# III. Daily Proceedings

#### **CONFERENCE MINUTES**

Monday Afternoon, May 29, 1978 - 2:00 P.M.

The one hundred and twenty-fifth session of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church convened at the Convention Center in Little Rock, Arkansas, with an Opening Celebration prepared by the Conference Council Board of Worship, William A. Eason, Chairman. The service opened with a greeting by Varnell M. Norman, Sr., the liturgist. The opening hymn was Charles Wesley's "And Are We Yet Alive?". The choir, composed of persons from churches throughout the Conference and directed by Lucy Cabe with George Foster as the organist, offered the anthem "The Lord's Supper" by special permission of the Broadman Press. Bishop Kenneth Hicks, in his meditation, proclaimed "We assemble here as the Body of Christ called to be salt, light, and leaven." Bishop Hicks was the celebrant of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. He was assisted by Joy Thornton, Bill Robinson, Joe Hunter, Bill Haake, James Swain, Larry Martineau, Mackey Yokem, and Tom Nation.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order and called on Robert Trieschmann, who presented the Bishop's wife, Elaine, and daughter, Linda, to the Conference, which stood and applauded in appreciation. James Major, Secretary of the Conference, moved the adoption of the agenda as presented in the Pre-Conference Report. It was done. The Secretary announced the Roll Call was being taken at the Registration Desk.

Nominations: The Secretary nominated his staff: Therral Wilson, Journal Clerk; O. D. Peters, Secretarial Assistant. They were elected. James Major moved that the Bar of the Conference be the table area. It was done.

Transfers In: Bishop Hicks announced that Tom Weir and Eric W. Parker are being transferred in.

Welcome: Wendell Strong, Chairman of the United Methodist Fellowship of Little Rock, which is the host of the Conference, welcomed the Conference. Bishop Hicks welcomed Bishop Martin to the Conference, which stood and applauded in appreciation.

Nominations: John Hays, Secretary of the Cabinet, presented the report of the Nominating Committee. Bill Robinson nominated Wendell Strong for the Committee on the Annual Conference. He was elected, and the report was approved with the deletion of the nominations to the Committee on Review and Evaluation. John Hays moved that the Cabinet be granted the right to fill vacancies created by transfer of ministers from one district to another. Passed.

Standing Rules: John Hays moved to delete the last sentence of Standing Rule 6.b. The motion will lay on the table for 24 hours.

Gladwin Connell moved two changes in the standing rules:

- 1. III Conference Procedure
  - 3. Conference Expense Fund.
    - (a) Registration fees and offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be administered by the Conference Treasurer and shall be used to defray the expenses of the session.
    - (b) Substitute Conference Treasurer for Host Pastor on line three.

When any proposal is submitted to the Annual Conference which involves the expenditure of funds not included in an established budget, such proposal shall be referred for advice and recommendation to the Council on Finance and Administration before a vote is taken by the Annual Conference.

John Miles moved the suspension of the rules to allow the consideration of the proposed addition above. It was done.

Bob Scott moved to amend the addition to include "and referred back to the same session

of the Annual Conference." The amendment was accepted. The Conference called for the question. The motion passed.

St. Paul School of Theology: Shrum Burton reported to the Conference for St. Paul School of Theology.

**Board of Ordained Ministry:** John Ross, Chairman of the Conference Relations Committee, reported that the District Superintendents have examined the pastors and found them faithful. The report was adopted. Board Chairman, Bill Elliott, gave Report No. 1 of the Board. The report was adopted.

**Standing Rules:** John Miles moved amendments to Standing Rule 6 to lay on the table for 24 hours.

**Greetings:** Charles Ashcraft called for the Conference to send greetings to Mrs. Aubrey Walton. The motion passed.

Greetings were read from Harold S. Bailey, Robert Beasley, and Harold Botteron.

Irl Bridenthal called for greetings to H. O. Bolin. Passed.

#### Monday Evening, May 29, 1978 — 6:30 P.M.

Bill Robinson presided over a Conference-wide Fellowship Dinner with an invocation by John Hays. Wendell Strong welcomed the Conference and a choir, composed of members of the United Methodist Fellowship, entertained during the dinner.

Following dinner, Carr D. Racop, Russ Racop, and Robert Regnier presented a slide presentation, "Serendipity of the Methodist Churches in Arkansas."

Worship Services: The evening worship service was led by Fred Haustein. The choir of DeWitt United Methodist Church, Marjorie Jenkins, Director, with Martha Neal, organist, and Ellen Alston, pianist, offered "Rejoice in the Lord" as a call to worship, "On This Day," as an anthem, and "Our God Is A Rock" as an offertory. Bishop Hicks introduced the Conference preacher, Barry Bailey, who, in his sermon "The Outsider," based on the life of Paul, said, "When you feel out of it, recognize it, let it make you more sensitive to the needs of other people, and let God help you to share that experience with someone else."

Bill Kennedy offered the response "Sail On," and the choir pronounced the choral benediction, "The Lord Bless You and Keep You."

#### Tuesday Morning, May 30, 1978 - 8:30 A.M.

**Devotional:** John Ross was the worship leader. Bishop Hicks, in his sermon based on Mark 9 and Matthew 25, said "We should be sensitive to the Messiah's presence in others that we may discover the incarnation as a way of life."

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the Conference to order and called upon the elder statesman of the United Methodist Church, Bishop W. C. Martin, who spoke to Conference of the joy of the past and the challenge of the future. Irl Bridenthal expressed his appreciation for Bishop Martin.

Children's Home: Alvin Murray, Chairman of the Policy Committee of the Methodist Children's Home, moved that the Conference ratify the action of the Children's Home Board of Trustees in drawing up a new charter. John Gill, attorney for the Home, spoke to the charter.

John Miles moved to amend Alvin Murray's motion to authorize the Conference Board of Trustees to enter into negotiations with the Children's Home Trustees and the Internal Revenue Service to amend the charter to read "the remaining assets of the Methodist Children's Home be returned to the Annual Conference of the Arkansas area of the United Methodist Church." The amendment passed. John Gill asked to delete the phrase "and the Internal Revenue Service" in order to avoid asking for a private ruling and the cost involved. Charles Ashcraft so moved. It was done.

Don Nolley questioned the Home's moving in the direction of foster homes. Joe Phillips, Administrator, said that this is an effort to meet the needs of the individual children. The question was called for and passed. Harry Bass commended the officers of the Home for integrating the Home.

Publishing House: Thomas Carpentar spoke to the Conference stating that the United Methodist Publishing House has had a very good year. Mr. Carpentar presented teaching packets to the Conference and a check for \$5,241.38 to the Conference Board of Pensions.

Diaconal Ministries: Ernestine McKinney, Chairperson of the Board of Diaconal Ministries gave the report of the Board. Charles Walthall presented a resolution calling for the Diaconal Ministers to be given membership and vote in the Annual Conference. George Martin offered the amendment that the Committee on Nominations be instructed to use the Diaconal Ministers as a pool to equalize the number of clerical and lay delegates. The amendment was accepted. The Resolution was adopted. The entire report was adopted and the diaconal ministers were approved.

Council on Ministries: Ed Dunlap, Chairman of the Conference Council on Ministries gave the report of the Council and moved that the Conference be divided into discussion groups. The motion was passed.

Chaplains: Jeff Davis introduced Alexina A. Hazzard, who presented the chaplains to the Conference and reported to the Conference.

Courtesy: Robert Trieschmann introduced visitors from the North Arkansas Conference: Melba and Charles Ramsey, Mrs. William Arnold, Mouzon Mann, Ralph Hillis, Paul Bumpers, Wayne Jarvis, Joel Cooper.

Recess: The Conference recessed in preparation for the Memorial Service.

#### Tuesday Morning, May 30, 1978 — 11:30 A.M.

Service of Celebration and Commemoration: The worship leaders were Gerald Myers and Bill Stewart. The choir of ministers was directed by David Glaze. Harold Flowers offered the sermon "Memorials Are Not Enough," based on Luke 11:47, saying:

1. Memorials are not enough, for by carefully memorializing the past, we can avoid responsibility to the past, present, and future.

2. There is the tendency to take the living faith of the dead and make it the dead faith of

the living. 3. We should not just memorialize Jesus in the worship service and avoid his spirit. We should walk in the light of Jesus, who is the light of the world.

James Major, Conference Secretary, called the names of those who died during the year and as the bell tolled for them, the Conference thanked God for them.

Tuesday Afternoon, May 30, 1978 — 3:00 P.M.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session together and Bob Trieschmann led the Conference in a stanza of "Amazing Grace."

Conference Council: Ed Dunlap, Chairman, stated, "If the program is not funded, the time line does not apply."

Keenan Williams moved to delete Goal 3 under Priority 1. - Weekly Television Program. It was done.

Ed Dunlap reported that the council is asking approval for only those programs listed in Column One and we should write above Column Three — "For Information Only."

Don Riggin moved that we adopt Priority 1 with the exception of Goal 3. It was done.

Ed Dunlap presented Priority 2 and agreed to delay consideration until tomorrow.

Ed Dunlap presented Priority 3. Nick Evans moved to relocate Goal 7 to Priority 6 Parish Development. It was done.

Ed Matthews moved to add an additional \$8,000 be apportioned to the churches for the next two years for regular church extensions for the small rural churches. The motion was withdrawn.

Priority 3 — Ethnic Minority was adopted as amended.

Priority 4 — Future Planning was adopted.

Priority 5 — Leadership Training was adopted with the addition of "including training of leaders in aged, ethnic minority, and children's work."

Priority 6 — Parish Development was adopted.

Priority 7 — Professional Ministers was amended with the addition of the "evaluation of local churches as well as pastors." Bill Elliott moved to amend by adding \$3,125 to Conference administration. The amendment was adopted. The report was adopted.

Don Riggin moved to adopt Priority 8 — World Hunger with the addition of the figure \$350,000 under Voluntary Giving for Advance Special. It was done.

Pensions: Gerald Fincher, Secretary of the Board of Pensions, gave Report #1 of the Board. Sidney Good, Chairman, spoke to the report. It was adopted. Gerald Fincher gave Report #2 of the Board. It was adopted.

Minutes: Gerald Myers reported that the minutes of Monday, May 29, 1978, have been read and approved. It was adopted.

Review and Evaluations: Bill Elliott presented the report of the Committee on Review and Evaluation to lay on the table overnight.

Recess: Bishop Hicks declared the Conference recessed for the afternoon.

#### Tuesday Evening, May 30, 1978 — 7:00 P.M.

The evening worship began with a pre-service concert by the choir from Hawley United Methodist Church, Pine Bluff.

At 7:30 P.M., the Service of Worship and Consecration of Diaconal Ministers began with a prelude played by George Foster and a call to worship sung by a composite choir from the Little Rock area.

A hymn of praise "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee," was sung. William A. Eason, the liturgist, led the Conference in the call to confession, called for a silent prayer, and gave the words of assurance and led in the response.

After the singing of the hymn "When We Walk With the Lord," Bishop Hicks led in the Pastoral Prayer. While the offering was being taken, the organist, George Foster, played an offertory. Upon the presentation of the offering, the Doxology was sung and Bishop Hicks led in the prayer of consecration. Then the choir sang the anthem.

After a welcome and announcements by Bishop Hicks, the Conference preacher, Dr. Barry Bailey, was presented.

Dr. Bailey based his message on the Book of Job. He related the narrative of the Book and pointed out that good people are not protected by God from suffering.

He presented three ideas: (1) One can sin and not suffer, (2) There are times when one can suffer and it will not be related to wrong doing, (3) Sin does cause us suffering. On the other hand, we hurt because we love, and we are often hurt because of our own choices, but our response to suffering is one of the most important things in life.

