PROCEEDINGS

OPENING SESSION—WEDNESDAY EVENING

Conference Opened. The third session of the Little Rock Conference of the Methodist Church convened at Fordyce, Arkansas, at 7:30 p. m., November 12, 1941, with Bishop Charles C. Selecman in the chair. After the singing of hymn number 287, "A Charge to Keep I Have" and the repeating of the Apostles' Creed, the Bishop led in prayer. Hymn number 402, "And Are We Yet Alive," was sung. After an appropriate address the Bishop, assisted by the District Superintendents, administered the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Roll Call. The Secretary of the last Conference was asked to call the roll and a motion prevailed to call the roll by having the members of the Conference, both Ministerial and Lay, to turn in their names on a slip of paper. George G. Meyer, Frederick W. Schwendimann, C. R. Hozendorf, Eldred Blakeley, Mark F. Vaught and W. D. Golden were asked to serve as tellers in this roll call.

Secretaries Elected. Clem Baker was elected Secretary. K. L. Spore, R. E. Fawcett, R. E. Darrow and A. J. Shirey were elected assistant secretaries. S. T. Baugh was elected Editor of the Journal and Minutes. C. E. Whitten was elected Statistician. T. T. McNeal and A. W. Hamilton were elected as assistant statisticians.

Provisions for Completing Roll Call. Announcement was made that as delegates arrive they should turn in their names to R. E. Fawcett, Roll Call Secretary.

Question Number 3. Question Number 3, What preachers have died during the year—was called and the death of S. G. Rutledge, B. F. Musser and W. A. Fitzgerald was reported. It was also announced that Mrs. J. W. Harrell, Mrs. O. H. Keadle, Mrs. J. R. Diffie and Mrs. J. M. Owen, wives of preachers, had passed away during the year.

Memorial Service Announced. It was announced that the Memorial Service would be held at 9:00 a. m. on the next day and that W. C. Watson would preside.

Opening Time Set. A motion prevailed setting the morning devotional at 8:15 and the business session at 8:30. It was announced that J. M. Workman would conduct the devotional Thursday morning.

Question 1 Called. After the singing of hymn number 164, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" to the Welsh tune "Diadem," Question 1, What are the reports of the Superintendents, was called and the seven District Superintendents reported. The Bishop commented on the reports making special reference to the additions on profession of faith, the Hendrix College-Ministerial Education Special, the payment of church debts, and new churches which had been established. The Bishop also spoke to the Conference on the Christian Education Advance.

Welcome Address. Edward W. Harris, pastor host, presented the Honorable B. G. Hickey, Mayor of Fordyce, who delivered the welcome address which was responded to by C. M. Reves in behalf of the Conference.

An Order of the Day Established. An order of the day for 11:30 a. m. Thursday to consider the report of the Arkansas Methodist Commission was set.

Adjournment. After the singing of the Doxology, C. J. Greene, Secretary Emeritus, pronounced the benediction and the Conference adjourned at 10:00 p. m.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

THURSDAY—NOVEMBER 13TH

Conference Opened. After Devotional Services conducted by J. M. Workman, the Conference convened at 8:30 a. m., with the singing of hymn number 211, "Arise, My Soul, Arise" and the use of responsive reading for Palm Sunday on page 627.

Nominations. The Secretary of the Cabinet, J. E. Cooper, presented nominations for vacancies on Quadrennial Boards, Committees, and Commissions and Annual Committees. The nominations were elected.

Communications. The Secretary distributed certain communications.

Bar of the Conference. The first floor of the Sanctuary was established as the bar of the Conference.

Publishing House Representative. Bishop Pitts, representative of the Publishing House was presented to the Conference. He spoke of certain books and other matters and presented to the Treasurer of the Board of Conference Claimants, Otto W. Teague, a check for \$1,515.48 for the beneficiaries of the board.

Question 2 Called. Question 2, Are all the preachers blameless in their life and official administration, was called and the names of the retired ministers were called one by one and their characters passed.

Leave of Absence. A leave of absence to attend the funeral of his niece was granted Van W. Harrell. A motion prevailed asking the District Superintendent to grant such leaves of absence to any members of the Conference who should need to be away.

Memorial Session. W. C. Watson was called to the chair and after the singing of hymn number 525, "I Will Sing You a Song of the Beautiful Land," J. M. Workman led in prayer. The names of the ministers and ministers' wives and widows who had passed away during the year appear in the minutes of the preceding session. W. C. Watson delivered the memorial address and the hymn, "The Sweet Bye and Bye" was sung.

Laymen Who Had Passed Away. A motion prevailed to set aside one page in the Journal to record the names of prominent laymen who have died during the year.

Representing the General Board of Pensions. Dr. S. H. Babcock, representing the General Board of Pensions was presented to the Conference. He addressed the Conference.

Report No. 1 of the Board of Conference Claimants. J. M. Workman presented Report No. 1 of the Board of Conference Claimants.

Printed Program Adopted. The printed program of the Conference which had been distributed was made official.

Homes for Retired Ministers. The Bishop spoke to the Conference on the subject of retired ministers' homes. C. D. Meux, J. M. Workman and W. C. Watson also spoke on this subject.

Dr. Wm. K. Anderson. Dr. Wm. K. Anderson, Secretary of the General Commission on the Course of Study and Associate Secretary of the College Section of the General Board of Education, was presented. He addressed the Conference.

Hendrix Banquet Announced. Clem Baker announced for 6:00 p. m. a banquet for graduates, former students and friends of Hendrix College.

Question 9. Question 9, Who are retired? was called and the names of C. J. Greene, J. M. Workman, W. W. Nelson, M. K. Irvin and S. K. Burnett were presented by their District Superintendent and referred to the Committee on Conference Relations. Each of these brethren addressed the Conference as did many of their friends and brethren.

Order of the Day. The order of the day for the consideration of the Hendrix College-Ministerial Education Special having arrived, the President of the Conference Board of Education, E. Clifton Rule, was

called to the chair. The Recording Secretary of the Conference Board of Education, Kenneth L. Spore, presented Report No. 1 of the Board. E. Clifton Rule, C. M. Reves, Leland Clegg, John Hugh Reynolds, President of Hendrix College, and the Bishop spoke to the report and it was adopted.

Arkansas Methodist. The Bishop resumed the chair and the report of the Arkansas Methodist Commission was presented by C. M. Reves, chairman. E. T. Wayland, editor of the Arkansas Methodist was presented. He addressed the Conference. Gaston Foote, who had served without remuneration as editor for the past year, was asked to speak, which he did. The report was adopted.

A resolution affirming the sale by the Commission of the property at 112 East Seventh Street, Little Rock, was presented and adopted.

Dr. W. V. Cropper. Dr. W. V. Cropper, representing the General Board of Missions and Church Extension, was presented. He spoke briefly.

Adjournment. After announcements, the benediction was pronounced by James Thomas and the Conference adjourned at 12:35 p. m.

FRIDAY—NOVEMBER 14TH

Conference Opened. After devotional services conducted by C. J. Greene, the Conference opened at 8:30 a. m. Hymn number 232, "I Need Thee Every Hour," was sung and the Lord's Prayer was repeated. The Bishop spoke briefly about Kirby Page's book "Living Prayerfully."

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the preceding session were approved.

To Amend the Rules. A resolution to amend Standing Rule Number 4 with respect to entering the names of laymen who had been prominent in the sessions of the Conference and who had passed away during the year, in the Journal, was presented by S. T. Baugh and others.

A resolution to amend the Standing Rules to clarify the work of the Board of Ministerial Training was presented by A. G. Walton and others. These two resolutions were placed on the table for one day as provided for in our rules.

The Governor to Speak. A motion prevailed to request Governor Homer M. Adkins to address the Conference at 10:15.

Discontinued. Under Question 30, Who are discontinued? B. Y. Findley was discontinued.

Yong Hak Park. The Bishop announced that Yong Hak Park had been appointed to serve a mission charge among Koreans in California but that he wished to hold his membership temporarily on our rolls.

