CONFERENCE MINUTES

Monday Afternoon, May 26, 1980 — 1:30 p.m.

The one hundred and twenty-seventh session of the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church was convened at First United Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Arkansas, with an Opening Celebration — Commemoration and Communion — prepared by the Conference Council Board of Worship, William A. Eason, Chairman. The opening hymn was Charles Wesley's "And Are We Yet Alive?" The liturgist was Harold Flowers. The choir, composed of persons from churches throughout the Conference, offered the anthem, "The Strife Is O'er." James Argue offered the sermon, "The Importance of Remembering."

Gerald Fincher, Conference Secretary, called the names of those who had died during the year, and the bell was tolled for each of them, after which the Conference thanked God for them.

The Conference sang "For All the Saints," and then Bishop Hicks served as the celebrant of the Sacrament of Holy Communion. He was assisted by Roger Armstrong, Dorothy Claiborne, David Deere and Beverly Sawyer. Composition and presentation of slides relating to Holy Communion were given by Bubba Smith as the elements were received by the congregation.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order at 3:00 p.m. and called on the Secretary, who moved that the printed agenda be adopted with changes as time and circumstances may dictate. Passed. The Secretary announced the Roll Call was being taken at the Registration Desk.

Nominations: The Secretary nominated his Staff: John O. Alston, Journal Clerk; O. D. Peters, Secretarial Assistant. They were elected. Gerald Fincher nominated the following Tellers: Robert Trieschmann, David Deere, Bennie Ruth and Dale Diffie, who were elected. The Secretary moved that the Bar of the Conference be inside the pillars. Passed.

Welcome: Carlos Martin, host Assistant Pastor, offered regrets that George W. Martin, host Pastor, could not be present because of his recovering from heart surgery. Gene Harwood, host Lay Member, welcomed the Conference and read a letter from George Martin. James Major moved the Secretary respond to the letter. Passed.

Relations: John Ross gave the report of the Conference Relations Committee, stating that the District Superintendents have examined the pastors and have found them blameless in the life and moved the adoption of this report. Passed.

Ministry: William D. Elliott, Chairman of the Board of Ordained Ministry, moved the adoption of Report #1. John P. Miles moved the following amendment: Be it resolved that the Board of Ordained Ministry be asked to conduct a study concerning the relations between ministers. That recommendations be made to the Annual Conference on a Code of Ethics for these professional and personal relationships. Further, be it resolved, that at least two sessions with the ministers on a district level be conducted. One to begin the study, one to review the results of that study before a final report is submitted to the Annual Conference. Both passed.

Review and Evaluation: Dale Booth, Chairman, moved nine changes presented lay on the table overnight. Passed. Standing Rules changes were presented and moved by Alvin Murray, David Wilson, J. B. McIlroy, John P. Miles, Bill Cheyne and Carr Dee Racop, Jr. All proposed changes were received to be discussed tomorrow. Dr. Grant S. Shockley, Conference Preacher, was introduced by Bishop Hicks. Announcements were made by the Secretary. George Tanner presented information about the seven forum groups and their meeting places. They are 1) Pensions, 2) Budget Recommendations, 3) Program Recommendations, 4) Ordained ministries, 5) World Hunger, 6) Communications, 7) Enabling the Local Church. Adjournment concluded with the prayer offered by O. D. Peters.

Monday Evening, May 26, 1980 — 7:00 p.m.

A pre-service concert was presented by Les Carillons Handbell Choir of First United Methodist Church, Gurdon.

Worship Service: The evening service of worship included Bishop Hicks and students from different Wesley Foundations — Mary Ann Collins, UALR; Alvin Black UAM; Tommy Hazelwood, HSU; Bill Cole, SAU. Bill Kennedy led the congregational singing. The choir of Salem United Methodist Church, directed by Donna Elswick, accompanied at the organ by Susan Daniel. The Conference Preacher, Dr. Grant S. Shockley preached on Philipians 2. He spoke that Christ alone is worthy of our total commitment; no other name can bring salvation except Jesus Christ, who is Lord of the past, present and future.

Tuesday Morning, May 27, 1980 — 8:30 a.m.

Devotional: Tom Haley was the worship leader. Arthur Terry preached on John 14:15-18, emphasizing that Jesus, the Resurrected Christ, appeared to persons in very ordinary ways. From then until now the Christ appears to persons in ordinary ways and remains with us always.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the Conference to order. The State of the Church Address was given by John B. Hays, Dean of the Cabinet. This address was adopted by the Conference. Highlights of the 1980 General Conference were given by Don Riffin, Jay Lofton and J. Robert Scott. An audio-visual report was presented by Fred Haustein. John P. Miles moved that the delegates be commended for their leadership. Passed.

Gladwin Connell asked for and was granted a personal privilege. He presented and moved the adoption of a resolution from the Joint Committee on Episcopacy of the North Arkansas and Little Rock Conferences commending the invaluable guidance and assistance of Bishop Hicks for the past four years and requested that the South Central Jurisdiction Committee on Episcopacy re-assign Bishop Hicks to the Arkansas Area for another quadrennium. John B. Hays asked for and was granted the chair and the resolution passed unanimously. Bishop Hicks accepted back the chair and responded with appreciation.

The 1980 Ingathering will be November 22. John T. Adkinson, Jr. moved that the Conference urge our Congress members to support the Older American Act of 1972. Passed.

Courtesies: Robert Trieschmann presented Bishop Paul Galloway to the Conference, which applauded his greeting to the Conference. The following visitors were also acknowledged: George Ivey, Edgar Outlaw, Paul Bumpers, Fred Roebuck, Robert L. Moore,

Richard Poss, Earl Carter, Bill Wilder, Gerald Hammett, Robert Robertson, a group of students from SAU, and Eugene Moore of the General Board of Pensions. Shrum Burton brought greetings to the Conference from St. Paul School of Theology. Greetings from H. O. Bolin were given to the Conference.

Parish Development: Harold Davis called upon Vic Nixon to speak to Parish Development; he recognized the members of the Area Committee. Tom Abney spoke to the Policy of the Parish Development. Harold Davis moved the adoption of the report. Passed.

Courtesies: Employees in the Conference Council and Area offices were introduced to the Conference. Robert Trieschmann acknowledged guests — Jim Workman and Jim Beal. Greetings from James Richardson were given. Members to whom greetings are to be sent: Ed Galloway, Harold Sadler, and Trebie Shaw. Announcements were made of Mrs. Royal (Eva) Dodson being admitted to a local hospital, and of the serious illness of parents of Mrs. Hicks.

Order of the Day was set for Wednesday at 11:00 a.m. as a time of recognition of the clergy retirees.

Tuesday Afternoon, May 27, 1980 — 1:30 p.m.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order and called on Fred H. Arnold to lead the Conference in singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name."

Study Committee: Bill Keltner, Chairman, gave the report of the Committee and moved its adoption. Passed.

Chaplain's Report: Winslow Brown gave this report, which was received by the Conference.

Bishop Hicks read a telegram to the Conference from Negail Riley.

Ministry: William D. Elliott, Chairman of the Board of Ordained Ministry introduced Mike Clayton, Registrar of the Board, who reported to the Conference the Board's recommendation of V. Sanford Hankins and Royal S. Dodson for Associate Membership in the Annual Conference. They were elected.

The Registrar reported to the Conference the Board's recommendation of Stephen Walker Douglas, Mary Susan Butt, Michael C. Morey, William O. Reeves and Henry Wilkins, IV for Probationary Membership in the Annual Conference. They were elected. Upon recommendation of the Board the following were elected to Full Connection and Elder's Orders: Melvin Bitter, Thomas M. Haley, Carl D. Diffie, Michael C. Mitchell and George E. Rook. Conference Relations: John Ross gave the following report of Committee on Conference Relations: Leave of Absence, Robert W. Robertson; Discontinuance from Probationary Membership, James R. Adkins; Withdrawal by Surrender of the Ministerial Office, Howard Ritchie. Members in Full Connection retiring this year: Alfred DeBlack, David Hankins, George Meyer, Charles Richards, Elmo A. Thomason; Associate Member retiring this year: Jess Taylor. The report was moved and adopted.

Darrell Bone expressed appreciation for the support from the Board of Ordained Ministry in his completion of a Master's Degree in Evangelism.

Diaconal Ministry: Charles Walthall, Secretary, moved the adoption of the report, which included the recommendation of Donna Gearhart Elswick as a certified Associate of Music. Passed.

Pensions: Sidney Good, Chairman of the Board of Pensions, presented Tom Weir, Board Secretary, who gave and moved the adoption of Report No. 1, which carried. Sidney Good told of the availability of \$10.00 per service year bonus this year, which was approved. Charles Richards expressed deep appreciation to Sidney Good for his competent and dedicated leadership in the Pension Program. The Conference responded with a standing

vote of appreciation.

Jim Argue moved that the report include appointing a task force to study the disability provisions of the Conference and report to the 1981 Conference. Passed.

Dr. Eugene Moore, Associate General Secretary of the Board of Pensions, spoke to the Conference, commending the Conference for fully funding past liability.

Disability: John Lindsay gave and moved the report of the Joint Committee on Disability recommending that Horace Grogan be continued on Disability and James F. Richardson and Don R. Williams be placed on Disability. Passed.

Horace M. Grogan asked that the first four years of his service as pastor while a student be accepted as a full-time accepted supply. Don Riffin moved this matter be referred to the Board of Pensions for consideration and report back to the Conference tomorrow. Passed.

Equitable Salaries: Gene Harwood, Chairman, gave the Commission's report. John Hays moved that the study of standardizing salaries be continued. Passed. The full report was then adopted.

Review and Evaluation: Dale Booth, Chairman, presented the Review and Evaluation report. John P. Miles moved an amendment that the Review and Evaluation Committee evaluate whether ministers should provide their own furniture within the church-owned parsonage system and report their conclusions to the 1981 session of the Annual Conference. Passed.

Dale Booth moved to adopt the report with the change of Standing Rule 6, Board Service (c) to read: "The membership of the Committee on Review and Evaluation; Committee on Planning and Research; Committee on the Annual Conference; and the Episcopal Committee shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) of Review and Evaluation." Passed.

Alvin Murray moved to amend the Standing Rules to read: "Matters calling for expenditure of funds for the Annual Conference may not be presented for adoption on the last day of the regular meeting of the Annual Conference." Defeated.

John P. Miles moved the following amendment to Standing Rules: "Beginning with the 1984 Quadrennium no member of the Annual Conference shall be eligible for the chairmanship of a board, committee, commission or council of the Annual Conference who has served as chairman of a board, committee, commission or council for the preceding 8 years."

David B. Wilson offered the following substitute motion: "Under section II of the Conference's Standing Rules add the number '8' to read as follows: Requests for financial support by the Conference, when not presented to the Conference by the Council on Finance and Administration, shall lay on the table for twenty-four hours prior to a vote being taken. This rule may be suspended by a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote of the Conference. It does not preclude a Council on Finance and Administration recommendation being amended." Passed.

