



# III. Daily Proceedings CONFERENCE MINUTES

# The Service Of Commemoration And Communion Monday Afternoon, June 2, 1986 — 1:30 p.m.

The Commemoration and Communion Service was prepared by the Little Rock Conference Board of Worship in cooperation with the appropriate boards and agencies. The Conference organist was Carolyn Appling. Worship leaders included: Celebrant, Bishop Richard Wilke, Resident Bishop of Arkansas; Preacher, Jim Argue, Sr. The elements were distributed by the Little Rock Conference Cabinet.

Gerald Fincher, Conference Secretary, called the names of those who died during the year, and a bell was tolled for each of them, after which the Conference thanked God for them.

The Conference sang, "For All the Saints."

The one hundred and thirty-third session of the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church was convened at the First United Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Arkansas. The session was called to order immediately following the Service of Commemoration and Communion by Bishop Richard Wilke.

The Bishop called on the Secretary for those matters that need to be dealt with in order to organize the Conference business. Gerald Fincher, Secretary of the Conference, moved the adoption of the agenda as printed in the 1986 Members Workbook with the understanding that it may be adjusted as need arises. The motion was seconded and passed. The Secretary nominated as general tellers: Robert W. Trieschmann, head Teller, Roger Armstrong, John P. Miles III, Robert Woody, Dale Diffee, Bill Fish and Carol Galbreath. These nominations were approved. The Secretary nominated John O. Alston as Journal Clerk; O. D. Peters as Staff Assistant; and Patricia Parker as Transcriptionist. The Secretarial Staff was approved.

Other instructions given by the Secretary, "The official roll call will be taken from the pre-registration slips. I hope that each member (clerical and lay) sent in the pre-registra-

tion information or has registered properly since arriving at Conference. This information contained on the slips will be used to record your name, address, and attendance at Conference and will be printed in the 1986 Journal as submitted."

The Secretary moved the Bar of the Conference be as follows: From the front of the church to the rear of the Sanctuary, the center aisle to be included; each side aisle from the front of the church to the marble columns to also be included.

John Miles made an amendment to the motion that "Visitors are given the privilege to sit with the Bar of the Conference without vote." The amendment was approved.

The Secretary asked that identification badges be worn at all times as they are the ticket to voting.

Further instructions were: "When granted the privilege of the floor by the Presiding Officer, delegates shall identify themselves by name and the church or district which they represent. Persons who wish to be recognized should first proceed to one of the microphones. In order to balance the lay and clergy votes, I move that the following persons be granted the laity vote: Local Church Delegates (2 per district), District Lay Leaders, Diaconal Ministers, Lay Chairpersons of Conference Boards, Committees, Commissions and Task Forces not already delegates, three at-large lay delegates from each district making a total of 281 and the number of clergy delegates at 273."

The Secretary stated new forms are available on which to record any motion, amendment, substitute motion, or resolution. These forms must be used to record said information either before the action is made or acted upon. The form is then delivered to the Secretary for inclusion in the Journal. This is the only form the Conference Secretary will accept for the official record and minutes.

The Secretary stated it was his wish that the minister's service record be as accurate as possible. Some 1985 Journals are available at the Secretary's desk for reference. Ministers are invited to examine their record for accuracy. The Secretary should be informed of any corrections. Special emphasis is for persons transferring into the Little Rock Conference or for those whose status is changed at this Conference.

The Secretary informed the Conference that emergency messages would be posted on the Board in the Sanctuary and all other messages would be posted on a bulletin board in the basement. John Hays welcomed the Conference as host pastor. He introduced the Mayor of Hot Springs, The Honorable Jim Randall, who is a member of First UMC. The Mayor welcomed the Conference to Hot Springs. Jim Tarkington, Chairman of the Administrative Board at First UMC, also welcomed members of the Conference.

Ruth Cobb gave the Conference Nominating Committee report and moved the acceptance of this report. A substitute motion was offered by Nick Evans. "The report of the Nominating Committee be approved with the exception of the slate of nominations for the Council on Finance and Administration and that the Nominating Committee prepare and present to this Annual Conference a slate of nominations for the Council on Finance and Administration comprised of persons whose local church or pastoral charge paid 100% of 1985 Conference Apportionments." The legality of this motion was questioned. The motion carried by a vote of 217 for and 69 against.

It was reported that Marge Thompson, Conference Communications Chairperson, was not listed as a member of the Conference Council on Ministries. This will be reviewed and brought back to the Conference. The question was raised as to whether persons who are members of the CFA and elected for the quadrennium can be removed from office before the quadrennium ends and replaced. Gary Harrison presented a motion, "I move that the Report of the Committee on Nominations and Personnel be presented in the District Pre-Conference workshop." The motion failed.

Diana Kinsey, Chairperson of Religion and Race, made an amendment to the nominations roster, to "Amend nominations roster for CORR substituting Susan Smith Miles as an at-large member, in the place of James Rush." Her motion carried.

Joe Wilkerson made a motion, "I move that the report of the Nominating Committee be held over until June 3." The motion carried.

John B. Hays presented the report of the Board of Ordained Ministry. Jim Argue, Sr. made a substitute motion on the Entry into United Methodist Ministry From Other Denominations portion of the Report, "Change wording in Paragraph 2 (b) not less than twelve months and (c) before the end of one year." The motion failed. George Tanner made an amendment to that same portion of the Board of Ordained Ministry report, "I move we amend the proposal of the Board of Ordained Ministry, Entry to United Methodist Ministry from other Denominations," by deleting section (b) of paragraph 2; and the phrase 'before the end of two years during which one is appointed as a minister from another denomination," in section (c) or paragraph 2." The motion failed. The addendum to the report of the Board of Ordained Ministry was approved without change.

Constance Waddell extended a thanks for Mt. Sequoyah and presented the report. The re-

port was approved.

# The Celebration Of The Word Monday, June 2, 1986 — 7:30 p.m.

The Preacher was Bishop Emerson Colaw from the Minnesota Area. The liturgist was Bishop Richard Wilke. The prayer was offered by Bishop Colaw. The Organist was Mrs. Carolyn Appling of the First United Methodist Church in Hot Springs. The Choir was from Sulpher Springs United Methodist Church and Good Faith United Methodist Church in Pine Bluff under the direction of John Browning and Audrey Powell.

Tuesday Morning, June 3, 1986 — 8:15 a.m.

For the morning worship, Bill Steele was the liturgist and Bruce Bennett gave the message. The organist was Mrs. Carolyn Appling.

The session was called to order by Bishop Wilke at 9:00 a.m. Bishop Wilke gave the Epis-

copal Address (see reports).

Bob Trieschmann presented an orchid to Julia Wilke. Mrs. Wilke then presented an orchid to Jane Colaw. Mrs. Kitchens, Julia Wilke's mother, was presented to the Conference. She is a member of First UMC in Texarkana.

The report of the Committee on Nominations was presented after being tabled on Monday. Gladwin Connell reported two years work of the Task Force on structure had been put

in force by the Nominating Committee this year in their nominations.

Maxine Callaway Waller made a motion to amend the Nominating Committee report to include Sandra Graves Crawford, Chairperson of Black Methodists for Church Renewal, on the CCOM. The motion carried. Gladwin Connell made a motion, "I move that the Chairperson of the BMCR Caucus not be a voting member of the CCOM."

John Miles moved that the rules be suspended to vote on BMCR representation of CCOM.

Gladwin Connell's motion failed.

Gary Harrison moved "I move that any interested, established United Methodist caucus be allowed a membership slot on the Conference Council on Ministries." This motion was tabled for 24 hours.

Davis Thompson made an amendment to the Nominating Committee report, "The Chairperson of the Committee on Communications be included as a full member of the Little Rock Conference Council on Ministries." This amendment was also tabled for 24 hours.

There was a request for a vote to reconsider the matter of the motion of Nick Evans which was on the floor Monday and the vote was affirmative.

Norman Carter made a substitute motion "Be it moved that the Little Rock Conference Nominating Committee in making nominations to CFA, give favorable considerations to Pastors and Lay Persons from churches that have a long and distinguished record of paying their Benevolence and apportionments in full." The vote was 122 for and 126 against. Ralph Hale asked for a recount. The recount vote was 141 for and 131 against. The substitute motion passed.

The Nominating Committee report will be held over until Wednesday in accordance with a motion made, seconded and carried. Two motions concerning this report will have to be on the table for 24 hours.

A point of special privilege was requested by Leona Bonsall and she asked that Ernestine Henderson McKinney be sent a letter of congratulations by the Secretary of the Conference on being recognized as one of 100 outstanding women from the UMW or predecessor organizations who were honored at a recent assembly of the UMW in Anaheim.

Leona Bonsall presented the report of the UMW and the report was approved. The Lydia Patterson report was received as presented by Theresa Palamaurs. The General Board of Pensions report was presented by Merle Peterson. The report is accepted as corrected.

JoAnn Miles made an amendment to the Board of Pensions report, "I amend the report to read that the Little Rock Conference in session June, 1986, petition the General Board of Pensions to ACTIVELY seek IRS approval to extend to minister's widows the courtesy of 'Housing Exemption' from taxes currently enjoyed by retired ministers." The motion carried.

Sam Albright reported on the United Methodist Publishing House emphasizing recent books: 50 Years of Pun & Pleasure by George Kerr; I Hear the Roaring Thunder by Larry Powell; and, How to Be Happy in a Non-Electric Church by Merle Allison Johnson. He also presented the Little Rock Conference with a check for \$8,238.64 for the Pension Fund.

Mike Parker, Chairman of the Board of Diaconal Ministries introduced Marsha Dodd who presented the report. (See reports). The report was accepted as presented in the Pre-Conference Journal.

Jim Argue, Jr. presented the report of the United Methodist Foundation of Arkansas and the report was accepted.

## Wednesday Morning, June 4, 1986 — 8:15 a.m.

For the Morning Worship Service Jeane Pope, pastor of the Bearden-Thornton Charge brought the message and John Darnall, pastor of Good Faith in Pine Bluff was the liturgist. The session was called to order at 9:05 a.m.

Gladwin Connell presented the report of the Council on Ministries. Charles Settle presented a 1987-88 CCOM priority "A Year of In-Depth Bible Study."

Paulette Purser, Hymnal Revision Reader Consultant, made a motion, "I move that the Little Rock Annual Conference go on record as requesting the retention of "Onward Christian Soldiers" and the "Battle Hymn of the Republic" in the new hymnal, and that the Secretary of the Annual Conference notify the Hymnal Revision Committee of our vote. Further, I move that Rev. Paulette Purser convene the Reader Consultants of the Little Rock Annual Conference and request that they prepare an instrument for local church action which will allow the local church the opportunity of expressing their individual views. Along with this instrument, lists are to be supplied on hymns to be included, hymns to be excluded and the language changes of which they are aware." This motion passed.

Jim Beal a member of the North Arkansas Conference, extended an invitation to the NA and LR Annual Conferences to meet at Batesville First UMC on November 8, 1986, for a joint called meeting. John Miles made a motion, "We join with the North Arkansas Conference with enthusiasm to Bishop Wilke's call for a joint session of both conferences on November 8, 1986, at Batesville, Arkansas for the purpose of celebrating Arkansas' Sesquicentennial Celebration." The motion carried. The Conference recognized Dr. K. T. Turner of Sierra Leone who brought greetings to the Conference from Africa.

Dr. Hazo Carter, President of Philander Smith College, presented a certificate of appreciation to the Conference for the faithful support of the work of the Black Colleges and for paying 100% of the Black Colleges apportionments.

Bervin O. Caswell brought greetings to the LRAC from the General Board of Discipleship. Jim Argue, Sr. presented the report of the Personnel Committee. Gladwin Connell introduced Chester Jones who has been brought to this Conference as pastor of Hunter UMC in Little Rock and as a part-time Consultant to Ethnic Minority Churches.

Bishop Wilke introduced Jay Lofton who will be the CCOM Director.

Chester Jones spoke to Conference. The Personnel Committee report was approved.

Tyrone Gordon presented the report of the Missional Priority Coordinating Committee. The report was approved.

Gladwin Connell moved the CCOM report be continued in the afternoon. The motion was approved. The Order of the Day was scheduled. The District Superintendents and their wives were presented to the Conference by Bishop Wilke.

The spouses of all pastors serving in the Conference were asked to stand and they were presented to the Conference.

Janice Rogers, Administrative Secretary to the Bishop, was introduced to the Conference. Joe Phillips was called to present the report of the Methodist Children's Home. The report was accepted. Bob Scott made an amendment to the report, "I move that the United Methodist Children's Home be encouraged to: 1. Delay the closing of the Arkadelphia unit of the Home; 2. Make an appeal to the United Methodists of Arkansas to secure the funds needed to keep the home open; 3. To review the admission policy, its interpretation; its application and other related factors, with the purpose of reaching a larger number of chil-

dren and youth with quality loving care." After prolonged discussion a vote was called and there were 210 for and 46 against the motion. The report was accepted as amended.

Joe Wilkerson made a motion, "I move that the Nominations and Personnel Committee place its report on the Conference floor on the first day of the business session and that the vote on the report be voted on at the next day of the business session." The motion passed.

Wednesday Afternoon, June 4, 1986 — 2:00 p.m.

The session opened with the singing of "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus" led by Richard Oliver. Michael Wood offered the prayer.

Gladwin Connell continued with the report of the CCOM. He called on Jim Argue, Jr., to

introduce the University of Arkansas Med Center minister program.

A video "In Defense of Creation" was shown. Bishop Wilke read the Council of Bishops Pastoral letter to all United Methodists and asked that pastors share this letter with their congregations on September 14, 1986, or before. (See reports).

Don Eubanks presented a resolution concerning the American Farm Family Crisis. (See reports). John Miles made an amendment to the report but will be called on another time.

The resolution stood on its own. The resolution was passed.

Sam Albright moved that the Board of Church and Society be adopted. John Miles made a resolution as an addendum to the Farm Family Resolution "Petition the appropriate federal officials to seek a moritorium on the foreclosure of family farms and further, that they seek to make available to the family farmers, low interest loans in the midst of the farm crisis." The report as amended was passed.

The resolution addressed to Arkansas senators (see reports) was approved and the Secretary was instructed to send the resolution to Senator Dale Bumpers and Senator David Pryor. Martin Nicholas presented to the LRAC the "Resolution to the Little Rock Annual Conference Study of the Consultation on Church Union Consensus." Ray Bates made a motion to perfect the resolution. The resolution was accepted with the perfection in the 7th paragraph "And the Little Rock Annual Conference."

A motion was made that the total CCOM report be adopted. The report was approved. A standing ovation was given Gladwin Connell for his four years as Director of the CCOM. James Kirby, Dean of Perkins School of Theology, SMU, acknowledged Beverly Sawyer's

presence and presented his thanks to this Conference for its support of Perkins.

The Bishop recognized the 5 Star churches: Grand Avenue, Hot Springs; Pullman Heights, Hot Springs; Malvern First UMC; Mt. Ida UMC; Piney Grove, Hot Springs (Arkadelphia District); Bearden UMC; Thornton UMC: Dumas Memorial UMC; St. Paul, El Dorado, Harmony Grove UMC; Magnolia First UMC, Silver Hill; Stephens (Camden District); St. John's UMC, Prescott, Nashville; Avery's Chapel, Friendship (Hope District); St. James, Little Rock; Markham, Duncan, New Hope (Little Rock District); Crossett, Dumas, Faustina, Harrell, Hampton, Lake Village, Wilmot Portland Wilmar Circuit, Redfield, Monticello First UMC; Monticello Circuit (Monticello District); Hawley Memorial, Grand Avenue, Stuttgart; White Hall; Union; Mt. Olivet (Pine Bluff District).

## Thursday Morning, June 5, 1986 — 8:15 a.m.

C. E. McAdoo brought the message and the liturgist was Kurt Boggan.

The Bishop called the session to order at 9:00 a.m.

Tom Abney presented the report of the Insurance Committee, David Prothro was called on to give a portion of the report. He reviewed some of the items which appeared in the informational booklet which was mailed to participants in the insurance program

George Frazier, a new Insurance Board member, was introduced to the Conference and Gene Harwood, vice-chairman of the Board, was also introduced. Thanks were extended to churches which are participants in the Frank B. Hall Insurance Company. The Insurance Committee Report was approved.

Allen Bonsall, representing the Trustees of the Conference, presents the report. The report was accepted.

Charles Murry reported on a consultation in St. Louis for pastors of growing churches. John Miles, Bishop Wilke, Tyrone Gordon, George Williams and Charles Murry attended. Ruth Cobb presented the Nominating Committee report. The chairpersons of the Committee on Communications will be a member of the CCOM. This was approved.

