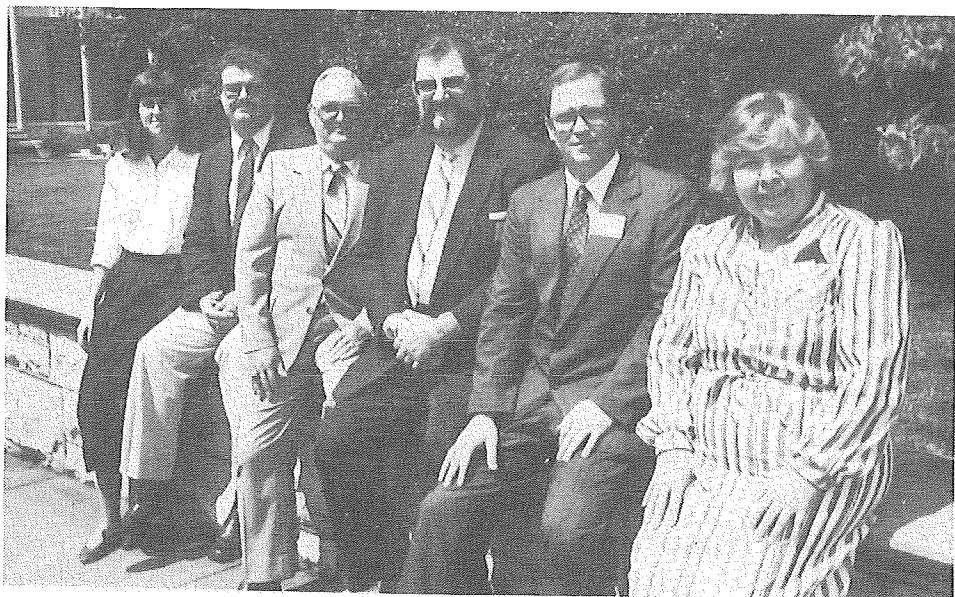

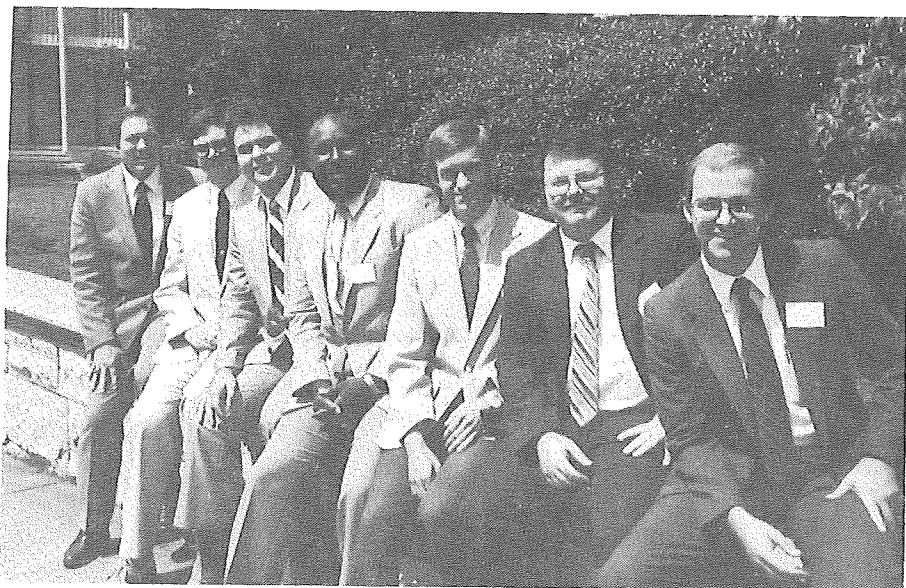

Monday Morning, June 8, 1987 — 8:15 a.m.

The preacher was Chester Jones. The liturgist was Joe F. Wilkerson. The prayer was offered by Chester Jones. The Organist was Carolyn Appling of the First United Methodist Church in Hot Springs.

The One hundred and thirty-fourth session of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church was called to order at 9:00 a.m. in the Sanctuary of First United Methodist Church, Hot Springs, Arkansas.

Bishop Wilke called on the Secretary of the Conference, David Prothro, for those matters that need to be dealt with in order to organize the Conference business.

The Secretary moved that the agenda be adopted with the provision that it can be adjusted as the need arises. He placed the following names in nomination as tellers for the 1987 Conference session: Robert W. Trieschmann, Head Teller, Dale Diffie, James Polk, Michael Walsh, Tyrone Gordon and Gerald Myers. He also placed in nomination the following as secretarial staff: John O. Alston, Journal Clerk; Patricia Parker, Transcriptionist.

Other instructions given by the Secretary, "The official roll call will be taken from the pre-registration slips. I hope that each member (clerical and lay) sent in the pre-registration information or has registered properly since arriving at Conference. The information contained on the slips will be used to record your name, address, and attendance at Conference and will be printed in the 1987 Journal as submitted.

The Secretary moved the Bar of the Conference be as follows: From the front of the church to the rear of the Sanctuary, the center section be included; each side section from the front of the church to the marble columns be included also. Visitors are given the privilege to sit within the Bar of the Conference without vote. Please wear your identification badge at all times. It is an indication of your right to vote.

Forms are available on which to record any motion, amendment, substitute motion or resolution. These forms must be used to record said information either before the action is proposed, or immediately following the proposal being made or acted upon. The form is then delivered to the Secretary for inclusion in the Journal. This is the only form the Conference Secretary will accept for the official record and minutes.

The Secretary stated it was his wish that the minister's service record be as accurate as possible. The 1986 Journal is available at the Secretary's desk for reference. Please inform the Secretary of any corrections that should be made. Persons transferring into the Little Rock Annual Conference from another Conference, or those whose status is changed at this Conference — newly elected deacons, elders, new diaconal ministers, etc. need to report to the Secretary.

The Secretary reminded the Conference that the bulletin board in the Sanctuary would be

used for emergency messages and the board in Fellowship Hall could be used to post or receive messages. He asked that these boards be checked periodically during Conference. He also reminded the Conference that the offerings received at the worship services during Conference would be used toward the expenses incurred by this church in hosting this Annual Conference.

The Secretary made a motion that the agenda, the tellers, the Secretary's Staff and his recommendations be accepted. His motion was seconded and passed. John P. Miles moved the whole Sanctuary be the Bar of the Conference. This motion was seconded and passed.

Maxine Howell nominated Barbara Douglas as an additional teller. The nomination was approved.

Greetings were extended from other Annual Conferences.

Jay Lofton made a motion to suspend C. 4. in the Standing Rules.

STANDING RULES

C. Conference Procedure

4. Conference Expense Fund

- a. Registration fees and offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be administered by the Conference Treasurer and shall be used to defray expenses of the session.

He moved "for the suspension of this rule and the Conference Treasurer be instructed to forward the offering received at the Sunday night Communion Service to the Methodist Church of South Africa in response to the appeal to Bishop Wilke from Bishop Ben Olinphint." The motion was seconded and carried.

The Conference Secretary stated, concerning the casting of ballots: "Separate ballot books will be issued to clergy voters and lay voters. The clergy ballot book will be blue. The lay ballot book will be white. In case the lay delegate has to be away from the floor of the Conference, the ballot book can be used by the alternate lay delegate. However, only one vote is to be cast by a church delegation per ballot."

"We are electing delegates to General Conference and Jurisdictional Conference. In accordance with paragraph 37-39 of the Constitution, the Jurisdictional delegates 'shall in the order of their election be the reserve delegates to the General Conference.' According to our clergy membership and lay membership we will be electing 14 delegates, 7 clergy and 7 lay. The first 4 elected in each category will be the delegates to General Conference. The next 3 elected will be the delegates to Jurisdictional Conference only, but will be the reserve delegates to General Conference. Therefore, vote for 4 (to go to General Conference) on your first ballot. When 4 clergy and 4 lay have been elected, we will then elect the Jurisdictional delegates. When all delegates have been elected, we will then elect 3 alternate delegates to the Jurisdictional Conference. In order of election, this person or persons would serve should there be the need.

A discussion was held concerning vote of diaconal ministers and whether or not their votes will be used to balance the Conference between lay and clergy as a part of the lay vote. Bishop Wilke asked that the vote of the diaconal ministers be researched.

Bishop Wilke reported on those who have transferred in to the Little Rock Annual Conference: Leonard Nash, Allan Hilliard, Jim Southerland, Glenn Pettus, Chris Cooper, Ed Wyers and Richard Stegall. Those who have transferred out of the Little Rock Conference are: Nick Evans, Gary Goldman, William Haltom, Shelton Kilgore, Ed Matthews, Ed Warren, Jack Wilson and Kay Evans.

John Hays, host pastor, welcomed the Conference. He introduced Jim Tarkington, Chairperson of the Administrative Board of First United Methodist Church, who offered a welcome from First UMC to the members of the Conference.

David Wilson stated a valid ballot must be numbered, the ballot must contain the exact number of candidates and the first and last names of the candidates must be spelled correctly.

The vote of the diaconal ministers was discussed further. Charles Murry made a motion

that in accord with #309 diaconal ministers have voice and vote in this Annual Conference. Bishop Wilke asked that Julia Wilke be introduced. Bob Trieschmann escorted Mrs. Wilke to the front of the Sanctuary and presented her with a corsage.

Charles Murry withdrew his motion.

The Conference moved to a recess.

The Conference was reconvened after recess at 10:15 a.m.

Research confirmed that diaconal ministers are full members of the Annual Conference on the lay side with full voice and vote.

Mike Parker introduced two candidates for Diaconal Ministers: James R. (Rusty) Johnson and Laura McDonald. It was voted to accept the two candidates.

First ballots for both lay and clergy delegates were taken.

Conference Secretary, David Prothro made a motion that on the first ballot names receiving two or more votes will be read. On succeeding ballots the names of those who received 5 or more votes will be read. The motion was passed.

Bishop Wilke gave the Episcopal Address (see reports).

John Hays presented the report of the Board of Ordained Ministry with noted changes and made a motion that the report be accepted. The motion was seconded and the report was approved.

Presented to Conference were: Associate Members — Franklin M. Maples, Everett M. Dobson; Probationary Members — Valarie Duncan, Thomas F. Hazelwood, Russell Ray Moore, Leslee L. Phillips and Lawrence A. Ferguson; Full Members — Bruce W. Bennett, Gary F. Harrison, James D. Kassos, C. E. McAdoo, Jim P. Polk, George R. Williams, C. D. Wornack. The Bishop asked historic questions, responses were given and all were welcomed to the Conference.

Bill Haake presented the statistical report and his report was accepted. (See reports.) Merle Peterson, Chairman of the Board of Pensions, presented the report with change on page 30, line 11 of the Pre-Conference Journal.

2. Amend the membership of the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries, page 8, Little Rock Annual Conference Structure, by adding after "at-large" the following: "one of which shall be selected by the Board as the Volunteers in Missions Coordinator." The sentence would then read; and eight members at-large, one of which shall be selected by the Board as the Volunteers in Missions Coordinator. (Sponsored by the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries.)

3. Amend the membership of the Conference Nominating Committee, page 13, Little Rock Annual Conference Structure, by the addition of **One Ethnic At-Large Member of the Committee**, to be elected by the Conference Nominating Committee. (Sponsored by the Conference Nominating Committee.)

Kurt Boggan presented a report of the Committee on Review. A motion was made to approve the first paragraph of the Committee on Review report. The motion was seconded and passed. It was moved by Bob Regnier that the report of the Committee on Review on the proposal for a staff position on Cooperative Parish Ministries be sent back to the Com-

mittee for further study to be brought back to the 1988 session by the Committee on Review. His motion was seconded and passed.

Dianna Kinsey presented the report of the Commission on Religion and Race. A resolution was made by the Commission to petition the 1987 Annual Conference to present to the United Methodist General Board of Pensions concerning the South African investments.

PETITION TO THE 1987 ANNUAL CONFERENCE SESSION SOUTH AFRICA AND THE GENERAL BOARD OF PENSIONS

Whereas South African Christian leaders are urging stiff economic sanctions against South Africa's apartheid system; and

Whereas the Sullivan Principles for U.S. corporate workplace conduct, upon which the General Board of Pensions (GBP) has based its strategy for encouraging change in South Africa, have, as of May, 1987, been superseded by their originator Dr. Leon Sullivan in favor of a call to end all U.S. corporate ties with South Africa; and

Whereas the pension board continues to hold and even to expand its investments in companies doing business in South Africa; and

Whereas socially responsible investing must take cognizance of a range of justice and peace concerns;

Therefore the Little Rock Annual Conference

- A. Registers great dismay at the continued intransigence of the GBP regarding the call for economic sanctions and for U.S. corporations to withdraw from South Africa, and
- B. Strongly urges the GBP to take decisive action at its July 7-9, 1987, meeting, including to:
 1. urge all South Africa-related corporations in which the GBP invests to cut all business ties with white-controlled South Africa, including licensing and franchises;
 2. divest by the end of 1987 from any of these major strategic corporate supporters of apartheid whose stocks are held by the GBP: Unisys, Chevron, Citicorp, Control Data, Exxon, Fluor, GE, GM, IBM, Mobil, Newmont Mining, Shell and Texaco;
 3. exclude from their investment universe for new companies doing business in South Africa;
 4. move beyond consideration of South Africa-free funds and instead make the entire portfolio socially responsible;
 5. join and fully participate in the ecumenical corporate responsibility network coordinated through the Interfaith Council for Corporate Responsibility; and
 6. provide adequate staff services to enable the board to accomplish the above and to establish our pension board as the leader in its field in socially responsible investing, especially in relation to South Africa, nuclear weapons, human rights, consumer protection, environmental presentation, and equal employment opportunity.

WHEREAS the General Commission on the Status and Roll of Women has openly stated its intention to propose legislation to the 1988 General Conference which would change the Discipline of the United Methodist Church so that it would (1) not prohibit the ordination of homosexuals, (2) nor restrict the use of funds to promote the acceptance of homosexuality; and

WHEREAS the General Commission on the Status of Role of Women has further stated its intention to change the social principles of the United Methodist Church so that it would not say "... we do not condone the practice of homosexuality and consider their practice incompatible with Christian teachings";

BE IT, therefore, resolved that Little Rock Annual Conference request that the 1988 General Conference not change any part of the 1984 Discipline concerning homosexuality.

Charles Murry moved this resolution be tabled until it is printed and returned tomorrow for consideration. Charles Murry's resolution was seconded and passed.

Jim Wilson, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Camp Tanako, introduced Terry Everett, Superintendent of the Camp. Jim Wilson presented the report on Camp Tanako. This report replaces the Pre-Conference Journal report. The report was accepted.

Dr. Alvin Murray introduced a guest, Ms. Deanda Socorro, Business Manager from Lydia Patterson Institute, who presented the report of Lydia Patterson. The report was accepted.

The report from Philander Smith College was presented. The report was accepted.

The results of Ballot #4 for the laity were reported. There were 162 valid ballots cast. There was no election.

The results of Ballot #4 for the clergy were reported. There were 128 valid ballots cast. John P. Miles was elected.

Roger Armstrong moved that Ballot #5 be sealed and reported on Tuesday, June 9. The motion was seconded and passed.

MOTION: It is recommended that paragraph 726.5 be amended

by adding 5d — “There shall be organized in each Annual Conference an Ethnic Minority Local Church Concerns Committee which shall be representative of all conference agencies for the implementation of the Conference’s Comprehensive Plan.”

This Committee shall be composed of 1/3 laywomen, 1/3 laymen, 1/3 clergy, of whom 50% shall be racial/ethnic minority persons. It shall also include a representative of the Cabinet.

