PROCEEDINGS

THURSDAY AFTERNOON, 2:00 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened. The ninety-second session of the Little Rock Conference of The Methodist Church (which was the seventh session of the United Church) was called to order at the First Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Arkansas, at 2:00 o'clock Thursday afternoon, November 1, 1945, Bishop Paul E. Martin presiding. The congregation stood and sang the National Anthem after which Hymn 402, "Are We Yet Alive" was sung. Rev. H. B. Vaught led in prayer. Rev. Fred R. Harrison, secretary of the last session of the Conference was asked to perfect the roll. He asked that each member of the Conference write his or her name on a slip of paper with the church represented, these names constituting the calling of the roll. After which Fred R. Harrison was elected secretary of the Conference. Brother Harrison named the following assistants: statisticians, Coy E. Whitten and T. T. McNeil; journal clerk, R. B. Moore; assistant, Fred W. Schwendimann; roll clerks, Curtis Williams, Claud Roy; Journal editor, S. T. Baugh.

Rev. W. B. Slack, Conference host, named the bounds of the Conference and moved that the printed program become the order of business of the conference.

Gavel. Bishop Martin called attention to a gavel sent by Chaplain R. O. Beck, made of pear wood by a Polish prisoner of war.

District Superintendents' Character Passed. Names of all district superintendents were called and characters were passed. Rev. J. E. Cooper, secretary of the Cabinet, read corrections in nominations by cabinet for Committees, Commissions and Boards. These were adopted.

Reinstatement. Rev. L. E. N. Hundley's name was referred by Dr. E. C. Rule, to Conference Relations Committee for Effective Relation.

Special Appointments. The names of those receiving special appointments were called and their character passed.

Retired and Supernumerary. The names of the ministers in the retired and supernumerary relation were called and their characters passed.

Announcements. Time and place was announced for meetings of the various Boards and Committees. The Conference adjourned with the benediction by Rev. I. L. Claude, Booneville.

FRIDAY MORNING, 8:30 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened. Bishop Paul E. Martin called the Conference to order at 8:30 o'clock. Hymn No. 2, "We Gather Together to ask the Lord's Blessing," was sung, after which, Rev. Doyle T. Rowe led in prayer. Bishop Martin brought an inspiring meditation on the Scripture, "The Good Samaritan," speaking on the Words, "On The Morrow." Hymn No. 249, "I Love to Tell the Story," was sung concluding the devotion.

Minutes Approved. Rev. C. R. Hozendorf, Chairman of the Committee to Read and Correct the Minutes, reported that the minutes of the last session had been read and approved.

Resolution. Rev. S. T. Baugh was recognized by the chair. He presented a resolution (Attached) for the correction and change of the standing rules of the Conference. The resolution was placed upon the table for the 24 hours required.

Mr. Carl Hollis Excused. Rev. Arthur Terry announced the tragic death of Cone Turner, Jr., nephew of Mr. Carl Hollis of Warren, and asked that Mr. Hollis be excused and that a message of sympathy be sent to the family.

Dr. Clem Baker Returns to Effective Relation. Dr. E. C. Rule made a motion that it is the sense of the Little Rock Conference that from this time forward the Rev. Clem Baker return to the Effective Relation. Dr. C. M. Reves seconded the motion. The motion was passed unanimously.

Methodist Publishing House. Dr. C. M. Reves, representing the Methodist Publishing House, presented a check to the Conference Claimants Board. Mrs. Vera Siegel was presented and brought greetings from the Publishing House. Bishop Martin urged the Ministers to visit the book room and purchase and read good books.

Undergraduate Classes. The Board of Ministerial Training presented Report No. 1 of that Board. (Attached).

Dr. Clem Baker. Dr. Clem Baker was invited to the Chancel and presented to the Conference.

Admitted Into Full Connection. Rev. K. K. Carrithers and James E. Major were admitted into Full Connection, and with them the Class to be admitted on trial were presented "The Book of Worship" by Mr. J. D. Reynolds of Camden.

Visitors. The following visitors were introduced to Conference: Rev. H. T. Blackburn, East Oklahoma Conference, Chaplain Richard Perry, Ex-Chaplain D. T. Rowe, Chaplain John G. Gieck; Rev. Grover Johnson, Rev. Fred Roebuck, Rev. H. M. Lewis, and the Rev. Sam Watson from the North Arkansas Conference; Dr. E. T. Wayland, editor of the Arkansas Methodist, and Dr. M. R. Chambers, professor at Hendrix College.

Adjourned. At 10:30 the Conference adjourned for a fifteen minute intermission.

CONFERENCE REOPENED

Bishop Martin asked that the Conference sing Bishop Cushman's Crusade Chorus, "Set Us Afire." He requested Rev. John McCormack to sing the song, after which the congregation joined in the singing.

World Service and Finance. The World Service and Finance Commission was excused to meet for a brief session.

Rev. B. L. Schubel. The Rev. B. L. Schubel of the Board of Pensions was presented and addressed the Conference on the work of that Board and also represented the Council of Secretaries.

Guests. Mrs. Charles C. Selecman and Mr. and Mrs. J. J. Perkins were invited to the Chancel and introduced to the Conference by Bishop Martin.

Resolution. Dr. E. C. Rule presented a resolution relative to the purchase of a camp site which is attached.

The Bishop's Home. Mr. J. T. Thompson was presented and brought a report of the Committee in charge of providing a home for the Bishop in Little Rock, Ark. The Committee was commended for their fine work and continued for another year.

Board of Education, Report No. 1. Rev. Alfred Freeman, Chairman of the Board of Education, was presented. He asked the Secretary of the Board of Education, Rev. R. B. Moore to read Report No. 1 (Attached). It was adopted, after which Report No. 2 (Attached) was read. Dr. Matt L. Ellis, president of Hendrix College, spoke to the report. It was unanimously adopted.

Bishop Charles C. Selecman. Bishop Charles C. Selecman addressed the Conference on the Perkins School of Theology of Southern Methodist University.

Announcements. Rev. Edward Dunlap announced that the Hendrix College Banquet would be held Saturday afternoon, November 3, at 5:30 o'clock, at Coy's Steak House.

Rev. Neill Hart asked that all Ministers who had not done so, to deliver the packages for the food shower to the Methodist Hospital.

Crusade For Christ. Dr. Albert E. Day, Rev. W. E. Brown, and Rev. K. L. Spore were invited to the platform. Rev. K. L. Spore, chairman of the Board of Evangelism, presided and asked that Rev. J. L. Tucker, Secretary, read Report No. 1 of that Board. It was adopted.

Dr. W. E. Brown led in prayer, after which the congregation remained standing and sang Hymn No. 282, "Soldiers of Christ."

Bishop Charles C. Selecman, president of the General Board of Missions, introduced Dr. Albert E. Day, the guest speaker of the hour.

Hymn No. 279, "God of Grace, and God of Glory," was sung, after which the benediction was pronounced by Bishop Martin.

SATURDAY MORNING, 8:30 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened. The Conference was called to order by Bishop Martin with Hymn No. 213, "My Faith Looks Up To Thee." Dr. Clem Baker led in prayer. Bishop Martin spoke on the text, "Thou shalt not see the a kid in its mother's milk," stating that there was a great need in our day to speak out against those things which offend the highest sensibilities of men. He contrasted such things with the loveliness and beauty available to us. Hymn No. 299 was sung concluding the devotional.

Board of Temperance. Upon request of A. E. Jacobs, chairman, the Board of Temperance was excused for a brief meeting.

Minutes Approved. C. R. Hozendorf reported that the Committee had read and approved the minutes of the last session.

Greetings Received. Greetings to the Conference were brought by Secretary Harrison from the following: Chaplains Mark F. Vaught, Ralph Clayton, D. Mouzon Mann, A. C. Carraway, Bishop W. C. Martin, Rev. M. K. Irvin (Retired), Rev. J. B. Sims (Retired), Rev. J. T. Clark (Retired). A telegram from Dr. R. Z. Tyler of the General Board of Missions was read; in which the Conference was urged to give full support to the Board. It was suggested that the secretary be authorized to send words of greetings to Mrs. J. D. Hammons, who is ill in Little Rock.

Error in Publicity. Rev. A. J. Christie called attention to the incorrect newspaper account of the Crusade Fund of the Texarkana District, asking that it be changed from \$7,000 to \$28,000.

Transfer Out. Bishop Martin announced the transfer of Rev. Alfred H. Freeman to the Southwest Texas Conference.

Board of Education. Report No. 1 of the Board of Education was amended to include: a scholarship of \$7,500 to the Perkins School of Theology at S. M. U., election of officers, and the nomination of a Camp-site Committee.

Board of Education. Report No. 3 of the Board of Education was read by R. B. Moore, secretary of the Board. Rev. Roy E. Fawcett, executive secretary of the Board of Christian Education, spoke on the work of the Board for the past year and plans presented in the reports. The Chairman spoke to the report, which was adopted. Rev. Alfred H. Freeman spoke of his joy in the fellowship of this Conference and a brief farewell message.

Transfer Out. Dr. C. M. Reves, transferred to the North Arkansas Conference, brought a farewell message.

Appreciation Expressed. Dr. J. M. Workman, retired, was recognized and spoke briefly a word of gratitude for the assignment of Dr. Reves to Conway.

Board of Temperance. Rev. A. E. Jacobs, chairman of the Board of Temperance, spoke of the work of that board. An offering for the Anti-Saloon League was taken, \$144 being received.

Changes in Standing Rules. S. T. Baugh referred to the resolution changing and correcting standing rules and moved its adoption. It was passed. Brother Baugh brought a brief oral report of the Historical Society.

Board of Lay Activities. Dr. Matt L. Ellis, Conference Lay Leader, was recognized and called for the reading of the report of the Board of Lay Activities. Mr. T. W. McCoy read the report. Dr. Ellis, retiring Conference Lay Leader, spoke to the report. The report was adopted. Mr. T. W. McCoy, of Benton, was elected Conference Lay Leader. He addressed the Conference briefly.

Order of the Day, 10:00 O'Clock. Report No. 1 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes was read by C. D. Cade. It was adopted.

Mr. B. T. Fooks, chairman of the Methodist Hospital Board, brought report No. 2. It was adopted.

Mr. J. S. M. Cannon brought report No. 3, and spoke to the report. It was adopted.

