STANDING RULES

1. *Nominations.* The presiding elders shall be a standing committee on nominations, and shall nominate all members of the quadrennial boards and annual committees; also the Conference Treasurer.

2. *Undergraduates.* Undergraduates who remain in the same class more than two successive years will be discontinued or located unless they are in school. Extraordinary circumstances and a two-thirds vote of the Conference will be necessary to override this rule.

3. *Conference Program.* The pastor-host of the Conference, the presiding elder in whose district the Conference session is held, and the chairman of the Committee on Evangelism, shall constitute a Committee on Conference Program. This Committee shall arrange, not less than sixty days before the Conference meets, for all preaching or other inspirational services, and select the speakers for each service. The program made by this committee shall be subject to revision as the exigencies of any situation may require or the Conference direct.

4. *Conference Treasurer.* The Conference shall elect quadrennially a Conference treasurer who shall give bond to the Board of Trustees in such sum as the Conference may determine, and who shall receive and disburse such funds as the Conference may direct. The premium on the treasurer's bond shall be paid out of the Conference expense fund.

5. *Auditing Accounts.* The books of the Conference treasurer and of the treasurer of each Conference Board shall be audited annually within sixty days after the adjournment of the Conference session, by a qualified public accountant, such accountant to be employed by the Secretary of the Conference and paid out of the Conference expense fund. The reports of the accountant shall be filed with the Conference Secretary, and the results thereof published in the Conference Journal.

6. *Financial and Statistical.*

(1) All assessments for Conference claims and all reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars with no columns for cents.

(2) Each pastor shall settle with the Conference treasurer, and turn over his statistical reports with the treasurer's receipt attached, the first day of the Conference.

(3) The presiding elder will furnish the statistical secretary with all assessments on pastoral charges not less than sixty days before the annual Conference meets.

7. *Conference Claimants.* The Board of Finance shall co-operate with the Board of Trustees in securing homes for Conference Claimants and additional donations to the Conference Superannuate Endowment Fund. Such homes and funds shall be held in trust by the Board of Trustees.

8. *Memoirs of Preachers' Wives.* Memoirs of preachers' wives who have died shall be read at the Memorial session of the Conference and published in the Conference Journal, and preachers wives shall be invited to take part in the Memorial session.

9. *Conference Expense Fund.* The Budget Committee shall make an assessment for a Conference expense fund to cover the cost of all clerical work necessary in preparing Conference records, printing and distributing the Conference Minutes, for preserving Conference records and documents, and all legitimate expenses incurred by the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer in carrying out the orders of the Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall be custodian of this fund which shall be paid out on the order of the Conference Secretary.

10. *Reports and Resolutions.* All reports, resolutions and other papers intended for publication in the Conference Minutes shall be typewritten and in triplicate.

11. *History Commission.* There shall be a self-perpetuating History Commission composed of five clerical members of the Conference, one of whom shall be the Secretary of the Conference, whose duty it shall be to collect and preserve biographical data of clerical members of the Conference, data of all kinds that promise to be of historical interest and value, the Conference records, and other documents of historical value. The Commission shall make a quadrennial report to the Conference at the session next following the General Conference.

12. *Lay Representation.* Lay representation in District Conference shall consist of four members elected by the Quarterly Conference of each pastoral charge. Alternate delegates shall be elected by the Quarterly Conference.

13. *Repealed.* All actions and parts of actions of the Conference, which may be construed as standing rules, which were taken prior to the annual session of 1923, and which are not contained in, or are in conflict with the foregoing rules are hereby repealed.

14. These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided that the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing a day before the vote is taken.

JOURNAL

FIRST DAY—TUESDAY EVENING SESSION

Conference Opened.—The eighty-fifth session of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, met in the First Methodist Church in Camden, Arkansas, at 7:30 p. m., November 15, 1938, with Bishop Charles C. Selecman presiding. J. D. Baker conducted the devotional service, J. D. Hammons leading in prayer. The Bishop presented Rev. Marshall Steel of the North Texas Conference, who had been secured as the Conference preacher, and he delivered the first of a series of sermons to run throughout the Conference session. His theme was, "The Chief Work of the Minister."