The Conference Ethnic Minority Local Church Concerns Committee shall develop a comprehensive and holistic plan to be implemented by the Conference Council on Ministries. The Committee shall also develop criteria for the evaluation of programs and projects, to be used in its reports to the Conference Council on Ministries.

It is recommended that an amount of money equal to the apportioned funds retained for the “Missional Priority” emphasis, during the past quadrennium, be designated to the Ethnic Minority Local Church Concerns Committee.

RATIONALE: As a result of emphasis on Ethnic Minority local churches, all of God’s children will have the opportunity to develop their abilities and contribute to the total church.

He introduced Martha Faulker to the Conference; she addressed: 1) Superserve '87; 2) the draft of a petition to General Conference to authorize the continuation of the Africa Church Growth and Development Program; 3) the Global Gathering in Louisville, Kentucky. The report and petition were approved.

WHEREAS

The General Conferences of 1980 and 1984 approved and provided funding channels for a program known as Africa Church Growth and Development with components of:

- evangelism and community development,
- leadership development, and
- church construction, and

LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE

WHEREAS

The Africa Church Growth and Development Program has proved to be a justified "new model" for serving both existing and new opportunities and challenges of church growth and development, offering opportunities for self-determination and mutual sharing and cooperation of United Methodist churches in Africa, Europe, and United States of America, and

WHEREAS

Continuation of this program is vital to the churches Africa, Europe and the USA.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

that THE LITTLE ROCK ANNUAL CONFERENCE does hereby recommend that the General Conference of 1988 authorize the continuation of the Africa Church Growth and Development Program as a global program, covering Africa, Europe, and the United States of America with undergirding through the Advance For Christ and His Church and with programmatic relationship through the General Board of Global Ministries (GBGM), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED

that this program report to the 1992 General Conference through the GBGM reporting system.

Mort Cox reported on Adult Education and the report was approved. The results of Ballot #11 for the laity were reported. There were 147 valid ballots cast. There was no election. The results of Ballot #11 for the clergy were reported. There were 117 valid ballots cast. There was no election.

Marilynn Loyd, Don Armstrong and Norman Carter presented Resolution #1 for COSROW which had been tabled overnight. The resolution passed.

RESOLUTION #1

WHEREAS the General Commission on the Status and Role of Women has openly stated its intention to propose legislation to the 1988 General Conference which would change the Discipline of the United Methodist Church so that it would (1) not prohibit the ordination of homosexuals, (2) nor restrict the use of funds to promote the acceptance of homosexuality; and

WHEREAS the General Commission on the Status of Role of Women has further stated its intention to change the social principles of the United Methodist Church so that it would not say "... we do not condone the practice of homosexuality and consider their practice incompatible with Christian teachings";

BE IT, therefore, resolved that Little Rock Annual Conference request that the 1988 General Conference not change any part of the 1984 Discipline concerning homosexuality.

Dr. Joe Clark presented the report of the Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry. College students were introduced by Foundation ministers. Bob Trieschmann introduced Rob Walker from Henderson State University. Joe Arnold introduced Rusty Jones and Lynn Smith from SAU. Tom Abney introduced Kim Marcussen from UAM and Darrell Bone introduced Conrad Tarrvin from UALR.

C. E. McAdoo was acknowledged as minister of the Ecumenical Ministry to students at UAPB. Bill Robinson moved that a committee be formed by the Bishop to study the feasi-

bility of a Wesley Foundation at UAPB. The motion carried. The total report of the Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry was accepted.

The results of Ballot #12 for the laity were reported. There were 146 valid ballots cast. There was no election. The results of Ballot #12 for the clergy were reported. There were 110 valid ballots cast. Chester Jones was elected.

Tom Abney introduced committee members and Mary Lois Stanfield and presented the report of the Committee on Insurance. David Prothro reviewed the insurance booklets for 1987 which were mailed to participants in the program. Three items were brought to the attention of the Conference as instrumental in keeping the program advantageous: 1. Over the past three years there has been a 5% net increase in premium costs; 2. prompt and coordinated efforts by the cabinet have been made to help delinquent become current; and, 3. there has been conservative and reliable handling of funds.

Gene Harwood will coordinate a Health Fair at Annual Conference next year. It was reported the Committee has compared other insurance programs. The Committee recommends ministers enroll in Social Security. This portion of the report is passed.

An insurance resolution by Tom Abney, tabled from Monday, June 8, was presented. A motion by Joe Woodward was made to table, refer to CFA for study and return on Wednesday morning. The motion carried.

Jay Lofton, Conference Council on Ministries, presented the CCOM budget for 1988 with the Arkansas United Methodist newspaper change. The report of the CCOM Budget was adopted. Three proposed amendments to Little Rock Conference Structure which lay on the table from Monday were presented and adopted.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The following proposed amendments to the **Little Rock Annual Conference Structure** are submitted for consideration by the members of the 1987 session of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

1. Amend the membership of the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries, page 8, Little Rock Annual Conference Structure, to include the **Conference Secretary of Global Ministries** as a member of the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries. (Sponsored by the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries.)

2. Amend the membership of the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries, page 8, Little Rock Annual Conference Structure, by adding after "at-large" the following: **"one of which shall be selected by the Board as the Volunteers in Missions Coordinator."** The sentence would then read: and eight members at-large, one of which shall be selected by the Board as the Volunteers in Missions Coordinator. (Sponsored by the Conference Council Board of Global Ministries.)

3. Amend the membership of the Conference Nominating Committee, page 13, Little Rock Annual Conference Structure, by the addition of **One Ethnic At-Large Member of the Committee**, to be elected by the Conference Nominating Committee. (Sponsored by the Conference Nominating Committee.)

Sam Albright presented the report of Church and Society and the report was adopted. The results of Ballot #13 for the laity was reported. There were 147 valid ballots cast. There was no election. The results of Ballot #13 for the clergy were reported. There were 114 valid ballots cast. There was no election. Ralph Hale moved Ballot #14 be sealed and ready for counting at the opening session on Wednesday. The motion passed.

John Christie moved the Standing Rules be suspended and that his resolution be considered now.

The Little Rock Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church directs its council office, in consultation with representatives of the Arkan-

sas AIDS Foundation, to select and distribute appropriate materials regarding the growing Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome epidemic analysis — so that UM pastors can begin to serve as reliable sources of accurate information concerning AIDS.

Furthermore the AC urges each clergy and layperson to familiarize themselves with the relevant factual data, so that our ministry in this crisis may begin to be adequate to the task.

Bob Trieschmann introduced Jim Beal, President of the Historical Society of Arkansas, and his wife, Mauzel. The Conference session was closed with a prayer by Clint Burleson.

The Order Of Worship For The Consecration Of Diaconal Ministers And The Ordination Of Deacons And Elders

The preacher was Dr. Fred B. Craddock. Bishop Richard Wilke consecrated the diaconal ministers and ordained the deacons and elders. Assisting in the consecration was Mike Parker, chairperson of the Board of Diaconal Ministry. Assisting in the ordination was John Hays, chairperson of the Board of Ordained Ministry and Charles Murry, registrar of the Board of Ordained Ministry. Liturgists were the members of the Cabinet of the Little Rock Conference. The Choir and Brass Quartet were from the First United Methodist Church of Magnolia, Kerry Johnston, Organist and Choirmaster.

The Celebration Of The Word Wednesday Morning, June 10, 1987 — 8:15 a.m.

The preacher was Don Eubanks. The liturgist was Tom Abney. The organist was Carolyn Appling of the First United Methodist Church in Hot Springs. Bishop Wilke called the session to order at 9:00 a.m. following the worship service. The results of Ballot #14 for the laity were reported. There were 134 valid ballots cast. LaVerne Burton was elected. The results of Ballot #14 for the clergy were reported. There were 105 valid ballots cast. John Walker was elected.

Dianna Kinsey introduced a petition concerning South Africa and the General Board of Pensions.

PETITION TO THE 1987 ANNUAL CONFERENCE SESSION SOUTH AFRICA AND THE GENERAL BOARD OF PENSIONS

Whereas South African Christian leaders are urging stiff economic sanctions against South Africa's apartheid system; and

Whereas the Sullivan Principles for U.S. corporate workplace conduct, upon which the General Board of Pensions (GBP) has based its strategy for encouraging change in South Africa, have, as of May, 1987, been superseded by their originator Dr. Leon Sullivan in favor of a call to end all U.S. corporate ties with South Africa; and

Whereas the pension board continues to hold and even to expand its investments in companies doing business in South Africa; and

Whereas socially responsible investing must take cognizance of a range of justice and peace concerns;

Therefore the Little Rock Annual Conference

- A. Registers great dismay at the continued intransigence of the GBP regarding the call for economic sanctions and for U.S. corporations to withdraw from South Africa, and
- B. Strongly urges the GBP to take decisive action at its July 7-9, 1987, meeting, including to:
 1. urge all South Africa-related corporations in which the GBP invests to cut all business ties with white-controlled South Africa, including licensing and franchises;
 2. divest by the end of 1987 from any of these major strategic corporate supporters of apartheid whose stocks are held by the GBP;

- Unisys, Chevron, Citicorp, Control Data, Exxon, Fluor, GE, GM, IBM, Mobil, Newmont Mining, Shell and Texaco;
3. exclude from their investment universe for new companies doing business in South Africa;
 4. move beyond consideration of South Africa-free funds and instead make the entire portfolio socially responsible;
 5. join and fully participate in the ecumenical corporate responsibility network coordinated through the Interfaith Council for Corporate Responsibility; and
 6. provide adequate staff services to enable the board to accomplish the above and to establish our pension board as the leader in its field in socially responsible investing, especially in relation to South Africa, nuclear weapons, human rights, consumer protection, environmental presentation, and equal employment opportunity.

The conference secretary is requested to mail this resolution to the UM General Board of Pensions (c/o Rev. James Parker, General Secretary, 1200 Davis St., Evanston, IL 60201) in time for consideration at the July 7-9, 1987 meeting.

Dianna Kinsey presented a summary of the petition and moved for the adoption of the resolution to General Conference. The vote was 134 for and 115 against. The petition was adopted.

Richard Lancaster made a motion that the Commission on Religion and Race provide a list to local churches of corporations doing business in South Africa which the General Board of Pensions has invested in, so that individuals within local churches may make a stand of conscience through boycott and influence with these corporations. The motion carried. George Kerr made a motion that the vote regarding requesting the General Conference to request that the Board of Pension withdraw funds and boycott those corporations who do business with South Africa have the number for and against submitted to the General Conference when the resolution is submitted. The motion carried.

The Nominating Committee Report was approved with changes after being tabled overnight. The report of the Committee on Archives and History was presented by Ruth Cobb. The report was approved. The results of Ballot #15 for laity were reported. There were 118 valid ballots cast. Maxine Calloway-Waller was elected. The results of Ballot #15 for clergy were reported. There were 96 valid ballots cast. There was no election.

Gerald Myers gave the report of the Equitable Salaries Committee. The minimum salary is changed to read: \$16,500 for Full-Time, \$11,900 for Resident Student, \$9,800 for Non-Resident Student and \$11,000 Base Salary. The report was approved as amended. John Ross, Secretary of the Conference Trustees, presented the Trustees report. The report was accepted. Bishop Wilke announced. Alvin Murray was elected as the new Dean of the Cabinet.

David Wilson reported the Wilton United Methodist Church has asked for approval to discontinue the congregation. This request was approved. Janis Rogers, Administrative Secretary to Bishop Wilke, was introduced to the Conference by the Bishop.

Roger Armstrong read the awards for the United Methodist Rural Fellowship.

Charles Ashcraft, CFA Chairman, introduced Joe Woodward who introduced Tom Abney of the Insurance Committee. Add the following: "columns 35, 36, 38, 39, 40 and 41." Charles Murry moved that the previous motion (by Mike Clayton) be referred to CFA for study and report to the Conference in 1988. Charles Murry's motion passed. Tom Abney made a motion to change the CFA report as follows: "That the category of Higher Education and Campus Ministries, item Wesley Foundation, be changed to reflect the existence of the UAPB Campus Ministry and its funding by adding the item UAPB Campus Ministry." The motion was passed.

Don Wilson made a motion that the 1988 budget format for paying apportionments remain in the form of the 1987 budget format. After discussion David Steele moved the question. His motion was passed. The standing vote on Don Wilson's motion was 116 for and 150 against. Bob Scott made a motion to add "and may be accepted by the local church" to

"W," p. 7 of the CFA report. Jeff McElroy made a substitute motion to delete "W," page 7 of the CFA report. Norman Carter moved "to refer substitute motion to eliminate 'W' from the CFA report to CFA for study and report back to 1988 Annual Conference." The standing vote on Norman Carter's motion was 156 for and 69 against. John Hays made a motion "That the Conference Secretary in consultation with CFA be instructed to list 'Apportioned' and 'Paid' on each apportionment and fair share category beginning with the 1988 Journal and subsequent journals." The motion passed.

The results of Ballot #17 for the laity were reported. There were 120 valid ballots cast. There was no election. The results of Ballot #17 for the clergy were reported. There were 116 valid ballots cast. Alvin C. Murray was elected. Ballots #18 for clergy and laity were taken. John Walker moved "that one ballot be taken and that the three persons receiving the most votes be elected alternate delegates to Jurisdictional Conference." John Hays called for division of the house for clergy to vote on this motion. This motion passed. John Walker's motion passed.

John Hays made a motion the Session of Conference be extended until the business of the Conference was completed. The motion carried. Bob Langley moved the previous question on all CFA report. The motion carried. The full CFA report, as amended, was passed. Bishop Wilke stated he would appoint the Committee to study the Ecumenical Ministry at UAPB within the next three weeks.

Ray Bates presented a resolution by Robin Wynne which had been tabled overnight.

RESOLUTION

Whereas, in 1980 Congress enacted legislation requiring that each state manage and dispose of low-level radioactive waste produced in each state.

And, Whereas in 1983 the State of Arkansas enacted legislation joining the Central Interstate Low-Level Radioactive Waste Compact consisting of 5 states — Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Kansas and Nebraska to jointly develop a facility.

And, Whereas each state is refusing to allow the development of a low-level radioactive waste disposal and management facility.

And, Whereas if each of the 50 states develops its own facility there would exist a proliferation of low-level radioactive waste facilities causing irreparable harm and damage to our environment.

And, Whereas this is a national problem and should be dealt with on a national level to prevent proliferation of such facilities.

Therefore, be it resolved that the Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church urges Congress to immediately readdress and reconsider the management and disposal of low-level radioactive waste and do the utmost to resolve the problem and prevent any irreparable harm and damage to our environment.

Further, we are opposed to nuclear dumps in that they have potential power to destroy God's creation.



Bishop Wilke called the Conference back to session after recess. The results of Ballot #19 for the laity were reported. There were 97 valid ballots cast. Mike Parker, Grady May and Dale Booth were elected. The appointments for the coming year were read by Bishop Wilke. Following a prayer by the Bishop, the Conference stood to sing, "A Charge to Keep I Have" led by Varnell Norman. The 134th Session of the Little Rock Conference was adjourned with a Benediction by Bishop Wilke.

The Special Sesquicentennial Conference of the Arkansas Area comprised of the North Arkansas and the Little Rock Annual Conference. Representatives from the Louisiana Annual Conference and the Oklahoma Indian Missionary Conference were present. These areas were a part of the old Arkansas Conference in 1836. The table used by the Secretaries was a special table made from pieces of wood from church buildings in the early years of the Methodist work in Arkansas. It was first used at the Centennial (1936) Celebration of the Conference.

Call To Order: Bishop Richard B. Wilke called the session to order with the traditional singing of the Wesleyan Hymn "And Are We Yet Alive."

Opening Prayer: The Reverend George Duerson, Superintendent of the Alexandria District, the Louisiana Conference gave the prayer.