The motion by Gary Harrison concerning membership of any established caucus group in the CCOM had a proposed amendment by Jo Ann Miles "I propose an amendment to add two provisions to this motion: 1. That each request must be individually approved by the Little Rock Conference. 2. There be a one year delay in implementation." The motion by Gary Harrison and the amendment by Jo Ann Miles failed.

Nick Evans' motion in reference to CFA membership, as amended by Norman Carter, passed. The vote was 116 for and 114 against.

Joe Wilkerson's motion for a change in the standing rule in regard to the Nominating Committee slate was added as a change to the Standing Rules.

Maxine Waller reporting for Dianne Kinsey made an amendment to the Nominating Committee report substituting Regina Norwood for Marie Watkins, substituting Susan Smith Miles for James Rush, adding BMCR representative, Sandra Crawford and Cabinet representative, Norman Carter. The amendment was approved.

Tyrone Gordon made a motion to amend the Nominating Committee report, "Re: Missional Priority Coordinating Committee. Substitutions on Committee Report for at-large substitute Dick Freer for David Acklin, Box 90, Sparkman, Ark." This amendment was approved. Ruth Cobb moved the adoption of the Nominating Committee report. The report was adopted. Roy Smith presented the report of the Youth ministry. Courtney Niven reported on the activities and progress of the Little Rock Conference youth and also reported on the Youth Service Fund. The report was approved.

The Equitable Salaries report was approved. The Camp Aldersgate Report was accepted. Charles Ashcraft moved the adoption of the CFA report. (see report). Grady May made a motion to amend the CFA report, "I would amend this report of the CFA that the District Superintendent's salary and expenses remain the same as well as Little Rock Conference Council Director." This amendment failed. Billy Martin made a motion, "I move the deletion of XII, page 22 from the CFA report." This motion carried.

Nick Evans made a motion, "I move the following amendment to the report of the CFA: the amount apportioned to the churches in 1987 for Cooperative Parish Ministries shall be \$22,780 and the office of the area directors of Cooperative Parish Ministries and New Church Development shall receive no funding from the Little Rock Annual Conference after June 15, 1987." The amendment failed. John Walker made a motion, "The Committee on Review of the Little Rock Annual Conference shall consider the effectiveness of the Office of Cooperative Parish Ministries and New Church Development. This committee shall report to the next session of the Annual Conference making recommendations concerning the ministries and staff need of this office." This substitute amendment passed.

Dan George made a motion, "Amend page 20 #IV line 11 add the following: 'all giving to Conference "Advance Specials" shall be excluded from the apportionment formula when a local church has paid its apportionments in full.' "This amendment did not pass.

Gene Harwood made a motion for an amendment, "It is moved that the Council on Finance and Administration report be amended to include a statement of recommendation and encouragement to be directed from the Annual Conference to the United States Congressmen and Senators from Arkansas, such statement to be in support of the continuation of tax deferred Individual Retirement Accounts 1. as a means of increasing the financial stability of older Americans, 2. as a means of providing more available funds for church support, charitable contributions, etc., 3. and as a means of keeping faith with the previously understood agreement between the Internal Revenue Service and the United States citizenry." The amendment was approved.

John Hays made a substitute motion concerning the apportionment formula, "That CFA be respectively requested to study the deletion of items #6, 61, 62, 70 and 71 from the ap-

portionment formula." The substitute motion passed.

The CFA report #1 was approved.

CFA report #2 was presented by Biff Averitt concerning the area headquarters long range Planning Committee — called Arkansas Headquarters Committee. Mike Clayton offered an amendment, "CFA Report II - Under section identified the Task, # (2) add the following words 'including feasibility of Conference merger and district realignment.'" This amendment failed. Ann Onstott, Conference Treasurer, gave the treasurer's report. The Annual Conference raised 3.3 million dollars which represents a 92% rate of pay out.

George Tanner reported the EMLC consultation job description.

Roger Armstrong named those churches which received UMRF Awards; Open Country: New Salem, Silver Springs, Rondo, Concord, Sulphur Springs, and Rock Springs; Small Town: St. Paul, Malvern, Bearden, Few Memorial, St. Paul Maumelle, Eudora, Rison/Mt. Carmel; Pastors: Keenan Williams, Helen Jeane Pope, Jerry Rhodes, Richard Lancaster, Tom Abney and David Jones. The Church of the Year: Open Country Church, Rondo; Small Town Church, St. Paul Maumelle; Pastor of the Year, Jeane Pope.

Alvin Murray made a motion concerning Bethel UMC, "On behalf of the Cabinet, I move that the Conference approve the discontinuance of the Bethel Church (Union County) on the Parker's Chapel charge. The remaining congregation members have approved this and so has the Cabinet. The closing will be in keeping with paragraph 2546 of the 1984 Discipline. Approval has also been given by the Camden District Board of Building and Locations." This motion passed. George Tanner, Dean of the Cabinet, set moving day as June 11, 1986. The June salary in full is to be paid to the new pastor.

John Hays issued an invitation to the Little Rock Annual Conference for the 1987 session of Annual Conference to be held at First UMC, Hot Springs. This was unanimously accept-

Mike Campbell, personal privilege, reported an effort would be made by First UMC to replace the sound system in the sanctuary and he also noted with appreciation the many improvements made by First UMC over the last two years.

Charles Settle made the report of the Resolutions Committee. The report was approved.

Richard Oliver led in singing "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing."

The appointments for the coming year were read by Bishop Wilke. Following a prayer by the Bishop the Conference stood to sing, "A Charge to Keep I Have." The 133rd Session of the Little Rock Annual Conference was adjourned with a Benediction by Bishop Wilke.

# VI. Reports

# **Episcopal Address 1986**

Bishop Richard B. Wilke And Are We Yet Alive And see each other's face Glory and thanks to Jesus give for his almighty grace.

What troubles have we seen What mighty conflicts past Fightings without and fears within Since we assembled last.

Never have I been so excited about being a United Methodist! Never in my life have I been so thoroughly enmeshed in the life of the church. Never have I been so proud to be a part of the United Methodist Church as I have been to be part and parcel of the United Methodist Church of Arkansas during this past conference year.

To stand here today, in the middle of Arkansas' Sesquicentennial year — and in the middle of Methodism's sesquicentennial year in Arkansas — brings me pride and delight. I rejoice with you over a thrilling heritage, and I celebrate with you the challenge of an unfolding future.

At the local church level, we are 842 churches strong, 376 in the Little Rock Conference, 466 in the North Arkansas Conference. Last year at this time, I appealed to you to increase your efforts to make disciples, to grow in your Sunday Schools, to start new congregations, and to try to stop our membership decline. You have responded by organizing over 300 new adult Sunday School classes in Arkansas, nearly 150 in the Little Rock Conference, and increasing Sunday School attendance in the Little Rock Conference from 18,066 to 18,504 and in North Arkansas from 21,568 to 21,615.

While we did not yet totally stop our membership decline, which resembles the national averages, we did cut our losses in half in 1985, and we may succeed, even start growing again in 1986.

A year ago, we became a part of a simple but significant challenge. I lifted up a Five Star Plan to

- a) start a new adult class
- b) increase SS attendance by 5%
- c) offer a confirmation or membership training class
- d) receive one person by profession of faith for every 75 members
- e) pay conference apportionments in full.

I cannot tell you how pleased I am to be naming and giving certificates this week to 87 5 star churches, 38 in the Little Rock Conference, and 49 in the North Arkansas Conference. This achievement is remarkable, and does not mention scores of churches who achieved three or four of the challenged goals.

I want to honor those churches with a special breakfast on Thursday morning.

And I want to repeat the challenge for statistical year 1986. If you couldn't do it last year, do it this year, and if you did it last year, do it again. All we need is for each church in Arkansas to receive two persons more into membership this year, and we would be a growing church once again — we are that close.

Incidentally, because I believe so much in the power of the gospel to change and challenge young lives, I am going to change one of the stars in 1987 to a youth challenge. With 75% of America's teenagers not active in church or synagogue, what a mission field for the Methodists.

Financially, it has been our strongest year ever, with more money given for all causes —

a tremendous response to hunger, growing concern for missions, a campaign for new church development in Little Rock Conference and for pensions in North Arkansas. A year and a half into the church development campaign we have given nearly half a million dollars in Little Rock. Two years into the pension campaign, nearly 1½ million dollars have been received in North Arkansas.

In this conference, with new church development as a priority, we have already given \$100,000 to Piney Grove in Hot Springs, and \$100,000 to St. John's in Hope, and both churches are responding with magnificent stewardship, growth and witnessing emphasis. A significant land purchase was made by Highland Valley. Studies are underway in other areas, especially by Few Memorial in Texarkana and in Mountain Harbor at Mt. Ida. Both conferences are declaring the coming year as the Year of the Church School (with a special concern in Little Rock Conference for the Adult Church School.)

Ladies and gentlemen, friends in Christ, I believe we are ready to grow again!

But, there is more, much more. Our institutions are strong and serving the total society. Hendrix College is recognized as one of the top liberal arts, church related colleges in America. The financial campaign to strengthen scholarships, endowments, and building improvements has terrific momentum and will catapult the college into another century — and at a time when many colleges are floundering.

Philander Smith is solvent, strengthening its faculty, growing by 10% a year, sustained by the Black College Fund, by increasing support by alumni. What a ministry Philander has been, especially to young black students, to prepare them for leadership in our church and our society.

I am hoping that many congregations will develop scholarship plans to help students go to United Methodist colleges — and other scholarships to help them go to college at all.

Our Children's Home and our Aldersgate Camp serve people throughout the state and are now models for similar organizations throughout the nation. It is a great time to thrust them forward with financial support. We were thrilled at Aldersgate to receive a \$600,000 grant from the Women's Division, Board of Global Ministries, for respite and day care for special children. The whole nation will be observing this Christ-like work.

Our Camp Tanako stands at a vibrant crossroads. After a year of intensive study, the tragic deaths of two chairmen since we assembled last, the trustees have raised privately the necessary money to dream and design a year-round facility that could be a spiritual life renewal center for children, youth and adults. Ideally located in as beautiful a spot as God ever created, it deserves the enthusiastic support of every Methodist. Tanako could be so significant that it would serve Christians of all denominations, from all over Arkansas and beyond, almost everyday of the year.

Now, I want to speak about our involvement in life. A few people would like for us to be ostriches, hiding our heads in some isolated strip of sand.

With the danger of nuclear holocaust so potentially destructive, do you expect the Methodists to sit in a corner, like little Jack Horner, with our thumb in the pie? No, we are going to be praying, and studying, and debating, and trying to be peacemakers in a violent, nearly out of control world.

With racial justice still incomplete, do you expect the Methodists to rest on faded laurels, just because ethnic peoples can go to school, or eat hamburgers, or sit on the same pew? No. We have work yet to do.

I am thankful for the ministry of Jay Lofton. After five solid years as superintendent of the Conway District, he becomes the first black member of the Little Rock Cabinet, serving as Council Director.

Rev. Chester Jones comes to Hunter Church, the first black pastor of our most clearly defined integrated church. And, after serving as a national consultant to local churches with the Board of Global Ministries, he comes to help us with priority Ethnic Minority Local Church concerns by agreeing to consult with and assist every one of our 42 ethnic churches in Arkansas.

But our dream, and God's dream, is churches that are no longer white or black, but which are made up of people who are saved by the blood of Christ.

Do you expect us to be silent on women's issues? I remember how hard it was to get a gymnasium for our girls to play basketball. Equal pay for equal jobs is still not found everywhere. Condescension for women is rampant in our society. There are some churches that are hesitant to accept a woman as their pastor. A few churches this year refused a carefully thought out appointment of a woman to their pulpits. But churches that have helped to break the mental stereotype are finding joy in a new day when the Holy Spirit works through men and women in ministry. As a bishop, I am thrilled to observe the simply glorious work being done by the women ministers in Arkansas.

The hymnal is creating quite a stir. I'm glad I don't live in a church that walks in locked step like a bunch of goose stepping soldiers. We are discussing, arguing, debating. Some language is blatantly sexist. It is time for us to include men and women as saints of God.

Some images of the more female side of the spirit have not been stressed.

Still, our language is limited. We cannot call God "it" and be satisfied. Our Savior is a man — a very special man — Jesus Christ. But the Church is often referred to as she. Jesus said he would have liked to gather the people as a mother hen gathers her chicks under her wings.

Frankly folks, we're going to make it. Keep the discussion stirring — in love, in prayer. Write the hymnal committee. I'd rather you'd write them than me. And remember that part of our dynamism is in our democracy. And that any change, even modest change, is difficult.

Our concerns for world hunger continue. Long after the rock stars moved on to other projects, and after the TV cameras have gone to other splashy exposes, we will still be supplying cattle and goats and chickens, and providing surplus rice and wheat, and teaching destitute people how to improve their crops and their diets. Arkansas has more compassion on hunger issues than any place I've ever been.

Finally, I want to say a word about the spiritual condition of the family called Arkansas United Methodists.

A spirit pervades this church of ours that is as deep as a river — I've seen you care for one another in life and in death — cancer, the death of a child, tornado, the burning of a church. You care.

I've seen pastors move and churches weep — and wish them well. I've seen a compassion for the poor and a hand reached out to the elderly. I've seen children grasped to your heart.

I am proud to be a part of the historic, sacramental, democratic socially concerned, evangelistically committed people of grace called the Methodists. And Julia and I are most proud and happy in this the year of our Lord, 1986, to be living out our faith and our stewardship of life in the United Methodist Church in Arkansas.

Then, let us make our boast
Of his redeeming power
Which saves us to the uttermost
Til we can sin no more
Let us take up the cross
Till we the crown obtain
And gladly reckon all things loss
So we may Jesus gain.
Amen.

# A Pastoral Letter To All United Methodists In Defense Of Creation:

#### The Nuclear Crisis And A Just Peace

From your brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, the Council of Bishops, to all those people called United Methodist in every land: Grace to you and peace in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

With hearts and minds open to Christ, who is our peace;

In obedience to His call to be peacemakers;

And in response to the biblical vision of a wholistic peace, **shalom**, revealed in Scripture to be God's will and purpose for all of creation:

We, the bishops of The United Methodist Church, have been moved by the spirit of Jesus to send you a message which we have titled In Defense of Creation: The Nuclear Crisis and a Just Peace, a message we believe to be of utmost urgency in our time.

This message has been prepared over a span of two years during which time we have earnestly sought to hear the Word of God through the scriptures. At the same time we have prayerfully and penitently reflected on the continuing buildup of nuclear arsenals by some of the nations. We have become increasingly aware of the devastation that such weapons can inflict on planet Earth. We have watched and agonized over the increase in hostile rhetoric and hate among nations. We have seen the threat of a nuclear confrontation increasing in our world. We have been motivated by our own sense of Christian responsibility and stewardship for the world God created.

This brief pastoral letter is an introduction to a substantial Foundation Document which we have produced as the major portion of our message to the church. In our Foundation Document we have attempted to state with clarity the biblical basis for our concerns and our conclusions about the issue we are addressing. We have set forth a theology for peace with justice in our time which reflects our understanding of the mind and will of Jesus Christ. This theology for a just peace reflects also our understanding of those insights of both pacifism and just war theory which speak with relevance to the issues of the present nuclear crisis.

We write in defense of Creation. We do so because the Creation itself is under attack. Air and water, trees and fruits and flowers, birds and fish and cattle, all children and youth, women and men live under the darkening shadows of a threatening nuclear winter. We call The United Methodist Church to more faithful witness and action in the face of this worsening nuclear crisis. It is a crisis that threatens to assault not only the whole human family but planet Earth itself, even while the arms race itself cruelly destroys millions of lives in conventional wars, repressive violence, and massive poverty.

Therefore, we say a clear and unconditioned No to nuclear war and to any use of nuclear weapons. We conclude that nuclear deterrence is a position which cannot receive the church's blessing. We state our complete lack of confidence in proposed "defenses" against nuclear attack and are convinced that the enormous cost of developing such defenses is one more witness to the obvious fact that the arms race is a social justice issue, not only a war and peace issue.

Our document sets forth a number of policies for a just peace, including such disarmament proposals as a comprehensive test ban, a multilateral and mutually verifiable nuclear weapons freeze and the ultimate dismantling of all such weapons, and bans on all space weapons. However, the nuclear crisis is not primarily a matter of technology: it is a crisis of human community. We encourage independent U.S. and Soviet initiatives to foster a political climate conducive to negotiations. We urge a renewed commitment to building the institutional foundations of common security, economic justice, human rights, and environmental conservation. And we make appeal for peace research, studies, and training at all levels of education.