Special Appointments. The names of D. A. Weems and R. C. Rhodes were referred to the Committee on Conference Relations for consideration of their service record and pension rights.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

Claud R. Roy. Under Question 46, Who are granted Sabbatical leave, the name of Claud R. Roy was referred to the Committee on Conference Relations with a request for this relationship.

Special Appointments. The Bishop called attention to paragraph 560 in the Discipline requiring all members holding special appointments to report to the Conference Secretary, for publication in the minutes, the amounts of their salaries and other remunerations.

Orphanage Report. James Thomas, Executive Secretary and Superintendent of the Arkansas Methodist Orphanage reported. The report was adopted.

Board of Trustees. The report of the Little Rock Conference Board of Trustees was received.

Questions 26 and 27. Question 26, Who are re-admitted? and Question 27, What ministers coming on credentials from other evangelical churches are received? were asked and the answer to each was, No one.

Admitted on Trial. Question 28, Who are admitted on trial? was called and the name of Dean Mouzon Mann was presented by the Superintendent of the Camden District. His work was found to be in order and he was admitted on trial. It was announced that this event had occurred on the thirtieth anniversary of the reception of his father into the Conference and the Conference meeting in the same church.

Elders Elected. Question 34, What members have completed the studies of the fourth year? was called and answered with the names of John W. Hammons, C. Ray Hozendorf and Rufus Ford Sorrells, and they were elected to Elders Orders.

Ordination Service Set. A motion prevailed setting 11:30 Saturday morning as the time for the Ordination of Deacons and Elders. Arthur Terry and Fred G. Roebuck were appointed to prepare and sponsor the Deacons-elect. E. Clifton Rule, Gaston Foote, Roland E. Darrow and B. Frank Roebuck were appointed to prepare and sponsor the Elders-elect.

Accepted Supplies. Question 40, What accepted supply pastors are taking the course of study? was called. The report which appears elsewhere in the Journal was presented and adopted.

Conference Claimants Anniversary. J. M. Workman, President of the Board of Conference Claimants was called to the chair. Otto W. Teague, the Treasurer of the Board of Conference Claimants presented Reports No. 2 and 3 of the board and they were adopted.

Messages Received and Sent. Messages from Forney Hutchinson, who had served Fordyce as his first appointment; Bishop Ivan Lee Holt, who had been a member of the Fordyce church in his youth, were received and a motion prevailed authorizing the Secretary to respond.

Greetings from the Arkansas State Baptist Convention in session at Jonesboro were read, quoting Matthew 28:18-20. A motion prevailed instructing the Secretary to send appropriate reply.

A motion prevailed to send a message of love and appreciation to Claud R. Roy.

C. M. Reves expressed appreciation for the great place that Fordyce has had through the years in our Little Rock Conference Methodism. The Conference by unanimous vote endorsed his remarks.

Accepted Supply Pastors. Question 39, Who are the accepted supply pastors? was called. The report of the committee, which appears elsewhere in the Journal, was presented and adopted.

Clem Baker. Clem Baker, Conference Secretary, for the information of the Conference, read a list indicating the number of men probably to retire each year for the next ten years. He also announced that thirty-five young men, through our Ministerial Education program, are preparing to enter the ministry in this Conference.

M. K. Irvin. The pastor host announced that the flowers at the altar of the sanctuary had been placed there by the present pastor and members of the Nashville church in honor of M. K. Irvin, a former pastor at Nashville, retiring this year.

Education. Report No. 2 of the Board of Education was presented by Kenneth L. Spore, Recording Secretary. Clem Baker, Executive Secretary, and the Bishop spoke to the report and the report was adopted.

Dr. W. V. Cropper. Hymn number 278, "Lead On, O King Eternal," was sung and Dr. W. V. Cropper of the General Board of Missions and Church Extension addressed the Conference on the subject of "World Service." Hymn number 484, "From Greenland's Icy Mountains," was sung.

Governor Homer M. Adkins. Honorable Homer M. Adkins, Governor of Arkansas, and an active member of Asbury Methodist Church in Little Rock, was presented to the Conference. He addressed the Conference.

A resolution expressing our appreciation of and loyalty to the Governor and commending his stand on moral questions and his efforts to enforce the laws of the state particularly for the suppression of gambling, was proposed by E. Clifton Rule and others. The resolution was adopted unanimously by a standing vote.

Baptist Convention. It was announced that our message of greetings to the Baptist State Convention had been sent and that it included Romans 12:4-5.

Sam Yancey. Sam Yancey, Superintendent of the Western Methodist Assembly and President of the Arkansas Anti-Saloon League, was presented to the Conference. He addressed the Conference.

Gaston Foote. The transfer of Gaston Foote to the Alabama Conference to be stationed at First Church, Montgomery, effective at the close of this Conference, was announced.

Present to J. Wayne Mann. John W. Hammons, in behalf of the preachers of the Texarkana District, presented J. Wayne Mann, retiring District Superintendent, with an electric shaver as an expression of appreciation and love.

Adjournment. After announcements, the benediction was pronounced by Gaston Foote and the Conference adjourned at 12:35 p. m.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

Conference Opened. After devotional services conducted by J. A. Henderson the Conference opened at 8:30 a. m. Hymns number 280, "Onward Christian Soldiers"; 67, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," and 164, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name" (to the tune Diadem) were sung.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the preceding session were approved.

District Conference Journals. The Secretary announced the Committee on District Conference Journals and called a meeting for 10:00 a. m.

Next Session. Question 22, Where shall the next session of the Annual Conference be held? was called, and Homer T. Fort, pastor of First Church, Hot Springs, invited the Conference to Hot Springs for 1942. The invitation was accepted.

Lay Activities. The Board of Lay Activities reported. The report was adopted, electing J. S. M. Cannon as Conference Lay Leader.

Question 3. Question 3, Is the Annual Conference incorporated? was asked, and the answer was found to be "No."

Audits. The boards were instructed to turn in to the Conference Secretary their audit reports not later than one week following the adjournment of the Conference. The Conference Secretary was authorized to answer Question 4-B when such audit reports have been received.

W. S. C. S. Mrs. A. R. McKinney of First Church, Texarkana, Conference President of the W. S. C. S., was presented. She reported. Mrs. Jessie Hotchkiss Smith, Treasurer of the Conference W. S. C. S., and who had served in that capacity for twenty-five years, and Mrs. E. D. Galloway of DeQueen, Conference Secretary of Missionary Education of the W. S. C. S., and two District Secretaries were introduced. J. D. Hammons made mention of the many benefactions of J. F. Taylor, and the Conference stood in his honor.

Treasurer Reports. The Conference Treasurer, C. E. Hayes, filed his report.

Temperance. W. R. Burks, Secretary of the Board of Temperance, read the report of the board. C. C. Coulter, Superintendent of the State Anti-Saloon League, addressed the Conference. At the suggestion of S. T. Baugh and others, a collection was taken and divided, half to the Anti-Saloon League and half to the W. C. T. U. It was announced later that this collection had amounted to \$84.00. The report was amended to require all pastors to read it in their congregations. The report was adopted.

Goals and Objectives. C. M. Reves, Chairman of the Committee on Goals and Objectives, was called to the chair. Clem Baker, Secretary of the Committee, read the report. C. M. Reves, Clem Baker, Homer T. Fort, Arthur Terry and Bishop Selecman spoke to the report and it was adopted.

Full Membership. The Bishop resumed the chair and Question 31, Who are received into full membership? was called. Herman D. Ginther, Frederick W. Schwendimann, and Robert W. Core were received into full membership. Hymn number 249, "I Love to Tell the Story," was sung.

Christian Advocate. Dr. Roy L. Smith, Editor of the Christian Advocate, addressed the Conference.

Ordination Service. The time for the Ordination Service having arrived, Herman D. Ginther, Frederick W. Schwendimann and Robert W. Core were ordained deacons. John W. Hammons, Rufus F. Sorrells, C. Ray Hozendorf and Robert O. Beck were ordained elders, the latter having been elected to Elder's Orders under the Seminary Rule. In the Ordination Service hymn number 78, "Lead On, O King Eternal," was used. The District Superintendents, Roy L. Smith and J. D. Hammons, assisted the Bishop in the Ordination Service.