Secretaries.—The roll of the Conference was called and C. J. Greene was elected Secretary, Clem Baker, C. R. Roy, Otto Teague, George Meyer, assistant secretaries, C. E. Whitten, Statistical Secretary, and A. W. Hamilton and G. W. Warren his assistants.

Welcome.—C. M. Reves, the pastor host, introduced Mayor Ben T. Laney, who welcomed the Conference in felicitous words. James Thomas responded to the welcome address.

Time of Sessions.—A motion carried that the Conference sessions should begin at 8:30 a. m., and close at 12:00 m. The limits of the auditorium were made the bar of the Conference.

Boards and Committees.—The presiding elders made their report, nominating the quadrennial and the annual boards and committees, and the report was adopted.

Introduced.—Rev. Jeff Smith, a general evangelist, was introduced and spoke briefly of his work.

Order of the Day.—A motion carried that the election of delegates to the Uniting Conference be made the order of the day at 10:00 o'clock Wednesday.

Conference Preacher.—C. M. Reves announced that Brother Steel would preach each day at 3:00 p. m. and 7:30 p. m. Hymn No. 140, "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood," was sung and the Conference adjourned with the benediction by Brother Steel.

SECOND DAY—MORNING SESSION

Conference Opened.—The Conference met at 8:30 a. m., with Bishop Selecman in the chair. The Bishop led the devotional exercises, reading and commenting upon part of the thirteenth chapter of John.

Minutes Approved.—The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Roll Called.—The roll of those who were not present at the first session was called and alternates were seated in place of absent principal lay delegates.

Order of the Day.—The order of the day having been reached, the Conference proceeded to the election of delegates to the Uniting Conference. Six tellers for the lay group and six for the clerical group were elected. A motion carried that any ballots containing more or fewer names than the number to be voted on should be illegal. The first ballot was cast and the tellers retired to count the votes.

Rural Church Commission.—The Rural Church Commission made its report and the report was adopted.

Special Committees.—The special committee appointed by the Bishop to consider increased support for Hendrix College made its report, and a motion carried that the report be referred to the Board of Education.

Order of the Day.—A motion carried that the report of the Board of Education on its findings and recommendations on the report of this special committee be made the order of the day at 10:00 o'clock Friday.

Report of Orphanage.—James Thomas made his report as Superintendent of the Orphanage and the report was adopted.

Minister Exonerated.—Under question 22, the name of J. D. Rogers was called and his Presiding Elder, E. C. Rule, reported on Brother Rogers, who a year ago was under complaint and his case left to the Presiding Elder to proceed under the law. The Presiding Elder has investigated and he found nothing of a serious nature involving the character of Brother Rogers. His character passed and his name was referred to the committee on Conference Relations for the Superannuate relation.

Question 22.—Question 22 was resumed and the names of all the preachers except the Superannuates were called and their characters passed.

Tellers Report.—The lay tellers made the report of the first ballot and J. S. M. Cannon was elected. The clerical tellers reported and C. M. Reves was elected clerical delegate. The second ballot for delegates was cast.

Introduced.—Mrs. Charles C. Selecman, wife of Bishop Selecman, Dr. W. F. Quillian, Secretary of the General Board of Education, Mr. J. D. Reynolds of Camden, Dr. J. M. Williams of Hendrix College, Rev. W. P. Whaley and Rev. E. T. Wayland, of the North Arkansas Conference, were introduced.

Tellers Report.—The clerical tellers reported that Clem Baker and J. D. Hammons had been elected delegates, and the lay tellers reported that there had been no election.

Time Extended.—A motion carried to extend the time in order to cast another ballot which should be sealed until the afternoon session.

Board of Education Report.—The Board of Education reported the nomination of the following to be additional members of the Board, they having been approved by the presiding elders, and the report was adopted: Clerical—C. J. Greene, C. M. Reves, Leland Clegg, Albea Godbold, J. E. Cooper; Lay—J. S. M. Cannon and C. E. Hayes.

Adjournment.—The Conference adjourned with the benediction by H. S. DeVore.

