PROCEEDINGS

OPENING SESSION—WEDNESDAY EVENING

Conference Opened. The fourth session of the Little Rock Conference of the Methodist Church (which was the eighty ninth session since the organization of the Conference in the former M. E. Church, South) convened at the First Methodist Church in Hot Springs at 7:30 p. m. Wednesday, November 11, 1942, with Bishop Charles C. Selecman presiding. Hymn No. 287, "A Charge To Keep I Have" and hymn No. 402, "And Are We Yet Alive" were sung, the Apostle's Creed was repeated and Dr. E. B. Hawk, Dean of the School of Theology of Southern Methodist University, led in prayer. The choir of First Church presented a special musical number. The responsive reading entitled, "Church Anniversary," page 601 and the second reading on page 602, were read and the "Gloria Patri" was used. Hymn No. 256, "Faith Of Our Fathers," was sung. Dr. W. Angie Smith, pastor First Methodist Church, Dallas, Texas, preached. His subject was "The Divine Call to Service." Hymn No. 268, "Are Ye Able," was sung. At this point the Bishop with appropriate remarks declared this session of the Conference duly opened.

Roll Call and Organization. After Roll Call the Conference was organized with the election of Clem Baker as Secretary, Roy E. Faucett as Assistant Secretary, Kenneth L. Spore, Journal Clerk, S. T. Baugh, Editor of the Journal, C. R. Roy and Roland E. Darrow, Staff Assistants, C. E. Whitten, Statistician, and T. T. McNeal and A. W. Hamilton, Assistant Statisticians. Mark Vaught, W. D. Golden, C. Ray Hozendorf, Hal H. Pinnell and George G. Meyer were elected tellers.

Cabinet Nominations. The Secretary of the Cabinet, J. E. Cooper, presented the nominations of the cabinet for vacancies on Quadrennial Boards and the nominations for annual committees. The Bishop nominated the Investigating Committee. All these who were thus nominated were elected.

Referred For Retirement. The Districts were called and the Superintendents asked that the following be referred for the retired relationship: W. C. Watson, J. F. Taylor, J. A. Henderson, James Thomas, L. E. N. Hundley, M. O. Barnett and J. C. Williams. They were referred.

For Admission On Trial. The Districts were called and the Superintendents recommended: Joe H. Robinson, Orrie L. Thompson, Gerry Clyde Dean and W. S. Cazort. They were referred to the Committee on Conference Relations.

Program Adopted. J. E. Cooper presented a printed program which was adopted, setting several special orders. The Ordination Service was set for 11:30 a. m. Friday. The admission of the class on trial and into full connection was set for Friday a. m., immediately following the devotional.

John C. Johnson. The name of John C. Johnson, a young minister, who had met a tragic death in an automobile accident in June, although not a member of the Conference, was referred to the Committee on Memoirs.

The Conference Adjourned. The Conference adjourned with prayer and the benediction by W. C. Watson, at 9:30 p. m.

THURSDAY—NOVEMBER 12TH

The Conference convened at 8:45 a. m., with Bishop Selecman in the chair. Hymn No. 245, "O, Sometimes the Shadows Are Deep" and hymn No. 267, "Rise Up, O Men of God," were sung, J. E. Cooper lead-

ing. The second reading on page 574 was used and John L. Hoover led in prayer. Hymn No. 280, "Onward Christian Soldiers," was sung.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the preceding session were approved and the Secretarial Staff were asked to approve the minutes of succeeding sessions.

Flowers for T. O. Rorie. A beautiful basket of flowers, in memory of T. O. Rorie, Sr., who had passed away during the year, were placed in the altar by Leland Clegg, acting for Mrs. Claud Phillips, a daughter of the deceased.

Bar of Conference. The bar of the Conference was set.

District Superintendent Reports. J. E. Cooper, Superintendent of the Arkadelphia District reported.

Memorial Service. The order of the day for the Memorial Service having arrived, the Bishop asked W. C. Watson, Chairman of the Committee on Memoirs to preside. Hymn No. 514, "Lead, Kindly Light," and hymn No. 521, "It Singeth Low in Every Heart," were sung and Bishop Selecman led in prayer. It was announced that T. O. Rorie, Sr., and Z. D. Lindsay, retired ministers; R. P. James, an active minister; Mrs. R. O. Beck, wife of an active member of the Conference, and Mrs. S. A. Hill and Mrs. Horace Jewell, widows of deceased members of the Conference had passed away during the year. It was announced that John C. Johnson and J. D. Sorrells, local preachers, had passed away during the year. W. C. Watson, after appropriate remarks, concerning T. O. Rorie and Mrs. Horace Jewell, introduced John L. Hoover, who delivered the memorial address. The hymn, "Sweet Bye and Bye," was sung.

Publishing House. The Bishop resumed the chair and presented Mr. Lovick Pierce, Manager of the Methodist Publishing House, Dallas, Texas, who spoke briefly and presented to the President of the Conference a check for \$1,396.02, for the retired ministers fund. This was our share of the Publishing House profits for the preceding year.

E. B. Hawk. Dr. E. B. Hawk, Dean of the School of Theology of Southern Methodist University, addressed the Conference.

Hendrix Dinner. Fred R. Harrison announced that the dinner for graduates, former students and friends of Hendrix College would be held at the Como Hotel at 6:00 p. m.

Address of Welcome. The pastor host presented Colonel Martin A. Easley of First Church, who delivered an address of welcome. Kenneth L. Spore, in behalf of the Conference and at the request of the Bishop, responded. The Bishop also responded.

John McCormack. The transfer from the North Arkansas Conference of John McCormack was announced. He was introduced.

Visitors. Dr. Alfred E. Moore, Nashville, Tennessee, representative of the General Board of Education, Dr. Burnell L. Schubel, St. Louis, assistant secretary of the General Board of Pensions, E. W. Martin, Conway, Lay Leader of the North Arkansas Conference and Business Manager of Hendrix College, H. M. Lewis, pastor at Batesville, J. L. Dedman, Superintendent of the Helena District, H. H. Griffin, Superintendent of the Searcy District, and E. T. Wayland, Editor of the Arkansas Methodist, were introduced.

Educational Advance. Clem Baker read the report of the Board of Education on The Educational Advance. E. Clifton Rule, President of the Board of Education, led the discussion. Alfred H. Freeman, W. Neill Hart, E. Clifton Rule, Clem Baker and the Bishop addressed the Conference in behalf of the Advance and the report was adopted.

Edward W. Harris. The transfer of Edward W. Harris to the North Arkansas Conference was announced. He was presented to the Conference.

Valuable Records. S. T. Baugh, a member of the History Commission, spoke of the loss of certain valuable old church records in the recent parsonage fire at Dalark. He urged that other such valuable records in the Conference should be deposited with the History Commission and preserved in the fire proof vaults at Hendrix College.

Reports of District Superintendents Resumed. Leland Clegg, Superintendent of the Camden District, and C. M. Reves, Superintendent of the Little Rock District, reported.

Anderson's History. J. M. Workman, representing James A. Anderson, asked that the preachers who owe Dr. Anderson for copies of his history purchased at the Conference two years ago, pay for them.

Chaplain Sewell. Chaplain Ralph A. Sewell, a member of the Conference, was asked to speak. He did so. A message from Chaplain A. C. Carraway was read.

The Fellowship of Suffering and Service. Bishop Selecman urged upon all our churches the observance of the Fellowship of Suffering and Service offering, pointing out that two-thirds of all our offerings at all communion services should be given to this fund, which embraces Overseas Relief and Camp Service. Messages from Bishop Welch and Bishop Leonard, who head up these causes in the general church, were read.

Executive Session. An Executive Session of the Conference for the purpose of attending to all matters of ministerial character was ordered to be held at the Central Baptist Church at 2:00 p. m. Friday.

Dr. Alfred E. Moore. Dr. Alfred E. Moore, representing the General Board of Education, addressed the Conference.

Dr. B. L. Schubel. representing the General Board of Pensions addressed the Conference.

J. T. McClure. Dr. J. T. McClure of the East Oklahoma Conference was introduced.

Conference Adjourned. After announcements, the Conference adjourned at 12:45 p. m. with prayer by J. F. Taylor.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Conference Opened. The Conference convened at 8:45 a. m. with Bishop Selecman in the chair. Hymn No. 209, "Amazing Grace," and hymn No. 232, "I Need Thee Every Hour," were sung. The responsive reading was the first reading on page 599. E. T. Wayland led in prayer. Hymn No. 354, "Peace, Perfect Peace," was used.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the preceding session were approved.

Temperance. An order of the day to consider the report of the Committee on Temperance was set for 11:00 a. m. Saturday, to consume thirty minutes.

Goals and Objectives. An order of the day to consider the report of the Committee on Goals and Objectives was set for 10:30 a. m. Saturday.

Arkansas Methodist. C. M. Reves presented the report of the Arkansas Methodist Commission. C. M. Reves, E. T. Wayland, R. H. Cannon and others spoke to the report and it was adopted. Mrs. E. T. Wayland was introduced to the Conference.

Mrs. Charles C. Selecman. The pastor host presented Mrs. Charles C. Selecman to the Conference. The Conference invited her to take a seat on the platform but she smilingly declined.

Town and Country Commission. George W. Warren, Secretary, presented the report of the Town and Country Commission. Clem Baker spoke to the report and it was adopted.

Full Connection. Eldred Blakeley, W. D. Golden, Richard T. Perry, Mark Vaught and Harold O. Eggensperger were received into full connection.

Roll Call Completed. All members of the Conference who had not reported their presence at the opening session were asked to do so at once.

