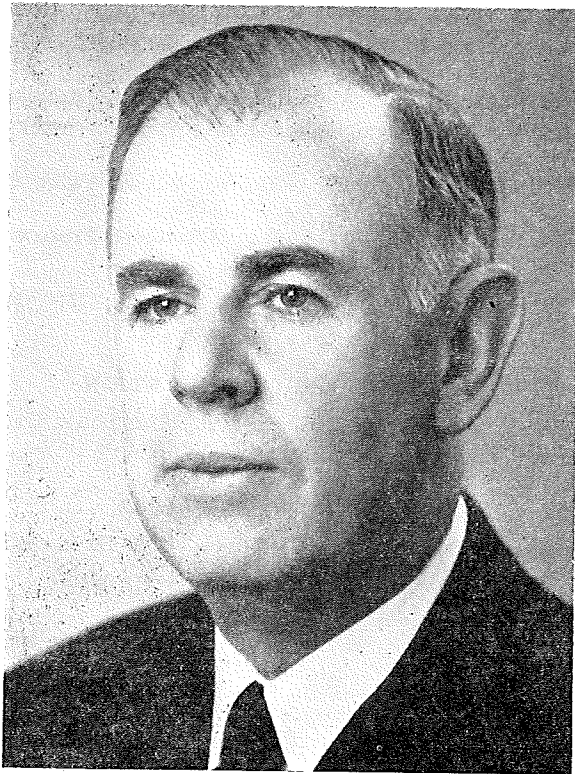

PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY MORNING, 10 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened—The ninety-fourth session of the Little Rock Conference of The Methodist Church (the ninth session of the United Church) was called to order at the First Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Ark., at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning, October 29. Bishop Paul E. Martin called the Conference to order and Hymn No. 402, "Are We Yet Alive" was sung. Rev. S. K. Burnett led in prayer. Rev. Fred R. Harrison, Secretary of the last session, called the roll, asking the clerical and lay delegates to sign slips passed to them in order that an accurate check on attendance might be made.

Rev. Fred R. Harrison was elected Secretary of the Conference and asked the Conference to elect the following assistants: C. E. Whitten, statistical secretary, with Lewis Averitt and A. W. Hamilton as his assistants, R. B. Moore, Journal Clerk, with Bryant Stephens and Mark Vaught as his assistants, S. T. Baugh as Journal Editor.

Bishop Martin recognized Rev. R. L. Long, and Rev. Francis Buddin, and welcomed them back into the conference. The following visitors were then recognized and presented to the Conference: Rev. D. Emory Hawk, Rev. and Mrs. Paul W. Quillian, Mrs. Paul Martin, wife of the presiding Bishop, and Mrs. Francis A. Buddin.

District Superintendent's Characters Passed—The names of all District Superintendents were called and their characters passed.

Board and Committee Nominations—Rev. R. B. Moore, Secretary of the cabinet, read the nomination of the Cabinet for replacements on the quadrennial boards and the annual boards of the Conference. These were adopted.

Admission Into Full Connection—The class for admission into full connection was received. Each member of the class was presented a leather-bound copy of the Methodist Discipline and the Book of Worship by Mr. Alton B. Raney.

Bar of Conference Defined—Rev. Francis A. Buddin, Conference Host, defined the Bar of the Conference, asking the Lay and Clerical delegates to be seated separately as directed, in order to facilitate the balloting. Dr. Buddin presented the newspaper representatives: Mr. Walter Ebel of the Arkansas Gazette, and Miss Edna Howe of the Hot Springs papers.

Tellers Nominated and Elected—Rev. R. B. Moore read the list of nominations for the tellers in the election of the delegates to the general and Jurisdictional Conferences, as follows: Clerical—Claude Roy, Secretary, Dan R. Robinson, George G. Meyer, A. C. Carraway, J. Ralph Clayton, H. O. Bolin, C. Ray Hozendorf, and Fred Arnold; Lay—Austin Ledbetter, Secretary, Henry Finkbeiner, B. T. Fooks, Alton B. Raney, W. J. Fish, W. W. Taylor, O. A. Graves, W. R. Boney. They were elected.

Bishop Martin made a statement regarding the procedure to be used in the election of delegates to the General and Jurisdictional Conferences and commented on the form of government used in the Methodist Church.

First Ballot Taken—The first ballot, both clerical and lay, for the General Conference delegates was taken.

District Superintendent's Reports—Each district superintendent presented a report of the year's work for his district as follows: Arkadelphia; R. B. Moore; Camden, Arthur Terry; Little Rock, E. C. Rule; Monticello, T. T. McNeal; Pine Bluff, Fred R. Harrison; Prescott, Van W. Harrell; Texarkana, A. J. Christie.

Gifts Presented to A. J. Christie and Arthur Terry—The preachers of the Texarkana District, represented by Rev. Edward W. Harris, presented to Rev. and Mrs. A. J. Christie a gift of Sterling Silver. Preachers of the Camden District, represented by Rev. A. E. Jacobs, presented to Rev. Arthur Terry a traveling bag. The gifts were presented to these two retiring Superintendents as expressions of love and appreciation from the men with whom they had served.

Service of Commemoration—Bishop Martin announced that the hour had arrived for the service of Commemoration. The service was conducted by Rev. Kenneth L. Spore, assisted by Reverend Otto Teague and Rev. John M. McCormack, with Rev. Fred R. Harrison reading the names of those memorialized. Rev. John L. Hoover delivered the commemoration message. The service was concluded with the singing of the Doxology, the benediction being given by Bishop Martin.

Bishop Martin changed the order of the day, directing that the Conference reconvene in the afternoon at 2:15 o'clock instead of 2:00 o'clock as scheduled.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, 2:15 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened—Conference session opened at 2:15 o'clock with Bishop Paul E. Martin presiding. After Hymn No. 249, "I Love To Tell The Story" was sung, Reverend C. B. Davis led the prayer.

Report of Ballot No. 1—A report of the first ballot for the election of delegates to the General Conference was heard, as follows: Clerical, No election; Lay, No election. Bishop Martin directed that a second ballot, both clerical and lay, be taken.

Motion Passed—Recognition was made that Rev. J. E. Fulkerson, Rev. W. W. Fincher, Rev. T. D. Spruce, Rev. L. E. N. Hundley, Rev. J. T. Rodgers, and Mr. C. L. Cabe are unable to attend the Conference due to illness. It was moved by Reverend Clem Baker that these members of the Conference and all retired ministers not attending be sent the greetings of the Conference by the Secretary.

Board of Temperance—Rev. W. D. Golden, secretary of the Board of Temperance, brought the report of that Board. Rev. A. E. Jacobs and Rev. R. H. Cannon spoke to the report and the report was adopted. An offering was taken for the Arkansas Anti-Saloon League in the amount of \$133.00.

Members Excused—Rev. R. A. Teeter, Rev. Virgil Keeley, and Rev. Alva C. Rogers were excused from the Conference by Bishop Martin.

Ministers Retired—The following members of the Conference were retired: Rev. J. R. Diffie, Rev. W. C. Lewis, and Rev. R. C. Walsh.

Report of Ballot No. 2—A report of the second ballot, in the election of delegates to the General Conference, was heard, as follows: Clerical, Rev. E. C. Rule elected; Lay, Mr. B. T. Fooks elected. Bishop Martin directed that a third ballot, both clerical and lay, be taken.

Accepted Supplies Retired—Rev. A. J. Bearden, an Accepted Supply of the Conference was retired.

Motion Passed—Rev. T. T. McNeal moved that the name of A. J. Bearden be referred to the Board of Conference Claimants with the recommendation that he receive pension funds from that Board. The motion was passed.

Report on Ballot No. 3—A report of the third ballot in the election of delegates to the General Conference, was heard, as follows: Clerical, Fred R. Harrison elected; Lay, no election.

Announcement—Rev. Francis A. Buddin announced the cancellation of a reception scheduled for 8:30 o'clock this evening. He introduced to the Conference Rev. E. T. McIlwain of the General Board of Pensions,

Rev. Earl R. Hoggard and Rev. W. Harrison Baker, both members of the North Texas Conference, and Dr. Matt L. Ellis, President of Hendrix College.

Report on Lay Ballot No. 4—A report on the fourth Lay ballot in the election of delegates to the General Conference was heard as follows: O. A. Graves elected.

First Ballot for Jurisdictional Conference Taken—The first ballot, both clerical and lay, in the election of delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference was taken and sealed, the tellers being instructed by Bishop Martin to count and report on such ballot Thursday morning.

Greetings—Greetings to the Conference were read by Bishop Martin from Reverend and Mrs. James E. Major, now serving in Santiago, Chile. The Secretary of the Conference was instructed to send the greetings of the Conference to these friends.

Announcements—The time and place were announced for the meeting of the various Boards and Committees for the afternoon.

The benediction was pronounced by Rev. Clem Baker.

THURSDAY MORNING, 8:30 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened—The Conference was convened at 8:30 o'clock and the devotional period was conducted by Dr. Francis A. Buddin. The Hymn No. 213, "My Faith Looks Up to Thee," was sung. The prayer was led by Rev. J. A. Henderson. Dr. Buddin read from Paul's letter to the Philippians and led the Conference in meditation upon the passage read. The devotional period was concluded with Hymn No. 267, "Rise Up, Oh Men of God."