This message which we are sending to United Methodist people is not meant to be a consensus opinion of our church or a policy statement of our denomination on the nuclear crisis and the pursuit of peace. It is given from the bishops to the church as a pastoral and a prophetic word. It is **pastoral** in that we as bishops will seek to lead the church in study, prayer and action related to this issue and this theme, using this document as a basic resource and guide. It is **prophetic** in that this document is our response to the Word of God. It faithfully states our understanding of that Word to our world at this moment in history.

Our message is the result of many months of prayerful study, research and reflection. It is not given to the church with any feeling that it should be the final word on this issue or with the hope that it will silence all contrary opinions; but rather, we are sending this statement to the church seeking the fullest and fairest possible discussion of our understandings and convictions, together with an honest consideration of different and critical opinions.

Peacemaking is ultimately a spiritual issue. It is a sacred calling of Jesus. All dimensions of church life offer openings for peacemaking: family life, Christian education, the ministry of the laity, pastoral ministry in every respect, political witness, and the great fact of the church as a worldwide company of disciples which transcends all nations, governments, races, and ideologies.

Now, therefore, we ask you, our sisters and brothers, to join with us in a new covenant of peacemaking; to use the Bible together with our Council's Foundation Document as basic resource for earnest and steadfast study of the issues of justice and peace. We call upon each local pastor and lay leader to give leadership in a local church study of the issues surrounding the nuclear threat. We ask you all to open again your hearts, as we open our hearts, to receive God's gracious gift of peace; to become with us evangelists of shalom, making the ways of Jesus the model of discipleship, embracing all neighbors near and far, all friends and enemies, and becoming defenders of God's good creation; and to pray without ceasing for peace in our time.

Now we draw this pastoral letter to a close with prayers for all of you and for all the na-

tions and peoples of the Earth.

We humbly pray that God will accept and use our lives and resources which we dedicate

again to a ministry of peace.

May the love of God, the peace of Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit be among you everywhere and always, so that you may be a blessing to all creation and to all the children of God, making peace and remembering the poor, choosing life and coming to life eternal, in God's own time.

Amen.

## Conference Council On Ministries 1986-87

**Purpose Statement** 

The purpose of the Little Rock Conference, the churches and institutions related to the United Methodist Church within the Conference shall be:

- 1. To communicate the Gospel with the intention of nurturing personal commitment to Jesus Christ and related Christian values.
- 2. To develop support systems and structures which will contribute to the enrichment of life-in-relationship with God, neighbor, family, environment, society and one's self.
- To enable United Methodist Christians to join with others in alleviating human need in ways which lead to self-development and personal achievement.
   To assist the fellowship of people called United Methodists in achieving our purpose, we

understand our function as a Conference to serve:

- 1. As PARTNERS with the local churches in discovering, interpreting, and proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ; serving as the body of Christ; and performing the mission of Christ in His world.
- 2. As PARTNERS with districts, South Central Jurisdiction, and General Church in offering approaches which will enable the identification and implementation of forms of ministries which offer hope and encouragement for the present and future.
- 3. As PARTNERS with other communions in offering approaches which will enable the identification and implementation of ministries which offer hope and encouragement for the present and future.

# Report Of The Personnel Committee, Conference Council On Ministries

The ethnic staff position came into being with the merger of the Little Rock and Southwest Conferences in 1972. It was funded by the "Funds for Reconciliation." The late Reverend John Thompson was the first ethnic staff person appointed. Through the years the position has evolved to where it most recently was titled "Associate Area Director, Conference of the Little Rock and Southwest Conference of the Little Rock

ence Council on Ministries." After considerable prayer and study the Personnel Committee recommended to the Conference Council in session on February 20 that the EMLC position be eliminated. It passed the Council with three dissenting votes.

The Personnel Committee does strongly urge the Bishop and Cabinet to appoint an ethnic person to a position of leadership in the Area or Conference but that the appointment be made on ability and to an existing position and not to an ethnic position. This must be done if we are ever to have open itinerancy.

Our recommendation to the Annual Conference is that the current position be eliminated and that, at the earliest opportunity, an ethnic be appointed to a position of leadership.

## Proposed Church Development: 1987-88 A Year Of Indepth Bible Study

In keeping with the importance of Adult Christian Education and Spiritual Development, and in realizing the importance of Bible study in strengthening the Church School as a whole, we propose that the priority of the Little Rock Annual Conference year 1987-88, be an intentional effort of all churches to hold an indepth study of the Bible. This priority will compliment this year's priority focus; therefore, we propose that the Church Development Conference Priority for 1987-88 be "A Year of Indepth Bible Study."

## Board Of Education 1987

## Purpose

To develop and promote a Conference program of Christian education that gives persons of all ages a knowledge of and experience in the Christian faith and nurture as motivation for Christian service in the Church, the Community, and in the World.

#### Goals

- 1. To assist the DCOM's in training local church leaders to actually do the work of Christian Education in the local church.
- 2. To work with the Coordinating Committee on Camping to provide quality experience in our Conference Camping Ministry; to expand the scope of the camping ministry by at least 5% each year and to affirm the General and Annual Conference priorities.
- 3. To promote the Little Rock Conference Camping Program at Camp Tanako and Lab Training Events at Mt. Sequoyah through the DCOM's and local churches.
- 4. To encourage the observance of Christian Education Sunday and Christian Education Week in each local Church for the purpose of emphasizing the importance of Christian Education. The Christian Education Day offering goal is \$9,000 for 1987.
- 5. To encourage and support the development of Family Life and Single Ministries in the Conference, District, and local churches.
- 6. To encourage continued church school growth through the creation of new church school classes for all age levels.

#### Recommendations

- 1. We urge the United Methodist Curriculum be the basis for Christian Education for all the local churches of our conference. It is our conviction that United Methodist Curriculum is the best material available for Christian Education in United Methodist Churches.
- 2. Believing that it is crucial for the employed Christian Education workers to be trained in the history, doctrine, polity, and literature of United Methodism: we recommend that local churches encourage staff members to seek United Methodist Certification.
- 3. We encourage all local churches to observe the last week in September as Christian Education week.

# Committee On Higher Education & Campus Ministry 1987

One of the primary functions of the Committee on Higher Education and Campus Ministry is to present the financial needs for adequate support of all ministries related to higher education. This includes schools, colleges, seminaries, camp ministries, related to our Conference. Therefore, we present the following recommendations to the Council on Finance and Administration and to the Annual Conference for their consideration and action.

- 1. We recommend that an apportionment of \$170,631 be made to the churches in the Little Rock Conference for the support of Hendrix College for 1987.
- 2. We recommend that the full apportionment as requested be made to the local churches for the Black College Fund.
- 3. We recommend that the full apportionment as requested be made to the local churches for the Ministerial Education Fund.
- 4. We request that an apportionment in the amount of \$150,661 be made to the local churches for the support of Campus Ministries in the Little Rock Annual Conference for 1987.
- 5. We request that an apportionment of \$25,000 be made to the local churches for Philander Smith in 1987.
- 6. We continue the request granted in 1984 that Wesley Foundations be granted permission to conduct "low-key" Capital Fund Campaigns to raise funds for major repairs on Wesley Foundation buildings and parsonages.

# Perkins School Of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas 75275

Since Jurisdictional Conference approval of the "Fair Share Goals" campaign for Perkins and St. Paul's Schools of Theology, virtually every Annual Conference has taken action to adopt the goals. Dean James E. Kirby and staff representatives have visited 40 district meetings to discuss the need for endowment growth to support student scholarship aid, to augment the intern program, and to enhance the quality of education at Perkins.

"We are very pleased with the progress the conferences have made," said Dean Kirby. "We have every reason to believe that a great majority of the goals will actually be raised. The support of the Bishops and other conference leaders has been gratifying to us, due to their efforts and to the fact that people understand that their gifts will help their confer-

ence and the church and well as the seminary."

The Perkins Alumni Loyalty Fund promises to exceed this year's goal of \$90,000, augmented by two challenge grants made by Mrs. Annette Wilkes of Dallas and another made anonymously by a Perkins alumnus. These gifts go towards annual operating budget support of the school, in an amount equal to the proceeds of \$1 million in endowment funds.

Enrollment for the 1985-86 academic year was down from the all-time high of a year ago, with conscious effort to more effectively manage admissions in degree programs other than the Master of Divinity, the basic ministerial degree. Anticipation of revisions of the Doctor of Ministry degree, which was adopted in December to begin in the summer of 1986, kept entrance low in this area. Of a total of 387 enrollments in all Masters programs, 279 are in the M.Div. degree.

New faculty appointments in place for the year included holders of three endowed chairs: the new Lois Craddock Perkins Chair in Homiletics, Dr. James A. Wharton; the LeVan Chair in Worship and Preaching, Dr. William K. McElvaney; and the McCreless Professor of Evangelism, Dr. William J. Abraham. Renewed emphasis on the importance of preaching reflects in these appointments and in the new curricular provision that essentially doubles the preaching opportunities for students.

Active search communities have worked diligently to fill professorial vacancies in New Testament, Old Testament, Church and Society, and the directorship of Bridwell Library, with announcements of appointments anticipated by Conference time.

Perkins this year adopted a four-day class schedule, in response to needs expressed by student pastors and the large number of other students who find it necessary to work while in school. The plan will be evaluated at year's end, to determine the effects. One noticeable change has been in community life, where time for "extra" meetings has been limited. Despite the apparent difficulty, very effective emphasis weeks have been held by Women students, Hispanic and International students, and by Black Seminarians.

The diversity of the student body is evidenced by the presence of seventeen denominational groups, of twenty-seven international students from fifteen nations, of one-third women and two-thirds men students in the Masters programs. Fourteen Merit Scholars, selected for academic and personal qualities pursued their studies with support grants conferred by the school from special gift funds.

Continuing Education took new shape with wide expansion of offerings within categories of Spiritual Formation, Conflict Management, and Stewardship training. Two Liturgy and Lectionary Workshops were offered for the Advent and Lenten seasons. And pilot programs for Lay Academies were held, leading to scheduling of some twenty week-end study opportunities for laypersons to be held in as many cities during 1986-87, coordinated by a Lay Advisory Committee.

A newly formed Executive Board made up of Trustees of S.M.U. and other lay and minis-

terial leaders held an effective meeting in early 1986, with additional sessions planned periodically.

**Hendrix College** 

A little more than 100 years ago the Methodists of Arkansas gave birth to Hendrix College. The college continues to acknowledge this heritage and appreciate Methodist support. It desires to strengthen its relationship to present day United Methodist of Arkansas.

We hope to do this in two ways:

1. By pursuing excellence without becoming elitist. It is true that the college seeks those students who have high grade point averages and ACT rankings. We have done very well with this thrust. In the freshman class of 1985-86 there were 19 merit scholars and 19 merit finalists, with 56 percent of the class in the top ten percent of their high school graduating class. The ACT score for the freshman class was 24.5, and the grade point average was 3.57.

But the vast majority of the students are those who are better than average in their grade points, their leadership potential, and their general citizenship. The college attempts to take these students and expose them to the best possible educational experi-

ences, equipping them to be better servants.

2. By making direct contributions to the church. In the present student body, 72 percent of the students receive some form of financial aid, with many of them being United Methodist. In the year just closing, the college gave \$105,000 in tuition grants to dependents of ministers and to ministerial students, a direct benefit to the local church's ministerial support package. Moreover, the faculty and staff of Hendrix preach and teach in local churches across the state on a regular basis. Several students pastor churches. The college welcomes the church groups that use the facilities for the various conferences, assemblies, and schools it holds annually on campus.

Enrollment and Tuition: For the 1985 fall enrollment there were nearly 100 more students who made application for admission than ever before in the history of the college. That increase in application interest is running equally high for the fall of 1986, although we have no plans to extend enrollment much beyond 1,000 total. In the fall of 1985, we admitted 995 students, about equal numbers of male and female; 90 percent from Arkansas, 5.2 percent black, 37 percent United Methodist, 353 freshmen, 24 transfers, 16 foreign students from ten counties; 80 percent live in college housing; 409 courses and 23 majors are offered. There is a faculty/student ratio of 15 to 1. In 1985-86 there were 27 ministerial students. Over 60 percent of the graduates of Hendrix go on to graduate or professional schools. Tuition for the 1986-87 school year will be \$4,500; board and room cost averaging an additional \$2,000.

Faculty: By every measure, the Hendrix faculty is the strongest ever. Of the 60 full-time and 11 part-time faculty, 70 percent hold doctorates; 88 percent have appropriate terminal degrees. They represent a broad background of cultural and educational experiences. They bring great commitment to their chosen profession and are devoted to their students.

Education and General Budget for the 1986-87 year is approximately \$8 million. The tuition each student pays provides only 55 percent of the cost of their education. Another 30 percent comes from unrestricted endowment income, and the remaining 15 percent comes from annual fund gifts. The apportionment gifts of \$265,182 in 1985 from the United Methodist Churches in Arkansas made up 33 percent of this annual fund budget.

The Campaign For Hendrix: In the early spring we had reached some \$4 million, or onethird of our tentative \$12 million identified need to move us into the opening years of this second century with the kind of strengths Hendrix has come to expect. This extremely important program is off to a good start. The Church Division in that effort has a goal of \$425,000 for the state. Because the Conferences are involved in other important fund-raising projects this goal, by design, is small. Yet the college and leadership in the Conferences believe it would be wrong not to give the United Methodists of Arkansas the opportunity to be a part of this effort to enhance the Hendrix tradition as we move into the second century. This challenge will be presented to the churches on a non-apportioned, free will basis. Committees have been organized in each of the 13 districts and are working on strategies. This fall individual United Methodists and individual United Methodist Churches will be challenged to make three-year pledges to this \$12 million need.

Recognitions: During the past year, the college has received a number of recognitions. A study by the Great Lakes College Association of the percentage of graduates of over 1500 institutions who went on to the Ph.D. in a period ending in 1980, established that Hendrix was 99th overall and 46th in the humanities Ph.D.s. The college was once again listed in the Competitive Colleges and was listed in a new book by the education editor of New York Times, The Best Buys in College Education. A follow-up article in Seventeen magazine that identified the 12 best buys in the country listed Hendrix. Other follow-up articles that mentioned Hendrix by name: the Cleveland Plain Dealer, the Washington Post, and This World. The author of Best Buys was interviewed on CNN and specifically mentioned Hendrix College. The Hendrix choir was featured in Bishop Wilke's Christmas TV program, as well as having an outstanding European tour last summer.

The Church gave the college life in its beginning, and it continues to do so. The college desires to fulfill the mission the church gave it; to excel in "the uniting of knowledge and vi-

tal piety" in the lives of those who come under the college's influence.

# Philander Smith College Little Rock, Arkansas

Philander Smith College, founded in 1877, again, welcomes the opportunity to report, this year, some of its achievements and concerns for the past year.

During the 1985 Fall Term, enrollment increased by 5 percent over the 1984 Fall Term. The headcount enrollment for the Fall of 1984 was 544 and 571 for the Fall of 1985. Over a three-year period, 1983, 1984, and 1985, headcount enrollment increased by 22 percent.

Improvements continue to be made in the academic area. The academic program by the addition of new, highly qualified faculty members, the implementation of an honors program, and weekly assembly programs an improved academic advising system, and a required computer literacy course. Night classes have been increased by 50 percent.

Three micro-computer instructional laboratories have been installed for Developmental Education, Business Economics and Mathematics Computer Science. Micro-Computers have also been installed in the Library. Retention is in evidence by the fact that the number of students graduating increased by 6 percent over a two-year period. Insufficient financial aid for deserving students continues to be a major concern at the College.

Fund-raising continues to be a major priority. In October, the Development Office completed its first six months of operation as a fully staffed, adequately, functioning unit. Over 40 percent of the College's 1.47 million dollars Annual Fund Campaign has been raised or pledged. Two significant grants were received in 1985-86: \$246,500 from Little Rock City Trust and \$225,000 from Village Square Limited Partnership, Inc., Little Rock.

The College's Business and Industry Cluster Program has significantly increased the college involvement in the business community. Thirty-five businesses are now involved in the Cluster Program. Over \$40,000 in wages have been earned by the College's students through the Cluster. The Cluster membership has contributed cash, equipment, and numerous educational seminars. Moreover, the membership serves as ambassadors of goodwill for the College, especially in the business community.

Approximately, \$200,000 in computer hardwares and softwares, supported by federal

funds, have been placed into operation. The administration is now using a PDP 11-44 Digital Computer for fiscal affairs, registration and financial aid.

The College continues to implement a program of sound fiscal responsibility. It ended the past fiscal year with a small surplus of funds. The North Central Association in accepting an annual report from the College made the following statement: "The general fiscal management seems to be on a sound basic ..." Computerized general ledger and student billing systems, installed in the Fall of 1985, are greatly facilitating business office operation and providing relevant information for decision making.