Greetings: Bishop Richard Wilke read greetings from the Council of Bishops meeting at Lake Junaluska North Carolina.

Greetings From The Governor: Aubrey Kay Nixon, Daughter of the Reverend and Mrs. Victor Nixon brought greetings from Governor Bill Clinton.

Organization Of The Conference: Bishop Wilke recognized Charles E. Watt, Secretary of the North Arkansas Conference and David Prothro, Secretary of the Little Rock Conference for the purpose of setting the Bar of the Conference and other organizational matters. The Conference was organized.

Historical Questions Of 1836: Bishop Wilke asked the historic questions:

Answer: William G. Duke and Daniel Sears — 2.

Question #7: Who are the Supernumerary Preachers?

Answer: William Stevenson and Lemuel Wakelee — 2.

- Question #8: Who are the Superannuated Preachers?
 Answer: None
- Question #9: Who have been expelled from the connection this year?
 Answer: None.
- Question #10: Who have withdrawn from the connection this year?
 Answer: None.
- Question #11: Were all the preachers character examined?
 Answer: This was strictly attended to by calling over their names before the Conference.
- Question #12: Who have died this year?
 Answer: None.

Questions #6-12 were answered by the Reverend John B. Hayes, Chairperson of the Little Rock Conference Board of Ordained Ministry.

Question #14: What amounts are necessary for the Superannuate preachers and the widows and the orphans of preachers; and to make up the deficiencies of those who have not obtained their regular allowance on their Circuits.

A Time To Go Deep

Religion is in the news daily, and the news is mostly bad. Religion commands the headlines, but those headlines cause us to hang our heads.

Jim and Tammy Bakker, Assembly of God, are defrocked because of sexual impropriety, drug use and cover up kick backs.

Jerry Falwell, Baptist, moves in to the multimillion dollar empire, accused of unfriendly takeover in a holy war.

Oral Roberts, a pentecostal and a Methodist, declares himself a hostage of God, in danger of death if \$8 million does not come in within thirty days.

Closer to home, Southern Methodist University, my alma mater, is racked by scandal, payments to athletes inviolation of NCAA, and worse, lies by a few leading trustees.

Our dear friends and colleagues, Peggy and Walker Railey are in hospitals in Dallas this morning — Peggy in a coma after having been strangled in her own garage; Walker under a doctor's care after trying to take his own life with an overdose of medication.

Retired Bishop Crutchfield dies of AIDS with a swirl of innuendo and rumor around his grave.

Most of us in recent days have felt sick in the pit of our stomachs. It is easy to become discouraged; to drift into cynicism; to pray with tears in our eyes; even to wander the dark and deadly path of disillusion and despair.

So, my word to the Church is:

It is a great time to go deep!

It is an appropriate time to claim our spiritual birthright. In a world shaking at the foundations, now is the hour to remember who is our true foundation. It is time to reaffirm what we really believe as Christian people.

Let me show you what I mean:

A. We believe in sin; sin in the world; sin in the human condition; sin in all human affairs; sin in every man and woman; sin in ourselves.

For a couple of generations, we Methodists have acted as if sin were as superficial as smoking cigars behind the barn, courting in the back seat of a car, or getting drunk on Saturday night.

Once again we are confronted by corruption. Our institutions, government, business and church are contaminated by greed and lust and self-seeking.

Our forebears were not so far wrong as we thought when they believed with the Bible that "we have all sinned and fallen short of the glory of God."

We are preparing to celebrate the creation of the Constitution of the United States of America, one of the most remarkable documents ever to appear in the annals of history. Who wrote it? People who believed in sin. Calvinists who understood the serious depravity of human nature. Free thinkers who distrusted every form of unrestricted authority.

They didn't trust any person or any organization completely. That is why they separated the powers: the administrative, the legislative, the judicial — each looking over the shoulder of the other. Congress divided into House and Senate, elected. Court appointed for life. Certain rights granted to the states. Church and state separate to be in constant tension with one another.

Even right now the Congress is calling on the carpet the Administration's activities in Central America. (I might say: if the Administration had listened to our missionaries and religious workers in Nicaragua, they would not be in the mess they are in.)

Our country and our United Methodist Church is built on a deep fear of evil, believing that "power corrupts, and absolute power corrupts absolutely."

Greed for money can infect the church. One reason I am pleased to work in the United Methodist Church is the careful way every local church and every institution has its books

audited, always by qualified laity. A financial scandal in Methodism is most unusual because we systematically hold each other accountable. The greed of the TV evangelists occurred because they were accountable to no one.

Lust for power can infect the church. Many times, as a bishop, I recognize how little power I have — no voice, no vote ever again in any conference of the church. But we know that bishops are sinners too, and thus have the Discipline, the Judicial council, and the conferences looking over their shoulders. Those whom you elect to General Conference will write the law book of our church under which we all serve.

The church is impacted by social structures that debilitate and dehumanize. Racial injustice plagues us still. With our lips we quote our Bible, "God is no respecter of persons," but doors to our churches and our institutions are opened barely a crack. I am happy that many congregations are now interracial, even though modestly so. I am gratified that a few black laypersons participate in active growing, predominantly white congregations and that a few white individuals belong to predominantly ethnic churches. A black youth worker here, a black council director there, a black intern here, a white pastor of a black church there, a fully integrated congregation here, a daycare center with all kinds of nationalities and ethnic backgrounds, a board of trustees with ethnic presence. It is encouraging, but still we are structurally saturated by the sin of the centuries.

Women have historically been hindered, demand to a lesser state. But wherever Jesus Christ has touched people, women have been lifted into partnership.

"In Christ there is neither male nor female," wrote Paul.

I am pleased that women in ministry are making a powerful contribution to United Methodism. I work side by side with two brilliant women bishops, Judith Craig of Michigan and Leontine Kelly of California. Most conferences have some women as district superintendents. I am proud of every woman who pastors a church in Arkansas. They show that the prophet Joel was inspired when he said God would pour out God's Spirit on all flesh and both sons and daughters will prophesy.

Yet each year at appointment time, some church will refuse an appointment because the minister is a woman — and sinful stereotypic thinking is still with us.

We are the children of Adam and Eve. We ought not to be surprised by sin in any of its malicious forms, for we struggle not against flesh and blood, but against the spiritual rulers of darkness. We are broken and twisted and bent. No longer do I blush to sing those words in Amazing Grace, "that saved a wretch like me." When I look in my heart, I know it is true.

We live in a world where the prophets are stoned, where Christ is crucified, and where you and I walk the precipitous possibilities of heaven and hell. Our Bible prepares us to understand the awful reality of sin in all human hearts and human institutions.

B. Now, in the second place, as we plumb our deepest thoughts, we believe in the mercies of Christ Jesus. We believe in grace. The Methodists are a people defined by grace.

Who does Johnny Carson think Christian people are anyway? Plaster of Paris saints? Hothouse plants who grow only under glass? Goody goody boys and girls who do not bleed when cut, weep when wounded, tremble when tempted, sweat drops of blood when crucifixion looms before us?

Let them come and sing with us our real, bedrock songs of faith, the ones we sing with tears glistening in our eyes.

Rock of Ages cleft for me
Let me hide myself in thee
Let the water and the blood
From thy wounded side which flowed.
Be of sin the double cure
Save from wrath and make me pure.

Or come and sing:

There is a balm in Gilead
To make the wounded whole
There is a balm in Gilead
To heal the sinsick soul.

If we have acted like we are holier than thou, then we need to repent, for as Jesus said, "none are good save God." We are not good, we are God's people. We are sinners saved by grace. It is a time for remembering that. And it is a time for extending that grace.

Never in my life have I been so hurt and offended by judgmentalism. When a Christian minister is wounded, the rumors become vicious and ugly. Church people sometimes degenerate into mob mentality. Someone like Finis Crutchfield or Walker Railey — or your own pastor — falls down, and people, eager to believe the worst, fast to repeat gossip, willing to bear false witness before the facts are in, say scandalous things about which they have no firsthand knowledge. The media has become adept at throwing gasoline on the fire. Let us hold our tongues.

Sometimes I think that a wounded minister is like a bleeding steer crossing a stream filled with piranha fish. Everyone rushes to get a bite.

Then, as we plumb the bedrock of our faith, it is vital that we extend this grace to our neighbors. Tell them they are welcome among the Methodists, even if they've been shamed by public scandal. Run to the prisons and speak of the "Sacred Head Now Wounded." Your most likely converts will be among the poor, for they lack the encrustation of the rich. Your most likely newcomers will be children, for they do not yet exhibit the arrogance of their elders. Many a teenager is so filled with guilt and confused loneliness, that they will give their lives to a compassionate, forgiving Savior.

We need more sermons about the Savior.

In a world gone mad, it is time we remembered that the world has a Savior. "While we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." People think I am interested in church growth. I'm actually interested in conversion, where sinsick people touch the bleeding side of a life changing Savior. Let the United Methodists sing lustily, "I serve a risen Savior. He's in the world today."

I wish the reporters would call me to talk Aldersgate, where blind, or lame, or shaking, or sick children are nurtured. where abused babies are loved. Where grace is shown. I wish reporters would call me to ask about our Children's Homes, where teenagers proudly hold their heads up, lacking strong family foundation, live a Methodist, and grow to be mature adults.

C. Recent events remind us that the local congregation is where the power is greatest. Where do sinners saved by grace receive the Holy Communion? Not from Brother Swagert, but at the communion rail in their local church. The holiest place in all the world is where you baptize babies, offer yourselves in marriage, roll your caskets to the altar, and pledge yourselves to God and the church.

There is something in me that wouldn't preach in the Crystal Cathedral, but God is very real when I preach in the United Methodist Church in Lake Village or in Cotton Plant, Arkansas.

People are saved there — even though it never hits the papers. Lives are changed there, even though it never makes the 10:00 news.

I'm very pleased at 5 Star churches — and for every church that is reaching out. We will thank nearly 150 congregations in Arkansas for striving to have a stronger Sunday School, a more significant membership training program, a more converting congregation.

Everything we do should strengthen the local church. I am pleased that our Lord has chosen men and women to call into the ministry of the gospel. We have 848 congregations in Arkansas. One out of seven has less than 25 members. You cannot imagine how pleased the district superintendents and I will be, when we read the appointments, to have available a pastor for every church and an appointment for every pastor.

Congregations can be sick, of course, and the general decline of our denomination reflects a spiritual malaise that has infected many a worshipping fellowship. Still, I believe an institution like SMU is too far removed from the local church, and I strongly believe the TV evangelists are too distant from the faithful congregations.

The final thing I want to say is this: we are discovering what connectionalism is all about.

Connectionalism is more spiritual than structural. It is more of a covenant than it is a

contract. We United Methodists work together, not merely by law, but by love. Consider the following:

a) We are starting new churches. Throughout the state we are raising money to buy land, help build new structures, and support pastors' salaries of fledgling congregations. No one church can do it alone. There is no way the structures can make it happen. New congregations are begun when a missionary spirit sweeps across the conference.

b) Study of the Bishops' Pastoral Letter on the Nuclear Crisis. I am thrilled that hundreds of churches are taking the Pastoral Letter seriously. Many adult classes are studying the issues of war and peace. Study groups have been formed to evaluate the armaments race and nuclear madness. Why? Because the bishops wrote the letter? Partly. But mostly because we are spiritually united in our hunger and thirst after righteousness. We work together because we believe in being peacemakers.

c) Our ministry to youth waxes and wanes. After a few years of listlessness, a new concern is emerging. We simply must take the challenge of the gospel to the young. Sunday School classes and UMYF's, youth choirs and youth groups, youth camping and work projects must become a top priority for us. It cannot happen by episcopal edict; it will require a unified burst of enthusiasm. Once again, pastors and lay persons will need to give time and energy to the youth program of the conference.

I believe our church is in a moment of renewal. But it will require unity of spirit. Our connectionalism must not be an arena for competition, but an opportunity for cooperation.

So, in a world where the foundations are shaking, let us go deep. Let us reaffirm our profound understanding of sin, reemphasize our belief in grace, remember that the local church is the heartbeat of Methodism, work together in a spiritual connectedness so that we will not be thrown into turmoil or despair. If we build on the Christ who is the true foundation, having done all, we will be able to stand.

Conference Council On Ministries 1987-88

Purpose Statement

The purpose of the Little Rock Conference, the churches and institutions related to the United Methodist Church within the Conference shall be:

1. To communicate the Gospel with the intention of nurturing personal commitment to Jesus Christ and related Christian values.
2. To develop support systems and structures which will contribute to the enrichment of life-in-relationship with God, neighbor, family, environment, society, and one's self.
3. To enable United Methodist Christians to join with others in alleviating human need in ways which lead to self-development and personal achievement.

To assist the fellowship of people called United Methodists in achieving our purpose, we understand our function as a Conference to serve:

1. As PARTNERS with the local churches in discovering, interpreting, and proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ; serving as the body of Christ; and performing the mission of Christ in His world.
2. As PARTNERS with districts, South Central Jurisdiction, and General Church in offering approaches which will enable the identification and implementation of forms of ministries which offer hope and encouragement for the present and future.
3. As PARTNERS with other communions in offering approaches which will enable the identification and implementations of ministries which offer hope and encouragement for the present and future.

Board Of Higher Education And Campus Ministry 1988

The Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry is charged with presenting the financial needs for support of all ministries related to higher education. That responsibility includes Schools, Colleges, Seminaries, Campus Ministries and Wesley Foundations related to the Little Rock Annual Conference. Therefore we present the following recommendations to the Council on Finance and Administration and to the Annual Conference:

1. That an apportionment of \$170,631.00 for Hendrix College be apportioned to the Churches for 1988.
2. That an apportionment of \$160,161.00 for Wesley Foundations be apportioned to the Churches for 1988.
3. That an apportionment of \$5,500.00 for U.A.P.B. Ecumenical Campus Ministry be apportioned to the Churches for 1988.
4. That an apportionment of \$25,000.00 be apportioned to the Churches for support of Philander Smith College for 1988.
5. That an apportionment of \$4,000.00 for support of Scarritt College be apportioned to the Churches for 1988.
6. That full apportionment as requested for the Black College Fund be apportioned to the Churches for 1988.
7. That full apportionment as requested for the Ministerial Education Fund be apportioned to the Churches for 1988.
8. That the practice of Wesley Foundations conducting low-key Capital Funds campaigns for repairs to Wesley Foundation buildings and Parsonages be permitted to continue.

Perkins School Of Theology, Southern Methodist University, Dallas, Texas 75275

Developments this year provided scholarships for students, enhancement of faculty, increased quality of research resources, and improved continuing education opportunities for ministers in service. 131 new students enrolled in the Fall, 1986, including 98 in the M.Div

degree, elevating numbers in that degree to 298. All degrees total 481, compared to 507 last year; 32% women, 15% ethnic or international students.

Churches have contributed to the "Fair Share Goals" campaign authorized by the South Central Jurisdictional Conference for Perkins and St. Paul Schools of Theology. The Ministerial Education Fund provided 66% of annual gifts and grants, or over \$800,000 that constitutes about 20% of the total Perkins budget. Perkins Alumni Loyalty Fund pledges and gifts exceeded \$100,000.

Three strong faculty appointments this year were: Dr. Jouette Bassler, New Testament; Dr. Theodore Walker, Ethics and Society; and the Rev. Mary Lou Santillan Baert, Associate Director of the Intern Program. Dr. Robert Maloy comes on June 1 as Professor of Church History and Director of Bridwell Library. Upon the retirement of Dr. W. Richey Hogg this year, a third world theologian is being sought to enrich Perkins' commitment to the globalization of theological education. Internationalization has expanded to include the first exchange student going this year to the seminary in Costa Rica and the first intern assignment in Mexico.