Mr. Perkins Speaks to Conference. Bishop Martin presented Mr. J. J. Perkins, Wichita Falls, Texas, who addressed the Conference about the Perkins School of Theology at S. M. U., and the Methodist Home for Children of Waco, Texas.

Meeting Called. K. L. Spore, announced meeting of Board representatives during the intermission. The Conference adjourned for ten minutes.

Conference Re-Opened. The Conference re-opened with the singing of "Set Us Afire, Lord," Bishop Cushman's Crusade Chorus.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

Conference Treasurer. Mr. Caughey E. Hayes, treasurer of the Conference, brought in the Conference Treasurer's Report, and it was filed.

Camp-Site Committee. Roy E. Fawcett explained the personnel of the Camp-site Committee and asked that these elections be completed at once.

Resolution. J. S. M. Cannon brought a resolution on the Arkansas Methodist. (Attached). The resolution was adopted.

Arkansas Methodist Commission. The report of the Arkansas Methodist Commission was read by J. S. M. Cannon. Dr. E. T. Wayland, editor of the Arkansas Methodist, addressed the Conference. The report was adopted.

Accepted Supplies. Chas. H. Giessen brought the report of the Committee on Accepted Supplies. (Attached).

Returned to Active List. The Board of Conference Relations reported on the requests of L. E. N. Hundley, retired, and A. N. Stonecipher, supernumerary, for return to active list. The Board recommended that this be done, and the Conference accepted.

Afternoon Session. Motion was made and passed that there be an afternoon session from 2:00 to 4:00 o'clock. Bishop Martin asked Rev. J. M. Hamilton to preside.

District Lay Leaders. Rev. J. E. Cooper read nominations for district lay leaders. (Attached). Motion was made by Dr. Matt L. Ellis, seconded by E. C. Rule, that those nominated be elected. The motion passed.

Sabbatical Year. Rev. A. J. Christie announced the illness of Rev. Harold D. Sadler and asked that Brother Sadler be given a Sabbatical year's leave of absence. The Conference granted the request.

Courtesy Committee. Dr. W. B. Slack presented the following: Dr. and Mrs. Paul D. Womeldorf, Executive Secretary of the South Central Jurisdiction; Edward W. Harris, transferred from North Arkansas Conference; Chaplains Gerry C. Dean and Wm. L. Arnold, members of the Conference in the service.

Jurisdictional Secretary. Dr. Paul D. Womeldorf addressed the Conference and spoke of the work of the new Jurisdictional Council.

Parsonette Luncheon. Dr. W. B. Slack announced the luncheon for minister's wives, given in honor of Mrs. Paul E. Martin. He called attention to the worship services as listed in the printed programs.

Adjourned. Following announcements of Board meetings, the benediction was pronounced by Rev. Dan R. Robinson.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON, 2:00 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened. Rev. J. M. Hamilton, presiding, called the session to order with the singing of Hymn No. 21, "Come Let Us Tune Our Loftiest Song." Rev. O. E. Holmes led in prayer.

Rev. K. L. Spore was recognized, and he brought nominations from the Cabinet for the Board of Evangelism. These were: W. E. Brown, Dan R. Robinson, L. C. Gatlin and Clem N. Baker. The Conference elected.

Widows and Orphans Fund. S. T. Baugh reported upon the liquidation of the Widows and Orphans Fund. (Attached). The report was adopted.

Bible Board. Rev. C. D. Meux brought the report of the Bible Board. It was adopted.

Property Transferred. Rev. R. H. Cannon moved that the Conference Board of Trustees be authorized to transfer Harris Chapel Church lot in Little Rock District back to the original donors or heirs. Motion passed.

Conference Claimants. Report No. 1 of the Board of Conference Claimants was read by S. T. Baugh, and it was adopted. Rev. Otto Teague brought report No. 2, which was filed. Report No. 3 was read and adopted.

Special Chaplain Committee. Rev. A. J. Christie was recognized by the chair. He spoke concerning the responsibility of the Conference for the security of our returning chaplains and read a report setting up a special committee by the Conference for the care of the returning chaplains. The report was adopted.

Motion. A. E. Jacobs moved that if need arise the Board of Ministerial Sustentation be authorized to use a portion of its funds, not to exceed \$1000.00, for the ad interim support of chaplains. The motion was seconded by Clem N. Baker and was passed by the Conference.

Planning Committee. Rev. J. L. Hoover was recognized. He made nomination of J. L. Dedman, H. O. Bolin, and S. T. Baugh to serve as a Planning Committee for the Conference. The motion was seconded by Coy Whitten and was passed by the Conference.

Statistical Report. Rev. Coy Whitten, Conference Statistician, made the statistical report. (For filing).

Announcements. Dr. W. B. Slack gave information concerning the Sunday services, and made some remarks about the entertainment of the Conference. The Doxology was sung and the benediction was pronounced by Rev. Edward W. Harris.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON, 3:00 O'CLOCK

C. C. Coulter. Mr. Clyde C. Coulter, president of the Arkansas Anti-Saloon League, was introduced.

Board of Temperance. Rev. W. D. Golden read the report of the Board of Temperance, which was unanimously adopted.

Camp-Site Committee. The name of Rev. L. M. Starkey was added to the Committee on Camp-sites, representing the Board of Temperance.

Offering. An offering in the amount of \$144.00 contributed by the Conference was presented to Mr. C. C. Coulter for his work in the Anti-Saloon League.

Mr. Hayward Johnson. Rev. A. E. Jacobs, chairman of the Board of Temperance, introduced Mr. Hayward Johnson, Dramatic Director of the Methodist Board of Temperance, who directed the play "The Criminal." Mr. Johnson spoke of his work and an offering was received for the General Board of Temperance.

Mr. Clyde C. Coulter pronounced the benediction.

MONDAY MORNING, 8:30 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened. Bishop Martin opened the session with Hymn No. 220, "Majestic Sweetness Sits Enthroned" after which Rev. O. E. Holmes led in prayer. Bishop Martin read Psalm 84, "How Amiable is

ARKANSAS METHODIST COMMISSION

To The Little Rock and North Arkansas Conferences:

The Arkansas Methodist Commission, comprising equal membership from the Little Rock and North Arkansas Conferences, submits the following report (See Financial Statement from October 15, 1944 to October 15, 1945) and makes the following recommendations for the ensuing year, in accordance with decisions reached in the annual meeting of the Joint Commission on October 19, 1945:

1. That we again record our sincere thanks to Dr. E. T. Wayland for his services as Editor and Business Manager and to the helpful staff of assistants working with him.
2. That the Little Rock and North Arkansas Conferences authorize the Joint Commission of the Arkansas Methodist to incorporate under the laws of the state of Arkansas.
3. That Dr. E. T. Wayland be re-elected as Editor and Business Manager of the Arkansas Methodist.
4. That we request, for the Arkansas Methodist, from the Commission on World Service and Finance, the same apportionments for the ensuing year as were granted by the Conference during the year now closing.
5. That the Annual Conferences adopt as their plan for the Annual Circulation Campaign for the Arkansas Methodist the same general plan that has been followed for the past four years, as recorded in the Conference Journals, and that January 6th through January 13th be fixed as the date for the Annual Circulation Campaign this Conference year.
5. That the subscription price of the Arkansas Methodist be \$1.25, the same as for the past three years.

BOARD OF CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS
Report No. 1

This Conference has responded beautifully to the needs of your Claimants which has enabled your Board to provide a more liberal annuity for all our Claimants. Splendid advancement has been made the past few years toward this worthy objective. This year your Board is paying \$18.00 per service year to retired ministers. This is the result of your sympathetic and loyal support of this cause, and it is most gratifying.

Your Board attempts to keep in touch with all our Claimants throughout the year, and in several cases we have provided needed medical assistance out of our emergency fund.

In compliance with Par. 1613 (10) of the 1944 Discipline, this Conference last year authorized your Board to set aside an amount equal to 5% of our Conference income as a reserve fund "in order to stabilize the annuity rate payable in the Conference." This has been done and will continue until we have accumulated a reserve fund equivalent to 25% of the average annual income for the past five years.

This Conference also authorized your Board to set aside an amount equal to one-half of one percent ($\frac{1}{2}$ of 1%) of the cash salary paid the pastors to be paid the General Board of Pensions for a stabilizing fund to become operative at the next General Conference. This has been done and will continue throughout the quadrennium.

This year a good layman gave your Board a life insurance policy of \$2,500.00 upon which he pays the annual premiums. This is a most thoughtful thing he has done and others may wish to do likewise.

There is no indication that salaries will be reduced any next year therefore the income from assessments should be equal to that of this year or a little more. Therefore your Board most respectfully request the same percent in each bracket as that of 1945.

For pastoral charges paying the pastor:

- to \$ 500. an amount equal to 6% of pastor's salary
- 501. to 1000. an amount equal to 7% of pastor's salary
- 1001. to 1500. an amount equal to 8% of pastor's salary
- 1501. to 2000. an amount equal to 9% of pastor's salary
- 2001. to 2500. an amount equal to 10% of pastor's salary
- 2501. to 3000. an amount equal to 11% of pastor's salary
- 3001. to 3500. an amount equal to 12% of pastor's salary
- 3501. and up an amount equal to 13% of pastor's salary

(Apportionments)

We submit the Claimant Roll, including superannuated preachers, widows of preachers and dependents of deceased ministers, showing the amount allocated to each claimant.

The apportionments are made on an equity basis being determined by the years of service rendered. Apportionments to widows being on a basis of 70% of that which their husbands would receive per year of service, for the actual time of service rendered while she was his wife.

Dependent children's claim is determined by multiplying the father's approved years of service by one-fourth of the annuity rate, provided that in no case the total annuity claim of the children exceed the annuity claim of the deceased father.

Your Board of Claimants is pleased to report that due to effectiveness of the graduated scale of percentages by which the charges pay to this fund, and to the 100% giving of all churches, our funds have been materially increased, and we are able to announce another \$3.00 per year of service increase in our allocations.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Report No. 1

Promotional Work

The Crusade For Christ. We recognize the Crusade for Christ as the chief objective immediately before us. We know that the best laid plans and the most carefully wrought out programs come to naught, except as they find expression in Christian Evangelism, thereby winning men to Christ and Church membership. We take seriously the Challenge set before us for increased Church School enrollment and attendance, for additional officers and teachers, and for commitments to

Christ and Church and Church membership. Believing that these objectives are attainable, we ask that you join with us in making your own the following recommendations:

1. That we cooperate whole-heartedly with other agencies in the community studies that will enable us to know definitely our local responsibilities and opportunities.