In student services, a new Dean of Students is providing quality leadership. Residence halls received additional renovation, including the decoration of the women's lounge and the establishment of a lounge in the men's dormitory. Adequate counseling is provided through the Human Development Center. The Collegiate Chorale has performed in several United Methodist Churches as well as other places during the year. The Varsity Basketball Team had a good year, winning over 50 percent of its games. The Varsity Volleyball Team was crowned champion of Inter-Regional Athletic Conference.

### United Methodist Children's Home, Inc.

The UNITED METHODIST CHILDREN'S HOME is currently going through a period of testing, of adjustment, and of a consequent preservation and progress in services to children and their families. As a place of sanctuary for neglected, abused, abandoned or otherwise needy girls and boys, the Home is a powerful expression of the mission and ministry of the United Methodist Church in Arkansas.

During the past few years, major changes have occurred in this state and across the nation in the field of child care. Since the vast majority of the UMCH residents have been referred through the courts, the Home is directly effected by an act of the federal government that orders state social service agencies to make, within 18 months, permanent plans for children in their custody. This act also directs juvenile judges to explore all alternatives before a child can be removed from its home. As a result, children who must be relocated due to a highly unfavorable family atmosphere, are moving through the residential child care facilities, such as the Children's Home, at a much faster pace. Today, the average length of stay is about 15 months. A major goal of the new federal act is to counsel children and families in their own home in lieu of removing the child from the parent's custody. Three years ago, when the Home's professional staff and service delivery committee prepared its Five-Year Plan, family counseling was named as one of the top priorities in the 10-point program. The Home had foreseen the trend well in advance and is already performing this function. There is still the major need for specialization which will require continuing residential child care accommodations. Again, as the Home prepared for the future, specialized activities were included in their planning.

The adolescent transitional living program was initiated in 1984 and has received local and national recognition for its success. As residents reach the age of 16½, the Home provides a living environment similar to that soon to be encountered as they reach the age of majority. Emphasis is placed on education, home, the job and social interaction. The Children's Home makes every effort to ready them for a productive young adulthood.

Last December 1, an Emergency/Reception Center was opened on the Little Rock campus. The shelter is providing care, on a short term emergency basis, to dependent/neglected girls, ages 13 through 17. The facility accommodates 6 to 8 youth. In addition to the emergency care, each individual's needs are being evaluated to determine the teen's ability to return to her home or to function within the guidelines of the United Methodist Children's Home or another long-term residential child care agency.

As the Home updates its Five-Year plan, it is paying particular attention to the trend that indicates that, within the next few years, the children needing residential care will, primarily, be in their teens and will have greater emotional and behavioral problems. They will need a structured environment and specialized services through private agencies such as your Children's Home.

In mid-April, representatives of the Council on Accreditation of Services for Families and Children, a national organization, conducted a thorough on-site evaluation of the Home's operation. This carries the Home one step closer to becoming a fully accredited member-agency of the Child Welfare League of America. The initial qualifying requirements for membership and the maintenance of the rigid standards of excellence signify continuing high quality child care, long a hallmark of the United Methodist Children's Home.

Last year, 172 youngsters resided at the Home for varying periods of time, accounting for 29,567 child care days. Their average age is slightly less than 14 years. Approximately 75% of the residents are female. For the girls and boys referred to the Home through Arkansas Social Services, the state provides \$300 per child each month for room and board. The actual cost to care for each child is approximately \$1,500 a month. The \$1,200 difference between the room and board payment and actual cost must be made up through various sources of income to the Home. Contributions from the United Methodist constituency in both Conferences is a major source of the needed revenue.

Although individual cash donations to the Home in 1985 reflected a 4% increase over the previous year, there has been a short-fall in the predicted income from other sources, over which the home had no control. This situation has dictated a major reduction in expenditures throughout the Home's system. Every avenue has been explored in the trimming of operational expenses in an effort to bring them in line with the latest projection of income for the remainder of the fiscal year.

On May 20, at their annual spring meeting, the Home's Board of Directors, following the proposal of Administrator Joe R. Phillips, Jr. and the recommendations of the executive and finance committees, voted to terminate the operation of the group homes in Arkadelphia. The decision of the Board is based not only on the mid-year review of the Home's financial status but also on the persisting reduction of the number of children being served in Clark County.

Other economy measures already enacted include a reduction of support and personnel and the cancellation of some support services. There has not been, nor will there be, any curtailment of the child care programs now in effect at the Little Rock, Magnolia and Searcy homes.

The administration and representatives on the Board of Directors are closely watching existing conditions and will take all necessary action to maintain the strong institutional integrity that has existed for over 84 years.

Public support and understanding are solicited as the Home adjusts to these current economic problems and the changes in services to children in need of the Home's care. The Home's ministry is characteristic of the concerns of the United Methodist Church. In this, the sesquicentennial year, the Home renews its commitment as a vital arm of the Church. With everyone's help, the Home will continue to meet the perplexing challenge in today's society; the plight of the increasing number of children and youth whose lives have been disrupted.

Hunger begins as girls and boys in Arkansas starve for love, affection and acceptance. They are victims of human-made disasters when the living conditions in their own home crumbles. Hands must be extended across Arkansas in support of this institution's efforts. Regardless of the amount of time the child is entrusted to the Home's care, he or she will always remember that the United Methodist Church opened a window of hope for their future.

Camp Tanako Long Range Development Plan

First, I thank you for giving the Camp Tanako board the opportunity last year to raise some money to prepare a master plan for future development of our camp. You gave us your approval to raise \$25,000 and I am very pleased to announce that in both pledges and cash, we have attained that goal.

This is especially meaningful due to the losses we have suffered within the last year of both our board president, Beck Tyre, who died very shortly after annual conference and then the death of Gene Cobb, our last president, only several months ago.

As most of you know, last year we hired Dr. Ken Bailey of Opinion Research out of Tulsa, to help us with a market survey. Dr. Bailey is the Bailey of the Bailey Poll which I am sure all of you have seen in the newspapers recently. With a lot of input from our Long Range Planning Committee and the board, Dr. Bailey came up with a market survey which asked for the recipient's opinions on every aspect of Camp Tanako; from food service to spiritual atmosphere, cabin conditions to programming, and asked as well, for opinions concerning what future facilities would be desirable, or not desirable, for us to consider in a long range plan.

The market survey was mailed to approximately 1500 persons, including ministers, lay leaders, youth directors, campers and the general Methodist population of our conference. We got a very good response, and everything that you will see in the brochure now being handed out to you is a result of that survey. There is a complete copy of the survey results at the conference office and everyone is welcome to take a look at it.

The final summary report of the Long Range Development Plan is not yet complete, but should be in the very near future. The brochure you are now receiving has been in our possession only since last Friday afternoon, so it is fresh off the press. We may be rushing it a bit, presenting you with this brochure at this time, but we want to keep you as fully informed as we can. There are Camp Tanako board members who are seeing this brochure for the first time right now.

Obviously, this is a very ambitious plan. Should we be able to complete the first phase, the new cabins, Camp Tanako will be improved greatly, and I would be proud of that accomplishment alone. Yet, think what a showplace we would have, what a fine camp, to be the hub not only of our conference camping, but of most major conference activities for young and old alike.

Again, this is a progress report. The task of the Camp Tanako board is to develop a plan to raise the funds necessary to bring this dream into reality. We will be talking with many of you in the next year, developing a program to present here in 1987 to do just that.

We appreciate your support and we appreciate any ideas you may have that will help us in formulating our tactics to assure the success of this plan, and to assure that Tanako will have a long and fruitful life in the service of the Little Rock Conference.

### **Commission On Religion And Race**

Last year our report came before you and identified some real concerns which we felt and feel must be addressed if we are to make any headway toward true inclusiveness as defined by our Church. We also briefly outlined the actions we planned to take to begin the process of assessing our Conference as we all work for inclusiveness. We indicated we would survey all bodies and from our responses and evaluations, three to five bodies would be chosen for monitoring.

In the fall, 1985 Conference Council on Ministries meeting, 42 Racial Inclusiveness Surveys were hand delivered or mailed to Conference body chairpersons. Though numerical responses were a little disappointing, we are pleased to report that some responses reflected genuine concern for moving in a direction of inclusiveness, not only in the agencies themselves, but in the activities of the agencies as well.

Several agencies, however, indicated they have not taken any steps to insure provisions whereby ethnics are placed on the agencies or included intentionally, in their programming. Most indicated a perceived lack of control in the make-up of their bodies, since their membership is recommended by the Nominations and Personnel Committee. And, all with budgets, except one indicated no insight into how their funded line items could be used to promote inclusiveness.

Some of our problems relative to inclusiveness occur because we are not sufficiently familiar with and sensitive to matters of racism to recognize them when they occur. Recognizing this need the Council of Bishops and the General CORR are sponsoring a National United Methodist Convocation on Racism to provide a forum for a mid-decade assessment of the progress of the United Methodist Church in the United States of America in combatting racism and to present ways in which racism manifests itself and impacts upon the lives of millions of people throughout the globe. It is their desire to involve fifteen persons in positions of power and influence in the church and society who are capable of initiating change in racist patterns in their local situations, to attend this Convocation.

- 1. To co-sponsor with the North Arkansas Conference a Minority Self-Determination Workshop on November 1, 1986
- 2. To identify and involve more people as associates in the work of the Commission
- 3. To monitor actions and progress of the Missional Priority Coordinating Committee, the Nominations and Personnel Committee and the Cabinet

- 4. To identify fifteen influential individuals to participate in the National Convocation on Racism September, 1987, and
- 5. To sponsor a sensitization workshop for the Little Rock Cabinet before December, 1987

Board Of Church & Society

The Little Rock Conference Board of Church & Society plans to have a workshop titled "Ministry to Farm Families in Crisis." The workshop is to develop, define and refine skills necessary for coping with the stress and grief primarily that is associated with the changes brought to the rural communities of our state due to the present economic situation. Providing tools to not only assist our ministers but also community leaders, and the farm families themselves, broadening our ministry beyond the minister on the local level.

#### Resolution

The Rural Crisis continues to impact the lives of persons and devastate communities. The Rural Crisis is a national crisis with its greatest impact in the heartland of the nation. The Dakotas, Minnesota, Iowa, Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma and Arkansas are experiencing severe crisis in rural communities.

Because the United Methodist Church is a church of the land, and people are suffering in the midst of the Rural Crisis, the United Methodist Church must be involved in mission/ministry in a time of transition.

The 1984 General Conference of the United Methodist Church, in a statement on agricultural and rural life issues, called for action:

- Develop appropriate programs which educate on the inter-relatedness of urban and rural interests.
- 2. Engage in ministries to rural America which will aid in resolving the issues outlined in this resolution.
- 3. Devote their best scholarship to a theology of the land.
- 4. Redress the unjust imbalance in the distribution of funds between rural and urban ministries.

Therefore, the Little Rock Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, joins with the other Annual Conferences in the Heartland region to petition the National Division of the Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church to call a consultation, with representatives from the conferences in the heartland, to develop and implement a plan to create a Rural Center in Kansas City to serve this region.

#### Petition

The appropriate federal officials to seek a moritorium on the foreclosure of family farms and further they seek to make available to the family farmers, low interest loans in the midst of the farm crisis.

#### Resolution

WHEREAS, the Charitable Contributions Law (CCL), which passed Congress as part of the Economic Recovery Tax Act in 1981, giving all taxpayers, including non-itemizers, the opportunity to deduct their contributions to charitable organizations, expires December 31, 1986; and

WHEREAS, tax reform as proposed by the Senate Finance Committee does not continue this opportunity; and

WHEREAS, we are living in an era of Federal budget cuts which are shifting the burden of providing many human services from government financed programs to voluntary programs; and

WHEREAS, experts estimate that charities will lose \$6 billion due to lower marginal tax

rates, and an additional \$6 billion due to the loss of the non-itemizer deduction, and these losses will be suffered as we attempt to provide more needed services due to cut-backs; and

WHEREAS, the contributions deduction for all Americans, not just the wealthy, is a proper incentive to encourage support of worthwhile causes that improve the quality of life in our nation, and since the inception of the income tax, Congress has wisely exempted from tax assets that are given to causes in the public good rather than consumed for personal benefit; and

WHEREAS, justice dictates that the same public policy encouragement exist for the three out of every four taxpayers who do not itemize as it does for those with incomes warranting itemization; then

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Little Rock Conference of The United Methodist Church supports legislation which provides for the charitable deduction for all taxpayers, and commends Senator Bumpers for his co-sponsorship of Senate Bill 361, which would achieve this purpose.

### Resolution To The Little Rock Annual Conference Study Of The Consultation On Church Union Consensus

Whereas, issues of Christian unity confront us at all levels of the church life; and

Whereas, United Methodists have traditionally been in the forefront of ecumenical advances; and

Whereas, the United Methodist Church is a founding member of the Consultation on Church Union which on November 30, 1984 adopted the final revision of IN QUEST OF CHRIST UNITING, now entitled THE COCU CONSENSUS; and

Whereas, the theological document COCU CONSENSUS will be presented for a vote of acceptance to the General Conference of the United Methodist Church in 1988; and

Whereas, the COCU document, COVENANTING TOWARD UNITY, is now presented for study and revisions to participating denominations;

Therefore, be it resolved that:

The Little Rock Annual Conference, through the Conference Council on Ministries and the Conference Chairperson on Christian Unity and Interreligious Concerns, appoint a task force to study these two documents and report to the General Commission on Christian Unity and Interreligious Concerns; and the 1987 Little Rock Annual Conference.

Each district encourage study of the two documents in the churches and that the superintendents be asked to chose two churches from each district to study and report to the GCUIC:

The two documents be studied as widely as possible throughout the annual conference in anticipation of the deliberations of the 1988 General Conference;

And, in order to develop awareness, the Board of Worship investigate the possibility of a COCU worship for the 1987 Annual Conference.

### Board Of Global Ministries 1987

#### Purpose

To serve as a linkage between local churches, districts, the Annual Conference, the Jurisdictional Council on Ministries and the General Board of Global Ministries, providing for global functions related to the objectives and scope of the General Board of Global Ministries.

#### Goals

 To interpret the nature of and Biblical and theological mandates for global mission, making mission education and cultivation opportunities available to all persons in the Little Rock Annual Conference and enlisting persons in missions. (Committee on Education and Cultivation) 2. To interpret and support Parish and Community Development, increasing total membership, ethnic membership, community service and development, and participation in Cooperative Parish Ministry. (Parish and Community Development Committee)

3. To interpret and increase financial support of the Missional Priority, Special Programs related to global ministries, and Advance Specials. (Parish and Community Development Committee, World Hunger Committee, Education and Cultivation Committee, Church Development Committee)

4. To interpret, increase and implement financial support of Health and Welfare Ministries (Health and Welfare Committee)

### Recommendations to CFA

- We recommend the \$40,000 apportionment for Special Church Extension be continued.
- We recommend the \$12,000 for Regular Church Extension in Conference Benevolences be continued.
- We recommend the Saint Paul School of Theology be allowed to solicit gifts in the Little Rock Annual Conference for the endowment of a chair in Parish Ministries.
- We recommend \$50,000 be requested from the churches in "Fair Share" goals for "Core Costs" at Aldersgate, and the "Programmatic Costs" be continued as a Conference "Advance Special."

# IV. APPORTIONMENT FORMULA:

The decimal will be a conference decimal, with each church weighed against the conference total.

### VIII. ALDERSGATE "FAIR SHARE":

We recommend \$50,000 be requested from the churches in "Fair Share goals for core costs" at Aldersgate, and that "programmatic costs" be continued as a Conference Advance Special.

### IX. CHRISTIAN CIVIC FOUNDATION:

We recommend \$12,500 be requested from the local churches in "Fair Share" goals for the Christian Civic Foundation in 1987.

#### X. PERKINS/ST. PAUL FAIRSHARE:

We recommend \$63,060 be requested from the local churches in "Fair Share" goals for the Perkins-St. Paul Campaign for 1987.

#### XI. OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS — We recommend that:

- A. Apportionments for Ethnic Minority Local Churches be accepted by every local Church and that 50% of the Missional Priority Fund be retained for use in the Conference. We recommend that the World Hunger goal of \$300,000 be retained.
- B. Pastor's Utilities and Appurtenances: If no utility allowance is made, we recommend that the local churches designate a part of the salary as Parsonage Utilities and Appurtenances to exempt those costs from income taxes.
- C. The contract between the Committee on the Annual Conference and First United Methodist Church — Hot Springs be approved. The contract sets a flat payment of \$2,400 for the cost of the 1987 session of the Annual Conference.
- D. The Travel Allowance remain at \$.20 per mile plus \$.02 per mile for each additional person, to encourage car pooling.
  - E. Retired Ministers be paid \$35 per diem for days they attend Annual Conference.
- F. Pastor's Moving Expense be paid at the rate of \$300 plus \$.75 per mile, effective January 1, 1987. The mileage is to be paid from parsonage to parsonage, with one exception. When transferring from another conference, the rate will apply from parsonage to the Little Rock conference boundary. The policies for application for Pastor's Moving Expense Funds are listed in the 1982 JOURNAL, page 127, Section 12II(F).
  - G. All unrestricted benevolence funds be placed in a central operating balance.
- H. "Interest Income" from investments, with the exception of the income earned from Church Development Funds, continue to go into the Conference Administration Fund.
  - I. Any Conference employee who has, or who desires, a tax sheltered annuity, may direct

the Director of Finance & Management to pay this annuity from his regular income following proper guidelines.