Perkins faculty serve the church at large: Dr. Richard Heitzenrater in the Commission on the Doctrinal Statement, the Rev. Roger Deschner, Dr. John Holbert, and Scott Jones on Hymnal Revision Committees, Professor Victor Paul Furnish, editor of the *Journal of Biblical Literature*, and Dr. Schubert Ogden, Chair of the Council on Theological Scholarship and Research of the Association of Theological Schools.

Continuing Education offers the second class in the new Doctor of Ministry curriculum this summer, and continues the Spiritual Formation Certificate program, a Senior Pastors' Seminar next January in San Diego, a young pastors Mentor program, a series of Lay Academies in several area cities, plus professional training courses for diaconal ministers, Christian education and music leaders and pastors' Courses of Study.

Saint Paul School Of Theology Kansas City, MO.

As one of the thirteen seminaries of the United Methodist Church, Saint Paul has been training pastors and other leaders for the church for over twenty-five years.

From its beginning, Saint Paul has seen its special ministry to be the training of men and women for local church ministry. More than 1,000 Saint Paul graduates serve in ministry around the world, and twelve of them are members of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

Currently, there are 134 students enrolled in the Master Divinity program at Saint Paul, including one from the Little Rock Annual Conference.

In the 1986-87 school year, Saint Paul welcomed two new members to the faculty. Kristine Culp, Instructor in Theology, is completing her Ph.D. at the University of Chicago in theology. Dr. John R. Levison joined the faculty as the Assistant Professor of New Testament and becomes the first occupant of the Lindsey P. Pherigo Chair in New Testament. In addition, two new persons joined the administration at Saint Paul. Dr. R. Kevin LaGree, a member of the Kansas East Annual Conference, became Vice President for Institutional Advancement. The Rev. James Oman, a member of the Missouri West Annual Conference, became Director of Student Recruitment and Seminary Relations.

Saint Paul renews its commitment to make available to the students and to the church the best foundations of knowledge, skills, and personal wholeness and integrity that can be provided. The support of churches in the Little Rock Annual Conference — through their prayers and financial support — plays a significant part in making that commitment a reality.

Hendrix College

Hendrix College was established by the Methodists of Arkansas a little more than a hundred years ago to mark the centennial of Methodism in this nation. The college is the

church's gift to the state and nation. Thus began a relationship between church and college which has proven to be mutually advantageous. The college gratefully acknowledges this relationship. From our desire to strengthen this relationship, I present the following report to the annual conferences of Arkansas:

Enrollment: Hendrix began the 1986 fall quarter with 1007 students, about equal numbers of male and female (1000 is considered the optimum number). Ninety percent of these students come from Arkansas, 4.3 percent are black, 1.6 percent are international, 35 percent are United Methodists. There are 335 freshmen, 16 transfers, and 16 international students from 11 different countries. Over 80 percent of the students live in college resident halls. They can choose among 409 courses and 23 majors. In 1986-87 seven ministerial students were enrolled. Over 60 percent of the graduates of Hendrix go on to graduate or professional schools.

Tuition: Tuition for the 1986-87 school year was \$4,500; board and room costs average an additional \$2,200, for an average total cost at Hendrix of \$6,800 this past year. Tuition for 1987-88 will be \$4,900.

Student Aid: 67.7 percent of all students receive some form of financial aid, i.e., scholarships, loans, grants, work, etc., amounting to \$2,918,063. Tuition grants to dependents of ministers and to ministerial students amount to \$105,600 this year.

Faculty: Of the 60 full-time and 11 part-time faculty members, 70 percent hold doctorates and 92 percent have appropriate terminal degrees. These teachers bring to their students a broad and deep background of cultural and educational experiences. The college enjoys a 15.8 to 1 faculty/student ratio. Faculty compensation at Hendrix is slightly higher than the other colleges in Arkansas, with the exception of the University of Arkansas.

Financing a Student's Education: Tuition pays for 56.3 percent of the student's education. Endowment income produces 28.1 percent, 12.8 percent comes from gifts, and 2.8 percent from other sources. The market value of the endowment fund on January 31, 1987, was \$43.5 million. In fiscal year 1985-86 the return was 27.6 percent (income and appreciation). Current fund gifts amounted to \$912,499 of which \$281,215 came from the United Methodist churches of Arkansas.

Operating Expenses: The total operating expenses of the college continue to rise, moving from \$9.669 million in 1983-84 to \$10.642 million in 1986-87.

The Campaign for Hendrix: In October of 1986, we officially launched The Campaign for Hendrix with a goal to raise \$16.8 million by 1989, (\$12 million for capital; \$4.8 million for the annual fund). As of February 28, 1987, the college has received in cash and pledges \$8 million toward the goal. Gifts have made possible the completion of a new wing to Couch Hall, providing 50 new beds. Also, the refurbishing of Staples Auditorium and Greene Chapel has begun and will be completed by May of 1988.

In a most satisfying show of confidence, the faculty/staff division of the campaign was the first division to reach and exceed its goal of \$75,000.

The Methodists' Division has a goal of \$425,000. On February 28, 1987, this division has raised over \$300,000. At this point the churches have not been asked to make contributions, but permission to approach churches for voluntary contributions is being requested of this session of this annual conference. The successful completion of this campaign is an absolute necessity, as Hendrix becomes in its second century an even better college.

A Challenging Word to Arkansas Methodism: Hendrix is Arkansas Methodism's gift to the nation. The college must have, expects to receive, and deserves the highest level of support and loyalty from the United Methodist churches of Arkansas. In return the college will do its best to combine appropriately the "knowledge" explosion and the "vital piety" dimensions of these changing and perilous times.

Philander Smith College Little Rock, Arkansas

Enrollment increased by 2 percent over the 1985 Fall Term during the 1986 Fall Term. This is the fourth consecutive year enrollment increased. Students came from 15 states and

10 foreign countries.

Our highly qualified faculty continues to be loyal and dedicated to providing instructional services. The Core Curriculum, major programs, Teacher Education Programs and International Studies are being strengthened. A Successful Assembly Series and a Religious Emphasis Week Program were held during the year.

A new satellite telecommunication system has been installed on the campus. The system will give the faculty, staff and students access to numerous educational programs, through a network of several colleges and universities.

Fund-raising continues to be a major priority of the College. Over 50 percent of the College's 1.47 million dollars Capital Funds Campaign has been raised or pledged. Several significant grants from private and federal sources were received during the year, and the Annual United Negro College Fund Campaign in Arkansas yielded approximately \$125,000 in cash and pledges. A planning and implementation process for developing the "1992 Philander Smith College Vision" has been completed. The College is experiencing a new image in public relations. It was honored in 1986 by the Public Relations Society of America, Arkansas Chapter, with a Certificate of Excellence.

The College continues to implement a program of sound fiscal responsibility. On for four consecutive years, the College has operated with a balanced budget. October 21, 1986, The University Senate of the United Methodist Church "noted with great satisfaction and pride that Philander Smith College had, over the past two years, left the "crisis zone" in the assessment and rating of the United Methodist colleges and universities with regard to ten selected indicators of financial health." The North Central Association of Schools and Colleges accepted the College's annual report of November 1, 1987 with commendations on progress it is making on audits, budgets, general financial matters, fund-raising activities and results, and enrollment.

In the Student Services area, a new Dean of Students is providing quality leadership. Under his leadership, student morale is high. Viable programs in student orientation, counseling, testing, student activities, health services, religious activities, financial aid and career services were strengthened during the year. Residence Halls received additional renovation, including painting the exterior of the Halls, overhauling the heating system, repairing or replacing the furniture and installing new venetian blinds in rooms. Improvements were made in athletics. The Men's basketball team won second place in both Conference Games and Conference Tournament. The Women's basketball improved its performance. The Collegiate Choir completed a successful tour to Los Angeles; has performed in several United Methodist Churches, other churches and organizations; and is preparing for its 1987 Spring Tour.

The newly reorganized Board of Trustees continues to provide dynamic leadership for the College. It is planning fund-raising strategies, developing institutional policies, the "1992 Philander Smith College Vision," and Board development and orientation have been some of its activities for the year. At its meeting February 27, 1987, Mr. Henry McHenry, Board Chairman, commended Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., President for his outstanding leadership during his 4 years in office.

United Methodist Children's Home, Inc.

Since 1977, under the administrative leadership of Dr. Joe R. Phillips, Jr., numerous residential group care concepts have been successfully implemented as the needs of the child at risk frequently change. Programs at the Home are constantly being updated to bring them in line with improved techniques found in similar institutions throughout the United States. Likewise, other child care centers have adopted some of the program and concepts initiated at UMCH. Peer group consultation/exchange is an invaluable aid in meeting the continuing challenges of group care.

During the past year, 178 youngsters have benefitted from the Home's care in its facilities in Little Rock, Magnolia and Searcy. They have been in residence for varying lengths of time, accounting for approximately 26,000 child care days. The normal daily population

is 70; the average length of stay at the Home is 20 months. The average age is 14 years. Approximately 75 percent of the residents are female. The average annual cost of care for each child is in excess of \$21,000 (or approximately \$58 per day).

Increased emphasis has been placed on the admittance of girls and boys through private referrals. The primary source for identifying those families in need of the Home's services are the United Methodist pastors throughout Arkansas. Currently, 35 percent of the Home's residents have been referred by our pastors or private individuals. Other referrals are through the State of Arkansas Department of Human Services, Division of Children and Family Services.

Contributions from the United Methodist constituency in both Annual Conferences continue to be a major source of income for the Children's Home. Thanks to the efforts and generosity of many faithful supporters, the 1986 Christmas Offering reflected an 11 percent increase over the previous year as cash donations exceeded \$352,000. This was a greatly needed response to the difficult financial position reported to the Conferences in mid-1986. The Home receives no funding from the federal government or United Way. Likewise, it receives no funding through the United Methodist apportioned funds.

Not forgetting their United Methodist heritage but strengthening and preserving it, the Board of Directors elected the Reverend Bob D. Orr to succeed Joe R. Phillips, Jr. as the UMCH administrator, effective June 1, 1987. Dr. Phillips enters retired status at the 1987 session of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

This should give us a good start on our major fund raising program which would begin within the next year or so.

We would also very much like to have some sort of a function just preceding or during annual conference in 1988 at Camp Tanako, to more familiarize the members of the conference with our camp.

Committee On Communications

Although the majority of communications ministries are operated on an area-wide basis, the Little Rock Conference Committee on Communications supplements this ministry by working to strengthen avenues of two-way communication in our conference.

Videotaping of conference workshops and events for use in local churches has increased dramatically in the last few years. Some events taped in the past year include Time for Growth education event, Children's Choir Festival, ordination and consecration service and pornography education event. At this session of Annual Conference, videos will be produced of the COSROW breakfast speaker and Clergy Women's Consultation. Assistance has been given in production of the Church Development up-date video.

Audio tapes of Children's Choir Camp and Adult Spiritual Education events were also produced, and audio tracks of Catch the Spirit radio spots are provided to any interested churches or areas. Assistance was given in sponsoring the Alternate View Network training event to investigate local church use of satellite dishes.

Surveys distributed to all pastors have been helpful in discovering what churches are doing and what equipment they have to work with, and in listing talented persons to assist with specific tasks such as the AUM Circulation Task Force. Every pastor who expressed a specific need will be contacted with an answer to his/her question, response to concern or some direction in discovering options available.

Improved communication from conference boards and agencies to local churches is being studied in an attempt for the committee to move beyond providing communication tools to more direct involvement in sending news of important conference programs and events to local churches. Lists of local church coordinators have been provided to each district coordinator to improve direct communication.

Every committee member also serves on the Area Committee on Communications which carries responsibility for the Arkansas United Methodist, audio-visual library, print shop, and other projects, including the new "Ministry through Communication" newsletter which is designed to give local church coordinators basic help in understanding their role, plus ideas for programs and updates on area and general church communications programs and resources.

Commission On Archives And History

In June, at the Annual Conference, the Commission on Archives and History of the Little Rock Conference featured an exhibit of materials from the Methodist Archives at Hendrix College, the Robert E. L. Bearden History Room at First Methodist Church in Little Rock, and from the private collection of Dr. John Butler Hays, the host pastor. Such interest was shown that it was decided that each year the Commission would feature historical material.

At the same conference, Mrs. James H. Rice was appointed archivist of the Little Rock Conference, a newly created service which is directly responsible to the Commission on Archives and History. Mrs. Rice and her committee, Mrs. John Riddle and Mrs. Ewing Wayland, will organize the materials of the Little Rock Conference which are in the archives at Hendrix College. Their first goals are: (1) an inventory of the holdings of the Conference; (2) conservation of the documents and photographs which is urgent; and (3) a location file so that the materials can be found readily for use. A new four drawer filing cabinet has been purchased by the Commission as well as five hundred acid-free file folders and five hundred sheets of acid-free interleaving. Much has already been accomplished in the conservation of photographs.

At the Annual Conference the ministers were asked to send to the archivist the historical data on each of their churches. Since that time, Bishop Wilke has sent the questionnaire from his office to each pastor. These returned questionnaires will form the basis of the information available in the archives. Also, copies of the biographical material on each current minister is also available at Bishop Wilke's office, to be copied by the archivist.

In September a workshop serving both Commissions on Archives and History of the two Arkansas Conferences was held at Hendrix College. Members of both Commissions attended the workshop chaired by Mrs. Marilyn Martin, a member of the General Commission on Archives and History. Conservation methods, church archival management, and other pertinent information was discussed. Members were also shown the materials available in the archives.

At the Sesquicentennial celebration of Arkansas Methodism held in Batesville in November, the two Commissions were mandated to work together as a joint commission. Since that time, the two archivists, Mrs. Rice and Mrs. James Upton of the North Arkansas Conference, have been working together in the Hendrix archives and are making plans for further training. An historical exhibit was sponsored by both conferences at Batesville.

Both Mrs. Rice and Mrs. John Riddle plan to attend the workshop on September 18-20 which will be held at Drew University in Madison, N.J., by the General Commission on Archives and History.

To achieve this goal, leadership training was the focal point of Conference Camp, six district adult training "Roadshows" in the fall of 1986, and a youth leadership weekend, "Lead with the Spirit" is the theme for Conference Camp to be held July 26-31, 1987. It is our hope that our emphasis will begin the process of identifying and developing Christian leaders in our United Methodist Church.

The emphasis for 1987-88 will be the development of strong district youth ministry teams, with a continued focus on leadership development through fall adult training programs and a spring youth leadership retreat. Mid-Winter Retreat is scheduled for February 19-20, 1988, at a site to be announced.

The Youth Service Fund, the outreach program of the United Methodist Youth supported eight ministries with youth through the contributions of local youth groups. Four YSF-supported ministries were outside the Little Rock Conference: Van Buren Community Center (Dayton, Ohio), Mountain T.O.P. Day Camp (Tennessee), Camp Hope and Camp Share (Rocky Mt. Annual Conference), and Someone Cares Crisis Ministries (South Carolina Annual Conference); and four ministries are within the Little Rock Conference: Camp Tanako, Urban Family Outreach (Little Rock), Abused Women's Shelter (Arkadelphia), and Senior Citizens Center Services (Pine Bluff). We urge each local church youth group to participate in this ministry of our Conference. Each youth is encouraged to give a dime a week to YSF.

We are revising our constitution for greater flexibility and function. It is to be presented for adoption at Conference Camp, 1987, and to the Little Rock Annual Conference in 1988 for inclusion in the 1988 journal.

We urge the support of the Little Rock Annual Conference to approve a resolution now before the Conference Council on Ministries Executive Committee which provides for the hiring of a full-time, paid Coordinator of Youth Ministries beginning in January, 1989.

