CONFERENCE MINUTES

Monday Afternoon, May 30, 1977 - 2:00 P.M.

The one hundred and twenty-fourth session of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church convened at Hot Springs in the First United Methodist Church, with an Opening Celebration prepared by the Conference Council Board of Worship, William A. Eason, Chairman. The service opened with a greeting by George W. Martin, the liturgist. The opening hymn was Charles Wesley's "And Are We Yet Alive?". The choir, composed of persons from churches throughout the Conference and directed by Mrs. George Sullivan with Lynn Bauman as the organist, offered the anthem "Spirit of God Descend Upon My Heart." Bishop Kenneth Hicks was the Celebrant of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. He was assisted by J. W. Lofton, Jim Brown, James Ford, and Albert Elder.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order and expressed his appreciation for the reception that the Conference has given him during the months since his election. James Major moved the adoption of the agenda as printed in the Pre-Conference Report. It was done. James Major announced that the Roll Call was being taken downstairs at the Registration desk.

Nominations: Conference Secretary, James Major, nominated his staff: Therral Wilson, Journal Clerk; O. D. Peters, Staff Assistant; and Tellers, Bennie Ruth, H. O. Richardson, and Dale Diffee. They were elected. James Major moved that the Bar of the Conference be from the posts forward. It was done.

Welcome: Video-taped welcomes from Governor David Pryor and Attorney General David Clinton were received. George W. Martin, Host Pastor of the Hot Springs First United Methodist Church, welcomed the Conference and introduced his associates Gerald Myers and Clarence Holland and Chairpersons of the Lay Committee on the Annual Conference, George and Ruby Lassiter. Don Sniffer, Chairman of the Administrative Board, gave the church's official welcome and introduced the Mayor of Hot Springs, Tom Ellsworth, who welcomed the Conference.

Bishop W. C. Martin greeted the Conference for the retired Bishops of Arkansas, Paul Galloway, Aubrey Walton, and W. C. Martin.

The Conference voted to send greetings to Bill Lea, Leland Clegg, Welcome Burleson, H. O. Bolin, Ralph Hemund, Winslow Brown, and E. D. Galloway.

Bishop Hicks introduced the District Superintendents and their wives. The Conference stood in appreciation.

Bob Trieschmann presented Bishop Hicks' wife, Elaine, to the Conference which stood in appreciation.

Amendments: George Martin presented the General Conference Constitutional amendments for ratification of the Conference:

Amendment No. 1976-15, "Conference Lay Delegates" — 206 for, 6 against, and none abstained.

Amendment No. 1976-16, "General and Jurisdictional Lay Delegates" — 190 for, 1 against, 2 abstained.

Amendment No. 1976-17, "Missions Conferences" — 165 for, 1 against, 2 abstained.

Amendment No. 1976-18, "Conferences Represented" — 177 for, 0 against, 1 abstained. Amendment No. 1976-19 "Canada-Ontario" — 182 for, none against, none abstained.

John Miles presented an amendment to the Standing Rules, I.,7,d. P. 166. "If a person is a member of a board, agency, or institution that receives the funds of the annual Conference that member of such board, agency or institution shall not serve on the Conference Council of Finance and Administration." It will lay on the table overnight.

Ordained Ministry: Bill Elliott, Chairperson of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry, presented John Ross, Chairperson of the Committee on Conference Relation, who reported that all the members of the Conference had been found faithful by the District Superintendents. The report was adopted. John Walker, Registrar, gave Report No. 2 of the Board which was adopted. The Conference elected as Probationary members Donald F. Armstrong, David R. Steele, Rodney G. Steele, George E. Rook (415), Ellis Lloyd Posey (426.2), George W. McCoy (441). The Conference elected to Deacon's Orders: (1972 Discipline 312.1) V. Sandford Hankins and Larry W. Martineau; (449.2) Donald F. Armstrong, David R. Steele, Rodney G. Steele, George E. Rook. After presentation to the Conference and examination by Bishop Hicks, the Conference elected to Full Connection (421) J. Michael Campbell, J. Wayne Edwards, Ellis Edward Warren, and George Mackey Yokem, who were also elected to Elder's Orders.

Courtesy: Bob Trieschmann presented Mr. and Mrs. Grafton Thomas to the Conference which applauded in appreciation of its former treasurer.

Recess: The Conference adjourned for the afternoon.

Monday Evening, May 30, 1977 — 7:00 P.M.

A pre-service concert was presented by the "Good Friends" of Magnolia, Ken Stonecipher, Janet Holloman, Karla Gibson, and Rhonda Roark.

Worship Service: The evening worship service was led by Fred H. Arnold. The choir of Malvern First United Methodist Church, Thomas Bolton, Director, offered "Introit and Processional" as a call to worship, "Hallelujah, Praise the Lord" as an anthem, and "Blest Are the Pure In Heart" and "O the Deep, Deep Love of Jesus" as offertories. Bishop Hicks introduced the Conference preacher, Jameson Jones, who preached the sermon, "The Calling of A People," based on II Corinthians 4:1-10, saying that God has called the church to

- 1. Proclaim the Gospel
- 2. Build a fellowship
- 3. Empower people to live
- 4. Engage in mission

Tuesday Morning, May 31, 1977 — 8:30 A.M.

Devotional: Doyne Graham was the worship leader. Bishop Hicks offered the sermon ''To Be Sent'' based on John 1:6-14 saying

- 1. The Christian is an extension of Christ.
- 2. We are reenactments of the Word becoming flesh.
- 3. To be a minister is to be sent as Christ was sent to people that Christ cares desperately

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the Conference to order and called for the report of the Committee on Review and Evaluation. Mrs. E. T. Davenport, Chairperson of the committee, introduced the report and secretary Bill Elliott, who gave Report No. 1 and moved its adoption. The report will lay on the table overnight. John Miles moved that the Committee of Review and Evaluation study all of the Standing Rule I. 7. B and report back at their convenience. The motion passed.

Cabinet: Charles Richards, Chairman of the Cabinet, moved additions to the Standing Rules which will lay on the table overnight. The Cabinet moved that moving day be Wednesday, June 8. It passed. The Cabinet moved that pastors receive May salary from present churches and June salary from new churches. The motion passed.

Publishing House: Sam Albright of Cokesbury represented the publishing interests of the church and presented a check to the Little Rock Annual Conference for \$3,464.54 as its share of the profits of the Publishing House. Bishop Hicks presented the check to Gerald Fincher, Secretary of the Conference Board of Pensions.

Nominations: Elmo Thomason gave the report of the Conference Nominating Committee. Lloyd Perry asked that John Walker be elected as a member at large of the Board of Church and Society. He was elected. Mike Clayton nominated Larry Powell to replace Ray Hozendorf as a representative to the Arkansas Council of Churches. He was elected. The committee's report was adopted.

Council on Ministries: Elmo Thomason, Council Director, gave his report and the report of the Conference Council on Ministries. The reports were adopted.

Campus Ministries: Thomas Abney, Chairman of the Committee on Campus Ministry, gave the committee's report.

Church and Society: Lloyd Perry, Chairman, and Robert Van Hook, Secretary of the Conference Council Board of Church and Society, gave their report including a resolution calling for the Arkansas General Assembly to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment. The resolution passed by a vote of 97 for, 71 against, with 4 abstentions. Robert Van Hook moved the adoption of a resolution calling for Congressman Thornton to vote against the funding of the proposed breeder reactor in Tennessee. Marshall Steel spoke against, Lloyd Perry spoke for, and Ralph Mann spoke against. The motion failed.

Courtesy: Bob Trieschmann presented the following visitors: Mouzon Mann, Ralph Hillis, Harold Scott, Frank Clemens, Allen Hilliard, and Charles Ramsey.

Recess: The Conference recessed in preparation for the Memorial Service.

Pensions: Sidney L. Good, Chairperson of the Board of Pensions, gave the Board's report with the aid of Gerald Fincher, Board Secretary. The list of full time local pastors was approved for annuity credit: Sandford Hankins, Richard D. Justice, William A. Scott, Bun Gantz, Autrey Sirmon, Royal S. Dodson, Guy J. Downing, Altus Block, and H. E. Ratekin.

Sam Jones moved to amend the report that the \$30,000 of new money be designated for current income. The amendment failed.

Negail Riley asked that the Board study the possibility of allowing ministers serving ethnic minority churches to earn more than 40% of their total compensation from outside employment. This request was accepted by the Board for further study. The entire report was adopted.

The Conference voted to extend condolences to Don Williams and his family at the death of his father.

Adjourned: Marshall Steel moved adjournment, and it was done.

Tuesday Evening, May 31, 1977 — 7:00 P.M.

A pre-service concert was given by the Children's Choir of Dumas United Methodist Church.

The worship leader for the evening service was Howard Williams. The Wesley United Methodist Church Choir, directed by Edgar Thompson and accompanied by George Foster, offered the offertory, "Hail Mary" and the anthem, "Onward Christian Soldiers." Bishop Hicks introduced the Conference preacher, Jameson Jones, who offered the sermon, "The Word In Our Feet," based on John 29:1-10.

1. The resurrection became a word in the disciples' feet and got them to running.

Wednesday Afternoon, June 1, 1977 — 2:00 P.M.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order and asked Bill Haake to lead the Conference in the singing of ''I Am Thine, O Lord.''

Cabinet Standing Rule: Charles Richards and John Hays reviewed the standing rules offered previously concerning "Legislative Committees." Fred Haustein moved the amendment, "Only those proposals from standing committees would be referred to legislative committees." The amendment failed. Bob Van Hook moved that the original be referred back to the cabinet for a year for further study. It passed 108 for and 74 against.

Religion and Race: Harry Bass, Chairperson of the Commission on Religion and Race, gave that report. Ed Matthews moved to amend by deleting No. 4 and substituting that the Budget Committee of the Conference Council of Ministries recommend the salary for Black Conference Council of Ministries staff members and present the specific figure to the Conference Council on Finance and Administration for funding and that the Review and Evaluation Committee and Bishop name the person and job specification. The amendment passed. The report was adopted.

Ethnic Minority: Harry Bass and Bill Robinson gave the report of the Task Force on

Ethnic Minority Priority. The report was adopted.

Missional Priorities: Ed Matthews, Tom Atkinson, and Lloyd Perry presented a report of the General Conference's three missional priorities: World Hunger, Evangelism, Ethnic Minorities. The Conference granted Nadine Hardin of the North Arkansas Conference permission to add to the report. Elmo Thomason moved the adoption of the presentations of Missional Priorities. They were adopted.

Mt. Sequoyah: N. Lee Cate, Superintendent of Mt. Sequoyah Assembly, spoke to the

Conference, which adopted his report.

Tanako: Don Riggin, Chairperson of Camp Tanako, Inc., gave the report of the camp and presented Terry Everitt, Camp Superintendent-resident agent. He was elected. Bill Elliott gave Report No. 1 of the Board. It was adopted. John Walker gave the first part of Report No. 2 concerning local pastors. It was adopted. John Ross, Chairperson of the Conference Relation Committee, gave the committee's report including recommendations for Sabbatical leave (425) Sam Jones; leave of absence (433) Gary Goldman and Travis Langley on the condition that he be a member of the Mena Charge Conference and under the supervision of its pastor. These leaves were granted. The report recommended retirement be granted to George G. Kerr (434.5), Osborne White (434.3), and Robert C. Ekberg (434.3), and Bun Gantz (L.P.). This was done. These men were greeted by the Conference and Bishop Hicks and presented certificates by James Major, Conference Secretary.