Carr Dee Racop, Jr., presented the following Standing Rule change: "III. Conference Procedure

2. Reports and Resolutions. CHANGE to "Pre-Conference Reports."

Necessary pre-conference reports shall be distributed to the Annual Conference members and other interested persons as early as practicable, but no later than the times of the briefing sessions of each District. These reports shall be prepared by the Board of Agency responsible and/or the Conference Council on Ministries. Expenses of preparation and distribution shall be cared for by the related agency." James Major moved that this motion be referred to the Committee on Review and Evaluation for study and they report back to the 1981 Conference. Passed.

J. B. McIlroy moved that a Committee on Rules shall be appointed for this and each succeeding Conference. Motion did not carry.

Nominations: David Prothro gave and moved the report of the Conference Committee on Nominations. James Porter asked about racial balance in the nominations. Jay Lofton gave a response of clarification. John P. Miles moved that the Nominating Committee continue its work to establish proper racial balance and the Conference will trust their judgment.

Passed. The full report was passed.

Courtesies: Robert Trieschmann acknowledged guests of the Conference.

Tuesday Evening, May 27, 1980 — 7:00 p.m.

A pre-service concert was presented by Philander Smith College Choir.

Worship Service: Bishop Hicks and David Wilson led the service. Bill Kennedy led the congregational singing. The choir of First United Methodist Church, England, directed by Peggy Morton, offered the anthems, "A Round of Praise," and "The First Song of Isaiah." Dr. Grant S. Shockley, the Conference preacher, emphasized action of the Faith as given in the passages of Micah 6:8 and Matthew 28:19.

Wednesday Morning, May 28, 1980 — 8:30 a.m.

Devotional: Dale Diffie was the worship leader and George Meyer preached about "I Was Made a Minister," from Ephesians 3:7.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order. John Lindsay and George Tanner presented the Conference Council on Ministries report. Each District Chairperson gave a report of their plans for 1980-81. The report was presented, discussed and adopted with these additions: Ralph Hale moved that the Council provide printed support for the local church for help in establishing a ministry to singles, passed; Claude Jenkins requested that an examination and evaluation of youth ministry be done by the Council and a report be made back to the 1981 Conference. Bishop Hicks asked that this request be reflected in the minutes.

Communications: Keenan Williams of the Task Force on Communications presented the report to which Jerry Canada, Editor of The Arkansas Methodist, spoke. Biff Averitt moved that the Conference recognize the 14 years of service of Mrs. Doris Woolard. Charlotte Pickens spoke on the Resource Center and Fred H. Haustein on the Production Center. Sam Albright, Manager of the Little Rock Cokesbury store presented a check in the amount of \$6,831.01 from the United Methodist Publishing House profits to Bishop Hicks for the Ministers' Retirement Fund. He then presented Ernest Chandler, Manager of the Southwest Region of Cokesbury. By consensus, the Communications report was to be continued after lunch. A call for the Order of the Day was made.

Courtesies: Robert Trieschmann presented Mrs. Elaine Hicks and Mrs. Grant Shockley to the Conference. Mrs. Hicks called for the District Superintendents' wives to come forward. She and Bishop Hicks presented a gift to Mrs. Charles Richards and Charles, respectively, as they leave the Cabinet for retirement. All ministers' wives were asked to stand to be recognized. Mrs. Hicks announced that a gift had been made to the Methodist Foundation in honor of the Cabinet. Bishop Hicks gave recognition of Harold Davis as a former member of the Cabinet this year.

Retirees: The retiring pastors addressed the Conference.

Elmo Thomason expressed appreciation for his 46 years of service, concluding with mixed feelings in the change of responsibilities. He offered a hope of happiness and joy for all.

George Meyer offered his gratitude to the Conference for all his time working with persons through the years. His morning devotional message had expressed much of his feelings.

Charles Richards told of his 37½ years having been wonderful and joyful. He stated appreciation of the Methodist Church and Methodist people. His word to persons planning to be ministers and those early in the ministry — set goals and work toward them in response to God's call.

Jess Taylor expressed thanks to God for calling him to the ministry and for all who had worked with him at Perkins School of Theology and throughout the church where he had served.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

David Hankins offered his thanks for God's blessings, especially for the more than 30 years of his service as a minister.

John B. Hays spoke in behalf of Alf DeBlack, who sent his greetings, but could not be present as he was recovering from a heart attack.

Certificates of appreciation were given to each retiree by the Conference Secretary.

Courtesies: Robert Trieschmann introduced Mrs. Mildred Walton to the Conference. She offered the Conference this adage: "As you slide down the bannister of life, may all the splinters be pointed in the right direction."

Mt. Sequoyah: Lee Cate, Superintendent of Western Methodist Assembly, spoke of the program and promotion of Mt. Sequoyah. He mentioned that a new formula for asking for support of Mt. Sequoyah is coming up.

Methodist Children's Home: Joe R. Phillips, Jr., Administrator of the Methodist Children's Home, offered thanks to the Bishop, District Superintendents, and Pastors for helping make possible the 16.8% increase in the Home's Christmas offering. He emphasized the opening of a counseling center, available to those who have a need to use it, and encouraged persons to visit the Home.

Archives and History: Ralph Hale, Chairman of the Commission on Archives and History, moved the adoption of the report. Passed.

Bishop Hicks announced at 12:05 the Conference was in recess until 2:00 p.m. and called on Arthur Terry to offer the prayer.

Wednesday Afternoon, May 28, 1980 — 2:00 p.m.

Business Session: Bishop Hicks called the session to order and asked Fred H. Arnold to lead in the singing of hymn number 294, "I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord." Carlos Martin presented George and Ruby Lassiter, co-chairpersons of First United Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Annual Conference Committee. The Conference gave an applause of appreciation to them.

Hendrix College: Roy Shilling, President of Hendrix College, spoke to the Conference.

Communications: Keenan Williams moved the Arkansas United Methodist Communications report be adopted as presented in the morning session. John P. Miles moved that the financing of the Communication Program be finalized with the CFA report later. Passed. Clarification was made that the program content of Communications was the motion before the house. The report passed.

John Lindsay moved the adoption of the Council on Ministries Budget as presented.

Jerry Cookus made the substitute motion that the Council on Ministries Budget be a working document as a guideline (working model) dependent upon the final action of the CFA report. Passed.

Board of Global Ministries: Ed Matthews moved that \$8,000.00 be made available from Restricted Special Church Extension Funds for release in 1980 to assist in the purchase of a mobile parsonage for the Daisy-Langley Charge. Passed. Ed Matthews moved that Hunter United Methodist Church, Little Rock, be granted eligibility for Special Church Extension Funds for an additional three years (1981-84). Passed.

Ed Matthews moved that (for policy for Church Extension) "the Commission on Religion and Race" be substituted for the "Ethnic Minority Local Church Task Force" and that "The Committee on Parish and Community Development" be substituted for "the Task Force on Parish Development" wherever needed. Passed.

John Lindsay moved that all matters which do not relate to funding of Communications be approved. Passed.

Personal Privilege: Gladwin Connell moved that the CFA report be received by the Conference at 9:00 a.m. Thursday as Order of the Day. Passed.

Women: Helen Blakely, President of the Conference United Methodist Women, reported to the Conference.

Perkins School of Theology: Craig Emerick spoke to the Conference naming the three

churches of this Conference with Interns last year — DeWitt, Lakeside and Pulaski Heights.

Philander Smith College: Grant Shockley, President of Philander Smith, spoke to the Conference and presented a certificate of appreciation from Philander Smith to Bishop Hicks.

Arkansas Methodist Foundation: Bryan Brawner spoke to the Conference encouraging workshops in helping persons to make wills and reported that the Foundation had \$119,049.00 in assets.

Camp Tanako: Don Riffin, Chairperson of the Tanako Board of Trustees, introduced Terry Everitt, Resident Agent, who reported to the Conference on Tanako.

Men: Dale Booth reported to the Conference for United Methodist Men. By unanimous consent, the Conference asked that the name of William M. Shepherd be listed in the Memoirs of the Journal.

Youth: "Buddy" Ratliff, Conference Coordinator, introduced the youth members of the Conference. Wayne Clark, Conference Youth President, gave the report of the youth. Roger Armstrong moved that all Annual Conference Boards and Committees which have youth members be encouraged to schedule at least one-half of their regular meetings on dates and hours which will permit youth members to attend. Passed.

Aldersgate: Mackey Yokem, Director of Aldersgate, offered thanks for the opportunity to speak to the Conference and have his report as a part of the Journal.

Civic Foundation: Ed Harris gave the Christian Civic Foundation report, to which Earl Hughes spoke in favor. The report was adopted. Bill Cheyne moved that we urge the North Arkansas Conference to reconsider funding the CCF. Passed.

John Wilcher moved that a committee be appointed today to study the proposed Constitution of Arkansas concerning the tax implications toward religious property and holdings and to report back tomorrow. The motion passed and was referred to the Conference Board of Trustees.

Insurance: Thomas P. Williams, Jr., Insurance Committee Chairperson, presented and spoke to the Insurance report and moved the adoption of the report, including the resolution to cover nursery charges for newborn infants. Passed. A tribute of thanks was offered to Tom Abney and Ernestine Martin for their work with the Committee.

The Conference agreed to extend the time of the session to complete further business.

Nominations: Don Riffin gave the Nominating Report for General and Jurisdictional Boards and Agencies. John B. Hays explained the procedure for nominations. Don Riffin moved the nominees be ratified. John P. Miles moved the nominations cease. Passed. The nominees were ratified and approved by the Conference.

Don Riffin moved that the Little Rock Annual Conference endorse George Wayne Martin as a Favorite Son Candidate for the Episcopacy in 1980. Unanimously passed.

Pensions: Tom Weir, Secretary of the Board of Pensions, reported that the Board had voted unanimously to deny Horace M. Grogan's request for service years. Roger Armstrong moved the report be approved. Passed.

Courtesies: Robert Trieschmann acknowledged guests to the Conference — Clint Burleson and Jim Keith.

The session was closed with prayer by Jim Fairweather.

Wednesday Evening, May 28 — 7:00 p.m.

The Service of Ordination

Bishop Hicks served as Worship Leader. Other ministers assisting were Mike Clayton, Registrar of the Board of Ordained Ministry; William D. Elliott, Chairperson of the Board; Conference Secretary, Gerald Fincher; and the District Superintendents. Marshals were Mike Campbell, Charles Murry, Beverly Sawyer, and Keenan Williams. Lynn Bauman was the choir director. The choir was from First United Methodist Church, Hot Springs. Laity reading the Scripture was J'Ingrid Clemons.

Dr. Grant S. Shockley preached "To Be Called," based on Ephesians 4:1-8. His message was a challenge of the '80's.

Thursday Morning, May 29 — 8:30 a.m.

Devotional: Varnell Norman was Worship Leader. The Scripture lesson was Psalms 113. Bishop Hicks spoke about our moving into the 21st century. His message was based on Hebrews 3:7 ff. He spoke of God as a god who acts, reminding us that the Bible is held together not by covers, but by the Good News of God's action. Christianity, he mentioned, is a secular religion and God is a secular god, making his revelation known through the secular. God, he further stated, is an interrupting god who lets us liberate ministry — not limit it.

