes, Salvation Army, etc., throughout the Southwest. Judging from the great number of individual requests, the State of Arkansas is one of the neediest fields for distribution of Scripture, and a special effort has been made to supply missionaries working in the mountain regions of the State. Because of widespread poverty in these areas, it is often impossible for the people to buy even the cheapest Scriptures, and the Bible Society has met this need with donations to the limit of its funds.

We present herewith the following resolutions:

WHEREAS, the work of the American Bible Society in translating, publishing, and distributing the Bible is of great importance in the life of the churches and is indispensable to the whole missionary enterprise, be it resolved:

FIRST, That we express our hearty endorsement of the activities of the Society in its efforts to make the Bible more generally the common possession of humanity.

Second, That, inasmuch as Sunday, December 6, has been designated as Universal Bible Sunday, ministers and churches represented in this body take advantage of the cooperation offered by the Society in furnishing assistance, and plan carefully for a worthy observance of this day.

This is to be paid out of the first funds coming to the Treasurer for the new year's budget, and that all other funds be apportioned as indicated in the report.

We urge, in fact, insist, that all Boards shall present their askings to the Commission on Budget in writing and setting forth in detail the items making up their budget.

#### REPORT OF BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

##### Report No. 1

These statements of fact about the joint interests of our Church and Hendrix College are matters of high moment for our people. Our present efficiency has been vitally connected with the College and our future success even to a larger degree will depend on how closely the Church is related to the college as its basic source of leadership supply and training.

We look to Hendrix to give our ministers their collegiate literary courses. Our efficiency is limited by the success of the College with ministers and laymen, and its efficiency is limited by our interest in liberality. The future Methodist organization in Arkansas will be directly dependent on how effective we make it possible for Hendrix to be.

The Church has a right to look to Hendrix for a Christian atmosphere for its literary training. So, in turn, the College has a right to look to the Church in strengthening its clientele for securing students of the highest Christian type and for aid in securing adequate maintenance to do well the things expected.

The number of ministers now training at Hendrix from the Little Rock Conference is six. To meet our needs this is far too small. Unless early means are found to change the situation we fear we shall in the near future suffer serious embarrassment because of our lack of men adequately prepared to meet demands. The Little Rock Conference should have thirty candidates in training at Hendrix College all the time.

Feeling, therefore, that the Church needs to look with ever increas-

ing favor to the College and that College ties with the Church must be ever stronger, we recommend:

1. That the Little Rock Conference continue the program initiated at its last session in raising \$2,500 for the education of ministerial students at Hendrix.

2. That the Church be urged to seek with great diligence to discover young men of parts who may be led to give themselves to the work of the ministry, and that the College be given every possible aid in securing students of promise and worth.

3. That we observe more carefully Section 7 of Paragraph 455 of the 1934 Discipline, to-wit:

"To see that information concerning the work of our schools and colleges and universities is given regularly in the Church through quarterly programs, thereby emphasizing the place and importance of these institutions in the educational system of our Church. It is recommended that the fifth Sunday be set apart for this program."

4. That when such fifth Sunday is observed each congregation may have an opportunity of contributing something for the college maintenance. To increase the interest of our people in Hendrix they need to hear more often and more intimately about it, and they need to give systematically to it. We do not love in glowing generalities; we love specifically, and loving and giving go hand in hand. We cannot stress too highly the imperative need of our congregations' giving the College a permanent place in their regular contributions. The need of Hendrix is continuous; it will grow with increasing demands for the future and such conditions can be successfully met only by regular, normal giving.

5. That the date for Hendrix College Week be referred to a committee composed of the Chairman of the Board and the Presiding Elders.

6. That Mr. H. C. Couch, J. J. Harrison and Wilbur Gulley be elected to succeed themselves as members of the Board of Trustees of Hendrix College.

7. That toward securing an adequately trained ministry, toward securing students of promise and worth, and toward securing adequate help for the College in its budget and capital accounts, we ask Dr. J. H. Reynolds and the Board of Trustees to lead the way. To them the Church pledges not only sympathetic interest, but as a Conference we will make an earnest and an honest effort to reach the ends needed and sought.