2. That we set definite goals for enrollment, for additional workers and for additions to the Church, both on profession of faith and by certificate, these goals to be set in the light of the opportunities that each local situation presents.

3. That, wherever practical, we establish new schools in unchurched areas.

4. That we pledge our undivided support to this work of reaching more people with better Christian teachings, confident that the resources are available for turning the Crusade for Christ into a great movement for the coming of the Kingdom of God.

The Work of the Church School Divisions. It will be our purpose to promote the interests of each age group, with appropriate programs under the direction of the best possible trained leadership.

Training Leadership. We would keep central in our educational emphasis the importance of a trained leadership, people who not only know the way themselves but who are able to share that way with those whom they serve. We recommend both formal and informal training in every situation where workers can be assembled to think together about more effective ways and means of doing their work.

We would keep our workers reminded of the splendid leadership possibilities at Mt. Sequoyah, and would recommend an increased attendance on the part of Conference, district and local Church workers.

The Fourth Sunday Missionary Emphasis. We continue the promotion of the Fourth Sunday program in all our Churches, and recommend, unless otherwise provided for, that the offerings be taken and remitted regularly to the Conference Treasurer.

Wesley Foundation Work. We recommend the continuation of the Wesley Foundation Work in State-supported Schools within the bounds of our Conference, and jointly with the North Arkansas Conference at the University of Arkansas. We would also pledge our support to the student program of our own Hendrix College. We believe that there is a need for a closer and a more regular contact between the local Churches and students in these higher institutions of learning.

Southern Methodist University. We take pride in the fact that Southern Methodist University is rapidly becoming one of the great institutions of the nation. We encourage our young ministers to take theological training there, in the Perkins School of Theology. We recommend a continuance of the \$400 scholarship maintained there for the past several years, said amount to be taken from the Ministerial Education Funds.

On presentation of Bishop Charles C. Seleckman, the Board voted to endow a scholarship in the Perkins School of Theology, to the amount of \$7500.00, payable from promotional funds at the rate of \$2500.00 annually for three years.

We nominate J. D. Reynolds to succeed himself as trustee of Southern Methodist University.

Arkansas Pastors' School. We set as our goal a full attendance of pastors on the Arkansas Pastor's School. The indications are that it will be one of the best schools yet held. We nominate the following to serve on its Board of Managers: A. G. Walton, R. B. Moore, J. L. Dedman, Mrs. T. S. Lovett, W. Neill Hart, Roy E. Fawcett, and C. R. Hozendorf. Cabinet representative, Arthur Terry.

The Methodist Home. We pledge our continued support to the

Methodist Home and our full cooperation with its Superintendent, in the promotion of the Annual Christmas offering.

Philander Smith College: In this day of racial tensions, we would be reminded of the good work done by Philander Smith College for negroes. It is under good administration and is rendering helpful service to its own people and toward a better understanding between the races.

Church School Day. We recommend that Sunday, April 21st, be named as Church School Day, again setting the goal for the offering at \$3600.00.

Conference Staff. We have elected Roy E. Fawcett, Executive Secretary, and request the Bishop to appoint him to this office. We nominate Mrs. W. A. Bates Conference Director of Children's Work, and C. Ray Hozendorf Conference Director of Youth Work.

Changes in Board Organization. Vice-Chairman A. G. Walton was elected to succeed Chairman Alfred H. Freeman, resigned, and W. Neill Hart was elected as Vice-Chairman.

Camp Committee: The Chairman and Executive Secretary were elected to represent the Board on the Conference committee to consider the purchase of a site and the erection of a camp for Conference-wide use.

Appropriations. We request the World Service Commission to continue the same apportionments as last year.

Report No. 3 Ministerial Training and Hendrix College

In cooperation with the Board of Ministerial Training, we recommend the following joint policy for the program of Ministerial Education.

1. To qualify for a loan or work under the Ministerial Education program of the Little Rock Conference, a ministerial student shall have been licensed to preach and duly recommended to the Committee in writing by a District Superintendent.

2. A ministerial student who qualifies may borrow from the Ministerial Education Fund according to his needs, an amount not to exceed \$300.00 in any one year.

3. In repaying his indebtedness to the Fund, a student may be allowed to render service during the vacation season under the direction of the Committee, for which he shall receive credit at the rate of \$25.00 per week for a maximum amount of 12 weeks. If he owes only a part of the maximum amount and if he desires to work and his services are needed, he may work the entire twelve week period, and the amount earned above his indebtedness shall be credited against assistance for future training.

4. A joint committee of six, consisting of the Chairman of the Board of Education, the Executive Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Secretary of the Board of Education, the Chairman of the Board of Ministerial Training, shall allocate all funds according to the need, upon recommendation of the District Superintendents. The ministerial students repaying loans through service during the vacation period shall be assigned by the joint Committee together with the District Superintendents.

5. A note shall be executed for all loans made and such notes shall be credited and marked paid when sufficient satisfactory service has been rendered during the vacation period under the direction of the joint committee and the District Superintendents.

6. The joint committee shall be charged with the responsibility of

keeping informed concerning the progress made by the ministerial student participating in this program, both in his school work and in his work during the vacation period. For continuance in this program the student must maintain a reasonable standard of academic work as well as a high standard of Christian conduct.

7. We recommend that the offering for Hendrix College and Ministerial Education be taken in the month of February, and that the goals be the same as last year, \$8000.00.

8. We recommend that the following trustees for Hendrix College be elected:

Trustees at Large:

H. F. Trotter to succeed himself, term to expire in 1951.

George Pike to succeed G. DeMatt Henderson, deceased, for the unexpired term ending in 1949.

Alumni Trustee:

Lewis P. Mann to succeed himself, term to expire in 1951.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM

Report No. 1

We report that the Board in cooperation with the Board of Education and the Cabinet have set the dates and places for our District Crusade Rallies of Evangelism: Little Rock, Winfield Church, November 13, at 2:30 p. m., to 9 p. m.; Arkadelphia, Arkadelphia, November 14, 10:00 a. m., to 4:00 p. m.; Prescott, Hope, November 15, 10:00 a. m., to 4:00 p. m.; Texarkana, First Church Texarkana, November 16, 2:00 p. m., to 9:00 p. m.; Monticello, Monticello, November 18, 3:00 p. m., to 9:00 p. m.; Pine Bluff, Pine Bluff, First Church, November 19, 2:00 p. m., to 9:00 p. m.; Camden, El Dorado, November 20, 2:00 p. m., to 9:00 p. m. The program in each rally will be arranged by the District Superintendent. The Executive Secretaries of the Boards of Evangelism and Education will appear on each program and the principle address at the night session in each rally will be delivered by some Little Rock Conference preacher, selected by the Superintendent in cooperation with the Board of Evangelism.

We report that plans have been launched and are being developed for a Conference-wide Survey to locate prospects for all our churches. This survey is to be the week of January 6 to 12. The survey is to be conducted by the pastors, except in communities with more than one Methodist Church, where it will be conducted by a Committee provided for by the District Superintendent.

We report that plans are being perfected for a Conference-wide School of Evangelism to be held in Greater Little Rock, January 22-25 inclusive. Every pastor in the Conference is expected to participate in the school. The Greater Little Rock Churches will provide lodging, breakfast and probably supper, while the home churches or districts will provide travel expense and lunch for the pastors participating in the school. Where needed the Conference Board of Evangelism will help in defraying expenses. Dr. Dawson Bryan, of Houston, Texas and author of the book: "A Workable Plan of Evangelism," will direct this school. Following the Conference-Wide School, there are to be Schools of Evangelism throughout the Conference in areas determined by the Superintendents, until every church and community in the Conference has been reached. Goals have been set for the whole church: A million accessions and a million and three hundred thousand inactive members

reactivated. Each pastor should figure his own goal. The goal for each church would be one accession for each eight members the church now has, active and in-active; and re-activate all his present inactive members.

Your Board has re-elected John M. McCormack, our Conference Secretary of Evangelism, and respectfully requests the Bishop to appoint him to serve with his other duties and appointment.

Your Board has gone on record as looking toward that day when ministerial supply and finances will permit the Board to put a full time man in the field to direct visitation and mass and other forms of Evangelism in the Conference.

The Board pledges cooperation with the Bishop and his Cabinet and other Boards and agencies in providing interim work for any of our Chaplains who return during the year.

We urge that there be held in each church during the year a preaching mission, a revival meeting, or a special period of services. However, we call attention to the fact that this, while it is much easier to be done, cannot possibly take the place of a well-planned and strenuously executed program of Visitation Evangelism. In the view of your Board our present goals for the Year of Evangelism, which represent only a part of our real responsibility, cannot possibly be met unless all of us use all methods of evangelism to the limit. This your board urges upon all pastors, lay leaders, and superintendents throughout the year ahead.

It is a real pleasure to have Dr. Albert Day of the General Board of Evangelism and the New Life Movement with us at the session of the Conference. We shall all hear him with much profit to ourselves and to the cause.

The Board of Evangelism has a contract with Radio Station KARK Little Rock. The program known as "Methodist Crusaders" is heard each Saturday afternoon from 1:30 to 2:00. The program costs the Board of Evangelism about \$24.00 each week. The program consists of organ music, gospel songs, Scripture, prayer and a gospel message. Ministers have come in from all over the Conference to speak. Often they bring their best talent from their churches to furnish the music. It is the purpose of the Board to continue this service, and bring in ministers who have not yet appeared on the program. Each minister is urged to prepare carefully a message, making it definitely scriptural, spiritual, and evangelistic.

Letters have been received from all over the state, expressing appreciation for this ministry. One lady wrote saying that she lost her nine year old boy and needed help. She said, "I listen each Saturday to the 'Methodist Crusaders.' It is the only Methodist program on the air that I ever hear. It is so fine and helpful. I thank God for our church." A Presbyterian wrote and said she was inspired greatly by the "Methodist Crusaders" program and hoped other churches will catch the Crusade Spirit. A Baptist Minister called, saying it was one of the best radio religious programs he hears on the air. The management of the radio station expressed satisfaction and very great appreciation for our "Methodist Crusade" program. Figures assembled by radio show that in one religious broadcast we reach as many people with the gospel as a minister does in two years in his own congregation.