Sustentation. R. H. Cannon announced that the sustentation checks were ready.

Statistician. The Statistician filed a partial report and asked for the privilege of filing his complete report later for publication in the minutes. The request was granted.

World Service Commission. D. T. Rowe, Secretary of the Commission on World Service and Finance read the report of the Commission. The Commission was asked to furnish to each District Superintendent a copy of the report. Remarks were made by R. H. Cannon, H. D. Sadler, J. M. Workman, A. J. Shirey and Clem Baker. The report was adopted.

W. L. Arnold. W. L. Arnold, United States Army Chaplain, and a member of the Conference was asked to speak briefly. He did. The Bishop and others spoke of the service of the Army Chaplains.

Afternoon Session Set. A motion prevailed calling for an afternoon session of the Conference at 3:00 p. m.

Town and Country Work. A recommendation from the Conference Commission on Town and Country Work providing for District Commissions of Town and Country Work was adopted.

Sunday Afternoon Session. The Sunday afternoon session was set for 2:00 p. m.

Street Preaching. J. F. Taylor announced preaching on the streets for 4:30 p. m. this day and certain other members of the Conference were asked to assist him in the services.

J. D. Hammons to Preside. The Bishop requested J. D. Hammons to preside at the afternoon session.

J. L. Dedman. J. L. Dedman, formerly a member of this Conference, and District Superintendent of the Helena District in the North Arkansas Conference was introduced.

Transfers. The transfer of Albea Godbold to the Memphis Conference, William B. Slack from the Louisiana Conference, and Alfred Hendrix Freeman from the West Oklahoma Conference was announced.

Adjournment. After announcements, the benediction was pronounced by Alfred H. Freeman, and the Conference adjourned at 12:55 p. m.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

Conference Opened. The Conference opened at 3:00 p. m. with J. D. Hammons in the chair. Hymn number 23, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing," was sung. James Thomas led in prayer.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the morning session were approved.

Board Meeting Called. Charles H. Giessen, chairman, called a meeting of the Committee on Conference Relations, to convene at once.

Missions Report. O. E. Holmes, Recording Secretary, read Report No. 1 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension. J. D. Hammons spoke to the report and it was adopted.

Hospitals Report. C. D. Cade, Secretary, read the report of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. The report was adopted setting the third week in June as Golden Cross Week.

Sustentation. A. C. Carraway, Secretary, presented the report of the Commission on Ministerial Sustentation. A. C. Carraway and R. H. Cannon spoke to the report and it was adopted.

Missions Report. O. E. Holmes read Report No. 2 of the Board of Missions and Church Extension which was adopted.

History Commission. S. T. Baugh reported for the History Commission on the matter of printing the Minutes of the Conference from 1854 to 1881. The Commission was asked to give the matter further study and report next year.

Standing Rules. The resolutions calling for changes in the Standing Rules presented on yesterday were called up and adopted.

Evangelism. John L. Tucker, Secretary-Treasurer, presented the report of the Commission on Evangelism. The report was adopted.

Bible Board. W. T. Bone, Secretary, reported for the Bible Board. R. H. Cannon and J. F. Taylor spoke to the report and it was adopted.

District Conference Journals. Curtis W. Williams, Chairman, submitted the report of the Committee on District Conference Journals. The report was adopted.

Town and Country Work. George W. Warren, Secretary, presented the report of the Commission on Town and Country Work which was adopted. The Secretary of the Conference read the nominations of the Cabinet for District Commissions on Town and Country Work. They were elected.

W. W. Fincher. On recommendation of the Committee on Conference Relations, W. W. Fincher was given the supernumerary relationship.

Retired. On recommendation of the Committee on Conference Relations, C. J. Greene, J. M. Workman, W. W. Nelson and S. K. Burnett were added to the list of retired ministers.

C. R. Roy. On recommendation of the Committee on Conference Relations, the Conference requested the Bishop to give Claud R. Roy a Sabbatical year.

W. W. Fincher. On recommendation of the Committee on Conference Relations, the Conference requested the Board of Conference Claimants to give consideration to the matter of giving Brother Fincher a pension for next year from the emergency fund of that board.

In School. Question 37, Who are left without appointment to attend school? was asked and the answer given was James Edwin Wade, Dean Mouzon Mann and Louis W. Averitt.

Minute Questions. Questions 23, 41, 47 and 48 were called and the answer in each case was "None."

Editing Reports. On motion of the Conference Secretary the Conference authorized the Secretarial Staff to edit the reports of all boards for insertion in the Journal.

C. C. Neal. C. C. Neal, President of Arkansas Haygood College was introduced. He spoke to the Conference and was given the privilege of standing at the bar of the Conference to receive a collection.

Public Worship. The Committee on Public Worship announced that Gaston Foote, recently transferred to the Alabama Conference, would preach tonight and that the love feast would be held at 9:00 a. m. Sunday, and that at 11:00 o'clock Sunday Bishop Seleckman would preach at the First Methodist Church, Kenneth L. Spore would preach at the First Presbyterian Church and E. Clifton Rule would preach at the First Baptist Church.

Adjournment. J. D. Hammons pronounced the benediction and the Conference adjourned at 4:40 p. m.

SUNDAY SESSION

Conference Opened. The Conference met at 2:00 p. m. After the singing of hymn number 379, "I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord," the Bishop read a few verses from the 84th Psalm, and James Thomas led in prayer. Hymn number 338 (First Tune), "Jesus, Lover of My Soul", was sung. The Bishop spoke to the Conference on Hymnology with particular reference to the hymns of Charles Wesley. He said that pastors should select a Charles Wesley hymn at least once a month, not only for their sentimental value, but because of their theological teaching.

Pastors' Retreat. The Bishop urged that a spiritual retreat be held in each district, for the pastors, early in the year. He distributed to the pastors a questionnaire for this purpose, which had been written by Dr. J. N. R. Score and edited by the Bishop.

Parchments Presented. Ordination parchments were presented to those members of the Conference who had been ordained the preceding day.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the preceding day were approved. It was decided to authorize the Secretarial Staff to approve the minutes of the concluding session.

District Boards. The Secretary was authorized to enter District Boards and Committees in the Journal, without their being read to the Conference.

District Number and Boundaries. A motion prevailed authorizing the setting up of a committee to study the number of districts and their boundaries, and to report at the next Conference. The committee appointed was: E. Clifton Rule, S. T. Baugh, C. M. Reves, Leland Clegg, J. S. M. Cannon, C. A. Overstreet, and Clem Baker.

District Meetings Called. A meeting of the preachers of each district, with the District Superintendent, was called to meet immediately upon adjournment.

Resolutions. The report of the Resolutions Committee was read by C. Ray Hozendorf. The Bishop further expressed the appreciation of the Conference for the hospitality of Fordyce. Edward Harris, pastor host, responded in behalf of Fordyce.

Appointments Read. Hymn number 381, "The Church's One Foundation", was sung. The Bishop made some appropriate remarks stressing the idea of, "We are workers together with God". He then read the appointments of the preachers for the ensuing year.

Adjournment. After the singing of the Doxology, H. M. Fikes, newly appointed pastor at Fordyce, pronounced the benediction. The Conference finally adjourned at 3:10 p. m.

BOARD OF CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS

Report No. 1

The past year has made a marked advance in the results of the plan adopted at our Conference in Texarkana last year. Mr. Alton B. Raney, our wise Secretary, was delighted at the unanimous adoption of the plan outlined by him. Our income shows a probable increase of \$5,000.00 over last year. This will appear as very timely indeed when the men retiring this year add 236 years of service; but in spite of this your Board is able to pay \$10.00 per service year as against \$6.00 last year, with the certain retirement next year of men whose service years amount to 244 years. There will be needed an additional income to meet their needs also. This important matter was presented to the Conference Cabinet and they unanimously voted for a one per cent increase to in some degree meet the additional demand on your Conference Board. We are asking, therefore for your adoption of this one per cent increase for the Conference Year of '41-'42.