Finance and Administration: Ray Hozendorf, President of the Council on Finance and Administration introduced Ann Onstott, Area Treasurer, who gave a brief report.

Ray Hozendorf announced the CFA action granting Camp Tanako permission to borrow money to put the Camp in good order before the camping season begins. Ray Hozendorf introduced the Council's report and moved the adoption of the Hendrix College "Fair Share" Four Year Endowment Methodist Students (Scholarships for Methodist Students in Arkansas).

Jerry Cookus moved that the program be amended to read: "The Hendrix Fair Share Four Year Endowment Campaign shall be a matching funds program. \$46,500.00 is requested from the Little Rock Conference for each of the four years, 1981-84. This asking is to be matched dollar-for-dollar by Hendrix College each year. The total endowment shall fund a scholarship program exclusively for Arkansas Methodist students who otherwise would not be able to attend our church-related college." After discussion, the motion was defeated.

Vote on the main motion was taken by secret ballot with 119, yes; 78, no.

Roy Bagley moved that the capital campaign of \$200,000.00 for former Highland Church Property be approved. Following discussion, vote by secret ballot was 164, yes; 36, no.

Ray Hozendorf moved that 30% of the Missional Priority apportionment to the local church for Ethnic Minority Local Church be retained for use in the Annual Conference. Passed.

Ray Hozendorf moved that the full CFA report be adopted as presented.

Kenneth Kinard moved to amend the report to read that the Communications Budget be \$71,289 instead of the \$64,500. By count vote the motion was defeated with 96 against and 88 for.

The main motion was passed.

Ray Hozendorf was given words of thanks and appreciation for his years of service on CFA from John P. Miles, Roy Bagley and Bishop Hicks.

John B. Hays moved "That the Trustees of the Little Rock Annual Conference be and are hereby authorized to enter into a loan agreement for the financing of the property owned by the Annual Conference at the most favorable terms and interest rates available.

"Further, that any two officers of the Board of Trustees shall be authorized to sign any mortgage and other legal documents necessary to complete the loan." Passed.

Statistician: Bill Haake, Statistician, gave the statistical report of the Conference for 1979, which was accepted.

1981 Conference Location: Gene Harwood extended, on behalf of the membership and officials of First United Methodist Church, Hot Springs, an invitation for the 1981 Conference to be hosted by them. The invitation was adopted.

Trustees: Everett Vinson, Chairperson of the Conference Board of Trustees, gave and moved their report, which passed.

Lydia Patterson: Noe Gonzales of Lydia Patterson Institute spoke to the Conference with thanks from the school.

Resolution: James Argue moved the following resolution, which passed: "In light of recent events in our state and communities which threaten the health of our public educational systems and consequently the cultural and economic health of these local communities, be it resolved that we of the Little Rock Annual Conference reaffirm the

United Methodist Social Principles in their support of 'free public elementary and secondary schools.' "

Privilege: Kelsey Caplinger was introduced by William D. Elliott as receiving Man of the Year Award from the Arkansas Democrat. The Conference recognized him with applause.

Arthur Terry moved that the Conference send greetings to Bishop and Mrs. William C. Martin and to Marshall Steel.

Trustees: Everett Vinson reported that the Conference Board of Trustees had examined the two Constitutions (present and proposed) of Arkansas and found no substantial change in them.

Resolutions: Charles Settle, Chairperson of the Committee on Resolutions, gave the committee's report, which was adopted.

Bishop Hicks acknowledged Carlos Martin and expressed appreciation for his work in relation to the Conference. The Conference gave a standing response.

Bishop Hicks offered appreciation for what the Conference had meant to him and Mrs. Hicks the past four years.

Harold Davis acknowledged the presence of James Richardson, Pastor Emeritus of Village United Methodist Church, Hot Springs Village. The Conference gave a standing response.

Appointments: Bishop Hicks, with the assistance of the District Superintendents, read the ministerial appointments.

John B. Hays moved that Wednesday, June 4, be moving day. Passed.

Charles Ashcraft moved that salaries for June will be paid by the church to which the ministers are appointed for the new year.

Closing: The one hundred and twenty-seventh session of the Little Rock Annual Conference adjourned with the singing of the hymn "A Charge to Keep."

Charles Richards offered the closing prayer.





RECOMMENDATIONS

For 1981 Funding

1. We recommend that the Arkansas Council of Churches apportionment be \$5,000.00.
2. We recommend that the Regular Church Extension apportionment be \$8,000.00.
3. We recommend that the Special Church Extension apportionment be \$40,000.00
4. We recommend that Christian Education Day apportionment be \$12,000.00.
5. We recommend a goal of \$3,000 for Golden Cross Sunday.
6. We recommend a Fair Share Goal for the Hendrix College Four Year Capital Fund Campaign of \$93,000 for each year of the Quadrennium.
7. We recommend that the Hendrix College apportionment be \$148,800 for each year of the Quadrennium.
8. We recommend a \$10,000.00 apportionment entitled "Prison Ministry" in Section IV: "Other Conference Ministries." This is to support an ecumenical Prison Ministry now being designed with United Methodist leadership.
9. We recommend that the CFA set up a "Restricted Housing Account" of \$5,000.00 each year for the Quadrennium to be administered by the Conference Council on Finance and Administration. The money is to be loaned to Conference Council on Ministries Staff for the purpose of a down-payment on a house. The loan is to accrue at no interest and is due at the time when the Director or Associate Directors receive a new appointment.
10. We recommend that the CFA Study Committee be asked to do a feasibility study concerning the economic factors involved in providing cars and expenses in comparison to the present expense allowance plan. The results of the study to be shared with the CCOM at the Evaluation Meeting on September 5, 1980.
11. We recommend that one line-item entitled "Arkansas United Methodist Communications" be carried beginning in 1981 and that funding for all communication elements be included therein as indicated in the CCOM recommendations and the Arkansas Methodist budget.
12. We recommend that a Sunday be designated as United Methodist Foundation Sunday, and that the specific day be the same Sunday in Little Rock and North Arkansas Conferences.
13. We request permission to call a one day session of the Little Rock Annual Conference to consider any changes necessary as a result of decisions made at General and Jurisdictional Conferences, if the Bishop, Cabinet, or Conference Council on Ministries deem it advisable. We recommend the session, if called, take place in late September or early October.

Conference Study Committee

During the 1978 Annual Conference this Committee was established to study administrative structures and agencies, excluding institutions, that are funded by the

This committee has met on a continuing basis since its establishment. At last year's conference we asked for written input from the conferees and in April of this year sent out a questionnaire to both Lay and Clergy asking their thoughts on specific issues.

I'm not going into the detailed results of the questionnaires, however, we have prepared a general summary that has been distributed to you. As indicated in the summary, we will be furnishing the results to the Review and Evaluation Committee for distribution to the appropriate Boards and Agencies.

This committee is also distributing to you the results of a study on the district structure in our conference. Again, I will not cover in detail but, briefly, you will see that the Little Rock conference has six districts with an average of 63.3 churches per district. We rank five out of seventeen in average number of churches. If we were to reduce the number of districts to five, the average number of churches would increase to 76, giving the Little Rock Conference the largest number of churches per district in the South Central Jurisdiction.

While the reduction of the number of districts would amount to a savings of approximately \$45,000 per year, a part of that savings would be lost in increased costs to the Annual Conference as five superintendents would have to increase their travel to minister to their increased responsibility. When the actual savings are spread over the churches, their reduction in apportioned funds would be out of proportion to the loss in service available to the churches. This would be particularly true of the smaller churches in each district which use the services of the districts more than the larger churches.

This leads the Study Committee to conclude that it would be unwise to consider a reduction in the number of districts at this time. When we are attempting to move closer to the local church in every policy decision and program development area, a reduction in districts would retard effective enablement of the local church for ministry and mission.

Conclusion: We therefore recommend that the districts remain at 6 in the Little Rock Annual Conference.

It appears that there will be no further need to maintain this committee on an active status and the members of the committee recommend that it be dissolved, with the acceptance of this report, with the understanding that the material developed will be given to the Review and Evaluation Committee for distribution.

Summary of Questionnaires

In order to receive suggestions from Pastors, Lay Members of the Annual Conference and Administrative Board Chairpersons, we prepared a questionnaire and mailed copies to each local church. Approximately 500 forms were mailed out; 62 were returned.

The results were tabulated and reported to the Committee. The specific suggestions related to each agency will be reported to those Boards and Agencies of the Annual Conference for further study and implementation.

On the 62 forms which were returned, there were over 300 suggestions made concerning our work as an Annual Conference. These suggestions centered on program concerns and indicated needs to strengthen areas such as Visitation Evangelism, the educational program of the Church, a need to emphasize stewardship, to enrich our Conference and District Youth programs.

There was also a call for more supervision by the District Superintendents of the local churches. There was some indication that we need a return to an appointment process

which would involve a recommitment to "sent" ministry by the cabinet, the pastors and the churches.

A question about the number of districts indicated that 33 felt six districts was the proper number; 19 felt we should have five or fewer; 4 felt the need for seven or more. 12 additional respondents felt that we should continue with six districts but that there was need to realign the districts.

The need for clarification of the roles of the Conference Council on Ministries and the Council on Finance and Administration was mentioned by 32 persons.

In the Ethnic Minority Local Church, the forms indicated the felt need for better training for both lay and clergy leadership. Those responding recognize the shortage of trained black clergy and the problems of recruiting because of the limited salary scale in the black churches. Open itinerancy is also a concern.

There is also an indication that the Conference begin to take seriously the need to examine programs to make sure they are still viable and meeting current needs. Those that have served well in the past may not be as useful now as they were and should perhaps be discontinued.

The Study Committee feels that its work is done and respectfully requests that the continuing responsibility of this committee be assigned to Review and Evaluation. Finding of this Study Committee shall be filed with Review and Evaluation for distribution to the new Boards and Agencies.

Study of the Districts of the Little Rock Annual Conference

The Study Committee was asked to examine the District Structure of the Conference, specifically the number of Districts.

We submit the following report and recommendation:

I Review of Past Studies

RE— 1949 Journal reflects a recommendation to reduce from 7 to 5 districts by 1951.

1950 Journal reflects a recommendation reduced to 6 districts, rescinding the action of 1949 reducing to 5 districts.

RE— 1973 Journal, page 55, Study Committee on District division of Conference and office and work of District Superintendent. Committee composed of George Ivey, Clint Burleson, Joe R. Phillips, Edwin B. Dodson, Thomas A. Abney, John Lindsay, Gene Harwood, Frank Thompson, J. C. Whisnant, Eugene Cobb, Taylor Prewitt, Sidney Good and Homer Winstead.

Three hearings were held at Little Rock, Camden and Pine Bluff. Strong opposition was voiced to reduction in all three hearings, particularly in the Monticello and Hope areas, these being the areas most affected by any reduction in districts.

In 1974, Journal reflected the report of the Committee on page 179. It recommended that the number of districts remain at 6, the same conclusion reached in 1950. On page 50 of the 1979 Journal, action is recorded which indicates that the resolution was passed, maintaining 6 districts.