With our appropriations we are accomplishing some things through our evangelistic program which otherwise would be impossible. We call attention to projects in four districts: A religious survey of South Hot Springs in the Arkadelphia District reveals the need for a new church in a rapidly growing community. Brother Cooper and Rev. J. D. Baker hope soon to have a new building under way there. In East Jefferson School District, in the Monticello District Rev. Jim Major conducted a revival and established a new Sunday School and preaching

place. Brother Terry hopes soon to have a new church there. We hope also in the Monticello District to secure and operate a "District Gospel Trailer" fully equipped with facilities for conducting open air services in the small towns and open country. In the Red River bottoms in the Texarkana District, Rev. J. Frank Walker conducted a revival and established a new Church School with 57 members and a new preaching place. He and Brother Christie hope within the next year to have a new church building in that community. Through the aid of the Board of Evangelism Rev. Van Harrell has opened three abandoned churches and started services and programs.

We request that our present appropriation remain the same for another year. We suggest a policy of our District Secretaries and Superintendents rendering bills to the Treasurer of the Board, after their projects have been carried through, rather than requesting money before starting their projects, not knowing just how much money will be necessary. This will assure us the largest possible good for each dollar placed in the project. We look forward to the time when our appropriations for each district Secretary will be many times the amount now allowed for such work.

Our financial statement, with the auditors report is attached herewith.

METHODIST HOSPITAL OF ARKANSAS, INC.

Report No. 2 — November 1, 1945

The Board of Trustees of the Methodist Hospital of Arkansas, Inc., submit the following report to the Board of Hospitals and Homes.

A total amount of \$134,316.36 was raised in a campaign as authorized by the Little Rock Conference for purchase of the hospital. An amount of \$100,000.00 was expended for purchase of hospital, and an amount of \$5,509.02 was expended for necessary expenses pertaining to campaign and improvements on hospital property, leaving a balance of \$28,807.34 on hand as of this date.

The operating statement of hospital reflecting operation from June 28, 1945 to September 30, 1945 shows a loss of \$346.28. This loss was

due to the fact that only one-half of the hospital was in operation during this period, as decoration and improvement has been made continuously on property during this time, making full use of hospital impossible.

All of available capital on hand at this time has been set aside for purchase of surgical and other equipment necessary to improve facilities of hospital.

The Board of Trustees are deeply indebted to our director, Dr. John G. Benson, and our superintendent, Miss Harriet Poe, for organization set up by them for operation of the hospital.

We are also deeply indebted to the medical profession of Hot Springs for their cooperation and help in organizing our staff, which is composed of over 40 of the leading physicians and surgeons of the city.

We wish to express our appreciation to District Chairmen in charge of raising hospital campaign funds. These chairmen are:

Bishop Paul E. Martin and his cabinet have endorsed for your consideration, the following program:

That a minimum of \$30,000.00 be raised during the ensuing year by the Golden Cross Society, designating the second Sunday in May (Mother's Day) for this project.

That the District Superintendents prorate to each district and to each charge the amount to be requested from them.

It is respectfully urged that each pastor, church, and church school make every effort to care for the amount designated to them.

Money will also be received as memorials to be used in equipping rooms, etc., pertaining to the full furnishing of the hospital.

We recommend the election of the following trustees for a term of three years:

Homer M. Adkins, E. Clifton Rule, Aubrey Walton, Carl Hollis, and D. W. Harrell.

The Constitution and By-Laws have been formulated and accepted by the Board, also the by-laws, rules and regulations governing the medical staff have been approved both by the Board of Trustees and the medical staff. A copy of the by-laws will be placed in the hand of any pastor requesting it.

A policy has also been formulated governing medical service to be furnished the pastors and their immediate families, as follows:

All services rendered pastors of any church in any district in the Little Rock Conference be charged at the regular rate, but that 40% flat discount be given as a deduction from the total bill when same is paid. This applies also to any member of the pastor's immediate family.

Such discount does not apply to services rendered by the Bath House nor to medical supplies, and it is understood that such discount applies only to what might be termed as room and board.

This policy is to be adopted only for a period of one year, at the end of which time further benefits will be extended if profits of the hospital justify it.

We have secured a new location, consisting of eighty acres adjoining the city limits of Little Rock on the west side. The cost was \$10,500. We are having this property landscaped in preparation for our new building program, which we hope to begin in 1946.

We request the same apportionment of the Conference benevolences as that given us last year.

We are presenting for Conference action proposed and amended Articles of Incorporation, which have been adopted by our Board of Trustees.

Christmas offering envelopes will be provided without cost, and we hope the pastors will make it possible for every member to have an opportunity to make a contribution to the Annual Offering.

LAY ACTIVITIES

Laymen of the Little Rock Conference are increasingly interested and active in the program of Methodism. The record of the Conference in its work on the financial phase of the Crusade for Christ and also in World Service giving evidence of effective cooperation of our laymen and Ministers. We rejoice that the Little Rock Conference leads the Arkansas-Louisiana area in Crusade payments, and we are delighted with reports by our District Superintendents on all phases of Church work. These records indicate to us excellent preparation looking toward 1947 which has been designated as "Stewardship Year" in our Church. Our people are already showing greater stewardship practice, benevolent giving, Ministerial support, and sound, local Church finance, including the reduction of indebtedness on Church property. No one of us is satisfied with our accomplishments, but what has been done challenges us to measure our opportunities to attain the greater goals that lie ahead, as outlined in reports of various Boards.

We recommend:

1. That laymen relate themselves actively in the next phase of the Crusade for Christ with as much willing zeal for evangelism, and for Church School enrollment and attendance as was shown in the effort to meet and exceed financial quotas.

2. That the Fourth Sunday in February, 1946, be observed as Layman's Day, and that as many Churches as can do so have programs given by Laymen.

3. That all parts of the program of our great Church receive our support. We repledge our cooperation with the General Board of Lay Activities in all its work.

4. That continued efforts be exerted toward ongoing Methodist men in every Church.

5. That circulation of church papers and other Christian Literature be emphasized by the pastor and the charge lay-leader of every Church. We urge the committee on Literature of the board of stewards of each local Church to work out a plan whereby good books can be obtained from our publishing house and distributed in our Methodist homes.

Forty-five persons attended the annual meeting of the Board on November 1, 1945, in Hot Springs. A resolution unanimously passed, expressing appreciation to Matt L. Ellis retiring Conference Lay Leader, for his service to the Board.

T. W. McCoy was nominated for Conference Lay Leader. Fred Gantt was elected Secretary and J. S. M. Cannon, Treasurer, of the Board of Lay Activities.

MINISTERIAL SUSTENTATION FUND

We, your Commission on Ministerial Sustentation, submit the following as the amended plan for the incoming year.

I. Commission

1. On nomination of the Superintendent of each of the several districts, the Annual Conference shall elect quadrennially one lay member from his district and one preacher to serve on this Commission. The District Superintendents shall be ex-officio members.

2. The Commission shall elect its own chairman and such other officers as its needs may require.

3. The Commission shall meet annually at least one month before Conference at the call of the chairman, and at such other times and places as needs may require.

II. Beneficiaries

1. Beneficiaries under this plan shall be those ministers serving charges under the appointment of the Bishop, including those on trial, in full connection, and supply preachers who meet disciplinary requirements for supplies.

2. The minimum salary fixed for these shall be \$1,000.00. The Commission will match dollar for dollar as far as its funds permit, any increase paid by any charge over and above the average paid by such charge for the three fiscal years ended in 1941, 1942 and 1943.

III. Raising Funds

1. For the purpose of meeting the requirements set forth in the preceeding paragraph, an apportionment of 1 per cent shall be made on all preacher's salaries of \$1200.00, or more, upon the whole salary and upon all charges paying such salaries.

2. The Treasurer elected by the Commission shall be the one to receive and disburse funds accruing from this source, provided, funds shall be paid only on certification of the District Superintendent of the beneficiary.

3. District Superintendents shall report to the Commission the names of beneficiaries and the amount of aid given. The Treasurer shall keep an itemized account of the benefits paid out and report same to the chairman of this commission as soon as possible.

4. Any part of this plan may be amended at any session of the Conference on recommendation of the Commission, or on motion from the floor of the Conference.

The Division of Church Extension of the Board of Missions and Church Extensions met at First Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Arkansas, November 1st, 1945 at 11:30 a. m., with the following members present: Rev. The report of the Treasurer showed that the Board had a balance of \$3,381.50 in its Loan Fund and \$4,219.51 in its Donation Fund available.

The Executive Committee reported that the following had been recommended in the interim of the Annual Conferences:

Donation to Sardis Church (four miles N. of Stamps, Ark.) in the amount of \$400.00.

Donation to Rock Springs Church (near Wilmar, Ark.) in the amount of \$100.00.

Donation to Fountain Lake Church (near Hot Springs, Ark.) to the amount of \$500.00 from the General Board, and a loan of \$7,500.00 from the General Board.

The following applications for Loans and Donations to the Conference and General Boards respectively were presented before the Board by the Secretary:

1. Application from Geyer Springs to the Conference Board for a donation of \$500.00, and a loan of \$1,000.00 was recommended.

2. Application from Spring Hill Church, Prescott District, to the Conference Board for a donation of \$400.00 was recommended on condition that the amount finish paying for the church.

3. Application from Fountain Lake Church, near Hot Springs, Ark., to the Conference Board for a donation of \$500.00 was recommended, subject to the completion and paying for the Church.

4. Application from Shady Grove Church, near Mena, Arkansas, to the Conference Board for \$500.00 was granted, subject to the completion and payment for the Church.

5. Application from L'Frais Church, on Friendship Circuit, Hot Springs County, to the Conference Board for \$50.00. Donation was recommended.

6. Application from Antoine Church on Antoine Charge, Pike County, to the Conference Board for a donation of \$500.00 was recommended on the certification that all indebtedness was taken care of.

7. Application from Antoine Church to the General Board for a donation of \$500.00 and a loan for \$500.00 was recommended.

8. Application from Fairview Church, near Camden, Ark., to the

General Board for a loan of \$7,000.00 was recommended.

9. Application from the Fountain Lake Church near Hot Springs to the General Board for a donation of \$500.00 was recommended.

10. Tentative application from Rev. A. J. Christie to help build a parsonage in the amount of \$500.00 was made to Conference Board.

11. The Board rescinded the donation of \$400.00 granted Sardis Church, since the church had notified the Board that it would not need the grant.

12. The Board rescinded the grant of \$150.00 made to the Doddridge Church, as the said Church has not qualified for said grant and will not use it.