Fincher and Stonecipher. The Superintendent of the Camden District, Leland Clegg, presented W. W. Fincher and A. N. Stonecipher for the supernumerary relationship. They were referred to the Committee on Conference Relations.

Conference Claimants. Alton B. Raney, Secretary, presented Report No. 1 of the Board of Conference Claimants. S. T. Baugh and Otto Teague spoke to the report and it was adopted.

Orphanage. James Thomas, Superintendent, presented the report of the Arkansas Methodist Orphanage. He spoke to the report and it was adopted.

On Trial. W. S. Cazort, Joseph H. Robinson, Gerald Clyde Dean and Orrie L. Thompson were admitted on trial.

Deacons. Harold O. Eggensperger, W. D. Golden, Eldred Blakeley and D. Mouzon Mann were elected and ordained Deacons.

Elders. Clinton M. Atchley, Mark Vaught, Curtis W. Williams and Richard T. Perry were elected and ordained Elders, the District Superintendents assisting the Bishop in the ordination.

D. Mouzon Mann. D. Mouzon Mann was elected Elder contingent upon his appointment as a Chaplain in the United States Army to be ordained if and when such appointment is apparent. This action was taken, under proper recommendation and in keeping with Pars. 258 and 266 of the Discipline.

Executive Session. An Executive session to consider questions of ministerial character and standing was announced for 2:00 p. m., to be held at the Central Baptist Church.

Introductions. Chaplain Gravely, Upper South Carolina Conference; Chaplain Grey, North Georgia Conference; A. W. Martin, pastor First Church, Jonesboro; Warren Johnston, pastor First Church, Fort Worth, Texas; L. M. Starkey, pastor of Central Church, Fayetteville; R. S. Hayden, District Superintendent, Conway District; Sam M. Yancey, Superintendent of the Western Methodist Assembly and President of the Arkansas Anti-Saloon League; Glenn Sanford, Extension Secretary, North Arkansas Conference; and Matt L. Ellis, President of Henderson State Teachers College were introduced.

Conference Adjourned. After announcements, the Conference adjourned at 12:45 p. m. with prayer by Sam M. Yancey.

AFTERNOON SESSION—FRIDAY

Conference Opened. Pursuant to order the Conference convened in executive session at the Central Baptist Church at 2:00 p. m., with the Bishop in the chair. The hymn, "Come Thou, Almighty King," was sung. William B. Slack led in prayer. "Blest Be The Tie That Binds" was sung.

Characters Passed. The question, Are all the members blameless in their life and official administration? was called. The names of the effective members were called one by one, by districts, and their characters passed, with the exception of that of H. M. Fikes.

H. M. Fikes. Leland Clegg announced that H. M. Fikes had withdrawn under complaints, filing a signed statement to that effect. Leland Clegg moved that the name of H. M. Fikes be recorded in the Journal as having withdrawn under complaint. C. M. Reves seconded the motion and it was adopted. A motion prevailed that we proceed by all legitimate means to obtain his credentials, and the Secretary of the Conference was instructed to inform the military draft authorities that H. M. Fikes is no longer a minister.

W. Roy Jordan. Leland Clegg, Superintendent of the Camden District, presented W. Roy Jordan's request for a year of Sabbatical leave. It was announced that he at present was working for the Missouri Pacific Railroad, but that his application for a Chaplaincy in the United States Army was pending, upon which favorable action early in the new year was expected. Reves moved that Gerald Clyde Dean be elected Deacon and Elder, under Paragraphs 258 and 266 in the Discipline, contingent upon his acceptance as a Chaplain in the United States Army. The Committee on Conference Relations concurred in the recommendations and the motion prevailed.

Amendment to Standing Rules. J. E. Cooper, Secretary of the Cabinet, moved an amendment to Section 3, Paragraph 3, in the Standing Rules of the Conference. The motion was placed on the table for one day as required.

Amendment to Standing Rules. J. E. Cooper, Secretary of the Cabinet, moved to rescind Paragraph 15 of the Standing Rules. The motion was duly seconded and placed on the table for one day as required by Paragraph 17 of the Standing Rules.

Conference Closed. After announcements the Conference adjourned at 4:00 p. m. with prayer by James Thomas.

SATURDAY MORNING

Conference Opened. The Conference opened at 8:45 a. m. with the Bishop in the chair. Hymn No. 244, "Am I A Soldier of the Cross," and hymn No. 279, "God of Grace and God of Glory," were sung. The first reading on page 573 was used and F. G. Roebuck led in prayer. Hymn No. 67, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," was sung.

Minutes Approved. The minutes of the preceding session were approved.

Petition. A petition from J. F. Taylor and others concerning dancing in Hendrix College was presented and referred to the Board of Trustees of Hendrix College.

Philander Smith College. The Bishop presented a communication from Philander Smith College and commended the work of that institution under the presidency of Dr. M. Lafayette Harris.

Amendments. Proposed Constitutional Amendments Number 1 and Number 2 were presented and approved by a vote of the Conference 123 to 0 and 122 to 0, respectively.

District Superintendents. The reports of the District Superintendents were resumed and Arthur Terry, Monticello District, and J. D. Baker, Prescott District, reported.

Appreciation of J. D. Baker. S. T. Baugh, in behalf of the preachers of the Prescott District, presented a token of appreciation to J. D. Baker, concluding his sixth year as Presiding Elder and District Superintendent of the Prescott District.

Treasurer—C. E. Hayes, Conference Treasurer, reported.

World Service. This report was adopted. An offering of \$82.52 was taken for the Anti-Saloon League.

Appointments Broadcast. It was announced that KTHS would broadcast the appointments at 8:00 p. m. Sunday.

T. Otto Nall. T. Otto Nall, representing the Christian Advocate, addressed the Conference.

1943 Meeting. On invitation of First Church El Dorado, the Conference voted unanimously to hold its 1943 session in El Dorado.

Afternoon Session Ordered. A session for 1:30 p. m. was ordered.

Conference Adjourned. After announcements the Conference adjourned with prayer by J. D. Baker.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON

Conference Opened. The Conference convened pursuant to order at 1:30 p. m., with the Bishop in the chair. Hymn No. 242, "He Leadeth Me," was sung.

Accepted Supplies Service Record. Clem Baker presented a resolution respecting the inclusion in the 1943 Journal, a Service Record for Accepted Supply Pastors. The resolution was adopted.

Journal Published Price. The Secretary presented a resolution providing a published price of fifty cents for our Conference Journal. The resolution was adopted.

Ministerial Training. Charles H. Giessen, Registrar, presented the report of the Board of Ministerial Training respecting Accepted Supply Pastors. The report was adopted.

Accepted Supply Pastors. The Committee on Accepted Supply Pastors reported and the report was adopted.

Board of Ministerial Training. The Board of Ministerial Training reported respecting the Course of Study of undergraduates.

W. S. C. S. Mrs. A. R. McKinney, President, filed the report of the Conference W. S. C. S.

Payments have increased which help your Board to meet the increased demands by retirement of men who have served long and well. Seven men retiring at this session of the Conference have a service record of 317 years.

Your Board has carefully considered the needs of our Claimants for this year, and also for the future, looking forward to the not distant future when this Conference will provide for these noble veterans a support more worthy of a great church.

Thanks to your more generous provision this past year, your Board will be able to pay our Claimants this year \$10.00 per service year. This is far below their needs, and below what this great Conference will eventually provide.

Your Board therefore most respectfully requests this Conference to accept a one per cent increase in all brackets in the apportionment for Conference Claimants over that of last year. These percentages are as follows:

For pastoral charges paying to the pastor:

\$ 500, an amount equal to	5% of the pastor's salary
\$ 501 to \$1,000, an amount equal to	6% of the pastor's salary
\$1,001 to \$1,500, an amount equal to	7% of the pastor's salary
\$1,501 to \$2,000, an amount equal to	8% of the pastor's salary
\$2,001 to \$2,500, an amount equal to	9% of the pastor's salary
\$2,501 to \$3,000, an amount equal to	10% of the pastor's salary
\$3,001 to \$3,500, an amount equal to	11% of the pastor's salary
\$3,501 and up, an amount equal to	12% of the pastor's salary

BOARD OF CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS

Report No. 3

We submit the Honor Roll, including superannuated preachers, widows and orphans of deceased ministers, showing the amount allocated to each Claimant. We have adhered to the ruling of the 1940 Discipline, allocating the funds on an equity basis, giving to the widows an apportionment on the basis of 70% of that which their husbands would receive per year of service, widows' service years determined by the actual years they lived with their husbands during active ministry.

Your Board is pleased to report that the graduated scale adopted by this Conference and raised by one per cent last year has netted an increase to Claimants above \$3,500.00. There are seven ministers retiring this year with total service years of 317. Even in face of this increase your Board is in position to pay the same per service year as of last year. Allocating to the preachers \$10.00 per year of service and to the widows \$7.00 per year of service.

We indicate below years of service, amount paid to Claimant by General Board, and the amount distributed by the Conference Board. The Conference Board has authorized the Treasurer, Otto W. Teague, to distribute the Conference Funds November 10, 1942, and April 10, 1943, paying half of the allocation at each time.