While a net loss of eleven churches was recorded from 1974 to 1979, charges increased by 20 and regular appointments by 15, indicating an increased load in one or more of the two latter categories for each district.

Also, beginning in 1974 the program responsibilities of the District Superintendents increased as the District Council on Ministries became more active.

In 1976 the General Conference added an Expectation/Evaluation System of each pastor to the Superintendent's responsibility.

The 1976 General Conference mandated a consultation dimension to the appointment process, requiring a conference by the Superintendent, the pastors involved, and the Pastor-Parish Committees of churches involved in pastoral changes. The 1980 General Conference added steps in the appointment process, the Expectation/Identification system and in program responsibilities related to the Superintendent and the District Council on Ministries.

All of the above has added to the work load of the Superintendent.

The Restoration Committee has spent over \$3,000.00 on this building (the money has been raised independent of conference sources) and feels that the additional acreage is necessary to the continued preservation of this site.

We announce the date of October 3-4, 1980 for the South Central Jurisdictional meeting of the Archives and History Commission. This is to be held at Perkins School of Theology, SMU, Dallas, Texas.

We call attention to the sale of Dr. W. D. Lester's, *The History of The Negro and Methodism in Arkansas and Oklahoma, 1838-1972*. These may be secured from the Council office for \$5.00 per copy.

Arkansas Methodist/United Methodist Reporter

January 1, 1980 the Arkansas Methodist became an area edition of the Texas Methodist/United Methodist Reporter, Dallas, Texas. Presently the circulation of the paper is approximately 15,000. Of that number, 3354 are paid subscriptions and 1400 are local church editions (First UMC, Little Rock; and First UMC, Springdale).

Churches of the area accepted a total of \$102,109 for support of the paper in 1980 (\$54,030 in North Arkansas, and \$48,079 in Little Rock). In addition, the paper ended 1979 with a balance

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of \$12,000. The 1980 budget called for an expenditure of \$106,415. Anticipated income for the year, figuring on a 90% response to the apportionment, is: \$91,898 from apportionments, \$16,770 from paid subscriptions, and \$1,000 from advertising for a total of \$109,668.

Commission On Equitable Salaries

The Equitable salary support for a charge shall be computed on the combined ministerial support paid the pastor by a charge.

I. Charges are eligible for Equitable Salary Assistance provided:

1. Each church submits its budget, in writing to the Commission, through the District Superintendent annually.
2. Each church conducts an Every Member Visitation, and reports the results to the Commission, through the District Superintendent annually.
3. Each church pays in full all acceptances to the Conference or District Treasurer.
4. The charge agrees to increase salary support a minimum of \$250.00 annually, moving toward the goal of total support at the earliest possible date. (Exception may be requested).
5. The charge makes application to the Commission annually, on the prescribed form, by action of the Charge Conference through the District Superintendent.
6. The charge is served by a full-time pastor, or ministerial student approved by the Annual Conference. By full time we mean disciplinary meaning of full-time minister.

II. The Commission will supplement charges meeting these requirements to reach the minimum salary set by the Annual Conference up to a maximum of \$1,800.00 per year computed on the basis of total support paid the pastor by the charge including base salary, travel and utilities.**III. The minimum Salary for a pastor, approved by the Annual Conference for the conference year beginning June 1, 1980, shall be:**

Full-time	\$11,200.00
Resident, student	\$10,000.00
Non-resident, student	\$ 8,000.00

IV. To encourage charges to reach full Equitable Salary support, a charge will be given credit for any annual increase that is in excess of \$250.00 (see 4 under Program) in an amount equal to one-half of said increase: total support not to exceed \$11,200.00.**V. We encourage the cabinet, the local church and the pastors to work toward charge realignment immediately, in order to strengthen the Church and improve ministerial support.****VI. Station Churches, except in geographically isolated situations paying less than Equitable Salary, will be given two years to meet minimum standards or undergo charge reorganization. Failure to meet this requirement will result in loss of Equitable Salary assistance.****VII. In the event of insufficient funds to meet all claims each charge shall share proportionately from the funds available.**

VIII. The Commission shall report annually in the Conference Journal by district the amounts paid during the conference year to each charge and minister.

IX. That the above plan of distribution of funds be made effective June 1, 1980.

X. The Equitable Salary Commission shall be empowered to designate a portion of their fund for Mission Salary Supplement and report their distribution by charges and Districts in the Journal each year.

The Commission shall develop new guidelines for Missions Salary Supplementation and report these to the 1981 session of the Annual Conference.

Insurance Committee

Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program

Little Rock Conference has the Hospitalization and Medical Expense Program, (HMEP), provided by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church. Travelers Insurance Company is the underwriter.

Eligibility

To save printing in the Pre-Conference and Annual Conference Journals, the listing of eligibility requirements for HMEP participation is printed every fourth year. This listing is in the 1979 Journal.

Ministers transferring into the Conference, or accepting a first appointment may enroll in HMEP within 90 days of transfer or appointment without having to provide a "Statement of Physical Condition" form. A new lay employee of a participating church or organization may enroll within 90 days of employment without having to submit a "Statement of Physical Condition" form.

Enrollment forms are available from the Insurance Committee secretary at the Office of Finance and Management, P.O. Box 3364, Little Rock, Arkansas 72203.

Benefits Paid Under HMEP

UNDER AGE 65

Benefits paid under HMEP for those under age 65 may be found in the 1979 Journal, including the resolution concerning supplemental accident coverage.

Age 65 and Over — Complements Medicare

In-Patient Hospital Services: Full payment of each \$180 Part A Medicare deductible; full payment of \$45 per day from 61st through 90th day; full payment of semi-private and miscellaneous charges from 91st through 120th day beyond payment made from Medicare Lifetime Reserve days; then 80% of reasonable charges from the 121st day up to a \$250,000 lifetime maximum.

Skilled-Nursing Facility: Full payment of \$22.50 per day from the 21st through the 100th day.

Physicians and Other Medical Services: 20% of reasonable charges after a \$60 calendar year Medicare Part B deductible. You must pay the \$60 Part B deductible.

Prescription Drugs — Full-Time Private Duty Nursing: 80% of reasonable charges after calendar year deductible of \$50, up to a \$250,000 lifetime maximum. You must pay the \$50 deductible.

Geographical Limits: Worldwide coverage.

Important Information Concerning Medicare Enrollment: Any minister who will reach his 65th birthday when he is still serving in a full-time capacity, and not drawing Social Security, should apply three months before his 65th birthday at his local Social Security office for Medicare. Should a minister's wife reach age 65 before the minister, she should apply for Medicare at the local Social Security office. This applies to those who are eligible, and wish to participate in Medicare.

It is each person's responsibility to secure his or her own Medicare coverage.

For those age 65 and older, HMEP provides coverage which complements Medicare.

Payment of Premiums

Each local church, or charge, will provide 60% of the premium cost for either individual or family coverage, whichever is applicable, for those under regular appointment, and for eligible local church lay employees.

The Conference Board or Agency responsible for its own budget will provide 60% of the premium cost for either individual or family coverage, whichever is applicable, for ministers under special appointment with annuity credit on the Conference.

The Conference Board of Pensions is paying the full HMEP premium for Conference Claimants.

All eligible persons holding an appointment from the Bishop are required to participate in the HMEP.

If a minister has not paid his HMEP premium by the beginning of the quarter following the quarter for which the premium was due, the minister will be removed from the HMEP enrollment. Any hardship case should be communicated by the District Superintendent to the Secretary of the Insurance Committee for review and action by the Insurance Committee. Any exceptions to this rule must be approved by the Insurance Committee.

Death Benefit Program

Little Rock Conference has Plan D, with Optional Alternate E3, and Surviving Spouse coverage F., Plan B, of the Death Benefit Program provided by the General Board of Pensions of the United Methodist Church.

Eligibility

Complete eligibility requirements may be found in the 1979 Journal, including the resolutions at the end of the report.

Enrollment Periods

An open enrollment period shall be held each year during the month of December for all persons currently eligible. The effective enrollment date shall be January 1 of the succeeding year.

A limited enrollment period shall be held each year for 90 days following the session of Annual Conference. Enrollment at this time shall be limited to those persons for whom appointment or change of Conference relationship on or after January 1, has provided new eligibility status in the plan.

Individual enrollment may be requested at any time within 90 days of becoming newly eligible, with the effective date of eligibility as the effective date of coverage.

Enrollment applications are available from the Insurance Committee secretary at the Office of Finance and Management.

Premiums

The DBP premium is 1.82% of the average salary of the Conference, which, for 1980 is \$13,210. The premium for 1980 is \$240.42, minus a \$25 refund, or \$215.42. The church pays 60%, or \$129.25, and the minister pays 40%, or \$86.17. As long as we do not have heavy claims, we anticipate such a refund yearly, to be distributed as determined by the Insurance Committee.

The 1980 premium was due at the Office of Finance and Management December 1, 1979, since premiums for the whole Conference were due at the General Board of Pensions in January, 1980, to avoid a late payment interest charge. This schedule will be in effect again this year.

DBP premiums for ministers and full-time local pastors retired with pension claim by this Conference are paid by the Little Rock Conference Board of Pensions. DBP premium for eligible surviving spouses of ministers and full-time local pastors is paid by the Conference Board of Pensions. Surviving spouse DBP premium for 1980 is \$105.68.

Participation

All eligible persons holding an appointment from the Bishop are required to participate in the Death Benefit Program.

Board Of Ordained Ministry

Report No. 1

Policy and Program

- I. The Little Rock Conference Board of Ordained Ministry proposes to work strictly within the framework of the current Book of Discipline of the United Methodist Church.
- II. The elected officers of the Board are: chairperson, vice-chairperson, secretary, registrar, and associate registrar. The chairman shall be the treasurer.
- III. The executive committee of the Board are elected officers, Chairperson of the Continuing Education Committee, and the Chairperson of the Conference Relations Committee.
- IV. The Board shall meet prior to the opening of school, at mid-year, and Annual Conference, and on call of the chairperson.
- V. The Board shall have representatives on each District Committee of the Ordained Ministry (Par. 731.1e). In consultation with the district superintendents, the chairperson shall appoint a member of the Board to serve on each committee.
- VI. The Board's sources of income shall be:
 - A. A percentage of conference benevolences.
 - B. $\frac{1}{4}$ (25%) of the amount collected from local churches designated for Ministerial Education.
 - C. Gifts, bequests, interests, and repayments of loans.
- VII. The Board shall maintain a scholarship aid fund for ministerial training as follows:
 - A. For those in the course of study above the local pastor's license.
 1. Assistance in courses of study schools.
 - a. The cost of required textbooks for each year of the course of study.