Commission On Status And Role Of Women

Goals 1987

1. To help every local church to establish a chairperson or identify someone to incorporate COSROW concerns into their work area.
2. To emphasize that each local church have a study on "Words That Hurt and Words That Heal" using the Guidelines from the 1984 General Conference. The following action was taken by the Conference COSROW in 1984:
 With prayerful consideration and thoughtful deliberation, be it hereby known that the Commission on Status and Role of Women of the Little Rock Annual Conference, on the Twenty-First day of August, Nineteen Hundred and Eighty Four, recommends to the Inclusive Task Force the following:
 - I. We as COSROW affirm that traditional imagery of God remains meaningful and Biblically sound.
 - II. We as COSROW affirm that less traditional imagery of God is also meaningful and Biblically sound.
 - III. We as COSROW stress that Clergy are an integral part of faith and inclusive image formation.
 - IV. We as COSROW would like to emphasize that we realize that the Task Force's (General Council on Ministries Task Force on Language Guidelines) role is not in changing the wording of the Bible, but in making the interpretation more inclusive.
 - V. We as COSROW would like to encourage the laity to study Resource Material on Inclusive Language (Inclusive Language Lectionary, Report Number Nine — sometimes referred to as Report Number Fourteen, etc.) in order that as Laity we may grow in our individual understandings.
3. To continue to work on our image and seek to improve it. Objectives toward meeting this goal include:
 - a. To continue to educate ourselves in order to give quality leadership to the total life and mission of the church.
 - b. To continue an Annual Conference Breakfast as a visible and important means of saying who we are and what we are about.
 - c. To encourage Women in the Pulpit Sunday as a means of visibly encouraging women's inclusion.

Cooperative Parish Ministries And New Church Development

The Arkansas Area has 817 churches (1986 Journals). Of these 77.23% have fewer than 200 members and 90% (735) have less than 200 in attendance at the worship service. The average attendance of each of the two conferences is 73 persons. The Office of CPM and NCD has a primary role in assisting all churches, including new ones, but particularly being an advocate for the smaller membership churches. This has been accomplished through support of the United Methodist Rural Fellowship, participating in the National Network of Town and Country Ministries, in dialogue with the Cabinets and the Bishop of the Area, assisting in the placement of Church and Community Workers, participating in District and Local Church "My Job" style training events, leading workshops on the Smaller Membership Church. For several years the cooperative parish settings have been responsible for attracting seminary students to do their internship in Arkansas; this gives the local churches trained leadership and provides the students a vision of smaller church needs and a model of cooperation in ministry. Seven interns will be in the Area in 1987.

Several local churches have received and provided ministry not available before. Last summer in the Marianna Parish all but one church had a Vacation Church School. One of those could not remember ever having one and they had over 30 children due to funding which provided a summer youth/children's worker for the parish. Two will be placed in 1987 and the Baxter-Marion Parish is being provided with funds to place a Worker for Older Adults. All these funds are located beyond the budget of the Office. \$4,000 for the South-

west and Marianna Larger Parishes has been obtained from National Division B.O.G.M. for 1987.

The Office was assigned the monitoring and processing of Moving Methodist referrals through the (501) FRIENDS Hotline and since May of 1986 has forwarded 238 names to the National office (on out-of state referrals) or to local churches in Arkansas.

Training events have been held for multiple purposes from a "cooperative style of ministry" to "evaluation" of a parish. The next one is to be October 1-2, 1987 for clergy and lay staff persons of parishes.

New Church Development Work has included working with the Bishop, Cabinets, District Building and Location Committees, and pastors and congregations of developing/emerging or new churches. Regular contact with counsel, training, funding for specific needs, along with sending pastors to National training for pastors of new churches, has been and will be vital to these churches.

The selection of sites for new churches has involved many trips to areas such as Joplin, Texarkana, Hot Springs Village, Sherwood, Maumelle, West Little Rock with District Superintendents, General Church Consultants, and with District Church Building and Location Committees or Task Force Persons. Negotiations through realtors led to the purchase by the Conway District of a five-plus acre site on Brockington Road in Sherwood.

The Catch the Vision program to help fund new congregations in the North Arkansas Conference started in 1986. The Office of CPM & NCD maintains all the individuals records (now over 2000) and coordinates the campaign with Rev. Greg Webb, the Conference Coordinator of Catch the Vision. Of \$110,000 pledged in 1986, approximately \$82,000.00 has been paid. The 1987 campaign has a target of \$200,000.00. Production of a video tape, campaign materials, and development of a poster contest have been exciting and, prayerfully, will result in a new level of support for this urgent need in our area. The Little Rock Conference Church Development Campaign has become a follow-up part of the work of the Office. Quarterly reports are being prepared to give current information on the level of funding and to promote the need.

With grave concern for the balancing of income with expenditures, this Office spent within the apportioned receipts in 1986, and expects to do so again in 1987.

1988 Goals

1. Participate in training of District Building and Location Committees across the Area.
2. Spring and Fall training events for Cooperative Parish Staff persons.
3. Continue work to enable starting a new church in the North Arkansas Conference in 1988.
4. In the Little Rock Conference proceed on the adopted sequence of West Little Rock, Hot Springs Village, and Texarkana as the location of a new United Methodist Church or relocated congregation.

The South Central Jurisdiction — The United Methodist Church

The purpose of the South Central Jurisdiction is essentially the same as that of a local church: to reach out and receive people as they are; relate individuals to God through the redeeming power of Jesus Christ; develop persons as Christian Disciples; and, send them back into the community to make life more loving and just for all who live there.

In 1986 the Jurisdiction sought to achieve this purpose in the following ways:

Evangelism and Church Growth — We hosted a National Consultation of Pastors of Growing Churches at St. Louis. Sixty pastors of local churches experiencing dramatic growth in membership attended and shared their experiences. From this event have come specific recommendations to the Council of Bishops regarding Evangelism and Church Growth.

Youth Ministry — The Jurisdictional Youth Ministry Organization annual meeting was held at Mt. Sequoyah in July with an excellent program and attendance.

Student Conference — For the first time in more than 20 years a Jurisdictional Student Conference was held in San Antonio, Texas, with over 200 college students in attendance. Dr. John Holbert was the Bible teacher. A group of 20 students from Central America attended.

The Farm Crisis — The initiative taken by our Jurisdiction last year has resulted in the formation of an Ecumenical Farm and Rural Crisis group. Made up of representatives of eight denominations from a ten state area, it is first of its kind in the nation. The consultation held in Kansas City last fall gave birth to this ecumenical approach.

Leadership Development — Sacramento, New Mexico and Mt. Sequoyah, Fayetteville, Arkansas was the site of Laboratory Training Schools and Seminars for Church School teachers and leaders. Our goal to train 1000 Sunday School teachers for this quadrennium has already been reached.

Volunteers in Mission — This rapidly growing outreach ministry has necessitated a full time VIM Coordinator. She is Jo Ann Small, former missionary to Malaysia and graduate of Perkins School of Theology. A spot check of several institutions, camps and mission projects reveals that in 1986 there were 315 work teams involving 4,973 persons serving as Volunteers in Missions. This report is incomplete and does not reflect our total involvement in the VIM Program.

Retiree Events — Seven retiree events were held in 1986 at Mt. Sequoyah. This is a ministry with, by and for older adults that has had a tremendous response.

Camp Leaders Workshop — This workshop was held at Camp Canyon, OK., for camp administrators and program directors. Over 70 leaders met for 4 days seeking ways to solve management problems, improve planning skills, and to explore ways to relate camping to the gospel.

Disaster Workshop — With joint sponsorship of the United Methodist Committee on Relief a workshop on Disaster Relief and Response was held at Dallas, TX. for Annual Conference Coordinators and other persons involved in this ministry.

Clergy Women's Seminar — This event at Bridgeport, TX., provided an opportunity for a large group of women clergy to come together to share and discuss concerns and issues common to women clergy and to receive affirmation and support from their calling and ministry.

United Methodist Men — Our Jurisdiction hosted the Tenth National Congress of United Methodist Men and Scout Leaders last fall in Irving, Texas. Mr. Charles Dick of Kansas City is the Jurisdiction president of United Methodist Men.

Other Events — The Jurisdiction continues to sponsor Bishop's Week and the Ecumenical Missions Conference, both of which are held at Mt. Sequoyah, and, the Protestant Radio Hour. Dr. Walker Railey of Dallas, Texas will be the preacher for the United Methodist segment in 1988.

Report To The Little Rock Conference Mount Sequoyah 1986

Bishop Wilke, lay and clergy members of The Little Rock Annual Conference and friends, we welcome the opportunity to report to you about our work. The Mount Sequoyah Conference and Retreat Center in Fayetteville, Arkansas is committed to serve to The South Central Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church. Its Board of Trustees consists of the active bishops of the Jurisdiction, one elected person from each Annual Conference and seven at-large members. The trustees are elected by the Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church.

This institution was created in 1922 and has its purpose "to equip people for the mission of the church in the world." A growing number of persons are coming to Mount Sequoyah each year seeking training which will enable them to be Christ's church in service to the world.

As a place of beauty and relaxation, the facilities of Mount Sequoyah are ideal. Thirty acres of grounds accommodate the fifty buildings and leave plenty of room for trees and flowers, secluded places and panoramic vistas. Each year friends make donations to beautify the property. Large beds of plants and bulbs have been planted. Hundreds of new shrubs and trees have been set out.

Over half of the 1987 programs will be General church and Jurisdictional events. The North Arkansas Conference will use the facility for its annual meeting. A Camp Meeting is planned for August. Ministers and staff are encouraged to come for personal retreats and study in September. Volunteers in mission are being invited to rally on the mountain over the Labor Day weekend. Intensive Spanish is being offered in August and Morton Kelsey will lecture in November.

The Mount Sequoyah Conference and Retreat Center seeks to serve and the Little Rock Annual Conference is a partner in this labor. Help us to tell the story and share the excitement.

Lydia Patterson Institute El Paso, Texas

The Lydia Patterson family extends a warm hand of amistad and a cordial saludo to the Conference. The following is our report on the educational mission of LPI during 1986.

Due to a lack of interest, Spanish classes for church leadership were not held this past summer. This initial program under the Center for Cross-Cultural Educational Ministries involved participants over a two-week period in language instruction, cultural awareness workshops, lectures, city tours and an excursion to Chihuahua City, Mexico. It was very successful but had to be dropped because not enough ministers signed up for the program. It will again be offered in 1987. Twenty five students received LPI High School diplomas on June 4. Ceremonies were conducted at the Chamizal National Theatre in El Paso. Mr. J. Ambrose, Editor of the El Paso Herald Post, a civic leader in El Paso, was the commencement speaker. One hundred and fifty students enrolled in a six-week ESL summer session. In addition, fifty students from various El Paso County Public Schools attended an eight-week educational compensatory program. This program was sponsored by the Private Industry Council and held at Lydia Patterson Institute.

The total number of students who have enrolled for the school year 1986-87 are 283: 149 are in High School, 23 are in the 8th grade and 109 are in ESL Department. This enrollment is slightly smaller than last school year. Twenty-two FTE teachers, seven support staff and three administrative staff are giving leadership to the Institute program. Fourteen faculty members have bachelors degrees, nine have masters, and one has a doctorate.

This year only forty eight percent of our teachers are certified. We lost a few certified teachers and this trend casts doubt on our goal of having all teachers certified by 1988. Significant curricular accomplishments have been made and strong improvement has taken place in student academic achievement during the last year as evidenced by grade point averages. Mr. Gonzalo LaFarelle is the school principal.

Major renovations have been made in recent months to our facilities. First, the roofs of the main building and the gymnasium were completely renovated at a cost of \$102,000. This was an urgent necessity and we are thankful that we have been able to move ahead to complete this important project. Another necessary renovation was made to our gymnasium floor this summer. Mrs. Socorro deAnda is the business manager in charge of facilities.

As we work together to shape the future of this historic institution, it is imperative that we do so with courage and with vision. We shall continue to work for the development of a high quality preparatory Christian school, a model for public and private educational institutions alike. Both the need and the potential for such a ministry are still present in our LPI context.

Lydia Patterson is the only remaining Hispanic academic institution of the United Meth-

odist Church in the United States. Its future as an academic institution must be preserved and developed. There are many needs among the Hispanic peoples of our country and Mexico. But certainly one of the most vital is the need for development of the human mind. The growing educational needs in our part of Texas and Mexico, tell us that literally millions of minds are being wasted because these needs are not being met.

We have a crucial secondary school academic mission, and a very significant ministry is taking place presently with young persons every hour of every day. Ours is a commitment to the development of Hispanic young lives.

Yet we have a special calling and responsibility to care for the minds of these youths, to teach them the intellectual love of God, and that they are to love God with all their minds and with the fullness of that intellectual potential which God has given to them.

Furthermore, we are moving forward to further develop the Center for Cross-Cultural Educational Ministries at LPI. We believe that the church needs leaders who have that rare combination of knowledge and vital piety; leaders with passion for the souls of Hispanic peoples and with the knowledge and skills to effect Christian ministry among them. Those two elements, so seldom found together in our individual and collective life, will be integrated in the curriculum and mission of our new Center.

Our 'Road Show' ends with the words "But what of LPI? Its story is not yet finished. Its future has been placed in your hands." Let us move forward in faith to shape a greater and brighter future for Lydia Patterson, knowing that God has placed this unique ministry in our hands, indeed.

Commission On Equitable Salary And Mission Salary Supplement Policy Statement

All request for Equitable Salary grants shall be received before grants for mission salary supplement are considered. Equitable Salary needs shall have prior claim on available funds.

- I. The Commission shall recommend to Annual Conference the amount for Equitable Salary to begin on January 1st. The Commission shall recommend the maximum amount of Equitable Salary monies that a charge may receive. (Para. 722.9) This amount shall be effective on January 1st. The maximum amount of Equitable Salary support for 1988 shall be \$2400.00.
- II. The Minimum Salary for a pastor approved by the Annual Conference for 1988 year shall be:

Full-Time.....	\$16,500
Resident Student.....	\$11,900
Non-Resident Student.....	\$ 9,800
Base Salary.....	\$11,000
- III. Where a charge sets more than the minimum requirement of \$250.00 the pastor will be allowed to receive the benefit of the increase for that year provided total support does not exceed minimum salary. No pastor shall suffer a loss of income through the next session of the Annual Conference due to the failure of the charge to meet the minimum requirements.
- IV. To encourage the charge to reach full Equitable Salary support a charge will be given credit for any annual increase that is in excess of \$250.00 and the pastor shall be allowed to receive an amount equal to one-half of said increase: total support not to exceed the minimum salary set by Annual Conference.
- V. In the event of insufficient funds to meet all claims, each charge shall share proportionately from the funds available.
- VI. The Commission shall report the amount paid during the fiscal year to each charge and minister.
- VII. The above plan of distribution of funds be made effective June 1987.

VIII. Equitable Salary Applications and Grants

1. Every church and/or charge shall submit a proposed budget in writing. Copies to the Commission through the District Superintendent by January 1.
2. Each church and/or charge shall conduct a financial campaign and report the results to the Commission through the District Superintendent by January 1.
3. Each church and/or charge shall have accepted the apportionments in full for the coming year. Each church and/or charge shall have paid the apportionments in full the preceding year.
4. The church and/or charge shall make application to the Commission on the prescribed form by action of the Charge Conference.
5. The District Superintendent shall make his/her recommendations to the Commission by the date set by the Commission. The date shall not be later than January 10.
6. Exceptional cases may be declared by the Commission from the above requirements and waived on recommendation by the District Superintendent provided the District Superintendent shall file in writing the reasons for the exceptional circumstances.
7. Pastoral assignment shall be full-time (Para. 442 & 442.1) except that the Commission shall consider applications whose pastoral supply is appointed in accordance with para. 442.2 and 436.2.
8. In exceptional cases approved by the Cabinet, any requirements above except #7 may be waived by the Commission.