Osborne White said, "I appreciate the opportunity to fulfill my calling in the Little Rock

Conference."

George Kerr said, "It's been a privilege to be a member of the Little Rock Conference. I'm retiring so that the next time I hear a District Superintendent tell a joke that I don't think is funny, I won't have to laugh at it."

Robert Ekberg said, "I came here from Texas, and now I'm going back; but Methodism

in Arkansas has been good to me and I'm grateful."

The Conference stood and applauded in appreciation for these men.

THE SERVICE OF ORDINATION

The Conference recognized these ministers and thanked God for them.

Thursday Morning, June 2, 1977 — 8:30 A.M.

Devotional: Norris Steele was the worship leader. Bishop Hicks in his sermon called for the ministers to venture forth and risk everything for Christ rather than sitting in the backyard of mediocrity.

Business Session: Dale Diffee reported that the minutes for Wednesday morning have been read, corrected and are ready for approval. They were approved.

Jim Major asked for permission for the Committee on Minutes to read and approve the minutes of Wednesday afternoon and today following the adjournment of Conference. It was granted.

Council on Ministries: Ed Dunlap presented the Council on Ministries' proposed course of action as listed in the Pre-Conference Journal. It was adopted.

Trustees: George Kerr, Chairman of the Conference Board of Trustees, and Everett M. Vinson, Secretary, gave the report of the Board. Question was raised by Ray Bates concerning the parsonage on the Mt. Pine property. It is considered a part of the property and the sale. The report was adopted.

Insurance: Tom Abney gave the report of the Insurance Commission. Jeff Davis asked about the duplication of military coverage. Marshall Steel moved that the committee be authorized to investigate these duplications that the committee feels are an unfair discrimination against anyone and settle them. The motion passed. The report was adopted.

Children's Home: Joe Phillips, Administrator of the Methodist Children's Home, spoke to the Conference.

Disability: In the report of the Joint Committees on Disability by its secretary, David Wilson, the following ministers were recommended for disability leave: Harold Bailey, Welcome R. Burleson, Horace M. Grogan, Calvin L. Miller, Jess W. Taylor and Carl E. Beard. This was done. John Ross announced that Harold Bailey had been on disability leave

until he reached 65 and was automatically placed in the retired category by the General Board and moved that Harold Bailey be granted the retired relationship. It was done.

United Methodist Women: Helen Blakley gave the report of the Conference United

Methodist Women. The report was adopted.

Laymen: William M. Shepherd, Conference Laymen's President, expressed his appreciation for Bishop Hicks and gave his report, which was adopted.

Equitable Salaries: Harold Hansford, Secretary, and George Martin, Chairman of the Commission on Equitable Salaries, gave their report. The report was adopted.

Planning and Research: Palmer Garner, Chairperson of the Committee on Planning and Research, and Ed Matthews, Secretary, gave their report, which was adopted.

Stewardship: Allen Bonsall, Chairperson of the Conference Council Board of Stewardship,

gave the Board's report, which was adopted.

Statistician: Cagle Fair, Conference Statistician, gave his report which was adopted. Calendar: Elmo Thomason presented the Conference Calendar, which was adopted.

Episcopacy: George Martin, Chairman of the Committee on Episcopacy, gave the Committee's report expressing appreciation for Bishop Hicks and thanking God for his

coming. The Conference stood and applauded in agreement.

Personal Privilege: C. Ray Hozendorf called the Conference's attention to paragraphs 706 and 709 of the discipline, which appears to be in conflict with the standing rule passed yesterday. John Miles suggested we refer the matter to the Judicial Council. Bishop Hicks said that only a Bishop's ruling may be referred to the Judicial Council. John Miles moved that the Conference suspend the standing rule until Bishop Hicks has ruled upon the legality of the standing rule. John Miles withdrew his motion. R. P. Meredith moved that we reconsider the standing rule. It passed. Harold Flowers moved to refer the matter to the Committee on Review and Evaluation. The motion was defeated. T. Nichols Evans moved to strike the standing rule that was adopted. It was done.

Courtesy: Bob Trieschmann introduced new ministers taking charges to the Conference:

Harold Wingfield, Tony Lewis, David Bush, and Steve Hale.

Resolutions: Charles Settle presented the report of the Committee on Resolutions to the

Conference, which was adopted.

Next Year's Conference: Gene Harwood, on behalf of Hot Springs First United Methodist Church, invited the Conference back next year. Wendall Strong and Varnell Norman, on behalf of the United Methodist Fellowship of the six Black United Methodist Churches in Little Rock, invited the Conference to the Little Rock Convention Center next year. Bonita Hays from the Little Rock Convention Bureau, spoke on the advantages of meeting at the Little Rock Convention Center. Marshall Steel moved to accept the invitation from Hot Springs. John Miles offered a substitute motion that we accept the invitation to Little Rock. The substitute carried.

James Major moved to empower the District Superintendents to name their committees on Church Building and Locations and the District Committee on Ordained Ministry. This was done.

Appointments: Bishop Hicks read the ministerial appointments.

Closing: The one hundred and twenty-fourth session of the Little Rock Annual Conference adjourned with the singing of the hymn, "A Charge to Keep" and the benediction by Arthur Terry.

Objectives

- 1. The Little Rock Annual Conference through the Council on Ministries and its existing boards and task forces, challenges our people to become involved and participate in world and national efforts to alleviate world hunger. - 2. Conference will work toward inspiring systems and lifestyles that will conserve energy, and physical or natural resources.
- 3. Coordinate World Hunger emphasis and other missional priorities which will support and promote General Conference Advance Specials and supporting agencies.

Actions (Strategies)

- 1. CCOM establish a World Hunger Task Force to implement objectives.
- a. Upon call of the Bishop have a session of the Annual Conference in the fall of 1977, to deal with and promote the missional priorities.
- 2. Cooperate with NAC in the work of the task force so that uniformity may be area-wide. This would include: design of programs, statewide efforts, and setting dates for fulfillment.
- 3. Each charge report to Charge Conference each year during the quadrennium plans whereby the missional priorities including World Hunger at the local church level is being implemented. Some suggested ideas for local church planning would be:
 - a. Have worship services dealing with World Hunger, including sermons.
 - b. Observe a special Hunger Sunday in which you include:
 - 1. A prayer for hungry people.
 - 2. Receive an offering for hungry people.
 - 3. Have class sessions dealing with hunger.
 - 4. Use of a metronome to dramatize hunger, and so forth.
 - c. Youth and children relating church programs on World Hunger.
 - d. Families live for a day on a poverty budget.
- 4. Work for public policies and legislation aimed at more equitable production and distribution of food.

5. Provide information and resources to local churches that will call attention to World Hunger issue.

a. Ways of overcoming waste.

- b. Encourage persons to realize the disparity in per capita use of the world's resources.
- 6. Provide financial support and assistance to the ongoing agricultural projects within the state and nation.

Evangelism 1-B

Goals

- 1. The Little Rock Conference will assist local churches in their efforts to give opportunities for persons and families to make commitments to Jesus Christ and His Church
- 2. Also to provide guidelines for making decisions through (1) outreach ministries (2) supportive community (3) growth in discipleship.

Objectives

1. Make Evangelism normative in the local church.

2. Furnish resources and personnel whereby each church can have a comprehensive plan of evangelism in this quadrennium.

Action

1. Continue the conference-wide program "Comprehensive Plan of Evangelism," through outreach ministries, growth in discipleship and supportive community.

2. Relate the local churches to the group and media ministries (Radio and TV) hosted by

Maxie Dunnam during May, 1977.

3. For helping local churches in the discovering of its resources and opportunities for evangelistic ministry.

a. Aid for goal setting.

b. Step-by-step in planning a year-round comprehensive plan of evangelism.

c. Help to find ways of evaluating the congregation.

4. Help to make the plan operative as suggested in the Council on Evangelism Meeting in Des Moines, Iowa. (Fall of 1977 — Leaders of Annual Conference will begin Training Enterprises as set forth at the Conference.)

5. The Conference will continue to provide leadership and develop resources for Decision

Point:

- a. A Heritage to Celebrate.
- b. A Community That Cares.
- c. A Community That Learns.
- d. Into the Next 100 Years.
- 6. The Conference will set aside the First Sunday in Epiphany as Covenant Sunday urging members to make and renew covenants with God and with each other and focusing on vows for baptism, confirmation and reception into the Church.
- 7. Designate the week beginning with Ash Wednesday as Evangelism Week and the Sunday following Evangelism Sunday to emphasize the evangelistic concern.

Ethnic Minority

1-0

Goal

1. To affirm the Ethnic Minority Local Church Missional Priority for the Quadrennium 1976-1980.

Objective

1. To sensitize the white majority about ethnic concerns.

2. Encourage Ethnic Minority Local Church Task Forces at the conference, district, and local levels to assist in strengthening the local church.

3. Request the conference COM in developing the 1978 council budget, to give priority to

programs which will strengthen the Ethnic Minority Local Church.

4. To establish inclusive congregational structures where "Social Settings" indicate this to be the most effective form of ministry and where the openness and willingness to experiment with such forms can be created.

Action

- 1. Share strategies with churches in racially transitional neighborhoods and provide support for churches electing to implement such strategies:
 - a. Racially inclusive, self-supporting churches by December 1980 in a racially transitional community.
 - b. Develop new ethnic congregation in educational area in Little Rock after careful study concerning the potential has been made.
 - 2. Develop strategies for parish development in rural black congregations.
 - 3. Empower Ethnic Minority for Christian mission and ministry.
 - 4. Assist in recruitment and training blacks for professional ministry.
- 5. Conference-wide program of pulpit music, and other worship art exchanges between white and black congregations.
 - 6. Train and employ blacks in the personnel role of the conference and districts.
 - 7. Assist the Arkansas Area task force to fulfill the following:
 - a. Annual Conference prioritize program to assure that adequate financial support is given to minority ministries.
 - b. Assist in the recruitment of four new ministers from ethnic minorities, during the quadrennium.
 - c. Provide an area-wide leadership training event for members of ethnic minority churches by August 1978.
 - d. Develop roles for employment in the Conference office.
 - e. Secure five "listening teams" composed of Black members of the United Methodist Church and wherever possible, utilize the Black members of this task force and organize them, and train them to visit five geographical areas within the state "seeking to discover what the members of the Black United Methodist Churches believe to be their most pressing needs and what they believe to be the best solution for their problem." The teams are to report back to the task force.

f. Provide necessary support to Black Caucus to have a consultation on the parish by September of 1979 and an evaluation consultation on Black Ministries not later than

1980.

Goal No. 2

The Conference will help provide leadership training in all fields of service both lay and clergy for growth and development.

Objective No. 1

Professional Ministry — continue to provide opportunities for training in church planning, administration, and pastoral relationships.

- A. Support and promote the Arkansas Pastors' School and Ministers' Weeks.
- B. Encourage participation in Lecture Series throughout the jurisdiction and conference.
- C. Provide overnight retreat for pastors to learn ministerial roles (Board of Ministry).

Objective No. 2

Continuing Education — work toward the development of a program of continuing education both for Clergy, Diaconate, Staff, and Laity.

Action

- A. Provide a list of continuing education opportunities to ministers, staff, and laity at the beginning of each year.
- B. Reorganize C.E.F. and provide opportunity for "Fellowship of Learning." Promote Ecumenical Clergy Conference (yearly), Economic Clergy Conference, Wesley Foundation Retreats. (Board of Ministry, Diaconal Ministry, Committee on Higher Education).