##### Report No. 2

Before the Board we had President J. H. Reynolds and Dr. J. M. Williams representing Hendrix College; Dr. Boyd McKeown and Dr. J. Q. Schisler representing the General Board of Christian Education; Dr. A. C. Millar representing the Western Methodist Assembly; together with the reports of our Treasurer and the members of our Conference staff. Our Conference year-book showing all the details of our Board's operation will be placed in the hands of each preacher in the Conference, hence, we confine this report to our recommendation.

##### Recommendations:

1. That College Week be observed in each local church in the Conference and that \$2,500 be set as the goal for a free will offering to be taken on that day to be used for a scholarship fund for Ministerial

education, and that the President of Hendrix College with the Executive Committee of the Board of Christian Education be responsible for the administration of this fund.

2. That we place greater emphasis this year than ever before upon the Christmas Offering for the Orphanage, seeking to reach a goal of not less than \$5,000.00 from the churches of the Little Rock Conference.

3. That the goal and date for Young People's Anniversary be left to be determined by the Executive Committee in conference with the Presiding Elders.

4. That the Conference accept \$3,000.00 as its goal for Church School Day offering and that we strive to secure an offering from every church in the Conference.

5. That our Presiding Elders be asked to serve as an enrollment committee to cooperate with the Board of Managers in securing attendance of all pastors at the 1937 session of the Arkansas Pastors' School.

6. That first emphasis be placed again this year upon our extension program in the interest of the rural churches of our Conference.

7. That we join the other Conferences of Southern Methodism in a campaign for increased membership in our Church Schools for a period beginning with this Conference and lasting until the session of our next General Conference.

8. That a Conference-wide meeting for Church School Superintendents and Pastors be held in Little Rock as early in the year as can conveniently be arranged.

9. That J. H. Hollis be elected to represent the Little Rock Conference on the Board of Trustees of the Western Methodist Assembly.

10. That the following appointments be made: Professor Emory University, R. C. Rhodes; Vice President and Professor Hendrix College, C. J. Greene; Student Union Seminary, John William Hammons.

11. That Mrs. J. M. Stinson and Mrs. Tom McLean be added to the present Little Rock Conference representatives on the Board of Managers of the Arkansas Pastors' School.

12. That the Conference Commission on Budget make the following apportionments for the Board of Christian Education: \$6,242.00 for Hendrix College; \$6,242.00 for Conference promotion; \$750.00 for the Pastors' School.

**BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES****Report No. 1****Temperance and Social Service**

Your Conference Board most heartily commends the excellent course of study submitted for use in our Church Schools during the year and especially through the month of October.

This type of education on the use and effect of alcohol upon every phase of our activities, must be continued. We pledge our united effort in cooperation with the Board of Education in this educational work.

Among all forces for increasing the consumption of alcohol now arrayed against us, none is more powerful than the great advertising agencies now being employed by liquor interests. Not only the great newspapers but practically all our household magazines carry these advertisements. They are prepared by the most skillful advertising agencies in the country. We would not overlook mentioning as one of the most powerful of these agencies, the moving picture shows. Whether paid for as advertising or not the continued portrayal of drinking scenes in almost every picture shown creates the impression that drinking is the almost universal and conventional thing to do.

Pending a time when our educational efforts will ripen into fruitful action, a careful study of the whole question of control and law enforcement should be made. We are not unmindful of the fact that a large body of our own membership would at this time oppose the adoption of another prohibition amendment. This leads us to conclude that in every instance where legal prohibition is attempted in cities and counties, the question of law enforcement should receive the most careful study. Our ultimate goal is of course the complete banishment of intoxicating liquor as a beverage and to this end we pledge our most hearty cooperation and support. We nominate W. R. Jordan, J. B. Withee, J. H. Hollis and A. C. Millar as Little Rock Conference representatives on Arkansas Anti-Saloon League.

**Gambling**

Never was the gambling mania more widespread in the land than at present. In legalizing certain forms of gambling, the state has contributed a large share in the creation of this condition. We call upon our legislature to repeal all forms of legalized gambling and pledge to our law enforcement agencies our best efforts and cooperation in aiding to enforce anti-gambling laws.