Conference Called to Order—Bishop Martin assumed the chair, calling the Conference to order, and asked for a report of the Committee on Conference Minutes. The report not being ready, the matter was deferred.

Rev. L. E. N. Hundley—It was announced by Rev. Fred R. Harrison that Rev. L. E. N. Hundley, one of the Conference's retired ministers, had passed away earlier in the morning. Bishop Martin asked the Conference to stand and offered a prayer.

Visitors—Dr. and Mrs. Richard C. Raines were presented to the Conference, Dr. Raines being a minister of the Methodist Church of Minneapolis, Minn.

The Methodist Publishing House—Mr. C. W. Bell, representing the Methodist Publishing House, was presented and spoke concerning the book display in the basement. He presented a check in the amount of \$2,771.58 to the Board of Conference Claimants. Bishop Martin received the check and urged the ministers and laymen to visit the book room and to purchase and read good books.

Report of Ballot No. 1—A report of the first ballot for the election of delegates, both clerical and lay, to the Jurisdictional Conference was heard, as follows: Clerical, No election; Lay, Mr. T. W. McCoy and Mrs. E. D. Galloway were elected. Bishop Martin directed another ballot to be taken.

Dr. A. T. McIlwain—Dr. A. T. McIlwain, Executive Secretary of the Board of Pensions, was introduced and spoke concerning the work of the Board of Pensions.

Resolutions Adopted—Rev. Aubrey G. Walton presented a resolution to the Conference petitioning the Committee on Episcopacy of the Jurisdictional Conference to reassign Bishop Paul E. Martin to the Ark.-La. area. It was adopted.

Report of Ballot No. 2—A report of the second ballot for the elec-

tion of delegates, both clerical and lay, to the Jurisdictional Conference was heard, as follows: Clerical, Rev. R. B. Moore and Rev. Arthur Terry elected; Lay, Alton B. Raney elected. Bishop Martin directed another clerical ballot be taken.

Motion Passed—A motion was passed to elect three reserve delegates, clerical and lay, to the Jurisdictional Conference.

Committee on Courtesies—Dr. Francis A. Buddin, Chairman of the Committee on Courtesies, presented the following visitors to the Conference. Dr. C. M. Reves and Rev. Carl Keightley, members of the North Arkansas Conference, Dr. and Mrs. Hubert Johnson, representatives of the Methodist Children's Home of Waco, Texas, Miss Louise Long, Chaplain at the State Hospital for Nervous Diseases, Dr. Frank W. Langham of the American Bible Study, and Mr. M. C. Redwine, Conference Lay Leader of the Kentucky Conference.

Board of Hospitals and Homes—Rev. C. D. Cade, Secretary, read Report No. 1 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. The report was adopted.

Methodist Children's Home—Mr. J. S. M. Cannon, Superintendent of the Children's Home, read Report No. 2 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes. Dr. Hubert Johnson, Superintendent of the Methodist Children's Home of Waco, Texas, and representing the General Board of Hospitals and Homes, spoke to the report and commented upon the work done by the Board and by the various types of homes operated throughout the Church. The report was adopted.

Report of Clerical Ballot No. 3—A report of the third Clerical Ballot for the election of delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference was heard and there was no election.

Motion Passed—Rev. Fred R. Harrison submitted a motion that the Conference send flowers and an expression of sympathy to the family of Rev. L. E. N. Hundley. The motion was passed.

Methodist Hospital—Mr. B. T. Fooks read Report No. 3 of the Board of Hospitals and Homes, which was a report of the Methodist Hospital. Mr. Fooks and Rev. R. E. Simpson, Superintendent of the Methodist Hospital, spoke to the report. The report was adopted. The combined report of the Board of Hospitals and Homes was then adopted.

Report of Lay Ballot No. 1—A report of the first Lay ballot in the election of reserve delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference was heard, as follows: J. S. M. Cannon, W. W. Taylor, and Mrs. H. King Wade were elected, completing the Lay balloting.

Report of Clerical Ballot No. 4—A report of the fourth clerical ballot for the election of delegates was heard. Rev. A. G. Walton was elected. Bishop Martin directed the first clerical ballot for reserves to be taken.

Visitors—Rev. Arthur Terry presented the following visitors to the Conference: Rev. Cecil Culver, Rev. O. D. Peters, Rev. James Chandler, and Rev. O. L. Cole, all members of the North Arkansas Conference.

Board of Lay Activities—Bishop Martin introduced Mr. T. W. McCoy, Conference Lay Leader, who spoke of the work of the Board of Lay Activities during the past year, and read the report of the Board of Lay Activities.

At this point Bishop Martin invited Bishop Paul B. Kern, the Conference Preacher, to preside.

Bishop Kern then recognized Mr. McCoy who introduced Mr. M. C. Redwine, Lay Leader of the Kentucky Conference, who spoke concerning Lay Activities. The report was adopted.

Recess—Bishop Martin assumed the chair and recessed the Conference for a 15 minute period.

Conference Reconvened—Bishop Martin reconvened the Conference, using the Hymn "My Faith Looks Up to Thee."

Miss Louise Long—Bishop Martin recognized Miss Louise Long, a Chaplain of the State Hospital for Nervous Diseases, and she spoke briefly of her work.

Report of Clerical Ballot No. 1—A report of the first clerical ballot in the election of reserve delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference was heard and there was no election. Another ballot was taken.

Board of Education—Reverend Aubrey Walton, Chairman of the Board of Education, was recognized. He read Report No. 1 of the Board of Education. Rev. Roy E. Fawcett, Mrs. W. F. Bates, Rev. C. Ray Hozendorf, and Mr. Roland Shelton, spoke to the report. Bro. Walton presented Bishop Paul B. Kern who addressed the Conference in behalf of the Church School in the Crusade for Christ. The report was adopted.

Announcements—The time and places were announced for noon luncheons, and the Board and Committee meetings for the afternoon. Bishop Martin announced that the Philander Smith Choir had been delayed and would be presented following the devotional period on Friday.

Report on Clerical Ballot No. 2—A report of the second clerical ballot in the election of reserve delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference was heard and there was no election.

Visitors—Dr. Francis A. Buddin presented to the Conference the following visitors: Rev. Fred Roebuck, minister of the North Arkansas Conference, and Dr. Clarence W. Lockey of the Board of Missions and Church Extensions.

Adjournment—Bishop Martin ordered the Conference adjourned and Rev. Fred Roebuck pronounced the benediction.

FRIDAY MORNING, 8:30 O'CLOCK

Conference Opened—The Conference was convened at 8:30 o'clock and the devotional period was conducted by Rev. R. L. Long. Hymn No. 2, "Come Thou, Almighty King" was sung. The prayer was led by Rev. D. T. Rowe. The Crusade Quartet, composed of John McCormack, Curtis Williams, Alfred Doss, and Fred Schwendimann sang, with Mrs. Curtis Williams as accompanist.

Conference Called to Order—Bishop Martin assumed the chair and called the Conference to order. The Philander Smith Choir was presented and sang a series of four numbers. Dr. M. L. Harris, President of Philander Smith College, was presented and spoke briefly, expressing appreciation for the support which the college has received from the churches of the Conference. Bishop Martin spoke, recognizing the fine work accomplished by Dr. Harris and the college. An offering was taken for the college.

Motion Passed—Rev. Fred R. Harrison moved the Conference to petition the Columbia Broadcasting System that the Philander Smith Choir be invited to appear on the "Wings Over Jordan" Program. The motion was passed.

Dr. D. Emory Hawk—Dr. D. Emory Hawk was recognized as representing Dr. E. B. Hawk, Dean of the Perkins School of Theology. Dr. Hawk spoke of the work of the Perkins School of Theology, its future building program, and expressed appreciation for the support given to the school by the Conference.

Greetings—Recognition was made of communications bearing greetings to the Conference from C. M. Thompson, J. W. Workman, and J. E. Fulkerson.

Excused—Rev. Otto W. Teague was excused from the Conference to be in a funeral service of Rev. L. E. N. Hundley.

Undergraduate Class—The names of the Undergraduates were called, reported upon, and advanced.

At this point, Bishop Martin relinquished the chair, inviting Bishop Paul B. Kern to preside.

Commission on Christian Literature—Rev. B. F. Fitzhugh, Secretary, read the Report No. 1 of the Commission on Christian Literature which was adopted.

Arkansas Methodist—J. S. M. Cannon submitted the report of the Joint Commission of the Arkansas Methodist. Dr. E. T. Wayland, Editor of the Arkansas Methodist, spoke to the report. The report was adopted.

Accepted Supplies—Rev. Ralph Clayton, Secretary of the Committee on Accepted Supplies, brought the report of that Committee. It was adopted.

Vernon Chalfant, and Rev. Sam Yancey, all members of the North Arkansas Conference, and Dr. E. L. Geissinger, Associate Secretary of the Board of Lay Activities.

President of W.S.C.S.—Mrs. E. D. Galloway, Conference President of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, was presented. Mrs. Galloway made a report of the work of the Women during the year, and spoke of plans for the new year. Bishop Martin commented on the report. Mrs. Galloway presented Miss Ary Shough, a Deaconess of the Prescott District.

Resolution—Rev. Rufus Sorrells introduced a resolution from the Commission on Ministerial Sustentation. It was adopted.