SECOND DAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference Opened.—The Conference met at 2:00 p. m., with Bishop Selecman presiding. The Bishop conducted devotional services, H. B. Vaught leading in prayer.

Tellers Report.—Lay tellers reported that Carl Hollis had been elected, and the clerical tellers reported that there had been no election. Another ballot was cast.

Address Conference.—Dr. W. F. Quillian, Secretary of the General Board of Christian Education, addressed the Conference.

Tellers Report.—The lay tellers reported that Fred Moore and Mrs. J. M. Stinson had been elected, and the clerical tellers reported that E. C. Rule had been elected.

Address the Conference.—Dr. C. K. Vleit, Secretary of the General Conference Commission on Benevolences, addressed the Conference, the session having been extended ten minutes to hear the address.

Alternates.—Ballots were cast for alternates and the ballots were ordered sealed until the next session.

Adjournment.—The Conference adjourned with the benediction by A. C. Millar.

THIRD DAY—THURSDAY SESSION

Conference Opened.—The Conference met at 8:30 a. m., with Bishop Selecman in the chair. The Bishop conducted devotional exercises, Rev. A. W. Martin of the North Arkansas Conference leading in prayer.

Minutes Approved.—The minutes of the two previous sessions were read, corrected and approved.

Lay Tellers Report.—The lay tellers reported the election of T. A. Prewitt, Dr. T. E. Fuller, Mrs. H. King Wade, and C. A. Overstreet, as alternate lay delegates.

Leave.—M. K. Rogers, J. F. Taylor and G. L. Cagle were granted leave of absence.

Question 20.—What traveling preachers and what local preachers have been elected elders was asked, and the members of the class of the fourth year were dealt with as follows: Louis William Averitt, not having been before the examining committee, was continued in the class of the fourth year; Alfred Isaac Doss, Charles Houston Farmer, George Gardner Meyer, and James Ralph Sewell had finished the course of study, they were recommended by their presiding elders, they made their report, and they were elected to elder's orders. Alton J. Shirey had finished the course of study, he being already an elder.

Special Prayer.—L. R. Sparks led the Conference in a special prayer for the recovery of Carl Keightley, who is a patient in the Booneville sanatorium.

Tellers Report.—The tellers reported that in the last vote there was no election. In the next vote J. W. Mann was elected and in the final vote, which was the eleventh for clerical delegates and alternates, J. D. Baker was elected clerical alternate delegate to the Uniting Conference.

Adjournment.—The Conference adjourned with prayer by Rev. Jeff Smith.

FOURTH DAY—FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Conference Opened.—The Conference convened at 8:30 a. m., with Bishop Selecman in the chair. The Bishop conducted devotional services, J. F. Taylor leading in prayer.

Minutes Approved.—The minutes of the previous session were read, corrected and approved.

Resolution.—A resolution was adopted affecting the distribution of funds for Conference claimants.

Resolution.—A resolution pledging loyalty to the administration of President Lee of Southern Methodist University was adopted.

Question No. 1.—Under question No. 1, Who are admitted on trial, Robert Owen Beck, and John Wilfred House, having met the educational requirements and having been recommended by the Committee on Admissions, were admitted.

Clinton Marion Atchley and Curtis Wendell Willams, not having met the educational requirements, but having been recommended by their presiding elders, and by the Committee on Admissions, were admitted on a two-thirds vote of the Conference.

Lay Activities.—J. S. M. Cannon presented the report of the Board of Lay Activities, and pending its adoption, Jess Morris, Lay Leader of the North Texas Conference, was introduced and discussed the work of boards of lay activities.

A motion carried that the part of the laymen's report concerning liquor and gambling be furnished to the Arkansas Gazette.

Time Extended.—A motion carried to extend the time of the session to hear Mrs. J. M. Stinson's report as President of the Conference Woman's Missionary Society, and the report of the Conference Treasurer.

Mrs. Stinson made the report of the Woman's Work, and C. E. Hayes made a summary report as Conference Treasurer.

Afternoon Session.—A motion carried that when we adjourn we adjourned to meet at 1:30 p. m.