God does not deliberately harm us, but promises to be with us to love us.

Bishop Hicks then led in the Consecration of Diaconal Ministers. The candidates were presented by Ernestine McKinney and their names were read by Charles Walthall. They

were Marcia R. Dodd, Mary Jane Goss, and Mary L. Williams. Bishop Hicks consecrated each of them.

Olive Smith was recognized as a Diaconal Minister. The candidates were accompanied by Charles Walthall and Lucille Nix, as the marshalls.

After the singing of the hymn of consecration "Take My Life," Bishop Hicks pronounced the benediction. The choral response was sung and the service ended with a postlude played by George Foster.

#### Wednesday Morning, May 31, 1978 - 8:30 A.M.

The morning worship began with a prelude played by George Foster. Calvin D. Mitchell gave the call to worship and the hymn "Come, Christians, Join the Sing," was sung.

Bishop Hicks read selections from Genesis 32 and 33.

Bishop Hicks' message was a continuation of the theme "Ministry as Incarnation." God is not always made visible by being so good that others see God in you, but more by your seeing God in others. The doctrine of incarnation is the doctrine of the Bible; and it did not begin with Jesus, but is the dominant theme of the Bible story — the struggle of God to reconcile the world to himself, prepare us to see God in the face of our estranged brothers. The Bible contains the word of God, but Jesus is God's word — the ministry of incarnation.

The hymn "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus," was sung and Calvin D. Mitchell pronounced the benediction and the postlude was played.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order and Arthur Terry requested that the retired Bishops Martin, Galloway, and Walton be carried in the Conference Journal as honorary members and their memoirs be carried in the Journal. It was done by common consent.

Marshall Steel introduced Chester and Goldie Johnson, lay delegates from Carlisle, who are celebrating their golden wedding anniversary. The Conference stood and applauded.

Minutes: Dale Diffee reported that the minutes of the Tuesday morning session have been read and found to be correct. They were adopted.

Council on Ministries: Ed Dunlap, Chairman, presented the revised report on Priority: Evangelism which was adopted with the deletion of \$450 Board of Evangelism Operational Expense, which is charged to the Council Board Operational Expense.

Howard Williams moved that the Conference continue the discussion groups in future Conferences. It was done.

Jim Major asked for the Conference to give its consent for George Tanner, Ed Dunlap, and John Hays to help straighten out the report of the council. It was done.

Ed Dunlap moved that the budget of the Council on Ministries be adopted. It was done.

Ed Dunlap expressed appreciation for the work of the Council Director, Elmo A. Thomason, and Associate Director, Carr D. Racop. The Conference stood and applauded in appreciation. John Miles moved that the Journal reflect this appreciation. It was done.

Standing Rule: John Miles spoke to his proposed amendment to Standing Rule 6. David Wilson moved to amend by excluding Philander Smith and Mount Sequoyah Assembly. The question was called for by the Conference. The amendment failed. Alvin Murray offered as substitute motion that the "trustee" part of the amendment be considered later when it can be cleared up. It was accepted by John Miles. Youth delegate asked for consideration of amendment to 6(a). The question was called for. The amendment passed.

Review and Evaluation: Bill Elliott, Secretary of the Review and Evaluation, presented the report to the committee. The section on Recommended Changes of Responsibilities was adopted.

Don Riggin moved that we refer II under Other Recommendations back to the Council on Ministries. It passed 128 for and 38 against.

Section IIIA was adopted.

Section IV was adopted.

Ed Matthews moved to add the Chairperson of Church Extension be added to the Council on Ministries to lay on the table overnight.

James Major moved that the Conference ask the Committee on Review and Evaluation to prepare an updated copy of the "Structure" to be printed in the form of a booklet similar to the Pre-Conference Report. It was done.

John Hays presented his amendment to delete the last sentences of Standing Rule 6(b). The question was called for. The motion passed.

Brother Hicks brought to the attention of the Conference the need for funds to publish The Complete Works of John Wesley and asked for interested persons to contact Joe Quillian.

Gladwin Connell presented his amendment to Standing Rule 3. It was adopted.

Youth Ministries: Fred Haustein, Conference Youth Coordinator, presented the Conference Youth President, Brad Reeves, who spoke to the Conference.

Women: Mrs. Hubert Blakely, President of Conference United Methodist Women, spoke to the Conference.

Courtesy: Bob Trieschmann presented the wives of the district superintendents to the Conference, which stood and applauded in appreciation. Mrs. Kenneth Hicks presented each wife with a corsage.

In order to have a part in making it possible for Mrs. Hicks to accompany Bishop Hicks on his education tour this summer, the Cabinet presented Mrs. Hicks with \$600.

Mrs. Aubrey Walton was presented to the Conference, which stood and applauded in appreciation.

Men: R. P. Meredith, Chairman of the Board of Laymen, gave the report of the Board and moved that the action of the 1977 Conference be rescinded and the names and addresses of the church lay leaders be printed in the Journal. It passed.

Tanako: Don Riggin, Chairman of the Board of Camp Tanako, gave the report of the Board and presented Terry Everitt, Secretary/Resident Agent of Tanako, who addressed the Conference. Don Riggin moved the second Sunday in August be designated as Camp Tanako Sunday. It was done. Don Riggin moved that the Conference ratify the election to the Board of Managers, terms to expire in 1981, Mrs. Herbert Clem, John Trieschmann, Dick Meredith, Charles Settle and Don West. It was done.

Arkansas Methodist: Bill Cheyne, Vice Chairman of the Board of Managers of the Arkansas Methodist, presented the report of the Board, and John Workman, Editor.

Carr D. Racop moved that the portion dealing with increase asking be deleted. The motion failed.

The report with the exception of the financial report (which will be dealt with later by the Council on Finance and Administration) was adopted.

Children's Work: Mary Frances Garrett gave the report of the Conference Children's Work.

Insurance: Tom Williams, Chairman of the Insurance Committee, gave the report of the committee with a resolution calling for mandatory participation in the Death Benefit Program and alterations in the Insurance Program. The resolution was adopted. A resolution enrolling surviving spouses in the Death Benefit Program was presented. It was adopted.

Courtesy: The Conference greeted Earl Carter, Allen Hilliard, Vic Nixon, and Orville Brannon from the North Arkansas Conference.

#### Wednesday Afternoon, May 31, 1978 — 1:30 P.M.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called on Joe Arnold who led the Conference in the first stanza of "O How I Love Jesus."

The Secretary extended greetings from E. D. Galloway, to whom the Conference asked that greetings be sent.

Institutions: J. B. Holt of Perkins School of Theology, Roy Shilling of Hendrix College, Waltar Hazzard of Philander Smith, Lee Cate of Mount Sequoyah Assembly, Joe Phillips of the Methodist Children's Home, Ray Tribble of Aldersgate Camp, Ed Harris of the Christian Civic Foundation, addressed the Conference on behalf of their institutions.

Courtesy: W. D. Lester reported on the effort to publish The History of the Little Rock Southwest Conference. Ray Hozendorf, Chairman of the Council on Finance and

Administration, announced that the Council has agreed to underwrite the publication of this book to \$4000.

Wesley Foundation: Robert Trieschmann spoke on the work of the Wesley Foundations of the Conference.

James Ridgway spoke to the Conference on Overseas Educational Opportunities.

Church and Society: Robert M. Van Hook II presented a resolution requesting the Christian Civic Foundation place the Chairperson of the Board of Church and Society as an ex-officio member of its Executive Committee. The resolution passed; Van Hook presented a second resolution requesting Senators Dale Bumpers and Kaneaster Hodge to vote for H. J. Resolution 554 giving representation to Washington, D.C. The resolution passed.

Archives and History: Ralph Hale gave the Commission on Archives and History's report. It was adopted.

Ministry: Bill Elliott spoke to the Conference on Continuing Education. John Walker, Registrar, gave Report No. 2 of the Board, including those recommended into Probationary Membership (415.1): Carl Dean Diffee, (416.2); Melvin Bitter; (415) William Kurt Boggan, Karen Louise Brown, Stephen Emmett Darr, William Joseph Head, Richard Dale Justice, Thomas Weaver Pelton, Roy P. Smith. The report was adopted and the ministers were elected. The report included those recommended for Full Connection (421): Robert C. Armstrong, Roger E. Armstrong, William S. Briant, Jr., John D. Darnall, Fred W. Hunter, Richard C. Lancaster, Charles F. Murry, Henry A. Ratliff, Jr., Walter L. Smith, Constance D. Steele, William N. Steele, Joy L. Thornton, and Donald E. West. Bishop Hicks examined the candidates for Full Connection before the Conference and they were elected. The Board recommended for Deacon's Order, Maurice T. Burroughs, Royal S. Dodson, and L. E. Jolly, under paragraph 312.1, William Kurt Boggan, Karen Louise Brown, Stephen Emmet Darr, William Joseph Head, Thomas Weaver Pelton, Roy P. Smith, under paragraph 449.2 and the recognition of orders of Melvin Bitter as Deacon under paragraph 426.2.

John Ross requested that Gary Goldman be given Honorable Location. Granted. Travis Langley requested withdrawal by surrender of the Ministerial Office. Granted. The Conference granted retirement to George Bailey, R. O. Beck, W. H. Piggee, who were presented to the Conference.

George Bailey said, "The Lord has been so good to me. My wife has been so good to stand by me. I'm so proud that I have been able to serve the church in the ministry."

#### Thursday Morning, June 1, 1978 — 8:30 A.M.

**Devotional:** Connie Steele was the worship leader. Bishop Hicks, in his sermon based on John 20, said, "Ministers are earthen vessels sent to other earthen vessels called congregations." In order to provide a more effective ministry, some things need to happen.

- Churches look at salaries and expenses from perspective of cost of providing an adequate ministry

**Lydia Paterson**: Noe Gonzales brought greetings to the Conference from Lydia Paterson Institute.

Minutes: Dale Diffee reported that the minutes have been corrected through noon yesterday and moved their adoption. Bishop Hicks called on the Secretary to add to the motion. Jim Major moved that the Conference authorize the Committee on the Minutes to read and approve the closing minutes of the Conference. It was done.

Standing Rule 6(d): John Miles presented the revised amendment to Standing Rule 6(d). "No person from the Little Rock Conference, clerical or lay, shall serve as an elected trustee of more than one United Methodist-related institution within the bounds of the Arkansas Area at a time." "Within the bounds of" these United Methodist-related

institutions are understood to be the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Aldersgate, Methodist Children's Home, the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, Wesley Foundations, Little Rock Conference Camp Tanako, and Mt. Sequoyah Assembly. This amendment to the standing rule is to take effect during the year 1979, as each institution could possibly have its timetable of elections on a different schedule. Trustees presently serving are allowed to complete their present terms.

Bob Scott moved to amend by deleting Philander Smith, Wesley Foundation, and Mt.

Sequovah. The amendment was defeated and the main motion passed.

Review and Evaluation: Bob Cheyne moved that Conference Council on Ministries and the Conference Committee on Nominations work cooperatively to provide a structure for lay life and work in the Annual Conference. It was done.

Global Ministries: Ed Matthews recalled for consideration the proposed change in structure: The Conference Council Board of Global Ministries requests that the Chairperson of the Committee on Church Extension, which is a committee within the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries, be included in the voting membership of the Conference Council of Ministries. It was approved.

Nominations: John Hays and the Cabinet nominated Harold Flowers and Jeff Davis to the Conference Board of Trustees, Frances Garrett to the Board of Diaconal Ministries, Dale Booth as Chairperson of the Committee on Review and Evaluation, Louis Averitt to the Board of the Arkansas Methodist, and Mike Campbell as Chairperson of Young Adult Ministries of the Conference Council on Ministries. They were elected.