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION

Report No. 1

The Education Advance

Your Board of Education consider the Education Advance, the most important single item in our program for another year and, therefore, has asked for this Special Order of the Day to give it first place in our thinking and plans for the new Conference year. The Little Rock Conference along with the other Conferences in the Oklahoma City Area are especially fortunate in the leadership being given to and the emphasis being placed upon the Advance by our Bishop and our District Superintendents. We note with pride that practically every Bishop in the Church and a large number of the annual Conference have asked for copies of our poster and other promotional literature being used in this area and that many of these Conferences have been inspired to promote the Advance along the same lines initiated by this area. Your Board especially appreciates the whole hearted support being given by each of our District Superintendents and by practically every pastor in the Conference. Final statistics on Church School enrollment are not yet available but preliminary reports indicate that several districts will show an encouraging increase in enrollment in our Church Schools. The total increase for our Conference will possibly not be as large as we had hoped due in part to the dislocation of our people on account of war enterprises and in part to a more nearly perfect record of what our

actual enrollment for the year has been. We are encouraged to believe that reports that will be given at this Conference will come more nearly revealing the actual Church School enrollment for this Conference year than have any reports ever before made to our Conference. This is largely due to the monthly reports requested by our Bishops and followed so splendidly by our District Superintendents and pastors.

Three Phases: The Advance comprehends three phases—Christian Education in the Home; Community Cooperation; Reaching the Unreached for Church and Church School.

Opportune Time: There was never a more opportune time for the Advance along all the above lines. Fifty million people are yet unreached. The hearts of people are hungry for God; ministers and laymen, left at home, are seeking an avenue to match the sacrificial service being rendered by our boys in service; Protestantism is united. If we do not do this job now, we never will. The Genius of Methodism is its passion for the lost. No matter how much money we raise, how many buildings we erect, how splendid the reports are along other lines, if we lose this passion—Methodism is doomed.

Recommendations—For the promotion of the Advance in our Conference this year we make the following recommendations:

1. That it be a united effort within the Conference, the District and the Local Church with all agencies within these groups participating.

2. In order to unify the efforts within the Conference we recommend that the Advisory Committee of the Town and Country Commission which represents all Conference Agencies be requested to give Conference direction to this movement.

3. That the district program be promoted by the District Superintendent and his enlarged district staff.

4. That in the local church the pastor organize a unifying group and wherever necessary set up a special promotional agency for the Campaign.

5. That the Conference set a 20 per cent increase over the total enrollment reported this year as its goal for the new Conference year, this goal to go down to the districts and local churches with the suggestion that this goal be increased in districts and local churches where practical.

6. That immediately after Conference each pastor and local church school superintendent be urged to determine the actual enrollment in each Church School the first Sunday of the new Conference year and that accurate records be kept of new enrollments until next Conference so that a correct and complete report of enrollment will be available for the next Conference session.

7. That we continue the use of the monthly report card provided by our Bishop for same. That there be a Church School organized in each Methodist Church in the Conference with mission schools wherever possible.

8. We recommend again that churches in our larger towns and cities be urged to look carefully into the responsibility of sponsoring mission schools within their communities.

This is an unusual effort calling for unusual sacrificial service. No church will succeed in the Advance unless it gives unusual attention and makes definite plans for promoting this program.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Report No. 2

Hendrix College and Ministerial Education

All colleges are facing a critical situation. Possibly no other institution in our American life is more affected by the war than are our institutions of higher learning. Our Hendrix College is no exception. The decrease in enrollment for the present semester is not serious but no one can tell what the future may bring. Hendrix closed out its fiscal year with all obligations paid in full. This was due largely to the increased financial support from the Little Rock and North Arkansas Conferences. Four years ago the Little Rock Conference was contributing just a little over \$4000.00 for the support of Hendrix. During the present fiscal year this Conference has contributed \$13,271.62. \$6,497.48 came from Conference benevolences, and \$6,774.18 from the February Special. In order to maintain the high standard of Hendrix and to tide it safely over the present crisis, the Methodist people of Arkansas must rally enthusiastically to its support. We are glad to note that Reverend Ralph Hillis, a splendidly trained young minister, has been secured as Director of Religious activities among the Methodist students at Conway. We appreciate the splendid service rendered to the College students by Reverend Cecil R. Culver last Conference year and congratulate Hendrix and the Methodist Church at Conway upon being able to secure Reverend Edward W. Harris as their pastor and leader of Church activities for another year.

We make the following recommendations:

1. That the Commission on World Service allocate the same amount as last year for Hendrix College.
2. That the Ministerial Education Fund be combined with the Hendrix College Special and that February 1—14 be set aside by the Methodists of Arkansas for promoting and raising a minimum of \$5,000 for Hendrix College and a minimum of \$3,000 for Ministerial Education in each Conference.
3. That the following: J. I. McClurkin, Mrs. Gordon Young, Richard Perdue, a pastor and a district superintendent, to be selected by the cabinet, the Executive Secretary and chairman of the Board of Education be elected to serve with Bishop Selecman on a joint committee with the North Arkansas Conference to direct this state-wide campaign.
4. That the Campaign be conducted along the same lines as last year.

HENDRIX COLLEGE TRUSTEES:

That the following be elected to membership on the Board of Trustees for Hendrix College: J. J. Harrison, W. P. Gulley, and Harvey C. Couch to succeed themselves; Ira A. Brumley to succeed Connor Morehead as North Arkansas Conference trustee.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Report No. 3

Since the result of our year's work will be found in the Year Book of this Board and since Reports No. 1 and 2 have already dealt with the Educational Advance and Hendrix College, our final report to this Conference is confined to a word of appreciation and our recommendations.

Appreciation. We have had a good year and wish to thank our Bishop, our District Superintendents, our pastors and the hundreds of fine laymen whose loyal support has made the success of our year's program possible.

Finances. Our finances are in good shape. Due to economy in administration we have spent less than our estimated budget and received more than our estimate on Church School Day and from Conference Benevolences. Your Board has, therefore, been able to enter the new year with all obligations paid and sufficient monies on hand to guarantee our continuation on a cash basis. All specials sponsored by this Board including Church School Day, the February Special and the Methodist Orphanage exceeded the goal set by the Conference. Each of our seven districts paid more than the amount asked on each of these items. Your Board is responsible for receiving, receipting and disbursing funds for our various institutional causes. This accounts for, by far, the largest per cent of money handled. This includes funds for Hendrix College, the February Special, the Pastors' School, the Student Loan Fund, Wesley Foundations and the S.M.U. scholarship. Your Board furnishes the office work, the postage, the stationery, and other necessary expenses incidental to handling these funds without any cost to the institutions they represent. In addition to this your Board, out of its operating fund takes care of the expenses of the Board of Ministerial Training, the promotion of the Fourth Sunday Offering and several small items outside of our regular program. The Treasurer's report with the auditor's statement is published in our year book and is attached to this report for publication in the Journal.

Recommendations. We recommend:

I. EDUCATION ADVANCE:

1. That first emphasis be given this year to the Education Advance with the Conference goal of 20 per cent increase based on the enrollment reported at this Conference.

II. CHILDREN'S WORK:

1. That through our Conference and District Officers of Children's Work, a vigorous effort be made this year to reach all the children for whom Methodists are responsible in our Conference.
2. A Nursery Home Department (Cradle Roll) in each church.
3. Training opportunities to all Children's workers.
4. A Coaching Conference on Vacation Church Schools again this year with ever increasing interest upon holding Vacation Church Schools wherever possible.

III. YOUTH WORK:

1. Youth organized in the Methodist Youth Fellowship in each church.
2. Sub-district organizations continued with emphasis in spite of the war.
3. District organizations perfected in each district.
4. Youth Assemblies the same as last year with renewed effort to have all churches represented.
5. All Youth Organizations paying to the Methodist Youth Fund.
6. The Methodist Youth organized for participation in the Education Advance.

IV. ADULT WORK:

We recommend wholehearted cooperation with our new Director of Adult Work, Dr. Matt L. Ellis in the promotion of all phases of both young adults and adult work sponsored by our General Board.

We recommend that a vigorous effort be made to enlist all our adult divisions and adult classes in the Education Advance and that if possible an Adult Assembly be held this year.

V. WESLEY FOUNDATIONS:

We have made appropriations for Wesley Foundations as follows: Monticello A. & M. \$100.00; Magnolia A. & M. \$100.00; Henderson State \$100.00; University of Arkansas \$250.00; State-wide Student Conference and student officers expense \$100.00 and have set aside an additional \$100.00 for Henderson when an enlarged program at that institution is worked out. We have also made provision for an appropriation for our student work at Conway when satisfactory adjustment can be made with other groups supporting our work there. We are happy to report the employment of capable, full time Directors of Religious activities among the students both at Fayetteville and at Conway.

VI. PASTORS' SCHOOL:

Under the leadership of Dr. C. M. Reves, our Dean, Arkansas had one of the best sessions in years of its Pastors' School last summer. An even better program has been planned for next year.

We recommend that our District Superintendents be continued as our enrollment committee and that an earnest effort be made to secure the attendance of every pastor in the Conference including our Supply pastors.

VII. TOWN AND COUNTRY WORK:

Your Board proposes to cooperate with other Conference agencies and an enlarged program of our town and country churches. We have made an appropriation of \$500.00 toward this work and have directed our Executive Secretary to give such time as may be necessary for the promotion of same.

VIII. SPECIAL DAYS:

We recommend the observance of the following Special Days:

1. Church School Day—April 11th or as near thereto as practical with a Conference Goal of \$3600.00.
2. Orphanage Sunday—December 20th with a goal of \$6000.00.
3. February Special for Hendrix College and Ministerial Education—February 1—14 with a minimum goal of \$8000.00 to be divided on the basis of \$3000.00 for ministerial education and \$5000.00 for Hendrix College.
4. Methodist Student and Wesley Foundation Day, September 12th.
5. World Service Sunday each Fourth Sunday in the year with all churches participating.

IX. PHILANDER SMITH COLLEGE:

That we commend Philander Smith College for negroes as one of our Methodist institutions; that our churches open their doors to the Philander Smith singers and that an offering for Philander Smith College be taken on Race Relation Sunday.

X. SCHOLARSHIP FOR THE SCHOOL OF THEOLOGY AT S. M. U.

That this Conference continue its scholarship of \$400.00 at S. M. U. and that same be included in our Ministerial Education Fund.