J. That housing allowances (for persons receiving such funds) be set at the estimated actual expense as reported to the conference or local church. This information should be reported at the beginning of each calendar year. This will result in a reallocation in the funds paid to such persons and will not increase the total amount paid.

K. Each board, commission, committee or agency not be allowed to change a line item in its approved budget which would exceed 10% of the amount without the approval of the

Council on Finance & Administration.

L. The latest independent audits shall be submitted for review and study by any agency receiving conference funds.

M. Wesley Foundations may solicit funds within their supporting Districts after approval is given by the proper District Council on Ministries.

N. \$2,500 be paid from Conference Benevolence balances to the ARCHIVES & HISTORY CENTER as a one-time grant.

O. Local Church Administrative Boards consider paying all Conference Life and Health Insurance (DBP & HMEP) premiums directly, above salary, in order to provide tax savings for pastors and other church employees. If necessary or desirable, the salary may be reduced by the same amount. This policy must be consistently applied to all employees.

P. Participation by the Conference in Area Programs must not exceed 50% of the cost of that program, with exceptions approved by the Council on Finance & Administration.

Q. The funds for the Missional Priority be placed in the Council on Ministries Director.

R. The management and investment of all the monies of/from all those boards and agencies which receive monies from the Conference or line item apportionments must be handled by the Area Treasurer's office.

S. Any capital asset purchase over \$1,500 must be approved by the Council on Finance & Administration prior to purchase, even if that budget has been previously approved.

T. Permission be granted to the Area Treasurer to borrow funds (on a short-term basis) from the Arkansas Area account if Little Rock Conference funds are not sufficient to meet current needs. Both Council on Finance & Administration presidents must approve the loan before it is transacted.

Interest on such loan will be paid at the current money market rate.

U. The Conference provide fidelity bonding insurance for all local churches in compliance with Paragraph 2510 of the 1984 BOOK OF DISCIPLINE.

V. The Board of Trustees of Camp Tanako be allowed to raise \$25,000 from sources other than local church budgets for the development of a Master Development Plan to be presented in 1987.

W. The amount of \$25,178.50 be expended from Conference Benevolence fund balances to purchase a mini-computer to be used in the conference offices.

X. A uniform percentage "pad" of five percent (5%) will be added to all 1987 apportion-

# XII. RECOMMENDATION TO THE DISTRICT COUNCIL ON MINISTRIES:

RECOGNIZING a need for greater commitment in both the financial support and acceptance of the Little Rock Conference Program and Budget at the local church level,

AND recognizing that the meeting of this need can be better facilitated through better communication to and education of the membership and leadership of the local churches of the Conference

AND recognizing that the strongest link that exists between the Conference and the local church is the District Superintendent's office as it monitors both,

WE RECOMMEND to the District Council on Ministries the formation of District Teams who:

Will have membership consisting of clergy and lay leadership of that district;

2. Work in consultation with the District Superintendent, Pastor and local church, upon invitation of the above, in the individual churches;

3. Have as a resource the Conference Council on Finance & Administration:

- 4. Work to facilitate acceptance and support of the Conference Budget and Program through:
- a. Educating the local churches concerning the nature of the Conference Administration and Program.
  - b. Interpretation of the Conference Budget and Program.

# REPORT II AREA HEADQUARTERS COMMITTEE

### The Recommendation

We recommend to the Annual Conference that the Bishop appoint an Area Headquarters Long-Range Planning Committee. It shall be called the Area Headquarters Committee (AHC).

The Membership

The Committee shall be composed of ten persons, of which five shall be from each Conference. There shall be a chairperson, vice-chairperson, secretary, two representatives of each Council on Finance and Administration, one representative of each Conference Board of Trustees, a lawyer and a realtor. Ex-Officio Members shall be the Resident Bishop, Area Treasurer, Conference Council on Ministries Director of each Conference, and a representative of Cokesbury Bookstore.

#### The Task:

The AHC shall be charged with the following tasks:

- 1. Evaluate the current needs of the Headquarter facilities.
- 2. Determine future needs for the next five, ten, and fifteen years.
- 3. Consult with First United Methodist Church as to their projected rent and parking space available through the year 2000.
- 4. Develop a plan to provide the space needed and cost involved for the Conference.
- 5. Study the possibilities of purchasing property, (such as location, cost, size, square footage, and the possible building we might build.)
- Study leasing office space in the greater Little Rock Area and its advantages and disadvantages.
- Present to the Annual Conference a proposal for the best option to meet our needs now and in the future.

The Time-Line And Enabling Legislation

We currently do not have a lease signed by the church or the CFAs. Therefore, we will operate from year to year. We, therefore, request the AHC to report preliminary plans to the 1987 Annual Conference with their projected time-line of action from that point on. In the event that First United Methodist Church chooses to evict us, we ask AHC to immediately meet and develop contingency plans and that a Special Call Session of the Annual Conference be called to act upon these plans, until long-range plans have been approved. Similar legislation is being proposed to each Conference and in the event of differences we ask permission for the Executive Committees of the CFA to work them out.

The Funding Of This Committee

We request the Conference to authorize up to \$5,000 each, from their Contingency Funds already apportioned, to fund the study, and plans which may need to be drawn up and presented to the Conference as well as the Committee's expenses.

And New Church Development

Conference year 1985-1986 has been a period of transition in the Area Office, having gone from a single focus on cooperative parish ministries to including a parallel thrust of new church development. Cooperative parish ministry is doing together what we cannot do alone, and the effort to start new churches has a similar characteristic — the conference, district, and local churches working together to make new disciples and establish new congregations. It has been an exciting year to see new ministries emerge and to see the potential for new churches being pursued.

I. Cooperative Parish Ministries is still strong in Arkansas, and we still lead the country in varieties of models of ministries under the leadership of our parishes.

A. One very promising movement is underway as several parishes are redefining their purpose from existence to ministry. Churches which were once concerned with survival are now reaching out with renewed spirit to touch the lives of persons in District Committees in making these become a reality.

- B. Training events for pastors and laity of new churches has been and will be, a regular part of the leadership development process in church growth. Long-range planning and stated purposes are essential to steady progress.
- C. The L.R.C. Third-Century Pioneer Development Fund has gotton off to a great start. Gifts designated in advance have been made to the new congregation at Hope, to the Piney Grove U.M.C., and as of February 28, 1986 there is \$145,907.66 in the fund.
- D. In North Arkansas the Catch the Vision program to fund new developing congregations is off to an excellent beginning. Several churches have met or exceeded their goal for participants, and some churches have pledged their goal outright! The Vision is indeed contagious.
- E. Goals for 1987:
  - (1) To start at least one church in the North Arkansas Conference.
  - (2) To select and purchase a new site in West Little Rock, Little Rock Conference.
  - (3) Select future pastors of new congregations and provide initial training.
  - (4) Develop or redevelop a congregation in Texarkana.
  - (5) Possible strengthening of a church in the Joplin Area.

#### II. Other Activities

- A. The Director of the Area Office CPM/NCD will continue to serve as liaison with Perkins School of Theology in its Intern Program.
- B. The Director will continue to serve on the National Network of Town and Country Ministries to maintain awareness of the needs of smaller membership churches and the rural and open county churches.
- C. The Director will continue to offer limited consultation services on site and physical plant needs to Area congregations (as time permits!).
- D. The Director will continue to assist the Bishop and the Cabinet(s) in the appointment of Clergy to Cooperative Parish settings and to new church responsibilities.

#### COOPERATIVE PARISH MINISTRIES

In 1977 both the North Arkansas and Little Rock Conferences designated "parish development" as one of three priorities. In September of the same year an Area Task Force on Parish Development convened to begin planning for the future. The Task Force identified strategic components of parish development and the Task Force became known as the "Bishop's Committee on Parish Development."

The committee presented a proposal to the two annual conferences in 1979. The proposal was revised and adopted. Victor Nixon was appointed Area Director of Cooperative Parish Ministries. In 1980, the annual conferences approved the Area policy which provided for an Area Committee on Cooperative Parish Ministries. This plan became an authoritative model of cooperative ministries throughout United Methodism.

In 1983, Louis Averitt was appointed Area Director of Cooperative Parish Ministries. Under his leadership we were led to understand our goal as promoting cooperation as the United Methodist way of doing ministry.

Ron Clark became the area director in 1985 with the new title of Area Director of Cooperative Parish Ministries and New Church Development. The Conference year of 1985-86 has thus been a year of transition in the Work of the Area Committee of Cooperative Parish Ministries.

This brief history of Cooperative Parish Ministries in Arkansas indicates the development of the work and the new directions we are headed. Some questions arise. The area committee suggests that no policy statement changes be made this year but that at conference 1987 it bring a recommendation as to whether the dual responsibilities of cooperative parish ministries and new church development be included in an area committee's responsibility.

In addition the following goals for 1987 are recommended:

- 1. That existing parishes evaluate their current status and their programs/ministries.
- 2. Leadership training be provided for staff and laity parish council members.
- 3. An area newsletter be produced.

# The South Central Jurisdiction Of The United Methodist Church

The purpose of the South Central Jurisdictional Council on Ministries is to respond to needs and requests originating with Annual Conference Councils on Ministries. In 1985 the following areas of ministry were implemented:

THE FARM CRISIS: The Jurisdictional Council on Ministries requested that the Council of Bishops issue an appeal to the President and Congress of the United States urging steps to alleviate problems related to the farm crisis. The Council at its fall meeting in Wichita, Kansas responded with a strong statement encouraging action in two areas — the farm credit system and rural human service projects.

VOLUNTEERS IN MISSION: A Jurisdictional workshop was held in April with 241 persons present. In 1985 over 160 work groups and teams involving more than 2,100 people served on short-term work projects in Latin America, Mexico, the islands of the Caribbean, Africa and the United States.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT: Laboratory Training Schools and Seminars were held at Sacramento, New Mexico and Mt. Sequoyah, Fayetteville, Arkansas with more than 400 persons in attendance.

RETIREE EVENTS: These have been one of the great success stories in the Jurisdiction. Five of these were held at Mt. Sequoyah. Enrollment was at or near capacity for each one.

YOUTH MINISTRY: The Jurisdictional Youth Ministry Enterprize was held in Oklahoma City and was well attended. Our youth ministry program is becoming one of the finest of any Jurisdiction.

BISHOPS' WEEK: A time for Bible Study, preaching, the Willson Lectures and leisure at Mt. Sequoyah. It is always well-attended.

PROTESTANT RADIO HOUR: This is the oldest religious radio program in the nation. It is carried by 72 stations in the Jurisdiction. In 1985 Rev. Bill Henson, pastor of First United Methodist Church, Houston, Texas preached during the thirteen-week segment assigned to The United Methodist Church.

OTHER EVENTS: Ecumenical Missions Workshop, Archives and History Seminar, Communications Workshop and a Church Growth Seminar were held in our Jurisdiction.

1985 — A YEAR OF CHANGE: Dr. S. Duane Bruce retired as the Executive Director of the Jurisdiction and was replaced by Earl B. Carter of Arkansas. Dr. & Mrs. Lee Cate retired as the Superintendent and Manager of Mt. Sequoyah and was succeeded by Rev. & Mrs. Don Waddell of Texas. A former missionary, Mrs. Jo Ann Small, became the first director of the Volunteers in Mission program. Mr. Roy Stewart finished his term as Jurisdictional Youth Coordinator and was replaced by Ms. Jan Bond of Missouri and the Rev. Ms. Lynn Dyke of Kansas.

# Mount Sequoyah

1985

Bishop Wilke, lay and clergy members of the Little Rock Annual Conference, and friends it is with genuine pleasure that we report from your Jurisdiction Conference and Retreat Center, MOUNT SEQUOYAH.

This is our first report as the administrators, having been appointed to this work in June of 1985. We are Don and Constance Waddell. Constance, the former Mrs. Ferris Norton, whom many of you know, and I were married four years ago and have begun a third career in ministry. During Don's early ministry, he spent fourteen years as an agricultural missionary in Chile. His second career was to spend twenty-one years as minister and district superintendent in the North Texas Annual Conference. Both of us were drawn to Mount Sequoyah out of a deep love for the church and a desire to be helpful to ministers and laypersons seeking assistance in doing ministry.

During the year of 1985, we were privileged to host a total of 10,900 persons on the mountain. Most of these persons stayed for a period of approximately three days and were in attendance at an event planned by a local church or a Judicatory body. Many other denominations used the facilities as well. With a capacity of more than three hundred persons we believe that in 1986 we may attract about thirty percent more than last year. New programs have been developed and good publicity has been given so that we are encouraged to believe that many will respond. Among these new programs we include the JURIS-DICTION YOUTH, the training of UMW district leaders, the GENERAL COMMISSION ON RELIGION AND RACE, and the jurisdictional VOLUNTEERS IN MISSIONS meetings.

Many persons from the Little Rock Conference have attended the events for retirees in the Spring and Fall. Now we hope to attract younger persons, youth, and families to use the facilities. Mount Sequoyah, located on the top of a mountain, with thirty acres of grounds and seventy acres of wilderness is an attractive setting for a wide variety of church groups. Trees and flowers are being planted to enhance the already beautiful grounds. The cottages and meeting rooms are being remodeled and refurbished to meet the expectations and needs of our guests. A well trained and increased staff is endeavoring to create a pleasant and joyful environment.

Many persons have volunteered to help on the mountain. Workcamps and individuals have assisted in a variety of ways. Volunteers are being sought now for 1987 to assist us in the library, in the Cokesbury book store, in maintenance work, and on the grounds. Persons interested are invited to be in contact with us as soon as possible.

The 1985 budget for Mount Sequoyah was \$312,535. Income is derived 70 percent from sale of services (room and meals), 18 percent as support from the churches of the Jurisdiction, and 12 percent from other gifts, interest and miscellaneous sources. The budget for 1986 does not include the major funds needed for refurbishing the cottages. The sum of \$100,000 has been approved to be sought as additional support from the annual conferences of the Jurisdiction. It is our hope that the Little Rock Conference will assist us in this effort.

It is with considerable satisfaction that I report to you that this sixty-three year old conference and retreat center, which belongs to each of you and all of the other United Methodists of the South Central Jurisdiction, is flourishing, is solvent, and is projecting itself into the twenty-first century with bold new programs. Come and see us on the mountain in Fayetteville, Arkansas. Help us to tell the story and share the excitement.

# Lydia Patterson Institute El Paso, Texas

The Lydia Patterson family extends a warm hand of amistad and cordial saludo to the Conference. The following is our report on the education mission of LPI during 1985.

Spanish classes for church leadership were held on August 12-23, 1985. This initial program under the new Center for Cross-Cultural Educational Ministries, involved participants over a two-week period in language instruction, cultural awareness workshops, lectures, city tours and an excursion to Chihuahua City, Mexico. The program will be repeated in the summer of 1986.

Forty-four students received LPI High School diplomas on May 23rd. Ceremonies were

conducted at the Chamizal National Theatre in El Paso. Mrs. Maria Elena Flood, a member of the Texas State Board of Education and a civic leader in El Paso for many years, was the Commencement Speaker; One hundred and fifty students enrolled in a six-week ESL summer session. In addition, forty-five students from El Paso attended an eight-week educational compensatory program, sponsored by the State of Texas, at Lydia Patterson Institute; Total number of students who have enrolled for the school year 1985-86 are 327: 112 are in High School, 28 are in Junior High and 187 are in ESL Department. This enrollment is slightly higher than last school year; Twenty-two FTE teachers, seven support staff and three administrative staff are giving leadership to the Institute program. Fourteen faculty have Bachelors degrees, nine have masters and one has a doctorate. Sixty seven percent of our teachers are certified. We are proud of the progress being made towards the goal of having all teachers certified by 1988; Significant curricular accomplishments have been made and strong improvement has taken place in student academic achievement during the last year as evidenced by grade point averages and the size of the Honor Roll. Mr. Gonzalo LaFarelle, is the school Principal.

Major renovations have been made in recent months to our facilities. First, the roofs on the main building and the gymnasium are being completely renovated at a cost of \$102,000. This was an urgent necessity and we are thankful that we have been able to move ahead to complete this important project. Another necessary renovation was made to our gymnasium floor this summer. Mrs. Socorro De Anda, is Business Manager in charge of facilities.