Report No. 2, of the Board of Education—Rev. A. G. Walton, Chairman of the Board of Education, presented Report No. 2 of that Board, which related to Hendrix College.

Dr. Matt L. Ellis, President of Hendrix College, spoke to the Report, bringing the greetings of Hendrix College and reporting items of interest regarding the college. The report was adopted.

Resolution—Rev. Fred R. Harrison presented a resolution relating to a change in the Charter of Hendrix College. The resolution was adopted.

Motion Passed—A motion was passed to extend the time of the morning session in order to finish the agenda of business.

Dr. Frank W. Lanham—Dr. Frank W. Lanham, representative of the American Bible Society, was recognized and spoke concerning the work of his organization.

Dr. Clarence Lokey—Dr. Clarence Lokey, representing the Secretarial Group of the Board of Missions and Church Extensions, was recognized and spoke concerning Methodism's World Mission program.

Announcements—Announcements of further services of the day and Board, Commission, and Committee Meetings were made.

Adjournment—The session was adjourned by the benediction pronounced by Rev. J. A. Wade.

FRIDAY NIGHT, 7:30 O'CLOCK

Conference Standing Rules—The amendment to the Conference Standing Rules, submitted by Rev. John B. Hefley and tabled on Friday, was reread, discussed, and was adopted.

Executive Session—Rev. Kenneth L. Spore submitted the motion that an executive session composed of the clerical members of the Conference in full connection be convened following the adjournment at 12:30 o'clock. The motion was passed.

Methodist Youth Fellowship—Miss Suella Anderson, representing the Conference Youth Fellowship, announced the Youth Program, scheduled for the afternoon and evening hours, and invited the cooperation of the pastors in the Youth Program of the local church.

Announcements—Announcements were made regarding the luncheon for Ministers wives, the remaining services of the Conference, and the schedule of preaching services for Sunday.

Greetings—Greetings from Rev. Harold D. Sadler were read to the Conference.

Retired Ministers—The retired ministers were recognized and Bishop Martin presented parchments to each of them.

Vote of Thanks—A standing vote of thanks was given to Bishop Paul B. Kern, for his excellent leadership in the preaching services of the Conference.

Adjournment—The regular session of the Conference was adjourned and those eligible to attend the Executive Session were invited to remain.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Little Rock Annual Conference met in Executive Session immediately upon adjournment of the regular session Saturday noon November 1st, 1947, with Bishop Paul E. Martin presiding.

Passage of Characters—The names of all retired ministers, those

serving special appointments, and ministers and deaconesses were called and their characters were passed, with the exception of the following: Earl Robert Lewis, Chaplain, Veteran's Administration.

E. C. Rule stated that the name of Earl R. Lewis had been referred to the investigating committee.

Kenneth L. Spore, chairman of the committee on Investigations, read the report of the committee, recommending a trial. The report of the committee was adopted.

Bishop Martin led in prayer, after which the Bishop and the district superintendents were convened in separate session for private interview.

Kenneth L. Spore made a motion that the trial be held after the adjournment of the present session of the annual conference. It was seconded and passed.

Bishop Martin appointed Wm. E. Brown as Council for the church and A. G. Walton to preside at the trial.

All papers relating to the trial were turned over to the conference secretary.

R. H. Cannon made a motion that the findings of the trial be referred to the next session of the Annual Conference. The Motion was ruled out of order.

Motion was made to table the motion to suspend was withdrawn.

A motion was passed that the secretary of the conference be authorized to publish in the 1947 Conference Journal of the Little Rock Conference a statement relative to the status of Earl R. Lewis as a result of the trial. (See statement below).

A motion passed that if Earl R. Lewis is found not guilty, that his character is automatically passed.

The benediction was pronounced by Bishop Martin.

SUNDAY SESSION, NOVEMBER 2ND

At the close of the morning worship service Bishop Paul E. Martin called the conference to order.

R. O. Beck read the report of the Committee on Resolutions.

Bishop Martin presented the name of Harold D. Sadler and asked the conference for authority to appoint him as Conference Evangelist. The conference voted unanimously to give such authority.

Fred R. Harrison, on the authority of the cabinet, asked that A. J. Christie be added to the board of Education and that Arthur Terry be added to the Board of Missions.

Bishop Martin spoke of the love and affection with which he and his cabinet labored in bringing the appointments to completion for the year and assured each minister that each appointment was made after careful study and prayerful consideration. The appointments were read. Hymn No. 287, "A Charge To Keep I Have" was sung, after which Bishop Martin pronounced the benediction.

STATEMENT OF CONFERENCE SECRETARY

In accordance with the order of the conference relative to the status of Earl R. Lewis as a result of the trial, let it be known that the trial was held Friday, November 7, 1947 at 10 A. REPORTS OF BOARDS, COMMITTEES AND COMMISSIONS

THE JOINT COMMISSION OF THE ARKANSAS METHODIST

The Joint Commission met at the Albert Pike Hotel, in Little Rock, October 9th, 1947. The Commission was honored by the presence of Bishop Paul E. Martin, who spoke of his high regard for the Editor and his Staff, and the recognition accorded the Arkansas Methodist as one of the best, if not the best, Conference organs in Methodism.

The Editor reported that an addressograph system was being installed, which would greatly expedite the mailing of the paper, assure greater accuracy, and prevent loss of papers in the mails. It was believed the system would ultimately pay for itself in lowered costs of mailing.

A careful analysis of the financial report of the Editor indicated that the continued rise in costs of paper and printing would necessitate more income if a deficit is to be avoided. A review of other periodicals with reference to size, quality, and subscription prices charged, reflected the fact that the price of the Arkansas Methodist was by far the lowest of any paper of its class which we examined.

After full discussion of all issues presented, the Joint Commission makes the following recommendations:

1. That in order to prevent a deficit because of the increased cost of paper and printing, the price of the Arkansas Methodist be raised from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per year.
2. That we commend the Editor and his Staff for the high quality of the paper they are giving us and for their efficient business administration.
3. That Dr. E. T. Wayland be re-appointed editor and business manager of the Arkansas Methodist.
4. That Ewing T. Wayland be appointed associate editor and assistant business manager.
5. That there be allowed for the Arkansas Methodist for the ensuing year the same appropriation by the Commission of World Service and Finance as that granted last year.
6. That the subscription goal for the paper be fixed at 20,000 subscribers for the ensuing year.
7. That the Conference adopt as their plan the same general method used last year in the circulation campaign and that January 11th through January 18th, 1948, be set apart for the circulation campaign.

BOARD OF CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS

Report No. 1

During the last few years this Conference has responded splendidly to the needs of our Claimants. This has made possible a more liberal annuity for all our Claimants. The continued rise in the cost of living has wiped out much of the gain.

This year your Board is paying \$22.00 per service year to retired ministers. This is a small increase over that paid last year, made possible by increased salaries and the increase of 1% in percentages accepted by the 1946 Conference.

Four of our Claimants with long years of service, died during the year. They are: John D. Dunn, William F. Campbell, Leander W. Evans, and L. E. N. Hundley.

Your Board attempts to keep in touch with all our Claimants and in some instances we have provided needed medical and hospital care.

In compliance with Par. 1613 (10) of the 1944 Discipline, this Conference, three years ago, authorized your Board to set aside an amount equal to 5% of our Conference income as a reserve fund "In order to stabilize the annuity rate payable in the Conference." This has been done and will continue until we have accumulated a reserve fund equivalent to 25% of the average annual income for the past 5 years.

This conference also authorized your Board to set aside an amount equal to one-half of one percent ($\frac{1}{2}$ of 1%) of the cash salary paid the pastors, to be paid the General Board of Pensions for a stabilizing fund to become operative at the next General Conference. This has been done and will continue throughout the quadrennium.

These two special funds and our emergency fund are deposited in the Simmons National Bank, Pine Bluff. Regular funds are deposited in Worthen Bank & Trust Co., Little Rock.

We respectfully ask for the same percentages as that of last year, ranging from 7% to 14% for pastors, associate, and assistant pastors.

For pastoral charges paying the pastor, associate pastor, or assistant pastor:

BOARD OF CONFERENCE CLAIMANTS

Report No. 2

APPORTIONMENTS

We submit the Claimant Roll, including superannuated preachers, widows of preachers and dependents of deceased ministers, showing the amount allocated to each claimant.

The apportionments are made on an equity basis determined by the years of service rendered. Apportionments to widows being on a basis of 70% of that which their husbands would receive per year of service for the actual time of service rendered while she was his wife.

Dependent children's claim is determined by multiplying the father's approved years of service by one-fourth of the annuity rate, provided that in no case the total annuity claim of the children exceed the annuity claim of the deceased father.

This year we are in a position to pay \$22.00 per year of service to retired Ministers and \$15.40 to claimant widows, wherease we paid \$20.00 and \$14 respectively last year. Total of \$23.33 and \$16.30 respectively from both Conference and General Boards.

We indicate below years of service, amount paid to claimant by the General Board and the amount distributed by this Board.

The Conference Board of Claimants has authorized the Treasurer, Otto W. Teague, to distribute the Conference funds to Claimants on November 1, 1947 and April 10, 1948, paying one-half of the allocation at each time.