Moving Date: John Hays moved Moving Day be Wednesday, June 7. It was approved.

Finance and Administration: Bryan Brawner, Area Treasurer, gave his report. Danny George, Secretary of the Council, gave the Council's report. Ray Hozendorf, President of the Council, spoke to the report. John Blondell spoke to the Council's recommendation for a "Pastor's Moving Expense Fund," which came as an answer to a request from the laity. Ray Hozendorf moved the adoption of the report.

Jack Wilson moved to amend by deleting item XI J "Pastor's Moving Expense." The amendment failed.

Ed Matthew moved to amend by adding item XI O, the apportionment of \$8000 to the churches for regular church extension. The amendment passed.

Ed Dunlap moved that the \$8000 for regular church extension be added to Conference Benevolences item VB, increasing that item by \$8000. It was passed.

Bob Van Hook moved the deletion of item XI N. The motion failed with 33 voting for the motion. The entire report was adopted.

Ray Hozendorf presented a resolution calling for the establishment of a committee to study the office of the District Superintendent, the office of the Council on Ministries, the Arkansas Methodist and the Wesley Foundations, as to ways of using the financial responses of the Conference in the most productive manner. The committee is to be appointed by the Bishop and be composed of two lay men, two lay women, two ministers serving churches, a district superintendent, a youth; and that one man and one woman from ethnic minority groups be included among the members. The committee shall be authorized to call in resource persons as needed, and shall report its recommendations to the 1979 session of the Annual Conference and that the Council on Finance and Administration be authorized to pay the expenses of the committee.

John Hays moved to amend by including all administrative structures and agencies (excluding institutions) funded by the Annual Conference. The amendment was accepted. The resolution was adopted.

Statistician: Cagle Fair, Conference Statistician, moved the adoption of his report. It was adopted.

1979 Conference Location: George Martin, pastor First United Methodist Church Hot Springs introduced Gene Harwood, Administrative Board Chairman, who extended an invitation to Hot Springs and First United Methodist Church. Harold K. Davis moved acceptance. The motion passed.

John Walker moved the Conference extend a special word of thanks to our Conference

hosts. The Conference stood and applauded in consent.

Resolutions: Charles Settle, Chairman of Committee on Resolutions, gave the committee's report. Bishop Hicks called the members of the Host Committee to come forward so that the Conference could express its appreciation. The report was adopted and the Conference's appreciation expressed with a standing ovation.

Wendell Strong and the Host Committee presented a plaque to Bishop Hicks in appreciation of his service.

Earline Guel for the United Methodist Fellowship, presented Wendell Strong and Bill Robinson plaques in appreciation for their work on the Host Committee.

Courtesy: The Conference asked the Secretary to remember the Conference to Ed Galloway, Mrs. James Argue, Harold Saddler, Claude Clark, Dewey McCauley, and B. T. Fooks.

The Secretary read a telegram of greeting from Winslow and Lottie May Brown.

**Appointments:** Bishop Hicks read the ministerial appointments with the assistance of the district superintendent. The special appointments were approved by the Conference.

Closing: Arthur Terry moved we adjourn. The motion passed.

The one hundred and twenty-fifth session of the Little Rock Annual Conference adjourned with the singing of the hymn, "A Charge to Keep," led by Fred Arnold.

## The Arkansas Methodist, Board Of Managers

#### I - Report

The current status of the Arkansas Methodist may best be reported by making a brief comparison with the past.

Four years ago our paper faced a crucial turning point in its history. The loss of the Louisiana Methodist after a 25-year partnership left our publication with a one-third reduction in revenue and a similar loss in circulation. The immediate result was the necessity of emergency funding from our two Annual Conferences and the need to develop a totally new plan of financing the paper.

Such a bold new plan — to make the paper available to every United Methodist of the state through an apportionment plan to local churches — was adopted by both Conferences in

1974, to begin in January, 1975.

The effect of the plan was immediate: the first year the paper's circulation increased by

93% (from approximately 17,000 to 33,000) with only an 11% increase in cost.

Also, the reception of the new plan by the local churches of the two Conferences was especially gratifying. The first year, 93.36% of the total apportionment was paid; the second, 97.93%; and the third (1977), 95.33% — making the average of the three years, 95.54%. We believe that this is a marvelous response to the new plan and we are grateful to the churches for such support.

But to keep the paper 'in the black' has been a continuing struggle. Having experienced two years of very difficult and uncertain times — through which we were helped by our two Councils on Finance and Administration and other friends — our Board was determined to

operate within its budget and seek to overcome a long pattern of deficit spending.

Last year that stance began to show results. We were able to report to you at last year's session that we had completed one of the paper's most successful years in its recent history in terms of management of resources. We finished the year with a balance in the bank — the first year in the previous twelve that we did not have to borrow money to "pay out" at the end of the year.

That success was not achieved, however, without having to make sacrifices. We reduced

the paper from 12 to 8 pages; reduced staff from five to four, and were not able to keep pace with what we felt were deserved salary increases for our staff.

Concerning our financial status at the end of 1977, we are happy to again report to you that we finished the year in the black and were able to lay aside a small amount of funds for some long postponed and much needed updating of equipment. Again, such accomplishments were made possible only by continued economies, among them being the reduction of our number of issues per year from 50 to 47.

Throughout these years when of necessity our attention has been focused on finances, we have tried to continue to produce the quality newspaper to which Arkansas Methodists have been accustomed for almost 100 years. Inflation continues to be a very real problem, necessitating the increase in apportionments requested in our recommendation below.

We believe the role of the Arkansas Methodist is a vital one as our church seeks to give its witness in our state. We are grateful to each local church and to our lay and clergy leadership for making that continued witness possible.

#### II - Recommendations

1. The Board of Managers continues to recommend that the costs for publication of The Arkansas Methodist be apportioned to the local churches, as determined by the Cabinets and Councils on Finance and Administration.

## 2. The "Plan-of-Circulation" proposal is as follows:

- a. Any clergy member of the Annual Conference AND any member of a local United Methodist Church who requests it. (We suggest that these requests be made in writing or by phone to the local church to which the person is related.) NOTE: Postal regulations require the following from each church whose members receive the paper:
- (1) The completion of a form, furnished to the church by the paper, certifying that "subscription" costs for the papers received by members of that church are paid by a portion of its members' contributions to their church. That form must be filed in the paper's office to meet Second Class Mail requirements.
- (2) Some payment, within the first six months of the year, of the Arkansas Methodist apportionment item. Postal authorities inform us that if no such payment is received in that time we must remove that church's members from our mailing list.
- PLEASE NOTE: The Board and editorial staff are totally dependent upon local church pastors and leaders to see that these guidelines are followed. We urge these leaders to help avoid waste by not sending names and addresses of those who do not request the paper, yet at the same time encouraging all who will to take the paper and read it. (The amount which a local church is apportioned by its district for the Arkansas Methodist is NOT determined by the number of papers sent to its members.)
- b. Conference-connected persons (when submitted by the appropriate authorities, along with their correct address):
  - (1) Retired ministers or their surviving spouse.
  - (2) Seminary students.
  - (3) Ministers in connectional appointments.
- c. Any subscriptions **not qualifying** in any of the above categories (Para 3a and 3b) will be \$5.00 per year.

## 3. Every-Family Plan:

Churches which wish the paper sent to every member family without the necessity of those families requesting it may choose the Every-Family Plan by paying a fee of \$1.00 per family IN ADDITION TO their regular apportionment. (Example: A church having 75 families would pay \$75.00 in addition to the amount apportioned by the Annual Conference.)

4. Local Church Special Edition Plan:

Local Churches are invited to consider this plan whereby a local congregation can have the back page for news of their own local church:

a. \$2.78 per family (for churches of 500 or more families);

b. The amount apportioned to your local church by the Annual Conference.

## **Board Of Diaconal Ministry**

#### Report No. 1

The Board of Diaconal Ministry shares responsibility of implementation of the Conference objectives set forth in the Priority on the Professional Ministry. The Board makes the following recommendations:

- 1) The Board shall work with the District Superintendents, pastors, local congregations, and with the Pastor-Parish Relations Committees in interpreting the diaconal ministry as an integral part of the total ministry of the church. This interpretation needs to be made in holding up before young persons the need the church has for personnel in both kinds of ministry. Within the church, there are persons called of God and ordained by the church to the special ministry of Word, Sacrament and Order the Ordained Minister. Within the church there are persons called of God and consecrated to the specialized ministries of love, justice, and service The Diaconal Minister.
- 2) The Board and District Superintendents will make information available to local pastors, local congregations, Pastor-Parish Relations Committees regarding diaconal ministry careers. The UMC has established professional standards and certification procedures for the following careers: directors and associates in Christian Education, in evangelism, in music, in church business administration, church and community workers, and health and welfare workers. In other than the careers and offices named here, standards and certification procedures established by a recognized professional association are accepted as valid certification for fulfilling professional standards of diaconal ministry in other careers. There are other requirements, however, for the diaconal ministry.
- 3) The Board shall encourage persons not yet qualifying for certification in Christian Education, evangelism or music, to take advantage of Foundational Studies for Certification in ministry careers that will be offered at several seminaries and Scarritt College in the summer of 1978 and subsequent summers.
- 4) The Board will work with the Christian Educators Fellowship and the Church Musicians Fellowship, and with the Board of Ordained Ministry when feasible, in providing joint training opportunities for continuing education, workshops and retreats.
- 5) The Board shall become aware of benefits provided persons working in diaconal careers within the Conference (basic salary, pension, Social Security, insurance,

etc.). Information about these benefits as well as entry and exit procedures will be provided to local Pastor-Parish Relations Committees. The Board will urge utilizing the Guideline for Pastor-Parish Relations Committee and Lay Personnel Interview.

## **Commission On Equitable Salaries**

The Equitable salary support for a charge shall be computed on the combined ministerial support paid the pastor by a charge.

- I. Charges are eligible for Equitable Salary Assistance provided:
  - 1. Each church submits its budget, in writing to the Commission, through the District Superintendent annually.
  - 2. Each church conduct an Every Member Visitation, and report the results to the Commission, through the District Superintendent annually.
  - 3. Each church pays in full all acceptances to the Conference or District Treasurer.
  - 4. The charge agrees to increase salary support a minimum of \$100.00 annually, moving toward the goal of total support at the earliest possible date.
  - 5. The charge makes application to the Commission annually, on the prescribed form, by action of the Charge Conference through the District Superintendent.
  - 6. The charge is served by a full-time pastor, or ministerial student approved by the Annual Conference. By full-time we mean disciplinary meaning of full-time minister.
- II. The Commission will supplement charges meeting these requirements to reach the minimum salary set by the Annual Conference up to a maximum of \$1,500.00 per year computed on the basis of total support paid the pastor by the charge including base salary, travel and utilities.
- III. The minimum salary for a pastor, approved by the Annual Conference for the conference year beginning June 1, 1978, shall be:

| Full time             | \$8,000.00 |

| Resident, student     | \$7,000.00 |
| Non-resident, student | \$6,000.00 |

- IV. To encourage charges to reach full Equitable Salary support, a charge will be given credit for any annual increase that is in excess of \$100 (see 4 under Program) in an amount equal to one half of said increase; total support not to exceed \$8,000.00.
- V. We encourage the cabinet, the local church and the pastors to work toward charge realignment immediately, in order to strengthen the Church and improve ministerial support.