There has been carried from year to year a balance of \$348.00 left over from sale of real estate and it is earning only 2%. We ask you to allow this \$348.00 to be placed in our general fund for distribution to Claimants.

The percentage for Conference Claimants adopted by the Annual Conference for 1941-42, per pastoral charge, is as follows:

For pastoral charges paying to the pastor:

\$ 500, an amount equal to	4% of the pastor's salary
\$ 501 to \$1000, an amount equal to	5% of the pastor's salary
\$1001 to \$1500, an amount equal to	6% of the pastor's salary

We submit the Honor Roll, including superannuated preachers, widows, and orphans of deceased ministers, showing the amount allocated to each Claimant. We have adhered to the ruling of the 1940 Discipline, allocating the funds on an equity basis, giving to the widows an apportionment on the basis of 70% of that which their husbands would receive per year of service, widows' service years determined by the actual years they lived with their husbands during active ministry.

Your Board is pleased to report that the graduated scale adopted by this Conference last November for the payment of Claimants has netted \$13,727.47, as compared with the income of \$9,440.67 the year before. We are allocating this year \$10.00 per service year to the superannuate preacher.

We indicate below years of service, amount paid to Claimants by General Board, and the amount distributed by the Conference Board. The Conference Board has authorized the Treasurer, Otto W. Teague, to distribute the Conference funds November 15, 1941, and May 1, 1942, paying half of the allocation each time.

Our minimum goal was \$8,000.00, hence it will be noted that the Conference exceeded its goal.

Appreciation: We express our sincere appreciation for the great services rendered by Bishop Charles C. Selecman who gave practically the entire month of February to the Campaign; to Reverend Leland Clegg, Conference Director, for the Campaign; to all members of the Directing Committee; to District Superintendents; to all the pastors; also to the lay membership at large.

It is our understanding that the North Arkansas Conference also exceeded its goal and that Hendrix College, as a result of this addition to its current budget, was able to pay all bills and salaries 100% at the close of its fiscal year, August 1, 1941 and your Board was able to meet all obligations to Ministerial Students.

Recommendations: It is evident that the needs of both our College and our Ministerial Students will be just as great during the ensuing Conference Year as during the last year. With this in mind, the Directing Committee, the District Superintendents, and the presiding Bishop of the two Conferences, in a joint session in Little Rock, September 25, 1941 made the following recommendations which we submit to you:

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

1. That the Commission on World Service and Finance in each Conference allocate in each Conference budget an amount for Hendrix College that will provide a minimum of \$5,000 from the budget in each Conference, thus making a total of \$10,000 from this source.

2. That the Ministerial Education Fund be combined with the Hendrix College Special and the month of February be set aside by the Methodists of Arkansas for promoting and raising a minimum of \$5,000 for Hendrix College and a minimum of \$3,000 for Ministerial Education in each Conference.

3. That we request Bishop Selecman to give as much of his time in February, 1942, as he can spare to the leadership of this Campaign and that he work with the Committee to provide additional leadership in event such leadership is needed.

4. That the following: C. M. Reves, E. C. Rule, Clem Baker, R. B. Moore, Bryan Stephens, Mrs. Gordon Young, and Alton B. Raney be elected to serve with Bishop Selecman on a Joint Committee with the North Arkansas Conference, to direct this state-wide forward movement.

5. That the representatives on this committee from each Conference in separate session, select a Conference Director for each Conference whose duties and responsibilities shall be defined by the Conference Committee.

6. That as soon as possible after each Conference session the District Superintendents and Conference Committee meet for the purpose of distributing the total Conference goal to the several districts and arranging a series of District Educational Institutes to be held in each Conference before Christmas.

7. That at these District Institutes the District Superintendent, in conference with his pastors and other representatives from the churches, distribute the district goal to the several pastoral charges and at the same time make plans for the February Institutes and promotional program.

8. That the Bishop, in conference with the District Superintendents and statewide Directing Committee, arrange for a series of Hendrix College and Ministerial Education rallies to be held in the state during the first two weeks in February.

9. That the offerings be taken in local churches any Sunday in February following the district rally, with preference for the third Sunday in station churches. All churches will be expected to report not later than Monday following the fourth Sunday. All offerings for this combined Special shall be sent to C. K. Wilkerson, Treas., 723 Center Street, Little Rock, Arkansas, who will distribute receipts in accordance with the above.

10. That the Conference Commission on World Service and Finance be requested to authorize and recommend this special effort for a minimum of \$8,000.00 in its report to the Conference.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Report No. 2

Since the results of the year's work is given in the Year Book of this Board, this report is confined to our recommendations.

We recommend:

I. EDUCATIONAL ADVANCE—That first emphasis be given to the Educational Advance with a goal of establishing a Church School

in every church; 25 schools in new mission places; 20% increase in Church School enrollment; and 3,000 training credits.

That the Executive Secretary be authorized to give much of his time to the small town and rural churches in the promotion of this campaign.

II. CHILDREN'S WORK:

1. That a Coaching Conference on Vacation Church Schools be held early after Easter followed by similar group meetings in all districts with a goal of doubling the number of Vacation Schools in our Conference.

2. A Conference Camp for Children's Workers at Ferncliff.

III. YOUTH WORK:

1. The perfection of the organization of the Methodist Youth Fellowship in Conference, District, Sub-district, and local churches.

2. A determined effort to have all local churches represented in the summer assemblies.

3. An effort to secure a pledge from all Local Church Youth Organizations for the Methodist Youth Fund.

IV. ADULT WORK:

Special emphasis upon the Young Adult Fellowship with a Conference-wide Young Adult Assembly and District-wide Young Adult Fellowships wherever practical.

V. PASTORS' SCHOOL:

That a more determined effort be made to secure the attendance of all pastors at the Arkansas Pastors' School; that the District Superintendents be requested again to serve as the Enrollment Committee; and that the Conference make the same appropriation as last year.

VI. WESLEY FOUNDATION:

The continued cooperation with the North Arkansas Conference in the promotion of Wesley Foundation in all our State Schools with a request for an appropriation of \$1,000.00 for this work.

VII. TOWN AND COUNTRY COMMISSION:

That this Board, in its emphasis upon the Educational Advance, cooperate wholeheartedly with the other Disciplinary Agencies in the work of our Town and Country Commission.

VIII. SPECIAL DAYS:

That our Conference observe the following Special Days:

1. Church School Rally Day the third Sunday in April, or as near thereto as practical, with a Conference goal of \$3600.00.

2. Orphanage Sunday on December 21st with a goal of \$6000.00.

3. That the month of February be observed for Hendrix College and Ministerial Education Special and the offering taken with a goal as provided in Report No. 1.

4. That we give more emphasis to Methodist Student Day on the day to be designated by the General Board, remembering that if students in our Conference participate in this General Board Fund, our Conference must share in its promotion.

5. That more emphasis be given to the Fourth Sunday program and offering for World Service with some plan worked out whereby a monthly report on offerings can be included in the promotional material sent out by this Board.

6. The observance of Student Recognition Day in all churches during the Christmas holidays where these churches have students in College.

IX. PHILANDER SMITH COLLEGE:

That we commend Philander Smith College for negroes as one of our Methodist Institutions; that our churches open their doors to the Philander Smith singers and that an offering for Philander Smith College be taken on Race Relation Sunday.

X. SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY AT S. M. U.:

That this Conference continue its scholarship of \$400.00 at S. M. U. and that same be included in our Ministerial Education Fund.

XI. HENDRIX COLLEGE TRUSTEES:

That the following trustees be nominated for Hendrix College: Sheldon J. Rushing to succeed J. Sam Wilson as trustee at large, term expiring in 1944. Harvey C. Couch, Jr., to succeed Harvey C. Couch, Sr., deceased, trustee at large with term expiring in 1942. Alton B. Raney to succeed self as trustee at large with term expiring in 1947. Henry J. Trotter to succeed H. K. Smith as trustee at large for term expiring in 1945. Marvin Bird to succeed J. C. Johnson, North Arkansas Conference trustee, term expiring in 1947. Connor Morehead to succeed F. M. Tolleson, North Arkansas Conference trustee, term expiring in 1947. Judge J. S. Utley, Alumni trustee.