13. Application from Christie Chapel Church in Columbia County, to the Conference Board for a donation of \$250.00 was recommended.

14. The grant of \$150.00 to Doddridge Church was rescinded as said church is not going to use the donation at the present time.

In accordance with your request we have audited your accounts as Treasurer for the period November 20, 1944 to November 5, 1945, and submit you herewith Statement of Receipts and Disbursements covering the period under review.

There has been remitted to the General Conference Treasurer 50% of collections for Benevolences and World Service, together with the Fourth Sunday offering, less 2½% reserved for Conference expense, and the correct percentage has been passed on to the Conference Boards.

While the Conference has authorized 3% to be used as Conference expense only 2½% has been used. In this connection it will be noted that collections for the Crusade for Christ, including War Bonds, amounted to \$238,684.14, none of which was used for expense and there was paid out of Conference funds \$300.00 for necessary expense of the Crusade for Christ collections.

Of the balance in Bank at November 5, 1945 amounting to \$4,412.01 there is included \$1,575.10 belonging to the Ministerial Sustentation Fund, leaving a Net Credit to expense operating fund of \$2,836.91.

All receipts as shown by the books have been deposited in the bank and the cancelled checks have been submitted for our inspection.

Based on the information obtained and the records examined by us, we believe the above mentioned statements correctly present your handling of the funds during the period above set forth, and which, in our opinion, has been economically and efficiently done.

Gentlemen:

Herewith for your approval I submit my report on the books of the Arkansas Methodist for the year ended October 15, 1945.

Inasmuch as the only records of the office consist of the cash book, I have limited this report to an accounting of the recorded cash receipts and disbursements, together with a condensed balance sheet set up from the audit report of October 31, 1941.

A comparison of the operating statements for the past four years reflects the following substantial improvements in the position of the Arkansas Methodist: (periods ending with October in each year).

U. S. Government Bonds are held in the sum of five thousand dollars, as shown on special schedule. These consist of 7/8% Certificates of Indebtedness, of which \$4,000 are matured.

Real estate owned is shown on the balance sheet at the figures placed by the appraisers secured by your Commission on April 12, 1941.

The property has subsequently been improved, and there has been a substantial enhancement in market value. \$10,000 insurance is carried on the buildings and \$1,000 on the furnishings. These items appear on the balance sheet at a total valuation of \$3,000.

The management does not treat thirty-day accounts payable as liabilities, nor are thirty-day accounts receivable considered as assets; and I have, therefore, disregarded them in the preparation of this balance sheet. Nor are withholding taxes due the Collector of Internal Revenue for the quarter ended September 30, 1945, shown as liabilities. I have, however, verified that all salaries and printing bills are paid to date.

In verification of disbursements, I have examined stubs of check books, all cancelled checks and invoices. Checks are found to be properly drawn, signed and endorsed. In verification of receipts, I have examined all duplicate receipts in the office. All recorded receipts have been properly accounted for.

After considerable search we found what we believe was the most suitable house on the market at the time and within the limits of our Budget. It is a two story structure, on a nice lot at 205 Colonial street, Little Rock. It is located in a very good section, near a Grammar and Junior High School, and within reasonable distance of car and bus lines and shopping center.

The fine manner in which everyone concerned cooperated made this assignment a privilege rather than a chore. The District Superintendents, the Pastors and the Churches over the State, were prompt and generous in supplying the \$8,500 or 1-3 the maximum covered by the Joint Resolution of the Conferences. The Trustees of the two Conferences borrowed \$13,500 from the Board of Church Extension to complete payments on the home, its repairs and furnishings.

The home was rented to Bishop Paul E. Martin on April 1st, 1945 at \$150.00 per month, which amount is being paid on mortgage and interest as his checks are received.

Bishop Martin and his gracious wife seem to be comfortable and happy there and it is a source of inward satisfaction to each of us to feel that we had a small part in realizing such an ambition. Here are the figures:

1. The amount apportioned to this Annual Conference by the General Commission on World Service and Finance is \$42,166.00.

11. The apportionment for the Episcopal Fund is to be an amount equal to 1¾% of the cash salaries of the pastors for the current year.

12. We concur in the report of the Board of Conference Claimants fixing \$28,500.00 as the amount computed by the Board as necessary to meet the needs for annuity payments and relief, setting aside 5% for Conference stabilization and ½ of 1% for Jurisdictional stabilization. We approve the plans of the Board to raise an additional \$30,000.00 for Conference Claimants through individual solicitations and not by every member canvas or popular subscription.

13. We recommend that an amount not to exceed 3% of all funds handled by the Conference Treasurer except Crusade for Christ Funds, be set aside for Conference and Administrative expense.

14. We nominate C. E. Hayes as Conference Treasurer and recommend that his salary be \$60.00 per month and that he be allowed \$60.00 per month for clerical help. We further recommend that he be allowed for the current year an additional \$200.00 for clerical help and \$100.00 for himself as compensation for the extra work of handling the Crusade

for Christ Funds. We nominate Fred Gantt as assistant Conference Treasurer.

15. We approve the plans of the Board of Education to raise in co-operation with the North Arkansas Conference, the sum of one million dollars for expanding the physical plant and increasing the endowment of Hendrix College.

16. We call attention to the plan of the Hospital Board to use Golden Cross Sunday as a time for raising funds for our new hospital, and approve the plan. The minimum goal is \$30,000.00.

INTERIM SUPPORT OF RETURNING CHAPLAINS

The Special Committee composed of T. W. McCoy, Conference Lay Leader, J. L. Dedman, Chairman of the Board of Missions, W. Neill Hart, Vice Chairman of the Board of Education, Andrew J. Christie, representing the Cabinet, and Kenneth L. Spore, Chairman of the Board of Evangelism met to consider the matter of ad interim support and work of returning Chaplains until regular charges could be found for them.

The committee makes the following recommendations:

1. That the returning Chaplains be used in Educational, Missionary, and Evangelistic work in the conference, under the direction of the Bishop and his cabinet, until regular work can be found for them.
2. That they each be assured a salary to be determined by the cabinet.
3. That a contingent fund of \$4,000 be set up to be used by the cabinet in securing the purpose of this program.
4. That the said \$4,000 be provided by the Board of Education and Board of Missions, each contributing \$1500, and the Board of Lay Activities and Board of Evangelism each contributing \$500.
5. That the said funds be used in a pro-rata basis, with the administration in the hands of the cabinet and the treasurers of the boards contributing to the fund.

TO INCORPORATE ARKANSAS METHODIST

BE IT RESOLVED that the Little Rock Conference Representatives on the Arkansas Methodist Commission be and they are hereby authorized and directed to cooperate in necessary steps to incorporate the Arkansas Methodist under the laws of the State of Arkansas, the North Arkansas Conference having heretofore authorized such incorporation.

COMMEND MANAGEMENT

The Commission desires to commend the business management of the property owned by the Arkansas Methodist at 1018 Scott Street, Little Rock. Under the present management, the property has been cleared of all indebtedness and is now producing a substantial income for the paper.

The floor space in the building, formerly used as the office of the Arkansas Methodist is now renting for \$45 per month, which amount practically pays the rent on the down-town office which the Arkansas Methodist occupies in the Donaghey Building. The down-stairs floor space, formerly occupied by the editor of the Arkansas Methodist as living quarters has been converted into apartments which are now renting for seventy-five dollars per month, while the present editor provides his own home with a rent allowance of forty dollars per month.

If we add to the net cash receipts from the building, as shown in the financial report submitted for record, the \$240 rent allowance made to the assistant editor on salary, and subtract from expenditures two-thirds of the amount paid for insurance policies which run three years, we have a net profit of \$1,684.53 from the operation of the building this year. That amount will pay for the down-town office of the Arkansas Methodist and the rent allowance for the editor's home and still have a net profit of \$604.53 to the paper.

It is the feeling of the Joint Commission, after careful study of the matter on different occasions, that the property, as now administered, is a decided asset to the Arkansas Methodist.

AN ENABLING ACT**Authorizing the Purchase and Development of a Camp Site**

Whereas there is deep felt and widespread need for Methodism in the Little Rock Conference to have a camp, where Youth Assemblies, W. S. C. S. Meetings, Laymen's meetings, Missionary Institutes, Evangelistic Services, and other programs can be held;

And, whereas the time now seems right to purchase and develop the same;

BE IT RESOLVED:—

1. That a Committee, composed of one representative from and selected by the Conference W. S. C. S., the Conference Board of Missions, the Conference Board of Lay Activities, the Conference Board of Evangelism, the Conference Board of Temperance, the Conference Board of Ministerial Training, the Little Rock Methodist Council, and two members from the Conference Board of Education, be and is hereby constituted.

2. That the above Committee be and is hereby empowered to act for the Conference in selecting, purchasing a camp site, and developing facilities thereon, subject to the final approval of the Annual Conference.

3. That the said Committee shall be convened for purposes of organization by the Bishop within 60 days after the adjournment of this Conference, at such time and place as he shall determine.

4. That said Committee be and is hereby empowered to receive gifts, donations, devises, bequests, subscriptions, etc., from individuals, boards, agencies, and other groups to secure the purposes of this Act; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as power to involve the Conference in debt or to launch a Conference-wide financial campaign with quotas, allocations, or any other type of apportionments to the districts and charges, without specific permission of the Annual Conference.

5. That the Committee herein provided for shall be deemed the Board of Trustees of any other property or funds secured under the provisions of this Act, until a permanent Board of Trustees shall be set up at the next regular session of the Annual Conference after such property has been secured.

14. **District Committee on Qualifications of Local Preachers.** The district Committee on qualifications of local preachers shall consist of three traveling elders in the District.

15. Correct second line to read: Paragraph 722 of the 1944 Discipline.

Change the order numbering the Rules as follows: Present No. 12 to become No. 10; Present No. 10 to become No. 11; Present No. 11 to become No. 12, which is a more orderly arrangement.

Memoirs

DR. WHITE CALDWELL WATSON

Dr. White Caldwell Watson, the son of the Reverend Ezekiel and Dora Crowson Watson, was born in the Methodist parsonage at Falcon August 16, 1869. He passed to his eternal reward on Monday morning, July 2, 1945, in Little Rock. He gave fifty-three years of his life to the ministry of the Methodist Church in Arkansas, preaching the gospel to countless numbers, leading thousands to Christ, and bringing inspiration and comfort to all with whom he came in contact.