Objective No. 3

Communications — develop a media and resource center. Develop a delivery system employing all means of communication — general, jurisdictional, area.

Action

- A. Continue to provide support for the Arkansas Methodist and other publications by supplying with financial and informational assistance.
- B. Cultivate usage of the audio-visual library plus usage of the audio-visual equipment and expertise by the Council office and provide workshops for those interested.
- C. Employ the following systems of communication:
 - 1. Oversee development of the Annual Conference Resource Center/Film Library.
 - 2. Counsel districts and local churches on requirements for the job of local church coordinator of communications.
 - 3. Arrange on-going training of local church coordinators of communications.
 - 4. Discover the names of persons (lay and clergy) who can assist the conference communications program because of special background, interests or training.
 - 5. Analyze the total television and radio situation within the Conference boundaries. Get to know as many of the station managers as possible.
 - 6. Arrange for placement, in conjunction with local leadership, of religious radio and television programs sponsored by the denomination.
 - 7. Arrange for reaching as many local churches as possible with training on the effects of television (participate in one national Television Awareness Training seminar and/or make certain that other representatives of the conference receive TAT training).
 - 8. Promote the WORD AND MUSIC series and create training opportunities for pastors who wish to become involved with this radio series.
 - 9. Create a communication system from the annual conference directly to the local church Coordinator of Communication.
 - 10. Analyze daily and weekly papers in the state and get to know the editors, publishers, religious editors, and city editors.
 - 11. Have seminars to train persons in newsletter writing and arrange to receive copies of most newsletters published within the conference.
 - 12. Regularly feed stories and pictures to the conference paper about what is happening in local United Methodist churches.
 - 13. Maintain a file of qualified workshop leaders in any of the communication fields and share information when requested to district communicators and local church coordinators of communication.
 - 14. Make certain that everyone that should receive The Interpreter is receiving it.
 - 15. Analyze the communication flow within the conference. Where do breakdowns occur? How can they be overcome? Does everyone in a local church that needs basic information to do their job receive that information regularly and promptly?

- 16. Create a program for ongoing promotion and interpretation of the United Methodist World Service and benevolence program.
- 17. Coordinate communication activities related to the jurisdiction.
- 18. Become a clearinghouse for information about church public relations, and create a system for training local churches in the nature and function of good public relations.
- 19. Arrange special training for employees who are crucial to the flow of information within the conference . . . for example, the film librarian.
- 20. Train leaders in such communication areas as inter-personal relations, research, evaluation, conflict management, communication management, and production.
- 21. Maintain a system for ongoing evaluation of all conference communication activities.
- Create a network of persons (including the Bishop) who can be spokespersons for United Methodism when newspapers and television stations are looking for interviews.
- 23. Coordinate all communication activities related to regular and extraordinary meetings of Annual Conference.
- 24. Using a network of special consultants (including United Methodist Communication staff) to advise local churches on equipment needs, architectural requirements for communication activity and so forth.
- 25. Give guidance in the layout and design of printed materials for local churches.

Objective No. 4

Educational Leadership — the Conference will continue to provide leadership opportunities for officers and teachers of the Church School and other related persons.

Action

- A. Follow up the Conference-wide "My Job" Workshop enterprises with curriculum and teacher training called "Beyond My Job."
- B. Provide resources for certain leaders to attend the Mt. Sequoyah and related enterprises.
- C. Itinerate the districts with a training model for the Decision Point Church School.
- D. Provide leadership for all training enterprises needed in local churches.

Objective No. 5

The Conference will continue its training emphasis on missionary outreach.

Action — Missionary concern

- A. Cooperate with North Arkansas Conference providing missionary education throughout the Arkansas School of Missions, Hendrix College, each year and Town and Country Seminars.
- B. Distribute material dealing with Health and Welfare, Methodist Children's Home, Golden Cross.

Objective No. 6

Course Of Action

Request local Council on Ministries, District Councils on Ministries, and Conference agencies to implement the planning process, by the following steps and timeline:

A) Each District Council will recruit four (4) listening teams of two (2) persons each and the Conference will train them to interview the Council on Ministries of local churches regarding resource and program needs.

H) Council on Finance and Administration meet to consider program budget and all other budget requests of church agencies, conduct necessary hearings, and prepare a total budget to present to the Annual Conference session.

I) The report on proposed Conference program and financial and staff resources, needed to implement the program sent to lay and clergy members of the Conference, and to key leaders of the local church.

J) Proposed program received by Annual Conference; discussed and evaluated in legislative committees; amended and adopted by the Annual Conference session.

Reports Of Conference Boards, Commissions And Committees Commission On Archives And History

We recommend the following:

- 1. That each church elect a church historian (par. 261.6 of the 1976 Discipline) and where possible have a committee on Records and History.
- 2. That all photographs of the new classes admitted and the retiring ministers be made of professional quality so that they might be properly preserved in the Archives.

- 3. That the Little Rock Conference give verbal support to the Carolina Restoration Committee in its preservation of this uniquely historic Methodist church building.
- 4. That First United Methodist Church of Magnolia (organized in 1853) be designated as the honored church to provide the historic display at Annual Conference this year.
- 5. That we continue to support the church at Old Washington and encourage further restoration.
- 6. That we secure a permanent list of all books, records, documents and other materials belonging to the Little Rock Annual Conference, which are kept in the Archives at Hendrix College.

The Arkansas Methodist, Board Of Managers

I-Report

It is a pleasure to report that The Arkansas Methodist has completed its most successful year in terms of management of resources. While continually battling with inflation, we have finished the year with a balance in the bank. This is the first year in over 12 that we have not been forced to borrow money to "pay out" at the end of the year.

We have received a tremendous vote of confidence from the United Methodists of our two Annual Conferences. In 1975 we received 96.36% of our apportionment. In 1976 we received 97.93%. In 1976 United Methodists paid a total of \$88,187.53 of the \$90,000 which was apportioned to the two Conferences (\$45,000 to each). The response of the Church has been almost overwhelming. And we of the staff and Board of Managers have attempted to give leadership and management to match that kind of support.

We are continually looking for better procedures and management tools to give the Church the most service for their apportionment dollar. Some of our recent changes and innovations have been:

- $1. \ \,$ The reduction of our staff from five to four persons, with realignment of certain responsibilities.
 - 2. Reduced size of paper from 12 to 8 pages, saving approximately \$225.00 per issue.
- 3. A small reduction in rent by relinquishing some of our office space for use by the Area Stewardship Office.
- 4. As a result of a study by a general-church-level Study Team, we are in the process of making format changes to improve appearance of the paper and are currently receiving bids on publishing the paper and have under consideration some equipment changes designed to effect economies.

The Board has sought expert advice and counsel and will continually do so. The nominating committees of the two Conferences have added members to the Board who have expertise in journalism, advertising and public relations. Our aim is to utilize all responsible economies in an effort to publish the quality newspaper to which Arkansas Methodism is accustomed.

One of our first goals is to return to 50 issues a year (we plan to publish 47 issues in 1977) and the resumption of 12-page issues for those weeks requiring such volume (such as Annual Conference weeks, major events, etc.). We feel that with sound fiscal management and other procedural improvements this will become a reality in the near future; without an increase in budget.

II - Recommendations

- 1. The Board of Managers continues to recommend that the costs for publication of The Arkansas Methodist be apportioned to the local churches, as determined by the Cabinets and Councils on Finance and Administration.
- 2. The Board recommends for 1978 a total of \$102,000.00 be apportioned to the two Annual Conferences (to be divided equally between the two Conferences or as determined by the Cabinets and Councils on Finance and Administration). The figure of \$102,000.00 represents about 95% of the paper's budget for 1978, projected to be around \$111,000.00. (That represents a decrease of almost \$9,000 from the amount expended in 1976.)

3. The "Plan-of-Circulation" proposal is as follows:

a. Any clergy member of the Annual Conference and any member of a local United Methodist Church who requests it. (We suggest that these requests be made in writing or by phone to the local church to which the person is related.)

NOTE: Postal regulations require the following from each church whose members receive the paper:

- (1) The completion of a form, furnished to the church by the paper, certifying that "subscription" costs for the papers received by members of that church are paid by a portion of its members' contributions to their church. That form must be filed in the paper's office to meet Second Class mail requirements.
- (2) Some payment, within the first six months of the year, for the paper. Postal authorities inform us that if no such payment is received in that time we must remove that church's name from our mailing list.
- PLEASE NOTE: The Board and editorial staff are totally dependent upon local church pastors and leaders to see that these guidelines are followed. We urge these leaders to help avoid waste by not sending names and addresses of those who do not request the paper, yet at the same time encouraging all who will to take the paper and read it. (The amount which a local church is apportioned by its district for the Arkansas Methodist is not determined by the numbers of papers sent to its members.)
- b. Conference-connected persons (when submitted by the appropriate authorities, along with their correct address):
 - (1) Retired ministers or their surviving spouse.
 - (2) Seminary students.
 - (3) Ministers in connectional appointments.
- c. Any subscriptions not qualifying in any of the above categories (Para 3a and 3b) will be \$5.00 per year.

4. Every-Family Plan:

Churches which wish the paper sent to every member family without the necessity of those families requesting it may choose the Every-Family Plan by paying a fee of \$1.00 per family IN ADDITION TO their regular apportionment. (Example: A church having 75 families would pay \$75.00 in addition to the amount apportioned by the Annual Conference.)

5. Local Church Special Edition Plan:

Local Churches are invited to consider this plan whereby a local congregation may have the back page for news of their own local church:

a. \$1,468.75 annually (or \$31.25 an issue for 47 issues);

PLUS -

b. \$1.00 per family (the "Every Family Plan"),

PLUS-

c. The amount apportioned to your local church by the Annual Conference.

Board Of Diaconal Ministry

Report No. 1

The General Conference in 1976 passed legislation requiring each Annual Conference to organize a Board of Diaconal Ministry, with functions similar to the old Committee on the Lay Worker. Though the Annual Conference Board of Diaconal Ministry is not anywhere comparable to the Board of the Ordained Ministry, nevertheless the structure is such that they are parallel. The United Methodist Church has long had persons involved in vocations of serving ministry for whom the church has provided professional standards, certification and commissioning. These, for the most part, are "consecrated lay workers", certified ministers or directors of music, or education, or evangelism, deaconesses, and home missionaries.

"The concept of the diaconal ministry is not new. There are many in the Church who have been in this kind of ministry for a long time. The Church is now recognizing that this ministry exists, and that in fact persons can be 'called' to this ministry as well as to the ordained ministry. It is not a secondary ministry, but a ministry that has a validity all its own" (Rena Yocum, Chairperson of the Division of Diaconal Ministry of the Board of Higher Education and Ministry.)

During these past few months since the new Board of Diaconal Ministry was named for the Little Rock Annual Conference we have been seeking to discover "who we are" and how we will function. In order to assist in this process the Board is joining with the Board from the North Arkansas Conference in an Area Consultation on the Diaconal Ministry. Lakewood United Methodist Church, North Little Rock, March 26, 1977. Those attending will be the members of the two Boards, certified lay workers, deaconesses and home missionaries, residing within the area, as well as some who have expressed interest in learning more about diaconal ministry.

The Little Rock Annual Conference Board will meet in the afternoon of that day to determine goals and establish policies and procedures for its guidance and direction for the year 1977-78 and the remainder of the quadrennium.