COMMISSION ON EVANGELISM

Report No. 1

Your Conference Commission on Evangelism thanks all who have helped make this year of advance possible. Each member of the Commission, District Directors of Evangelism, District Superintendents, pastors and leaders of local churches have been diligent and tireless in calling people of our Methodism to a larger vision and a more loyal devotion to the spiritual needs of a sin sick and war torn world. Our Bishop, who is chairman of the General Commission, and whom we are fortunate to have as our leader in this conference, has been the most enthusiastic among us in this great field.

A number of our commission members, district directors, and certain young men, appointed by our district superintendents, attended the

conference on evangelism at Mt. Sequoyah early in the year. Evangelism institutes were held in each district at the beginning of the year. In some districts zone evangelism institutes were conducted. Many charges have organized evangelism committees. Most all the charges, and in some cases each church of these charges, conducted revival meetings and are reporting lasting results. Some pastors organized and led their congregations in personal evangelism campaigns. Many boards of Christian education in local churches are stressing evangelism from Sunday to Sunday. Many classes of children were organized for instructions and brought into church membership. Some new preaching places have been established. We have had a total of 5485 additions to our church rolls. Of this number 2340 came on profession of faith. There were 3145 by certificate and otherwise.

Your commission desires to make the following suggestions and recommendations:

1. We recommend that Dr. Homer T. Fort be added to our commission to take the place of Dr. Gaston Foote, resigned.
2. We urge members of the commission and others to be appointed by our district superintendents to again attend our Evangelism Conference early in the year.
3. We request that our district superintendents and their district directors of evangelism lead us in district institutes at the beginning of the new conference year. Such meetings should be well planned, as many of our pastors and leaders of local charges should attend, and the entire program should be confined to evangelism needs, methods, and inspiration.
4. Every charge in the conference should be organized for and dedicated to the promotion of evangelism. Every church school should be a medium of intelligent evangelism zeal and leadership. Every teacher and class should win each of their members to Christ and church membership. Our preaching services each Sunday night in all our churches, large and small, should be evangelistic in nature, and our messages should be ablaze with Holy zeal and should call for a verdict for Christ and a complete dedication to the church. We urge that we promote outlying communities and establish preaching places where there are no services being conducted. Our station pastors should establish afternoon preaching places where opportunities present themselves. Many of our fine laymen will cooperate with us in this program if encouraged to do so.
5. Our homes must again be Christ centered. We urge our pastors to promote establishment of family altars in all our homes. Literature dealing with evangelism should be placed in the hands of our people. The Arkansas Methodist, the Upper Room, the Christian Advocate, and our church school literature will help us to promote evangelism and spiritual zeal, if we will get our people to reading. Methodism must evangelize, or die.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Your committee has every reason to believe that our Conference has profited by the goals and objectives we adopted last year. While we have made progress, we have not reached all these goals and are suggesting practically the same with such modifications as are necessary.

I. Evangelism and Church Loyalty:—

1. All Districts participating in the Area Evangelistic Campaign.
2. Revival for all churches and every possible Mission point.

3. 8% net increase in church membership.
4. All active members participating in program of church.

II. Christian Education:

1. All churches participating in February Special for Hendrix College and Ministerial Education with a minimum goal of \$8000.00.
2. Local Church Program to center around the Educational Advance with the following objectives:
 - (1) A church school in every Methodist Church and twenty-five new Mission Schools.
 - (2) Twenty per cent increase in our Church School enrollment and attendance.
 - (3) The Youth of all churches organized into the Methodist Youth Fellowship.
 - (4) Young Adult Fellowship organized wherever possible in local churches with District and Conference-wide promotion of the Young Adult Work.
 - (5) Evening services where practical at the "League Hour" to include programs for all age groups beginning with the Juniors.
 - (6) All features of Training work, including Assemblies, Pastors' Schools, Local Classes, Standard Schools, re-emphasized as part of our Educational Advance.

III. Missions and Missionary Education:

1. A Woman's Organization in each church.
2. Church Board of Missions and Church Extension functioning in each congregation.
3. Each church observing the Fourth Sunday in each month as World Service Sunday in its Church School with program and offering for this cause.

IV. Lay Activities:

1. An active Board of Lay Activities in each charge.
2. An Adult Assembly with Board of Lay Activities and Board of Education participating in each district.

V. Finances:

1. An increase in acceptances for World Service and all acceptances paid in full.
2. Paid in full by Easter except when guaranteed by monthly payment through budget.
3. Definite financial plan adopted by each church.
4. Observance of all Special Days ordered by the Conference with \$6000.000 as the goal for the Orphanage and \$3600.00 as the goal for Church School Rally Day.
5. Payments on church debts to the end that our church property be cleared of debt by the end of the quadrennium.
6. Ministers' salaries paid in full and by the month wherever possible.

VI. Fifth Sunday Institutes:

1. New emphasis upon Fifth Sunday Institutes for circuits.

VII. Christian Literature:

1. At least one subscription for the Arkansas Methodist for every seven active Church members.
2. 1000 subscriptions for the Christian Advocate.
3. An adequate supply of our Methodist Church School literature for every church.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

4. The importance of reading good books, religious periodicals, the Upper Room, etc., kept constantly before our people.

This year we have secured historical information from every minister in our Conference. This includes: date of birth; date and place uniting with the Church; when licensed to preach; date admitted on trial; each appointment, and the number years served in each place.

BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES

Your Conference Board of Lay Activities submits the following report:

We feel that progress has been made along the line of all our objectives. Continued emphasis has been placed upon Christian Stewardship and a wider participation of our laymen in all the work of the Church. We have been especially grateful for the kind and sympathetic cooperation of the District Superintendents and pastors.

As a basis for our work for the coming year we respectfully suggest the following fields of activity:

Christian Stewardship

Christian Stewardship is the vital element in all our work. It should pervade every other task. Whatever progress may be made toward all our goals will be found along the path of an effective program of Stewardship cultivation and promotion. We do not undertake to say to any one just what his proportionate share will be of the financial obligations of the Church. In this connection, however, we wish to state that in our judgment, the old and time honored system of the tithe should be set as the minimum for giving. The relation of Christian Stewardship to every phase of Christian experience should be brought home forcefully to all our members.

Layman's Day

The value of Layman's Day has been so well established by experience, that we recommend its continued observance and fix the date the last Sunday in February or as near thereto as practical. For this year the program will be along the general theme, "Methodist Men and a Mission of the Church." Suitable programs will be prepared for distribution by the General Board without cost to the Local Church.

Adequate Support of the Ministry

The attitude of the Board of Lay Activities toward this important matter is well known. We recommend that our Laymen carefully inquire into the matter of what constitutes adequate support for their pastor. There are many items that enter into the expenses necessary to the work of the pastor about which the average layman knows but little. If the Church expects the best service the minister is able to give it must give to him adequate financial aid.

Jurisdictional Council

On some date to be fixed later a Jurisdictional Council for Laymen will be held at Mt. Sequoyah. Our ablest speakers will be provided for this meeting. Matters of vital interest concerning all phases of Lay Activities will make up the program to be given. It is hoped that at least one car from each district in the Jurisdiction will bring laymen and District Superintendents to Mt. Sequoyah for this occasion.

Christian Literature

Your Board feels that in these times when so many appeals are being made, for the support and loyalties of men, the supreme obligation of the Methodist Church is to reassert the basic fundamentals of Christian faith and practice. The press and the radio are being used to the fullest extent for the promotion of special fields in behalf of selfish and unchristian movements and persons. It is, therefore, the paramount duty of Methodist laymen to fortify their own lives against the vicious appeals of paganism by utilizing the resources and facilities offered by the various agencies of our Church for the cultivation of a deeper spiritual life. In this connection, we call attention to the great value of the Arkansas Methodist. No Methodist family within the bounds of Arkansas Methodism should be without this great paper. We reiterate our conviction that no teacher or official in the Church family should be without the Christian Advocate. It should be the duty of all Church lay leaders to promote in every way possible the circulation of these two great Church papers.