Introduced.—The following were introduced: Dr. L. W. Nickles, Presiding Elder of the Texarkana District, Texas Conference; Dr. Snyder, pastor of the M. E. Church, Stuttgart; Rev. Monroe Vivien, pastor of First Methodist Church, Texarkana, Texas; Dr. Harry Denman, Secretary of the General Commission on Evangelism; Rev. George Boles of the St. Louis Conference, and C. C. Neal.

Leave.—W. R. Boyd was granted leave of absence for the afternoon session.

Adjournment.—The Conference adjourned with the benediction by Dr. Denman.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Conference Opened.—The Conference convened at 1:30 p. m. with Bishop Selecman in the chair. The Bishop conducted devotional services, Gaston Foote leading in prayer.

Dr. Denman Speaks.—Dr. Denman addressed the Conference at some length, and took pledges of those who would join the Fellowship of Evangelism and try to secure pledges from others.

Sustentation Fund.—Mr. J. T. Thompson, chairman of the Ministers' Sustentation Fund, spoke on the subject of better ministerial support.

C. C. Neal Speaks.—Dr. C. C. Neal spoke to the Conference and took a collection for Haygood Industrial Institute.

Introduced.—H. H. Griffin, a transfer to this Conference, was introduced.

Question 47.—Question 47, Where shall the next Conference be held, was asked. Warren, Arkansas, and Winfield Memorial, Little Rock, were nominated, and a small majority voted in favor of Warren.

Adjournment.—The Conference adjourned at 3:10 p. m.

we have given large emphasis this year to the following new lines of work:

Aldersgate Commemoration.—Our Secretary and two other members of our Board attended the Aldersgate session of the Missionary Council held in Savannah in January and each of these attended and helped to set up the Commemoration program in the several districts of our Conference. From January until Easter our entire staff gave large emphasis and much of their time to the promotion of this program. We believe that the awakened spiritual life on the part of our Church School workers has well paid us for this effort.

The Work of the Rural Church Commission.—Your Board has carried on its extension program this year in harmony with the plans and policies of the newly created Rural Church Commission. The report of our secretary reveals that he has given more than half of his time to the country churches this year. Other members of our Conference staff as well as our volunteer district officers have also given largely of their time to rural territory. The report of the Rural Church Commission has already been before you and revealed splendid accomplishments in this field.

Our Farm Tenant Problem.—In keeping with a request coming to this Board from a group of ministers at the 1937 session of the Arkansas Pastors' School, your Board has joined the Board of the North Arkansas Conference in making an intensive study of our Church's responsibility to the farm tenant in Arkansas this year. The study was begun early in January and involved twenty-five preachers. Dr. R. H. Edwards of Cornell University was employed to direct this study. After five months study, a group of fifty ministers spent two weeks at the Pastors' School in a seminar on the farm tenancy and its relation to the church. As a result of this study we are confident that much has been done to create a more sympathetic understanding of this problem and that many valuable suggestions have come to those participating in the seminar. This is one of our most acute Rural Church problems and we are attempting to face it intelligently.

Membership Increase Campaign.—In accordance with the instructions of the General Conference held in Birmingham in May your Board has joined all the other Conferences of the connection in the promotion of a campaign to increase our Church School enrollment. Our Bishop, our presiding elders, and our preachers have all entered heartily into this campaign with us. The first nineteen Conferences held throughout the church this fall showed a net increase of over 60,000 with the prospects of making it over 100,000 when all reports are in. This will be the largest increase ever recorded by any denomination in any one single year and we did not start until the year was half over. The results in our own Conference are not yet known but we have sufficient information to indicate an increase of at least 5,000. Much time and considerable money has been spent in promoting this campaign.

Youth Crusade.—In appreciation of the fact that our Conference has been honored by the election of our Executive Secretary as a member of the General Conference Commission on the Youth Crusade, our Board has set as its goal the placing of this Conference in the forefront of all Conferences in the promotion of its youth program. Plans were begun at all the summer assemblies. At Little Rock on Labor Sunday and Monday a great conference-wide rally of young people and their adult leaders was held. In all union meetings the Crusade has been kept to the front. Our Conference Director as well as our district directors of Young People's Work have been diligent in laying the foundation for the crusade in district and charge gatherings. We