The Director of the Conference Council on Ministries has been in touch with those who have been previously certified in the various areas. The names of those approved for renewal of certification, together with any new ones the Board may approve, as well as any who desire to become consecrated diaconal ministers and approved for this relationship will be listed in Report No. 2 from this Board.

The membership of this Board, according to the Discipline, should have at least one-third

of its total coming from persons in diaconal ministry careers. The Director of the Council on Ministries was authorized to convey a request from this Board to the committee on nominations so that this omission may be corrected.

The Diaconal Ministry, its nature, the office, and the relationships, is described in Paragraphs 301-311 of the Discipline. The membership, purpose, and duties of the Annual Conference Board are described in Paragraph 732 of the Discipline. The members of this Board invite and urge pastors and lay persons to join us in the task of defining and interpreting the composite role of the diaconal minister, those helping this new Board become an effective instrument for ministry in the life and work of the Annual Conference.

Commission On Equitable Salaries

The Equitable salary support for a charge shall be computed on the combined ministerial support paid the pastor by a charge.

- I. Charges are eligible for Equitable Salary Assistance provided:
 - 1. Each church submits its budget, in writing to the Commission, through the District Superintendent annually.

- 2. Each church conduct an Every Member Visitation, and report the results to the Commission, through the District Superintendent annually.
- 3. Each church pays in full all acceptances to the Conference or District Treasurer.
- 4. The charge agrees to increase salary support a minimum of \$100.00 annually, moving toward the goal of total support at the earliest possible date.
- 5. The charge makes application to the Commission annually, on the prescribed form, by action of the Charge Conference through the District Superintendent.
- The charge is served by a full-time pastor, or ministerial student approved by the Annual Conference. By full-time we mean disciplinary meaning of full-time minister.
- II. The Commission will supplement charges meeting these requirements to reach the minimum salary set by the Annual Conference up to a maximum of \$1,500.00 per year computed on the basis of total support paid the pastor by the charge including base salary, travel and utilities.
- III. The minimum salary for a pastor, approved by the Annual Conference for the conference year beginning June 1, 1977, shall be:

Full time		 	 	\$7,500.00
Resident, student		 	 	\$6,500.00
Non-resident, stud	ent	 	 	\$5,700.00

- IV. To encourage charges to reach full Equitable Salary support, a charge will be given credit for any annual increase that is in excess of \$100 (see 4 under Program) in an amount equal to one half of said increase; total support not to exceed \$8,000.00.
- V. We encourage the cabinet, the local church and the pastors to work toward charge realignment immediately, in order to strengthen the Church and improve ministerial support.
- VI. Station Churches, except in geographically isolated situations paying less than Equitable Salary, will be given two years to meet minimum standards or undergo charge reorganization. Failure to meet this requirement will result in loss of Equitable Salary assistance.
- VII. In the event of insufficient funds to meet all claims each charge shall share proportionately from the funds available.
- VIII. The Commission shall report annually in the Conference Journal by district the amounts paid during the conference year to each charge and minister.
 - IX. That the above plan of distribution of funds be made effective June 1, 1977.

- G. We recommend that any Conference employee who has, or who desires, a Tax-sheltered Annuity, may direct the Director of Stewardship and Finance to pay this annuity from his regular income following proper guidelines.
- H. We recommend second-mile giving through Advance Specials for World Hunger and Ethnic Minority Churches for every local church.

I. Policy Statement on Budgets

- 1. We recommend that each Board, Commission, Committee, or other agency of the Little Rock Annual Conference prepare and present an annual detailed budget to the Council on Finance and Administration two months before the session of the Annual Conference.
- 2. We further recommend that no Board, Commission, Committee or other agency be allowed to change a line item in their approved budget which would exceed 10% of the amount without the approval of the CFA.
- J. The latest independent audits shall be submitted for review and study by the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Camp Tanako, Aldersgate, Inc., The United Methodist Children's Home, The Arkansas Methodist, The Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, Mt. L. We call your attention to the action of the 1976 Annual Conference establishing The Area Office of Stewardship and Finance and the election of a Director of Stewardship and Finance. In cooperation with the Council on Finance and Administration of the North Arkansas Conference the guidelines of the Office of the Director were established and in November a Director was elected to serve from January 1 until Annual Conference. We nominate Dr. R. Bryan Brawner as Director of Stewardship and Finance of the Area Office and request that you confirm our action for the past five months and elect him to this office.

Insurance Committee

Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program

The Little Rock Conference has the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program provided by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church. The Travelers Insurance Company is the underwriter for this insurance.

Eligibility

Complete eligibility requirements may be found in the 1975 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

Ministers transferring into the Conference may enroll in HMEP within 90 days of transfer without having to fill out a "Statement of Physical Condition" form. A new lay employee of a participating church or organization may enroll within 90 days of employment without having to submit a "Statement of Physical Condition" form.

Enrollment applications and cards are available from the Insurance Committee Secretary at the Area Office of Stewardship and Finance.

Quarterly Premium Rates

We have been advised that because of adverse experience, and increased medical costs, the following quarterly rates will become effective July 1, 1977.

Recommendations Concerning Payment Of Premiums

- I. We recommend that each local church, or charge, provide 60% of the premium cost for either individual or family coverage, whichever is applicable, for those under regular appointment, and for eligible local church lay employees.
- II. We recommend that the Conference Board or Agency responsible for their own budget provide 60% of the premium cost for either individual or family coverage, whichever is applicable, for ministers under special appointment with annuity credit on the Conference.
- III. We recommend that the Conference Board of Pensions provide 60% of the premium cost of the HMEP for each Conference Claimant.

Note: Retired ministers serving appointments, or employed by a church, should refer to the Board of Pensions Recommendations, paragraphs 8 and 9, for information concerning payment of their HMEP premiums.

All persons holding an appointment from the Bishop are required to participate in the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program.

If a minister has not paid his HMEP premium by the beginning of the quarter following the quarter for which the premium was due, the minister will be removed from the HMEP enrollment. Any hardship case should be communicated by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Insurance Committee for review and action by the Insurance Committee. Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Insurance Committee.

Benefits Paid Under HMEP Under Age 65

Benefits paid under HMEP for those under age 65 may be found in the 1975 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

Important Information Concerning Medicare Enrollment

Any minister who will reach his 65th birthday when he is still serving in a full time capacity, and not drawing Social Security, should apply three months before his 65th birthday at his local Social Security office for Medicare. This applies to ministers who are eligible and wish to participate in Medicare.

Any minister who has passed his 65th birthday, and has not applied for Medicare, but wishes to do so, should contact his Social Security office immediately.

Should a minister's wife reach age 65 before the minister, she should apply for Medicare at the local Social Security office.

It is the minister's responsibility to secure his own Medicare coverage.

For those age 65 and older, the HMEP provides supplemental hospitalization and medical expense coverage only.

Age 65 And Over — Complements Medicare

In-Patient Hospital Services: Full payment of each \$124 Part A Medicare deductible; full

payment of \$31 per day from 61st through 90th day; full payment of semi-private and miscellaneous charges from 91st through 120th day beyond payment made from Medicare Lifetime Reserve days; then 80% of reasonable charges from 121st day up to a \$250,000 lifetime maximum.

Skilled-Nursing Facility (Nursing Home): Full payment of \$15.50 per day from the 21st through the 100th day.

Physicians, Surgeons and Other Medical Services (Including Out-Patient Hospital Diagnostic Services): 20% of reasonable charges after a \$60 calendar year Medicare Part B deductible. You must pay the \$60 Part B deductible.

Prescription Drugs (Self Administered); Full Time (RN or LPN Private Duty Nursing): 80% of reasonable charges after calendar year deductible of \$50, up to a \$250,000 lifetime maximum.

Death Benefit Program

The Little Rock Conference has Plan D of the Death Benefit Program provided by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church.

Eligibility

Complete eligibility requirements may be found in the 1975 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

Enrollment Periods

An open enrollment period shall be held each year during the month of December for all persons currently eligible. The effective enrollment date shall be January 1, of the succeeding year.

A limited enrollment period shall be held each year for 90 days following the session of each Annual Conference. Enrollment at this time shall be limited to those persons for whom appointment or change of Conference relationship on or after January 1, has provided new eligibility status in the plan.

Individual enrollment may be requested at any time within 90 days of becoming newly eligible, with the effective date of eligibility as the effective date of coverage.

Enrollment application cards are available from the Insurance Committee Secretary at the Area Office of Stewardship and Finance.

Premium

The DBP premium is 1.82% of the average salary of the Conference, which as of January 1, 1977, is \$10,466. The premium for 1977 is \$190.48, minus a \$25 refund, or \$165.48. The recommendation is that the church pay 60%, or \$99.29, and the pastor pay 40%, or \$66.19. As long as we do not have heavy claims, we anticipate such a refund yearly, to be distributed as determined by the Insurance Committee.

The 1977 premium was due at the Area Treasurer's Office December 1, 1976, since premiums for the whole Conference were due at the General Board of Pensions in January, 1977, to avoid a late payment interest charge. This schedule will be in effect again this year.

Retired ministers should refer to the Recommendations of the Board of Pensions, paragraphs 7 and 9, for information concerning payment of their DBP premium.

Little Rock Conference Camp — Camp Tanako

Camp Tanako - A New Image

During 1976 the camp was used by 37 groups; of these 30 were United Methodists. The total number of campers including staff was 2,486 for 7,176 camper days.

Effective March 1, 1977, the Board of Trustees employed Mr. Terry Everitt of Little Rock to become the camp's first full time camp superintendent - resident agent. This is an effort to provide more continuity for the use of the camp facilities.

The development of Camp Tanako is the key to the new image. Phase One in this development will be the updating of all the existing structures and equipment: cabins and dining hall need to be painted and winterized, roofs on most of the present structures need repairing, work on the water and electrical systems is desperately needed, some of the beds and mattresses need to be replaced, pews in the chapel need refinishing.

Phase Two will be the creation and implementation of a long range plan for the physical development of the camp and a capital funds campaign for that development. This will take commitment of all United Methodists in the Little Rock Conference in time, energy and money. This will be presented to the conference in 1978.

We would like to thank those churches who are now providing financial support for the camp and encourage and recommend that all churches in the Conference include Camp Tanako as a line item in their budget. Further we recommend that the second Sunday in August be designated as Camp Tanako Sunday and that a special offering be received in churches that have not included the camp in their budget.

Our thanks to the Council on Finance and Administration for their contribution of \$15,000 from Conference Benevolences during 1977 and would like to sincerely request \$15,000 for the year 1978. We would like to thank the Conference Council Board of Education for their financial support of \$2,000 and the Conference Board of Missions support of \$1,000. The Board requests that this support be continued in 1978.

Camp Tanako is your camp. We urge your support and year round use of this facility.

Board Of Ordained Ministry

Report No. 1

Policy and Program

- I. The Little Rock Conference Board of Ordained Ministry proposes to work strictly within the framework of the current Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church.
- II. The elected officers of the board are: chairperson, vice-chairperson, secretary, registrar, and associate registrar. The registrar shall be the treasurer.
- III. The executive committee of the board are the elected officers, Chairperson of the Continuing Education Committee, and the Chairperson of the Conference Relations Committee.