Dr. Watson united with the Church in early youth, heard the call to the ministry as a young man, and was licensed to preach in Asbury Church in 1892. He was admitted on trial in the Little Rock Conference in the fall of 1892 at Magnolia. He was admitted into full connection in 1894, ordained a deacon in 1894, and ordained elder in 1896. He completed his academic training in Henderson and Hendrix Colleges, but continued to be a student all his life, not only a student of books but a student of men. Dr. Watson was loved by those whom he served. He was a strong preacher, a good pastor and a splendid administrator.

During his long years in the Methodist ministry Dr. Watson served the following appointments: England, Daleville, Mabelvale, Marion, Carlisle, Junction City, Hunter, Memorial, Hope, Lakeside in Pine Bluff, Camden, Warren, Commissioner of Galloway College, Pine Bluff District, Blytheville, Helena, First Church, Hot Springs, First Church, El Dorado, Texarkana District, Pine Bluff District, Malvern, Hunter Memorial.

He retired in 1942 after a very successful pastorate at Malvern, having reached the compulsory retirement age. However, early in 1943 when Hunter Memorial, Little Rock, became vacant due to the fact that the pastor, Alton J. Shirey, entered the chaplaincy of the United States Army, Dr. Watson was appointed supply pastor of that church. He was enjoying a great pastorate there when he became ill in the fall of 1944, from which illness he did not entirely recover, although such was the love of his people that they insisted upon his remaining their pastor until the end. As the Reverend Kenneth Spore says of Dr. Watson in his book *The History of the First Methodist Church of Camden, Arkansas*, "It is very probable that no man alive has received more members into the churches of this Conference than has W. C. Watson."

Dr. Watson was married to Miss Camille Powell October 25, 1899, at Marion, Arkansas. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Camille Powell Watson; by four daughters, Mrs. Louise Daley, of Boston, Mass., Mrs. Camille McDaniel, of Hot Springs, Arkansas, Mrs. Lansdale Harvey, of Cleveland, Ohio, Mrs. Jimmie Lewis Mixter, of Boston, Mass.; and by one son, Lieutenant Caldwell Watson, of Malvern, at present with the U. S. Army. There are twelve grandchildren.

When such a saintly soul comes to the end of the way, and we look back at his gracious life, at his great ministry, and at the host of people who rise up to call him blessed, we seem to hear the voice of our Heavenly Father saying "Well done, thou good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joys of the kingdom."

Dr. Watson has left for us an example and a challenge in Christian devotion, fellowship and service that will last across the years. Servant of God, well done!"

JOHN FALL TAYLOR

When David heard that Abner was slain, he exclaimed: "A prince and a great man hath this day fallen in Israel." These words can be fittingly applied to John Fall Taylor who was born May 12, 1867, in Chirena, Texas. He was the son of Dr. Daniel Thomas and Mary Louise Taylor who moved from Georgia to Texas and from thence to Arkansas, settling in Garland County near Hot Springs where John F. grew to manhood.



Very early in life, he professed faith in Christ and united with the Methodist Church in which church he was destined through the full consecration of all his powers to play a goodly role for more than fifty years. On September 18, 1914, he married Miss Lida Smith who survives him and who for more than thirty years held up his hands as he preached the word of truth to thousands of spiritually underprivileged people throughout the state of Arkansas.

Brother Taylor was admitted on trial in the Little Rock Annual Conference at Arkadelphia in 1891. It would be interesting to list the appointments to which he was assigned from 1891 to 1929, the latter date marking the time when he ceased to take regular work and became a conference missionary. A study of these appointments would indicate something of the consecration and devotion of this great man of God. Without an exception, they were "hard works" as we say. He not only went to them uncomplainingly but joyfully, saying as he often did, "that any church in Methodism presented a challenge of service that the highest angel of heaven should covet." However, the shortness of time and the unavailability of the records make it impossible to list his appointments chronologically.

Great personalities become symbols of certain great truths operating in the struggle of man for his place in life. Lincoln symbolizes the emancipation of the slaves of America. Wilson symbolizes the spirit of Democracy, etc. When the name, "Brother Jack Taylor," is mentioned, to those who knew him, certain great habits and activities of sainthood spontaneously spring up in their minds.

1. He was one of the most powerful men in prayer that I have ever heard. Others might say more beautiful prayers, but none could pray with more persistency, more faith, and more eloquence of the spirit than he. He prayed with and for people everywhere—in their homes, on the roadside, in sick rooms, in prison and death cells. Everywhere he went his voice was lifted up in supplication before the throne of God's grace. Oftentimes he would become sublimely eloquent in the act of prayer.

2. He had the most persistently burning passion for lost men that this writer ever saw manifested. In all his contacts with men, he always managed somehow to learn of their relationship to Christ. The weather was never too hot nor too cold for him to drag his old crippled and painridden body across the country in search of those who were lost. He was a democratic soul. He was interested in everybody. No matter of human wellbeing was foreign to his sympathy and his kindly ministry.

3. His life was characterized also by his unwavering loyalty to the inner convictions of his heart. His ears were never attuned to the currents of public opinion. He cared not if his stand involved his standing alone. He was as courageous as a lion. He knew not the emotion of physical fear.

4. But that which stands out and above all the other great qualities of his life was his utter forgetfulness of himself. In that, he was the superman. He was the most unselfish human being I have ever known. The consideration of self never seemed to enter the picture in his thinking. For instance, his salary on those hard circuits never amounted to as

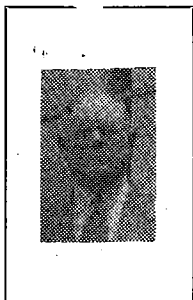
much as the average preacher spends in an incidental way. And yet by dint of an almost unprecedented self-sacrifice, he has build up a Missionary Endowment Fund of near \$29,000.00. He retired three years ago and began receiving a stipend from the church of from seven to eight hundred dollars per year, and it was his humble boast that not one cent of this money was ever used by either himself or his good wife. We stand before the exhibition of such unparalleled sacrifice, such unfaltering devotion, and such invincible faith and say: "I do not believe that God requires that much of me." I do not think so either. (It would cost me too much.) But I do think that the road is open and the challenge is made to any man who will pay the price of delving into the deep secrets of the mind and spirit of Jesus and expressing that new-found knowledge by a great act of consecration.

"Brother Jack" is gone. His work has been accomplished. But the sweetness and purity of his great life will continue as a sweet savor to refresh and inspire people to deeper and richer living down the years. He passed away on Friday, October 5, 1945, at 4:00 P. M., in the triumphs of the great faith that sustained and guided him for almost eighty years. His funeral was held in the First Methodist Church, Malvern, Arkansas, and was conducted by the pastor, assisted by Rev. J. E. Cooper and Rev. J. M. Hamilton. His body lies in Oak Ridge Cemetery in Malvern awaiting the resurrection call.

SILAS CELBY DUGGER

Silas Celby Dugger, son of William L. and Mary Naioma Dugger, was born February 27, 1882 at Dugger Mills near Everton, Arkansas. He was educated in the common schools of that section and in nearby academies. He was married November 6, 1910 to Minnie A. Holmes. He was licensed to preach in the Methodist Episcopal Church in the state of Nebraska. Moving to Missouri he became affiliated with the Congregational Methodist Church and received Elder's Orders.



Later he was an accepted supply in the Methodist Episcopal Church, Springfield District, Missouri Conference. In the fall of 1937 he was admitted to the Arkansas Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church and ordained Deacon. The following year he was ordained Elder. In November 1939, by the process of unification he became a member of the Little Rock Conference of The Methodist Church.

Before entering the ministry Brother Dugger taught school in Boone, Newton and Searcy Counties in Arkansas. Later he became engaged in railroad work as a station agent in Nebraska, Missouri and Arkansas. His first appointment as a supply pastor was in 1927. His appointment in the three churches

were: Methodist Episcopal Church, Judsonia February 1927-1930; Ava, Missouri 1930-1934; Almyra, Arkansas 1934-1937. Judsonia 1937 (By agreement with the Methodist Protestant Church.) Methodist Protestant Church, Ebenezer Circuit in Columbia County, Arkansas 1938. The Methodist Church, Prescott Circuit 1939; Wilmar Circuit 1940; Kingsland Circuit 1941; Watson-Kelso 1942 until his death, January 15, 1945.

Death came suddenly. His wife was near death in a Dumas Hospital. He had just wired that message to a son, Harold, and requested his other son Howard to help him outside the station for air. Before help could arrive he was gone.

On January 17, while arrangements for services were incomplete, Mrs. Dugger passed away. A double service was held in the church at Watson January 19, conducted by the District Superintendent, Arthur Terry, assisted by Rev. R. F. Sorrells and Rev. R. A. Teeter with other ministers of the Monticello District serving as pall bearers. A second

service was held the following day at Valley Springs, Arkansas conducted by Rev. T. R. Whiddon, assisted by Rev. W. F. Cooley. Burial was in Maplewood Cemetery at Harrison.

Brother Dugger made a good appearance, always clean and carefully attired. He possessed a quiet dignity. He was a good business man in his personal affairs and in matters pertaining to the church. He was a systematic student of the Holy Scriptures; a tireless worker; a constant pastor; a consecrated and effective Christian minister loved by his congregations, highly esteemed by his brother ministers and respected by all who knew him.

The journals of the churches for which he served will reflect progress to the Kingdom of God in the work committed to his care. It is probable that no charge ever made greater progress than Watson-Kelso did under his wise and spiritual leadership. Two sons survive, Leland Howard and Harold H. The love and sympathy of this Conference is hereby extended to them in memory of their beloved parents.

J. T. THOMPSON

Rev. J. T. Thompson was born in Nevada County, Arkansas, Nov. 4, 1871, the son of Asbury Taylor and Martha Singleton Thompson. On January 2, 1889, he was married to Mae Herring who survives him. To this union the following surviving children were born: Floyd E., W. Oren, Ira C., Clare, Watson, and Harry G.



His was the life of an active Christian. At the age of sixteen, he committed his life to Christ and united with the church. For a number of years he served as a Y. M. C. A. secretary where his influence was for good among the scores and hundreds of youth whom he touched. In 1920, he was received into the Little Rock Conference and appointed to Capitol View Church in Little Rock, where he remained for five years. His later service record is as follows: Carr Memorial four years, Bearden two years, Tillar two years, Blevins four years, Forest Park two years, Eudora four years, and Bryant almost a year and a half.