XI. DISTRICT DIRECTORS:

The list of District Directors will be found in our Year Book subject to such change as the Executive Committee and District Superintendents may find it necessary to make following the session of the Conference.

XII. DISTRICT INSTITUTES:

We recommend that our Executive Committee meet with the District Superintendents on Friday, November 20th to distribute goals for Church School Day and the February Special and to arrange for our Boards participation in the series of District Set-Up meetings, dates of which have already been given in the report of the Board of Missions.

XIII. APPROPRIATIONS:

We have requested the Commission on World Service and Finance to make the same appropriations as last year for this Board.

XIV. BOARD OF MANAGERS OF ARKANSAS PASTORS' SCHOOL:

We nominate the following to serve on the Board of Managers of the Arkansas Pastors' School: E. Clifton Rule, C. M. Reves, Arthur Terry, Clem Baker, Kenneth L. Spore, Roland E. Darrow, S. C. Dugger, Mrs. A. R. McKinney, Mrs. E. D. Galloway, O. E. Holmes, J. D. Hammons, and A. G. Walton.

XV. CONFERENCE STAFF:

We have elected Clem Baker, Executive Secretary and request the Bishop to appoint him to this office. We have elected Miss Fay McRae, Conference Director of Children's Work; C. Ray Hozendorf, Conference Director of Youth Work; Matt L. Ellis, Conference Director of Adult Work and Mrs. R. A. Thomas, Office Secretary.

XVI. SOUTHERN METHODIST UNIVERSITY:

We have received the report of Southern Methodist University from President Umphrey Lee. We commend the University for its many fine, and increasing, services to the entire South Central Jurisdiction. We are glad to note that the net enrollment of the University and all of its departments for the year 1941-1942 was 4,305, of these 207 were enrolled in the School of Theology. We especially commend the School of Theology and the other professional schools of the University. We urge our ministers where possible to attend Ministers' Week opening January 25, and to make wide use of the circulating library. We appreciated the visit of Dean E. B. Hawk before the Board of Education and the Conference.

XVII. WESTERN METHODIST ASSEMBLY:

Our Conference had a splendid representation at the several schools and conferences held at Mt. Sequoyah last summer. This institution is growing in its service to the entire South Central Jurisdiction and we heartily commend its programs to all our people.

XVIII. A WORD OF THANKS:

We conclude our report with heartfelt expression of appreciation to Dr. Connor Morehead and the membership of First Methodist Church, Little Rock for the adequate office space so generously furnished our Board. We also want to go on record in appreciation of the Youth Page edited by Rev. Harold Eggensperger and the Christian Education page edited by our Executive Secretary in the Arkansas Methodist. We sincerely thank Dr. Wayland and the Arkansas Methodist Commission for the generous space allocated to our educational program and commend the Arkansas Methodist for the splendid service it has rendered to Arkansas Methodism.

COMMISSION ON EVANGELISM

Report No. 1

Your Conference Commission on Evangelism make the following report:

We have made some advances along all lines, both in the numbers of people reached and brought into the kingdom and in the amount of moneys raised for all the causes we represent. In all of this we take courage as we face a new year and a needy moral and spiritual world. We have had 5966 additions to our rolls. Of this number 2539 were on profession of faith and 3427 by certificate and otherwise.

Your commission desires to make the following recommendations:

1. That we pay from the funds of the commission the traveling expenses of those appointed by the district superintendents to attend the Conference wide Evangelism Institute in Little Rock early in the year. We could take care of as many as five from each district.

2. That our district superintendents and district directors of evangelism promote a vigorous and continuous program of evangelism throughout the year, beginning with the District Advance Institutes, following the state wide meeting in Little Rock.

3. We feel that Methodism should take advantage of the radio to present the Christ to a chaotic world. We suggest that our chairman and secretary-treasurer furnish as much money as our funds will allow to help promote a radio program again this year. This program to be in cooperation with the conference board of education.

4. Each local church and church school should be the evangelising force of their respective communities throughout the year. We urge that pastors, with their local boards of education, teachers and classes lead in well planned personal workers campaigns in each charge. Revivals should be conducted in each church in our conference during the year. As far as possible let our station pastors offer their services to outlying communities for preaching services and revival campaigns.

5. Our homes should be Christ centered. We urge that our pastors seek to establish family altars in all our homes. Let us place the Upper Room, Tidings, the Christian Advocate, and our Arkansas Methodist in the hands of our people.

6. Let us call our people to consecrate themselves to every form and method of evangelism we know and seek earnestly and continuously to bring our communities and our world to Christ and his church.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Your committee appreciates the growing spirit of cooperation existing among the several Boards, Commissions and other agencies of our Conference. This is as it should be. The Little Rock Conference should have one great program led by our Bishop and District Superintendents with all the agencies of the Conference wholeheartedly cooperating in reaching our objectives. Our program can be stated under five great heads, namely:

- I. Evangelism or Reaching the Unreached.
- II. Christian Education.
- III. Finances and Service.
- IV. War Work—A New Feature this year.
- V. Organization.

In the first four of these objectives, the Board of Education, the Board of Missions the W. S. C. S. the Board of Lay Activities, the Methodist Youth Fellowship, and the Commission on Evangelism can give whole hearted cooperation, and even in the matter of organization each can be helpful to the other.

I. REACHING THE UNREACHED

Our first great objective should be to reach the 85,000 unreached people for whom the Little Rock Conference is responsible. For this effort we recommend wholehearted cooperation in three special campaigns:

1. The Educational Advance.
2. The Home Visitation Campaign of Evangelism.
3. The Group Ministry Plan for Our Country Churches.

II. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Christian Education should go hand in hand with the campaign to reach the unreached. It should reach our present members, our new members, and those we are seeking to reach for Christ. It involves what it means to be a Christian, a Churchman, and a Methodist. It includes Stewardship, Missions, Preparation for Leadership in the Church, and opportunities for Service. As such it should not be considered the responsibility of the Church School alone but of all the departments of the Church working together. We, therefore, recommend that the same agencies uniting in the campaign to reach the unreached also unite in the intensified campaign to reach all with Christian Education through:

Our Pastors' School
 Training Schools and Classes
 Schools of Missions and Mission Study Classes
 The Fourth Sunday World Service Program
 Stewardship Institutes and Classes
 Pastors' Classes for New Members
 Assemblies and Camps for Youth
 The Arkansas Methodist, the Christian Advocate, the radio,
 and the circulation of good books and pamphlets
 Enrollment in our own institutions of higher learning
 Our Sunday Schools

III. FINANCES

With our increasing income there is a corresponding increase in the demands upon our people for giving to causes outside the Church. Most of these are worthy causes but we would remind our people that there is also a growing demand upon the benevolent program of our Methodism. We therefore recommend:

1. A 10 to 25 per cent increase in Acceptance for World Service and Conference Benevolences, even in those churches that have already accepted 100 per cent of the askings.

2. The payment in full of all special offerings approved by our Conference.

3. An increased effort to retire all church debts by the end of the quadrennium.

IV. WAR WORK

The World War II has brought to our Church new problems and obligations; as well as new opportunities for Christian service. There is not a congregation in our Conference but that in some way will be affected by this crisis. Either within the bounds of our Conference or closely adjacent to it we have five training camps for service men, eight defense industries, and the largest Concentration Camp for Japanese to be found in America. A number of our communities are crowded with temporarily dislocated service men and civilian workers. Others have lost practically all their young men and a large number of their girls and young women. Eight of our ministers will be in service as Chaplains by the close of this Conference and an increasing proportion of the time of the pastors left at home must be spent with those whose loved ones are gone and in many cases lost in action. The Red Cross, the U. S. O. and many other civilian service agencies are demanding so much of the time of our best laymen and women that it is seriously affecting the necessary program of the Church. In the face of all this the Church faces the danger of surrendering its rightful leadership for Christian service to other agencies and facing a new world when the war is over with the accusation that the Church had no constructive part in meeting the present crisis. The Methodist Church and the Little Rock Conference must have a program but the problem is so complicated and there are so many suggestions coming from so many sources that your committee, instead of suggesting definite procedure here, recommends that this Conference appoint a War Work Commission, composed of the Bishop, the Cabinet, and representatives from all interested agencies of the Conference and that this Commission be charged with the responsibility of immediately studying the needs and opportunities for war service in our Conference and recommending a general plan of procedure to our Conference, our District, and our Local Churches.

V. ORGANIZATION

For the purpose of carrying out the unified program of our Conference, we recommend that each District Superintendent organize and make use of the enlarged District Staff to be composed of all District Officers provided for by our Discipline. For the purpose of setting up the district program we recommend that all agencies cooperate in one district set-up meeting to be held in each district as soon as possible following the adjournment of Conference. For local churches we recommend that our pastors make an earnest effort to provide for the organization of the Official Board, the Board of Education, the Board of Missions, the W. S. C. S., the Methodist Youth Fellowship and such other disciplinary boards and committees as may be essential in carrying out the program necessary for the most effective work in the local church.

Goals and Objectives 1942-1943

1. Educational Advance promoted in each Church with 20 per cent increase in enrollment per year.

2. Home Visitation Evangelism Campaign in each district with revivals in all churches not reached in the campaign.

3. At least one Group Ministry project in each district.
4. A comprehensive Training Program for each church.
5. All pastors attending Pastors' School; each charge represented in Youth Assemblies.
6. All Conference and District Officers attending Leadership Schools at Mt. Sequoyah.
7. 10,000 subscribers for Arkansas Methodist.
8. Methodist Radio Hour.
9. Pastors' salaries paid in full.
10. Increase in Acceptance for World Service and Conference Benevolences from 10 to 25 per cent.
11. Christmas Offering for the Orphanage, \$6,000.00.
12. Church School Day, \$3,600.00.
13. Hendrix College Ministerial Education, \$8,000.00.
14. All churches observing each Fourth Sunday with offering for World Service.
15. All Church debts paid by end of the quadrennium.
16. A definite program in each church designed to meet its responsibilities and opportunities arising out of the present World War.
17. Each Church organized according to the Discipline for carrying out the program of Methodism.