BOARD OF EDUCATION**Report No. 1****Promotional Work**

The Crusade for Christ—In planning for the new year, as would be expected, central place is given to the Crusade for Christ. We are strongly committed to all the objectives of the campaign, and shall endeavor to formulate and promote a program that will make possible the fullest realization of these objectives. Stated briefly, we make the following recommendations:

1. That we promote a vigorous campaign to reach those for whom we are responsible for Church School enrollment.
2. Believing that attendance is more important than enrollment, that we plan wisely for the follow-up of Church School absentees.
3. That wherever practical, we re-organize abandoned schools, and establish new schools in un-churched areas.
4. That every effort be made to improve the quality of work done by our Church Schools.

5. That we cooperate fully with other Conference agencies in a sustained program of enlistment for full-time Christian service.

Leadership Training—If we are to have officers and teachers to adequately staff the increased number of classes and groups brought in by the Crusade, we must enlist and train additional leadership. There must be a leadership development commensurate with the demands made upon the working staff. As for the type of training, let it be that which best serves the local church. Where possible, we recommend the regular units of training, and in situations where groups cannot be brought together in formal classes, we commend the Fellowship of study and such other types of informal training as make for a more skilled and effective leadership.

We call attention to the leadership possibilities at Mt. Sequoyah, and recommend the acceptance of our full quota of Conference, District, and local church workers.

Work of the Church School Divisions—For lack of space we shall not attempt to outline a program for each of the three age-groups. We leave this to be developed and promoted by the leadership in each of these areas, in the light of the opportunities presented and the leadership available.

Fourth Sunday Missionary Emphasis—We are not satisfied with our present Fourth Sunday program and offering. It is our conviction that Jesus was speaking seriously when He gave as His last command, "Go teach all nations." We, therefore, recommend an enlarged use of this opportunity to train those of all ages in the Christian grace of sharing. To that end, we believe that more schools should be using the materials now made available, and receiving the offering for the cause of World Service.

Arkansas Pastors' School—In view of the fact that no training agency has wrought more effectively over the years than has our Arkansas Pastors' School, we urge the largest attendance that entertainment facilities at the College will permit. We nominate the following to serve on the Board of Managers: A. G. Walton, J. L. Dedman, Mrs. T. S. Lovett, W. Neill Hart, C. Ray Hozendorf, Arthur Terry and Roy E. Fawcett. Cabinet Member: R. B. Moore.

Policy on Ministerial Training—Not satisfied with our present program of ministerial training, nor with the results therefrom, we request that the Bishop appoint a Conference Committee to develop a policy and formulate a program to be presented to the 1948 session of the Annual Conference.

Southern Methodist University—Grateful for the contribution that Southern Methodist University is making to the Jurisdiction and to the Church at large, and encouraged by the promise of greater usefulness in the years ahead, we urge our young ministers to take their seminary training there in the Perkins School of Theology. We are happy to report that the final payment of the \$7,500.00 scholarship endowment, pledged two years ago, will be made in the near future. We recommend a continuation of the \$400.00 cash scholarship, said amount to be drawn from the Ministerial Education Fund.

Philander Smith College—Having confidence in both the intelligence and integrity of its administration, we commend the work being done by Philander Smith College for negroes. We believe that it merits both the moral and financial support of all who are interested in a better understanding between the races.

Church School Day—We have named Sunday April 18th as Church School Day and request that the goal for the offering remain at \$3600.00.

Conference Camp Site Committee—Conditioned on the naming of a Conference Camp Site Committee, we have made the Chairman and the Executive Secretary the representatives of the Board.

Additional Board Members—We nominate, and request the Con-

ference to elect the following members of the Board, at large,—Ed McQuiston, M. H. Russell, Roland Shelton, Ralph Clayton, Fred Schwendimann, and Mark Vaught.

Conference Staff—We have elected Roy E. Fawcett Executive Secretary and request the Bishop to appoint him to this office. We nominate Mrs. W. F. Bates Conference Director of Children's Work, C. Ray Hozendorf Conference Director of Youth Work, and Roland Shelton Conference Director of Adult Work.

Apportionments—We request of the World Service Commission the same apportionments as last year.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Report No. 2

Hendrix College

The year of 1946-47 has been a great year for Hendrix College. We rejoice that Methodists and other friends have responded in such a grand way to the Million-Dollar Campaign. Organizing in 1946 the effort to raise \$800,000 in Arkansas to meet the condition of the 200,000 grant from the General Education Board of New York, the Program met with such success that it was announced last February that subscriptions totaled more than \$830,000. It is gratifying to hear that of this amount cash receipts at the College are \$617,476.48.

Hendrix has an enrollment of 595 this year, more students than the college has ever admitted. Under conditions that are often trying, effective work is being done by the excellent faculty; the college is serving the ends for which the institution was founded. But increased numbers make more obvious the physical needs of the campus. The most urgent requirements are a Chapel and a dining hall; the program of Hendrix will be greatly handicapped until the buildings are supplied.

We express our appreciation to Bishop Paul E. Martin, Dr. C. M. Reves, Campaign Director, the district superintendents, pastors and laymen who have worked so effectively in this cooperative effort. We recommend and strongly urge that campaign committees in all districts and local churches give great emphasis to the importance of collecting the unpaid pledges as soon as possible, and certainly not later than the end of January, 1948.

We recommend that the name of Hendrix be kept before the people of all our churches. All campaign gains cannot be measured in monetary terms; we should strive to maintain and cultivate the friendships, new and renewed, which Hendrix has won in recent months.

We recommend a resumption of the Hendrix Ministerial Education Special, suggesting the last week in February for the taking of the offering. We request that the goal for the offering be \$8,000, of which \$3,000.00 shall be for Ministerial Training and \$5,000.00 for Hendrix College.

In conformity with the action of the last Annual Conference, the Board of Education voted that each local church within the Conference be requested to contribute \$5.00 for each constituent of that church attending a college or university within the state. This amount is to be sent to the Church ministering to the student body represented.

We recommend the election of these trustees of Hendrix College:

Trustee at Large: Alton B. Raney of Little Rock, to succeed himself, term to expire in 1953.

Alumni Trustee: Mrs. W. P. McDermott of Little Rock, to succeed herself, term to expire in 1953.

BOARD OF EVANGELISM

Report No. 1

We rejoice to report that the spirit of evangelism is more apparent in our Conference among both ministers and laymen than it has been in recent years. Pastors reports show many new members added to our churches.

We pledge our full support to the last phase of the Crusade for Christ, that of church school enrollment and attendance. We call attention to the unusual opportunity which this phase of our program affords us for stressing visitation evangelism through the church school.

We go on record as supporting wholeheartedly any rural program into which our Commission on Town and Country Life is to lead us. We urge the holding of Schools of Visitation Evangelism in two or three of the principal centers in each of the Districts in the Conference during the year, and pledge support financially and otherwise in carrying the program into effect. We also urge the holding of revival meetings in every church in the Conference during the year, and suggest that in communities where there are more than one Methodist Church the meetings be held simultaneously. We pledge our full support to our District secretaries of evangelism and to the district superintendents in this program.

The Conference Secretary of Evangelism was sent by our board to Lincoln, Nebraska, to the National Rural Life Conference. There 2500 delegates studying together faced seriously again our rural church problems. All agreed that unless the spirit of evangelism is maintained and extended, the rural church nor the city church can long exist and continue to advance the Kingdom of God. We must inspire our people again that soil and soul belong to God and that man is a steward only of all that God has given him.

The national meeting of Conference Secretaries of Evangelism was held in Albion, Michigan. Our conference and board secretaries, John M. McCormack and John L. Tucker both attended. Some 125 of our leaders in this field were in attendance from over the nation. Outlines of this meeting and the memorials sent up to the General Conference appeared in the Arkansas Methodist. The General Board publishes fine evangelistic materials which is on display at this Annual Conference. Every Church should have a display rack, which can be secured from the Upper Room, for about \$15.00 and should keep it well supplied with tracts. This will help keep the spirit of evangelism before us and help promote this great cause. The General Board is sending to all our preachers throughout the church "Shepherd's Magazine" which we should be using to great advantage. The board is also promoting the Parish Plan for the Upper Room. This plan is for the Upper Room to be mailed to each family in the church. A large envelope is prepared for mailing and a small offering envelope is to be placed inside.

Our conference board is discontinuing for one year the radio programs which we have had for the past three years on KARK, Little Rock, and has set up a committee to confer with other boards and agencies of the Little Rock and of the North Arkansas Conferences looking toward a Radio Program of the Methodist church in Arkansas to be carried on a chain or such stations as may be necessary to cover the state.

Our financial appropriations help us to do much in promoting evangelism which would not otherwise be accomplished. Tracts, books, pamphlets and other materials are being sent to our pastors and leaders through-

out the Conference. One hundred copies of "Youth Courageous" by Thomas F. Chilcote, Jr., was placed in the hands of as many youth leaders this year. A copy of this book will be sent to all the officers of District and Sub-district Youth Fellowships within the next few weeks.

Outstanding projects of evangelism have been carried out in certain communities in three Districts this year through the aid of our funds. In the Camden District two promising Churches were organized and a charge which will soon pay \$1800 salary was created. In the Monticello District preaching services were conducted in isolated communities. In the Little Rock District a church was re-established and a growing congregation is now in progress on the Douglassville-Geyer Springs charge. First church Little Rock is promoting a new charge in the Robinson School community just outside the city.