**Economic Security**

We commit ourselves to the task of creating wholesome and just economic relations between employer and employee. These groups each have rights which must be safe-guarded and protected in order that the interests of both may best be conserved.

**Peace**

In a world torn with strife and threatened with another great war we would commend all properly directed efforts toward the establishment of world peace.

Your Conference Board is gratified with the increase noted in the benevolent collections and salaries paid to our pastors.

We feel that the time is now at hand for a general advance in both these causes. Many of our churches, not burdened with debt, can increase materially their contributions to our benevolent causes. The salaries paid all of our pastors should, and we feel confident will, be increased in proportion to the increased ability of all our people.

We realize fully that if these ends are to be achieved, careful cultivation and encouragement must be given through every avenue of our organization.

Your Board of Lay Activities pledges the full strength of its organization in this work. It cannot be done at all except through the active cooperation of Presiding Elders and Pastors. This cooperation in the past has been most generous on the part of our ministry and we know they will continue to work with us along all lines which promise the desired results.

We request both Presiding Elders and Pastors to use our organization whenever and wherever possible in carrying forward the work of the Church.

We recommend again the observance of Layman's Day, the second Sunday in June or as near thereto as practical.

We nominate J. S. M. Cannon for Lay Leader for the ensuing year and Sam T. Steel for Secretary-Treasurer.

3. Insist on duty of all officials to take Conference Organ.
4. Recommend a reduction of the askings to \$3,400.
5. Request election of same commissioners and editor for one year.

We appreciate past sacrificial service of Dr. A. C. Millar. He has sacrificially stood for the highest ideals of the Methodist Church. We

commend his present editorial leadership, and his clear visions of the social demands upon our Church. We are also grateful for the service rendered by our commission during the past difficult years.

At the request of Dr. James Thomas, I submit herewith my report of the audit of the books and accounts of the Arkansas Methodist Orphanage for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1936. The receipts as recorded in the books are verified with the deposits as shown by the bank statements. The disbursements are verified and found to be correct.

As a whole, the system employed is good and is accurately maintained. In my opinion, all receipts and disbursements are properly recorded.

Little Rock, Arkansas, October 1, 1936.

We are happy to state that the Orphanage, up to October 1st, was on a level financial condition. It became necessary for us to secure funds by loan to carry on until the Christmas Funds come in from that date as we had but little cash left. For this splendid achievement, we are indebted to Mrs. Steed, our matron, and her helpers.

At the beginning of the fiscal year, we had 33 children in the Home. We have received during the year 22 children, and have placed out 15 and now have a colony of 40 in the Home. Up to this report, we have placed 555 children in good homes throughout the United States.

Our children all attend church services regularly at Highland Methodist Church, where our Home has the pastoral oversight of the Rev. O. L. Cole, who is in every way suited to it and is very helpful to us.

I feel that our endowment is beginning to take proper shape and in the course of time we will have more to report than we have reported heretofore. Estimating the amount that I have secured to date, it is only an estimate because it is in an estate, I would say \$10,000.00. I have several more sums larger in the offing that I hope to close out in the course of time.

#### Recommendations

1. We request that you recommend to the Conference to give us the same assessments this year as they did last year, to-wit: \$5,000.00, with whatever scale the Budget Committee makes in all of the other askings.

2. We request that the Conference give us the Christmas Offering to be taken on the Sunday nearest Christmas Day in Stations, which will be Sunday, December 20th, and on the Circuits, it will be started on that Sunday and closed out as quickly as possible. We hereby beg our pastors to give everybody an opportunity to give as we are almost wholly dependent upon this Christmas Offering, which your Trustees think should be carried through the two Conferences, thus giving all of our people at both services on Sunday, December 20th, an opportunity to give to this cause. We sincerely hope that the offering will be much larger this year than it was last. Unless it is larger, we will suffer.

3. We recommend that the Boards of Christian Education accept, as they have heretofore done, this undertaking as a part of their work and that the Rev. Ira A. Brumley of the North Arkansas Conference and the Rev. Clem Baker of the Little Rock Conference, assist us as they usually do in this connection. If they do, nothing but success will follow.

4. We are increasingly convinced that the time has come when we should put forth a strong effort to place upon the hearts of our people the necessity for endowment so that bequests may be left in their wills for our Home.