As we work together to shape the future of this historic institution, it is imperative that we do so with courage and with vision. We will continue to work for the development of a high quality preparatory Christian school, a model for public and private educational institutions alike. Both the need and the potential for such a ministry are still present in our LPI context.

Lydia Patterson is the only remaining Hispanic academic institution of the United Methodist Church in the United States. Its future as an academic institution must be preserved and developed. There are many needs among the Hispanic peoples of our country and Mexico. But certainly one of the most vital is the need for the development of the human mind. The high drop-out rates of Mexican American teenagers from high schools in El Paso and all over this country, as well as growing educational needs in Mexico, tell us that literally missions of minds are being wasted every year. We have a crucial secondary school academic mission at LPI and a very significant ministry is taking place presently with young persons every hour of every day. Ours is a commitment to the development of Hispanic young lives, whollistically. Yet we have a special calling and responsibility to care for the mind of these youths. To teach them the intellectual love of God; that they are to love God with all their minds; with the fullness of that intellectual potential which God has given to them.

Futhermore we are moving forward to further develop the Center for Cross-Cultural Educational Ministries at LPI. We all believe that the church needs leadership having that rare combination of knowledge and vital piety; leadership with a passion for the souls of Hispanic peoples and with the knowledge and skills to effect Christian ministry among them. Those two elements, so seldom found together in our individual and collective life, will be integrated in the curriculum and mission of our new Center.

Our 'Road Show' ends with the words "But what of LPI? Its story is not yet finished. Its future has been placed in your hands." Let us move forward together in faith to shape a greater and brighter future for Lydia Patterson, knowing that God has placed this unique ministry in our hands, indeed.

# Board of Diaconal Ministry — 1987

### Purpose

The purpose of the Conference Board of Diaconal Ministry is to study the needs and resources of the Conference, relative to lay professional careers and to interpret Diaconal Ministry throughout the Conference, to seek to enlist persons of all races and ethnic origins; to guide persons interested in these careers through the process of training, certification and consecration.

#### Goals

- 1. To survey the present and potential use of lay professionals in the Annual Conference.
- 2. To work with the local churches and agencies employing Diaconal Ministers and lay employees in providing adequate salary, benefit support systems, and continuing education.
- 3. To increase the number of Diaconal Ministers in the Annual Conference by 10% in the 1985-88 Quadrennium.

# 1987 Program Objectives

- Keep current the survey of local churches employing lay staff persons in order to encourage continuing education toward certification and/or consecration as Diaconal Ministers.
- 2. To continue cooperation with District Superintendent and enable local church Pastor-Staff Relations Committees to fully understand 1984 Discipline regarding Diaconal Ministers; the importance of employing trained professional staff; and to aid them in upgrading their effectiveness through continuing education and benefit support systems.
- 3. To interpret Diaconal Ministry throughout the conference using the media (Arkansas Methodist, etc.)
- Each candidate will be assigned a Diaconal Mentor for spiritual and professional guidance.

#### **Policy Statement**

The minimum starting salary and benefits of persons who are certified by the United Methodist Church and/or Diaconal Ministers serving full-time in a United Methodist Church, shall commensurate with those of a beginning ordained minister.

#### **Scholarship Fund**

The Board of Diaconal Ministry shall maintain a scholarship fund for candidates preparing for Diaconal Ministry as follows:

- 1. For those fulfilling candidacy requirements through a master's degree at a theological or graduate school approved by the University Senate of the UMC.
- 2. For those fulfilling candidacy requirements through the UM Foundational Studies.
- 3. Each applicant may receive up to \$275 per year. Aid will be granted on the basis of need and availability of funds. Due to limited funds, transportation is not covered. Candidates may apply for the balance of tuition/expense cost from the General Board of Diaconal Ministry and/or the local church.
- 4. Candidates may make application for financial aid to the Committee on Scholarship and Continuing Ed. Send applications to the Vice-Chairperson or Registrar of the BDM. Diaconal Ministers are required to earn 1 continuing education unit or 10 contact hours in equivalent study. Financial aid is available for continuing education.

The following shall serve as policy guidelines:

 Each Diaconal Minister may apply for \$150 annually, if an equal amount is matched by the local church and/or minister. The matching requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Committee on Scholarship and CE funds shall be used for tuition, room, and board. Aid will be granted based upon the date of application and availability of funds.

- 2. Person seeking financial aid for CE shall secure an application from Vice Chairperson of BDM.
- 3. The Committee on Scholarship and CE shall review applications by Jan. 31 and June 30 of each year.

# Commission On Equitable Salaries **Policy Statement Equitable Salary And Mission Salary Supplement Equitable Salary Guidelines**

All request for Equitable Salary grants shall be received before grants for mission supplement are considered. Equitable Salary needs shall have prior claim on available funds.

- I. The Commission shall recommend to the Annual Conference the amount for Equitable Salary to begin on January 1st. The Commission shall recommend the maximum amount of Equitable Salary monies that a charge may receive. (Para. 722.9) This amount shall be effective on January 1st. The maximum amount of Equitable Salary support for 1987 shall be \$2,400.00.
- II. The Minimum Salary for a pastor approved by the Annual Conference for 1987 year shall be: Full-Time.......\$15,900

Resident Student .......\$11,500 

- III. Where a charge sets more than the minimum requirement of \$250.00 the pastor will be allowed to receive the benefit of the increase for that year provided total support does not exceed minimum salary. No pastor shall suffer a loss of income through the next session of the Annual Conference due to the failure of the charge to meet the minimum requirements.
- IV. To encourage charges to reach full Equitable Salary support a charge will be given credit for any annual increase that is in excess of \$250.00 and the pastor shall be allowed to receive an amount equal to one-half of said increase: total support not to exceed the minimum salary set by Annual Conference.
- V. In the event of insufficient funds to meet all claims, each charge shall share proportionately from the funds available.
- VI. The Commission shall report the amounts paid during the fiscal year to each charge and minister
- VII. The above plan of distribution of funds be made effective June 1986.
- VIII. Equitable Salary Applications and Grants
  - 1. Every church and/or charge shall submit a proposed budget in writing. Copies to the Commission through the District Superintendent by January 1.
  - 2. Each church and/or charge shall conduct a financial campaign and report the results to the Commission through the District Superintendent by January 1.
  - 3. Each church and/or charge shall have accepted the apportionments in full for the coming year. Each church and/or charge shall have paid the apportionments in full the preceding year.
  - 4. The church and/or charge shall make application to the Commission on the prescribed form by action of the Charge Conference.
  - 5. The District Superintendent shall make his/her recommendations to the Commission by the date set by the Commission. This date shall not be later than January
  - 6. Exceptional cases may be declared by the Commission from the above requirements and waived on recommendation by the District Superintendent provided the District Superintendent shall file in writing the reasons for the exceptional circumstances.

- 7. Pastoral assignment shall be full-time (Para. 442 & 442.1) except that the Commission shall consider applications whose pastoral supply is appointed in accordance with para. 442.2 and 436.2.
- 8. In exceptional cases approved by the Cabinet, any requirement above except #7 may be waived by the Commission.
- IX. The Equitable Salary Commission shall be empowered to designate a portion of the Equitable Salary Fund for Mission Salary Supplement provided that Mission Salary Supplement shall not exceed the balance anticipated for the year after Equitable Salary grants have been approved.
  - X. Mission Salary Supplement Applications and Grants
    - 1. Every church and/or charge shall present a budget for the year to the Commission through the District Superintendent.
    - 2. Each church and/or charge shall conduct a financial campaign and report the results to the Commission through the District Superintendent.
    - 3. Each church and/or charge shall have accepted the apportionments in full for the coming year. Each church and/or charge shall have paid the apportionments in full the preceding year.
    - 4. The church and/or charge shall make application to the Commission on the prescribed form by action of the Charge Conference.
    - 5. The District Superintendent shall make his/her recommendation to the Commission by the date set by the Commission. This date shall not be later than January
    - 6. Exceptional cases may be declared by the Commission from the above requirements and waived on recommendation by the District Superintendent provided the District Superintendent shall file in writing the reasons for the exceptional circumstances.
- XI. All grants from Mission Salary Supplements shall be reported by the Commission to the Annual Conference.
- XII. Adjustments may be made by the Commission at the beginning of the fiscal year when such adjustments are necessitated by a change of appointment or realignment of the charge — or by a new salary arrangement voted by the Charge Conference.

# **Board Of Ordained Ministry Policy Statement 1985-86**

NOTE: BOLDFACE SENTENCES AND PHRASES IN TEXT INDICATE PROPOSED CHANGES IN THIS POLICY TO BE CONSIDERED AT THE 1986 SESSION OF THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE. CHANGES TO BE EFFECTIVE JAN. 1st 1987.

### SECTION I: BOARD OPERATION

A. The Little Rock Annual Conference Board of Ordained Ministry proposes to work strictly within the framework of the current Discipline of The United Methodist Church.
B. The officers elected by the Board are: Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Regis-

trar, Associate Registrar, and Candidacy Registrar.

C. The Executive Committee of the Board is elected officers, the Chairperson of the Con-

- ference Relations Committee, the Chairperson of the Probationer's Committee, and the Chairperson of Continuing Education.

  D. The Board is divided into groups of members who may serve a maximum of eight years. The Executive Committee is responsible for reporting expired terms to the Bishop who shall consult with the Chairperson of the Board and the Cabinet in making nominations
- to the Annual Conference. (Par. 732.a-1984 Discipline)

  E. The Board shall meet prior to the opening of school, at mid-year, at Annual Conference, and on call of the Chairperson.
- F. The Board shall have a representative on each District Committee on Ordained Ministry (Par. 749.1) In consultation with the District Superintendent, the Chairperson shall ap-
- point a member to serve on each District Committee.

  G. The Board's sources of income shall be:

  1. A designated amount from the Council on Finance and Administration for the administration.
  - istrative costs of the Board.

    2. Twenty-five percent of of the amount collected from local churches for the Ministerial Education Fund.
  - al Education Fund.
  - 3. Gifts, bequests, interest on notes, and repayment of loans.
- H. The Policy Booklet shall be reviewed and revised annually by a committee appointed by the Chairperson of the Board.
- Policy statements of the Board shall be presented to the Annual Conference for approval or amendment, provided that all policies shall be in accordance with the current Discipline.

# **SECTION II: CANDIDACY**

- A. The first step into the Ministry of the United Methodist Church is to appear before and receive the recommendation of the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee from the local church in which one has held membership for one year. This recommendation is conveyed to the District Superintendent and a charge Conference over which the District Superintendent presides.
- B. That recommendation is then referred to the District Committee on Ordained Ministry which is to review the recommendation and arrange for the enrollment of the Candidate in the course of study required by the General Board of Ordained Ministry in Nashville, Tenn.
- C. The Candidate shall provide to the District Committee and the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry a health examination reported on the form provided by the Candidacy Registrar of the Conference Board. The Candidate will bear the expense for the examination.
- The Conference Board shall maintain a list of Supervising Pastors. The list shall include
  those who have completed the training to be Supervising Pastors. They shall be selected
  by the Registrar for Candidacy, approved by The District Superintendents and the Conference Board.

#### SECTION III: LOCAL LICENSE TO PREACH SCHOOL

- A. The annual school for Local Preacher's License shall be held as a joint venture with the Board of Ordained Ministry of the North Arkansas Annual Conference.
- B. Those serving on the Planning Committee shall be: Chairperson of the Board of Ordained Ministry, the Associate Registrar, and the Candidacy Registrar.
- C. In agreement with the North Arkansas Board of Ordained Ministry, the Little Rock Conference Board shall:
  - 1. Provide one-half of the administrative costs of the school.
  - 2. Provide two persons to serve on the faculty.
  - 3. Provide a person to serve as Dean of the school for the first two years of each quadrennium and the North Arkansas Board shall furnish the Dean for the last two years.
  - 4. The Little Rock Conference shall provide a registrar for students from this conference
  - 5. The Board shall pay room, board, and travel for its two faculty members and the Dean when the Dean is from this conference.
  - The Little Rock Conference shall reimburse the following expenses for its students; books, room, and board. The student must successfully complete the course to receive reimbursement.
- D. The evaluation of each student shall be sent to the Associate Registrar, the Candidacy Registrar, and The District Superintendent of the student's district.
- E. All persons seeking License to Preach shall undergo Psychological Testing. Guidelines appear in the 1985 Journal of the Little Rock Conference. (See Section VII of this Policy Statement.)

#### SECTION IV: COURSE OF STUDY — ADVANCED COURSE OF STUDY

- A. All persons entering the Course of Study shall notify the Associate Registrar of their intention to enter by March 15th of each year.
- B. Those students proceeding through the Course of Study shall notify and forward to the Associate Registrar their registration form for the current year by March 15th.
- C. The financial assistance from the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry is limited to:
  - The cost of tuition, registration fees, room and board for those in the five year basic program.
  - 2. Those enrolled in correspondence work will receive payment of tuition fees only.
  - 3. Those preparing to enroll in the Advanced Course of Study shall:
    - a. Appear before the Conference Board stating why they feel they should be considered an exceptional case. Permission to enroll in the Advanced Course of Study does not necessarily indicate that one will be recommended for Probationary Relationship on completion of that course.
    - b. Be prepared to meet all requirements of Par. 416 on completion of the Course.
    - c. For those seeking to prepare for Admission as Probationary Members of the Annual Conference, the Conference Board may reimburse each student \$135.00 for each completed course.

#### SECTION V: RELATIONSHIP TO COLLEGE STUDENTS

- A. Those enrolled in college level courses and planning to enter Seminary or the Course of Study shall:
  - 1. Meet with the Conference Board or its Executive Committee prior to enrolling in either the Course of Study or Seminary.
  - 2. Complete the requirements for Candidacy for Ministry.
  - 3. Before August 1st, prior to beginning seminary, make application to the Registrar of the Conference Board, furnishing all information requested and authorizing regular grade reports to be released to the Registrar, including a transcript of credits at the end of each academic year.

# SECTION VI: RELATIONSHIP TO SEMINARY STUDENTS

- A. Financial Assistance for Seminary Students shall be in the form of scholarship-loans. Funds from the Ministerial Education Fund shall be used for this aid.
  - Scholarship-aid is in reality a loan. It may be repaid through service in the United Methodist Ministry at the rate of one year of service for each year of financial assistance received.
  - 2. The loan is secured by a legally binding note signed by those receiving assistance. In the event that one does not enter the United Methodist Ministry, or serve long enough to discharge the loan, the loan shall become due and interest from the date of issuance of the note shall apply. Arrangements must be made to begin the repayment of the loan within six months.
- B. To qualify for Seminary Scholarship aid the student must:
  - 1. Be enrolled in a seminary approved by The University Senate of The United Methodist Church.
  - 2. Maintain a grade point sufficient to insure graduation from the institution in which the student is enrolled.
  - Authorize grade reports to be sent to the Registrar of the Conference Board and at the end of the school year arrange for the Registrar to receive a transcript of the years work.
  - 4. Maintain a current address at all times with the Registrar of the Board.
- C. Application process for loans shall be:
  - 1. Request from the Registrar the promissory note and the application blank.
  - 2. Complete the forms and send them to your District Superintendent for approval.
  - 3. Release and mail to the Registrar grade reports and or transcripts for last semester.
  - 4. Scholarship-aid must be requested by September 1st and January 15th.
- D. Limitations:
  - 1. Scholarship-aid shall not be given for more than four years toward the completion of the seminary degree.
  - 2. Full scholarship-aid is offered only to full-time students. Part-time students may receive aid on a pro-rata basis.
  - In the event courses are not completed, the student must refund to the Board that portion of aid received for that course. Additional aid will not be granted until this requirement is met.
  - 4. Scholarship-aid for summer school will be determined by the number of hours taken in comparison with a normal regular semester load.
- E. Emergency Aid
  - Additional aid for emergency situations may be granted to seminary students when requested; for health reasons, to those who come from disadvantaged economic backgrounds, or to those who have entered ministry later in life with family responsibilities.
  - 2. The maximum amount of emergency aid per year shall not exceed an amount equal to the scholarship grant for one semester. The Executive Committee must approve the request for emergency aid.
- F. Amount of Scholarship-Aid
  - 1. The Conference Board shall set the maximum amount of the Scholarship-aid each year based on a percent of the tuition charged by the seminary, not to exceed an amount equal to the set percent of \$6,000. The award of the scholarship-loans shall be based on the availability of funds and the needs of the individual.

# SECTION VII: PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMINATIONS

1. Psychological Examinations shall be required by all persons seeking License to Preach, Probationary Membership, Associate Membership, requesting re-entry into full or parttime appointment within the Little Rock Annual Conference, or any person seeking recognition of orders from another denominations.