We have requested that our appropriations remain the same for another year. Our board secretary-treasurer is duly bonded with Worthen Bank and Trust Company in Little Rock. Our books have been audited. Our financial statement is attached for printing in the Journal.

We have elected John M. McCormack Conference Secretary of Evangelism and respectfully request the Bishop to appoint him to the office. We have elected Kenneth L. Spore to continue as our representative on the Camp Site Committee.

BOARD OF HOSPITALS AND HOMES

Report No. 1

It is a pleasure for your Board of Hospitals and Homes to bring you a general survey of the activities of your two great welfare institutions, the Methodist Children's Home in Little Rock and the Methodist Hospital in Hot Springs.

We find upon reviewing the work of the year done under the direction of the Boards of Trustees and Superintendents that these institutions have been under the most capable and progressive leadership.

Both are operating effectively and at full capacity, with splendid improvement and expansion programs. They are increasing in strength and efficiency each year.

The Children's Home is putting on a building program to enlarge its capacity for caring for a larger group of children. The Methodist Hospital shows an increase in amount of service rendered and a decrease in cost of operation.

A more detailed coverage will be given in the reports given by Mr. J. S. M. Cannon and Mr. B. T. Fooks.

Your Board makes the following recommendations:

1st. We nominate Mr. Joe T. Thompson to be elected as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Methodist Children's Home, to fill the unexpired term of Geo. H. Burden, deceased, and that Rev. Harold D. Sadler and Rev. J. L. Dedman be re-elected as trustees to succeed themselves.

2nd. We recommend that an amendment be made in the Articles of Incorporation of the Children's Home, whereby, the membership may be increased to fifteen (15) members.

3rd. We recommend that such action be taken, by proper authorities, as is necessary to increase the membership of the Board of Trustees of the Methodist Hospital from sixteen (16) to eighteen (18) members, and that Mr. W. P. Sturgis of Arkadelphia be named as a trustee, and also that the District Superintendent of the Arkadelphia District be named as a Trustee.

4th. We nominate the following members for re-election to the Board of Trustees: Mrs. H. King Wade, Tom Stone, Rev. J. L. Dedman, and Henry T. Trotter.

5th. We nominate Dr. George C. Coffey as a member of Board of Trustees for full term, in place of Dr. J. M. Proctor, deceased.

6th. We nominate Mr. Tom Stone for re-election as Golden Cross Treasurer for 1947-48, and Rev. Conner Morehead as Conference Director of Golden Cross for 1947-48.

We appreciate very highly the fine work done by Mr. J. S. M. Cannon, B. T. Fooks, Rev. R. E. Simpson and Mr. Tom Stone in their several fields of service. We feel that these institutions are in good hands, and that the future is bright for both of them.

METHODIST HOSPITAL OF ARKANSAS, INC.

Report No. 1

The Board of Trustees of the Methodist Hospital of Arkansas, Inc., submit the following report to the Board of Hospitals and Homes.

Real progress has been made during the past year in fully equipping and operating the hospital and in securing satisfactory personnel for its operation.

It is gratifying to note that the hospital has again operated on an average of near 90 per cent of its capacity throughout the year.

We wish to express our appreciation to Bishop Martin, District Superintendents, Pastors and laymen for their cooperation in raising the designated Golden Cross Fund.

A total amount of **\$22,135.13** was raised within the Conference, listed as follows by Districts:

The success of this campaign was definitely due to the splendid efforts of Rev. E. D. Galloway, Conference Golden Cross Director, and our appreciation is extended to him.

An apology is offered to the Board of World Service and Finance in that permission was granted of them for a campaign to be inaugurated in October of 1947 to raise a sum sufficient to enlarge the hospital to 150 rooms and this campaign was never inaugurated due to the fact that circumstances made it inadvisable that such a campaign be started at this time. We feel that we might have stood in the way of some other group who might have used this permission to a better advantage.

We do believe that the future of the hospital is dependent upon an expansion program but until such time as the right kind of program can be inaugurated, it is deemed advisable that it be delayed.

It is believed by your Board of Trustees that any expansion program should take into consideration the curative effect of Hot Springs water, especially in the treatment of Arthritis and like diseases.

The services of Rev. R. E. Simpson during the past year as Superintendent of the Hospital have been extremely satisfactory and the Board

wishes to express its appreciation to him for the wonderful improvements that have been inaugurated under his management, which have resulted in a reduction of \$10,000.00 on its indebtedness.

Although it has been impossible to operate the hospital without a loss, due to our lack of capacity, through Dr. Simpson's efforts this operating loss has been cut to the very minimum.

The Hospital has increased its Admissions almost 50%. This is due entirely to the support of the Doctors on our Medical Staff. They are the only ones who can keep patients coming to our hospital, as every admission must be through some doctor on the staff.

You will observe that the Hospital has INCREASED its Income by \$1.08 per patient day while at the same time it has REDUCED its Expenses by \$1.62 per patient day.

The Hospital has added \$8,500.00 worth of Equipment this year. We have the most up-to-date ORTHOPEDIC Operating Room in the State (given by the Boyd Brothers & Sisters of Emmett at a cost of \$3,700.00 in memory of their parents); we have the latest development in a UROLOGICAL Operating Room that can be found anywhere—table with X-Ray attached so that pictures can be made at any moment from any angle during an operation. This equipment provided by friends who sent Christmas offerings last year sufficient for a down payment, with work done each month sufficient for the monthly payments.

We have a Resuscitator and Oxygen Tent with necessary equipment for all types of Oxygen Therapy. The Nurses contributed to a fund for the Resuscitator and Mr. W. P. Sturgis of Arkadelphia gave us the Oxygen Tent which is iceless and fully automatic. The Lila Ashby S. S. Class of Winfield Church gave the hospital an incubator for the Nursery. During the year we have used it on several occasions and were able to give Oxygen to several babies who would not have lived had they not received it.

We wish to express our sorrow at the passing of Dr. J. M. Proctor of Hot Springs, an honored member of the Board of Trustees. His interest in the hospital during the period in which money was raised for its purchase was responsible to a large extent for its purchase.

It is hoped that members and visitors to the Conference will take the opportunity of visiting the hospital during the week.

The Board also wishes to express its appreciation to the Administrative Committee, composed of Dewell Jackson, Dr. Charles Lutteloch, Tom Stone, W. E. Mowery, J. B. Freese, Doyle Shirley and C. E. Bayne, for the very fine work they have done this year in cooperation with Superintendent R. E. Simpson.

METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME

Your Methodist Children's Home submits its report as follows:

In the care of the children, we have had a good year. In the late winter, nearly every one in the Home had the "flu" and a few cases had to be hospitalized. Since recovering from the "flu", however, the health of the children has been good.

Two girls have graduated from high school during the year. These have obtained good positions here in the city. One of our girls married in the spring and several other children have been placed back in re-established homes or with relatives who wanted them and were able to take care of them.

Twelve children have been received into the Home during the year, so that our capacity has been filled practically all the time. During the past year, we have turned down seventy-four requests to take children, because we did not have room for them. Conditions responsible for this demand for institutional care of children have grown worse during the past two years. The increased load is causing anxiety to both state and national welfare workers. Good institutions with adequate facilities for caring for children will continue to have greater demands than they can meet for an indefinite time.

Our financial report has been audited by Frank L. Eaton & Co., Certified Public Accountants, and copies are attached hereto. We are pleased with the contributions that have come to us through the year.

We have started construction work on one of our new buildings. The cost will be high, but the need is so great, we feel that a beginning must be made. Our financial report, condensed to show present assets, would be as follows:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT**To**

**New and Amended Articles of Incorporation of the
METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME, INC.,
Successor to The Arkansas Methodist Orphanage**

ARTICLE SEVEN (7)

That Article Seven (7) of the said New and Amended Articles of Incorporation be amended to read as follows:

There shall be a board of trustees consisting of fifteen (15) members, seven of whom shall be elected by the North Arkansas Annual Conference of The Methodist Church of Arkansas and seven by the Little Rock Annual Conference of said Church. Nominations shall be by the Conference Boards of Hospitals and Homes, or such other agency as the Conferences may direct. The Resident Bishop of the Methodist Church for the area including the two said Annual Conferences shall be ex-officio member of the said board. Vacancies in the Board shall be filled by the Annual Conference in which they occur; provided, the Board shall be authorized to fill vacancies in the interim, and members so elected shall hold office until the next meeting of their respective Annual Conferences. Hereafter, all trustees elected by the Annual Conferences shall be elected for a term of three years, except when filling the unexpired term of one whose place has been made vacant. The said board of trustees shall hold and administer all property now in their hands, or that may hereafter be acquired in the name of the Methodist Children's Home, in trust for The Methodist Church in the state of Arkansas.

Members of the board of trustees and incorporators of the said New and Amended Articles of Incorporation were C. M. Reves, E. T. Wayland, Connor Morehead, and R. J. Rice, whose terms expired at the meeting of the said Annual Conferences held in 1946; Harold D. Sadler, J. L. Dedman, Sam B. Wiggins, and E. B. Belshe, whose terms will expire at the meeting of the said Annual Conferences in 1947; T. E. Fuller, Paul V. Galloway, George H. Burden, and Horace M. Lewis, whose terms will expire at the meeting of the said Annual Conferences in 1948.