The General Conference in its action provided for a Conference Board of Hospitals and Homes of four laymen and three ministers, and according to a Conference action there was set up in addition to this Conference Board, a District Board in each District in the Conference. To date the Conference Board has been unintentionally ignored in that all monies that have been raised in all the Districts have been remitted to the Treasurer of the District Board and disbursed by the District Board and no report of collections or disbursements has been submitted

to the Conference Board in order that they might be submitted to the Annual Conference.

We, therefore, recommend that in the future the District Superintendent and the Treasurer of each District Board submit to the Conference Board at the beginning of the Annual Conference session, a report on all monies received and disbursed. This must be done if the Conference Board continues to function.

BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES

Your Conference Board of Lay Activities submits the following report:

We are pleased to report that progress has been made in all of the objectives of our Layman's work. This has been made possible by the fine cooperation of our District Superintendents, our pastors and our laymen of the Conference, for which we are grateful.

We wish to recommend the following objectives for the ensuing year:

Christian Stewardship. Continued emphasis should be placed on Christian Stewardship.

Layman's Day. We recommend that Layman's Day be observed on February 21, 1943, and that every pulpit in the Conference be filled by a layman on that date or as near thereto as is practical. That it be made a special feature in the preparation for the week of Dedication, February 28-March 7, and that Layman's Week be observed the same week with special emphasis on "Lay Program in World Reconstruction."

Lay Speaking. We further recommend that our Lay Leaders and Lay Speakers help to fill the pulpits of churches made vacant as a result of preachers entering the Chaplaincy of the Armed Forces of our Nation. And that the laymen of the larger churches take advantage of the opportunity they have of rendering service in rural communities by carrying personal messages to those areas. This should be encouraged by the pastors of the churches.

Support of the Ministry. In the times of higher costs of living we recommend that our laymen study the necessary expense of the pastor and that adequate financial aid be given in every charge.

World Service. We urge that each charge Lay Leader see that the World Service program is presented to his charge before the acceptance is made for the benevolent program and that prayerful consideration be given to the request of the Commission on World Service for a substantial increase in the acceptance.

Educational Advance. Realizing the need for this program we urge that each and every layman give the fullest cooperation in the carrying out of this movement.

Christian Literature. We call attention to the Christian literature now being published by our church and recommend that that this literature be read more and more by our laymen.

Conference Lay Leader. We nominate Dr. Matt L. Ellis for Conference Lay Leader and Fred Gantt for Associate Conference Lay Leader. We report the election of Mrs. R. A. Thomas as Secretary-Treasurer of the Board for the ensuing year.

REPORT OF ARKANSAS METHODIST COMMISSION

The Arkansas Methodist Commission, composed of seven members from the Little Rock Conference and a like number from the North Arkansas Conference, submits the following report for the Conference year, 1941-1942:

The Arkansas Methodist has had an unusually good year. Through the full and hearty cooperation of the ministers and church membership of the two Conferences the Circulation Campaign in January, 1942, was a gratifying success, resulting in a circulation increase of 66 per cent, so that we now have 15,000 subscribers to the paper. During the year all past due indebtedness, amounting to more than \$2,000.00, has been paid. Our only financial obligations now are our current monthly bills, which, since the Circulation Campaign, have been paid promptly each month.

We make the following recommendations:

1. That the ministers and churches of the two Conferences express to the Rev. E. T. Wayland their grateful and high appreciation for his eminently successful work as Business Manager, and for his universally acceptable and distinguished service as Editor of the Arkansas Methodist, having produced for us a paper that is free from debt and of whose form and content the Methodist of our state are sincerely proud.
2. That the Rev. E. T. Wayland be re-elected as Editor and Business Manager of the Arkansas Methodist at a salary of \$3,300.00.
3. That our Annual Conferences adopt as their plan for the annual Circulation Campaign the eleven point program given herewith:

Arkansas Methodist Circulation Campaign

Remembering the splendid results of our Arkansas Methodist Circulation Campaign last January, and believing, with the restrictions of travel after November 22, and the limitations which this will place on the promotion of our work through District and Conference meetings, that the Arkansas Methodist, as a unifying and promotional agency, will be more necessary to our work than ever before, we recommend:

1. That January 10-17, 1943, be fixed as the time for the annual statewide, simultaneous Circulation Campaign for the Arkansas Methodist.
2. That the Circulation campaign throughout the state again be under the direction of Bishop Charles C. Sealeman, and that he appoint at this Annual Conference, a District Director of the Arkansas Methodist Campaign in each District to assist him and the District Superintendent in planning for the state-wide campaign.
3. That the Circulation Campaign, in the District, be under the direction of the District Superintendent and the District Director appointed by the Bishop. That they enlist the support of the District Lay Leader and the District Secretary of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, and the District Director of Young People's Work. That special emphasis be given the Circulation Campaign in the District set-up meetings held throughout the Conference at the beginning of the new year.
4. That the Circulation Campaign in the local church, be under the direction of the pastor and Church Director of Arkansas Methodist Campaign, appointed by the pastor. That they enlist the Church Lay Leader, the President of the Woman's Society of Christian Service and the President of the Youth Division as helpers in the Campaign. That plans be perfected in the local church, before the date for the Circula-

tion Campaign, for a complete canvass of the homes of the membership of our church for subscriptions and renewals to the Arkansas Methodist.

5. That the Circulation Campaign, within the local church, be completed within the eight days set by the Annual Conference for this work, where at all possible.

6. That each pastor or Church Director, on blanks to be furnished, make a report to the District Superintendent and to the office of the Arkansas Methodist on Monday, January 18, of the results of the campaign of the local church.

7. That the Arkansas Methodist, in the last week of January, after the manner of reporting the results of the Circulation Campaign last year, carry a full report by districts and by charges of the results of the campaign throughout the state, and that additional reports be carried in the Arkansas Methodist, for two or three weeks following, to include the results of any follow-up work that may be necessary to complete the campaign in the local church.

8. That a quota of one subscription for each seven active members be assigned to the districts. That this total assigned to the district be apportioned to the charges on the same basis by the District Superintendent and the District Director, at the post-conference set-up meetings.

9. That an effort be made throughout the state to bring all subscriptions to expire in January—the date of the Annual Circulation Campaign.

10. That in view of the increased cost of printing and materials, the subscription price of the Arkansas Methodist be one dollar and twenty-five cents per year.

11. That at any time, from the adoption of this report, through the Circulation Campaign in January, subscriptions may be taken for the Arkansas Methodist, at one dollar and twenty-five cents, all such subscriptions to run through January, 1944.

MISSIONS AND CHURCH EXTENSION

Report No. 1

As the world is passing through a crucial period, and the welfare of human beings in many lands, depends upon a manifestation of Christian spirit, we feel that there should be a renewed interest along all missionary lines of activities.

We wish to commend the editors of the World Outlook and the Methodist Woman, for the splendid periodicals they are giving the church and recommend that there be a ten per cent increase in subscriptions.

The hope for Missions lies in the interest of the Methodist Youth Fellowship, and we urge thorough cultivation in this age group through the use of the Board's visual education facilities.

There is great need at this time for a renewed interest in the rural work, and shifting population, which will be lost to the church unless cared for in a special way.

Every district should have a well planned institute, in which the various missionary organizations shall have representation. It should be the aim of each District Superintendent to have an organized Board of Missions in each local church whose duty it will be to sponsor a School of Missions and to distribute the splendid literature that is available.

It should be the goal of each church to observe the Fourth Sunday for World Service, using the literature and program sent out by the Council of Secretaries.

We feel that there should be special sermons on missions at least twice a year in each church, either by the pastor or a visiting missionary.

Dr. Quimby of the General Board of Missions was present and gave an optimistic report of the finances of the Board of Missions. Our hearts were made glad to learn that fourteen per cent more money has been received this year for missions than last year.

The District Missionary Institutes are to be held as follows:

Arkadelphia District—December 15-16, Arkadelphia.

Camden District—November 26-27, El Dorado.

Little Rock District—November 24-25, First Church, Little Rock.

Monticello District—December 3-4, Monticello.

Pine Bluff District—December 1-2, First Church, Pine Bluff.

Prescott District—December 8-9, Prescott.

Texarkana District—December 10-11, First Church, Texarkana.

We further recommend that Fred G. Roebuck be nominated for Conference Missionary Secretary and request the Bishop to appoint him to this office.

We recommend that the following be elected officers of the Division of Church Extension: B. F. Roebuck, Chairman; J. A. Wade, Secretary; J. H. Cummins, Treasurer, and the following as members of the Division: W. B. Slack, Carl Hollis and J. A. Wade.

Finally we urge that every congregation observe Dedication Sunday, March 7, 1943, at which time a love offering is to be taken, closing an intensive cultivation period in the study of missions.