- b. The cost of tuition or registration fees, and of room and board while attending the course of study schools. Because of limited funds transportation cannot be paid.
 - 2. Assistance in the correspondence course.
 - a. Payment of fees.
 - b. The cost of required textbooks for each course; the enrollees are to purchase the required books and then be reimbursed by the registrar.
 - B. For students from the Little Rock Annual Conference preparing for the effective ministry in the United Methodist Church who:
 - 1. Have satisfactorily completed at least enough semester hours of college credit to qualify for classification as a junior.
 - 2. Are enrolled in a college, university, or seminary approved by the University Senate of the United Methodist Church.
 - 3. Hold a current certificate of candidacy for the ministry in the United Methodist Church, be enrolled in a seminary, or be a Probationary Member of the Little Rock Conference.
 - 4. By August 1 make application to the registrar of the Board for the fall semester giving all information requested and authorizing regular grade reports to this Board's registrar from the school's registrar, including a transcript of credits at the end of the year. By January 15 make application for second semester. Application must be requested.
 - C. The Board may set a maximum amount of scholarship aid per year per recipient, but assistance will be determined for each individual on the basis of requirements or needs.
 - 1. Scholarship aid for summer sessions will be granted on the basis of the number of hours taken based on full-time load for full semester credit.
 - 2. The maximum scholarship aid for college students shall not exceed two years.
 - 3. Additional emergency scholarship aid will be granted at the Board's discretion to students in the following categories, requesting and making application, who:
 - a. Begin preparation for the ministry later in life with pressing financial responsibilities.
 - b. Have severe health circumstances.
 - c. Come from disadvantaged economic backgrounds.
 - 4. The maximum amount of emergency scholarship aid per person per year shall be equal to one semester's grant for scholarship aid. Executive committee must approve the emergency scholarship aid.
- VIII. The Board shall encourage participation in continuing education programs by ministers of the Little Rock Conference. Pastors are encouraged to participate in at least one continuing education experience annually (Par. 424). The following shall serve as policy guidelines:
- A. Members of the Conference, participating in continuing education experiences approved by the Committee on Continuing Education, may receive up to \$300 to cover costs for tuition, board, and books. Persons are responsible for their own travel.
 - B. Persons seeking financial aid for continuing education shall secure an application form from the Chairperson of Continuing Education.
 - C. No person shall be given more than \$300 each calendar year for continuing education.
 - D. In hardship cases, ministers can apply to the continuing education committee for help to attend Pastor's School. Such help will only be granted after other avenues for aid have been exhausted.
 - E. No financial aid is available for Minister's Week.
 - F. Requests for the continuing education funds shall be directed to Board of Ordained Ministry, Chairman, Palmer Garner.

- IX. The Board shall give assistance in a reasonable amount for physical examination for persons to be admitted as associate, probationary or full members.

Requests and Recommendations

- I. As the first step to ministry, candidates shall enroll for studies for certificate of candidacy for ministry with the Department of the Ministry, Division of Ordained Ministry.
- II. We assume our Conference's share of financial responsibility for the Arkansas Pastor's School.
- III. The Annual Conference Council on Finance and Administration is requested to grant:
 - A. An appropriation of a percentage from conference benevolences, based on the Board's financial needs that are not met by other sources.
 - B. An apportionment to local churches for the Ministerial Education Fund.
- IV. We express our appreciation for the support given the Ministerial Education Fund by the churches of the Annual Conference. The Little Rock Conference led all the other Conferences of Methodism by raising 115% of its goal for the Ministerial Education Fund which was a total of \$119,260. We urge every church to continue to give full cooperation and support of its share of the Ministerial Education Fund for the remainder of the calendar year and 1981.
- V. Ministers may be given a minimum of two weeks' vacation and a minimum of one week annually to participate in a continuing education enterprise (Par. 424).
- VI. For this summer the Board has planned two special orientation-training events. In cooperation with the North Arkansas Conference we will sponsor the School for the Local Pastor's License August 5-9 at Hendrix. Also, Pastor's School is August 25-28 with a team from The Menninger Foundation, Topeka, Kansas leading it. Thursday, August 28, will be a special day for Ministers' Wives to attend with special sessions planned. Preacher for the week will be Bill Steel, son of Dr. and Mrs. Marshall T. Steel. The school will be at Hendrix College, Conway, Arkansas.

Report Of The Joint Committee On Disability

The Joint Committee on Disability, in accordance with paragraph 740, recommends that the Little Rock Annual Conference grant the disability status to the following persons:

Board Of Pensions

1. We recommend that the Annuity rate be set at \$88.00 per service year beginning January 1, 1981 for both retired members of the Conference and Special Conference Claimants.

2. We recommend that the apportionments to the charges of the Annual Conference for Conference Claimants Fund be an amount of no less than 25% of the base Pastor's Salary for the conference, and that after the cost of current distribution is paid, the remainder be paid into the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund.

3. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 1706 Section 12e of 1976 Discipline that the Sunday following Easter, April 19, 1981, be observed as Retired Minister's Day. Each pastor is urged to acquaint his or her congregation with the pension program of the Conference as part of the observance, and if possible, to use a retired minister in the Worship Service.

4. We recommend that the pastor of each Local Church present the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, "Memorial Program for Retired Ministers Pension Fund," to the members of his or her congregation and urge their participation in the program. We further request that the Conference Statistician provide a column in the Conference Journal listing the number of Memorials made through the Local Church to the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas.

5. We recommend, in keeping with Par. 1706 Section 5 of the 1976 Discipline, the approval of the Annual Conference that Special Appointments shall be listed in the Conference Journal as follows: (1) With Annuity Claim (a) upon the Annual Conference, or (b) upon a General Board, an Institution, or an Agency of the United Methodist Church; (2) Without Annuity claim upon this Annual Conference.

6. We recommend that the Board continue to apportion to each Agency and Institution served by a ministerial member under special appointment with annuity claims on the Conference, the sum of \$1,056.00 (12 x Annuity rate) per year in accord with the 1976 Discipline Par. 1706 Section 3.a (3); and that said apportionments be paid to the Little Rock Conference Treasurer for the Board of Pensions not later than 15 days prior to the end of the fiscal year. These shall include: the office of the District Superintendent; the Executive Director and the Associate Directors of the Conference Council on Ministries; the Directors of the Methodist Children's Home, Western Methodist Assembly, Christian Civic Foundation, Aldersgate Camp, Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, and Methodist Foundation of Arkansas. The District Superintendents' amount to be paid from the District

Superintendent's Fund. When a minister is appointed to a Wesley Foundation, and also is appointed to a church or churches, the Foundation will be required to pay \$360 annuity.

7. We recommend that the Board of Pensions pay the entire insurance premium for our retirees both for the Death Benefit Program and the Hospital and Medical Expense Program. Also, we recommend continuance of Insurance Plan "B" which would include a death benefit for Widows of ministers in an amount equal to 10% of the Average Conference salary. In addition, we recommend that the eligible Conference Claimants and Special Conference Claimants have the voluntary portion of Medicare paid by the Conference Board of Pensions.

8. We recommend that an annual amount of \$3,000 from the pensions of each retired minister of the Little Rock Conference be designated as housing allowance.

9. We request of the Council on Finance and Administration an amount of \$285,000 to be apportioned to the Local Churches for 1981, the Eighth year of the Eight year MRPF campaign.

10. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 734 Section 4 of the 1976 Discipline that there shall be organized from the membership of the Board of Pensions of the Little Rock Conference a committee to compare the records of the amount paid by each pastoral charge for support of pastors and for pension benefit purposes, computing the proportional distribution thereof and keeping a permanent record of defaults of the ministers in the Conference who have failed to observe the provision in Par. 1260 Section 6 pertaining to proportional payment; and shall render annually to each minister and Charge in default a statement of amounts in default for that and preceding years.

In event of default by any Pastoral Charge after the notification by the committee, liens shall be filed against future pensions and the names of the churches and ministers along with the amount in default shall be printed in the Conference Journal.

11. We request the Secretary of the Annual Conference to print in the Ministers' Service Record in the Journal, one column stating "Years of Pension Claim on the Little Rock Annual Conference," and another stating "Total Service Years in the Ministry."

12. Since the Little Rock Conference has established a Minimum Salary considered to meet the needs of a full-time pastor, we recommend that (1) A minister who received the minimum salary or more must derive his or her sole compensation from the Charge and/or Conference sources in order to be eligible for pension benefits as a full-time minister. (2) If a minister receives less than the Conference minimum salary from church sources, but earns more than 40% of his or her total compensation from outside employment, he or she is not eligible for pension credit. (3) Student Supply time is to be considered as employment aiding the student preparing for full-time service as is required to meet minimal standards as a Conference Member or certified Associate Member, for actually serving full-time pastorates. The student is not eligible for pension benefits.

13. By vote of the Annual Conference we entered into the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund program as of January 1, 1974. We are now a full partner in this program. We want to again express our appreciation to all local Churches of the Little Rock Conference for participation in the additional budget askings for an eight-year period.

We want to emphasize the importance of our Special Gifts Campaign until we reach our Million Dollar Goal to supplement the funds mentioned above. As of March 1, 1980, our pledges and cash contributions have reached the \$849,094.18 figure. Inflation has steadily eaten away at the buying power of pension benefits for our retirees. This makes it even more urgent that we continue to raise their benefits through raising the annuity rate. A continued emphasis on Special Gifts is very important to our program in order that we might better meet the needs of our retirees.

We are grateful for the generosity of our people in making it possible for us to meet our obligation to the Minister's Reserve Pension Fund in full for 1974-75-76-77-78-79. We must continue this good work for the eight-year period.

14. A task force is to be appointed to study the matter of temporary disability and make recommendations to the 1981 Annual Conference.

15. Due to sound investment practices the Board of Pensions recommends a \$10.00 per

service year bonus for 1980 be paid to all retirees. This is a one time bonus.

16. A list of annuitants and pension payments for the year 1979 is available in the Conference Treasurer's Office from Earnestine Martin.

Review And Evaluation

I. Board of Ordained Ministries —

We recommend that the membership be organized into rotating classes. We recommend those persons elected in 1980 be divided into a class of 1984 and into a class of 1988 and that the Board of Ordained Ministries make the designation for each of the classes at their organizational meeting on Tuesday, May 27, 1980, or as soon as is practical.

II. Standing Rules 6,a — Structure Booklet, page 42 —

6. Board Service.

- (a) Membership to the boards, councils, commissions and committees shall be elected for a term of one quadrennium. Eligibility for election for membership on the same board, council, commission, committee shall be limited to two consecutive quadrenniums, excepting ex-officio membership on the Conference Council on Ministries. Membership begins upon election.

Beginning with the 1984 Quadrennium no member of the Annual Conference shall be eligible for the chairmanship of a board, committee, commission or council of the Annual Conference who has served as chairman of a board, committee, commission, or council for the preceding 8 years.

- (b) Amendment To Standing Rule 6. Board Service (c)

The membership of the Committee on Review and Evaluation; Committee on Planning and Research; Committee on the Annual Conference; and the Episcopal Committee shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) of Review and Evaluation.

- (c) Amendment To Standing Rule

Under section II of the Conference's Standing Rules add the number '8' to read as follows:

Requests for financial support by the Conference, when not presented to the Conference by the Council on Finance and Administration, shall lay on the table for twenty-four hours prior to a vote being taken. This rule may be suspended by a 3/4 vote of the Conference. It does not preclude a Council on Finance and Administration recommendation being amended.