- IV. The Board shall meet prior to the opening of school, at midyear, and Annual Conference, and on the call of the chairperson.
 - V. The board shall have representatives on each District Committee of the Ordained Ministry (Par. 731.1e). In consultation with the district superintendents, the chairperson shall appoint a member of the board to serve on each committee.
- VI. The board's sources of income shall be:
 - A. A percentage of conference benevolences.
 - B. 1/4 (25%) of the amount collected from local churches designated for Ministerial Education.
 - C. Gifts, bequests, interests, and repayments of loans.
- VII. The board shall maintain a scholarship aid fund for ministerial training as follows:
 - A. For those in the course of study above the local pastor's license.
 - 1. Assistance in courses of study schools.
 - a. The cost of required textbooks for each year of the course of study. The enrollees are required to submit to the registrar itemized statements or invoices from Cokesbury for books purchased for use in the pastor's school courses
 - b. The cost of tuition or registration fees, and of room and board while attending the course of study schools.
 - 2. Assistance in the correspondence course.
 - a. Payment of fees.
 - b. The cost of required textbooks for each course; the enrollees are to purchase the required books and then be reimbursed by the registrar.
 - B. For students from the Little Rock Annual Conference preparing for the effective ministry in the United Methodist Church who:
 - 1. Have satisfactorily completed at least enough semester hours of college credit to qualify for classification as a junior.
 - 2. Are enrolled in a college, university, or seminary approved by the University Senate of the United Methodist Church.
 - 3. Hold a current certificate of candidacy for the ministry in the United Methodist Church, be enrolled in a seminary, or be a Probationary Member of the Little Rock Conference.
 - 4. Make application annually to the registrar of the board prior to August 1, giving all information requested and authorizing regular grade reports to this board's registrar from the school's registrar, including a transcript of credits at the end of the year. Application must be requested.
 - C. The Board may set a maximum amount of scholarship aid per year per recipient, but assistance will be determined for each individual on the basis of requirements or needs.

- Scholarship aid for summer sessions will be granted one-half of the maximum annual allowance.
- 2. The maximum scholarship aid for college students shall not exceed five (5) semesters. The maximum aid for seminary students shall not exceed four years.
- 3. Additional emergency scholarship aid will be granted at the board's discretion to students in the following categories, requesting and making application, who:
 - a. Begin preparation for the ministry later in life with pressing financial responsibilities.
 - b. Have severe health circumstances.
 - c. Come from disadvantaged economic backgrounds.
- 4. The maximum amount of emergency scholarship aid per person per year is one-half of the amount of the school's tuition cost.
- VIII. The board shall encourage participation in continuing education programs by ministers of the Little Rock Conference.
 - A. Enrollment is encouraged in the "Group Guided Study Program" of Perkins School of Theology, or in a comparable study program of St. Paul School of Theology.
 - B. The board will underwrite the total travel expense and board and room (if any) of a faculty member of cooperating institutions conducting one day seminars for authorized study groups. Arrangements for paying these expenses will be made by the study group through the board's registrar.
 - C. Pastors are encouraged to participate in at least one continuing education experience annually (Par. 424). The following shall serve as policy guidelines:
 - 1. Members of the Conference, participating in continuing education experiences approved by the Committee on Continuing Education, may receive up to \$150 to cover costs for tuition, board, and books. Persons are responsible for their own travel.
 - 2. Persons seeking financial aid for continuing education shall secure an application form from the Chairperson of Continuing Education, John Dill.
 - 3. No person shall be given more than \$150 each calendar year for continuing education.
 - 4. In hardship cases, ministers can apply to the continuing education committee for help to attend Pastor's School. Such help will only be granted after other avenues for aid have been exhausted.
 - 5. No financial aid is available for Minister's Week.
 - IX. The board shall give assistance in a reasonable amount for physical examination for persons to be admitted as associate, probationary or full members.

Requests And Recommendations

- The board, each district superintendent, pastor, and local church shall hold up to young persons the need for ministers and the challenge of the ministry, that may enable them to hear the call.
- II. As the first step to the ministry, candidates shall enroll for studies for certificate of candidacy for ministry with the Department of the Ministry, Division of the Ordained Ministry.
- III. Each pastor shall obtain folders on the course of study and the materials for the certificate of candidacy for the ministry.
- IV. We assume our Conference's share of financial responsibility for the Arkansas Pastor's School.
- V. The Annual Conference Council on Finance and Administration is requested to grant:
 - A. An appropriation of a percentage from conference benevolences, based on the board's financial needs that are not met by other sources.
 - B. An apportionment to local churches for the Ministerial Education Fund.
- VI. We express our appreciation for the support given the Ministerial Education Fund by the churches of the Annual Conference. We urge every church to continue to give full cooperation and support of its share of the Ministerial Education Fund for the remainder of the calendar year and 1978.
- VII. Ministers may be given a minimum of two weeks' vacation and a minimum of one week annually to participate in a continuing education enterprise (Par. 424).
- VIII. The Board recommends the establishment of a Course of Basic United Methodist Policy, History, and Tradition that would be a prerequisite for any person receiving a local pastor's license and for persons entering ministry in the United Methodist Church from other denominations.

Committee On Conference Relations

The Committee on Conference Relations of the Board of Ordained Ministry is charged with the responsibility of making recommendations to the Board of Ordained Ministry and to the Conference concerning proposed changes in Conference Relations, Included are:

- Changes from effective relation to Retirement, Leave of Absence, Termination of Conference Membership, Disability Leave, or Sabbatical Leave.
- 2. Readmission to Conference Relationship.

All requests for such changes in Conference Relations and correspondence thereto should be sent to the Chairperson of the Committee on Conference Relations, John B. Ross.

Pursuant to Paragraph 434.8 of the 1976 Book of Discipline the Committee on Conference Relations prior to the meeting of the Annual Conference shall receive from all retired ministers "who reside outside the bounds of the Conference" a statement "of their Christian

and ministerial conduct, together with an account of the circumstances of their families, signed by the district superintendent or the pastor of the charge within the bounds of which they reside."

Board Of Pensions

Recommendations

- 1. We recommend that the annuity rate be set at \$72.00 per service year beginning January 1, 1978 for both retired members of the Conference and Special Conference Claimants.
- 2. We recommend that the apportionments to the charges of the Annual Conference for Conference Claimants be based on the decimal and that after the cost of the current distribution is paid the remainder be paid into the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund.
- 3. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 1706 Section 12e of 1976 Discipline that the Sunday following Easter, April 2, 1978, be observed as Retired Minister's Day. Each pastor is urged to acquaint his or her congregation with the pension program of the Conference as part of the observance, and if possible, to use a retired minister in the Worship Service.
- 4. We recommend that the pastor of each Local Church present the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas Memorial Program for Retired Minister's Pension Fund to the members of his or her congregation and urge their participation in the program.

We request that the Conference Statistician provide a column in the Conference Journal listing the number of Memorials made through the Local Church to the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas.

- 5. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 1706 Section 5 of the 1976 Discipline the approval of the Annual Conference that Special Appointments shall be listed in the Conference Journal as follows: (1) with annuity claim (a) upon the Annual Conference, or (b) upon a General Board, and institution, or an agency of the United Methodist Church; (2) without annuity claim upon this Annual Conference.
- 6. We recommend that the Board continue to apportion to each agency and institution served by a ministerial member under special appointment with annuity claims on the

Conference the sum of \$864.00 per year in accord with the 1976 Discipline Par. 1706 Section 3.a (3); and that said apportionments be paid to the treasurer of the Little Rock Conference Board of Pensions not later than 15 days prior to the end of the fiscal year, and that a like amount be assessed upon the office of the District Superintendent and said amount to be paid from the District Superintendent's Fund.

- 7. We recommend that eligible Conference Claimants and Special Conference Claimants have the death benefit program provided for them with the contribution to be paid by the Conference Board of Pensions in accordance with the program of the Conference Committee on Group Insurance. At present widows of ministers are not covered in the Death Benefit Program, but consideration is being given the matter at this time.
- 8. We recommend that the Conference Board of Pensions pay 60% of the annual payment of the premium of the Group Hospitalization for all eligible Conference Claimants and Special Conference Claimants. In addition, we recommend that the eligible Conference Claimants and Special Conference Claimants have the voluntary portion of the Medicare paid by the Conference Board of Pensions.
- 9. We recommend that all retired Ministers who serve appointments under the District Superintendent, and receive less than \$1,000.00 in annual salary and expense from the Charge, will have their contributions and premiums paid by the Conference Board of Pensions as outlined in Par. 7 and 8 of this report.

Furthermore, we recommend that the Church or Charge, served by a retired minister, whether employed or appointed, who receives \$2,000.00 or more salary or expense from the Charge, will pay the required 60% of the HMEP premium and the retired minister pay the remaining 40%; and that the Charge pay the required 60% of the Death Benefit Program premium with the Conference Board of Pensions paying the remaining 40% of the premium.

- 10. We recommend that an annual amount of \$2,400.00 from the pensions of each retired minister of the Little Rock Conference be designated as housing allowance.
- 11. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 734 Section 4 of the 1976 Discipline that there shall be organized from the membership of the Board of Pensions of the Little Rock Conference a committee to compare the records of the amount paid by each pastoral Charge for support of pastors and for pension benefit purposes, computing the proportional distribution thereof and keeping a permanent record of defaults of the ministers in the Conference who have failed to observe the provision in Par. 734 Section 4 pertaining to proportional payment; and shall render annually to each minister and Charge in default a statement of the amounts in default for that and preceding years.

In event of default by any Pastoral Charge after the notification by the Committee, liens shall be filed against future pensions and the names of the churches and ministers along with the amount in default shall be printed in the Conference Journal.

- 12. We recommend that all the Service Years of each minister be listed in one column in the Conference Journal and in another column list the number of these years for which he or she has a claim on the Little Rock Conference.
- 13. Since the Little Rock Conference has established a Minimum Salary considered to meet the needs of a full time pastor, we recommend that (1) A minister who received the minimum salary or more must derive his or her sole compensation from the Charge and/or Conference sources in order to be eligible for pension benefits as a full time minister. (2) If a minister receives less than the Conference minimum salary from church sources, but earns more than 40% of his or her total compensation from outside employment, he or she is not eligible for pension credit. (3) Student Supply time is to be considered as employment aiding one preparing for full time service as is required to meet minimal standards as a

Conference member or certified associate member for actually serving full time pastorates. The student is not eligible for pension benefits. In keeping with this statement we request the Secretary of the Annual Conference to print in The Ministers Service Record in the Journal one column stating "Years of Pension Claim on the Little Rock Conference," and another stating "Total Service Years in the Ministry."

14. By vote of the Annual Conference we entered the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund program as of January 1, 1974. We are not a full partner in this program.

We want to again express our appreciation to all Local Churches of the Little Rock Conference for participation in the additional budget askings for an eight year period.

Our Special Gifts Campaign is continuing until we reach our million dollar goal to supplement the funds mentioned above. As of March 1, 1977 our pledges have reached \$826,380.70.

We are grateful for the generosity of our people in making it possible for us to meet our obligation to the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund in full for 1974-75-76. We must continue this good work for the eight year period.

Committee On Planning And Research

The Committee on Planning and Reserach of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church is new in concept and function. We have had several meetings exploring the needs of the church in the field of research and planning.