ARKANSAS METHODIST ORPHANAGE

October 1, 1941, Through September 30, 1942

Your Home for Children, known as the Arkansas Methodist Orphanage, has had a good year. Many things have been somewhat expensive, but we have no debt and are in better shape than we have ever been since the Orphanage started. We have added a few improvements to our plant during the year and it is in good condition. I am glad to say in this annual report that the finances of the Orphanage are in good shape. I am attaching hereto a financial statement, together with the auditor's report, which explain themselves. We have received from all sources, together with the balance brought over from last year, \$13,437.61. The expenses for the year just closing were \$10,991.68, and we have a balance as of October 1, 1942, of \$2,445.93. In the beginning of the fiscal year, we had 38 children in the home. We have received during the year, three, and have let out 15, and now have a colony of 26 children in the home. We had four girls and one boy to graduate from the high school this year. We have placed over six hundred children in good homes throughout the United States up through this report.

Recommendations

1. That the Little Rock Conference, if possible, increase their assessment for the incoming year. This Conference accepted \$3,823.42 last year and paid \$2,525.03. The North Arkansas Conference accepted \$2,000.00 last year, and paid \$421.15.

2. That the Little Rock Conference, if it is at all satisfactory with its plans, recommend that the Christmas Offering be taken on Sunday, December 20th, in the stations, and be started on the circuits on that Sunday, running on through until each congregation has been given an opportunity to contribute. We further request that you recommend that your Board of Christian Education sponsor this movement, if at all possible. This has been done in the Little Rock Conference in previous years and for the year just closing the Christmas Offering from this Conference amounted to \$6,706.45. The Christmas Offering from the North Arkansas Conference amounted to \$2,420.16, up through October 1, 1942, which is the end of our fiscal year. We are grateful for these liberal amounts but we need more and urge everyone to give. We are increasingly convinced that if all of our brethren of the ministry would get the matter of our home on their hearts, the endowment would begin to roll in, many people who do not have much cash to give, but who have property to dispose of, would remember our home in their wills of the matter was constantly kept before them.

We are thankful to the Little Rock Conference for your loyal support and love, and beg our people, preachers and laymen, to visit the home and see what you have in this Christ-like institution.

REPORT OF BOARD OF TEMPERANCE

The liquor traffic is sabotaging the physical, mental, economic, moral and spiritual power of Arkansas and the nation. There are astounding reports of drunkenness among civilians—both men and women—and among the armed forces of the nation. It is known that one of the chief causes of the Pearl Harbor disaster, December 7, 1941, was liquor. The F. B. I. reports that there were more than five times as many men arrested for drunkenness throughout the nation in 1940 (with liquor legal), as there were in 1932 (under prohibition). In the City of

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

Washington in 1932 there were 104 women arrested for drunkenness, and in 1941 there were 1,769 women arrested for that offense. The population in Washington has increased about 100 per cent during the past ten years, and drunkenness among women in that city has increased more than 1,600 per cent. This is a deplorable and dangerous situation in our nation's capital.

The "wets" claimed that repeal of the 18th Amendment would stop bootlegging, promote temperance and produce so much revenue that taxes would be reduced. Bootlegging has not been stopped but has actually increased in many areas. An Arkansas sheriff, on January 19, 1942, signed the following statement: "There is much more bootlegging in my county now than there was during state and national prohibition, and it is much harder to catch bootleggers where there is legal sale of liquors." The Arkansas Legislature itself in March, 1941, Act 356, Section 7 of which reads in part: "... large quantities of moonshine intoxicating liquors are being manufactured and sold in the State of Arkansas," etc.

The liquor traffic in Arkansas in 1941 paid net revenue of \$2,974,300. Careful research revealed the fact that the liquor traffic cost Arkansas, in 1941, a little more than \$20.00 for every \$1.00 it paid in revenue, the total net loss being \$56,552,300. Added to this enormous economic loss, there is the moral and spiritual loss which cannot be calculated.

Anti-liquor sentiment has been growing in Arkansas in recent years, and it is much stronger now, as shown by the state-wide vote on Act No. 1—the Local Option Bill—on November 3rd.

We recommend:

1. That all the ministers exert themselves in, and lead their people in, the warfare against liquor and urge them to pay their poll taxes and support men and measures that will promote temperance and prohibition.
2. That we again commend and heartily thank Governor Adkins for his support of the temperance cause generally, and for his support of Act No. 1, particularly.
3. That we again endorse Senate Bill No. 860, which would, if enacted take liquor and vice from in and around the training stations of our armed forces.
4. That each District Superintendent give place on District Conference program for Mr. Clyde C. Coulter, Superintendent of Anti-Saloon League of Arkansas, and Mrs. May C. Crouse, President of the State W. C. T. U.
5. That we commend the Anti-Saloon League of Arkansas and its Superintendent, Mr. Clyde C. Coulter, for the courageous leadership in the warfare against the liquor traffic generally, and in the campaign for Act No. 1 particularly.

TOWN AND COUNTRY COMMISSION

In order to give increased emphasis to our rural church work this year, your Commission recommends:

1. At least one Group Ministry project in each district to be selected by the District Superintendent.
2. In order to secure cooperation and give direction to this work we recommend an Advisory Committee to be composed of the Chairman of the Board of Education, the Board of Missions, the Board of Lay

Activities, the President of the Woman's Society of Christian Service or some one whom the women may elect to represent her, the Executive Secretary of the Board of Education, the Conference Missionary Secretary, the Conference Youth Director, the Conference Director of Evangelism and the District Superintendents.

3. To meet the necessary expenses connected with our rural work we recommend that the Board of Missions appropriate \$100.00, the Board of Lay Activities \$100.00, the W. S. C. S. \$50.00, and the Board of Education \$500.00.

We recommend that the Board of Education direct its Executive Secretary to give such time as may be necessary to help set up these projects and for the promotion of same.

We recommend a vigorous promotion of the Education Advance in all our rural churches and that wherever possible our rural churches be urged to participate in the Home Visitation Campaign of Evangelism to be set up this year in each district.

We recommend that a vigorous effort be made to organize a Sunday School in each rural church and that our town and city churches organize Mission Schools wherever practical.

We recommend that our Board of Managers of the Arkansas Pastors' School provide for an outstanding course in rural work at our pastors' School; that special emphasis be given in securing attendance of all our pastors serving rural charges and that these pastors be urged to enroll for the course on Rural Work to be given by Dr. Rapking.

We recommend the work of our Sustentation Committee in its effort to raise the standard of pastors' salaries up to a living wage.

PLAN FOR MINISTERIAL SUSTENTATION FUND

We, your Commission on Ministerial Sustentation, submit the following as the amended plan for the incoming year:

I. Commission

1. On nomination of the Superintendent of each of the several districts the Annual Conference shall elect quadrennially one lay member from his district and one preacher to serve on this Commission. The District Superintendents shall be exofficio members.

2. The Commission shall elect its own chairman and such other officers as its needs may require.

3. The Commission shall meet annually at least one month before Conference at the call of the chairman, and at such other times and places as need may require.

II. Beneficiaries

1. Beneficiaries under this plan shall be divided into two groups, such grouping being determined by the relation to the Conference sustained by each, as follows: (a) Members of the Conference and those duly admitted on trial and serving under appointment from the Bishop; (b) Supply preachers who meet all disciplinary requirements for supplies.

2. The minimum salary fixed for each group, respectively, shall be \$1,000.00 and \$800.00. The Commission will match dollar for dollar as far as its funds permit, any increase paid by any charge over and above the average paid by such charge for the three fiscal years ended in 1939, 1940 and 1941, up to the minimum fixed for the group to which the pastor belongs.

III. Raising Funds

1. For the purpose of meeting the requirements set forth in the preceding paragraph, an apportionment of 1 per cent shall be made on all preachers' salaries of \$1,000.00 or more, upon the whole salary and upon all charges paying such salaries.

2. The Treasurer elected by the Commission shall be the one to receive and disburse funds accruing from this source, provided, funds shall be paid only on certification of the District Superintendent of the beneficiary.

3. District Superintendents shall report to the Commission the names of beneficiaries and the amount of aid given. The Treasurer shall keep an itemized account of the benefits paid out and report same to the chairman of this Commission as soon after the session of the Annual Conference as possible.

4. Any part of this plan may be amended at any session of the Conference on recommendation of the Commission, or on motion from the floor of the Conference.

Auditor's Report

Herewith for your approval I submit my report on the books of The Arkansas Methodist for the fiscal year ended October 31, 1942.

Inasmuch as the only records of the office consist of the cash book, I have limited this report to an accounting of the recorded cash receipts and disbursements, together with a condensed balance sheet set up from the audit report of October 31, 1941.

During the current year, income from subscriptions was practically double that of the previous year, \$12,384.79. There was a consequent material increase in printing costs. Advertising income declined approximately \$1,000.00.

The value placed on land and buildings is that listed in previous audits as the value fixed by appraisers secured by your Commission on April 12, 1941.

On the balance sheet, no liabilities are listed. The management does not treat thirty-day accounts payable as liabilities, nor are similar accounts receivable treated as assets. I have, therefore, not set them up. They are, of course, debts of The Arkansas Methodist. I have verified, however, that all salaries are paid to date, and all printing bills have been paid except that for the month of October, for which no statement had been received. This printing account for October would be the only liability of any consequence. All bills payable were liquidated during the year.

In verification of disbursements, I have examined stubs of check books, cancelled checks and invoices. Checks have been found to be properly drawn and signed and endorsed. In verification of receipts I have examined duplicate receipts in the office. All recorded receipts have been properly accounted for.

Memoirs

THOMAS OLIVER RORIE

Was born in Middle Georgia, April 14, 1853, and was educated at Emory College, Oxford, Georgia. Joined the North Georgia Conference in 1880 and after serving in that conference for a term of years was transferred to the Little Rock Conference in 1895 and stationed at Monticello, and from then on serving pastorates in the conference, traveling agent for the Methodist Orphanage, Field Editor for the Arkansas Methodist, serving faithfully and efficiently in all capacities wherever assigned until he retired from active service in 1926, making his home in Hot Springs until he was called home February 3, 1942, at eight o'clock in the morning.