III. Board of Managers of Arkansas Pastor's School —

We recommend that the membership from Little Rock Conference shall be composed of — Chairpersons of Boards of Ordained Ministries; Education; Global Ministries; Evangelism; the Dean of the Cabinet; and the Director of the Conference Council on Ministries. The Chairperson of Ordained Ministries will serve as Chairperson of the Board

or Dean of the School for a quadrennium. The position to be determined by the Board.

IV. Relationship of United Methodist Foundation of Arkansas and Board of Stewardship —

- 1) Board of Stewardship is to promote stewardship within local church, districts, and conference.
- 2) United Methodist Foundation of Arkansas is to receive, manage, disburse funds received through the channels provided by the guidelines of the United Methodist Foundation of Arkansas.
- 3) Executive Director of the Foundation shall be an ex-officio member (without vote) of the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 4) One director from the Foundation shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Stewardship.
- 5) Conference Council Director shall serve as liaison between the Foundation and Board of Stewardship.

V. Ecumenical and Inter-religious Affairs —

We recommend that the Annual Conference request Review and Evaluation and the Conference Nomination Committee to bring our structure in line with the action of the 1980 General Conference and that this be accomplished no later than the 1981 session of Annual Conference.

VI. Council on Finance and Administration —

In view of the action of 1980 General Conference, we recommend that membership on CFA be expanded to 15 members (5 clergy, 5 laymen, and 5 laywomen). Effective date — 1980 Annual Conference.

VII. Commission on Status and Role of Women —

We recommend that the chairperson of Commission on Status and Role of Women be named as a member of the Conference Council on Ministries.

VIII. Cooperative Parish Development —

We recommend —

- 1) Area Director of Cooperative Parish Development be an ex-officio member (without vote) of the Conference Council on Ministries.
- 2) The establishing of a Committee on Area Director of Cooperative Parish Ministries, and that the Conference Nominating Committee present nominations at the 1980 session of the Annual Conference.

Commission On The Status And Role Of Women

The end of the first quadrennium for the Commission on the Status and Role of Women in the Little Rock Conference finds that there is recognition of the Commission and its goals at the Conference level, but that this identity is not evidenced at district and local church levels. To extend this identity will be a goal during the new quadrennium.

On October 6, 1979, an awareness event, "Men and Women in Dialogue," was sponsored by the Commission and was directed to local women in an effort to affirm leadership qualities and skills that women, along with men, bring to the ministry of the church. Attendance was low, but an outstanding program was experienced. The Reverend H. Sharon Howell, an Associate Director of the Kansas East Conference Council and a member of the General Commission on the Status and Role of Women was the keynote speaker. She called women to "step out and risk . . . We've made excuses to avoid the role of women in ministry and now we must step out and risk. We must take issue with all that makes half of the world's population oppressed." she went on to remind us that Jesus called the disciples to "get out of the boat and come follow him." A participant observed that when you get out of the boat you have to rock it. Ms. Howell commented that as women respond to God's call, the boat will be rocked. Her challenge was "What will we do, sit and hope that the rocking stops? Or will we all be called to work together, to dialogue, to understand what it means for women and men to be in ministry.

Also featured were workshops led by Dr. Francis Christie, Hendrix College and Dr. Lewis W. Hyde, Jr., Arkansas Psychiatric Center and Reverend Beverly Sawyer, clergywoman.

A new brochure on The Commission on the Status and Role of Women was published to be distributed at Annual Conference and to the constituency through a special mailing in 1980. This outlines the history and responsibilities of the Commission and reaffirms our intention to work toward full and equal participation by women in the total life and mission of the church.

Specifically the Commission will work to:

a. Identify issues and concerns of interest to women and bring these to the attention of Annual Conference.

b. Provide support for women who engage in church related work — both clergy and diaconal.

c. Examine and address needs of special groups of women — singles, widows, older women, clergy women or clergy wives.

d. Work toward establishing active linkage groups in each district and where feasible in local churches.

e. Develop and maintain a list of women who are qualified to serve on conference and district committees, commissions, boards or agencies as vacancies arise, and as nomination committees function.

f. Work to improve leadership and communication skills of women.

g. Encourage women to accept places of responsibility.

A point of real concern for the Commission is inclusiveness. We voice a great appreciation for the laity of the Little Rock Conference in their selection of an inclusive delegation for General and Jurisdictional Conferences this year. We also affirm the progress made by the Nominating Committee this year in naming more women to conference commissions, committees, boards and agencies, than has been done before.

We shall continue to train and develop leadership among women and encourage full utilization of their potential in the ministry of the church and particularly within the Little Rock Conference.

Board Of Trustees

The Little Rock Conference Board of Trustees met in special session May 27, 1980.

Rev. Charles W. Richards, District Superintendent of the Camden District, presented a proposal that the application of any accrual of funds from the abandoned Pine Grove Methodist Church property be left to the discretion of the District Board of Missions and Church Extension. Motion passed.

Rev. Clinton Atchley presented a proposal to separate the Temperance Hill Methodist Church property from the cemetery by use of separate deeds. After discussion it was decided that this matter did not need to come before the Board of Trustees and should and could be handled by the local Board of Trustees. Motion referred back to the local Trustees.

Chairman Everett Vinson presented a proposal from the Carolina Restoration Committee requesting that the remaining five acres of the old Carolina Church property in the Hope District be deeded back to the District Board of Trustees. The Church was built in 1859. Funds are being raised to restore the Church to its original condition. Motion passed.

The Board of Trustees authorized Everett Vinson, Chairman and the Secretary, to continue to cooperate with John Butler Hays on the old Highland Methodist Church property.

United Methodist Women

As this quadrennium draws to a close, the United Methodist Women of the Little Rock Conference feel they have been faithful to the **PURPOSE** of our organization which states that we are:

A community of women whose **PURPOSE** is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

The executive committee set long range goals which will never be completely attained or accomplished but will continue to challenge as we endeavor to fulfill our **PURPOSE** as outlined by the Women's Division.

Our first goal was to improve communications at all levels. With the publishing of the first quarterly issue of our Newsletter, The Rocket, part of this long range goal did become a reality. Mrs. Louise Pate, editor and Mrs. Louis Fish, associate editor are to be congratulated.

There has not been a district meeting in this quadrennium that was not attended by at least one and sometimes six conference officers. This has been a team endeavor that has paid off. I want to commend the District Presidents and their officers for their dedication. They have been an inspiration to the conference as well as the local units.

The undirected pledge sent to the Women's Division to be used toward the projects and programs of United Methodist Women and the Board of Global Ministries has been increased by 5% for 1980. We met our pledge of \$105,000.00 for 1979. Supplementary gifts amounted to \$15,229.35 making a total of \$120,229.35 sent to the Division. Our annual gift to Aldersgate is \$1,500.00, \$2,000.00 to the Arkansas School of Christian Mission and over \$1,000.00 from the Elizabeth Thornberg Workman Fund for Youth which is used for the Youth Program in this conference.

The implementation of the Human Rights Program is still high on our priority list — these include women in crisis, child advocacy, and The New Charter for Racial Justice.

As early as 1869 church women who were concerned about hunger, poverty, education and medical care organized to meet the needs of people in these areas. Focusing primarily on the needs of women and the needs of children, their work soon expanded to other continents. As they worked to share the Gospel with others they also developed personal skills and leadership abilities, not neglecting their spiritual enrichment.

Today we are more than 1.2 million women in over 35,000 units in the United States and Puerto Rico — the largest organized group of women in the world.

At a time when the roles of women were extremely rigid, our predecessors founded schools; built hospitals; sent and supported missionaries; marched for women's suffrage; opposed war; and worked to abolish child labor; reduce illiteracy and reform prisons. Over 100 years later these concerns are what United Methodist Women stand for.

In 1979 the Women's Division contributed \$4,500,000.00 to the World Division and \$4,500,000.00 to the National Division.

West Gulf Regional School met on the SMU Campus in 1979. Ten conference officers and two substitutes for conference officers unable to attend were in this school. Substitutes were Mrs. Daisy Cabean from Hope District and Mrs. R. V. Powell from Pine Bluff District. Mrs. R. V. Welch, Conference Vice-President, was re-elected treasurer and business manager of the West Gulf school for 1980 which will meet in Lincoln, Nebraska next month.

The Arkansas School of Christian Mission met on the Hendrix Campus and was well attended by all conference officers and six district presidents. The weekend school was July 20-22. The weekday school July 23-26.

The Arkansas School will meet on the campus of Henderson Univeristy this year. Something new is being added. In order that families with children can take advantage of this school of Christian Mission there will be facilities to accommodate children of all ages. Also study programs for children through Jr. High age. Senior youth may attend adult sessions.

The purpose of this experiment is not to provide studies for the children, although this will be a provision, but to enable young parents to attend the school. Mrs. Louis Fish will serve as dean. Mrs. Ed Matthews will be coordinator of children's activities. Mrs. Sharon Spurlin will teach the Jr. High study. Mrs. Stephanie Hazelwood will coordinate youth activities. Dates are July 18-20 for the weekend school, July 21-24 for the weekday school.

A National Seminar held every four years is a continuing educational component of mission which has implications for future programming. During the month of August this seminar was held in Lincoln, Nebraska. The Little Rock Conference was well represented by Mrs. Ray Pledger, Mrs. J. D. Scott, and Miss Debbie Biniore.

The Women's Division held its fall meeting during the week of our annual meeting. Since all conference officers were involved at this time, Mrs. Peggy Mitchell, a Pine Bluff District officer represented our conference. Mrs. Mitchell later attended a Seminar for Minority Groups on the Equal Rights Amendment in Washington, D.C.

First Church, Little Rock hosted the Annual Meeting, October 13. "New Dimensions of Mission" was the theme for the day which was highlighted by the ratification of the New Charter for Racial Justice. Mrs. Kenneth Hicks gave the opening meditation. Senator Dale Bumpers was the distinguished speaker. A panel composed of Rev. Kathy Fadick, Mrs. Earl Hughes and Mrs. Nick Evans discussed different aspects of Human Rights, with special emphasis on rights of women and rights of children. New officers elected were Mrs. R. V. Powell, Pine Bluff, Secretary of Program Resources; Mrs. R. A. Patton, Monticello, Chairman of Nominating Committee; and Mrs. Troy Alley, member of Nominating Committee representing the Pine Bluff District.

In late October, District Officer Training took place at Malvern First Church, with Miss Ann Eaton a staff person from the Women's Division in charge.

One of the finest workshops ever held in Little Rock Conference was under the direction of Mrs. Terry Rasco. This event on Child Advocacy took place March 21-22 at Aldersgate. Since 1979 was the International Year of the Child, Mrs. Rasco wanted to have this workshop in 1980 to impress on everyone that working with and helping children is not a one year undertaking but a never ending responsibility.

Each speaker was an authority on the particular subject being presented. It was an inspiring, enlightening experience. Jim Guy Tucker, National Chairman on the White House Conference on Families was the key note speaker.