ARTICLE NINE (9)

That Article Nine (9) be amended to read as follows: The Board shall elect annually a president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer. Eight members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business.

CHRISTIAN LITERATURE

Your Committee on Christian Literature begs leave to submit the following report:

We think that, with the flood of literature and reading matter of all sorts being sent out continually by headquarters of all the false and fake "isms" that can be conceived of by the minds of selfish, designing and misguided men, it is high time for the ministers of the Methodist Church to place added stress on the matter of Christian Literature. We firmly believe that the religion we profess is the true religion; among our scholars and editors and writers we have men of superior ability and training; we have the facilities to publish and distribute the best of literature.

From the inception of the Methodist Church, our people have been great students, readers and thinkers. Our ministers have conviction that we are greatly influenced by what we read, and they have the ability to place the best of reading matter in the Methodist homes. We think we can not too strongly stress the matter of informing our people about the existence of reading matter that is most helpful to the Christian of all walks of life. We are urging our preachers to introduce into the homes of their flocks, all the good literature they can induce their people to use.

There are three principle ways of instructing our members; by teaching, by visual aid and by reading. To many all of these are not available, for some can not be reached by teachers and many do not have access to the visual aid helps. But all can be reached, in some way, by reading matter. Indeed, reading matter is not only available and of most excellent quality, but many people are more greatly influenced by what they read than by any other agent.

These considerations place a great responsibility on our ministers; They have every opportunity to know of the literature that is good, and they have daily contacts with church members who can be induced to secure and to read that literature.

We want to call attention to that excellent publication, The Upper Room. Bible readers often read at random, with not thought of systematic study and with no training that would enable them to make the most intelligible study possible. These will all find the Upper Room to be of invaluable assistance. Ministers, teachers, students and readers of immature or mature years are greatly helped by the use of this well arranged and splendidly edited guide. Every Methodist home should have the Upper Room at hand.

Now, that we are in the campaign to increase the membership and attendance in our Sunday Schools, this is a timely point at which to induce all our Bible students to use this great help. The immense flood of comic books turned loose upon our youth, make it more necessary than ever that Christian literature be placed in their hands.

Our own Arkansas Methodist continues to maintain its high standard of unusual excellence; we are not guilty of idle boasting when we say that this fine paper compares favorably with the best to be found anywhere, and for the minister in Arkansas, no other paper compares with it. Our capable editors should be commended for this great publication; it keeps us abreast of times in the religious world; it inspires all who read it; and it is most interesting in its every department.

Last winter's subscription campaign was highly successful; our preachers did great work in securing additional readers. But many of us overlooked some prospects, and in the mean time our church membership has increased; so we can reasonably hope to increase the number of subscribers to the Arkansas Methodist very substantially. May we all redouble our efforts, and with God's help, we can place this great paper in many additional homes.

May we suggest that the Christian Advocate receive a little more of our time. To neglect the reading of this publication is to shut one's self off from what is probably the best current religious publication that can be found. World Outlook, New Life Magazine should both go into far more of our homes.

Our people are directly influenced by the messages given them from the pulpit. Two inspiring, informative sermons each year on Christian literature would influence many of our people to increase their reading of religious publications.

BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES

Report No. 1

This has been a year of progress in Lay Activities in our Conference, as reports have already shown. Laymen throughout the entire Conference have shown more interest, we believe, in the overall program of the Church than ever before. The fact that our General Conference in 1944, in setting up the Crusade for Christ Program, gave the stewardship phase of that program to the Board of Lay Activities to promote, has in our judgment, awakened a new interest, zeal, and responsibility in the hearts and souls of our laymen. This year of stewardship study, the real meaning of what is stewardship in the Methodist Church, will bear much fruit in the years ahead. During the week March 9-16th, 1947, we held thirteen stewardship meetings in the seven districts, and the speakers were Mr. Roy H. Nichols, President of our Board of Lay Activities and Lay Leader of N. W. Texas Conference, and Mr. Carl S. McFall, Lay Leader of West Oklahoma Conference and Member of the General Board. More than 1,200 persons, mostly men, attended these meet-

ings, and the messages on stewardship by these active and devout lay leaders of our great Church will live and bear fruit in our own lives.

We rejoice that we had a part in the successful Hendrix College Million Dollar Campaign, and laymen throughout the Conference gave willingly of their time and money to this great Conference program. Yes, we laymen are now realizing as never before what the Apostle Paul meant when he said, **"I have a stewardship entrusted to me."**

At the suggestion of Bishop Martin, we have contributed \$200.00 as our Conference's share of the expense of the Methodist Radio Hour for the past year and will do so again this year.

We have cooperated with all other agencies of our Church in carrying forward the overall program.

We recommend:

1. That every Church continue its working "Stewardship" Committee as provided in the Discipline. We have just scratched the surface and yet the results are astounding. Dr. Potts of Crusade office stated at Des Moines meeting of Board of Lay Activities in July there were 4,000 Churches in Methodism that did not order stewardship material. If our Conference is average then that means about 100 Churches (14 per district) failed to get the thrill, experience and results of a study in practical stewardship. No Church has as much material on "Stewardship" as our Methodism now offers.

2. That each Church observe the Fourth Sunday in February, 1948 as Laymen's Day. We remind you that Laymen's Day was given official recognition by our General Conference. We urge every Pastor and District Superintendent to follow suggested program for this day as outlined by the General Board of Lay Activities. It will emphasize the Christian Education emphasis of the Crusade for Christ in cooperation with Board of Education.

3. That wherever possible, an organization of Methodist men in every Church, and, where already organized that they become chartered by "Methodist Men." The time may not be far off when "Methodist Men" as such, may have opportunity to use their influence to bring peace to a needy world.

4. That we continue the emphasis on the goal of 50% increase in the attendance at all worship services of the Church as set in the stewardship year of the Crusade for Christ.

5. Sound finance in the Local Church—

Never has there been a greater need of a sound financial policy in the local church. We rejoice in the increasing number of our churches which are able to discharge all indebtedness and the others which are building up surpluses to launch great building programs. In recognition of the stewardship of these funds, we urge upon the leadership of the local churches the strictest observance of the provisions of the Discipline relating to the whole financial policy of the Church. These provisions express the wisdom of the years in dealing with church finance.

6. That we continue the emphasis on the goal of 50% increase in proportionate givers and at least a 10% increase in the number of Tithers in every church.

7. The Liquor Traffic—

When the U. S. Department of Commerce reports that the National Drink bill last year (1946) in our country totaled \$8,779,000,000, an average of \$89.00 for every person over 18 years of age in the entire nation, nearly a fourth of the federal budget, we feel the Methodist Church in uncompromising resolution should gather new strength to fight this infamous business which thrives upon the physical, social, moral and spiritual decay of people.

We urge that all Methodists practice total abstinence and refrain from serving intoxicating liquors in their homes or at social functions. Surely no church official can justify or be excused for any violation

of this principle. We shall welcome the day when a church-wide movement for an attack upon this will be launched. We express our appreciation to our Board of Temperance for effective work done this year and assure them our cooperation.

8. Copy of MEMORIAL — To the General Conference of the Methodist Church. "The General Board of Lay Activities and the National Council Conference Lay Leaders herewith respectively memorialize the General Conference of the Methodist Church to take appropriate action looking to the continuance during the next quadrennium of the Church-wide emphasis upon Christian Stewardship.

During the year of special emphasis (1946-47) the Church was brought to a new and deeper consciousness of the meaning, opportunity, and responsibility of Christian Stewardship.

There is now evident a Church wide call that the work begun shall be continued.

The General Board of Lay Activities and the National Council of Conference Lay Leaders therefore memorialize the General Conference to continue the emphasis on the cultivation and promotion of Christian Stewardship along the lines and according to the pattern which has proven so successful in the Crusade for Christ."

Your Lay Board recommends that the Little Rock Annual Conference concur in this Memorial.

T. W. McCoy was nominated as Conference Lay Leader.

T. A. Prewitt was elected Vice Chairman, Fred Gantt, Secretary and J. S. M. Cannon, Treasurer of the Board for the ensuing year.

CONFERENCE CAMP COMMITTEE

In this brief report of the Conference Camp Committee, let us first of all express our regret that we do not have a definite location to present to the Conference. We trust, however, that this will not be construed as a lack of interest or activity on the part of the Committee. Numerous suggested sites have been checked, but none which, the Committee feels, meets the needs for a Conference Camp, have been found available.

We remind the Conference of a statement in our report of a year ago, regarding the combination of essentials for such an enterprise. The location selected must be adapted to the purposes for which it is to be used, it must be available on conditions that we can meet, reasonably accessible, and must meet the requirements of moral and health conditions. Therefore, in view of these facts, the Committee believes that in a matter of this importance that it is better to wait until a desirable site can be found rather than to accept a location that would not be suitable for the purposes which the institution would be expected to serve.

Feeling the pressing need for a Conference Camp, and believing still that there is a desirable and practically useful site that can be found and developed, we request that the committee to find and purchase such a site be continued, as provided in the act of the Conference of 1945 (See Page 120 1945 Journal), with the additional powers granted by the act of 1946 (See page 52 1946 Journal), and further providing that the Conference director or youth and one young person elected by the Conference Youth Council be included.