In 1943, he took the retired relationship, thinking to settle down for the remaining years of his life to a well-earned rest. But in view of the pressing need for pastoral leadership, he again answered the call of his church and accepted the last named charge, where in the same spirit that characterized his earlier years, he gave himself beyond the measure of his strength to the tasks to which he had been assigned. Following a brief illness, the end came on April 12, 1945, and his body was laid to rest in Pinecrest Memorial Park.

In the truest sense of the word, he was a good man. For the almost quarter of a century during which he was at the call of the church, he was a faithful itinerant preacher. Without show or pretense, he quietly gave himself with unquestioned devotion and loyalty to the Christ to whom he had committed himself as a lad, and in whose service he found the meaning of life.

J. R. DICKERSON

John Robert Dickerson was born August 27, 1864 in Atlanta, Georgia and passed away December 16, 1944 at a hospital in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

For a number of years he fought the "call" to the ministry, going

to California in an effort to escape. But while there he went with a friend to a Methodist District Conference. As a result the same year he was licensed to preach at Fresno and returned immediately to Rome, Georgia where he was admitted on trial in 1894. He wanted to transfer to California but his bishop persuaded him to come to Arkansas.



So, at the Annual Conference in 1894 he began his ministry at Washington where he served one year. The next year he moved to the DeAnn Circuit where he served two years. In 1896 his wife, whom he married in 1894, died. She was buried at Washington. It was also in this year that he built two churches on the same spot. After building the church at DeAnn he was on his way to Prescott to take out insurance on the structure when someone phoned him that the church had just burned. He came back immediately, cleared away the ashes almost before they had quit smoking, and built another church, completing this second building just a few weeks before the Annual Conference meeting.

Brother Dickerson built five Parsonages and thirteen Churches during his ministry. He served Parkdale twice—the first time building a parsonage, the second time, their present church building.

After the two years at DeAnn he served the following appointments: Texarkana Circuit, one year; DeWitt, four years; Pine Bluff, Riverside (now Carr Memorial), two years; Parkdale, two years; student Vanderbilt University, two years; Wesson, three years; Hot Springs, Third Street (now Grand Avenue), one year; Superannuated for one year because of ill health; Murfreesboro, one year; Lewisville, two years; Pine Bluff, Hawley Memorial, one year; Hot Springs Circuit, four years; Fairview, Texarkana, two years; Portland-Parkdale, five years; Bearden, one year.

His health failed again during his year at Bearden and he retired in October. However, early in the next year he supplied the Hot Springs Circuit until Conference; then was appointed a supply for the Springhill Circuit which he served his last full year before retiring permanently. His last sermon on this Circuit, which he did not then think was to be his last, was oddly enough from this text: "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith; henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness."

At the Conference in 1917 the bishop assigned him to a charge that paid \$1,200 but he requested the bishop to change his appointment to the Hot Springs Circuit (which paid \$210). In defense of his request he is reported to have said: "The rural church work is seemingly all on paper. I want this mission circuit just to see, and prove, what rural churches can do if given a chance." He served this charge for four years, built two Churches, at New Salem and Mt. Vernon, remodeled the Parsonage, collected all Centenary moneys, raised and increased the finances each year, and left the Charge paying a salary of \$1,200.

During his vacations while attending Vanderbilt he was busy preaching. The first summer he served as Pastor of the Prescott Church; the second summer he served the Church at Miami, Oklahoma. Here he built and furnished a beautiful Parsonage, living in it only five weeks himself before leaving. He returned to the Little Rock Conference that Fall.

Brother Dickerson always left the Churches he served much better—physically, financially, spiritually. He would have been an outstanding success in any business field he might have chosen.

He was married the second time, June 2, 1888, to Mrs. Sue Burch who so faithfully served with him through twenty-nine years of active ministry and helped him through these fourteen years of his retirement.

His funeral was held in Fairview Church, Texarkana, with the Pastor, Rev. Fred L. Arnold; the District Superintendent, Rev. A. J. Christie; the Rev. C. M. Reves, and the writer. Interment was in the cemetery at

tioned at England. In some ways coming home meant a loss to him. But his joy in being back among the scenes of his youth was great. Though in poor physical condition he gave himself with faith and devotion to the Church in England. He found much to admire and to love in his work with these good people. His words of affectionate regard for them were a sincere expression of his heart. He had served much larger congregations, but somehow his months of pastorate here were the crowning glory of his life. The people responded to him. They were attracted by his gentlemanliness. They were helped by his wise counsel. They were stirred by his affectionate pastoral care. They were stimulated and quickened by his pulpit ministry. They were grateful that this man and his great helpmeet had come their way. And by every token they expressed their regard.

He had served well. He had loved deeply. He had gathered the treasures of friendship. He had suffered. He had triumphed. In that kind of life one comes to know the "joy of the Lord." But we believe that for him and for us there is even a better thing, and that when the servant in faithfulness completes his work there is One who whispers in love, "Well done, good and faithful servant, enter into the joys of thy Lord."

MARION STINSON MONK

Marion Stinson Monk, son of Dr. Alonzo and Elizabeth Carl Monk, and for thirty-five years a Methodist minister, came to the close of his earthly career at England, Arkansas, August 8th, 1945. He was born at Camden, Arkansas, in 1883, when his distinguished father was pastor of the Church there.

He was educated at Georgia University and at Vanderbilt University.

It was his first purpose to give his life to the practice of law, and for sometime he followed that profession in Memphis, Tennessee. But his life work was the Christian Ministry and in 1910 he became pastor of Twenty-Eighth Street Church in Little Rock. That fall the Little Rock Conference met at Prescott, and he was admitted on trial. He had completed the year at Twenty-Eighth Street and was returned for the year 1910-11. In the fall of 1911 he was sent to Stephens and served there two years, he was then at Camden four years, Malvern two years, Central Avenue in Hot Springs four years, Lakeside in Pine Bluff two years. He was transferred to the Louisiana Conference in 1925 and was pastor of First Church Monroe, four years. Because of illness he was with-

out a pastorate in 1930. He then served Parker Memorial in New Orleans five years, 1931 to 1935, and went from there to Alexandria for four years. He was then at Bastrop a year and at Mansfield four years. In the fall of 1944, he was transferred back to his home Conference and stationed at England, Arkansas.

In 1911 he was married to Miss Lena Nichols of Little Rock. There was born to them a son, Marion Stinson, whose home is now in Bachelor, Louisiana. There is surviving also one sister, Mrs. Gid J. Bryan of Waxahatchie, Texas.

My first recollection of Marion Monk is of a handsome young man with a rich, full voice and with a spirit of gracious courtesy that manifested itself in thoughtful kindness toward a boy just beginning his ministry. The last impression of a man who had suffered greatly but had never lost the kindness and courtly charm of manner that distinguished him in his early years. He had suffered and his body bore the marks, but his spirit had found in the fire only refinement. The things that had happened to him had not been greater than his love and faith.

To him Arkansas and the Little Rock Conference were home. For the churches and ministers and people here he had a deep and tender affection. This was his native soil. He asked Bishop Martin to bring him home and his request was granted in his transfer back to be sta-

Minnie Holmes Dugger was born at Conway, Arkansas, October 21, 1882, the eldest daughter of David D. and Emma Holmes. Shortly her family moved to Valley Springs, Arkansas and she was educated in the academy there. On November 6, 1910 she was united in marriage to Silas Celby Dugger. Three children blessed the union. Two of them survive. They are Leland Howard and Harold H. Dugger.

Mrs. Dugger married a Christian layman. Presently he became a local preacher, then a supply pastor and finally an itinerant Methodist minister. She made the transition admirably. She was first of all a Christian home maker and mother as is evidenced by the atmosphere which permeated her parsonage home and by the characters of her two noble sons. She was equally the minister's wife. To be in her presence was to think such thoughts as modesty, refinement, patience, industry, peace, joy and devotion. Her countenance was constantly radiant with a smile. Her confidence in her husband's ability and her interest in his work was contagious. His congregations loved her devotedly.

In January 1945, while her husband was serving his third year as pastor of Watson-Kelso, she was stricken with pneumonia and passed away in a hospital at Dumas, Arkansas, January 17, 1945, just two days after the sudden death of her beloved husband.

MRS. D. D. WARLICK

Mrs. Mary Frances Warlick, the daughter of George and Caroline McCary, was born near Harpersville, Alabama, May 5, 1862, and died in Dallas, Texas, January 30, 1945. Her opportunities for an education were limited by the fact that her parents suffered all the privations growing out of Civil War conditions and her only schooling was a few weeks each year in the old fashioned log school house. But by reason of an indomitable will and an inherent thirst to know things, she managed to effect a state of preparedness that enabled her to cope to a remarkable degree with the heavy demands on her life.

In 1884, she met and was happily married to Rev. D. D. Warlick who was the "Methodist Circuit Rider" and who had built a little church near her father's farm. This was the first of a long succession of church building programs that crowned the success of this tireless and consecrated pair of Christian workers. Their labors represented a long pilgrimage. First, they went to Florida in hope of bettering the health of Sister Warlick, but finding her condition unimproved, they moved to Texas in 1886. They remained there for only a short time and then came back to Arkansas. Later they moved to Oklahoma where they found opportunity to match the rugged qualities of which they were built against the frontier conditions of that wild and unevangelized section of the country. But realizing that such conditions were inimical to her increasing ill health, they again moved to Florida where Brother Warlick was station at Pierson. After completing his work there, he became financial secretary of Hiram and Lydia College at Altus, Arkansas. This new assignment offered them the opportunity of wielding a great influence with young people for which they seemed to be especially gifted. The glory of their ministry in this respect is evidenced by the many leading laymen and preachers across the land, who bear the unmistakable marks of their personalities. They finally moved to Arkadelphia and built a home. There Sister Warlick had unlimited access to the heart problems of the student body of Henderson College and through christian tact and deep spiritual insight, she was able to safely guide scores and hundreds of these fine young people into safe paths, young people who now rise up and call her blessed.

Sister Warlick gave to the world a fine family: one son, Marvin T., who lives in Eugene, Oregon and three daughters, Mrs. R. M. Cantrell of Fort Worth, Texas, Mrs. J. A. Hillard of Dallas, Texas, Mrs. Vincent Carr of Lubbock, Texas. The evening of life found her with a wasted body but with a soul still young and sweet. "In the quietness of her room while two of her children anxiously waited, she calmly smiled when told that the others were coming, then closed her eyes in eternal peace." She had little of earth's wealth during her life-time, "but as she stood before the Great White Throne her hands were full of the things she had given away."