- VI. Station Churches, except in geographically isolated situations paying less than Equitable Salary, will be given two years to meet minimum standards or undergo charge reorganization. Failure to meet this requirement will result in loss of Equitable Salary assistance.
- VII. In the event of insufficient funds to meet all claims each charge shall share proportionately from the funds available.
- VIII. The Commission shall report annually in the Conference Journal by district the amounts paid during the conference year to each charge and minister.
  - IX. That the above plan of distribution of funds be made effective June 1, 1978.
- X. That a study be made by the Commission on Equitable Salaries as to the feasibility of standardizing salaries in the Little Rock Annual Conference and the findings of this study be reported in the PreConference Report of 1979 for the consideration in the June session 1979 Annual Conference.

  - H. Methodist Children's Home Offering Second and Third Sundays in December.
- X. We recommend that the Ecumenical Retirement Center, Inc. be given approval to secure individual gifts through their own efforts. We commend them for having repaid \$12,500 of the original loan of \$37,500, leaving a balance owed of \$25,000.

#### XI. OTHER Recommendations:

- A. Pastor's Utilities: If a charge does not otherwise provide for a pastor's utilities, then each charge is requested to designate the cost of parsonage utilities as a part of the pastor's salary, thus exempting the cost of utilities from the income tax claim.
- B. Authorized Payments by the Director of Stewardship and Finance:
  - 1. Methodist Foundation of Arkansas \$1,500 on a vouchered basis.
  - That the Committee on the Annual Conference in cooperation with the Office
    of Stewardship and Finance and the Host Church prepare a budget for
    Conference Entertainment Expense, and after Annual Conference
    recommend the payment of any deficit that needs to be paid to the Host
    Church.
  - 3. Travel allowances set at 12¢ per mile.
  - 4. Retired Ministers attending Annual Conference, \$25.00 per Diem.
  - 5. Pastor's Moving Expense at the rate of \$100 plus 75¢ per mile, except that no "expenses" will be paid in 1979. (See "guidelines" below for those who qualify.)
- C. Conference Benevolences Unrestricted Fund: That all unrestricted benevolent fund balances be placed in a central operating balance with the exception of the Board of Missions which shall transfer all balances to the Special Church Extension Fund (restricted).

- D. Interest Income: That interest income from investments shall continue to go into the Conference Administration Fund.
- E. Honorarium for Conference Preacher: We recommend that the Honorarium for the Conference Preacher be decided by the Presiding Bishop and the President of the Council on Finance and Administration and that this amount be paid from Conference Administration Fund.
- F. We recommend that any Conference employee who has, or who desires, a Tax-sheltered Annuity, may direct the Director of Stewardship and Finance to pay this annuity from his regular income following proper guidelines. We are continuing the study of lay employee's benefits as requested by the 1977 Conference Journal, pg. 113, Par. 4.
- G. We recommend second-mile giving through Advance Specials for World Hunger and Ethnic Minority Churches for every local church. We approve and endorse the World Hunger goals of \$250,000 in 1978 and \$300,000 in 1979.

### H. Policy Statement on Budgets

- We recommend that each Board, Commission, Committee, or other agency
  of the Little Rock Annual Conference prepare and present an annual detailed
  budget to the Council on Finance and Administration two months before the
  session of the Annual Conference.
- 2. We further recommend that no Board, Commission, Committee or other agency be allowed to change a line in their approved budget which would exceed 10% of the amount without the approval of the CFA.
- I. The latest independent audits shall be submitted for review and study by the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Camp Tanako, Aldersgate, Inc., The United Methodist Children's Home, The Arkansas Methodist, The Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, Mt. Sequoyah, The Christian Civic Foundation, and the four Wesley Foundations within the Little Rock Conference.
- J. We recommend that a "Pastor's Moving Expense Fund" be established and that \$12,500 be apportioned to the local churches in 1979 for this purpose. We further recommend that no "claims" be paid from this fund until after the Annual Conference of 1980.
  - That the rate of reimbursable moving expense for Pastors' be set at \$100 plus 75¢ per mile from parsonage to parsonage except when a Pastor shall transfer to or from another Conference, the rate will apply from parsonage to the Little Rock Annual Conference boundary.
  - 2. The following persons shall be eligible:
    - a. Pastors
    - b. Lay Pastors
    - c. Student pastors after first appointment
    - d. District Superintendents
    - e. Persons in Conference Connectional positions
    - f. Retiring Pastors
    - g. Persons taking disability leave
    - h. Other persons recommended by the Board of Ministry
- K. We recommend that Wesley Foundation in Arkadelphia be granted permission to raise \$8,000 from private sources within the bounds of the Hope and

Arkadelphia Districts under the supervision of the two District Superintendents and that such funds be used for needed repairs to the Foundation Building.

- L. We recommend that \$1,500 be set aside in 1978, 1979, and 1980 from Conference Benevolences Unrestricted Funds to help defray the expense of the Jurisdictional Conference meeting in Little Rock in 1980.
- M. We recommend that the Little Rock Conference accept the responsibility for financing the publication of Dr. W. D. Lester's book, The History of the Little Rock Southwest Conference, up to an amount of \$4,000, and request that the North Arkansas Conference provide an equal amount. Proceeds from the sale of the books shall be remitted to the Director of Stewardship and Finance.
- N. We recommend that local churches be apportioned an additional \$20,000 for Special Church Extension for a two year period, 1979-1980 and that all these monies be placed in a "Stabilization Fund", and that no funds or interest accruing to this account may be used until the end of this two year period.
- O. That the local churches be apportioned \$8,000 for Regular Church Extension.

#### **Insurance Committee**

## **Hospitalization And Medical Expense Program**

The Little Rock Conference has the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program provided by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church. The Travelers Insurance Company is the underwriter for this insurance.

#### Eligibility

Complete eligibility requirements may be found in the 1975 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

Ministers transferring into the Conference may enroll in HMEP within 90 days of transfer without having to fill out a "Statement of Physical Condition" form. A new lay employee of a participating church or organization may enroll within 90 days of employment without having to submit a "Statement of Physical Condition" form.

Enrollment applications and cards are available from the Insurance Committee Secretary at the Area Office of Stewardship and Finance.

#### **Benefits Paid Under HMEP**

For changes in benefits paid for those under age 65, please consult the resolutions at the end of the Insurance Committee report. (Effective July 1, 1978)

Benefits for those 65 and over are a complement to Medicare and are as follows:

In-Patient Hospital Services: Full payment of each \$144 Part A Medicare deductible; full payment of \$36 per day from 61st day through 90th day; full payment of semi-private and

miscellaneous charges from 91st through 120th day beyond payment made from Medicare Lifetime Reserve days; then 80% of reasonable charges from 121st day up to a \$250,000 lifetime maximum.

Skilled-Nursing Facility: Full payment of \$18 per day from the 21st through the 100th day.

Physicians, Surgeons and Other Medical Services (Including Out-Patient Hospital Diagnostic Services): 20% of reasonable charges after a \$60 calendar year Medicare Part B deductible. You must pay the \$60 Part B deductible.

Prescription Drugs (Self Administered); Full-Time (RN or LPN Private Duty Nursing): 80% of reasonable charges after calendar year deductible of \$50, up to a \$250,000 lifetime maximum.

## Important Information Concerning Medicare Enrollment

Any minister who will reach his 65th birthday when he is still serving in a full-time capacity, and not drawing Social Security, should apply three months before his 65th birthday at his local Social Security office for Medicare. This applies to ministers who are eligible and wish to participate in Medicare.

Any minister who has passed his 65th birthday, and has not applied for Medicare, but wishes to do so, should contact his Social Security office immediately.

Should a minister's wife reach age 65 before the minister, she should apply for Medicare at the local Social Security office.

It is the minister's responsibility to secure his own Medicare coverage.

For those age 65 and older, HMEP provides supplemental hospitalization and medical expense coverage only.

## **Payment Of Premiums**

- I. Each local church, or charge, will provide 60% of the premium cost for either individual or family coverage, whichever is applicable, for those under regular appointment, and for eligible local church lay employees.
- II. The Conference Board or Agency responsible for its own budget will provide 60% of the premium cost for either individual or family coverage, whichever is applicable, for ministers under special appointment with annuity credit on the Conference.

III. The Conference Board of Pensions will provide 60% of the premium cost of the HMEP for each Conference Claimant.

Note: Retired ministers serving appointments, or employed by a church, should refer to the Board of Pensions Recommendations for information concerning payment of their HMEP premiums.

All persons holding an appointment from the Bishop are required to participate in the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program.

If a minister has not paid his HMEP premium by the beginning of the quarter following the quarter for which the premium was due, the minister will be removed from the HMEP enrollment. Any hardship case should be communicated by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Insurance Committee for review and action by the Insurance Committee. Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Insurance Committee.

#### Death Benefit Program

The Little Rock Conference has Plan D of the Death Benefit Program provided by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church.

#### Eligibility

Complete eligibility requirements may be found in the 1975 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

#### **Enrollment Periods**

An open enrollment period shall be held each year during the month of December for all persons currently eligible. The effective enrollment date shall be January 1, of the succeding year.

A limited enrollment period shall be held each year for 90 days following the session of each Annual Conference. Enrollment at this time shall be limited to those persons for whom appointment or change of Conference relationship on or after January 1, has provided new eligibility status in the plan.

Individual enrollment may be requested at any time within 90 days of becoming newly eligible, with the effective date of eligibility as the effective date of coverage.

Enrollment application cards are available from the Insurance Committee Secretary at the Area Office of Stewardship and Finance.

#### Premium

The DBP premium is 1.82% of the average salary of the Conference, which as of January 1, 1978, is \$10,637. The premium for 1978 is \$193.59, minus a \$25 refund, or \$168.59. The church pays 60%, or \$101.15, and the pastor pays 40%, or \$67.44. As long as we do not have heavy claims, we anticipate such a refund yearly, to be distributed as determined by the Insurance Committee.

The 1978 premium was due at the Area Treasurer's Office December 1, 1977, since premiums for the whole Conference were due at the General Board of Pensions in January, 1978, to avoid a late payment interest charge. This schedule will be in effect again this year.

Retired ministers should refer to the Recommendations of the Board of Pensions for information concerning payment of their DBP premium.

Resolution For Annual Conference Adoption To Provide For Mandatory Participation In The DBP Program, And Alter Certain Coverages In The HMEP Program

#### Whereas,

In 1972, the Little Rock Annual Conference resolved that all eligible persons holding an appointment from the Bishop be required to participate in HMEP, and, the General Board of Pensions has made available certain coverages and provisions for the HMEP program, and

#### Whereas,

It is the considered judgement of the Insurance Committee of the Little Rock Annual Conference that mandatory participation in the Death Benefit Program, and three changes in the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program will best serve the total needs of all participants in both plans

## Be It Resolved:

1. That all eligible persons holding an appointment from the Bishop be required to participate in the Death Benefit Program, with enrollment to take place in the next open enrollment period of December, 1978, for all those not presently enrolled.

2. That a \$50 deductible be imposed on hospital expenses in the Hospitalization and

Medical Expense Program plan.

3. That a stop-loss feature to the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program plan be added. This would provide that after \$500 in out-of-pocket medical expenses have been paid for one family member, or a maximum of \$1,500 for a family, the insurance would pay 100% of all remaining covered medical expenses.

4. That the amount to be paid for out-of-hospital visits for a nervous or mental disorder be increased from 80% of \$20 per visit, 50 visits per year, to 80% of \$50 per visit, 50 visits per

year.