COMMISSION ON MINISTERIAL SUSTENTATION**Report No. 1**

We, your Commission on Ministerial Sustentation, submit the following as the amended plan for the incoming year:

I. Commission

1. On nomination of the Superintendent of each of the several districts, the Annual Conference shall elect quadrennially one lay member from his district and one preacher to serve on this Commission. The District Superintendents shall be ex-officio members.

2. The Commission shall elect its own Chairman and such other officers as its needs may require.

3. The Commission shall meet annually at least one month before Conference at the call of the chairman, and at such other times and places as needs may require.

II. Beneficiaries

1. Beneficiaries under this plan shall be those ministers serving charges under the appointment of the Bishop, including those on trial, in full connection, and supply preachers who meet disciplinary requirements for supplies.

2. The minimum salary fixed for these shall be \$1200.00. The Commission will match dollar for dollar as far as its funds permit, any increase paid by any charge over and above the average paid by such charge for the three fiscal years ended in '42, '43, and '44.

3. At the discretion of the District Superintendent, any man serving in his district under appointment of the Bishop and whose salary does not exceed \$1200.00 for the year exclusive of Ministerial Sustentation Funds may receive financial assistance over and above that set forth in Paragraph 2, Section 2 of this report, provided that such assistance does not exceed \$100.00 and further provided that it is in the opinion of the Superintendent a case of real necessity.

III. Raising Funds

1. For the purpose of meeting the requirements set forth in the preceding paragraph, an apportionment of 1 per cent shall be made on all preachers salaries of \$1500.00 or more, upon the whole salary and upon all charges paying such salaries.

2. The Treasurer elected by the Commission shall be the one to receive and disburse funds accruing from this source, provided, funds shall be paid only on certification of the District Superintendent of the beneficiary.

3. District Superintendents shall report to the Commission the names of beneficiaries and the amount of aid given. The Treasurer shall keep an itemized account of the benefits paid out and report same to the chairman of this commission as soon as possible.

4. Any part of this plan may be amended at any session of the Conference on recommendation of the Commission, or on motion from the floor of the Conference.

BOARD OF TEMPERANCE

Report No. 1

We, the Board of Temperance of the Little Rock Conference, feel that we as Methodist in Arkansas are not doing enough to fight the liquor traffic in the state. It is with great alarm that we see the spread of drinking and drunkenness in Arkansas, with the inevitable increase in the physical, mental, moral, spiritual and economic impairment of a large percentage of our drinking population, and the complete destruction of many of them.

We find that in 1946 the total cost to the people of Arkansas for the licensed liquor traffic was nearly four times the amount of money invested for public education in the State, including all schools of every description, both white and colored, including the State University.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

We make the following recommendations:

1. That we continue to fight the liquor traffic wherever and whenever possible.
2. That our pastors continue to cooperate in local option campaigns in their towns and communities and that such elections be held wherever possible.
3. That courses on alcohol be continued in our Youth Assemblies, and that, if it is at all possible, a course on Alcohol Studies, similar to that of Yale University, be carried in our Church College.
4. That we continue to work toward the passage of an inclusive bill to prohibit all liquor advertising in newspapers, magazines, or bill boards, and over the air.
5. That Sunday, October 17, 1948, be observed as Temperance Sunday, and a sermon on alcohol be preached in every Church in the Conference.

6. That the program of temperance be carried on through the medium of Visual Education, and that a director of temperance be appointed for each district to serve on the District Staff.

We wish to commend the Anti-Saloon League of Arkansas and its director, C. C. Coulter, for their fine work, and the pastors and laymen who are working against the evils of Alcohol, and we pledge our support to the work which they are doing.

We elect B. F. Fitzhugh to represent our board on the Composite Committee for another year.

TOWN AND COUNTRY COMMISSION

After much serious thought and many hours of work in the interest of the Town and Country work of our Conference trying all the while to arrive at a workable program for our rural situations, we have reached the conclusion that no program is going to work 100% in every situation, but facing the responsibilities of Methodism in the bounds of Little Rock Conference we feel that some start **must** be made.

Therefore, we your Town and Country Commission, make the following report and recommendations:

1. That the District Superintendent and his staff be responsible for the execution of this program in the Districts—the District Superintendent being the director in charge—with the responsibility of making a report to the Town and Country Commission in 1948 of work done during the year—except in the event a full time worker is secured—in which case he would make the report.

2. That we adopt the larger parish plan or a modified version that will meet the need in each district as it relates to the rural work program.

2. That we adopt the larger parish plan or a modified version that will meet the need in each district as it relates to the rural work program.

3. We recommend that in every District work be done to establish new churches, missions, or church schools in unchurched communities and/or the re-opening of abandoned churches, and full cooperation and generous support be given such rural projects as have already been started in any District.

4. That all cooperating boards, giving financial support to the Town and Country Commission, assist in the development of a training program for rural workers and assist in the finding of suitable persons for training in rural work.

5. We heartily recommend studying possibilities of cooperating with such governmental, civic, educational, social and other religious groups which are now making some definite rural progress.

6. Feeling that this work will grow to such an extent as to need a full time director, beginning with the next quadrennium and that during this conference year a qualified and acceptable person may be found available for this leadership, we suggest to the cooperating boards that they include in their annual budgets for the next quadrennium the following amounts which will provide funds for the annual budget of the Town and Country Commission.

Whereas, The Discipline, paragraph 437, contains the law "He (retired bishop) may participate in the Council of Bishops but without vote," and

Whereas, the Constitution of the Methodist Church declares (par. 36) "There shall be a council of Bishops composed of all the bishops of all the bishops of all the Jurisdictional and Central Conferences," thereby giving active and retired bishops the same constitutional rights and powers in that body, and

Whereas, no bishop retired or active, except those of the Central Conference (par. 20.2), has any limitations upon his right and power to vote in the Council of Bishops anywhere in the Constitution, and

Whereas, the Uniting Conference with powers limited by the Plan of Union inserted this rule, and

Whereas(this law in paragraph 437 does contravene and modify the Constitution (par. 36) which guarantees to retired bishops the right and power in the Council of Bishops, and it was adopted by the General Conference of 1940 in a motion indorsed all the actions of the Uniting Conference without carrying it through the necessary constitutional process (par. 10.2), and

Whereas, retired bishops by reason of their knowledge, experience, and continuing activities as General Superintendents render very valuable service, and

Whereas, the Council of Bishops in regular annual meeting in May, 1947, adopted unanimously a memorial to the General Conference that this law in paragraph 437 be eliminated;

Therefore, Be it resolved that the Little Rock Annual Conference hereby respectfully memorialize the General Conference to repeal the law in paragraph 437 by striking out "but without vote."

Gentlemen:

Herewith for your approval I submit my report on the books of the Arkansas Methodist for the period ended September 30, 1947, consisting of operations since October 15, 1946.

Inasmuch as the only records of the office consist of the cash book, I have limited this report to an accounting of the recorded cash receipts and disbursements, together with a condensed balance sheet set up from the audit report of October 31, 1941.

A comparison of the operating statements for the past four years reflects the following improvement in the position of the Arkansas Methodist (periods ending with October in each year except that the current year consists of only 11½ months):

It will be noted that during this period, income from subscriptions has increased by \$6,000 this year in comparison with 1944; while income

from advertising has decreased by approximately half that amount. It will also be noted that net worth increased by a substantially smaller amount than in past years due to increased expense of operations.

Real estate owned is shown on the balance sheet at the figures placed by the appraisers secured by your Commission on April 12, 1941. The property was subsequently improved and there has been a very substantial enhancement in the market value of the property. The real estate and improvements are carried on the books at \$6,000. Insurance is carried on the buildings in the sum of \$10,000 and on furnishings in the sum of \$1,000.

During the period under examination \$3,785 has been spent for equipment and office furnishings. Of this amount, \$785 has been arbitrarily charged to expense, and the remainder of \$3,000 has been set up as a capital account. No appraisal of the property was attempted.

The management does not treat thirty-day accounts payable as liabilities, nor the thirty-day accounts receivable considered as assets, and I have, therefore, disregarded them in the preparation of this report. Withholding taxes for the quarter ended September 30, 1947, are not shown as liabilities, and unearned insurance premiums are not considered as assets in this report.

In verification of disbursements, I have examined stubs of check books, all cancelled checks and invoices. Checks are found to be properly drawn, signed and endorsed. In verification of receipts I have examined all duplicate receipts in the office. All recorded receipts have been properly accounted for.





Memoirs

LEANDER WINSTON EVANS

Leander Winston Evans, son of James K. and Phoebe Waldrop Evans, was born May 8, 1862 at Walnut Hill, (Lafayette County) Arkansas. He entered his Father's house of many mansions on August 24, 1947 from the home of his daughter, Mrs. J. O. Lites, in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. His body was laid to rest in Graceland cemetery of that city. The funeral rites were held in Hawley Memorial Methodist Church conducted by

Reverend Fred R. Harrison, district superintendent; Reverend C. D. Cade, pastor; Dr. William E. Brown; Reverend John L. Hoover; and Reverend Otto Teague.