Lay Speaking

More and more the able laymen of our larger churches are visualizing the opportunity they have of rendering effective service in small towns and rural communities by carrying personal messages to those areas. Laymen who are making this sacrifice of time and expense for this most worthy purpose, have found their own Christian experiences built up and strengthened. We realize that we have only made a beginning in this important work. Encouragement of laymen by District Superintendents and pastors will be of great value along this line of work.

Financial Statement

The financial statement and auditor's certificate of the Board is attached hereto and made a part of this report.

We nominate J. S. M. Cannon for Conference Lay Leader and Fred Gantt for Associate Conference Lay Leader. We report the election of Mrs. R. A. Thomas as Secretary-Treasurer of the Board for the ensuing year.

REPORT OF ARKANSAS METHODIST COMMISSION

(2) In the spring of this year, the Commission, acting through C. M. Reves, chairman, and E. T. Wayland, Secretary, consummated the sale of part of the Arkansas Methodist property at 1018 Scott Street, and with the proceeds from the sale cancelled all indebtedness on our Arkansas Methodist building.

The terms of the above sale require the two Annual Conferences to conform by resolution the action of the Commission.

(3) We wish to express our great appreciation of the monumental service which Dr. Gaston Foote has rendered this year as editor of the Arkansas Methodist without salary and we suggest that the Conference give recognition to this service by suitable resolution.

Your Orphanage, working on the plan that was outlined in its beginning, has had a successful year. During the year, we have received 9 children, have placed 10, and now have a colony of 38 children in the Home. Up through this report, we have placed approximately 600 children in good homes throughout the United States.

I am glad to say in this annual report that the finances of the Orphanage are in good condition. I am attaching hereto a financial statement, which explains itself, together with auditor's report. We have received from all sources, together with the balance brought over from last year, \$15,917.32. The expenses for the year were \$15,054.00, and we had a balance as of October 1st, 1941, of \$863.32. You will observe from this statement that we will have to borrow a little money to run on until the Christmas Offerings are taken. We believe these offerings will be greater this year than ever before in the history of our Home.

We are getting the physical property in first class order and have had considerable expense in renovating and working over much of the plant.

The Board of Trustees of the Orphanage makes the following recommendations:

Recommendations:

1. That the Little Rock Conference, if possible, increase their assessments for the incoming year. This Conference accepted \$3843.23,

and paid \$2722.00. The North Arkansas Conference accepted \$2000.00, and paid \$1266.21, last year.

2. That the Little Rock Conference, if at all satisfactory with your plans, will recommend that the Christmas Offering be taken on Sunday, December 21st, in the stations, and be started on the circuits on that Sunday and run on through until each congregation has been given an opportunity to give. We further request that you recommend that your Board of Christian Education sponsor this movement, if at all possible. This was done by the Board of Christian Education of the Little Rock Conference for the year just closing, and the Christmas Offerings amounted to \$6209.42. The Christmas Offerings from the North Arkansas Conference amounted to \$1631.00, up to October 1st, 1941, which is the end of our fiscal year. We are grateful for these liberal amounts but we need more and we wish that everyone would give.

We are increasingly convinced that if all of our brethren of the ministry would get the matter of our Home on their hearts, the endowment would begin to roll in, many people who do not have much cash to give, but who have property to dispose of would remember our Home in their wills if the matter was constantly kept before them.

We are thankful to the Little Rock Conference for your loyal support and love, and beg our people, preachers and laymen, to visit us and see what you have in this Christ-like institution.

BOARD OF TEMPERANCE

Liquor is the greatest saboteur of our common defense, the most far-reaching in its effects and the most dangerous in its results. We are unalterably opposed to the sale and use of alcoholic beverages, in training camps or adjacent territory, for they are dangerously detrimental to the physical, mental and moral fitness of our forces being trained to defend America.

Inasmuch as moral conditions in Arkansas have grown steadily worse since the legalizing of liquors, with arrests for drunkenness increasing in many places 200% and more, and

The State Legislature in 1933 and 1935 enacted three separate bills legalizing liquors and taking away the last vestige of protective laws against liquors, without the vote or voice of the people, and

Despite claims of advocates of repeal that legalizing liquors would stop bootlegging, this lawless traffic flourishes; and Arkansas bootleggers gave the nation one of its big liquor scandals in 1940;

We Recommend:

1. Our people, led by their ministers, exert themselves to have all laws concerning liquor enforced, and all violators of such laws punished; and that they pay their poll taxes and support men for the Legislature and for other public offices who will vote for and work for temperance and prohibition.

2. We cannot too strongly stress the evils surrounding our boys in the Army camps caused by and resulting from the sale of whiskey, beer, etc. These boys, away from home, and often lonely, are peculiarly susceptible to these evils.

3. We endorse and pledge our vigorous support to Bill No. S.860, introduced by the late Senator Morris Sheppard, which Bill would prohibit liquors and vice from within Army Camps and from territory surrounding them; and we particularly and earnestly urge all our Arkansas members of both the House and the Senate to vote for and work for its enactment.

4. We heartily commend, and thank, Governor Adkins for his courageous stand against liquor, gambling and other vices in the state of Arkansas, and we urge all our people to support him in this noble effort.

Education:

We recommend that each pastor and church vigorously promote a campaign of temperance education in all departments of his church, including the church school; that the District Superintendents see that a training school be held in every church on what alcohol is and what it does. That the church school superintendent urge all teachers to qualify themselves to teach the Quarterly Temperance Lesson, and that they utilize our Methodist literature and other kindred literature on the evils of beverage alcohol. That each pastor earnestly strive to establish in his church a library on the evils of beverage alcohol. That the Conference Secretary of Christian Education include in each training school a course on alcohol.

We denounce and condemn the advertising of poisonous alcoholic liquors by radio, newspapers, highway billboards, etc.

We recommend that every pastor preach on the evils of alcoholic liquors, and that he have in his pulpit representatives of temperance organizations which are credited and recognized by the Conference. We especially recommend Mr. Clyde Coulter, Superintendent of the Anti-Saloon League, and representatives of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union.

TOWN AND COUNTRY COMMISSION

In order to strengthen our Town and Country Work, your Commission recommends that all the cooperating agencies unite their efforts on three major objectives this year:

1. Adequate Financial Program for Local Churches.
2. Comprehensive Program of Evangelism and Church Loyalty.
3. The Educational Advance.

I. Financial Program

Much has been accomplished already to improve the financial program of our small churches. Much remains to be done. The Unified Budget system adopted by our Conference two years ago has proven its worth. We recommend that, led by the Board of Lay Activities, with the other agencies of the Conference co-operating, we seek to secure an adequate financial program for every small church in our Conference.

II. Evangelism and Church Loyalty

1. Evangelism

In times of dire distress, people's hearts are turned toward God. We recommend that our Conference gird itself for the most far-reaching campaign of Evangelism that we have ever attempted. Our Bishop is leading in a special Evangelistic Campaign in early spring. This will reach many of our towns but not so many of our country churches. We recommend that this Commission work with the Bishop and the Commission on Evangelism in developing plans whereby this campaign can be carried to every country church and Mission Field in our Con-

ference. Our slogan should not stop with "A Revival in Every Church" but should include a revival in every needy place.

2. Church Loyalty

While we are seeking to win new members for Christ and His Church we must not forget the large numbers of our people who belong to the Church but manifest no interest in its program. In many churches this lack of interest is due to lack of knowledge of our Methodism. Again we recommend that in every town and country church in our Conference there be put on an intensive program of Church Loyalty. This is a program in which every agency of the Conference can participate.

III. Educational Advance

One half the people living within the bounds of our Conference are attending no Church School. Our Bishop has said our chief emphasis should be upon reaching this other half. Forty-one leading Protestant denominations have united in an effort to reach fifteen million new students for our Church Schools in 1942. We recommend that we go after our share and make this the one big objective of the new year.