Sixteen women from Little Rock Conference attended the South Central Jurisdiction meeting in El Paso, Texas, March 28-30. The purpose of this meeting was to elect 16 nominees from the 17 conferences in the Jurisdiction. Of these 16 nominees eight will be elected by the Jurisdictional Conference to serve on the Women's Division. The three nominees representing Little Rock Conference were Mrs. Rubye Lee Jackson, Mrs. Zenobia Waters and Mrs. Louis Fish. Mrs. Jackson is completing a four year term as a member of the Women's Division and is eligible for re-election. She was elected as a nominee on the first ballot.

Mrs. Waters was elected as an alternate nominee and was elected to the nominating committee of the Jurisdiction Core Planning Group.

Conference delegates were Mrs. R. V. Welch, Mrs. Ray Pledger, Mrs. J. H. McLarty, Mrs. James T. Young, Mrs. Allen Bonsall and Mrs. Hubert Blakley.

In Paul's letter to the Galatians he writes, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female." (Gal. 3:28) In God's sight there are no distinctions. From God's point of view the scripture erases all boundaries with which we enclose mankind. Nobody is shut in. Nobody is shut out.

The women in the Little Rock Conference are trying very hard to take the time to order our lives, to bring our practices into line with our beliefs. May we continue to offer loyal support to all human beings. May we walk each day with faith in God.

Christian Civic Foundation Of Arkansas, Inc.

This is the twenty-first report of the Christian Civic Foundation to the Little Rock Conference of The United Methodist Church. Highlights include the following:

Alcohol-Narcotics Education Program The 1979-80 school year marked the eighteenth year of service to the public schools of Arkansas through a program of preventive education related to alcohol and drug abuse. Approximately 250 schools were contacted. Specific dates for programs were offered to 190. Thus far, 107 have confirmed dates, and we expect to receive another fifteen or twenty dates, making this the highest number of schools served in our history. By the same token, this added success means that the cost of our program will be the highest in our history.

There is serious question concerning our ability to continue this program in the face of two anticipated developments: (1) The rise in gasoline prices to \$2.00 per gallon by December; (2) Gasoline rationing, freely predicted to follow the November elections. Considering the financial burdens of the school districts of Arkansas, we cannot recommend charging for our service. We doubt that any school district would accept our program at this time, if we charge enough to cover the expenses of that program.

Alcohol Beverage Control Board: We have assisted every individual, church, or community requesting our help in opposing objectionable permits for the sale of alcoholic beverages. Our office has made a complete analysis of all such permits that were in force April 16, 1979. This will be printed in the next issue of The Christian Citizen.

Constitutional Convention: One whole issue of the newsletter was given to information concerning the Constitutional Convention, which opened on May 14 and recessed on July 16 of 1979. The Executive Director attended all sessions of the Convention, and will attend the two-weeks session beginning June 16, 1980. The proposed constitution made no changes with respect to the language now existing which outlaws lotteries and permits pari-mutuel wagering at Hot Springs. Church people should study carefully the provisions that cover taxation of church property.

The General Assembly: An extended session of the 72nd General Assembly met Monday, January 7, 1980, and recessed January 17 until December 31, 1980. Governor Clinton issued a call for a Special or Extraordinary Session to begin on January 17, listing 76 items considered to be emergencies. House Bill 32, a bill that would have excluded wine and beer from the definition of "alcoholic beverages" in Act 132 of 1969 (the mixed-drink, private club bill), was defeated in committee.

Local Option Elections For 1980: At this time, we have information indicating that as many as six Local Option elections may be held at the time of the November elections in 1980. We will assist in every instance where our help is requested.

The Christian Citizen: We anticipate publication of three issues of our quarterly newsletter in 1980.

Finances: Total income from all sources for the fiscal year of 1979 was \$55,567.80. Disbursements totaled \$58,537.22. Disbursements exceeded income by \$2,969.42, and were met with cash balances on hand January 1, 1979.

Baptist giving for 1979 reached an all-time high, totaling \$26,266.39. Methodist giving from the North Arkansas and Little Rock Conferences totaled \$23,138.19. Other churches gave \$310. Individuals gave \$4,200. All other sources of income totaled \$1,653.22.

The new Budget for 1980, recommended for approval by the Board of Directors, totals \$67,991.00, as compared with \$61,794.00 for 1979.

Anticipated Giving for 1980 includes:

North Arkansas Methodist Conference: \$5,000, to be paid in five payments of \$1,000 each for the first five months of the year. Funding for the Christian Civic Foundation by the North Arkansas Conference will end May 31, with the remaining \$7,000 of the annual asking assigned to the Conference Board of Church and Society. In 1981, there will be no funding for the Christian Civic Foundation. A total of \$12,000 in new funds during 1980-81 to replace this source of income will be needed.

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

Little Rock Methodist Conference: Funding for 1980 will continue the \$12,500 received in 1979. The Finance Committee and Executive Committee have requested the Conference Council on Finance and Administration to grant an emergency fund of \$1,250 for 1980, to make up a part of the loss from North Arkansas. They have also been asked to increase the giving for 1981 by \$2,000, to \$14,500. The Council will present their recommendations to the Annual Conference session in May. We are hopeful that these requests will be granted by the Conference.

Arkansas Baptist State Convention: The Convention will continue giving \$20,000 to the Christian Civic Foundation for 1980, and we anticipate gifts from Local Baptist Churches to approximate \$6,000. The Executive Board of the Convention has already granted the request for \$2,500 for an Emergency Fund, to make up part of the North Arkansas loss. Monthly payments on this fund have already begun. The request for an increase of \$4,000 from the Arkansas Baptist State Convention for 1981 has already been voted, which brings the 1981 contribution to \$24,000.

1980 and 1981 will be testing times for us. If we receive all of the income that we have requested of our supporters, and if we use all of the cash funds (Contingency Reserve) we have on hand, we may be able to operate in the black through 1980. To continue the same program, without any increases in 1981, will require new income of approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000. If this new income is not received, the 1981 budget will have to be reduced by this amount. This means cutting staff and program. It is our intention to continue service to all seventy-five counties of the state, and to answer every call for assistance, regardless of whether the individual or the church are listed as supporters of our program. We are grateful for every gift of the past year, from the Conference, the Convention, the churches, and individuals who made their gifts as an expression of their faith in the cause of civic righteousness which we promote in their name.

J. Edward Dunlap

In a conversation with the writer a layman who served with J. Edward Dunlap on an important Annual Conference Board and who had been a member of a church he had served said, "Ed Dunlap was the most normal and balanced minister I have ever known." This statement reflects the high esteem in which laymen over the Conference held him. Ministers also had just as high regard for him. They not only elected him to be a part of their General and Jurisdictional Conference Delegation five different times but also in 1976 they endorsed him as their candidate for the episcopacy.

This distinguished minister began his life on November 6, 1918 when he was born the son of Edward Lee and Clara Berryman Dunlap in Wilmar, Arkansas. He attended public schools in Pine Bluff and the first year of college at what is today the University of Arkansas at Monticello. When he received his license to preach in 1938 upon the recommendation of the First United Methodist Church in Pine Bluff he transferred to Hendrix College where he completed his undergraduate work. He then earned the B.D. degree from Perkins School of Theology at SMU. After being admitted on trial and ordained Deacon in the North Texas Conference in 1942, he transferred to the Little Rock Conference in 1943 and one year later was ordained Elder and admitted into full connection.

During his fruitful ministry he served the following charges: Foreman, Oaklawn (Hot Springs), Lonoke, Mena, Nashville, Arkadelphia, Goddard (North Arkansas Conference) Monticello District, Winfield (Little Rock) Little Rock District, and First Church El Dorado.

His leadership abilities were used extensively by the Boards and Agencies of the Jurisdictional and Annual Conferences as well by the institutions of the church. The following is a partial list of the positions held: member of the Board of Trustees of Hendrix College, The Methodist Children's Home, and Philander Smith College; Chairman of the Jurisdictional Council on Finance and Administration, and Committee on Organization of Annual Conferences, member of the Jurisdictional Boards of Evangelism and Missions. He was twice a member of the Little Rock Conference Council on Finance and Administration; Chairman of the Conference Council on Ministries, the Board of Camp Tanako, the Board of Ministry, the Town and Country Commission and the Little Rock Conference Cabinet.

In the life of communities where he lived and served he was president of civic clubs such as Kiwanis and Rotary and was a 32nd Degree Mason serving as Knight Commander Court of Honor of Scottish Rite Masonry.

His death came without warning on December 15, 1979 and his funeral service held in First United Methodist Church, El Dorado, three days later, was conducted by Dr. Joe R. Phillips, Dr. Harold K. Davis and Dr. Alvin C. Murray. The interment was in Graceland Cemetery in Pine Bluff.

He is survived by his dear wife, Marion Tally Dunlap, his two children, Dr. James Edward Dunlap, Jr. and Dorothy Janelle Dunlap Cookus; his mother, Mrs. Lee Dunlap; his brother, Martel Dunlap; and his sister, Miss Hazel Dunlap.

His fellow ministers, his host of friends and his beloved family feel keenly his going, and believe that the Church Triumphant will rejoice that it has received into its membership such an able and devoted leader.

He accepted the retired relationship in 1970. In this capacity, he continued to supply churches. A faithful servant of God until the end of his earthly journey. He was supplying Wesley Chapel at Center Point at the time of his death.

Rev. Tyus died on March 4, 1980. Funeral services were held at Mt. Carmel United Meth-

odist Church in Lockesburg, May 8, 1980 with Rev. J. H. Oliver officiating. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Theola Tyus and four children.

William Martin (Bill) Shepherd

Dr. William Martin (Bill) Shepherd was born December 20, 1905, the son of Willie Lecoran and Katherine Martin Shepherd, and was reared on the family farm at Mabelvale. He received the B.A. Degree, cum laude, from Hendrix College at Conway, was selected as a Rhodes Scholarship candidate, and did graduate work at Purdue University in 1927-28.

The former Arkansas Power and Light Company executive had a distinguished career in the business world and also provided outstanding leadership in civic affairs. In 1942, he was named as one of the Junior Chamber of Commerce's "Ten Outstanding Young Men in America." He also served as National President of the Junior Chamber of Commerce. He was a 33-degree Mason, and was the author of the biographical book, "Seven Honor Men," published in 1978.

Vitally active in the United Methodist Church, Bill served at all levels — local, district, conference, and national. On the local level he served on the Administrative Board and as an adult Church School teacher in the Mabelvale Church for many years. He was chairman of the Building Committee when the present sanctuary was constructed. The large wooden cross which hangs in the sanctuary of the Mabelvale Church was handmade by Bill Shepherd and is testimony to the legacy of humble service which he left his family and his friends.

From 1960-68 Bill served as Little Rock District Lay Leader. He was a member of the Board of Trustees of Philander Smith College, which honored him with the Doctor of Humane Letters Degree. He also served on the Board of Aldersgate Camp.

As Conference Lay Leader from 1972-79, Bill gave leadership each year in the Laymen's Assembly at Camp Tanako. He served on the Little Rock Conference Committee on Planning and Research, as a member-at-large of the Board of Evangelism, and was a member of the Communications Committee.