**REPORT OF THE LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE BOARD  
OF TRUSTEES, 1935-1936**

**Constitution**

We, J. A. Henderson, Chairman, James Thomas, Secretary-Treasurer, and J. A. Sage, and P. W. Snodgrass, and our successors, desire to form a corporation, and for that purpose, adopt the following constitution:

First. The name of said corporation shall be The Board of Trustees of the Little Rock Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

Second. The object of the corporation shall be to receive, hold and administer all moneys, funds and property, real and personal, that may from time to time come into its hands by donations, gifts, devise, bequests, or otherwise, for any of the uses, purposes and needs of the Little Rock Conference, particularly funds and property for the use of superannuated preachers of said Conference.

Third. Said Board is authorized to place at interest any and all funds that may come into the hands for the use and benefit of said Conference, and shall make a full and complete report of its acts and doings in that behalf to the annual meeting of said Little Rock Conference for approval, showing disposition of the interests and funds received, provided always the Board shall carry out the wishes of the donors of said funds or property.

Fourth. That the vacancies in said Board shall be filled by said Little Rock Conference, but in the interim such vacancies may be filled by the remainder of said Board and the persons so appointed shall hold office until the next meeting of said Conference.

Fifth. That the regular meetings of said Board shall be on the first day of the annual session of said Conference, and at the same place as the Conference is held. The first meeting shall be on the fifth day of March, 1899, at the city of Little Rock. Provided also: The President of the Board may call a meeting of the Board when deemed necessary.

Sixth. That the officers of said Board shall consist of a President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected for two years, provided those elected at the first meeting shall hold until the regular annual meeting.

Seventh. Four members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

**GOALS FOR THE LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE**

1. That we seek to raise during the next two years, the General and Conference benevolences to the askings.
2. That our Board of Missions and Board of Christian Education set up the joint committee for Rural Work as authorized by the Discipline, and that this committee meet at least ten days before Conference with the Presiding Elders and the Executive-Extension Secretary to map out a Conference Rural Life Program.
3. That we seek to raise the standards of our Rural Work:
  - (a) By a more careful and liberal distribution of funds by the Board of Missions.
  - (b) By a sharing program of better paid pastors and churches of larger wealth. We suggest that the Conference appoint a commission for the study of this subject.
  - (c) By enlisting devout laymen for services in the rural churches.
4. That we seek to put Hendrix College central in our educational program, developing a loyalty for our only Methodist educational institution in the state.
5. That we observe College Day with an offering for ministerial training and urge upon our people the growing demand for a trained ministry. We also urge that our pastors preach on the call to the ministry.
6. That the Conference create a commission to study our church debts and make recommendations as to their solution.
7. That we seek higher standards for men and women in official positions. We call upon all the officers in our churches to take seriously and prayerfully their official position and urge pastors to be careful and prayerful in their nominations made at quarterly conference.
8. That we rethink our call to ministry. We were all, no doubt, truly called of God but our call never outlasts the vision. In the words of one of our Chief Pastors, "The validity of a call to preach rests not upon some early estatic experience but upon the continuing receptivity of our hearts to the ever active love of God and our burning consciousness of the need of the world. When from our hearts there fades the unwearying concern for a sinful world, then our call fades into the light of common day and our commission is cancelled." We might well examine our call. It may be that some of us have lost the call and should move out into the fields of competitive trades where personal ambitions thrive better than in the ministry.

## Memoirs

### FORREST FRANCIS HARRELL

Called of God to a high task. A life given in the fullest measure of devotion. The privilege of remaining actively at his work until the last swiftly fading hour. There are conditions for a full life. Such was the privilege of Forrest Harrell. Called of God to preach, his life work was completed in the active ranks.

Born in Mississippi, he came to Arkansas before he reached manhood. Except for a few years in Texas he remained a resident of the state. From 1896 to 1936 he was an itinerant Methodist preacher in Arkansas conferences.

He was tall of stature and erect of bearing. His character followed the same lines. He was always a man of independent spirit. Straightforward, he so shunned insincerity that those not close to him thought he was cold and distant. Proud of his manhood, he stood in the clear on debated questions and asked no favors. He thought out his decisions, then he took his position. He did so outspokenly. Fearless of all save dishonor, he often incurred ill will and loss rather than compromise. No man could buy him by favor, and none could intimidate him by threat.