Mrs. Milton K. Irvin whose maiden name was Jennie Naler, was born at Waco, Texas, December 1, 1878. She was the daughter of J. Howard and Nancy Moore Naler. On October 9, 1896, she was married to Rev. Milton K. Irvin, a minister of the Methodist Church, and as the companion of this highly cultured Christian gentleman, she gave almost fifty years of service to the Church. Brother Irvin was always highly acceptable to the people that he served and generally spent an unusually long period of service in the Churches to which he was assigned. And those of us who were privileged to know this family intimately, realize that no small measure of this acceptability and success was due to the consecration and the cultural contributions of his good wife. Hers was a full and rich life. For when she was only eleven years of age, she dedicated herself to Christ, united with the Methodist Church, and for fifty-five years gave of her best to her Master.

Sister Irvin was an unusual soul, and made many rare gifts of her personality to her home, to the Church, and to the world. She was a faithful handmaid of her Lord and no interest of His kingdom escaped either her attention or sympathy. But possibly her largest and most inspiring contribution was in the field of sacred music. She had one of the finest, deepest, and richest natural contralto voices that one nearly ever heard. She had a marvelous power of musical insight that enabled her to interpret and express the profoundest meanings of the "musical page." I once heard her and three other women sing at a district missionary meeting at Portland, Arkansas. They used that little song that had never especially impressed me—"Tell It Again."—the story of a little Gypsy boy who lay dying at the close of the day. But Sister Irving so arranged those words and so interpreted and rendered the music that I heard not only the cry of the Little Gypsy Boy, but the plaintive voices of the unchurched and unchristian millions across the world. The echoes of that hour still reverberate in the deep of my soul.

She looked well to the interest of her home. It was always a joy and distinct privilege for the writer, who served as their Presiding Elder for five years, to enter the fellowship of the home of this Godly man and his consecrated help-meet. Sister Irvin gave two children to the world whose moral and spiritual worth bear testimony to the faithfulness and good sowings of their great mother. The daughter, Reba, now Mrs. J. Roddey Edwards Jr., resides in Columbia, South Carolina. The son, Cecil H., resides in Texarkana, Arkansas. Besides the husband and two children, she is survived by three lovely granddaughters, Reba, Wanda, and Juanita Edwards.

Sister Irvin passed to her reward on October 30, 1945 and was buried at Columbia, South Carolina. May God's blessings abide upon this good family.

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. **Nominations.** The District Superintendents shall be a standing committee on nominations and shall nominate all members of the quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees except where they are otherwise provided for.

2. **Conference Program.** The pastor-host of the Conference, the District Superintendent in whose district the Conference session is held, the chairman of the Board of Evangelism and the chairman of the several Conference Boards shall constitute a committee on Conference Program. This committee shall arrange, not less than sixty days before the Conference meets, for all preaching, inspirational and anniversary services and select the Conference preacher. As far as possible it shall publish at least one month before Conference, the hours to be set apart for special services. The program made by this committee shall be subject to revision as the exigencies of any situation may require or the Conference direct.

3. **Financial and Statistical.** (1) All Conference assessments and all reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars with no columns for cents. (2) Each pastor shall settle with the Conference Treasurer and turn over his statistical reports not later than the first day of the Conference, provided this report must correspond with the Treasurer's report. (3) The District Superintendent shall furnish the Statistical Secretary with all assessments and acceptances of pastoral charges not less than sixty days before the meeting of the Annual Conference and these figures shall be accepted as official.

4. **Memoirs.** All memoirs of members of the Conference shall contain date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, names of all charges served, and place of burial. A small picture of each member of the Conference shall be printed with his memoir. Memoirs of preachers' wives shall be published in the Conference Journal. Names of deceased laymen who have been active in the Annual Conference or served on Conference Boards be printed in the Conference Journal.

5. **Conference Expense Fund.** The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall make an assessment for a Conference Expense Fund to cover the cost of all clerical work necessary in preparing Conference records, printing, and distributing the Conference minutes, for preserving Conference records and documents, for auditing accounts, and all legitimate expenses incurred by the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer in carrying out the orders of the Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of this fund which shall be paid out on the order of the Conference Secretary.

6. **District Superintendents' Salary.** In each district the District Superintendent's salary shall be estimated and apportioned to the several charges by the District Stewards under the chairmanship of the District Superintendent in a meeting called for that purpose early in the Conference year.

7. **District Expenses.** The District Stewards shall also estimate and apportion to the several charges an amount necessary for district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a Treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and shall distribute same on order of the District Superintendent. The Treasurer shall make an annual report to the District Conference showing receipts and disbursements.

8. **Reports and Resolutions.** All reports, resolutions and other papers intended for publication in the Conference minutes shall be type-written and in triplicate.

9. **Historical Society.** There shall be a Historical Society composed of the present members of the History Commission, the Secretary of the Conference, and additional members nominated by the Cabinet and elected by the Conference. It shall be the duty of the Society to collect and preserve biographical data of clerical members of the Conference, data of all kinds that promise to be of historical value and interest. Such material to be deposited in the vault of Hendrix College, Conway, Arkansas. This Society shall make a quadrennial report to the session of the Conference next following the General Conference.

10. **District Conferences** shall be held annually in each district.

11. **Lay Representation.** In addition to those members provided for in Paragraph 666 of the 1944 Discipline of the Methodist Church, each pastoral charge shall, upon nomination of the pastor, elect either at the annual meeting or at the Quarterly Conference, one representative to the District Conference; **provided**, that in charges of more than 500 members, one representative shall be for each additional 500 members or major fraction thereof. Alternate lay delegates shall be elected in the same manner as the principal.

12. **Lay Members.** Lay members to the annual conference shall be elected annually.

13. **Limits.** No member of the Conference shall serve on more than one of the following major Boards: Conference Claimants, Education, Evangelism, Hospitals and Homes, Missions and Church extension, and Temperance. Any member of any Board or Commission failing to attend at least one meeting of said Board or Commission in a period of twelve calendar months shall cease to be a member and his place shall be filled as provided in Rule 1.

14. **District Committee on Qualifications of Local Preachers.** The district Committee on qualifications of local preachers shall consist of three traveling elders in the District.

15. **Audit.** The audit accounts of all funds as provided for in Paragraph 722 of the 1944 Discipline shall be done by certified public accountants sufficiently in advance of the Conference session to have its report published in the Conference Journal.

17. **Amendment.** These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.

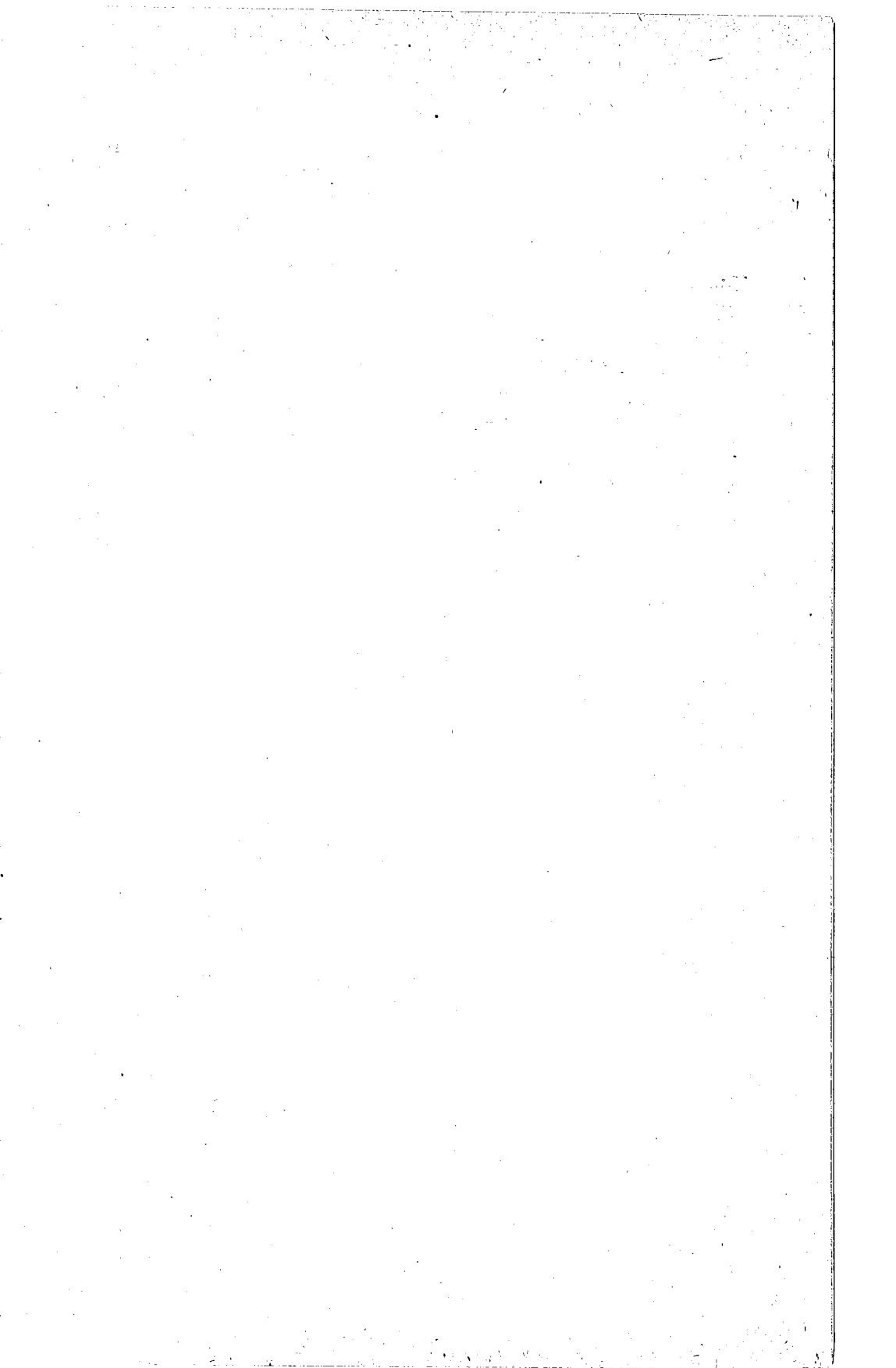