- B. The cost of the examination shall be paid by the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry except in the case of those seeking re-admission. (see section XI)
- C. The Psychologist shall be selected by the Board.

The full policy statement concerning the examination is in the 1985 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference. The policy is also available from the Registrar of the Board.

#### SECTION IX: PROBATIONARY PROCESS

- A. Applicants for ADMISSION INTO FULL MEMBERSHIP AND ORDINATION in the Little Rock Annual Conference who have completed all educational requirements and upon receiving full-time appointment shall enter into a Probationary Process for a period of not less than two years.
- B. This process shall be coordinated and supervised by the Probationers Committee of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry and shall be in full accordance with the disciplinary requirements and such other requirements as deemed necessary by the Annual Conference. (Par. 413 1984 Discipline)
- C. The Purpose of the Probationary Process of the Little Rock Annual Conference is to surround each probationary member with supportive caring groups. These groups are invited to face, with the probationer, the possibilities and challenges of Ordained Ministry and his/her growth in that ministry.
- D. Basic to the caring process is the establishment of a local Committee of Concern which is an official committee on the local level representing the Probationer's Committee of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. The Committee of Concern functions in the following ways:
  - 1. To help the Probationer to meet the requirements for full conference membership.
  - 2. To enable the Probationer to make transitions into the ministry with support and guidance.
  - To give opportunity for each committee member to grow in ministry and self understanding.

### E. The Committee of Concern shall be composed of the following:

- 1. The Probationer.
- 2. An Elder, Chosen by the Probationer.
- 3. Four lay persons (two men and two women if possible) chosen by the Probationer after consultation with the Chairperson of the Committee on Concern.
- 4. The Chairperson (an Elder appointed by The Conference Board of Ordained Ministry) "Members in Full Connection with an annual conference by virtue of their election and ordination are bound in a special covenant with all the ordained ministers of the annual conference." (Par. 421 1984 Discipline) The concept of the Committee of Concern also presupposes a sense of covenant with one another in the group, with Christ, and with the Church. The mutual counseling relationship of the Committee of Concern is of paramount importance.
- F. In consultation with the District Superintendent, Chairperson of the Committee of Concern, the committee itself, and others, the Probationer will develop a GROWTH COVENANT stating his/her personal goals for growth as pastor and person during the process.
- G. The Probationer's Committee of the Board of Ordained Ministry will design a two-year program of growth opportunities, seminars, evaluations, retreats, and other requirements which must be completed in total by the Probationer. Either the Probationer of the Board of Ordained Ministry may recommend the extension of the two year process if deemed advisable.
- H. By February 1st of the second year of probation, the Probationer shall present to the Committee of Concern and to the Chairperson of the Probationers Committee of the Board of Ordained Ministry a written sermon and answers to the doctrinal questions required for conference membership. (Par. 423 1984 Discipline)
- I. The Probationer shall be required to take a health and psychological exam in keeping

# SECTION X: CONTINUING EDUCATION

- A. The Board shall encourage participation in continuing education programs by ministers of the Little Rock Annual Conference. Pastors are required by the Discipline to earn at least two continuing education units per year. (A continuing education unit is 10 hours of instruction). The following shall serve as policy guidelines:
  - 1. Each eligible individual applicant may receive up to \$150.00 annually, if an equal amount is provided by the church and/or the individual. These amounts shall include only projected expenses for tuition, books, fees, room and board. This matching requirement may be waived for those who receive less than \$4,000.00 above Equitable Salary.
  - 2. Persons seeking financial aid for continuing education shall secure an application form from the Chairperson of Continuing Education. All requests relating to continuing education funds shall be directed to the Chairperson of said committee.
  - 3. In hardship cases, ministers can apply to the Committee on Continuing Education for help to attend Pastor's School. Such help will be granted only after other avenues for aid have been exhausted.
  - 4. No financial aid is available for Minister's Week at any Seminary.

# SECTION XI: ENTRY/EXITING/RE-ENTRY

### A. ENTRY

- 1. Requests for conference membership or ordination:
  - a. For Associate and Probationary Memberships (and/or Deacons Orders); one shall make application through their District Committee on Ordained Ministry. The District Committee shall forward their recommendation to the Registrar of The Board by the 1st of October each year.
  - For Full Membership (and/or Elders Orders) application shall be made to the Registrar of the Board.
  - c. All requests for Conference Membership shall be on file with the Registrar at least nine months prior to conference.
  - d. Psychological Testing is required by all persons seeking their first relationship with the conference. (See separate policy statement on psychological testing)
  - e. A medical examination is required for all persons seeking a first time relationship with the conference. The examination is to be on the prescribed form. The Conference Board will reimburse the applicant up to \$40.00 for the examination. Any additional expense (ie. special test etc.) will be the responsibility of the applicant.

### B. EXITING

- Whenever and for Whatever reason, a person related to the annual conference with ministerial relationship, leaves that relationship, the exiting must be reviewed and approved by the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry as per the requirements of The Discipline.
- The Secretary shall record in the minutes of the Board the stated reason for the exiting. The Registrar shall enter in the persons record the stated reason for the exiting. Additional statements shall be recorded from the Cabinet and the person who has exited.
- 3. Disciplinary procedures shall be followed as listed in the following paragraphs of the 1984 Discipline:
  - a. Voluntary Termination par. 454
  - b. Involuntary Termination par. 455
  - c. Administrative Location par. 455.2
  - d. Trial par. 455.2
  - e. Leave of Absence par. 450
  - f. Disability par. 452
  - g. Retirement par. 453
  - h. Honorable Location par. 454.2

#### C. RE-ENTRY

- 1. All requests for re-entry to the Annual Conference for appointment must be presented to the Board of Ordained Ministry 90 days prior to the beginning session of the Annual Conference.
- 2. The Board shall review all files and statements kept by the Secretary and Registrar of the Board at the time of exiting.
- 3. All persons requesting re-entry are required to submit to a psychological examination as prescribed in the policy in psychological examinations. The cost of this evaluation shall be borne by the person requesting re-entry. Persons returning from Leave of absence with consent may have the requirement waived by the Chairperson and Registrar of the Conference Board.
- 4. Disciplinary procedures will be followed by The Conference Board in re-entry process as listed in the following paragraphs:
  - a. Return from Leave of Absence. par. 450

#### **Board Of Pensions**

#### Report No. 1

- 1. We recommend that the Little Rock Conference participate in the Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP) and the Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP) of the General Board of Pensions during 1987 on the following basis:
  - a. Contribution base shall be limited to each minister's plan compensation not to exceed the denominational average compensation.
  - b. Contribution rate shall be MPP, 12% of each minister's contribution base, and CPP, 4.4% of each minister's contribution base.
  - c. Annuity rate for pre-January 1, 1982 service shall be \$220.00 per service year.
  - d. Surviving spouse percentage of the formula benefit rate shall be 70%.
  - e. A 25 year amortization period shall be used to pay the unfunded past service liability.
  - f. Monthly contributions to MPP/CPP shall be made through the apportionment system.
  - g. CPP benefits shall be supplemented with Death Benefit Plan-Plus (DBP-Plus) to 300% DAC.
  - h. Active participants will contribute to the Death Benefit Program Plus with the church paying 60% and the participant 40%.
  - Every Conference member making less than the Equitable Salary from his/her primary salary paying unit can be included in CPP at the rate of 3.4% of his/her contribution base.
  - j. Probationers at seminary will be provided CPP at 3.4%.
  - k. Those on leave of absence may participate in CPP at the rate of 3.4%. The participant will pay the full 3.4%.
- 2. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 1606, Section 12e of the 1984 Discipline that the Sunday following Easter be observed as Retired Minister's Day. Each Pastor is urged to acquaint his or her congregation with the pension program of the Conference as part of the observance, and if possible to use a retired minister in the Worship Service.
- 3. We recommend in keeping with Par. 1606, Section 4h of the 1984 Discipline, the approval of the Annual Conference that Special Appointments shall be listed in the Conference Journal as follows: (1) With Annuity Claim, (a) upon the Annual Conference, or (b) upon a General Board, an Institution, or an Agency of the United Methodist Church: (2) Without
- Journal as follows: (1) With Annuity Claim, (a) upon the Annual Conference, or (b) upon a General Board, an Institution, or an Agency of the United Methodist Church; (2) Without Annuity claim upon this Annual Conference.

  4. We recommend that the Board of Pensions pay the entire premium for our eligible retir-
- ees, surviving spouses, and ministers on disability for the Hospital and Medical Expense Program. The Death Benefit for eligible surviving spouses is now a part of the CPP of the new pension program. Benefits remain 10% of the Denominational Average Compensation. In addition, we recommend the eligible Conference and Special Conference Claimants pay their own voluntary portion of Medicare which was paid previously by the Conference Board of Pensions.
- We recommend that an annual amount equal to 100% of the pension and disability payment of each minister of the Little Rock Conference be designated as housing allowance.
- i. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 736, Section 4 of the 1984 Discipline that there shall be organized from the membership of the Board of Pensions of the Little Rock Conference a committee to compare the records of the amount paid by each pastoral charge for support of pastors and for pension benefit purposes computing the proportional distribution thereof and keeping a permanent record of defaults of the ministers in the Conference who have failed to observe the provision in Par. 736, Section 4 pertaining to proportional payment, and shall render annually to each minister and charge in default a statement of amounts in default for that and preceding years. In event of default by any Pastoral Charge and after the notification of the committee, liens shall be

filed against future pensions and the names of the churches and ministers along with the

amount in default shall be printed in the Conference Journal.

- 7. We request the Secretary of the Annual Conference to print in the minister's Service Record in the Journal, one column stating "Years of Pensions Claim on the Little Rock Conference," and another stating "Total Service Years in the Ministry."
- A list of annuitants and pension payments for the year 1985 is available in the Conference Treasurer's Office from Mary Stanfield.

#### Resolution Relating To Rental/Housing Allowances For Retired Or Disabled Ministers Of This Conference

Whereas, the religious denomination known as the United Methodist Church has and functions through Ministers of the Gospel who are duly ordained or licensed; and

Whereas, the practice of the United Methodist Church is to provide a parsonage or a rental allowance as part of the gross compensation for each of its active ordained or licensed ministers, and

Whereas, pensions paid to retired ordained or licensed ministers of The United Methodist Church are considered as deferred compensation and are paid to said retired ordained or licensed ministers in consideration of previous, active service, and disability benefits are considered payments in lieu of compensation for active service; and

Whereas, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized that the Little Rock Annual Conference is the appropriate organization to designate a housing/allowance for retired ordained or licensed ministers who are members of this Conference; and

Whereas, the disabled minister has the same legal relationship to an Annual Conference as does the retired minister and, thus, this Annual Conference is also the appropriate organization to designate a housing/allowance for a disabled ordained or licensed minister who is a member of this Conference:

#### Now Therefore Be It Resolved:

- 1. An amount equal to 100% of the pensions payments received by a retired minister, or 100% of the disability benefit payments received by a disabled minister, during the year 1987 be and is hereby designated as a rental/housing allowance respectively for each retired or disabled ordained or licensed minister of The United Methodist Church who is or was member of the Little Rock Annual Conference at the time of his or her retirement or disability;
- 2. The pension or disability payment to which this rental/housing allowance applies shall be the pension or disability payment resulting from all service of such retired or disabled ordained or licensed minister from all employment by any local church, Annual Conference, General Agency, or institution of The United Methodist Church or any former denomination that is now a part of The United Methodist Church, or from any other employer who employed the minister to perform services related to the ministry and who elected to make contributions to the pension or benefit funds of The United Methodist Church for such retired minister's pension or disabled minister's benefits.

The Little Rock Annual Conference in session June, 1986, petitions the General Board of Pensions to actively seek IRS approval to extend to ministers' widows the courtesy of "housing exemption" from taxes currently enjoyed by retired ministers.

#### Note:

The rental/housing allowance which may be excluded from a minister's gross income is limited to the lesser of (1) the amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the minister's employer or other appropriate body, (2) the amount actually expended by the minister to provide his or her housing, or (3) the legally determined fair rental value of the parsonage or other housing provided. As specified in Rev. Rul. 71-280, 1971 C.B. 92, "the only amount that will qualify for exclusion under section 107 (2) of the Code as a 'rental allowance' is an amount equal to the fair rental value of the home, including furnishings and appurtenances such as a garage, plus the cost of utilities."

Beginning in 1984, there is no longer a sick pay or disability income exclusion available with respect to disability benefit payments. Therefore, the full amount of disability benefit payments will be taxable income to the recipient beginning in 1984.

Addendum A To The Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP) and The Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP)

(MPP Supplement Paragraph (c)) For the Year 1987

This Addendum A is applicable to the Little Rock Annual Conference and is effective as of January 1, 1987. It replaces any previously executed Addendum A and shall be in effect until amended by the Annual Conference in accordance with the provisions of the Ministerial Pension Plan and the Comprehensive Protection Plan.

Contribution Base

The MPP and CPP Contribution Base shall be the Active Participant's Plan Compensation for a plan Year not to exceed the Denominational Average Compensation. (MPP Section 4.1 (c) and CPP Section 4.1 (c)

Contribution Rate

The MPP Church Contribution rate shall be 12% of the Contribution Base of each Active Participant and the CPP Church Contribution rate shall be 4.4% of the Contribution Base of each Active Participant. (MPP) Section 4.1 (b) and CPP Section 4.1 (c))

Contribution Method

The Church Contribution shall be made monthly to the Plan by the Annual Conference in accordance with the Plan document. Such MPP and CPP Church Contributions shall be transferred monthly from the Deposit Account of the Annual Conference by the General Board of Pensions to each Active Participant's account and the Protection Benefit Fund. respectively. The Annual Conference shall maintain an amount in its Deposit Account sufficient to provide for the monthly transfer of the Church Contributions on behalf of its Active Participants. In the event the Deposit Account is overdrawn, an interest charge shall be made by the General Board of Pensions. Such charge shall be made at the current monthly rate of interest credited to the STIRA investment program. (MPP Section 4.1 (a) and 4.2 (g), and CPP Section 4.1 (b) and 4.2 (h))

Past Service Pension Rate On January 1, 1987, the ministerial Pension Rate shall be \$220.00, and the local pastor's Pension Rate shall be \$220.00. (Disciplinary Paragraphs 1606.2 (b) and 1606.7) (MPP Supplemental Section (f))

Surviving

In accordance with paragraph (3) (5) of Supplement One, the Surviving Spouse Benefit Spouse Benefit shall be 70% of the Participant's Formula Benefit.

Special Arrangements The Little Rock Annual Conference Board of Pensions is hereby authorized, at its discretion, to arrange with the General Board of Pensions for active participation in the CPP by persons who are eligible under special rules but not automatically included as Active Participants. (CPP Section 3.2)

Past Service Funding In accordance with paragraph (f) of Supplement One, the Unfunded liability as of January 1, 1987 has been actuarially projected to be \$4.062.059. Past service funding deposits are required to fund this unfunded liability, and shall be in the amounts for the periods as shown below:

Amount \$317,760.00 **Period of Deposits** 25 years

These annual deposits shall be made at the end of each calendar year as required by the General Board of Pensions. The past service deposits shall be transferred from the Little Rock Annual Conference Deposit Account to the Past Service Funding Account on December 31. If the annual cash flow requirement, as determined by the General Board of Pensions, exceeds the combined past service funding deposit amounts, then the cash flow

requirement shall become the required past service funding deposit. (MPP Supplement One (f))

#### **Board Of Trustees**

Your Conference Trustees submit the following recommendations for action by this session of the Little Rock Annual Conference:

1. Authorize the Mt. Pisgah Church property, located in the Arkadelphia District, and consisting of about .85 acre; be advertised for sale to the highest bidder. The time limit for bids will be thirty days. One bid of \$400.00 has been received. The money is to be given to the Arkadelphia District Board of Missions.

- Authorize the Johnson Chapel Church, located in Prairie County, Little Rock District; be deeded to the Johnson Chapel Cemetery Association, Inc. The incorporation papers have been reviewed and found to be in order.
- 3. Authorize the District Superintendent of the Hope District to lease for \$1.00 the Fouke United Methodist Church property, to the Fouke School District, until the next Annual Conference Session of 1987. The school needs the property for expansion, but this will give us time to research the deed and meet the requirements concerning the sale of property.
- 4. Request this session of the Little Rock Conference, to authorize the purchase of liability insurance for the Conference Board of Trustees.
- 5. We recommend the building on the one-acre property, former location of New Bethel Church, Prairie County, Little Rock District, be advertized for sale by the Trustees of First United Methodist Church, Des Arc; and the land be returned to the William Bell family in accordance with the deed. The money received from this sale, after expenses, to go to the Trustees of First United Methodist Church, Des Arc, Arkansas.