He was married first to Miss Fannie Brooks in Georgia in 1880. To this union six children were born, three surviving, Mrs. Claude Phillips of Arkadelphia, Rev. T. O. Rorie, junior pastor of Wagner Memorial Church, St. Louis, Missouri, and Clem B. Rorie of Fort Smith. His first wife died in 1908 and in April, 1912, he married Miss Helen Lehmanns, who survives him. To this union two children were born, one, Lieut. Ben L. Rorie, survives, and several grandchildren remain to sustain his loss. One son, Paul, who preceded him in death some years was a preacher of no ordinary ability, thus besides giving 46 years of active work to the ministry himself gave two fine sons to the same cause.

Embraced within the confines of the above dates was the life of a man of no ordinary ability. Blessed with a fine mind, a sterling character, a kind loving heart, he projected his life through his day and generation in a broad constructive way. How he knew and loved the doctrines of Methodism. He could preach said doctrines in a very unusual way. This man was constructed on broad and liberal lines. He could not brook the little and narrow. He had no patience with the veneer or camouflage; but moved on straight lines and not in circles, and demanded that from those with whom he dealt. He was the personification of rugged honesty.

While this writer was pastor of First Church, Hot Springs, he was a frequent auditor of his ministry and what a help this was, sympathetic, appreciative, attentive and helpful in all his attitudes. The writer remembers how one night he invited the subject of this sketch to talk to his prayer meeting crowd upon the subject of "Infant Baptism," how he amazed and thrilled that crowd upon this beautiful and vital subject. And he did everything he laid his hand to in a similar way. Bishop Bristel once said of Bishop McCabe, "He was a man whose brain was filled with empires and his heart with milleniums." So with this good man; he loved his country, his church, his family, his friends, his Lord and had a Heavenly longing for the coming of the Kingdom of God on earth. He lived nobly, suffered patiently and like an infant pillowing its head upon the bosom of its mother and falling to sleep; he pillowed his head upon the promises of his Lord and quietly and sweetly slipped away into the arms of his Lord. In closing I want to say in the words of Dr. Brown at the memorial service of Dean Tillett, "He held his place; held the long purpose like a growing tree; held it through blame and faltered not at praise, towering in calm, rough-hewn sublimity above the hills, and when he fell, he went down as when a lordly cedar,

green with boughs goes down upon the hills and leaves a lonesome place against the sky."

His funeral was conducted from the family church, Oaklawn, Hot Springs, February 4, 1942, by his faithful pastor, Rev. George Reutz, assisted by Rev. Roy Farr.

On October 27, 1942, Mrs. Horace Jewell passed to her reward; more than 95 years old.

Martha Tabitha Taliaferro was born March 1, 1847, in Wilkes County, Georgia. Her parents, Nicholas Taliaferro (1801-1871) and Nancy (Hill) Taliaferro (1804-1868) were the parents of four sons and three daughters. Martha Tabitha was the youngest of the seven. She united with the M. E. Church, South, at Pope's Chapel, Wilkes County, Georgia, in 1859, when she was twelve years of age. That was the beginning of 83 years of faithful service to the church.

In the fall of 1860, her family moved to Cleveland County, Arkansas, settling about 25 miles from Pine Bluff. In Arkansas, she joined a church near their home, called Bethlehem. She probably remained a member of that church for some 16 or 17 years.

Her opportunities of education were limited, due to the circumstances of the times. She attended a private school three or four years before the Civil War. That, with one year in Wesleyan Female College, Macon, Georgia, after the war, was the extent of her formal education. However, she was a great student of life, and a reader of good literature. She was, therefore, an educated woman, in the real sense.

As a young lady, she lived through the trying times of the war between the states. Her three brothers (one had died before the war) went away to the war. Her oldest brother did not come back. She spent the first three years of the war at her family home in Cleveland County, which was for a time, between the Federal and Confederate lines. She saw an engagement between a Company of Union and a Company of Confederate soldiers, fought in her own front yard. On another occasion, a body of "grey-backs" all but hanged her father in their front yard, after stealing everything they could move from the premises. This she would have seen had she not been away from home that night, ministering to a sick neighbor. The last year of the war, she spent at Mound Prairie, Texas, where a brother, an army officer, was in charge of a Confederate Government factory. On January 30, 1873, she married Mr. James M. Duncan, a young planter from Southwest Georgia. They were very happy and appeared to have a bright future, but, in less than three months, on March 21, 1873, her young husband died leaving a noble Christian testimony. On November 5, 1873, the broken hearted young widow was blessed with the birth of a baby girl, who was named Jimmie, for her father. Jimmie is now Mrs. John Arnold of Hope, who for nearly 69 years was a comfort and consolation to her dear mother.

For nearly five years, Mrs. Duncan, and her little daughter lived on their farm in Cleveland County. It was during this period (1873) that she entertained Bishop Wm. M. Wightman, and he held a Conference, in her home, with Miss Emma Van Valkenburg of Warren, and other ladies, which led, a few months later, to the organization of the first Woman's Foreign Missionary Society in the M. E. Church, South.

In 1877, Mrs. Duncan met Reverend Horace Jewell, at that time in his fourth year as pastor of First Church, Pine Bluff, and who had been bereaved, the previous year, of his first companion, the former Miss Mattie Powell of Camden. A correspondence developed which resulted in their marriage, December 27, 1877. When Brother Jewell and Mrs. Duncan married, she had her little girl, Jimmie, about four years of age; and he had two daughters, Ella, about fifteen, who in 1884 became the wife of Reverend E. M. Pipkin, of this Conference; and, Nannie, about twelve, who married George Hughes of Benton in 1889. There were four other children of Brother Jewell's first marriage, who had died in infancy. These two daughters soon became quite attached to their step-mother, as did Jimmie to her step-father, and they all grew up together as one loving happy family.

After their marriage, Brother Jewell served the following appointments: Monticello (1877-78); the Pine Bluff District (1878-81; First Church, Little Rock (1881-85); the Little Rock District (1885-88); First Church, Pine Bluff (1888-89); Searcy (1889-92); Prescott (1892-93); Winfield Memorial (1893-94); Arkadelphia District (1894-98); Malvern (1898-1902), and Lonoke (1902-04). He retired in 1904 and moved to Hope in December. He served Fulton Circuit and other supply pastorates in the vicinity of Hope for several years, and was accidentally killed by a train at a crossing, in Hope, on February 7, 1917.

To this union there were born three sons and two daughters. The sons were Albert Taliaferro, Horace Hughes, and Nicholas Taliaferro. Albert and Nicholas, both dutiful and loving sons, survive their mother living in Hope. The daughters were Linda and Ann Taliaferro. The latter is now Mrs. John Hollis of Little Rock. Her frequent visits and letters were always sources of much pleasure to her mother. The former, Miss Linda was the constant companion of her mother. If it is possible for a lady to be a mother to her mother, Miss Linda was. She made a career out of taking care of her mother.

Mrs. Jewell, or "Mother Jewell" as almost everyone called her, for a quarter of a century (for more reason than because she was growing old in years), continued to live in Hope following the death of her husband. Until the very last years of her life, she came regularly to church, although for many years her hearing had been gone. She always occupied the second pew in front of the pulpit. This pew will doubtless continue, long, to be known as "the Jewell pew." After she could no longer go to church, she made a church of her room, where she continued to read her Bible and pray and to talk to all who came about the church, and God, and all good things.

It would be difficult to pick out the outstanding characteristics of this noble soul. She did so abound in good things that could be said of her. She was kind, loving, and true. She loved her church and the church loved her, being indebted to her for many great and useful services over 83 years of her loyal membership. One could always be sure of striking up a conversation in which she was obviously interested, when the subject was the church. She loved flowers. Wherever she went, to parsonage, homes, across the state, she left the premises blooming—and flowers loved her, they always seemed more willing to grow and shed out their radiant beauties for her, than for most people. She loved children. Her life was given for her children, her children's children, her grandchildren's children, and the children of others—and these little ones loved her. They often would go to her from their own mothers. As observed above, it is difficult to pick out her outstanding virtues—it is more difficult to pick out her faults if one were disposed to look for them. She said she was "spoiled." Maybe she was,

what of it? Surely it was a pleasure to "spoil" so sweet and fine a person.

The writer of these words can think of no more appropriate way of closing this little tribute than to quote from the memoir of her husband, written by Reverend T. D. Scott in 1917. Brother Scott said of Brother Jewell, "He never seemed to grow old or lose interest . . . he was always cheerful and happy." These words are as descriptive of Mrs. Jewell—his wife of forty years, and his widow for twenty-five more—as they were of her noble Methodist preacher husband.

"Thanks be to God that such have been,
Though they are here no more."

REV. Z. D. LINDSAY

The Rev. Z. D. Lindsay was born on July 5, 1867, in the bounds of the Old White River Conference. In his early manhood he served as engineer on the railroad. During his services as an engineer he received, in a railroad accident, an injury from which he never fully recovered.

He was converted in early manhood and immediately felt the call to the ministry. For a few years he served in the White River Conference.

He came to the Little Rock Conference in the fall of 1906, and was sent to the Washington charge. For twenty years he served circuits and stations, and on a district for one year. He was a superannuate for sixteen years before his death, and made his home in Nashville, Arkansas, during these years. The end came very suddenly and very quickly. He tried to reach his bed but was gone in a few moments. There was but little change in his general condition until a few minutes before his death. He has left behind three very fine children, two daughters and a son, with their companions, to mourn his death.