## Little Rock Annual Conference Resolution **Death Benefit Program**

Whereas the Little Rock Annual Conference is participating in the Death Benefit Program as administered by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church, and

Whereas, the rules and regulations of the Death Benefit Program now provide for the enrollment of surviving spouses by a participating Annual Conference, and

Whereas, the Little Rock Conference Board of Pensions voted to extend Death Benefit

Program coverage to the eligible surviving spouses of the conference,

Therefore, be it resolved that each eligible surviving spouse of the Little Rock Annual Conference be enrolled in the Death Benefit Program in accordance with the following provisions:

1) The surving spouse of each deceased conference member and each local pastor shall be enrolled provided such spouse is receiving a surviving spouse benefit on account of service in the Little Rock Annual Conference.

2) The level of participation shall be Plan B for Little Rock in accordance with the Death

Benefit Program rules and regulations.

3) The effective date of coverage for each eligible surviving spouse shall be January 1, 1979.

4) The rules and regulations of the Death Benefit Program shall pertain in all questions concerning eligibility, benefits, enrollments and contributions.

# **Board Of Ordained Ministry**

#### Report No. 1

# **Policy and Program**

- The Little Rock Conference Board of Ordained Ministry proposes to work strictly within the framework of the current Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church.
- II. The elected officers of the Board are: chairperson, vice-chairperson, secretary, registrar, and associate registrar. The chairman shall be the treasurer.
- III. The executive committee of the Board are elected officers, Chairperson of the Continuing Education Committee, and the Chairperson of the Conference Relations Committee.
- IV. The Board shall meet prior to the opening of school, at midyear, and Annual Conference, and on the call of the chairperson.
- V. The Board shall have representatives on each District Committee of the Ordained Ministry (Par, 731.1e). In consultation with the district superintendents, the chairperson shall appoint a member of the Board to serve on each committee.
- VI. The Board's sources of income shall be:
  - A. A percentage of conference benevolences.
  - B. 1/4 (25%) of the amount collected from local churches designated for Ministerial Education.
  - C. Gifts, bequests, interests, and repayments of loans.

- VII. The Board shall maintain a scholarship aid fund for ministerial training as follows:
  - A. For those in the course of study above the local pastor's license.
    - 1. Assistance in courses of study schools.
      - a. The cost of required textbooks for each year of the course of study.
      - b. The cost of tuition or registration fees, and of room and board while attending the course of study schools. Because of limited funds transportation cannot be paid.
    - 2. Assistance in the correspondence course.
      - a. Payment of fees.
      - b. The cost of required textbooks for each course; the enrollees are to purchase the required books and then be reimbursed by the registrar.
  - B. For students from the Little Rock Annual Conference preparing for the effective ministry in the United Methodist Church who:
    - 1. Have satisfactorily completed at least enough semester hours of college credit to qualify for classification as a junior.
    - 2. Are enrolled in a college, university, or seminary approved by the University Senate of the United Methodist Church.
    - 3. Hold a current certificate of candidacy for the ministry in the United Methodist Church, be enrolled in a seminary, or be a Probationary Member of the Little Rock Conference.
    - 4. By August 1 make application to the registrar of the Board for the fall semester giving all information requested and authorizing regular grade reports to this Board's registrar from the school's registrar, including a transcript of credits at the end of the year. By January 15 make application for second semester. Application must be requested.
  - C. The Board may set a maximum amount of scholarship aid per year per recipient, but assistance will be determined for each individual on the basis of requirements or needs.
    - Scholarship aid for summer sessions will be granted one-half of the maximum annual allowance.
    - The maximum scholarship aid for college students shall not exceed four years.
    - 3. Additional emergency scholarship aid will be granted at the Board's discretion to students in the following categories, requesting and making application, who:
      - a. Begin preparation for the ministry later in life with pressing financial responsibilities.
      - b. Have severe health circumstances.
      - c. Come from disadvantage economic backgrounds.
    - 4. The maximum amount of emergency scholarship aid per person per year is one-half of the amount of the school's tuition cost.

- VIII. The Board shall encourage participation in continuing education programs by ministers of the Little Rock Conference. Pastors are encouraged to participate in at least one continuing education experience annually (Par. 424). The following shall serve as policy guidelines:
  - A. Members of the Conference, participating in continuing education experiences approved by the Committee on Continuing Education, may receive up to \$150 to cover costs for tuition, board, and books. Persons are responsible for their own travel.
  - B. Persons seeking financial aid for continuing education shall secure an application form from the Chairperson of Continuing Education.
  - C. No person shall be given more than \$150 each calendar year for continuing education.
  - D. In hardship cases, ministers can apply to the continuing education committee for help to attend Pastor's School. Such help will only be granted after other avenues for aid have been exhausted.
  - E. No financial aid is available for Minister's Week.
- IX. The Board shall give assistance in a reasonable amount for physical examination for persons to be admitted as associate, probationary or full members.

# Requests and Recommendations

- I. As the first step to the ministry, candidates shall enroll for studies for certificate of candidacy for ministry with the Department of the Ministry, Division of the Ordained Ministry.
- II. We assume our Conference's share of financial responsibility for the Arkansas Pastor's School.
- III. The Annual Conference Council on Finance and Administration is requested to grant:
  - A. An appropriation of a percentage from conference benevolences, based on the Board's financial needs that are not met by other sources.
  - B. An apportionment to local churches for the Ministerial Education Fund.
- IV. We express our appreciation for the support given the Ministerial Education Fund by the churches of the Annual Conference. We urge every church to continue to give full cooperation and support of its share of the Ministerial Education Fund for the remainder of the calendar year and 1978.
- V. Ministers may be given a minimum of two weeks' vacation and a minimum of one week annually to participate in a continuing education enterprise (Par. 424).
- VI. The Board recommends the establishment of a Course of Basic United Methodist Policy, History, and Tradition that would be a prerequisite for any person receiving a local pastor's license and for persons entering ministry in the United Methodist Church from other denominations.

VII. For this summer the Board has planned an orientation study retreat for Seminary graduates, persons receiving a local pastor's license and persons entering the ministry in the United Methodist Church from other denominations.

#### **Board Of Pensions**

#### Report No. 1

- 1. We recommend that the Annuity rate be set at \$75.00 per service year beginning January 1, 1979 for both retired members of the Conference and Special Conference Claimants.
- 2. We recommend that the apportionments to the charges of the Annual Conference be an amount of \$349,800, and that after the cost of current distribution is paid, the remainder be paid into the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund.
- 3. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 1706 Section 12e of 1976 Discipline that the Sunday following Easter, April 22, 1979, be observed as Retired Minister's Day. Each pastor is urged to acquaint his or her congregation with the pension program of the Conference as part of the observance, and, if possible, to use a retired minister in the Worship Service.
- 4. We recommend that the pastor of each Local Church present the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, "Memorial Program for Retired Ministers Pension Fund," to the members of his or her congregation and urge their participation in the program. We further request that the Conference Statistician provide a column in the Conference Journal listing the number of Memorials made through the Local Church to the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas.
- 5. We recommend, in keeping with Par. 1706 Section 5 of the 1976 Discipline, the approval of the Annual Conference that Special Apportionments shall be listed in the Conference

Journal as follows: (1) With Annuity claim (a) upon the Annual Conference, or (b) upon a General Board, an Institution, or an Agency of the United Methodist Church; (2) Without Annuity claim upon this Annual Conference.

- 6. We recommend that the Board continue to apportion to each Agency and Institution served by a ministerial member under special appointment with annuity claims on the Conference, the sum of \$900.00 (12 X Annuity rate) per year in accord with the 1976 Discipline Par. 1706 Section 3.a(3); and that said apportionments be paid to the treasurer of the Little Rock Conference for the Board of Pensions not later than 15 days prior to the end of the fiscal year. These shall include: the office of the District Superintendent; the Executive Director and the Associate Directors of the Conference Council on Ministries; the Christian Civic Foundation, Methodist Children's Home and Mt. Sequoyah Assembly. The District Superintendent's amount to be paid from the District Superintendent's Fund. When a minister is appointed to a Wesley Foundation, and also is appointed to a church or churches, the Foundation will be required to pay \$360 annuity.
- 7. We recommend that the Board of Pensions pay the entire insurance premium for our retirees both for the Death Benefit Program and the Hospital and Medical Expense Program. Also, we recommend adoption of Insurance Plan "B" which would include a death benefit for Widows of ministers in an amount equal to 10% of the average Conference salary. In addition, we recommend that the eligible Conference Claimants and Special Conference have the voluntary portion of the Medicare paid by the Conference Board of Pensions.
- 8. We recommend that an annual amount of \$2,400.00 from the pensions of each retired minister of the Little Rock Conference be designated as housing allowance.
- 9. We request of the Council on Finance and Administration an amount of \$285,000 to be apportioned to the Local Churches for 1979, the Sixth year of the Eight year MRPF campaign.
- 10. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 734 Section 4 of the 1976 Discipline that there shall be organized from the membership of the Board of Pensions of the Little Rock Conference a committee to compare the records of the amount paid by each pastoral Charge for support of pastors and for pension benefit purposes, computing the proportional distribution thereof and keeping a permanent record of defaults of the ministers in the Conference who have failed to observe the provision in Par. 1260 Section 6 pertaining to proportional payment; and shall render annually to each minister and Charge in default a statement of the amounts in default for that and preceding years.

In event of default by any Pastoral Charge after the notification by the Committee, liens shall be filed against future pensions and the names of the churches and ministers along with the amount in default shall be printed in the Conference Journal.

- 11. We request the Secretary of the Annual Conference to print in the Ministers' Service Record in the Journal, one column stating "Years of Pension Claim on the Little Rock Conference," and another stating "Total Service Years in the Ministry."
- 12. Since the Little Rock Conference has established a Minimum Salary considered to meet the needs of a full-time pastor, we recommend that (1) A minister who received the minimum salary or more must derive his or her sole compensation from the Charge and/or Conference sources in order to be eligible for pension benefits as a full-time minister. (2) If a minister receives less than the Conference minimum salary from church sources, but earns more than 40% of his or her total compensation from outside employment, he or she is not eligible for pension credit. (3) Student Supply time is to be considered as employment aiding the student preparing for full-time service as is required to meet minimal standards

as a Conference Member or certified Associate Member, for actually serving full-time pastorates. The student is not eligible for pension benefits.

13. By vote of the Annual Conference we entered into the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund program as of January 1, 1974. We are now a full partner in this program. We want to again express our appreciation to all Local Churches of the Little Rock Conference for participation in the additional budget askings for an eight-year period.

We want to emphasize the importance of our Special Gifts Campaign until we reach our Million Dollar Goal to supplement the funds mentioned above. As of March 1, 1978, our pledges and cash contributions have reached the \$834,000 figure. Inflation has steadily eaten away at the buying power of pension benefits for our retirees. This makes it even more urgent that we continue to raise their benefits through raising the annuity rate. A continued emphasis on Special Gifts is very important to our program in order that we might better meet the needs of our retirees.

We are grateful for the generosity of our people in making it possible for us to meet our obligation to the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund in full for 1974-75-76-77. We must continue this good work for the eight-year period.

#### **Review And Evaluation Committee**

Currently the function of the Review and Evaluation Committee, as listed in the 1974 Journal, pages 194-195 is:

- "1) Annually, review and evaluate the work of the Conference Council on Ministries, the boards, agencies, etc.
- 2) Review the job analysis of our conference employed staff and make recommendations for changes.
- 3) Recommend revisions of the Annual Conference structure so as to align the structure with changes in the Discipline of the church or to facilitate the program of the Annual Conference."

#### Recommended Change of Responsibilities:

With the implementation of the changing Conference structure, certain functions previously performed by the Review and Evaluation Committee are now the responsibility of other Conference Council on Ministry Committees.