I. Assumptions:

- A. A data bank of information is needed about the Conference beyond that presently available.
 - 1. We need a model or profile . . . i.e. statistical picture . . . of the church in the Conference for the state.
 - 2. There should be a catalogued source of information available to churches, boards and agencies.
 - 3. There are sources of data outside the church which can be used, (i.e. Bureau of Census, University of Arkansas College of Business and Administration, State Chamber of Commerce, AIDC, etc.)
 - 4. Data would be gathered on current and projected geographical distribution of population and economic strength.
 - 5. Data would be gathered on the basis of political districts (state and church) so that a District can ask for information that relates to any specific area.
- B. Current programs being emphasized by local churches should be recorded, and made available upon request.
- C. The committee would serve as a clearing-house for all planning and research sponsored by the Conference Council on Ministries.
 - 1. Research done at the request of Conference Boards and Agencies will be considered the property of that Board and Agency.
 - It will be released by that Board, Agency, or CCOM but not by the Planning and Research Committee.

II. Proposed Functions of the Committee:

- A. To set up and organize a center of information or data, possibly on computer.
- B. To do research on request of Conference Boards or Agencies.
- C. To assist District Board of Missions with the location of new churches.
- D. To advocate long range Planning of five years or more for the Local Churches, the Districts, and Annual Conference.
- E. To do Long Range Planning (5 to 10 years) and make recommendations to the Conference based on research.
- F. To release to the news media through the proper channel interesting and unusual data revealed by research.

The Commission On Religion And Race

- 1. The Commission on Religion and Race affirms the recommendations from the Committee on Review and Evaluation which met April 27, 1977:
 - A. That a Conference Ethnic Minority staff position be established and funded by the Annual Conference to be appointed by the Bishop and to be responsible to the Bishop and the Conference Council on Ministries. This recommendation is to become effective as soon as possible, but not later than January 1, 1978.
 - B. We further request that the Council on Finance and Administration make funding available for this position.
- 2. The Commission on Religion and Race concurs with the recommendations made by the Council on Ministries as affecting the inclusiveness of the Church.
- 3. The Commission on Religion and Race supports the call for a special session of the Annual Conference in November.
- 4. We recommend that the Budget Committee of the Conference Council on Ministries recommend the salary for the Black Conference Council on Ministries staff member and present the specific figure to the Council on Finance and Administration for

funding, and that the Committee on Review and Evaluation (or the Personnel Committee of the Conference Council on Ministries, if the Nominating Committee names one) in consultation with the Bishop and Ethnic Minority Missional Task Force be assigned the responsibility of naming job specifications and recommending person or persons for this position.

Committee On Review And Evaluation

Report No. 1

To review annually and evaluate the work of the Conference Council boards and agencies; to review the job analysis of our Conference employed staff and make recommendations for changes to recommend revisions, of our Annual Conference structure is the work of this committee.

We seek from the Boards, agencies and individuals of the Conference ideas and suggestions on structural changes they see, and any other needs of which they are aware.

- I. Recommendation RE: District Property:
 We recommend the deletion of Standing Rule #1, Article #3, because this rule violated
 Paragraph #2413 in the current Discipline, where this matter is adequately handled.
- II. Recommendations on Conference Nominations procedures: Due to concern for a more professional and responsible approach to Conference Board Leadership and membership, we as a Review and Evaluation Committee have taken under study the procedure for nominating persons for membership on the various Boards and agencies of the Conference and further, how the Chairpersons are nominated.
 - A. We call to the attention of the Annual Conference the standing Rule 7.B which states that officers of the Boards can come only from at-large membership of the Boards. Many present Board officers were not elected in accordance with this standing Rule.

We recommend the temporary suspension of this rule (7.B) pending further study of how Board members are nominated and Boards are structured. We ask the Cabinet and Nominating Committee to study this and make recommendations to the 1978 Sessions.

- B. We recommend that Incorporated Boards and Agencies, such as the Children's Home, The Arkansas Methodist, Hendrix College, and Camp Tanako give serious consideration to including in their Articles and Bylaws the stipulation that the Conference Nominating Committee be consulted in making nominations to its Board memberships, with the understanding that the Conference Nominating Committee may have input on the nominations to such Boards.
- III. Judicial Council Decision 417 Study

In fulfilling the 1976 Conference request that we study Judicial Council Decision 417 and its effect on our conference, we find that:

A. Judicial Decision No. 417, dated October 30, 1976, is clear. Paragraph 705.1 of the 1976 Discipline is constitutional. It does not require the Annual Conference to have conference boards of Church and Society, Discipleship, Higher Education and Ministry, or Global Ministries. But it does require that the functions of these boards, and their divisions, be assigned to some agency of the conference.

In our Conference structure, there is one glaring omission. The Division of Lay Life and Work of the General Board of Discipleship (Paragraphs 1319-1323) has no corresponding structure in our Conference, and its functions have not been properly assigned to any other Conference agency.

We underscore the thrust of this division's responsibility, as expressed in Paragraph 1319. It speaks of "the ministry of the laity . . . to train and enable the loas - the whole body of the membership - to enter into mission . . . etc." Paragraph 1321 further explains seven major functions of lay development, including

promotion of Laity Day, the certified lay speaker program, and to provide support services to such "auxiliary groups" as United Methodist Men.

The fact that "men's work" is a separate and distinct arm of the broader "lay life and work" is made clear by its separate treatment in Paragraph 1323.

It is both proper and needful that a United Methodist Men's fellowship at the Conference level be established. Indeed, the Constitution of our church (Paragraph 36, Article 1) states that the Conference President of United Methodist Men is a member of the Annual Conference. But the Conference men's organization, whatever it is called, cannot substitute for the broader responsibilities and function of 'lay life and work.'

THEREFORE, WE RECOMMEND TO THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE:

- (1.) That the Conference Board of Lay Men be renamed Conference United Methodist Men, and that its functions and purposes be consistent with those of "men's work" as described in Paragraph 1323.
- (2.) That a Conference Board of Laity (or a division of Lay Life and Work, if a Conference Board of Discipleship is established) be created with functions and purposes as outlined in Paragraphs 1319-1323, and Paragraph 728.7.

It perhaps should also be pointed out that the offices of Conference Lay Leader (Paragraph 701.8) and District Lay Leader (Paragraph 752) are representative of the laity as a whole, and not of United Methodist Men. Indeed, in both of these above paragraphs, these officers are instructed "to relate to United Methodist Women, United Methodist Men, and United Methodist Youth Fellowship."

B. A second deficiency in our Conference structure is the absence of a Conference Commission on the Status and Role of Women. Paragraph 737 mandates that such an agency "or other comparable structural unit" be established. The Conference Committee on Nominations is aware of this recommendation and is prepared to make nominations at this conference.

Again the United Methodist Women cannot be considered a substitute for this agency. Paragraph 738 mandates that it be organized as a separate agency of the Conference, which of course it is.

Therefore, we recommend to the Conference the establishment of this agency, with functions and purposes as outlined in Paragraphs 2101-2109 and 737.

- C. As a matter of procedure, we concur in the organization of the Board of Diaconal Ministries, Paragraph 301 of the Discipline. Our Conference Board of Ministry is now the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry as is shown in 1977 Pre-conference Journal.
- D. Name Changes: While we are not mandated to establish certain specific Conference boards and agencies (Judicial Decision 417), nor to use in these cases exact titles of corresponding general agencies, we recommend that the Conference Board of Missions be renamed Conference Board of Global Ministries. The global concept of missions, which was incorporated into the name of our General Board of Global Ministries in 1968, is more than just a change of words. It underscores that we are all on this globe together. And all people in all lands, who do not know the love of God or the Lordship of Jesus Christ, are the object of our mission enterprise. The change in name of this Conference agency would be our indication that we share in this new concept of global missions.

We recommend that the Conference Board of Missions (Global Ministries) establish a Committee on Parish and Community Development. (Paragraph 729.5). This area of work has been listed as one of the priority needs of our Conference, and this committee could provide the needed leadership.

- E. The Review and Evaluation Committee is giving further study to the following matters:
 - (1.) The linkage of Higher Education and Campus Ministry under one agency. (Paragraphs 730 and 1601-1630).

(2.) The possibility of the conference establishing a Conference Board of Discipleship (See Paragraphs 1301-1329 and 728) with the major functions of education, evangelism, worship, stewardship, devotional life, and lay life and work being assigned to it.

F. The Board of Managers of the Arkansas Methodist asked that the Chairman of the Committee on Communications be named as an ex-officio member (with vote) of the Arkansas Methodist Board of Managers. We make this recommendation.

Report 2

Conference Ethnic Minority Staff Position I.

Inasmuch as the Ethnic Minority Church is one of the major missional priorities of the United Methodist Church, as voted by the 1976 General Conference, and

Inasmuch as the Little Rock Conference Committee on Review and Evaluation and the North Arkansas Conference Committee on Policy and Review voted to recommend the elimination of the Area Council Associate Director's position, this recommendation is hereby made to the Little Rock Annual Conference by the Committee on Review and Evaluation.

Inasmuch as qualified leadership is needed to strengthen the Ethnic Minority

Churches in our conference, therefore;

The Committee on Review and Evaluation recommends that a Conference Ethnic Minority staff position be established and funded by the Annual Conference for all areas of the Ethnic Minority Church development, to be appointed by the Bishop and responsible to the Bishop and the Conference Council on Ministries. This recommendation to be effective as soon as possible but not later than January 1, 1978. The Bishop and Committee on Review and Evaluation in consultation with the Ethnic Minority Missional Task Force of the Little Rock Conference shall be responsible for perfecting the job description. Until this job description is perfected, it is recommended that the job description of the Area Associate Director, as found on page 116, 1976 Little Rock Conference Journal be effective.

Recommendations Pertaining to a Resolution Passed by 1976 Conference. II.

That resolution instructed the Committee on Review and Evaluation to "study the present tasks of the Conference Council on Ministries Office and make recommendations to the 1977 session which would:

- 1. Shift as much responsibility as possible for coordinating the program of the Annual Conference from the CCOM office to the CCOM and its boards and
- 2. Reduce the size of the CCOM staff.
- Re-define the basic responsibility of the CCOM staff in terms of serving as resource persons to local churches and DCOMs in areas such as process planning, leadership training, Christian Education and parish development, and revise the job descriptions accordingly."

RE: POINTS 1 and 3: "shifting responsibilities for program . . ."

and "re-defining basic responsibilities of CCOM staff"

In the new planning stance now adopted, e.g. "Management-by-Objective" — a planning style which of necessity requires across-the-church involvement in gathering ideas, setting of goals, determining objectives and calculating actionstrategies — this kind of "shifting" will take place. This plan specifies that the CCOM directors and staff are to work with the Bishop and his Cabinet as a "design team" to take the MBO plan to all the District COMs and to all the boards and agencies of the Conference." The plan clearly states the necessity of strong,

responsible executive leadership from the CCOM Directors in administering all phases of the Conference program. (See Job Description.)

RE: POINT 2: "... reduce the size of the CCOM staff"

In not filling the vacancy created by the retirement of the Conference Coordinator of Children's Ministry the staff has been reduced by one.

With the new undertaking of the MBO style of planning, and the new direction this will require for administering Conference ministries, we do not recommend further staff reductions until we are further into this style of planning. We therefore recommend that the CCOM staff be composed of a Director, Associate Director, two secretaries, and the Conference Ethnic Minority Staff Person as recommended in Part I of Report 2 of this committee.

JOB DESCRIPTION OF CCOM DIRECTOR

(For Director only; further delineations in staff responsibilities will be made as the Conference becomes more experienced in the Management-by-Objective procedures, which is only now being adopted.)

1. The Director shall be the director of the CCOM and is held accountable and responsible for total Conference program.

All staff members, lay and ordained, employed by the CCOM are directly responsible and accountable to the Director.