IX. The Equitable Salary Commission shall be empowered to designate a portion of the Equitable Salary Fund for Mission Salary Supplement provided that Mission Salary Supplement shall not exceed the balance anticipated for the year after Equitable Salary grants have been approved.

X. Mission Salary Supplement Applications and Grants

1. Every church and/or charge shall present a budget for the year to the Commission through the District Superintendent.
2. Each church and/or charge shall conduct a financial campaign and report the results to the Commission through the District Superintendent.
3. Each church and/or charge shall have accepted the apportionments in full for the coming year. Each church and/or charge shall have paid the apportionments in full the preceding year.
4. The church and/or charge shall make application to the Commission on the prescribed form by action of the Charge Conference.
5. The District Superintendent shall make his/her recommendation to the Commission by the date set by the Commission. This date shall not be later than January 10.
6. Exceptional cases may be declared by the Commission from the above requirements and waived on recommendation by the District Superintendent provided the District Superintendent shall file in writing the reasons for the exceptional circumstances.

XI. All grants from Mission Salary Supplement shall be reported by the Commission to the Annual Conference.

XII. Adjustments may be made by the Commission at the beginning of the fiscal year when such adjustments are necessitated by a change of appointment or realignment of the charge — or by a new salary arrangement voted by the Charge Conference.

Board Of Ordained Ministry Policy Statement 1987-88

SECTION I: BOARD OPERATION

- A. The Little Rock Annual Conference Board of Ordained Ministry proposes to work strictly within the framework of the current Discipline of The United Methodist Church.
- B. The officers elected by the Board are: Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary, Registrar, Associate Registrar, and Candidacy Registrar.
- C. The Executive Committee of the Board is the elected officers, the Chairperson of the Conference Relations Committee, the Chairperson of the Probationer's Committee, and the Chairperson of Continuing Education.
- D. The Board is divided into groups of members who may serve a maximum of eight years. The Executive Committee is responsible for reporting expired terms to the Bishop who shall consult with the Chairperson of the Board and the Cabinet in making nominations to the Annual Conference. (Par. 732.a — 1984 Discipline)
- E. The Board shall meet prior to the opening of school, at mid-year, at Annual Conference, and on call of the Chairperson.
- F. The Board shall have a representative on each District Committee on Ordained Ministry (Par. 749.1) In consultation with the District Superintendent, the Chairperson shall appoint a member to serve on each District Committee.
- G. The Board's sources of income shall be:
 1. A designated amount from the Council on Finance and Administration for the administrative costs of the Board.
 2. Twenty-five percent of the amount collected from local churches for the Ministerial Education Fund.
 3. Gifts, bequests, interest on notes, and repayment of loans.
- H. The Policy Booklet shall be reviewed and revised annually by a committee appointed by the Chairperson of the Board.
- I. Policy statements of the Board shall be presented to the Annual Conference for approval or amendment, provided that all policies shall be in accordance with the current Discipline.

SECTION II: CANDIDACY

- A. The first step into the Ministry of the United Methodist Church is to appear before and receive the recommendation of the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee from the local church in which one has held membership for one year. This recommendation is conveyed to the District Superintendent and a Charge Conference over which the District Superintendent presides.
- B. That recommendation is then referred to the District Committee on Ordained Ministry which is to review the recommendation and arrange for the enrollment of the Candidate in the course of study required by the General Board of Ordained Ministry in Nashville, Tenn.
- C. The Candidate shall provide to the District Committee and the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry a health examination reported on the form provided by the Candidacy Registrar of the Conference Board. The Candidate will bear the expense for the examination.
- D. The Conference Board shall maintain a list of Supervising Pastors. The list shall include those who have completed the training to be Supervising Pastors. They shall be selected by the Registrar for Candidacy, approved by The District Superintendents and the Conference Board.
- E. The Conference shall provide training for Supervising Pastors in 1987 and 1989.

SECTION III: LOCAL LICENSE TO PREACH SCHOOL

- A. The annual school for Local Preacher's License shall be held as a joint venture with the

Board of Ordained Ministry of the North Arkansas Annual Conference.

- B. Those serving on the Planning Committee shall be: Chairperson of the Board of Ordained Ministry, the Associate Registrar, and the Candidacy Registrar.
- C. In agreement with the North Arkansas Board of Ordained Ministry, the Little Rock Conference Board shall:
 - 1. Provide one-half of the administrative costs of the school.
 - 2. Provide two persons to serve on the faculty.
 - 3. Provide a person to serve as Dean of the school for the first two years of each quadrennium and the North Arkansas Board shall furnish the Dean for the last two years.
 - 4. The Little Rock Conference Board shall provide a registrar for students from this conference.
 - 5. The Board shall pay room, board, and travel for its two faculty members and the Dean when the Dean is from this conference, **plus an honorarium of \$100.00 each for two faculty members and Dean.**
 - 6. The Little Rock Conference shall reimburse the following expenses for its students: books, room, and board. The student must successfully complete the course to receive reimbursements.
- D. The evaluation of each student shall be sent to the Associate Registrar, the Candidacy Registrar, and The District Superintendent of the student's district.
- E. All persons seeking License to Preach shall undergo Psychological Testing. Guidelines appear in the 1985 Journal of the Little Rock Conference. (See section VII of this policy statement.)

SECTION IV: COURSE OF STUDY — ADVANCED COURSE OF STUDY

- A. All persons entering the Course of Study shall notify the Associate Registrar of their intention to enter by March 15th of each year.
- B. Those students proceeding through the Course of Study shall notify and forward to the Associate Registrar their registration form for the current year by March 15th.
- C. The financial assistance from the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry is limited to:
 - 1. The cost of tuition, registration fees, room and board for those in the five year basic program.
 - 2. Those enrolled in correspondence work will receive payment of tuition fees only.
 - 3. Those preparing to enroll in the Advanced Course of Study shall:
 - a. Appear before the Conference Board stating why they feel they should be considered an exceptional case. Permission to enroll in the Advanced Course of Study does not necessarily indicate that one will be recommended for Probationary Relationship on completion of the course.
 - b. Be prepared to meet all requirements of Par. 416 on completion of the Course.
 - c. For those seeking to prepare for Admission as Probationary Members of the Annual Conference, the Conference Board may reimburse each student \$135.00 for each completed course.

SECTION V: RELATIONSHIP TO COLLEGE STUDENTS

- A. Those enrolled in college level courses and planning to enter Seminary or the Course of Study shall:
 - 1. Meet with the Conference Board or its Executive Committee prior to enrolling in either the Course of Study or Seminary.
 - 2. Complete the requirements for Candidacy for Ministry.
 - 3. Before August 1st, prior to beginning seminary, make application to the Registrar of the Conference Board, furnishing all information requested and authorizing regular grade reports to be released to the Registrar, including a transcript of credits at the end of each academic year.
 - 4. There is no scholarship aid for undergraduate students.

SECTION VI: RELATIONSHIP TO SEMINARY STUDENTS

- A. Financial Assistance for Seminary Students** shall be in the form of scholarship-loans. Funds from the ministerial Education Fund shall be used for this aid.
1. Scholarship-aid is in reality a loan. It may be repaid through service in the United Methodist Ministry at the rate of one year of service for each year of financial assistance received.
 2. The loan is secured by a legally binding note signed by those receiving assistance. In the event that one does not enter the United Methodist Ministry, or serve long enough to discharge the loan, the loan shall become due and interest from the date of issuance of the note shall apply. Arrangements must be made to begin the repayment of the loan within six months.
- B. To qualify for Seminary Scholarship-aid the student must:**
1. Be enrolled in a seminary approved by The University Senate of The United Methodist Church.
 2. Maintain a grade point sufficient to insure graduation from the institution in which the student is enrolled.
 3. Authorize grade reports to be sent to the Registrar of the Conference Board and at the end of the school year arrange for the Registrar to receive a transcript of the years work.
 4. Maintain a current address at all times with the Registrar of the Board.
- C. Application process for loans shall be:**
1. Request from the Registrar the promissory note and the application blank.
 2. Complete the forms and send them to your District Superintendent for approval.
 3. Release and mail to the Registrar grade reports and or transcripts for last semester.
 4. **Scholarship aid must be requested 10 days after each semester or quarter.**
- D. Limitations:**
1. Scholarship-aid shall not be given for more than four years toward the completion of the seminary degree.
 2. Full scholarship-aid is offered only to full-time students. Part-time students may receive aid on a pro-rata basis.
 3. In the event courses are not completed, the student must refund to the Board that portion of aid received for that course. Additional aid will not be granted until this requirement is met.
 4. Scholarship-aid for summer school will be determined by the number of hours taken in comparison with a normal regular semester load.
- E. Emergency Aid**
1. Additional aid for emergency situations may be granted to seminary students when requested; for health reasons, to those who come from disadvantaged economic backgrounds, or to those who have entered ministry later in life with family responsibilities.
 2. The maximum amount of emergency aid per year shall not exceed an amount equal to the scholarship grant for one semester. The Executive Committee must approve the request for emergency aid.
- F. Amount of Scholarship-Aid**
1. The Conference Board shall set the maximum amount of the Scholarship-aid each year based on a percent of the tuition charged by the seminary, not to exceed an amount equal to the set percent of \$7,000.00. The award of the scholarship loans shall be based on the availability of funds and the needs of the individual student.

SECTION VII: PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMINATIONS

- A. Psychological Examinations** shall be required of all persons seeking **Local Pastor's License Probationary membership, Associate Membership, requesting re-entry into full or part-time appointment within the Little Rock Annual Conference, or any person seeking recognition of orders from another denomination.**

- B. The cost of the examination shall be paid by the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry except in the case of those seeking re-admission. (see section XI)
- C. The Psychologist shall be selected by the Board.
The full policy statement concerning the examination is in the 1985 Journal of the Little Rock Annual Conference. The policy is also available from the Registrar of the Board.

SECTION IX: PROBATIONARY PROCESS

- A. Applicants for **ADMISSION INTO FULL MEMBERSHIP AND ORDINATION** in the Little Rock Annual Conference who have completed all educational requirements and upon receiving full-time appointment shall enter into a Probationary Process for a period of not less than two years.
- B. **Persons who have been admitted to PROBATION FROM ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP shall enter the Probationary process immediately.**
- C. This process shall be coordinated and supervised by the Probationers Committee of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry and shall be in full accordance with the disciplinary requirements and such other requirements as deemed necessary by the Annual Conference. (Par. 413 1984 Discipline)
- D. The Purpose of the Probationary Process of the Little Rock Annual Conference is to surround each probationary member with supportive caring groups. These groups are invited to face, with the probationer, the possibilities and challenges of Ordained Ministry and his/her growth in that ministry.
- E. Basic to the caring process is the establishment of a local Committee of Concern which is an official committee on the local level representing the Probationer's Committee of the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry. The Committee of Concern functions in the following ways:
 - 1. To help the Probationer to meet the requirements for full conference membership.
 - 2. To enable the Probationer to make transitions into the ministry with support and guidance.
 - 3. To give opportunity for each committee member to grow in ministry and self understanding.
- F. **The Committee of Concern shall be composed of the following:**
 - 1. The Probationer.
 - 2. An Elder, Chosen by the Probationer.
 - 3. Four lay persons (two men and two women if possible) chosen by the Probationer, after consultation with the Chairperson of the Committee on Concern.
 - 4. The Chairperson (an Elder appointed by The Conference Board of Ordained Ministry) "Members in Full Connection with an annual conference by virtue of their election and ordination are bound in a special covenant with all the ordained ministers of the annual conference." (Par. 421 1984 Discipline) The concept of the Committee of Concern also presupposes a sense of covenant with one another in the group, with Christ, and with the Church. The mutual counseling relationship of the Committee of Concern is of paramount importance.
- G. In consultation with the District Superintendent, Chairperson of the Committee of Concern, the committee itself, and others, the Probationer will develop a **GROWTH COVENANT** stating his/her personal goals for growth as pastor and person during the process.
- H. The Probationer's Committee of the Board of Ordained Ministry will design a two-year program of growth opportunities, seminars, evaluations, retreats, and other requirements which must be completed in total by the Probationer. Either the Probationer or the Board of Ordained Ministry may recommend the extension of the two year process if deemed advisable.
- I. By February 1st of the second year of probation, the Probationer shall present to the Committee of Concern and to the Chairperson of the Probationers Committee of the Board of Ordained Ministry a written sermon and answers to the doctrinal questions re-

quired for conference membership. (Par. 423 1984 Discipline)

- J. The Probationer shall be required to take a health and psychological exam in keeping with the provisions of the 1984 Discipline. (Par. 423.4)

SECTION X: CONTINUING EDUCATION

- A. The Board shall encourage participation in continuing education programs by ministers of the Little Rock Annual Conference. Pastors are required by the Discipline to earn at least two continuing education units per year. (A continuing education unit is 10 hours of instruction) The following shall serve as policy guidelines:
1. Each eligible individual applicant may receive up to \$150.00 annually, if an equal amount is provided by the church and/or the individual. These amounts shall include only projected expenses for tuition, books, fees, room and board. This matching requirement may be waived for those who receive less than \$4,000.00 above Equitable Salary.
 2. Persons seeking financial aid for continuing education shall secure an application form from the Chairperson of Continuing Education. All requests relating to continuing education funds shall be directed to the Chairperson of said committee.
 3. In hardship cases, ministers can apply to the Committee on Continuing Education for help to attend Pastor's School. Such help will be granted only after other avenues for aid have been exhausted.
 4. No financial aid is available for Minister's Week at any Seminary.

SECTION XI: ENTRY/EXITING/RE-ENTRY

A. ENTRY

1. Requests for conference membership or ordination:
 - a. For Associate and Probationary Memberships (and/or Deacons Orders); one shall make application through their District Committee on Ordained Ministry. The District Committee shall forward their recommendation to the Registrar of The Board by the 1st of October each year.
 - b. For Full Membership (and/or Elders Orders) application shall be made to the Registrar of the Board.
 - c. All requests for Conference Membership shall be on file with the Registrar at least nine months prior to conference.
 - d. Psychological Testing is required for all persons seeking their first relationship with the Little Rock Annual Conference except for Elders in Full Connection transferring into the conference. (See policy statement on Psychological Testing)
 - e. A medical examination is required for all persons seeking a first time relationship with the conference. The examination is to be on the prescribed form. The Conference Board will reimburse the applicant up to \$40.00 for the examination. Any additional expense (ie. special test etc.) will be the responsibility of the applicant.
2. ENTRY FROM OTHER DENOMINATIONS
 - a. The Board of Ordained Ministry shall follow specifically the provisions of paragraphs 425.2 and 426.3 in the 1984 Book of Discipline regarding the appointment and transfer of ministers from other denominations.
 - b. Persons who are coming into United Methodist Ministry from another denomination shall:
 - 1) Attend the Local Pastor's Licensing School within the first year of being appointed as a pastor in the Little Rock Conference.
 - 2) Serve under appointment for not less than twenty-four months under their denominational credentials before being received into relationship with the Conference.
 - 3) Complete the educational requirements of United Methodist History, Polity and Doctrine before the end of the two years in which one is appointed as a minister from another denomination.

- 4) Be assigned by the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry an Elder who shall meet with the minister quarterly to provide insight, guidance, and counsel regarding United Methodist Ministry during the two years of appointment as a minister from another denomination.
- c. Upon becoming a Probationary Member of the conference, one shall enter and satisfactorily complete the Probationary Process with a Committee of Concern.
- d. Upon applying for membership as a probationary, associate, or full member, one shall complete all the requirements of the Board including the supplying of transcripts of educational records, a health examination, a psychological evaluation, written materials (biographical statement, sermon, and responses to Disciplinary questions), and a recommendation from one's seminary (where applicable). Instructions for all of the above are provided by the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry.