He was known by those nearest him to be a man as tender and kind as a gentle woman. They knew the humility and sweetness that mixed his pride. They learned that his blunt speech and abrupt action was often a shield for an unusual sensitiveness of feeling.

His great joy was in preaching. There he excelled. He had only a few years formal education. But by great toil he mastered in later life what he could have gotten at earlier age in school. He made himself acquainted with his world. He acquired a mastery in the use of clear, strong English, and he knew the right forms. He became a constant student of the Bible. His purpose always to be a better preacher of the gospel by which he was being saved daily. He realized this intention so well that thoughtful men received a blessing from his pulpit ministry.

He said that he never wanted to superannuate. He prayed to be active to the end. He had the fulfillment of his prayer. On the last Sunday in January he preached morning and evening. The following Wednesday it was cold and snowing. He visited some members who were ill. He was ready for prayer meeting, but the weather kept his flock at home. He went to bed apparently well. Before morning he was desperately ill. The following Sunday morning just before eleven o'clock he went to join the great congregation of the saints gone on.

"We can not think of them as dead  
Who walk with us no more.  
Along the path of life we tread  
They have but gone before.

Ours are they by an ownership  
Nor time nor death can free  
For God has given to love to keep  
Its own eternally."

## REV. THOMAS O. OWEN

Thomas O. Owen was born about nine miles from Magnolia, Arkansas, June 4, 1865. He was the fourth son of Mr. and Mrs. Egbert B. Owen who came to Arkansas from Heard County, Georgia in 1856.

When as a young man he felt "the call to preach," he, as one living ahead of his generation, understood it to be a call to get ready to preach. In spite of many difficulties involved, he went to Central Collegiate Institute at Altus—later changed to Hendrix College and moved to Conway—where by hard work he earned his education and graduated in 1893 with honors.

On June 3, 1896, he was married to May Day Carruth of Washington, Arkansas, who was a graduate of Galloway College. Theirs was the first wedding in which graduates of our two church colleges were married. To this union was born two sons, E. Carruth Owen, now of New York City, and Thomas Cline Owen of Little Rock.

During thirty-five years of active work in the Little Rock Conference, Brother Owen served the church in fifteen of the best towns and cities in our state. Nashville, Stuttgart, Hot Springs, Malvern, Texarkana, Pine Bluff, Warren, Camden, Hope, Monticello, Fordyce, England, Mena, Lake Village and Bauxite were the centers of his ministry.

In 1929 he was superannuated on account of his failing health. After six years of semi-invalidism, he died April 4, 1936, at his home in Little Rock.

Brother Owen's ministry was distinguished by his strong convictions, his tender sympathy, and his unfailing zeal in his work. He fought courageously every evil known to him. He was a genuine friend and pastor to his people who were in trouble. He was an evangel of the gospel, always trying to win men to his Lord. Even in his illness, his friends could see in his face the radiance of the Christian religion, and his life was testimony of the triumph of the Christian Spirit. He certainly belongs to that company of whom it is written:

"Thou wast their rock, their fortress, and their might;  
Thou, Lord, their Captain in their well-fought fight;  
Thou, in the darkness drear, their one true light;  
Hallelujah, Hallelujah."

## SAMUEL WALTER RAINNEY

Samuel Walter, son of William Samuel and Henley Rainey, was born in Pulaski County, Arkansas, December 20, 1858, and died at his home in Little Rock, Arkansas, April 8, 1936—age 77 years, 3 months and 18 days.

While yet in infancy, Samuel Walter was baptised into the fellowship of the Methodist Church by Rev. Burton Williams. At the age of six years he professed faith in Christ for himself and assumed the vows of Church membership. A problem confronted the Rainey family in the education of their children from the first. Whether they had advantages in this direction beyond the village school of the county in which they were born we are not told. But of one thing we are certain. The children took advantage of any opportunities that were offered, and became liberally educated.