Therefore, we recommend the function of the Review and Evaluation Committee be changed to read:

Function: To give direction to the Planning and Research Committee and to the Personnel Committee of the Conference Council on Ministries when called upon by either of them, or by the Conference Council on Ministries, by the Annual Conference or in the absence of the action of any agency in the Conference in:

- 1) Annually, reviewing & evaluating work of the Conference Council on Ministries, the boards, agencies, etc.
- Reviewing the job analysis of our conference employed staff and making recommendations for changes.
- 3) Reviewing the Annual Conference structure so as to align the structure with changes in the Discipline of the church or to facilitate the program of the Annual Conference.

(This part of the report must lie on the Conference table 24 hours before it can receive Conference action.)

#### Other Recommendations:

I. Conference Council on Ministries Personnel Committee:

As directed by the Annual Conference last year, a Conference Council on Ministries Personnel Committee has been established. This committee has requested guidelines for its work. We recommend the following responsibilities for this committee.

1) Assist in co-ordinating staffs of both Conferences,

- 2) Function as an evaluating committee (such as a Pastor-Parish Relations Committee does in a local church) for the Conference staff,
- 3) Function as an evaluating committee for all appointive positions in the Conference staff where there is a vacancy,
- 4) Work with Conference staff in job descriptions and other related office procedures,
- 5) To review annually the compensation and fringe benefits of all lay employees of the Conference and to work with the North Arkansas Conference Council on Ministries in seeking a uniform policy for all lay employees of both Conferences.
- II. Conference Board of Ecumenical Concerns Merger into Conference Board of Global Ministries

In light of the change of the "Conference Council Board of Missions" to "Conference Board of Global Ministries," (See page 110, 111-D, 1977 Journal), the Conference Council Board of Ecumenical Concerns, in conjunction with the Conference Board of Global Ministries requested to become a Division of The Conference Council Board of Global Ministries. Procedures for accomplishing this merger have been completed under the guidance of the Conference Council on Ministries and the Committee on Review and Evaluation. We recommend that the Annual Conference approve this structural change.

# III. Board of Higher Education and Ministry

In order for our Conference to have a Board of Higher Education and Ministry (1976 Discipline 1603.3), for the remainder of this quadrennium we recommend that the chairpersons of the following Boards compose this committee in our Conference: Ordained Ministry, Diaconal Ministry, Campus Ministry and Higher Education, and that further study be given to this Board for the next quadrennium.

#### **Board of Trustees**

The matter concerning Fairview Methodist Church, near DeWitt, Pine Bluff District, was discussed. It was decided that Frank Wynne would check the matter out and report back to the Board.

The report received at our last board meeting reveals that three acres are in this piece of property. The church has not used the property since about 1918 and we do not have a clear title. Two attorneys advise us to recommend that the Conference give the Pine Bluff District Superintendent and the Pine Bluff District Board of Missions the authority to sell the land. Proceeds from the sale will go to the Pine Bluff District Board of Missions.

St. Paul Church, Hope District, and property of the former Southwest Conference, was considered. There are three acres of land; no building is involved. It was stated that a Mr. Whitman wants to buy the property. It was also noted that any proceeds from the sale of said property must go back to the former Southwest Conference Churches. The Board decided that Mr. Whitman is to have the first option to buy the land at the appriased value.

This recommendation is based on the provision that Mr. Whitman can prove he is an heir to the original donors of the property. Otherwise, the land is to be sold to the highest bidder.

Lonsdale Church, Arkadelphia District: two lots and an old building are involved. It has not been officially abandoned. A motion was made by Charles Ashcraft, seconded by Frank

Wynne that the property be disposed of by proper procedure.

Mt. Ida property and building near DeQueen, Hope District: the Board, in consideration of \$1.00, transferred the property to the Mt. Ida Cemetery Association. The Building was sold for \$100.00. This amount, on recommendation of the Cabinet, was transferred to the Hope District Treasurer and is to be used for District Missions and Church Extension. This matter was settled as stated.

The Mt. Carmel Church in Dallas County came up for discussion. Mr. Horace Mann requested that a reversionary clause be inserted in the deed to the property. The Board ruled that such a clause cannot be inserted and that the property, if ever abandoned, will be sold according to the Discipline and that the heirs of the grantor will be given preferential treatment in the sale.

Charles Ashcraft presented the matter of Thompson's Chapel, four miles north of Amity. It was agreed by the Board that the people of that church should encourage others to form a cemetery association and incorporate it so that the church can then deed the property to the association.

We recommend that if a non-profit cemetery association be formed and incorporated the land be deeded to the association.

A request was received relative to the Zion Church property, Camden District. No buildings are involved. We recommend that the two acres be sold for \$600.00 and that amount be applied to the cost of repairing the Atlanta Church, Camden District.

We recommend that the Fredonia Church property, Camden District, be deeded to a non-

profit cemetery association.

We further recommend that the Brewer's Chapel building and property, Pine Bluff District, be sold to the present owner of the surrounding property for \$500.00 within the next 60 days. In the event this option is not exercised within the specified time, the property would be offered on a sealed bid basis. We also recommend that the Pine Bluff District Superintendent and the Pine Bluff District Board of Church Buildings and Locations be authorized to sell the Brewer's Chapel building and land. Proceeds from the sale are to be used by the Pine Bluff District Board of Church Buildings and Locations.

# **United Methodist Women**

The year 1977 will be remembered by the Mission Team of the Little Rock Conference, United Methodist Women as a year of learning and growing as we have tried to carry out our theme for the year — "Ye Are My Witnesses."

Two or more conference officers have been in all district meetings and have felt enthusiasm and interest expressed by the women in all six districts. Our Annual Meeting at Lakeside United Methodist Church, Pine Bluff, reflected this enthusiasm and dedication.

We rejoice that a Commission on the Status and Role of Women was established at this Annual Conference a year ago. Mrs. Rubye Lee Jackson, a member of the Women's Division, chairs this committee which is composed of a cross section of women from over the conference and several men.

Several members of the executive committee have attended workshops and seminars on human rights and other concerns. One that was especially worthwhile was a Human Rights Seminar at the United Nations. Mrs. Allen Bonsall and Mrs. Nick Evans represented our conference where the focus was on issues to be emphasized in the 1979 mission studies issues of concern to our church as a whole — agriculture, hunger, employment, criminal justice, health care, the media and immigration. The concerns that are discussed at these special meetings are shared and studied by women in our conference. There is a reason United Methodist Women are known as the best informed women anywhere.

Our undirected pledge to missions for 1977 was \$105,000.00 which was exceeded by \$2,000.00. Supplementary gifts increased by \$5,000.00. Most of this increase was directed to hunger related programs of the World and National Divisions. A total of \$124,381.97 was sent to the Women's Division. Around \$1,000.00 was given to the Elizabeth Thornberg Workman Fund for Youth to help with the youth program in our conference. \$1,950.00 is our contribution to the Arkansas School of Christian Mission. \$1,500.00 is sent annually to Aldersgate through the Women's Division.

We have a task force and several committees working on long range goals and programs. In the late fall there will be a two day meeting for district officer training at Camp Tanaco. Plans are being made for a quarterly newsletter which will go to all local units. Mrs. Louise Pate and Mrs. Louis Fish are busy with this project. The Little Rock and North Arkansas Conferences of United Methodist Women will hold a Legislative Training Event in February. This is the first time the two conferences have had a joint workshop.

The Arkansas School of Christian Mission will be at Hendrix again with Mrs. James Nix as dean. The dates are July 21-23 for the weekend school and July 24-27 for the weekday school. The studies are The Book of Revelation, Contemporary China, and Covenant Living in Time of Change.

The highlight of our year was the National Assembly at Louisville, Kentucky just one month ago. Over 100 women from our conference went to Louisville by car, plane, camper and chartered buses. They went to assemble with 9,000 United Methodist Women from all 50 states and many foreign countries. The first session was called The Gathering and was a Service of Holy Communion. It opened with a processional composed of representatives of the National Division workers, representatives of World Division missionaries, international guests, ecumenical guests, officers of the Board of Global Ministries — the list goes on and on. It was an awe inspiring sight with many of the participants in native dress. Each conference had been asked to bring loaves of bread for the communion service and a love offering representing the membership of the women in each conference. These gifts were presented at the altar by the conference presidents and treasurers.

We were called to assemble with the promise of becoming "A New People For a New Age." We were asked to share our concerns, interests and hopes for the future by individual and group study of the 21st chapter of **Book of Revelation** — particularly the 5th verse which reads, "Behold I make all things new."

During the next three days we were reminded and challenged by the outstanding speakers that we do not lose heart even when faced with differences — and we do have our differences. We do not despair in the midst of perplexities. We believe, therefore we speak, and in our speaking we receive far more than we ever ask or think.

We were called to assemble that we might perceive the roads that lead to our becoming new people through Jesus Christ.

Procedure for ratification of the Charter For Racial Justice Policies was presented by the president of the Women's Division. In effect this means that it was referred to all of the organization at the same time. The target date of ratification is March 1, 1980. You will be hearing more about this charter in the near future.

The assembly ended with a communion service at which time the women prayed that they might find new insight and understanding and fuller commitment to the way of Jesus Christ.

At the close of this service each conference was presented with a communion goblet to be used within the conference.

Ours will be used for the first time at the Annual Meeting, October 14th at First United Methodist Church, Texarkana.

#### **Bishop Aubrey Gray Walton**

He was a cotton buyer.

God called him to preach.

Then God called him to be a Bishop in the Church.

When he answered the call to preach he resumed his education in Hendrix College from which he received the AB degree in 1928. He received the B.D. degree from the School of Religion of Duke University in 1931. In later years both of these institutions and Centenary College honored him with doctorates.

Neither poor transportation schedules nor heart attack could thwart his purposes.

On his way from Helena to Calico Rock, his first appointment out of seminary in 1931, there was no convenient train schedule. So, the railroad, on which he had shipped many bales of cotton, arranged to stop a "thru" passenger train at Calico Rock. He wired church officials at Calico Rock the day and hour of his



arrival. The whole town was at the station to see if the train would, or would not, stop. It gave the new preacher a priceless introduction to the community. Following a near fatal heart attack in 1948 he recovered to lead First Church in Little Rock to a growth in membership and attendance requiring two morning worship services and in a major building program that stands as one of the many monuments to his fruitful ministry.

From Calico Rock he was assigned to Eureka Springs in 1932; to Siloam Springs in 1933; to First Church in Searcy in 1935; to First Church in Texarkana in 1939. From 1944 until 1960, when he was elevated to the episcopacy at San Antonio, he served First Methodist Church in Little Rock.

He was a "conference man." From the local church to the Council of Bishops he served as a member, and often chairman, of many boards, commissions and committees. Rarely did he miss a meeting he was supposed to attend. During the 1957 Central High School integration fiasco at Little Rock his wise counsel and firm, but fair, leadership were major factors in Little Rock becoming a model for the nation in race relations.

His first, and only, episcopal assignment was the Louisiana Area which he served from 1960 to 1972. It was like being assigned to his home Area. The Arkansas and Louisiana Conferences had been one Episcopal Area for a number of years until 1960. Ministers of the Conferences had become close friends. They hailed him "Chief." In the pulpit he was a power. As an administrator he was a tower of strength. Space limits elaboration on his accomplishments as an episcopal leader but at the top of the list stands the merging of the two Annual Conferences in Louisiana across racial barriers.

Aubrey Gray Walton was born in Clarksdale, Mississippi, June 20, 1901; the son of Charles Barron and Carrie Mae (Eddins) Walton. On September 17, 1930, at First Methodist Church in Helena, Mildred Henry became his wife. Her gracious spirit, warm humor and sagacious counsel added vast dimensions to his distinguished ministerial career. She survives him with their two children, James Macon with the General Council on Finance and Administration in Evanston, Illinois, and Mildred (Mrs. Robert Ziegler) of Springdale, a housewife and mother of three sons.