In carrying out this Advance we suggest:

1. That a Church School be organized in every town and country church.
2. That a survey be made to locate new prospects.
3. That Cradle Roll and Home Departments be re-emphasized.
4. That the Methodist Youth and the Young Adult Fellowship be given a large place in this enlargement program.
5. That where it is at all possible, Fellowship meetings be held in each Church at the (League) evening hour with separate programs for each age group such as: "Junior League", "Y. P. Fellowship Meetings", "Young Adult Fellowship Meetings", "Discussion Groups for Adults".
6. That new Church Schools be organized wherever an opportunity exists and that our larger churches be urged to take this as special projects.
7. That a report form for reporting Church School enrollment be supplied each pastor and that the District Superintendents call for these reports at their monthly Preachers' Meeting.
8. That these summarized reports by Districts be published monthly in the Arkansas Methodist.

IV. Other Recommendations

Looking toward the adoption of a permanent Rural Church Policy for our Conference, we further recommend:

1. That the Bishop be requested to call a joint meeting of the Town and Country Commission of the two Conferences in Arkansas as early in the year as may suit his convenience, and that representatives from Hendrix College be called into this meeting for the purpose of inaugurating a Town and Country Program in connection with our College Work.
2. That, if it can be worked out, the Rapkin plan of Inter-Change Cooperation be tried out in at least one district.
3. That we again try to secure Dr. Rapkin for a series of District Rural Church Institutes early in the year.
4. That the committee in charge of Ministerial Student Work for the summer, strive to work out even more definite plans for coordinating the services of these young men with our Conference Rural Program.

5. That we favor the plan of a full time District Rural Worker, such as is now in force in the Camden District, wherever such worker can be financed.

6. That at this session of the Conference a District Town and Country Commission Auxiliary to the Conference Commission be elected for each district upon nomination of the District Superintendent—the District Superintendents to be a member of this Commission.

That each District Commission be authorized to study the possibilities and needs of Rural Work and initiate Rural work projects within its district; that each District Commission report to the Conference Commission at least a month before the next session of this Conference in order that the Conference Commission may have the benefit of these District reports in making its next Annual report to the Conference.

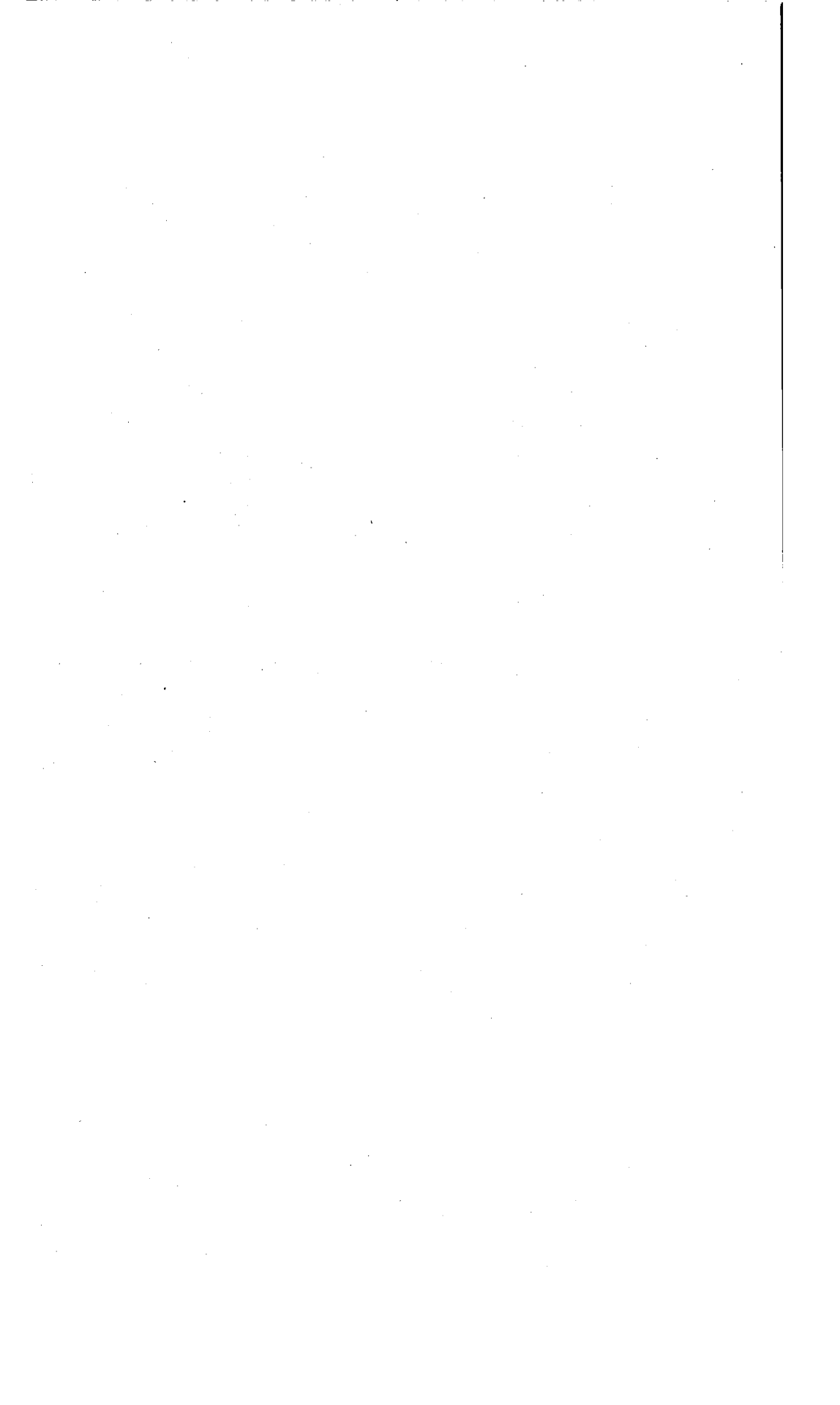

PLAN FOR MINISTERIAL SUSTENTATION FUND

We, your Commission on Ministerial Sustentation, submit the following as the amended plan for the incoming year:

I. Commission

1. On nomination of the Superintendent of each of the several districts the Annual Conference shall elect quadrennially one lay member from his district and one preacher to serve on this Commission. The District Superintendents shall be ex-officio members.

2. The Commission shall elect its own chairman and such other officers as its needs may require.

3. The Commission shall meet annually at least one month before Conference at the call of the chairman, and at such other times and places as need may require.

II. Beneficiaries

1. Beneficiaries under this plan shall be divided into two groups, such grouping being determined by the relation to the Conference sustained by each, as follows: (a) Members of the Conference and those duly admitted on trial and serving under appointment from the Bishop; (b) Supply preachers who meet all disciplinary requirements for supplies.

2. The minimum salary fixed for each group, respectively, shall be \$1,000.00 and \$800.00. The Commission will match dollar for dollar as far as its funds permit, any increase paid by any charge over and above the average paid by such charge for the three fiscal years ended in 1939, 1940 and 1941, up to the minimum fixed for the group to which the pastor belongs.

III. Raising Funds

1. For the purpose of meeting the requirements set forth in the preceding paragraph, an apportionment of 1% shall be made on all preachers' salaries of \$1,000.00 or more, upon the whole salary and upon all charges paying such salaries.

2. The treasurer elected by the Commission shall be the one to receive and disburse funds accruing from this source, provided, funds shall be paid out only on certification of the District Superintendent of the beneficiary.

3. District Superintendents shall report to the Commission the names of beneficiaries and the amount of aid given. The Treasurer shall keep an itemized account of the benefits paid out and report same to the chairman of this Commission as soon after the session of the Annual Conference as possible.

4. Any part of this plan may be amended at any session of the Conference on recommendation of the Commission, or on motion from the floor of the Conference.

Memoirs

REV. W. A. FITZGERALD

Rev. William A. Fitzgerald was born Oct. 10, 1851 at Dalton, Ga., and passed to his eternal life at his home in Amity, Arkansas, on July 28, 1941, at 5 o'clock in the afternoon at the age of 89 years, 11 months and 18 days.

When a young man he was converted and after a few years later he entered the ministry, joining the Mound Prairie Presbytery in 1888, and was truly a pioneer preacher. He suffered many hardships and privations. Traveling was very difficult in those days because there were no roads, and horse-back was the principal mode of travel. Many times in his travels when he would be so weary, and discouraged he would stop and tie his horse by the side of the road, and get down on his knees and pray for strength and courage.