Brother Evans was admitted on trial into the Little Rock Annual Conference at First Methodist Church in Texarkana, Arkansas, on December 8, 1904, Bishop Joseph F. Key presiding. He was then past forty two years of age. He was admitted into full connection and ordained Deacon by Bishop James Atkins in 1906 at Warren, Arkansas. He was ordained Elder in 1908 by Bishop E. R. Hendrix at Winfield Memorial in Little Rock. He served the following appointments: Spring Hill Circuit (1902-1903) as a supply, Chidester Circuit (1903-1905) having served this circuit one year as a supply before being admitted on



trial, Murfreesboro Circuit (1905-1906), College Hill in Texarkana (1906-1909), Mineral Springs Circuit (1909-1911), Millville Circuit (1911-1912), Bearden-Millville (1912-1913), Sheridan (1913-1916), Carr Memorial in Pine Bluff (1916-1918), Hawley Memorial in Pine Bluff (1918-1922), Carthage-Tulip (1922-1925). He requested, and was granted, the superannuate relationship at Arkadelphia in 1925, Bishop Sam R. Hay presiding.

On September 26, 1883, he was united in marriage to Miss Mary Freyberger, formerly of Shelbyville, Illinois. She preceded him to heaven on September 12, 1938, after almost 55 years of marital bliss. Nine children blessed the home. Seven of them survive. They are: six daughters; Mrs. Ola Bolls, Mrs. Gussie Vaughn, Mrs. Alta Vaughn, Mrs. Alma Whitten the wife of Reverend C. E. Whitten, Mrs. Ruby Lee Douglas, and Mrs. J. O. Lites; one son, Elbert A. Evans. Two sons, Fletcher and Vincent, died in 1902 and 1904 respectively.

Leander was the youngest of five brothers, all of whom became Methodist ministers. He was the last to enter the itinerent connection and the last to enter eternal bliss. His family, on his father's side, was of Welsh extraction. Two brothers, Alex T. and James K., married sisters and migrated to Arkansas from Georgia in 1859. James K., the father of this subject, died in the Confederate service at Austin, Arkansas, on September 8, 1862. Leander was exactly four months old. Phoebe Waldrop Evans was truly a remarkable woman, for in the black days of civil war, and in the days of privation that followed, with some assistance from her husband's brother and in the fear of Almighty God she reared her five fatherless sons in such a manner that they were able to hear and answer God's call to the sacred ministry.

Brother Evans' pulpit ministry was characterized by fervor and sincerity which won men to Christ. His pastoral ministry was full of compassion which made him the confidant of many. The joy of his religious life was reflected upon his countenance in a never ending smile. He excelled in prayer. His public prayers were brief as if giving God most of the time to speak. In his private prayers he must have done a great deal of listening for he was ever relating what God had said to him.

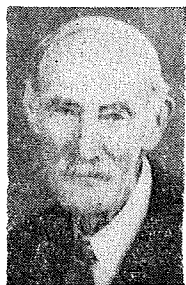
Brother Evans knew God personally and intimately. As a superannuate in the local church in the community where he lived he was the greatest source of help a pastor had this side of heaven.

JOHN D. DUNN

In 1888 he was married to Miss Katie Goodwin, of near Smackover, Arkansas, who preceded him to her heavenly home by several years.

Circumstances made it necessary for him to superannuate in 1926. It was then that he moved to El Dorado. He was active in the affairs of the El Dorado Church. He preached often for his brother preachers, held revival meetings for them and was ever interested and helpful in the ongoing of the Church. He was a member of First Church, El Dorado, Quarterly Conference. He always attended the sessions of the Annual Conference. The last session he attended was in Hot Springs, November, 1946.

Each year as the time drew near to make our offering for the Methodist Children's Home, in Little Rock, Brother Dunn, without fail, would call by the Church office to leave his contribution to the Home, and he would say: "I may not be able to come to church on the appointed day."

Although he had been rather feeble for several years, he continued to be rather active and went about his daily tasks at home until the morning of March 6, 1947, when he arose early as usual, dressed himself sat down in his big rocking chair by the fire to read his Bible and have his usual morning communion, as was his practice. When his son, Joel, entered the room to invite him to breakfast, Brother Dunn had gone to sleep—not to be awakened—his Bible lying on the floor by his chair, where it had slipped from his hand. A wonderful exit from this world and a wonderful entrance into heaven.

Brother Dunn is survived by four sons: Joel of El Dorado; LeRoy, of Camden; Hendrix, of Strong; and Wallace, of Texarkana. One daughter, Mrs. D. R. Crowe, of Hughes, Arkansas.

The funeral services were held in the First Methodist Church, El Dorado, Arkansas, by Rev. T. M. Armstrong, and Rev. Connor Morehead. His body was laid to rest in Arlington Cemetery, El Dorado.

CONFERENCE STANDING RULES

1. **Nominations.** The District Superintendents shall be a standing committee on nominations and shall nominate all members of the quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees except where they are otherwise provided for.

2. **Conference Program.** A Program for the session of the Annual Conference shall be arranged by the following Planning Committee not less than 30 days before the Conference convenes: The resident Bishop, the District Superintendents, the pastor-host, the Conference Lay Leader, the Conference President of the W.S.C.S., Chairman of the major Boards, Committees and Commissions, the Executive Secretary of the Board of Education, the Conference Missionary Secretary, and the Conference Secretary of Evangelism. Early in the Conference year the Committee may request the resident Bishop to select a Conference preacher, and arrange for all preaching, inspirational and anniversary services. This Conference program shall be published in advance of the convening of the Annual Conference. The program made by this Committee shall be subject to revision as the exigencies of any situation may require or the Conference direct.

3. **Financial and Statistical.** (1) All Conference assessments and all reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars with no columns for cents. (2) Each pastor shall settle with the Conference Treasurer and turn over his statistical reports not later than the first day of the Conference, provided this report must correspond with the Treasurer's report. (3) The District Superintendent shall furnish the Statistical Secretary with all assessments and acceptances of pastoral charges not less than sixty days before the meeting of the Annual Conference and these figures shall be accepted as official.

4. **Memoirs.** All memoirs of members of the Conference shall contain date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, names of all charges served, and place of burial. A small picture of each member of the Conference shall be printed with his memoir. Memoirs of preachers' wives shall be published in the Conference Journal. Names of deceased laymen who have been active in the Annual Conference or served on Conference Boards be printed in the Conference Journal.

5. **Conference Expense Fund.** The Conference Commission on World Service and Finance shall make an assessment for a Conference Expense Fund to cover the cost of all clerical work necessary in preparing Conference records, printing, and distributing the Conference minutes, for preserving Conference records and documents, for auditing accounts, and all legitimate expenses incurred by the Conference Secretary and the Conference Treasurer in carrying out the orders of the Conference. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of this fund which shall be paid out on the order of the Conference Secretary.

6. **District Superintendents' Salary.** In each district the District Superintendent's salary shall be estimated and apportioned to the several charges by the District Stewards under the chairmanship of the District Superintendent in a meeting called for that purpose early in the Conference year.

7. **District Expenses.** The District Stewards shall also estimate and apportion to the several charges an amount necessary for district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a Treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and shall distribute same on order of the District

Superintendent. The Treasurer shall make an annual report to the District Conference showing receipts and disbursements.

8. Reports and Resolutions. All reports, resolutions and other papers intended for publication in the Conference Journal shall be typewritten in triplicate on special forms furnished by the Conference Secretary.

9. Historical Society. There shall be a Conference Historical Society, composed of the members of the old History Commission, and new members added, as of 1943. The Secretary of the Conference shall be a member of the Society. Any vacancies occurring, other than the shifting of a Conference Secretary, shall be filled as provided in Rule 1. It shall be the duty of the Society to collect and preserve biographical data of clerical members of the Conference, and other material that promises to be of historical value and interest. Such material to be deposited in the vault of Hendrix College, Conway, Arkansas. All District Conference Journals and records shall be deposited in fire-proof vaults in the city where the District Superintendent resides. This Society shall make a quadrennial report to the session of the Conference next following the General Conference.

10. District Conferences shall be held annually in each district.

11. Lay Representation. In addition to those members provided for in Paragraph 666 of the 1944 Discipline of the Methodist Church, each pastoral charge shall, upon nomination of the pastor, elect either at the annual meeting or at the Quarterly Conference, one representative to the District Conference; **provided**, that in charges of more than 500 members, one representative shall be for each additional 500 members or major fraction thereof. Alternate lay delegates shall be elected in the same manner as the principal.

12. Lay Members. Lay members to the Annual Conference shall be elected annually.

13. Limits. No member of the Conference shall serve on more than one of the following major Boards: Conference Claimants, Education, Evangelism, Hospitals and Homes, Missions and Church extension, and Temperance. Effective at the Annual Conference of 1948, not more than one-half of the members of any quadrennial board, commission, or committee shall be re-elected, or reappointed, to the same board, commission, or committee. Thereafter one-half of all such boards, commissions, and committees shall be changed every four years. No person shall serve on any such board, commission, or committee in more than two consecutive quadrenniums. Any member of any Board, Committee, or commission failing to attend at least one meeting of said Board, Committee, or Commission in a period of twelve calendar months may be continued as a member only upon special request from such Board, Committee, or Commission. Vacancies shall be filled as provided in Rule 1.

14. District Committee on Qualifications of Local Preachers. The district Committee on qualifications of local preachers shall consist of three traveling elders in the District.

15. Audit. The audit account of all funds as provided for in paragraph 722 of the 1944 Discipline shall be done by certified public accountants sufficiently in advance to have its report published in the Conference Journal.

17. Amendment. These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.