On retirement the Waltons returned to Little Rock to make their home. It was there, on April 11, 1978, he made the transition from the terrestrial to the celestial. The memorial service was held in his beloved First United Methodist Church in Little Rock on April 12, 1978. Participating in the service were Bishop Paul V. Galloway, Bishop O. Eugene Slater, Bishop Kenneth W. Hicks, Bishop Paul W. Milhouse, Dr. Fletcher Nelson, a friend of many years, and Dr. Alvin C. Murray, pastor of the church. His body was carried to its resting place in Roselawn Cemetery by intimate lay friends of First Church.

#### Carl E. Beard

Reverend Carl E. Beard was born on July 27, 1924 in Clark County, Arkansas. He passed away at his home in Bryant, Arkansas on August 2, 1978.

He had pastored churches at Texarkana, Little Rock, Altheimer, Sardis, Bethel, and Welcome. He was also assistant chaplain at the Little Rock Veterans' Hospital.

Although he was only 53 at the time of his death, Carl was on a temporary disability leave from the regular pastorate. This was not because he was no longer interested in the church and its ministry, but was due to physical limitations. He still manifested an interest in the church and helped his local pastor, Reverend Guy Downing, in every way his health would allow him.

In fact, it was his intense concern and interest which in a sense, drove him to his early death. Carl had a

deep concern and love for people, for the church and what was happening to it, and to the world in which he lived. He felt a compulsion not only to witness to these situations, but to try and work change where he felt it was in God's Will. The intenseness to which he gave himself to these tasks finally just burned him out physically.

Even when his physical strength was gone, Carl still had a burning desire to continue to serve. The way in which he overextended himself and the frustration at not being able to continue, finally burned him out emotionally as well. When this happened, Carl had to take a disability leave which added even more to his frustration because he never ceased to care.

We may all wish he had more wisely conserved his strength, energies, and his health but we all loved him and respected him because he cared. We could not have asked him to have cared less. He is survived by his wife Jean, daughter Vicky, and son Eddy. May we continue to care for them even as he cared for others.

#### Welcome R. Burleson


Welcome Russell Burleson was born in Atlanta, Arkansas on August 24, 1916, the son of Charley and Annes McClendon Burleson. He attended the public school at Atlanta and Emerson. He was employed by International Paper Company at Camden and by American Oil Company, first as a roughneck and later as a machinist.

On December 24, 1938 he was married to Fondel Roberson of Atlanta Community. One child was born to this family, Charles Edward, who is manager of the Telephone Company office at Waldo.

Welcome died on October 11, 1977 at Magnolia, Arkansas and was buried in the Atlanta Cemetery, Atlanta, Arkansas on October 12. In addition to his wife and Charles Edward, he is survived by two grandchildren, one brother and two sisters.

Welcome was licensed to preach November 22, 1957

and was ordained Local Elder in the United Methodist Church in 1963. All of the years of his ministry were given wholeheartedly in service to what is known as the Magnolia Circuit.



For 19 years he was pastor of this six point charge. Prior to being licensed to preach he was for several years superintendent of the church school at Atlanta. The record shows that he did lay preaching in this church at Atlanta as early as April 6, 1947. During this period he assisted Rev. C. B. Harris in keeping the churches of this charge active. When Brother Harris died Welcome assumed the full responsibility which he nobly held until June of 1976 at which time it became necessary to take disability leave.

Welcome was a genuine Christian. Early in youth he was confirmed a member of the Methodist Church at Atlanta. His Christian faith has been an ever growing one. In serving the Magnolia Circuit for over nineteen years he has been a faithful, effective and dedicated pastor. He was deeply loved, respected and appreciated by his people. The Methodist Church could use more of his quality today. As was said in the poem "ABOU BEN ADHEM" so it can truthfully be said today "May his tribe increase" for he was of such quality as compose the Kingdom of Heaven.

#### **Leland Clegg**

For sixty years he preached the gospel of Jesus Christ.

He was born January 19, 1898 at Enterprise, Mississippi, the son of McDonald and Mary Mayfield Clegg. He was educated in Montrose, Mississippi, Methodist Seminary and Centenary College, Shreveport, Louisiana. For distinguished service to the church as a pastor, evangelist, administrator, organizer, missionary and builder, McMurry College at Abilene, Texas conferred upon him the degree of Doctor of Divinity.

At the age of 17 he was licensed to preach and at 19 admitted On Trial into the Louisiana Conference. In 1919 he was admitted into Full Connection and ordained Deacon. In 1922 he was ordained Elder in that Conference.

His ministerial appointments were: In Mississippi,
Harpersville Circuit. In Louisiana, South Mansfield, 1919; Associate, First Church Shreveport, 1920; and Logansport, 1921. In North Arkansas Conference, Mountain Home, 1923. In the Little Rock Conference, De Witt 1925; Grand Avenue, Hot Springs, 1929; Pulaski Heights, Little Rock, 1930; First Church, Magnolia, 1933; Pine Bluff District 1937; Camden District, 1938. In the East Oklahoma Conference, First Church, Muskogee, 1943. In the New Mexico Conference, Trinity, El Paso, Texas 1946. In the Oklahoma Conference, Oklahoma City District 1950; First Executive Secretary of newly organized Oklahoma Conference Council, 1956; Oklahoma City District (a second time), 1960.

He retired in 1964 and moved to his home in Magnolia, Arkansas. From there he served as pastor of nearby Emmerson until ill health compelled complete retirement on January 1, 1977.

Unusual attainments marked each appointment. To mention a few: While at De Witt he was in demand as an evangelist throughout the Conference. At Magnolia he led in the building of an educational unit which now bears his name. While Chairman of the Conference Board of Education of the Little Rock Conference enrollment, attendance and teacher training reached an all time high. In his two terms on the Oklahoma City District he led in the organization of 24 new congregations, one of which the District Board of Missions named in his honor and memory, Leland Clegg Memorial. He labored with love and effectiveness among his brothers of the Indian Mission Conference in Oklahoma.

He served with distinction on Boards, Commission and Committees at every level of Methodism. He was seven times elected a delegate to General and Jurisdictional



Conferences. With William B. Oden he co-authored "OKLAHOMA METHODIST IN THE TWENTIETH CENTURY." In this book he reveals, in his own inimitable way, he reveals a colorful picture of Oklahoma Methodism. The volume also displays his keen insights into, and his deep appreciation for, the abilities of his colleagues, an attribute that distinguished him as a leader of persons.

On June 30, 1918, he was united in Holy Matrimony to Lucille Triplett of Forrest, Mississippi. The ceremony was performed by the Reverend C. B. Galloway, later to become a bishop in the church. This writer was privileged to be a frequent and intimate visitor in their home and knows, as few persons could know, the support he received in his ministry from his wife and children. Oliver, their only son, is a distinguished attorney at law in Magnolia. Mary Elizabeth (Zibbie) now Mrs. Harlan Holmes, is the wife of an Arkansas Power and Light Company executive in Little Rock. Both accept leadership roles in their respective Methodist Churches. He is survived by his wife and their two children.

Memorial services were held June 17, 1977 in his beloved First Methodist Church in Magnolia. Those participating in the service were: Rev. Norris Steele, Pastor, Rev. James Robert Scott and Rev. Howard Williams, former pastors. Bishop Paul V. Galloway, Bishop W. McFerrin Stowe and Dr. Arthur Terry. Interment was in Magnolia City Cemetery.







The funeral was February 4, 1978, at First United Methodist Church with the Rev. Clinton M. Atchley officiating. Burial was at Oakland Cemetery.




#### **Baxter Elam Turner**

## X. Miscellaneous

The organization of the Little Rock Annual Conference is defined in the Statement of the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Conference as printed in the 1974 Journal.

The Standing Rules are subject to the Discipline of the United Methodist Church and the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

#### THE STANDING RULES

#### I. Conference Organization

- Number of Districts. There shall be six districts in the Little Rock Annual Conference.
- 2. District Conference. There may be a district conference held annually in each district, composed of those members provided for in the current Discipline, and one additional member from each pastoral charge, provided however, in charges of more than five hundred members there shall be one additional member for each five hundred members or fraction thereof.

#### 3. Nominations.

- (a) The Conference Nominating Committee shall be composed of the District Superintendent and one lay person from each district. The Bishop shall serve as chairman.
- (b) The Conference Nominating Committee shall nominate six members (three lay and three clergy) at large to achieve an equal balance of lay and clergy members, alternating by districts as follows:

Lay Clergy
Arkadelphia Little Rock
Camden Monticello
Hope Pine Bluff

- (c) The Conference Nominating Committee will nominate all members of the Annual Conference quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees and Conference Council on Ministry boards, committees and commissions except as otherwise provided. Each District Nominating Committee will complete its list of qualified nominations by December 31. All nominees shall be consulted regarding their nomination.

  All boards and agencies of the Conference shall be inclusive of ethnic minority.
  - All boards and agencies of the Conference shall be inclusive of ethnic minority representation.
- (d) Terms of office of the Nominating Committee shall be for four years beginning on January 1 following the session of the Annual Conference in the middle of the quadrennium.
- 4. Lay Members. Lay members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually and their names and addresses shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
- 5. Youth Membership. Each District Council of the United Methodist Youth shall elect annually two youth members of the Annual Conference, and their names shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.

#### 6. Board Service.

- (a) A membership on the same board, council, committee, or commission shall be limited to two consecutive quadrennia excepting ex-officio membership on the Conference Council on Ministries. Membership begins upon election.
- (b) There are two types of membership on Annual Conference boards, committees, commissions and councils: at large and ex-officio. A person may serve in only one at-large and/or one ex-officio capacity.
- (c) The membership of the Committee on Evaluation and Review and the

- Committee on Planning and Research shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) above.
- (d) No person from the Little Rock Conference, clerical or lay, shall serve as an elected trustee of more than one United Methodist related institution within the bounds of the Arkansas Area at a time. "Within the bounds of" these United Methodist related institutions are understood to be the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Aldersgate, Methodist Children's Home, the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, the Wesley Foundations, Little Rock Conference Camp Tanako, and Mt. Sequoyah Assembly. This is to take effect during the year 1979, as each institution could possibly have its timetable of elections on a different schedule. Trustees presently serving are allowed to complete their present terms.
- (e) All Councils, Boards, Committees and Commissions of the Conference shall be made representative. Special consideration shall be given to placing women, youth, and minority persons on the membership of these conference agencies.