Then in 1897 he joined the Methodist Episcopal Church and Conference, and served as pastor of the Amity Circuit until 1900 when he was sent to Beebe, Arkansas.

In 1902 he received his commission as Missionary of the American Sunday School Union and for 20 years he gave faithful and loyal labor to the people of Southwest Arkansas, when in 1914 his health necessitated his retirement from active duty.

William A. Fitzgerald has not only been a faithful soldier of the Cross, but he also served under the flag of his country during the Indian Wars.

He enlisted at Louisville, Ky., in 1873 and was a Corporal in Co. "B" of the 6th Regiment of Cavalry. Served for 5 years when he was honorably discharged from the service in 1878.

In 1879 he came to Hot Springs, Arkansas, where he met Miss Louise J. Dillard. He wooed and won her, and on Sept. 11, 1879, she became his life companion and this happy union continued for nearly 62 years. There were nine children born to this union of whom seven children and his faithful wife survive him.

The family altar was established 60 years ago and has stood through all the years. His sweet resignation to the will of God will remain a blessed memory to all who visited him. He said, "I am ready and anxious to be with Christ. I have done the best I could."

BENJAMIN FRANKLIN MUSSER

Benjamin Franklin Musser was born at Center Point, Howard County, Arkansas, on Jan. 17, 1884. He was killed in an automobile accident near El Dorado on Nov. 15, 1940, during the last session of annual conference. On June 26, 1918, he was married to Miss Elizabeth Long of Atlanta, Georgia, who with three children survive him. The oldest son, Ben, is a ministerial student doing graduate work at Duke University; Sarah and James are with their mother in Savannah, Georgia.

Frank, as he was familiarly known, was graduated from Hendrix College in the spring of 1916 and was admitted on trial into the Little Rock Conference in the fall of the same year. Upon the entrance of his country into the World War, Frank volunteered his services and became a Chaplain with the rank of a First Lieutenant. He was assigned to transport duty and made twelve trips across the Atlantic during that struggle.

His service in this conference included the following appointments: Bauxite Ct.; Capitol View, Little Rock; Stuttgart; McGehee; Stamps; Rison; Forrest Park, Little Rock; Grady-Gould; Lewisville-Bradley; Ashdown; Sherrill-Tucker and Bearden.

Many sweet and tender memories come trooping home as I attempt to pay a tribute to my departed friend. He was my pastor when I was licensed to preach and later I was his Presiding Elder for three years. In those intimate years there are thousands of golden moments in which we shared the best in life and even death has not robbed either of us.

Frank Musser was endowed by nature with a wonderful physique, tall, black-haired and handsome. He possessed a ready wit which was above the plane of sarcasm. The scenes of his boyhood made a deep impression upon his life and his mind was filled with folk-lore stories and experiences in which he made the characters of his day live again. In humor, pathos and song his character impersonations made him an entertainer often sought for great occasions and even in smaller groups of his friends. His hearty laugh will always ring in the ears of those who enjoyed his presence.

Frank could have become wealthy in the mechanic's art or upon the stage but in early life he became a Christian and in young manhood yielded to the call to preach. He set out to prepare himself for his life's work but his education came after long years of hardship and struggle. It was with a blacksmith's sledge that he was able to beat down the barrier that separated him from what his heart hungered for him to be. His dogged determination and genial spirit finally won the victory. Frank was a democrat and a lover of justice and mercy. Wherever he served the most obscure member of his church or any child could approach him with absolute freedom. He had been known to give his last dollar to one in need. He was a great Bible student and a clear thinker which made him a forceful preacher. His dignity and commanding appearance in the pulpit drew people to him.

The funeral services were held at the Methodist Church at Bearden on Monday morning, November 18, 1940, in charge of the Rev. Leland Clegg, Dist. Supt. of the Camden District, assisted by Rev. J. L. Hoover of Camden; Rev. Edward W. Harris of Fordyce and the writer. Burial was at Pinecrest Memorial Park near Little Rock.

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. **Nominations.** The District Superintendents shall be a standing committee on nominations and shall nominate all members of the quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees except where they are otherwise provided for.

2. **Conference Program.** The pastor-host of the Conference, the District Superintendent in whose district the Conference session is held, the chairman of the Commission on Evangelism and the chairmen of the several Conference Boards shall constitute a committee on Conference Program. This committee shall arrange, not less than sixty days before the Conference meets, for all preaching, inspirational and anniversary services and select the Conference preacher. As far as possible it shall publish at least one month before Conference, the hours to be set apart for special services. The program made by this committee shall be subject to revision as the exigencies of any situation may require or the Conference direct.

3. **Financial and Statistical.** (1) All Conference assessments and all reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars with no columns for cents. (2) Each pastor shall settle with the Conference Treasurer and turn over his statistical reports not later than the first day of the Conference, provided this report must correspond with the Treasurer's report. (3) The District Superintendent shall furnish the Statistical Secretary with all assessments on pastoral charges not less than sixty days before the Annual Conference meets.

4. **Memoirs of Laymen and Preachers' Wives.** Memoirs of preachers' wives shall be read at the Memorial Service of the Conference and published in the Conference Journal, and preachers' wives shall be invited to take part in the Memorial Session. Names of deceased laymen who have been active in the Annual Conference or served on Conference Boards to be printed in the Conference Journal.

5. **Conference Expense Fund.** The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall make an assessment for a Conference Expense Fund to cover the cost of all clerical work necessary in preparing Conference records, printing, and distributing the Conference minutes, for preserving Conference records and documents, for auditing accounts, and all legitimate expenses incurred by the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer in carrying out the orders of the Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of this fund which shall be paid out on the order of the Conference Secretary.

6. **District Superintendents' Salary.** In each district the District Superintendent's salary shall be estimated and apportioned to the several charges by the District Stewards under the chairmanship of the District Superintendent in a meeting called for that purpose early in the Conference year.

7. **District Expenses.** The District Stewards shall also estimate and apportion to the several charges an amount necessary for district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a Treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and shall distribute same on order of the District Superintendent. The Treasurer shall make an annual report to the District Conference showing receipts and disbursements.

8. **Reports and Resolutions.** All reports, resolutions and other papers intended for publication in the Conference minutes shall be typewritten and in triplicate.

9. **History Commission.** There shall be a self perpetuating History Commission composed of eight clerical members of the Conference, one of whom shall be the Secretary of the Conference, whose duty it shall be to collect and preserve biographical data of clerical members of the Conference, data of all kinds that promises to be of historical value and interest, the Conference records and other documents of historical value, all such material to be deposited in the Hendrix College vault. The Commission shall make a quadrennial report to the Conference at the session next following the General Conference.

10. **Lay Representation.** In addition to those members provided for in Paragraph 542 of the 1939 Discipline of the Methodist Church, each pastoral charge shall, upon nomination of the pastor, elect either at the annual meeting or at the Quarterly Conference, one representative to the District Conference; provided, that in charges of more than 500 members, one representative shall be for each additional 500 members or major fraction thereof. Alternate lay delegates shall be elected in the same manner as the principal.

11. **Lay Delegates.** Lay delegates to the annual conference shall be elected annually.

12. **District Conferences** shall be held annually in each district.

13. One District Superintendent may serve on each of the major Conference Boards. No member of the Conference shall serve on more than one major Board, provided that this rule shall not apply to those Boards and Commissions appointed by the presiding Bishop, nor to ex-officio members.

14. **District Committees on Qualifications of Local Preachers.** The District Committee on qualifications of local preachers to be nominated by the District Superintendents and confirmed by the Annual Conference shall consist of three traveling elders serving on the District.

15. The Course of Study for License to Preach must be taken through the Correspondence School, or a Standard Pastors' School.

16. The audit of accounts of all funds as provided for in Paragraph 801 of the Discipline shall be done by certified public accountants sufficiently in advance of the Conference session to have its report published in the Conference Journal.

17. **Amendment.** These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.