I think I knew Brother Lindsay and understood him as well as any one. He was a good gospel preacher. We had but few better gospel preachers than he. He did some deep thinking, and thought out and preached new sermons to the end of his ministry. Had it not been for the injury received in the railroad accident, from which he never fully recovered, he would have been a much greater success in his efforts to serve God.

I have lived within a city block from him for the past six years and was often in his home. I have had a chance to know him, and with my knowledge of his accident and his life I believe him to be a good man. He leaves behind three children, two daughters and a son, all of whom are married and have fine families, lovely homes and happy homes.

The funeral was held by the writer and Rev. J. W. Mann, and the body was buried in the Nashville cemetery.

Her manner of going was in such harmony with her manner of living. Quietly, calmly she slipped away and entered into her eternal rest. Her funeral was held by Rev. J. W. Mann, Rev. F. P. Doak and Rev. C. G. Hughes, and buried in Nashville cemetery.

During all the years he spent in College and University, he was serving circuits and working his way that he might become a well equipped minister of the gospel. He had a passion for learning, and no price in sacrifice and deprivation, was too great to pay for it. Brother James was happily married to Miss Freda Moss at Cove, Arkansas, December 28, 1923, and to this union were born four children, Reuel Palmer, Jr., who died in infancy, Dwight Moody, Lucy Lu and Enoch Marvin. Theirs was a happy home and family, ardently devoted to the work of the church. Brother James, while on his way to the Summer School for ministers at Hendrix College, June 1, 1942, was a victim in a highway accident in which four lives were lost. The funeral service was held in the church at Lockesburg, conducted by Rev. J. A. Christie, his District Superintendent, assisted by the writer. Interment was in the cemetery at Waldo.

He was a man of God, honorable and dependable in every respect, and with convictions so strong that there was never a compromise on his part, if he felt there was a moral principle involved. He is at rest, but is greatly missed by his family and friends. All who knew him feel that only victory can be the reward for spirits like his.

It was on June 1, 1942, while Mrs. Beck and Bobby were on their way to visit their loved ones in Conway with their husband and father while he attended the Pastors' School at Hendrix that the fatal tragedy occurred. CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. **Nominations.** The District Superintendents shall be a standing committee on nominations and shall nominate all members of the quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees except where they are otherwise provided for.

2. **Conference Program.** The pastor-host of the Conference, the District Superintendent in whose district the Conference session is held, the chairman of the Commission on Evangelism and the chairmen of the several Conference Boards shall constitute a committee on Conference Program. This committee shall arrange, not less than sixty days before the Conference meets, for all preaching, inspirational and anniversary services and select the Conference preacher. As far as possible it shall publish at least one month before Conference, the hours to be set apart for special services. The program made by this committee shall be subject to revision as the exigencies of any situation may require or the Conference direct.

3. **Financial and Statistical.** (1) All Conference assessments and all reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars with no columns for cents. (2) Each pastor shall settle with the Conference Treasurer and turn over his statistical reports not later than the first day of the Conference, provided this report must correspond with the Treasurer's report. (3) The District Superintendents shall furnish the Statistical Secretary with all assessments and acceptances of pastoral charges not less than sixty days before the meeting of the Annual Conference and these figures shall be accepted as official.

4. **Memoirs of Laymen and Preachers' Wives.** Memoirs of preachers' wives shall be read at the Memorial Service of the Conference and published in the Conference Journal, and preachers' wives shall be invited to take part in the Memorial Session. Names of deceased laymen who have been active in the Annual Conference or served on Conference Boards to be printed in the Conference Journal.

5. **Conference Expense Fund.** The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall make an assessment for a Conference Expense Fund to cover the cost of all clerical work necessary in preparing Conference records, printing, and distributing the Conference minutes, for preserving Conference records and documents, for auditing accounts, and all legitimate expenses incurred by the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer in carrying out the orders of the Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of this fund which shall be paid out on the order of the Conference Secretary.

6. **District Superintendents' Salary.** In each district the District Superintendent's salary shall be estimated and apportioned to the several charges by the District Stewards under the chairmanship of the District Superintendent in a meeting called for that purpose early in the Conference year.

7. **District Expenses.** The District Stewards shall also estimate and apportion to the several charges an amount necessary for district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a Treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and shall distribute same on order of the District Superintendent. The Treasurer shall make an annual report to the District Conference showing receipts and disbursements.

8. **Reports and Resolutions.** All reports, resolutions and other papers intended for publication in the Conference minutes shall be typewritten and in triplicate.

9. **History Commission.** There shall be a self-perpetuating History Commission composed of eight clerical members of the Conference, one of whom shall be the Secretary of the Conference, whose duty it shall be to collect and preserve biographical data of clerical members of the Conference, data of all kinds that promises to be of historical value and interest, the Conference records and other documents of historical value, all such material to be deposited in the Hendrix College vault. The Commission shall make a quadrennial report to the Conference at the session next following the General Conference.

10. **Lay Representation.** In addition to those members provided for in Paragraph 542 of the 1939 Discipline of the Methodist Church, each pastoral charge shall, upon nomination of the pastor, elect either at the annual meeting or at the Quarterly Conference, one representative to the District Conference; provided, that in charges of more than 500 members, one representative shall be for each additional 500 members or major fraction thereof. Alternate lay delegates shall be elected in the same manner as the principal.

11. **Lay Delegates.** Lay delegates to the annual conference shall be elected annually.

12. **District Conferences** shall be held annually in each district.

13. One District Superintendent may serve on each of the major Conference Boards. No member of the Conference shall serve on more than one major Board, provided that this rule shall not apply to those Boards and Commissions appointed by the presiding Bishop, nor to ex-officio members.

14. **District Committees on Qualifications of Local Preachers.** The District Committee on qualifications of local preachers to be nominated by the District Superintendents and confirmed by the Annual Conference shall consist of three traveling elders serving on the District.

16. The audit of accounts of all funds as provided for in Paragraph 801 of the Discipline shall be done by certified public accountants sufficiently in advance of the Conference session to have its report published in the Conference Journal.

17. **Amendment.** These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.

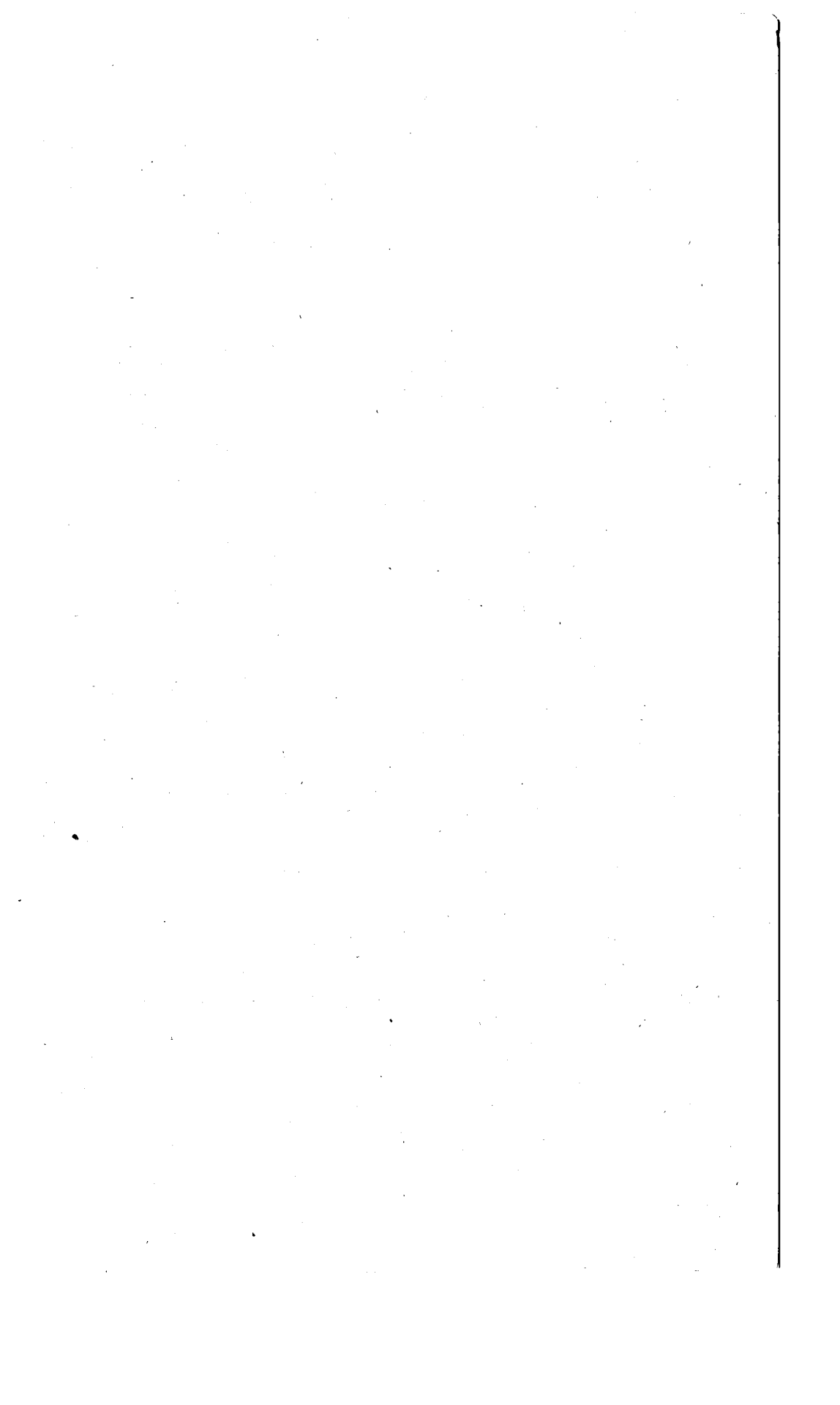