#### II. Financial Administration

- Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall run from January 1 to December 31.
- 2. Financial and Statistical.
  - (a) The District Superintendents shall furnish the treasurer with all apportionments to the churches on, or before January 15. These figures shall be official.
  - (b) All Conference assessments and reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars; with no column for cents.
  - (c) Each pastor shall make a statistical report to the District Superintendent who shall submit the reports to the Conference Statistician. The Pastor's financial report will be audited and checked by the Final Data Processing Print-Out. Where there is discrepancy, the amount recorded on the Print-Out will prevail.
- 3. Administrative Fund. The Council on Finance and Administration shall recommend an assessment for a Conference Administrative Fund. All clerical work of the Conference, the expense of publishing the pre-conference report, the expense of publishing the Journal and preserving the records of the Conference, the expense of preparing and printing the Worship Booklet for the Annual Conference, the expense of auditing the accounts of the several boards, the expenses of the Conference Secretary and Statistician, the expenses of committees raised by the Conference shall be paid from this Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of the Fund. Payments for unbudgeted claims on this fund shall be made on vouchers signed by the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration or the Conference Secretary.
- 4. Program Budgets. Budgets for expenditures for program for the District and the Conference shall be co-ordinated by the Conference Council on Ministries. The Conference Council on Ministries shall make recommendations to the Council on Finance and Administration which shall make a final recommendation to the Annual Conference.
- 5. Conference Treasurer. The Council on Finance and Administration shall set the salary and provide for the expenses of the Conference Treasurer and make arrangements for paying the same, subject to the action of the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference shall assign the duties, responsibilities, and the headquarters city, of the Conference Treasurer, on recommendation of the Council on Finance and Administration, in keeping with the provisions of the Discipline.
- 6. District Fund. The District Stewards shall estimate and allocate to the several charges an amount necessary for district parsonage and other necessary district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a treasurer who shall be custodian of

this fund and pay it out on order of the District Superintendent. The treasurer of the district fund shall report to the District Stewards annually, showing receipts and disbursements. Funds budgeted by the District Council on Ministries will be paid by the District Treasurer upon action of the District Council on Ministries and the approval of the District Superintendent.

7. Apportionments Based on Pastor's Salary. On all items apportioned to local churches by means of a percentage of the minister's salary, such percentage shall be understood to apply to all ministerial members of the local church staff serving under the appointment of the Bishop and District Superintendent, including ministers in full connection, ministers on trial, and full-time Lay Pastors.

#### III. Conference Procedure

- 1. Rules of Order. The Rules of Order shall be Roberts Rules of Order revised.
- 2. Reports and Resolutions. There shall be a pre-conference report which shall contain reports of all the boards and agencies of the Conference. This report shall be mailed to each member of the Little Rock Conference at least 30 days before the annual session. The Conference Secretary shall be the editor of this publication. All reports, resolutions, and other papers intended for publication in the pre-conference reports shall be typewritten, in triplicate, on special forms furnished by the Conference and obtained from the Conference Secretary. In the event editing of a report is deemed necessary by the Conference Secretary and Chairman of the Board involved, permission is hereby granted.
- 3. Conference Expense Fund.
  - (a) Registration fees and offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be administered by the Conference Treasure and shall be used to defray the expenses of the session.
  - (b) The Conference shall meet on a self-entertainment plan, except that the entertainment of the retired ministers shall be paid from the Conference Expense Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall pay a per diem for days actually in attendance directly to the retired ministers and be reimbursed from the Conference Expense Fund. Eligibility shall be determined by the Conference Board of Pensions.
  - (c) Any deficit in the Conference Expense Fund shall be made up from the Conference Administrative Fund.
  - (d) The Conference Expense Fund shall be administered by the Committee on the Annual Conference.
- 4. Unsponsored Resolutions. Any resolution not sponsored by a regular board or standing committee of the Conference must lie over for twenty-four hours before being debated and acted upon, provided, however, immediate debate and action may be ordered by two-thirds vote of the Conference present and voting.
- 5. Memoirs. There shall be published in the Journal a memoir of each deceased clerical member of the Conference, containing date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, charges served, and place of burial. A picture of the deceased shall be published with the memoir. The same shall be done for probationary members, associate members and lay pastors. Likewise, a memoir of wives or widows of the above shall be published in the Journal. The District Superintendents shall report to the Sub-committee on Memoirs the death of any of the above mentioned and be responsible for the submission of Memoirs not later than thirty days after the death occurs. The names or memoirs of deceased laymen who have been active in the Conference sessions, or served on Conference Boards or as officials of Conference institutions may be published in the Journal. The District Superintendent shall be responsible for securing the memoirs for laymen whose memoirs shall be published. It shall be the duty of the District Superintendents to report to the Chairman of the Conference Board of Pensions the death of any conference claimant that occurs in their respective districts.

#### 6. Historical Material.

- (a) The Library at Hendrix College shall be the depository for all historical documents and artifacts of the Little Rock Conference. The College Librarian shall be the custodian of these historical materials.
- (b) The Commission on Archives and History shall be responsible for securing a group picture of each class admitted into full connection for publication in the Journal and also two small pictures of each clerical member at the time of his retirement.
- 7. Unbudgeted Expenditures. When any proposal is submitted to the Annual Conference which involves the expenditure of funds not included in the established budget, such a proposal shall be referred for advice and recommendation to the Council on Finance and Administration and brought back to the same session of the Annual Conference for a vote to be taken by the Conference.
- 8. Campaigns. All Conference-wide campaigns to raise funds shall be voted on by secret ballot of the Conference.

#### IV. Amendments

These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.

#### Resolution

Whereas, the administrative costs of the Annual Conference are continually on the increase because of inflation, and concerned members of the Annual Conference urge greater fiscal responsibility, and greater efficiency in all areas of Conference Work,

Therefore be it resolved, that the Little Rock Conference establish a committee to study the office of the District Superintendent, the office of the Council on Ministries, the Arkansas Methodist, and the Wesley Foundations and to include all administrative structures and agencies of the Annual Conference (excluding Institutions) funded by this Conference as to ways of using the financial resources of the Conference in the most productive manner.

Be it also resolved, that the committee be appointed by the Bishop and be composed of two lay men, two lay women, two ministers serving churches, a district superintendent, and a youth, and that one man and one woman from ethnic minority groups be included among the members. The committee shall be authorized to call in resource persons as needed, and shall report its recommendations to the 1979 session of the Annual Conference.

Be it further resolved, that the Council on Finance and Administration be authorized to pay the expenses of the committee.

WHEREAS, The Diaconal Minister is a lay professional giving full time service to the

ministry and work of the church,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT: The Board of Diaconal Ministry of the Little Rock Conference makes the following requests concerning the Consecrated Diaconal Ministers of the Little Rock Conference:

- That the Conference Nominating Committee use the personnel of those who are consecrated Diaconal Ministers as a pool from which to draw such additional lay members as may be needed to provide to equalize lay and clergy membership in the Conference. See Amendment IX, Par. 36 and also Par. 307.1, 2 of the 1976 Discipline.
- 2. That local churches and church agencies employing Diaconal Ministers be asked to provide hospitalization and death benefit insurance through the General Board of Pensions on the same or similar basis as that provided for the ordained members of their staffs:
- 3. That the local churches and church agencies where Diaconal Ministers are employed be asked to provide a pension program through the Cumulative Pension and Benefit Fund of the General Board of Pensions.

# Minutes Joint Special Session of the Little Rock And North Arkansas Annual Conferences

## Staples Auditorium, Hendrix College Conway, Arkansas October 22, 1977

Informal Singing: An informal time of hymn singing was held prior to the worship service. Soloman Balenton was the song leader and Elise Shoemaker was the pianist.

Worship Service: Professor Robert M. McGill played the prelude after which the hymn, "All Creatures of Our God and King," was sung. Following the conference prayer which was prayed in unison, the Hendrix College Choir sang an anthem.

Bishop Kenneth W. Hicks then called on Roy B. Shilling, Jr., President of Hendrix College to present a welcome. Dr. Shilling welcomed the conference and made some remarks about Hendrix College and reaffirmed its close relation to the United Methodist Church in Arkansas.

Bishop Hicks then presented the sermon, "The Theological Perspective of the Missional Priorities." He read a passage from Philippians, and he said that the church was not interested in programs but in ministry. God's Church must be involved in the human predicament as its members cross the line of decision to share in tasks like the three missional priorities. He closed the worship service with a prayer.

Announcements: After the worship service, Dr. Shilling made some announcements for the comfort and convenience of the members of the conference.

Registration and Roll Call: James E. Major, Secretary of the Little Rock Conference, made an announcement concerning the Official Registration and Roll Call. It would be taken on cards furnished by the Pages. He also moved that the bar of the conference be the entire auditorium.

Instructions To The Conference: Bishop Hicks gave instructions regarding voting rights. He stated that the purpose of the Joint Session is to deal with the missional priorities as the task forces present them. He suggested that any additions be directed to the task force, not dealt with in this Session.

Ethnic Minority Local Church: Robert Felder, Chairperson of the North Arkansas Conference Ethnic Minority Local Church Task Force, presented the report of the Task Force. The report began with an audio-visual presentation of the condition of the black church in Arkansas Methodism. He then presented a written report and called attention to certain changes and spoke at length on it. Harold Flowers, Chairman of the Little Rock Conference Ethnic Minority Local Church Task Force led a panel consisting of William Robinson and Wendell Strong and himself which amplified the concerns of the report.

C. Ray Hozendorf moved that the conference receive the report and refer it to the proper boards and agencies of each annual conference for consideration and implementation. It was seconded.

Norman Carter and John T. Adkinson, Jr., asked questions for clarification. Norman Carter then moved an amendment to the motion that the report be received and referred to the proper committees and task forces in each annual conference for consideration only. It was seconded. This move to amend the motion was tabled so that the conference could adjourn for lunch.

#### Afternoon Session

Informal Singing: Soloman Balenton again led the conference in an informal period of hymn singing with Elise Shoemaker accompanying the music on the piano.

Business Resumed: Bishop Hicks called on Harold Flowers to report on a joint meeting of

the two conference task forces on the Ethnic Minority Local Church which was held at noon. Harold Flowers moved to amend the report under consideration by deleting Item No. 1 under the Prioritizing of Funds. It was seconded and passed.

Norman Carter withdrew his motion to amend the previous motion and C. Ray Hozendorf remade his motion to read "that the Conference receive the report as amended and refer it to the proper boards and agencies of each annual conference for consideration and

implementation." The amendment was accepted and the motion was adopted.

Evangelism: Fred Arnold, Chairman of the Little Rock Conference Task Force on Evangelism presented the report. It began with a movie entitled, "Go Tell." Fred Arnold then presented the first part of the written report, "Purposes and Goals." He was assisted by Don Eubanks. Buddy Arnold, Chairperson of the North Arkansas Conference Task Force on Evangelism, presented the second part of the report, "Conference Objectives and Local Church Objectives." He then offered to answer questions. It was moved and seconded that the report be adopted.

John Jump moved an amendment to delete Items D, G and K under Conference Objectives and Items B and C under Local Church Objectives. It was seconded. John Miles spoke in opposition to this motion. Don Riggin called for the previous question and the amendment failed. The entire report was then adopted.

Buddy Arnold called attention to the calendar of events.

Bishop Hicks spoke to the conference urging it to respond with growth in church membership as the population of the state grows. Increase in numbers, he said, was not a

proper motivation to growth but actually a measure of our evangelistic concern.

World Hunger: Donald Ebright, Chairperson of the North Arkansas Conference Task Force on World Hunger, presented the report. He was assisted by Loyd Perry who presented the Pastor's kit on World Hunger. Donald Ebright called attention to the Conscious Raising Event on World Hunger to be held at Hendrix College on November 12 and 13, 1977 and urged a good attendance. Clarence H. Mannasmith spoke to the report urging a good attendance and response to the Ingathering on November 18, 1978.

Donald Ebright called attention to the possible Interfaith Ingathering in 1979, and Loyd Perry spoke on the Arkansas Hunger Hike. Edward G. Matthews, Chairman of the Little Rock Conference Task Force on World Hunger, spoke on the Lent to Thanksgiving emphasis. Victor Nixon then spoke on the Missional Priority Fund and the Advance for World Hunger. He asked for \$1,500 from the North Arkansas Conference for the Conference's part of the rental of Barton Coliseum for the Ingathering Event in 1978. Joel Cooper announced that the North Arkansas Conference Council on Finance and Administration had approved this amount. It was moved and seconded that this amount be accepted. With only the North Arkansas Conference members voting, it was approved.

Don Riggin moved the adoption of the report. The motion was seconded and passed.