#### United Methodist Women

Bishop Wilke, Delegates and friends, I bring you greetings from the 178 local units of United Methodist Women in the Little Rock Conference.

I would like to share with you some happenings of the past year. The Hope District was pleased to have as guest speaker, Eva Lou Russell, Native American from Oklahoma City. Over 200 women listened to her share cultures of her native tribe. The Little Rock and Arkadelphia Districts were privileged to have Delos and Hazel McCauley, Missionaries to Nepal. The Little Rock and Monticello District Officers have taken part in Jurisdiction Leadership Training Events. The Little Rock District went to Kansas City and the Monticello District went to Mt. Sequoyah. It is always good to be with the staff and directors of the Women's Division.

In August, two young women from the Rock Springs Church, Monticello District, attended a Mission Event at the Alma Matthews House in Greenwich Village. They were accompanied by Ernestine Brooks, District Secretary. Upon their return they shared their enthusiasm with us, and we chartered a new unit at the Rock Springs Church in January.

Our conference had a very good attendance at the Arkansas Area School of Christian Mission last summer. Usually North Arkansas out numbers us 2 to 1, but for the weekend school they had only 19 more persons and for the weekday they had only 13 more. This is a good increase for us and I hope we will continue. We also had participation from 8 youth of our conference.

In your packets this week you should have received a registration form. It has all the information about our school. We are beginning with the weekday session August 11-14, and weekend session 15-17. Each district will be giving two youth scholarships to cover room, board and registration.

While many of us were at Hendrix for School of Mission, Liz Workman loaded a bus of women from our state and journeyed to Washington D.C. for participation in wrapping the Peace Ribbon of Church Women United, around the Pentagon, Lincoln Memorial, and the Capital. It measured over 15 miles. Over 1,500 church women participated in this event at Washington besides all of the others who made the ribbons. Twelve segments of the ribbon that will be placed in the Peace Museum are from Arkansas United Methodist Women.

The Women's Division total expenditures in 1985 were \$29,096,416 (general fund expenditures and expenditures of all other funds: Call to Prayer, Supplementary Gifts, Bequests, etc.). In 1985, on total expenditures the administrative costs were only 5.8%.

In 1985 we met our pledge in the amount of \$115,762.88. When designated giving is included a total of over \$140,000.00 was sent to Missions. This is a record for us; but we can not rest. Our Pledge to Mission for 1986 is \$120,000. We must take a leap in faith. It will take

each United Methodist Woman in the Little Rock Conference to reach this goal. We are well on our way, and I hope by December 1st we can say that our goal has been reached.

One of the things I have discovered in this office is:

"I have briefcase and will travel." I have been fortunate to be in all six districts for their meetings. During January, I traveled over 1000 miles, and in May it was over that mileage again.

I have visited, in my journeys, many wonderful churches in our conference. The members are warm and loving, no matter the size, and it is a pleasure and privilege to serve each of you.

The highlight for this year was the National Assembly at Anaheim, California. 8670 women and a few men, gathered to celebrate "Into the Future By Faith." From our conference were 55 women and 2 men. We traveled by car, pick up, van and jet. We visited Mission projects, wonders of the great United States, and family. Of the four Assemblies I have attended; this was the best. Our own Senator's wife, Betty Bumpers, shared Peace Links in two workshops, with the Arkansas delegation assisting. Pam Hunter carried our windsock in the opening celebration. Dixie Newton, who did not attend made the windsock for us. Jimmie Lee Stephens presented our Celebration Fund offering of \$2800. This will be added to the \$11,900.11 which was sent to the Women's Division in '83, '84, and '85. Margaret Wynne and Janis West sang in the choir and Betty Riggin assisted in the Intercessory Prayer Room. During the four days every missionary, mission project, and staff person was lifted up in special prayer. Betty also carried the windsock in the closing worship.

Our final session on Sunday morning, was Communion, administered by Bishop Roy Sano. Ann Ashcraft and myself assisted with the serving of communion. It was a great

event and many of us are planning a 90's celebration in Kansas City.

Everyone has an opportunity to participate in the events of the year by being a part of a local unit. This is where our roots are; the foundation of our organization. It is important to be counted and I will not settle for 96% reporting, I want everyone included. We will strive for 100% reporting in 1986.

On October 11, 1986, we will gather at First United Methodist Church, Mangolia, for our Annual Meeting. Carolyn Marshall, the President of the Women's Division, will be our speaker for the day. We will have a full day planned, and I am sure there will be something for everyone.

I might remind the ministers, that you are a member of the local unit executive committee, and the District Superintendent is a member of the District Mission Team. It is important that we work closely with the total church program.

I believe what I am trying to say to you today, in this report, is that there is no church without mission. I would not want to be a part of a church that does not have an active United Methodist Women's organization. It is one of the ways I am able to serve my Lord. The scriptures tell us to "go into all the world," and this is one way we are able to do this.

We still have 7 months of 1986 ahead of us, and there is always something to be done. I hope each one of you will go home, and make your local unit stronger than it has ever been. Our Purpose states: "The organized unit of United Methodist Women shall be a community of women whose Purpose is to know God and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship; and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church."

We have examined the statement of assets, liabilities and fund balances of the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church as of December 31, 1985 and 1984, and the related statement of changes in fund balances for the year ended December 31, 1985. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in note 1, the organization's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements. Consequently, certain receipts and the related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain disbursements are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements are not intended to present financial position and changes in fund balances in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, the aforementioned financial statements present fairly the assets, liabilities and fund balances of the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church as of December 31, 1985 and 1984, and the changes in its fund balances for the year ended December 31, 1985, on the basis of accounting described in note 1, which has been applied in a

manner consistent with that of the preceding year.

#### Little Rock Conference Of The United Methodist Church Notes To Financial Statements December 31, 1985 And 1984

#### 1. Summary Of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting — the financial statements of the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church have been prepared on the cash basis. The records are held open for approximately two weeks after year-end in order to include the remittances from the churches in the Conference for the last few weeks of the year. This policy is consistent with prior years.

#### 2. Income Taxes

The Conference meets the requirements of section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code and is therefore exempt from federal income taxes.

#### 3. Cash Investments

All cash investments are recorded at cost plus interest income as received in the account. These balances approximate current market value of the particular investments. Due to the current nature of most of these investments, market quotations are not available.

Interest on the savings accounts is received quarterly. Interest on Dean Witter Intercapital Liquid Asset Fund, Savers Federal Money Fund, and Fidelity Cash Reserves are received monthly. Interest on all other cash investments is not recognized until maturity.

#### 4. Notes Receivable — Finance and Management

Notes receivable — Finance and Management are 10% notes to the Conference from the Conference Board to reflect repayments due from investments in a computer and a parcel of land. The note relating to the computer was paid off in fiscal 1985. The remaining note relating to the parcel of land is payable \$2,313 monthly, including interest, through August, 1988.

#### Reverend Bruce H. Bean

Brother Bean, as he was affectionately called by most who knew him, was a retired associate member of the Conference. He was born at Centerpoint (Howard County) October 20, 1901, the son of Rufus and Susan Graves Bean. His transferral to the Church Triumphant came on December 18, 1985.

Reverend Bean began his vocational life working in clothing stores at Nashville. It was while selling clothing that he sensed God's call to ministry. He entered the ministry whole-heartedly and completed the Course of Study school at Perkins.

#### Rev. Raz Milton Crain

His youngest son, Arnold, remembers his father fondly as a parent who loved his family and as a minister with a passion for lost souls.

Brother Crain completed his early pilgrimage on July 9, 1985 just a few weeks prior to his 93rd birthday. 
#### Rev. William Matthew Crow

A memorial service was held February 21 at First United Methodist Church, England. Burial was at Mulberry cemetery.




The service of celebration for Gussie Diffee was held at Oaklawn United Methodist Church, Hot Springs






Lynda L. Frederick

# X. Miscellaneous

The organization of the Little Rock Annual Conference is defined in the Statement of the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Conference as printed in the 1985 Journal, pages 176-190.

The Standing Rules are subject to the Discipline of the United Methodist Church and the

Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

## THE STANDING RULES

- I. Conference Organization
  - Number of Districts. There shall be six districts in the Little Rock Annual Conference.
  - 2. **District Conference**. There may be a district conference held annually in each district, composed of those members provided for in the current Discipline, and one additional member from each pastoral charge, provided however, in charges of more than five hundred members there shall be one additional member for each five hundred members or fraction thereof.
  - 3. Nominations.
    - (a) The Conference Nominating Committee shall be composed of the District Superintendent and one lay person from each district. The Bishop shall serve as chairman.
    - (b) The Conference Nominating Committee shall nominate six members (three lay and three clergy) at large to achieve an equal balance of lay and clergy members, alternating by districts as follows:

LayClergyArkadelphiaLittle RockCamdenMonticelloHopePine Bluff

(c) The Conference Nominating Committee will nominate all members of the Annual Conference quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees and Conference Council on Ministry boards, committees and commissions except as otherwise provided. The Nominations shall be made available to Conference delegates on the opening day of Conference to be voted on not sooner than the following day. Each District Nominating committee will complete its list of qualified nominations by December 31. All nominees shall be consulted regarding their nomination.

All boards and agencies of the Conference shall be inclusive to ethnic minority

representation.

(d) Terms of office of the Nominating Committee shall be for four years beginning on January 1 following the session of the Annual Conference in the middle of the quadrennium.

4. Lay Members. Lay members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually and their names and addresses shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.

- 5. Youth Membership. Each District Council of the United Methodist Youth shall elect annually two youth members of the Annual Conference, and their names shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
- 6. Board Service.
  - (a) Elective membership on any board, agency, committee of the Little Rock Annual Conference may not exceed a maximum of eight consecutive years, excepting ex-officio membership on the Conference Council on Ministries. Membership begins upon election. Date of election shall be listed beside name in Conference Journal.
  - (b) There are two types of membership on Annual Conference boards, committees,

one at-large and/or one ex-officio capacity.

(c) The membership of the Committee on Review and Evaluation; the Committee on Planning and Research; the Committee on the Annual Conference; and the Episcopal Committee shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) of Review and Evaluation.

(d) No person from the Little Rock Conference, clerical or lay, shall serve as an elected trustee of more than one United Methodist related institution within the bounds of the Arkansas Area at a time. "Within the bounds of" these United Methodist related institutions are understood to be the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Aldersgate, Methodist Children's Home, the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, the Wesley Foundations, Little Rock Conference Camp Tanako, and Mt. Sequoyah Assembly. This is to take effect during the year 1979, as each institution could possibly have its timetable of elections on a different schedule. Trustees presently serving are allowed to complete their present terms.

(e) All Councils, Boards, Committees and Commissions of the Confrence shall be made representative. Special consideration shall be given to placing women, youth, and minority persons on the membership of these conference agencies.

(f) Beginning with the 1984 Quadrennium no member of the Annual Conference shall be eligible for the chairmanship of a board, committee, commission or council of the Annual Conference who has served as chairman of a board, committee, commission or council for the preceding 8 years.

## II. Financial Administration

 Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall run from January 1 to December 31.

#### 2. Financial and Statistical.

- (a) The District Superintendents shall furnish the treasurer with all apportionments to the churches on, or before January 15. These figures shall be official.
- (b) All Conference assessments and reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars; with no column for cents.
- c) Each pastor shall make a statistical report to the District Superintendent who shall submit the reports to the Conference Statistician. The Pastor's financial report will be audited and checked by the Final Data Processing Print-Out. Where there is discrepancy, the amount recorded on the Print-Out will prevail.
- 3. Administrative Fund. The Council on Finance and Administration shall recommend an assessment for a Conference Administrative Fund. All clerical work of the Conference, the expense of publishing the pre-conference report, the expense of publishing the Journal and preserving the records of the Conference, the expense of preparing and printing the Worship Booklet for the Annual Conference, the expense of auditing the accounts of the several boards, the expenses of the Conference Secretary and Statistician, the expenses of committees raised by the Conference shall be paid from this Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of the Fund. Payments for unbudgeted claims on this fund shall be made on vouchers signed by the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration or the Conference Secretary.
- 4. Program Budgets. Budgets for expenditures for program for the District and the Conference shall be coordinated by the Conference Council on Ministries. The Conference Council on Ministries shall make recommendations to the Council on Finance and Administration which shall make a final recommendation to the Annual Conference.
- 5. Conference Treasurer. The Council on Finance and Administration shall set the salary and provide for the expenses of the Conference Treasurer and make arrangements for paying the same, subject to the action of the Annual Conference. The Annual Conference shall assign the duties, responsibilities, and the headquarters city, of the Conference Treasurer on recommendation of the Council or Figure 2.

and Administration, in keeping with the provisions of the Discipline.

- 6. District Fund. The District Stewards shall estimate and allocate to the several charges an amount necessary for district parsonage and other necessary district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and pay it out on order of the District Superintendent. The treasurer of the district fund shall report to the District Stewards annually, showing receipts and disbursements. Funds budgeted by the District Council on Ministries will be paid by the District Treasurer upon action of the District Council on Ministries and the approval of the District Superintendent.
- 7. Apportionments Based on Pastor's Salary. On all items apportioned to local churches by means of a percentage of the minister's salary, such percentage shall be understood to apply to all ministerial members of the local church staff serving under the appointment of the Bishop and District Superintendent, including ministers in full connection, ministers on trial, and full-time Lay Pastors.
- 8. Requests for financial support by the Conference, when not presented to the Conference by the Council on Finance and Administration, shall lay on the table for twenty-four hours prior to a vote being taken. This rule may be suspended by a ¾ vote of the Conference. It does not preclude a Council on Finance and Administration recommendation being amended.

#### III. Conference Procedure

- 1. Rules of Order. The Rules of Order shall be Roberts Rules of Order revised.
- 2. Reports and Resolutions. There shall be a pre-conference report which shall contain reports of all the boards and agencies of the Conference. This report shall be mailed to each member of the Little Rock Conference at least 30 days before the annual session. The Conference Secretary shall be the editor of this publication, in the pre-conference reports shall be typewritten, in triplicate, on special forms furnished by the Conference and obtained from the Conference Secretary. In the event editing of a report is deemed necessary by the Conference Secretary and Chairman of the Board involved, permission is hereby granted.

3. Conference Expense Fund.

- (a) Registration fees and offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be administered by the Conference Treasurer and shall be used to defray the expenses of the session.
- (b) The Conference shall meet on a self-entertainment plan, except that the entertainment of the retired ministers shall be paid from the Conference Expense Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall pay a per diem for days actually in attendance directly to the retired ministers and be reimbursed from the Conference Expense Fund. Eligibility shall be determined by the Conference Board of Pensions.
- (c) Any deficit in the Conference Expense Fund shall be made up from the Conference Administrative Fund.
- (d) The Conference Expense Fund shall be administered by the Committee on the Annual Conference.
- 4. Unsponsored Resolutions. Any resolution not sponsored by a regular board or standing committee of the Conference must lie over for twenty-four hours before being debated and acted upon, provided, however, immediate debate and action may be ordered by two-thirds vote of the Conference present and voting.
- 5. Memoirs. There shall be published in the Journal a memoir of each deceased clerical member of the Conference, containing date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, charges served, and place of burial. A picture of the deceased shall be published with the memoir. The same shall be done for probationary members, associate members and lay pastors. Likewise, a memoir of wives or widows of the above shall be published in the Journal. The District Superintendents shall report to the Sub-committee on Memoirs the death of any of the above mentioned and be responsible for the submission of mem-

oirs not later than thirty days after the death occurs. The names or memoirs of deceased laymen who have been active in the Conference sessions, or served on Conference Boards or as officials of Conference institutions may be published in the Journal. The District Superintendent shall be responsible for securing the memoirs for laymen whose memoirs shall be published. It shall be the duty of the District Superintendents to report to the Chairman of the Conference Board of Pensions the death of any conference claimant that occurs in their respective districts.

#### 6. Historical Material.

- (a) The Library at Hendrix College shall be the depository for all historical documents and artifacts of the Little Rock Conference. The College Librarian shall be the custodian of these historical materials.
- (b) The Commission on Archives and History shall be responsible for securing a group picture of each class admitted into full connection for publication in the Journal and also two small pictures of each clerical member at the time of his retirement.
- 7. Unbudgeted Expenditures. When any proposal is submitted to the Annual Conference which involves the expenditure of funds not included in the established budget, such a proposal shall be referred for advice and recommendation to the Council on Finance and Administration and brought back to the same session of the Annual Conference for a vote to be taken by the Conference.
- 8. Campaigns. All Conference-wide campaigns to raise funds shall be voted on by secret ballot of the Conference.

#### IV. Amendments.

These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.