On the national level Bill served on the General Council on Finance and Administration, and was a member of the Joint Committee on Communications.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Edna Earl Brewster Shepherd; a son, William M. Shepherd, Jr.; a daughter, Mrs. Carl M. Phillips; a brother, Albert C. Shepherd; a sister, Miss Mary Sue Shepherd; and four grandchildren.

Bill Shepherd was a man of many talents and the recipient of many honors . . . but above all he was a loyal and devoted churchman. He died April 20, 1980, in Little Rock. The funeral service was held in the sanctuary of the Mabelvale United Methodist Church by the Reverend Louis M. Mulkey and the Reverend Herbert F. Pekar. Burial was at Pinecrest Memorial Park.

Hope Tabor Cade, the second child born to Rev. Edward A. Tabor and his wife Mamie Lou Tabor, was born May 28, 1892 in Ft. Smith, Arkansas where her father was pastor of the First Methodist Church in that city. However she spent most of her childhood and youth in the Conway-Little Rock area.

As a small girl in Conway, Hope was affectionately known to the neighbors as "Little Hope." "She was a plain child, — friendly, smiling and radiant, who made friends of both old and young. She was unaware of age difference, class lines and racial prejudice. She loved everybody."

In 1921 she met and married Charles David Cade, a student minister. She demonstrated her leadership ability and her love of people through nearly fifty years as a minister's wife. In the local churches she was known for her ability and willingness to help organize and promote Women's Societies of Christian Service and educational activities. Her family has said of her: "No pastor ever had a more firm supporter or a finer companion to live with him in the parsonage than Hope Tabor Cade, wife of Charles D. Cade."

The Cades retired and took up residence in Arkadelphia, Arkansas in 1957 where they continued to live until his death in December 1976 and her death in October 1979.

Hope T. Cade was the mother of two children: Charles David Cade, Jr., a successful engineer of Lincoln, Nebraska; and Carol Elizabeth Cade of New York City who is a successful art teacher at Newark State College in Newark, New Jersey.

X. Miscellaneous

The organization of the Little Rock Annual Conference is defined in the Statement of the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Conference as printed in the 1974 Journal.

The Standing Rules are subject to the Discipline of the United Methodist Church and the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

THE STANDING RULES

I. Conference Organization

1. **Number of Districts.** There shall be six districts in the Little Rock Annual Conference.
2. **District Conference.** There may be a district conference held annually in each district, composed of those members provided for in the current Discipline, and one additional member from each pastoral charge, provided however, in charges of more than five hundred members there shall be one additional member for each five hundred members or fraction thereof.
3. **Nominations.**
 - (a) The Conference Nominating Committee shall be composed of the District Superintendent and one lay person from each district. The Bishop shall serve as chairman.
 - (b) The Conference Nominating Committee shall nominate six members (three lay and three clergy) at large to achieve an equal balance of lay and clergy members, alternating by districts as follows:

Lay	Clergy
Arkadelphia	Little Rock
Camden	Monticello
Hope	Pine Bluff
 - (c) The Conference Nominating Committee will nominate all members of the Annual Conference quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees and Conference Council on Ministry boards, committees and commissions except as otherwise provided. Each District Nominating Committee will complete its list of qualified nominations by December 31. All nominees shall be consulted regarding their nomination.
All boards and agencies of the Conference shall be inclusive of ethnic minority representation.
 - (d) Terms of office of the Nominating Committee shall be for four years beginning on January 1 following the session of the Annual Conference in the middle of the quadrennium.
4. **Lay Members.** Lay members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually and their names and addresses shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
5. **Youth Membership.** Each District Council of the United Methodist Youth shall elect annually two youth members of the Annual Conference, and their names shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
6. **Board Service.**
 - (a) Membership to the boards, councils, commissions and committees shall be elected for a term of one quadrennium. Eligibility for election for membership on the same board, council, commission, committee shall be limited to two consecutive quadrenniums, excepting ex-officio membership on the Conference Council on Ministries. Membership begins upon election.
Beginning with the 1984 Quadrennium no member of the Annual Conference shall be eligible for the chairmanship of a board, committee, commission or

council of the Annual Conference who has served as chairman of a board, committee, commission, or council for the preceding 8 years.

- (b) There are two types of membership on Annual Conference boards, committees, commissions and councils: at large and ex-officio. A person may serve in only one at-large and/or one ex-officio capacity.
- (c) The membership of the Committee on Review and Evaluation; the Committee on Planning and Research; the Committee on the Annual Conference; and the Episcopal Committee shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) of Review and Evaluation.
- (d) No person from the Little Rock Conference, clerical or lay, shall serve as an elected trustee of more than one United Methodist related institution within the bounds of the Arkansas Area at a time. "Within the bounds of" these United Methodist related institutions are understood to be the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Aldersgate, Methodist Children's Home, the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, the Wesley Foundations, Little Rock Conference Camp Tanako, and Mt. Sequoyah Assembly. This is to take effect during the year 1979, as each institution could possibly have its timetable of elections on a different schedule. Trustees presently serving are allowed to complete their present terms.
- (e) All Councils, Boards, Committees and Commissions of the Conference shall be made representative. Special consideration shall be given to placing women, youth, and minority persons on the membership of these conference agencies.
- (f) Beginning with the 1984 Quadrennium no member of the Annual Conference shall be eligible for the chairmanship of a board, committee, commission or council of the Annual Conference who has served as chairman of a board, committee, commission or council for the preceding 8 years.

II. Financial Administration

1. **Fiscal Year.** The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall run from January 1 to December 31.
2. **Financial and Statistical.**
 - (a) The District Superintendents shall furnish the treasurer with all apportionments to the churches on, or before January 15. These figures shall be official.
 - (b) All Conference assessments and reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars; with no column for cents.
 - (c) Each pastor shall make a statistical report to the District Superintendent who shall submit the reports to the Conference Statistician. The Pastor's financial report will be audited and checked by the Final Data Processing Print-Out. Where there is discrepancy, the amount recorded on the Print-Out will prevail.
3. **Administrative Fund.** The Council on Finance and Administration shall recommend an assessment for a Conference Administrative Fund. All clerical work of the Conference, the expense of publishing the pre-conference report, the expense of publishing the Journal and preserving the records of the Conference, the expense of preparing and printing the Worship Booklet for the Annual Conference, the expense of auditing the accounts of the several boards, the expenses of the Conference Secretary and Statistician, the expenses of committees raised by the Conference shall be paid from this Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of the Fund. Payments for unbudgeted claims on this fund shall be made on vouchers signed by the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration or the Conference Secretary.
4. **Program Budgets.** Budgets for expenditures for program for the District and the Conference shall be co-ordinated by the Conference Council on Ministries. The Conference Council on Ministries shall make recommendations to the Council on

Finance and Administration which shall make a final recommendation to the Annual Conference.

5. **Conference Treasurer.** The Council on Finance and Administration shall set the salary and provide for the expenses of the Conference Treasurer and make arrangements for paying the same, subject to the action of the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference shall assign the duties, responsibilities, and the headquarters city, of the Conference Treasurer, on recommendation of the Council on Finance and Administration, in keeping with the provisions of the Discipline.
6. **District Fund.** The District Stewards shall estimate and allocate to the several charges an amount necessary for district parsonage and other necessary district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and pay it out on order of the District Superintendent. The treasurer of the district fund shall report to the District Stewards annually, showing receipts and disbursements. Funds budgeted by the District Council on Ministries will be paid by the District Treasurer upon action of the District Council on Ministries and the approval of the District Superintendent.
7. **Apportionments Based on Pastor's Salary.** On all items apportioned to local churches by means of a percentage of the minister's salary, such percentage shall be understood to apply to all ministerial members of the local church staff serving under the appointment of the Bishop and District Superintendent, including ministers in full connection, ministers on trial, and full-time Lay Pastors.
8. Requests for financial support by the Conference, when not presented to the Conference by the Council on Finance and Administration, shall lay on the table for twenty-four hours prior to a vote being taken. This rule may be suspended by a 3/4 vote of the Conference. It does not preclude a Council on Finance and Administration recommendation being amended.

III. Conference Procedure

1. **Rules of Order.** The Rules of Order shall be Roberts Rules of Order revised.
2. **Reports and Resolutions.** There shall be a pre-conference report which shall contain reports of all the boards and agencies of the Conference. This report shall be mailed to each member of the Little Rock Conference at least 30 days before the annual session. The Conference Secretary shall be the editor of this publication. All reports, resolutions, and other papers intended for publication in the pre-conference reports shall be typewritten, in triplicate, on special forms furnished by the Conference and obtained from the Conference Secretary. In the event editing of a report is deemed necessary by the Conference Secretary and Chairman of the Board involved, permission is hereby granted.
3. **Conference Expense Fund.**
 - (a) Registration fees and offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be administered by the Conference Treasurer and shall be used to defray the expenses of the session.
 - (b) The Conference shall meet on a self-entertainment plan, except that the entertainment of the retired ministers shall be paid from the Conference Expense Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall pay a per diem for days actually in attendance directly to the retired ministers and be reimbursed from the Conference Expense Fund. Eligibility shall be determined by the Conference Board of Pensions.
 - (c) Any deficit in the Conference Expense Fund shall be made up from the Conference Administrative Fund.
 - (d) The Conference Expense Fund shall be administered by the Committee on the Annual Conference.
4. **Un-sponsored Resolutions.** Any resolution not sponsored by a regular board or standing committee of the Conference must lie over for twenty-four hours before

being debated and acted upon, provided, however, immediate debate and action may be ordered by two-thirds vote of the Conference present and voting.

5. **Memoirs.** There shall be published in the Journal a memoir of each deceased clerical member of the Conference, containing date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, charges served, and place of burial. A picture of the deceased shall be published with the memoir. The same shall be done for probationary members, associate members and lay pastors. Likewise, a memoir of wives or widows of the above shall be published in the Journal. The District Superintendents shall report to the Sub-committee on Memoirs the death of any of the above mentioned and be responsible for the submission of Memoirs not later than thirty days after the death occurs. The names or memoirs of deceased laymen who have been active in the Conference sessions, or served on Conference Boards or as officials of Conference institutions may be published in the Journal. The District Superintendent shall be responsible for securing the memoirs for laymen whose memoirs shall be published. It shall be the duty of the District Superintendents to report to the Chairman of the Conference Board of Pensions the death of any conference claimant that occurs in their respective districts.
6. **Historical Material.**
 - (a) The Library at Hendrix College shall be the depository for all historical documents and artifacts of the Little Rock Conference. The College Librarian shall be the custodian of these historical materials.
 - (b) The Commission on Archives and History shall be responsible for securing a group picture of each class admitted into full connection for publication in the Journal and also two small pictures of each clerical member at the time of his retirement.
7. **Unbudgeted Expenditures.** When any proposal is submitted to the Annual Conference which involves the expenditure of funds not included in the established budget, such a proposal shall be referred for advice and recommendation to the Council on Finance and Administration and brought back to the same session of the Annual Conference for a vote to be taken by the Conference.
8. **Campaigns.** All Conference-wide campaigns to raise funds shall be voted on by secret ballot of the Conference.

IV. Amendments

These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.