On September 30, 1883, Samuel Walter married Annie Miller, of Hot Springs. To this union were born five girls, three of whom survive the father. They are respectively, Mrs. J. H. Vinson of Pine Bluff, Mrs. T. T. Taner of Houston, Texas, and Mrs. Ruth Duke of Little Rock.

Samuel Walter was licensed to preach in Asbury Church, Little Rock, in 1891; admitted on trial in the Little Rock Conference in 1893; was ordained deacon in 1895 by Bishop A. G. Haygood, and was ordained elder by Bishop E. R. Hendrix in 1897. Thus was well begun a ministry that stretched across a quarter of a century. His works were often large circuits, with much travel, and little remuneration. I first met him in Monticello while I was pastor there. He did his work well, and was popular with all the people who knew him. He founded the Methodist Church at Stamps, and the church at Crossett, and likewise the church at Highland in Little Rock. If he had never done any other work but this it would have been enough to stamp him with Immortality in Arkansas Methodism. If a tree is still to be known by its fruits, this Rainey Tree was one of the best investments planted in the Garden Of God. The records show that he had substantial growth in membership in every pastoral charge he ever served. He looked well after the big things of the Kingdom of God, and no church was ever safer than when Samuel Walter Rainey was its pastor.

In his early life he had chosen the law as his profession, and had been admitted to the bar long before he ever became a preacher. He was thus able to look carefully after the matter of land deeds and trust papers for the church. So that when he was called into the ministry it was not a case of a man hunting some remunerative job that would pay him a living wage. It was a case of a young man called to discipleship and told to sell all that he had and give to the poor, and then follow the Master. No man ever more completely did this sort of thing than Samuel Walter Rainey.

During his last illness, he spoke of Immortality and Eternal life as matters that were approaching into sight and he was not afraid. That old Twenty-Third Psalm was a great comfort to him in life and was his passport across the dark sea we call death. "Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil" he was saying in his last conscious moments. It was like the gray sea-gull, lifting its wings to the approaching storm, and off and above it with a glad cry of victory. Farewell, Bro. Rainey. We are all better men for having known you.

#### A TRIBUTE TO THE MEMORY OF MRS. F. P. DOAK

Mrs. F. P. Doak, (Miss Mary Jane Wilson) was born at Avilla, Saline County, Ark., January 30, 1864.

When she was but a few months old her mother died. Her father married again two years later and only lived a few years and died leaving her to be reared by a step-mother. She was united in marriage to Rev. F. P. Doak, February 15, 1883. To them were born five children, four of whom are still living and are following the Christ she taught them to love. Harvey Watson died when an infant.

Sister Doak was a very timid little woman, but a woman of strong convictions and brave enough to stand by them at all times and under all circumstances, regardless of what others might do or say. Her Christian character was a living testimonial to the reality and power of our Holy religion. She was always exceedingly modest in her professions of religious experience but her gentleness, her patience, her charity of spirit, her loyalty to her Christ and her purity of life were known by all with whom she was associated.

As a mother she was firm, yet kind, gentle, patient and thoughtful.

She knew Jesus Christ as her Saviour and shaped the program of her life with reference to Him and His Kingdom. She was a loyal itinerate and bravely and cheerfully accepted the results of the annual revolutions of the itinerant wheel. For fifty-three years she shared the joys and sorrows of an itinerant preacher's life, maintaining always her quiet cheerfulness of spirit; her abiding faith in God and her constant devotion to the church she loved and had given her entire life in beautiful service.

Her home and her church afforded an ample field for the exercise of all her powers and the use of all her time.

On these altars she poured out the richest treasures of her mind and heart.

She was especially devoted to the work of the Sunday School and of the Woman's Missionary Society and the results of her work in these departments of the church still abide in all the charges where she lived and labored.

She died near Magnolia, Arkansas, November 18, 1935, on her way to Shreveport, La., to visit Mrs. Noys and family, her oldest daughter.

Her funeral was conducted from the First Methodist Church of Nashville, Arkansas, where a throng of friends from all over the Conference gathered to pay tribute to this wonderful servant of God.

The writer had known and loved Sister Doak for some forty-four years and his life was enriched by having known her and felt almost like he was preaching the funeral of a near relative.

We join the bereaved family in lamenting what seems her untimely taking away.

The influence she set in motion will out-live the stars.