B. EXITING

1. Whenever and for Whatever reason, a person related to the annual conference with ministerial relationship, leaves that relationship, the exiting must be reviewed and approved by the Conference Board of Ordained Ministry as per the requirements of The Discipline.
2. The Secretary shall record in the minutes of the Board the stated reason for the exiting. The Registrar shall enter in the persons record the stated reason for the exiting. Additional statements shall be recorded from the Cabinet and the person who has exited.
3. Disciplinary procedures shall be followed as listed in the following paragraphs of the 1984 Discipline:
 - a. Voluntary Termination par. 454
 - b. Involuntary Termination par. 455
 - c. Administrative Location par. 455.2
 - d. Trial par. 455.2
 - e. Leave of Absence par. 450
 - f. Disability par. 452
 - g. Retirement par. 453
 - h. Honorable Location par. 454.2

C. RE-ENTRY

1. All requests for re-entry to the Annual Conference for appointment must be presented to the Board of Ordained Ministry 90 days prior to the beginning session of the Annual Conference.
2. The Board shall review all files and statements kept by the Secretary and Registrar of the Board at the time of exiting.
3. All persons requesting re-entry are required to submit to a psychological examination as prescribed in the policy in psychological examinations. The cost of this evaluation shall be borne by the person requesting re-entry. Person returning from Leave of Absence with consent, may have the requirement waived by the Chairperson and Registrar of the Conference Board.
4. Disciplinary procedures will be followed by The Conference Board in re-entry process as listed in the following paragraphs:
 - a. Return from Leave of Absence. par. 450
 - b. Re-Admission to Probationary Membership. par. 456
 - c. Re-Admission after Honorable Location or Administrative Location. par. 457
 - d. Re-Admission after surrender of Ministerial Office. par. 458
 - e. Re-Admission after termination by action of the Annual Conference. par. 459

Report Of The Area Long Range Planning Committee

The 1986 Annual Conference approved resolutions requesting the Bishop to appoint a long-range planning committee to study the Area Headquarters and make recommendations to the 1987 Conferences. Bishop Wilke appointed the Committee whose names appear at the end of this report.

Seven tasks were given to the Committee, which are dealt with in Section II of this report. The Committee began meeting in September 1986 and had a number of meetings, extending well into 1987.

At the time the Committee began meeting there was no signed lease with First United Methodist Church (Lessor) for rental of present office space in their facilities. The Committee asked the two Chairpersons of the Conference CFA's to negotiate a short-term lease with the Lessor and this contract is now in effect until the end of 1987, with option to renew for three years more.

The Committee also became aware of some stress between the Lessor and employees of the Lessee and had interviews with both parties. It was decided that stress can be relieved by having one person to be the liaison/contact person for the Lessee, so that grievances and disagreements can be represented by this person. It was also determined that all scheduling of meetings with the Lessor be performed by offices involved, well in advance. This ac-

tion has been implemented and both parties indicate harmonious relationships.

Other dissatisfactions voiced by Area personnel included more short-comings in heating/air conditioning, cleaning, security, and unsuitable carpeting. Consultations with Lessor have improved some of these, some cannot be entirely corrected due to the structure of the building but can be at a later time if major remodeling is performed. It was also found that the carpet and other appurtenances are the property and responsibility of the Lessee, as provided in the leases.

I. SETTING RESPONSIBILITY

In 1964, at the time of the planning of the present offices, a "New Methodist Headquarters Corporation" was formed and duly registered with the Circuit Court of Pulask County. At some time this body was allowed to become inactive and no new Directors elected. The purpose of the Corporation was "for the purpose of building, erecting, operating and maintaining an office building for the use and benefit of various agencies and boards of the Methodist Church."

We recommend that this Corporation be re-activated and directors elected, with three members from each Conference, according to the election practices of each Conference. The Corporation will act for the Headquarters and report to the Conferences each year. The new directors should have the Articles of Incorporation revised to bring it up to date and to meet present needs.

We further recommend that the name "Headquarters" be changed to "Center" so that the offices be known as "The United Methodist Center." This has been suggested by previous Bishops and by members of the Committee.

II. TASKS ASSIGNED TO THE COMMITTEE

1. Evaluate the needs of the Center facilities. The sub-committee which looked into this found that some offices have sufficient room but there are obvious short-comings in others. The Methodist Foundation moved to another location because of a lack of space. Other offices with insufficient space are: the CPM office, the A/V Library, the Area Printing Center and the Arkansas United Methodist newspaper.

Recommend: That an option be taken on the first floor space in the First Church building, to be utilized as soon as expected additional space is available. (This request has already been agreed upon by the Lessor)

2. Determine needs for the Center for the next 5, 10, 15 years. The Committee sees that there will likely be some expansion of Area ministries and that certain offices will need more space. However, more time is needed to make this study, as it is not possible to predict new directions at this time. Present space can be expanded to include the first floor space but this would require a new master plan at that time.

Recommend: That this Committee be continued for two more years so that this study can be continued and specific recommendations be made before the time space is available.

3. Consult with First Church as to their projected rent and parking space through the year 2000. Consultations were held with the Lessor and were very congenial. The Lessor expects that rents will increase modestly and has taken steps to provide more parking. At this time, as is reported below, our rental costs are much cheaper than other space we might rent or purchase. If this Committee is continued this would continue to be monitored.

Recommend: Committee continue to monitor the situation for the next two years and continue investigation of other possible locations.

4. Develop a plan to provide the space needed and the costs involved for the Conferences. Space mainly needed is for expansion of some offices and room for the United Methodist Foundation. We believe that when the first floor space is available there can be a major remodeling, of new and present space, to better meet our needs.

Recommend: Postpone the actual plan until we are assured the space is available and then use the services of an architect to plan total use. Costs will have to be figured at that time.

5 & 6. Study the possibilities of purchasing property. Study leasing in other locations. Sub-committees looked at various sites and found that the cost factor is too great at this

time for either purchasing or leasing or renting other property. The new lease with First Church is for \$5.50 per square foot plus \$100 per month for 20 parking spaces, which includes janitorial service and utilities. There is a large amount of space used for which no rental is charged. Other rental space surveyed runs from \$8 per square foot in poor locations to \$10.50 in better locations, these do not include services. In other properties we would also have to pay for space which we now receive gratis. Surveys of possible building sites to purchase or buildings now available indicate that costs would exceed what we now pay, considering front-end money that would have to be raised and payments to amortize debt.

Recommend: Stay in present location but continue to monitor the opportunities which may present themselves.

7. Present to the Annual Conferences a proposal for the best option to meet needs now and in the future. The Committee agrees that we are in a good position until the end of 1989. Study should continue and active efforts made to seek out opportunities. If they appear to be more attractive, they should be further investigated and a report made.

Recommend: Continue the same Long Range Committee, which will meet in conjunction with the United Methodist Center Corporation. They will make further Annual Reports to the Conferences. Plan to maintain offices in the present space until it is determined if the additional space will be available in the near future. Look to a permanent decision by Annual Conference meetings of 1989.

Board Of Pensions

Since 1982 the Board of Pensions has been able to raise the rate for past service from \$118.00 to \$220.00 (1987). At the same time, the period of years projected to pay the unfunded liability has decreased from 40 to 22 years. This has been possible by the rate of apportionments received from the local churches and the good investment yields at the General Board of Pensions.

Report No. 1

1. We recommend that the Little Rock Conference participate in the Ministerial Pension (MPP) and the Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP) of the General Board of Pensions during 1988 on the following basis:
 - a. Contribution base shall be limited to each minister's plan compensation not to exceed the denominational average compensation.
 - b. Contribution rate shall be MPP, 12% of each minister's contribution base, and CPP, 4.4% of each minister's contribution base.
 - c. Annuity rate for pre-January 1, 1982 service shall be raised from \$220 to \$230 (4.55% increase) per service year.
 - d. Surviving spouse percentage of the formula benefit rate shall be 70%.
 - e. A 22 year amortization period shall be used to pay the unfunded past service liability.
 - f. Monthly contributions to MPP/CPP shall be made through the apportionment system.
 - g. CPP benefits shall be supplemented with Death Benefit Plan-Plus (DBP-Plus) to 300% DAC.
 - h. Active participants will contribute to the Death Benefit Program Plus with the church paying 60% and the participant 40%.
 - i. Every Conference member making less than the Equitable Salary from his/her primary salary paying unit can be included in CPP at the rate of 3.4% of his/her contribution base.
 - j. Probationers at seminary will be provided CPP at 3.4%.
 - k. Those on leave of absence may participate in CPP at the rate of 3.4%. The participant will pay the full 3.4%.
2. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 1606, Section 12e of the 1984 Discipline that the Sunday following Easter be observed as Retired Minister's Day. Each Pastor is urged to acquaint his or her congregation with the pension program of the Conference as part of the observance, and if possible to use a retired minister in the Worship Service.
3. We recommend in keeping with Par. 1606, Section 4h of the 1984 Discipline, the approval of the Annual Conference that Special Appointments shall be listed in the Conference Journal as follows: (1) With Annuity Claim, (a) upon the Annual Conference, or (b) upon a General Board, an Institution, or an Agency of the United Methodist Church; (2) Without Annuity Claim upon this Annual Conference.
4. We recommend the following pertaining to the different insurance programs of the Conference:
 - a. Board of Pensions pay 100% of the premium for our eligible retirees, surviving spouses, and ministers on disability for the Hospital and Medical Expense Program.
 - b. Hospitalization Insurance and Conference Claimants: If a retired minister and/or spouse desires to have the premium for their Conference Hospitalization and Medical Insurance Program paid by the Board of Pensions, the minister must have been enrolled in the program prior to his/her 65th birthday. Likewise, if the spouse is to have the premium for the Program paid by the Conference, he/she must have been enrolled in the program for a minimum of one year prior to his/her 65th birthday or one year prior to the minister's retirement.
 - c. Hospitalization Insurance and Dependents of Deceased and Retired Ministers: In the case of a deceased minister whose spouse is under the age of 65, the Board of Pensions will pay the dependent's insurance premium for five (5) years following the death of the minister. In the event of extenuating circumstances, an extension of payments may be requested by the dependent. Payment automatically ends with the remarriage of the dependent. Each case will be reviewed annually. If a minister's spouse is under the age of 65 at the time of that minister's retirement, the Board of Pensions will pay only the portion of the Conference Hospitalization and Medical Insurance Program premium equal to the amount of the premium of the retired minister.

5. We recommend that an annual amount equal to 100% of the pension and disability payment of each minister of the Little Rock Conference be designated as housing allowance.
6. We recommend that in keeping with Par. 736, Section 4 of the 1984 Discipline that there shall be organized from the membership of the Board of Pensions of the Little Rock Conference a committee to compare the records of the amount paid by each pastoral charge for support of pastors and for pension benefit purposes computing the proportional distribution thereof and keeping a permanent record of defaults of the ministers in the Conference who have failed to observe the provision in Par. 736, Section 4 pertaining to proportional payment, and shall render annually to each minister and charge in default a statement of amounts in default for that and preceding years. In event of default by any Pastoral Charge and after the notification of the committee, liens shall be filed against future pensions and the names of the churches and ministers along with the amount in default shall be printed in the Conference Journal.
7. We request the Secretary of the Annual Conference to print in the minister's Service Record in the Journal, one column stating "Years of Pensions Claim on the Little Rock Conference," and another stating "Total Service Years in the Ministry."
8. A list of annuitants and pension payments for the year 1986 is available in the Conference Treasurer's Office from Mary Stanfield.

Resolution Relating to Rental/Housing Allowances For Retired Or Disabled Ministers Of This Conference

Whereas, the religious denomination known as the United Methodist Church has and functions through Ministers of the Gospel who are duly ordained or licensed; and

Whereas, the practice of the United Methodist Church is to provide a parsonage or a rental allowance as part of the gross compensation for each of its active ordained or licensed ministers, and

Whereas, pensions paid to retired ordained or licensed ministers of the United Methodist Church are considered as deferred compensation and are paid to said retired ordained or licensed ministers in consideration of previous, active service, and disability benefits are considered payments in lieu of compensation for active service; and

Whereas, the Internal Revenue Service has recognized that the Little Rock Annual Conference is the appropriate organization to designate a housing/allowance for retired ordained or licensed ministers who are members of the Conference; and

Whereas, the disabled minister has the same legal relationship to the Annual Conference as does the retired minister and, thus, this Annual Conference is also the appropriate organization to designate a housing/allowance for a disabled ordained or licensed minister who is a member of this Conference;

Now therefore Be It Resolved:

1. An amount equal to 100% of the pensions payments received by a retired minister, or 100% of the disability benefit payments received by a disabled minister, during the year 1988 be and is hereby designated as a rental/allowance respectively for each retired or disabled ordained or licensed minister of The United Methodist Church who is or was a member of the Little Rock Annual Conference at the time of his retirement or disability;
2. The pension or disability payment to which this rental/housing allowance applies shall be the pension or disability payment resulting from all service of such retired or disabled ordained or licensed minister from all employment by any local church, Annual Conference, General Agency, or institution of The United Methodist Church or any former denomination that is now a part of The United Methodist Church, or from any other employer who employed the minister to perform services related to the ministry and who elected to make contributions to the pension or benefit funds of The United Methodist Church for such retired minister's pension or disabled minister's benefits.

Note:

The rental/housing allowance which may be excluded from a minister's gross income is

limited to the lesser of (1) the amount of the rental/housing allowance designated by the minister's employer or other appropriate body, (2) the amount actually expended by the minister to provide his or her housing, or (3) the legally determined fair rental value of the parsonage or other housing provided. As specified in Rev. Rul. 71-280, 1971 C.B. 92, "the only amount that will qualify for exclusion under section 107 (2) of the Code as a 'rental allowance' is an amount equal to the fair rental value of the home, including furnishings and appurtenances such as a garage, plus the cost of utilities."

Beginning in 1984, there is no longer a sick pay or disability income exclusion available with respect to disability benefit payments. Therefore, the full amount of disability benefit payments will be taxable income to the recipient beginning in 1984.

**Addendum A To The Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP)
and The Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP)
(MPP) Supplement Paragraph (c) for the Year 1988**

This Addendum A is applicable to the Little Rock Annual Conference and is effective as of January 1, 1988. It replaces any previously executed Addendum A and shall be in effect until amended by the Annual Conference in accordance with the provisions of the Ministerial Pension Plan and the Comprehensive Protection Plan.