3. The Director and the staff shall:

(A.) Receive the training as the CCOM directs them in developing skills in Management-by-Objective; and in consultation with the Bishop's Cabinet they shall work as a "design team" to take the MBO plan to all District COMs and to all Boards and Agencies of the Conference.

Be responsible for enabling the CCOM, in consultation with the District Council on Ministries, to receive, to initiate, to coordinate and develop, and then to implement and administer all conference programs. In this relationship, all persons responsible for any part of the Conference Program, both lay and ordained, are directly accountable to the Director and should share with him all planning, scheduling, communication, implementation and administration of Conference program. (Delineated in paragraph 726.9 of current Discipline.)

(C.) See that the calendar of the "Course of Action" (See Director's report to the 1977 Annual Conference session) is implemented and evaluated.

(D.) Give direction to on-going research and planning to design the future of the Little Rock Conference.

(E.) Shall coordinate with the CCOM Budget Committee all budget askings of the Conference Agencies and work with the Conference Council on Finance and Administration to fund these, and provide direction in the CCOM goal of funding program and ministries rather than funding Boards.

(F.) Have on a designated day weekly meetings for the purpose of developing a teamwork approach and of maintaining a good channel of communication with all staff undertakings.

The Director shall cooperate with the Executive Director of the CCOM in the North Arkansas Conference in coordinating a meeting of the two Conference CCOM staffs at least once every two weeks for the purpose of establishing and maintaining a consultative and cooperative relationship in all Area programs. (The CCOM of the 2 conferences also designated the Area Director of Stewardship and the Editor of The Arkansas Methodist as participants in these bi-weekly area staff sessions.)

The Director shall function in an administrative and consultative relationship with the Conference Cabinet in matters relating to development, correlation, implementation and administration of the Conference program.

- 6. The Director, in consultation with, the appropriate Boards, Councils, Commissions and agencies, shall contract with persons such as General Board personnel, business firms, or education institutions to provide additional leadership resources needed for the studying, initiating and implementing of Conference program.
- 7. The Director shall call upon District Superintendents and Conference Chairpersons of Boards and Commissions though not employed by the CCOM to assist in providing program resources to program boards, commissions, institutions, District Councils on Ministries, and local churches.

WE FURTHER RECOMMEND:

- 1. That the Annual Conference provide for a "Personnel Committee" which will meet at least quarterly with the CCOM Director and staff to evaluate and review the on-going ministries directed by the Conference, and to measure the CCOM's accomplishments in reaching established goals and objectives. Until the creation of such a committee, the existing Review and Evaluation Committee will meet at least quarterly with the CCOM Director for this purpose.
- That the Chairperson of CFA in consultation with the Bishop name a committee
 to review the compensations and fringe benefits of all lay employees of the
 Conference and establish a uniform policy for all lay employees of the
 Conference.

Board Of Trustees

The Upchurch property near Mablevale has been deeded to the Methodist Episcopal Church, as requested by the Little Rock District Superintendent and ordered by the last session of Conference.

The Vimy Ridge property, previously declared abandoned, was sold to Mr. Doyle L. Roach for \$500.00. The proceeds were turned over to the Little Rock District Board of Missions.

Much time has been spent on the Carolina property. Previously the property had been declared abandoned and recommended to be sold. Later the deeds to the two acres on which the church stands were discovered to contain a reversion clause. For this reason the Board of Trustees requested that the Conference reverse its previous action and return the property to the Hope District. Since last Conference we have found that one other tract of the property also contains a reversion clause. The only parcel remaining with a trust clause is the two acres on which the old Academy stood. It lies immediately back of the Church and adjacent to it. The Carolina Restoration Committee has requested that these two acres be turned over to them to be developed as a part of the restoration project. This Board recommends that use be given to the Restoration Committee; but that ownership be retained by the Conference Board of Trustees.

The Wingfield Chapel property, declared abandoned last Conference has been sold for \$1250.00 and the money turned over to the Camden District Board of Missions.

Friendship Church, in Union County, was declared abandoned at the last session of Conference. This property encompasses about eight acres of land upon which a beautiful frame church building and cemetery are situated. The building is in good shape and the lawn and cemetery well kept. A Cemetery Association was formed under the direction of the Camden District Superintendent, Dr. Charles Richards, and they request that the property be turned over to them. It is the recommendation of this Board, with the concurrence of the Camden District Superintendent that the property be turned over to this Cemetery Association with the understanding that it be used only in conformity to the Discipline of the

United Methodist Church and that a written report be submitted annually to the District Superintendent. The Cabinet has concurred in this recommendation.

According to information given us the Old Cypress property in Dallas County has been deeded to a cemetery association by trustees of the former congregation. According to further information provided, the Board of Trustees found that this was not a valid transaction; therefore, we recommend that the Conference Board of Trustees grant to the Cemetery Association a valid deed.

Butterfield Church property near Malvern is no longer in use. There have been several inquiries regarding purchase of the property. We recommend the sale of this building and land, and that the proceeds be submitted to the Arkadelphia District Treasurer. It is our understanding that the Bishop and Cabinet of the Little Rock Conference are in agreement with this recommendation.

We have had several inquiries regarding purchase of the lot near Delight, where the Saline Methodist Church once stood. We ask that it be declared as abandoned property and sold.

There is an acre or more of land near Glenwood, Arkansas, where the Powers Chapel Church once stood. It has grown up in brush and timber. A small portion contains a cemetery, partially enclosed by a fallen down fence. We recommend that this property be declared abandoned and that portion not included in the cemetery be sold to the highest bidder.

A Cemetery Association has requested that they be allowed to acquire the land on which the Mount Ida Church stands near De Queen, to be used as additional burial lots. We propose that the building be sold and the land given to the Cemetery Association. We have found the Cemetery Association to be in good financial condition.

The Water Creek property still remains unsettled. To our knowledge, no Cemetery Association has as yet been formed. We recommend that this property be retained by the Conference Board of Trustees.

The Episcopal Residence has been duly deeded to Bishop Hicks and his wife, in compliance with the directions given by the Committee on Episcopal Residence of the Little Rock and North Arkansas Annual Conferences.

The Mt. Pine Church property in the Arkadelphia District has been declared abandoned; therefore, we recommend that said property be sold and the proceeds be deposited with the treasurer of the Arkadelphia District.

We also recommend that the abandoned Mt. Olivet Church property of the Holly Springs Circuit in the Camden District, be given to the Mt. Olivet Cemetery Association for use as a cemetery chapel.

United Methodist Women

Last October the Annual Meeting of United Methodist Women was held at First Church, Arkadelphia. The theme was ON OUR WAY — TOGETHER. This theme was not chosen lightly. At the end of the first quadrennium for United Methodist Women we know that we are "On Our Way Together". We are an inclusive organization, we are an enthusiastic organization. We care, we feel need, we want to be involved in the ever present struggle on this globe. The Women's Division is the largest source of appropriation for the Board of Global Ministries. United Methodist Women of the Little Rock Conference are proud of the part they play in the ongoing program of this Board.

Our financial report for the year ending December 31, 1976 showed an increase in giving in spite of an increase in the cost of living. A total of \$115,361.31 was sent to the Women's Division. \$103,250.44 was our pledge to Missions. The balance was from the offering of the Week of Prayer and Self Denial and from designated gifts. We surpassed our pledge and have increased our pledge for 1977 by \$3,500.00. Through the Elizabeth Thornberg Workman

Fund which is used in our own conference, \$1,460.67 was contributed to the Conference Youth Service Fund. Aldersgate Inc. receives \$1,500.00 annually. This does not include designated gifts which come from local units. Last year an additional \$4,000.00 went to Ecumenical Retirement Center Inc. Each year we give \$1,950.00 to the Arkansas School of Christian Mission.

Election of officers was held at the Annual Meeting. Of the 12 conference officers, 11 are new in their office. The new officers went to Cincinnati in March for NEW OFFICER TRAINING. They in turn held District Officer Training at First Church, Benton in April. The District Officers are busy making plans for similar training for local officers in fall and spring meetings. Our goal is to challenge, nurture and encourage the local units and to become aware of and respond to their needs.

There have been two outstanding workshops since the first of the year. The first was a Legislative Training Event held at St. John's Catholic Center in Little Rock with Mrs. George Meyer serving as chairman. Ms. Peggy Billings from the National Board of Missions was a featured speaker as was Mrs. Sara Weddington, the daughter of a Methodist minister. She has served in the Texas House of Representatives since 1972. The purpose of this workshop was to educate United Methodist Women in ways that they as Christian women can bring about political, social and economic changes through the legislative process.

The Women's Division sponsored a Communications Workshop at Aldersgate in May. This was a pilot program under the direction of Miss Joan Clark, Regional Worker. Lack of communication from the Division down to the local level is a great concern of all United Methodist Women, not just those in our conference. In the Little Rock Conference we hope to do something about it. Each district will have a workshop comparable to the one at Aldersgate.

The Arkansas School of Christian Mission will begin with the Weekend school, July 29-31. The Weekday school will be August 1-4. At the request of participants an extra day has been added to each school. Men and youth as well as women are urged to attend. The studies this year are excellent. In addition to the 3 studies, The Caribbean Crescent, The Local Church in God's Mission and Women Of the Bible, an emphasis will be made on Program Planning. The Women's Division will provide leadership for this emphasis.

Several women have distinguished themselves this past year.

Mrs. Rubye Lee Jackson of Pine Bluff has brought honor to our conference by being elected to the Board of Global Ministries through the Women's Division.

Mrs. Zenobia Waters is dean of the West Gulf Regional School which meets the week after next at Mt. Sequoyah.

Mrs. James Nix, immediate past president of the Conference United Methodist Women was a delegate to the World Conference in Dublin. Mrs. Nix was the first president of our United Methodist Women. Transition periods are never easy. She gave us excellent leadership and made the theme of our Annual Meeting a reality. We are ON OUR WAY—TOGETHER.

Charles David Cade was born August 16, 1890 at Pittsburg, Kansas, the son of Isaac Newton and Emma Chamberlin Cade. He spent his childhood and youth in the state of Kansas. His father was a Local Elder in the Methodist Episcopal Church.

In 1913 he moved with his family to Winthrop, Arkansas. He was licensed to preach in 1917. He volunteered for the Infantry in 1918. He was admitted on Trial in the Little Rock Conference in 1920 and served in the Conference until 1957, when he retired to Arkadelphia. There is no way that facts and statistics can describe the greatness and gentleness of this man's spirit. He served his appointments in the most fruitful way of any man I have known. I followed him at Wilmot. He had built a new church. He and his gracious wife had organized that Sunday School, Women's Society and Official Board in an admirable fashion. His wife, Hope, worked by his side and being a daughter of a Methodist minister, she loved and served the church even as Brother Charlie did.

He was a man of keen intellect, strong integrity, deep concern and independent spirit. His knees never bowed to the Baals of this world within or without the church.

In his last days, his spirit was bright and active in the First Methodist Church in Arkadelphia. He taught in a young Sunday School class, took communion to the nursing homes and shut-ins, called on the sick, and encouraged the young, and died in the arms of Jesus.

Charlie Cade, servant of God, your witness was bright and your memory sweet.

The Rev. J. Edwin Keith, Superintendent of the Methodist Children's Home for the past fifteen years, died on February 14, 1977. Mr. Keith was born in Malvern, Arkansas, on September 8, 1916, the son of John and Bessie Collie Keith, and the grandson of Rev. John Keith, founder of Keith Memorial United Methodist Church. He is survived by his wife, Lethal Fitzhugh Keith; three daughters, Lila Keith Riggs, Edwina Keith Traylor, and Paula Keith Hagerman; and nine grandchildren.

Ed was a Mason, a member of Arkansas Lodge No. 381 and of the Arkansas Consistory, and the Downtown Kiwanis Club of Little Rock. He was past President of the Child Welfare League of Arkansas, and served as a delegate to the World Methodist Conference in Dublin, Ireland.

He graduated from the University of Arkansas with a Bachelor of Science in Social

Welfare Degree, and from Perkins School of Theology, S.M.U. He entered the Little Rock Conference in 1936, and was ordained an Elder in 1949.

His first pastoral appointment was to the Arkadelphia Circuit in 1938. He served the churches of Hollywood, Mt. Pisgah, Mt. Zion, New Hope, Bismarck, Point Cedar, and Curtis until 1943. Succeeding appointments were Winslow-Elkins, McKinney and Garland (North Texas Conference), Bradley-Garland, and as Associate Minister of First Methodist Church, Little Rock. In 1954 the office of Director of Stewardship for the Little Rock Conference was created, and Ed became its first director. In that responsibility he assisted churches in Stewardship Revivals, and in Building Fund and Budget Campaigns. His job took him from the Gulf Coast to Alaska, wherever a church needed his assistance. In 1956, Ed left Arkansas for S.M.U., where he served for seven years as Director of Development.

In 1962, Ed returned to Arkansas as Superintendent of the Methodist Children's Home. Two new directions marked his leadership at the Home. The first was the establishing of extension children's homes in other locations in the state. There are seven such homes. They are the Blanch E. Johnson Manor at Searcy; the Oakly Manor Home at Ft. Smith; the John Magale Manor and the Joanne Magale Manor in Magnolia; the Willow Oakes Home in Marked Tree; and two homes in Arkadelphia to meet the needs of children who have become disturbed due to desertion, alcoholism, or abuse. Also, two Day Care Facilities have been built to provide good Christian care for infant and pre-school children of working mothers.

The other new direction was the development of a secure financial base for the Home. The sale of 56 of the 84 acres owned by the Home to the University of Arkansas at Little Rock was significant in the establishment of a permanent endowment fund.

He was a minister who practiced his doctrine much more than he preached it. The job he was called to at the Children's Home was one demanding many hours of work on Administrative matters, many hours of work so the Financial needs would be met, and many hours of figuring the best way to help just one more child. More than that, it demanded a life centered around caring. Few men are capable of fulfilling such demands as fully as Edwin Keith did.

Ed left with all of us a special "sermon" which can be found today in young families raising their children to know the worth of all mankind, and the hundreds of young people who will care more about their fellow man because he cared for them. We have lost his services at this moment in time but his ministry of caring is as a seed planted in the fertile soil of the eternal seedbed of humanity to produce and reproduce through the lives of people that have found themselves as a result of his ministry.

The funeral service was held at First Church, Little Rock, with Bishop Kenneth W. Hicks, Dr. Alvin C. Murray and the Rev. Louis L. Averitt officiating. Burial was in Rockport Cemetery at Malvern, Arkansas.

His pastoral appointments in order of service were the Orchard View, Columbus and Lockesburg Circuits, Dermott, Warren, Malvern, Lakeside Pine Bluff, Hope; First Churches in Pine Bluff, Hot Springs and Magnolia and the Altheimer-Wabbaseka charge. After his retirement the Administrative Board of Lakeside Church in Pine Bluff named him pastor emeritus of that congregation.

He served as a trustee of Hendrix College, Conway and Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas, a delegate to General and Jurisdictional Conferences. In fraternal circles he was a member of the Masonic order.

On January 1, 1918 she was united in marriage, at Springfield, to the Reverend William E. Brown, a distinguished young minister of Missouri Methodism and destined to become a leader in Methodism. X. Miscellaneous

The organization of the Little Rock Annual Conference is defined in the Statement of the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Conference as printed in the 1974 Journal.

The Standing Rules are subject to the Discipline of the United Methodist Church and the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

THE STANDING RULES

- I. Conference Organization
 - 1. Number of Districts. There shall be six districts in the Little Rock Annual Conference.
 - 2. District Conference. There may be a district conference held annually in each district, composed of those members provided for in the current Discipline, and one additional member from each pastoral charge, provided however, in charges of more than five hundred members there shall be one additional member for each five hundred members or fraction thereof.
 - 3. Nominations.
 - (a) The Conference Nominating Committee shall be composed of the District Superintendent and one lay person from each district. The Bishop shall serve as chairman.
 - (b) The Conference Nominating Committee shall nominate six members (three lay and three clergy) at large to achieve an equal balance of lay and clergy members, alternating by districts as follows:

Lay Clergy Arkadelphia Little Rock Camden Monticello Hope Pine Bluff

- (c) The Conference Nominating Committee will nominate all members of the Annual Conference quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees and Conference Council on Ministry boards, committees and commissions except as otherwise provided. Each District Nominating Committee will complete its list of qualified nominations by December 31. All nominees shall be consulted regarding their nomination. All boards and agencies of the Conference shall be inclusive of ethnic minority representation.
- (d) Terms of office of the Nominating Committee shall be for four years beginning on January 1 following the session of the Annual Conference in the middle of the quadrennium.
- 4. Lay Members. Lay members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually and their names and addresses shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
- 5. Youth Membership. Each District Council of the United Methodist Youth shall elect annually two youth members of the Annual Conference, and their names shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
- 6. Board Service.
 - (a) A membership on the same board, council, committee, or commission shall be limited to two consecutive quadrennia excepting ex-officio membership on the Conference Council on Ministries. Membership begins upon election.
 - (b) There are two types of membership on Annual Conference boards, committees, commissions and councils: at large and ex-officio. A person may serve in only one at-large and/or one ex-officio capacity. All officers shall be elected from the at-large portion of each membership.

(c) The membership of the Committee on Evaluation and Review and the Committee on Planning and Research shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) above.

II. Financial Administration

- 1. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall run from January 1 to December 31.
- 2. Financial and Statistical.
 - (a) The District Superintendents shall furnish the treasurer with all apportionments to the churches on, or before January 15. These figures shall be official.
 - (b) All Conference assessments and reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars; with no column for cents.
 - (c) Each pastor shall make a statistical report to the District Superintendent who shall submit the reports to the Conference Statistician. The Pastor's financial report will be audited and checked by the Final Data Processing Print-Out. Where there is discrepancy, the amount recorded on the Print-Out will prevail.
- 3. Administrative Fund. The council on Finance and Administration shall recommend an assessment for a Conference Administrative Fund. All clerical work of the Conference, the expense of publishing the pre-conference report, the expense of publishing the Journal and preserving the records of the Conference, the expense of preparing and printing the Worship Booklet for the Annual Conference, the expense of auditing the accounts of the several boards, the expenses of the Conference Secretary and Statistician, the expenses of committees raised by the Conference shall be paid from this Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of the Fund. Payments for unbudgeted claims on this fund shall be made on vouchers signed by the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration or the Conference Secretary.
- 4. Program Budgets. Budgets for expenditures for program for the District and the Conference shall be co-ordinated by the Conference Council on Ministries. The Conference Council on Ministries shall make recommendations to the Council on Finance and Administration which shall make a final recommendation to the Annual Conference.
- 5. Conference Treasurer. The Council on Finance and Administration shall set the salary and provide for the expenses of the Conference Treasurer and make arrangements for paying the same, subject to the action of the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference shall assign the duties, responsibilities, and the headquarters city, of the Conference Treasurer, on recommendation of the Council on Finance and Administration, in keeping with the provisions of the Discipline.
- 6. District Fund. The District Stewards shall estimate and allocate to the several charges an amount necessary for district parsonage and other necessary district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and pay it out on order of the District Superintendent. The treasurer of the district fund shall report to the District Stewards annually, showing receipts and disbursements. Funds budgeted by the District Council on Ministries will be paid by the District Treasurer upon action of the District Council on Ministries and the approval of the District Superintendent.
- 7. Apportionments Based on Pastor's Salary. On all items apportioned to local churches by means of a percentage of the minister's salary, such percentage shall be understood to apply to all ministerial members of the local church staff serving under the appointment of the Bishop and District Superintendent, including ministers in full connection, ministers on trial, and full-time Lay Pastors.

III. Conference Procedure

- 1. Rules of Order. The Rules of order shall be Roberts Rules of Order revised.
- 2. Reports and Resolutions. There shall be a pre-conference report which shall contain reports of all the boards and agencies of the Conference. This report shall be mailed to each member of the Little Rock Conference at least 30 days before the annual session. The Conference Secretary shall be the editor of this publication. All reports, resolutions, and other papers intended for publication in the preconference reports shall be typewritten, in triplicate, on special forms furnished by the Conference and obtained from the Conference Secretary. In the event editing of a report is deemed necessary by the Conference Secretary and Chairman of the Board involved, permission is hereby granted.

3. Conference Expense Fund.

- (a) Registration fees and undesignated offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be used to defray the expenses of the session including the honorarium and/or expense of the Conference Preacher.
- (b) The Conference shall meet on a self-entertainment plan, except that the entertainment of the retired ministers shall be paid from the Conference Expense Fund. The host church shall pay a per diem for days actually in attendance directly to the retired ministers and be reimbursed from the Conference Expense Fund. Eligibility shall be determined by the Conference Board of Pensions.
- (c) Any deficit in the Conference Expense Fund shall be made up from the Conference Administrative Fund.
- (d) The Conference Expense Fund shall be administered by the Committee on the Annual Conference.
- 4. Unsponsored Resolutions. Any resolution not sponsored by a regular board or standing committee of the Conference must lie over for twenty-four hours before being debated and acted upon, provided, however, immediate debate and action may be ordered by two-thirds vote of the Conference present and voting.
- 5. Memoirs. There shall be published in the Journal a memoir of each deceased clerical member of the Conference, containing date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, charges served, and place of burial. A picture of the deceased shall be published with the memoir. The same shall be done for probationary members, associate members and lay pastors. Likewise, a memoir of wives or widows of the above shall be published in the Journal. The District Superintendents shall report to the Sub-committee on Memoirs the death of any of the above mentioned and be responsible for the submission of Memoirs not later than thirty days after the death occurs. The names or memoirs of deceased laymen who have been active in the Conference sessions, or served on Conference Boards or as officials of Conference institutions may be published in the Journal. The District Superintendent shall be responsible for securing the memoirs for laymen whose memoirs shall be published. It shall be the duty of the District Superintendents to report to the Chairman of the Conference Board of Pensions the death of any conference claimant that occurs in their respective districts.

6. Historical Material.

- (a) The Library at Hendrix College shall be the depository for all historical documents and artifacts of the Little Rock Conference. The College Librarian shall be the custodian of these historical materials.
- (b) The Commission on Archives and History shall be responsible for securing a group picture of each class admitted into full connection for publication in the

Journal and also two small pictures of each clerical member at the time of his retirement.

7. Campaigns. All Conference-wide campaigns to raise funds shall be voted on by secret ballot of the Conference.

IV. Amendments

These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.

Resolution

Whereas, We, the United Methodists of the Little Rock Conference, are vitally concerned about human rights,

And whereas, the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas has not yet ratified the

Equal Rights Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America,

Therefore, be it resolved, by the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church, meeting in Annual Session at Hot Springs, Arkansas May 30 - June 2, 1977, that the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas be urged to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment to the Constitution will all due speed.