Contribution Base	The MPP and CPP Contribution Base shall be the Active Participant's Plan Compensation for a plan Year not to exceed the Denominational Average Compensation. (MPP Section 4.1 (c) and CPP Section 4.1 (c))
Contribution Rate	The MPP Church contribution rate shall be 12% of the Contribution Base of each Active Participant and the CPP Church Contribution rate shall be 4.4% of the Contribution Base of each Active Participant. (MPP Section 4.1 (b) and CPP Section 4.1 (c))
Contribution Method	The Church Contribution shall be made monthly to the Plan by the Annual Conference in accordance with the Plan document. Such MPP and CPP Church Contributions shall be transferred monthly from the Deposit Account of the Annual Conference by the General Board of Pensions to each Active Participant's account and the Protection Benefit Fund, respectively. The Annual Conference shall maintain an amount in its Deposit Account sufficient to provide for the monthly transfer of the Church Contributions on behalf of its Active Participants. In the event the Deposit Account is overdrawn, an interest charge shall be made by the General Board of Pensions. Such charge shall be made at the current monthly rate of interest credited to the STIRA investment program. (MPP Section 4.1 (a) and 4.2 (g), and CPP Section 4.1 (b) and 4.2 (h))
Past Service Pension Rate	On January 1, 1988, the ministerial Pension Rate shall be \$230.00, and the local pastor's Pension Rate shall be \$230.00. (Disciplinary Paragraphs 1606.2 (b) and 1606.7) (MPP Supplemental Section (f))
Surviving Spouse Benefit	In accordance with paragraph (3) (5) of Supplement One, the Surviving Spouse Benefit shall be 70% of the Participant's Formula Benefit.
Special Arrangements	The Little Rock Annual Conference Board of Pensions is hereby authorized, at its discretion, to arrange with the General Board of Pensions for active participation in the CPP by persons who are eligible under special rules but not automatically included as Active Participants. (CPP Section 3.2)

In accordance with paragraph (f) of Supplement One, the Unfunded liability as of January 1, 1988 has been actuarially projected to be \$4,289,486. Past service funding deposits are required to fund this unfunded liability, and shall be in the amounts for the periods as shown below:

These annual deposits shall be made at the end of each calendar year as required by the General Board of Pensions. The past service deposits shall be transferred from the Little Rock Annual Conference Deposit Account to the Past Service Funding Account on December 31. If the annual cash flow requirement, as determined by the General Board of Pensions, exceeds the combined past service funding deposit amounts, then the cash flow requirement shall become the required past service funding deposit. (MPP Supplement One (f))

Arkansas United Methodist A Plan Of Circulation

The Area Committee on Communication makes the following recommendations to the two Annual Conferences for consideration and adoption at the 1987 Annual Conference sessions:

1. That the month of September 1987 be a time of emphasis for securing renewals and new paid subscriptions to the Arkansas United Methodist, and that Sunday, September 13, be a time of special emphasis in each United Methodist congregation. The annual subscription price continues at \$10. Each local church will receive in advance of the campaign a complete listing of all paid and allocated subscribers for its use in promoting new paid subscriptions.
2. That a minimum of 2,500 additional (new) subscriptions be secured during the period of the circulation emphasis.
3. That new and renewal subscription promotions use the services of local churches to focus attention on the need and value of the Arkansas United Methodist to Arkansas United Methodism and its constituency.
4. That in January, 1988, the Arkansas United Methodist furnish each local church a list of all its subscribers, both paid and apportioned. These lists are used by the local church to update its allocations, making changes or corrections. The allocation lists are to be returned to the Arkansas United Methodist within 10 days.
5. That each local church administrative board, by appropriate administrative action, designate a person to serve as the Arkansas United Methodist circulation director for the local church, who, in consultation with the pastor, will direct the annual subscription effort in the local church. The name of this person so chosen would be forwarded to the district superintendent who, in turn, forwards the list of local church directors within the district to the Arkansas United Methodist, which may then work directly with the local director, keeping the local pastor informed.

V. APPORTIONMENTS AND ASKINGS:

A. World Service and Conference Benevolences: We recommend that the General Conference apportionment of \$349,240 for World Service be accepted and that an amount of \$842,229 be apportioned for Conference Benevolences for 1988; for a total apportionment of \$1,191,467. Further, we recommend that the monies received for World Service and Conference Benevolences be distributed on a basis of 29.25 % for World Service and 70.75 % for Conference Benevolences.

B. Ministerial Support: We recommend that the Ministerial Support apportionment of \$1,578,944 be accepted in full by the Annual Conference and that it be apportioned to the local churches.

C. Other Apportioned Funds: We recommend that the Annual Conference accept in full the askings listed below and they be apportioned to the local churches.

VI. APPORTIONMENT FORMULA:

We recommend that the formula used by the conference be a two year average of the most recent years' statistics: $\frac{1}{3}$ based on membership (column 9) and $\frac{2}{3}$ based on financial data, consisting of local church expenditures (columns 35-41, 60, 61, 62, 70 and 71) and that year's apportionments. The decimal will be a conference decimal, with each church weighed against the conference total.

VII. SALARY & EXPENSE OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS AND COUNCIL ON MINISTRIES DIRECTOR:

We recommend the District Superintendents' salary and expenses be:

We recommend a vouchered expense pool for the District Superintendents in the amount of \$21,000 for meetings (Cabinet, CCOM, and out of state) with the stipulation that no district, board or agency make any payment for the purpose indicated above.

We recommend that the Director of the Council on Ministries' salary and expense be the same as the District Superintendents.

VIII. ADVANCE SPECIALS:

We recommend General Advance Specials to local churches for first hand relationships with mission projects and involvement in mission.

IX. SPECIAL DAYS:

We recommend these Special Days with offerings:

Human Relations Day — Last Sunday in Epiphany
 One Great Hour of Sharing — Fourth Sunday in Lent
 United Methodist Student Day — Last Sunday of year
 World Communion Sunday — First Sunday in October
 United Methodist Children's Home — Second and Third Sundays in December
 World Order Sunday — May 22

X. ALDERSGATE "FAIR SHARE":

We recommend \$50,000 be requested from the churches in "FairShare goals for core costs" at Aldersgate, and that "programmatic costs" be continued as a Conference Advance Special.

XI. CHRISTIAN CIVIC FOUNDATION:

We recommend \$12,500 be requested from the local churches in "Fair Share" goals for the Christian Civic Foundation in 1988.

XII. PERKINS/ST. PAUL FAIR SHARE:

We recommend \$63,060 be requested from the local churches in "Fair Share" goals for the Perkins-St. Paul Campaign for 1988.

XIII. OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS — We recommend that:

- A. Apportionments for Ethnic Minority Local Churches be accepted by every local Church and that 50% of the Missional Priority Fund be retained for use in the Conference. We recommend that the World Hunger goal of \$300,000 be retained.
- B. Pastor's Utilities and Appurtenances: If no utility allowance is made, we recommend that the local churches designate a part of the salary as parsonage utilities and appurtenances to exempt those costs from income taxes.
- C. The travel allowance remain at \$.20 per mile plus \$.02 per mile for each additional person, to encourage car pooling.
- D. Retired ministers be paid \$35 per diem for days they attend Annual Conference.
- E. Pastor's moving expense be paid at the rate of \$300 plus \$.75 per mile. The mileage is to be paid from parsonage to parsonage, with one exception. When transferring from another conference, the rate will apply from parsonage to the Little Rock conference boundary. The policies for application for Pastor's Moving Expense Funds are listed in the 1982 JOURNAL, page 127, Section 1211 (F).
- F. All unrestricted benevolence funds be placed in a central operating balance.
- G. "Interest Income" from investments (estimated 1988 income: \$50,000), with the exception of the income earned from Church Development Funds, be deposited in the Conference Contingency fund. We further recommend that the expenses of the Conference Debt fund (\$30,000) and Contingency expenses (up to \$20,000) be disbursed from this fund.
- H. Balances remaining in the Conference Benevolence Fund and the Conference Administration fund at year end be transferred to the Contingency fund.
- I. Any Conference employee who has, or who desires a tax sheltered annuity, may direct the Director of Finance & Management to pay this annuity from his regular income following proper guidelines.
- J. Housing allowances (for persons receiving such funds) be set at the estimated actual expense as reported to the conference or local church. This information should be reported at the beginning of each calendar year. This will result in reallocation in the funds paid to such persons and will not increase the total amount paid.
- K. Each board, commission, committee or agency not be allowed to change a line item in its approved budget which would exceed 10% of the amount without approval of the Council on Finance & Administration.
- L. The latest independent audits shall be submitted for review and study by any agency receiving conference funds.
- M. Wesley Foundations may solicit funds within their supporting districts after approval is given by the District Council on Ministries.
- N. Local church administrative boards consider paying all conference life and health insurance (DBP & HMEP) premiums directly (above salary) in order to provide tax savings for pastors and other church employees. If necessary or desirable, the salary must be reduced by the same amount. This policy must be consistently applied to all employees.

- O. Participation by the conference in Area programs must not exceed 50% of the cost of that program, with exceptions approved by the Council on Finance & Administration.
- P. The funds for the Missional Priority be placed under the direction of the Council on Ministries director.
- Q. The management and investment of all the monies of/from all those boards and agencies which receive monies from the Conference or line item appropriations must be handled by the area treasurer's office.
- R. Any capital asset lease or purchase over \$1,500 must be approved by the Council on Finance & Administration prior to lease or purchase, even if that budget has been previously approved.
- S. Permission be granted to the area treasurer to borrow funds (on a short-term basis) from the Arkansas Area account if Little Rock Conference funds are not sufficient to meet current needs. Both Council on Finance & Administration presidents must approve the loan before it is transacted. Interest on such loan will be paid at the current money market rate.
- T. The Conference provide fidelity bonding insurance for all local churches in compliance with Paragraph 2510 of the 1984 BOOK OF DISCIPLINE.
- U. Balances remaining in the Conference Benevolence Fund and the Conference Administration fund at year end be transferred to the contingency fund.
- V. We concur with the proposal of the Camp Tanako Board allowing them to proceed with the raising of funds for Phase I of the Camp Tanako Master Development Plan.
- W. A uniform percentage "pad" of five percent (5%) will be added to all 1988 apportionments.
- X. The following be adopted, as the guide for the investment and care of all Conference funds:
 The Area Treasurer is charged with the responsibility for managing all Conference funds in a manner that will provide:
 - (1) The maximum income from the investment of all funds, while simultaneously insuring
 - (2) Adequate liquidity to meet the day-to-day operational needs of the Treasurer's office, and
 - (3) The safety and soundness of all funds.

To accomplish this, all funds should be (1) deposited in Arkansas Institutions in a fully-insured status on a short-term basis, generally ninety days, but up to six months with the approval of the Investment Committee or CFA, or (2) invested in direct U.S. government obligations for terms up to six months.

Longer term investments may be made from time to time, but these are generally discouraged, because of the uncertainty of the need for funds and the volatility of interest rates. The Area Treasurer is encouraged to consult with a majority of the Investment Committee of the CFA, when she is uncertain about an investment.

This policy is intended to be flexible in its application, in order to meet rapidly changing economic conditions. While income is desirable, the primary emphasis should continue to be the maintenance of adequate funds and the avoidance of speculative investments.

This policy may be amended from time to time, to meet changing conditions and to enhance the income of the Conference.

Little Rock Conference Board Of Diaconal Ministry — 1988

Purpose

The purpose of the Conference Board of Diaconal Ministry is to study the needs and resources of the conference, relative to professional ministry careers and to interpret Diaconal

nal Ministry throughout the conference, to seek to enlist persons of all races and ethnic origins; to guide persons interested in these careers through the process of training, certification and consecrated. The Board shall also assist in the personal/professional growth of certified and consecrated professionals in the church.

Goals

1. To survey the present and potential use of lay professionals in the Annual Conference.
2. To work with the local churches and agencies employing Diaconal Ministers and lay employees in providing adequate salary, benefit support systems, and continuing education.
3. To increase the number of Diaconal Ministers in the Annual Conference by 10% in the 1985-88 Quadrennium.
4. To encourage certification of salaried lay workers in the church.

1988 Program Objectives

1. Keep current the survey of local churches employing lay staff persons in order to encourage continuing education toward certification and/or consecration as Diaconal Ministers.
2. To continue cooperation with District Superintendent and enable local church Pastor-Staff Relations Committees to fully understand 1984 Discipline regarding Diaconal Ministers; the importance of employing trained professional staff, and to aid them in upgrading their effectiveness through continuing education and benefit support systems.
3. To interpret Diaconal Ministry throughout the conference.
4. Each inquiring candidate will be assigned a Diaconal Mentor for spiritual and professional guidance.
5. To hold an Annual Retreat for all persons who have a relationship to the Board.

Policy Statement

The minimum starting salary and benefits of persons who are certified by the United Methodist Church and/or Diaconal Ministers serving full-time in a United Methodist Church, shall be commensurate with those of a beginning ordained minister.

Scholarship Fund

The Board of Diaconal Ministry shall maintain a scholarship fund for candidates preparing for Diaconal Ministry as follows:

1. For those fulfilling candidacy requirements through a master's degree at a theological or graduate school approved by the University Senate of the UMC.
2. For those fulfilling candidacy requirements through the UM Foundational Studies.
3. Each applicant may receive up to \$275 per year. Aid will be granted on the basis of need and availability of funds. Due to limited funds, transportation is not covered. Candidates may apply for the balance of tuition/expense cost from the General Board of Diaconal Ministry and/or the local church. In the last quarter of the year, according to availability of unspent funds, additional or emergency aid may be granted.
4. Candidates may make application for financial aid to the Committee on Scholarship and Continuing Ed. Send applications to the Vice-Chairperson or Registrar of the BDM.

Diaconal Ministers are required to earn 1 continuing education unit or 10 contact hours in equivalent study. Financial aid is available for continuing education. The following shall serve as policy guidelines:

1. Each Diaconal Minister may apply for \$150 annually, if an equal amount is matched by the local church and/or minister. The matching requirement may be waived at the discretion of the Committee on Scholarship and CE funds shall be used for tuition, room, and board. Aid will be granted based upon the date of application and availability of funds.
2. Person seeking financial aid for CE shall secure an application from Vice Chairperson of BDM.
3. The Committee on Scholarship and CE shall review applications by Jan. 31 and June 30 of each year.

Bishop Wilke, delegates and friends, another year has passed and we gather gain to review the past, but, more importantly; to take a good look "Into the Future By Faith."

The United Methodist Women of the Little Rock Conference have looked in the future. In 1986, they accepted the challenge and made their pledge of \$120,000. In addition to the

\$120,000 a total of \$26,260.28 was sent to the Women's Division as supplemental giving. Yes, we have accepted the challenge of Mission, and continue to do what God calls us to do. 1987 and 1988, will be no different.

The Annual Meeting at First United Methodist Church in Magnolia in October was a highlight of our year. Carolyn Marshall, President of the Women's Division was the speaker. Mrs. Marshall said, "Our organization is on the cutting edge — we must be the support system to those who take risk, in the quest for peace and justice in world concerns." Continuing Mrs. Marshall said, "Peace like bread must be made daily — we specialize in the impossible — so it is with United Methodist Women — we go to the top of the mountain, see the vision, come back to carry and share the vision, then act to make that vision a reality. We must accept the challenge." I believe we are in the process of doing this.

The responsibility of this office that I enjoy the most, is being a part of your District and Local Unit meetings. I have the privilege of attending the District Programs, Officers Training and going into many of the Local Units. The future of Mission in the United Methodist Church is very bright, especially for those of us in the Little Rock Conference. The building was made possible through a grant of \$500,000 by the National and Women's Division of the General Board of Global Ministries, but in order to be able to use the building, many hours have been spent by volunteers the past year, to provide furnishings and other essential needs. The Respite Care Program and The Woodlawn Day Care Center for Abused Children, now have a center that is functional for their special needs.

Julia Wilke, along with others, have spread the word about Camp Aldersgate programs this past year. Almost 3000 copies of "Trickem On Gooch Creek," have been sold, with the proceeds going to assist with their program. The United Methodist Women have always been proud to have an active part in Camp Aldersgate. I know this will continue.

Now we look to the future. The Conference Officers will travel Sunday to Oklahoma City for their West Gulf Regional School of Christian Mission. Our study themes for the coming year will be: "The Acts of the Apostles," "People and Churches of the Soviet Union," and "Toward Health and Wholeness." These will be presented at the Arkansas Area School of Christian Mission at Hendrix College, at two events; the Week-day August 11-14, and the Week-end August 14-16. Every church should have someone in attendance at this event. It is a wonderful opportunity for study, and you are able to receive Continuing Education Credit.

Three years ago the Conference Program Committee of United Methodist Women began a Conference Day Apart. This was a one day event held during the week. Jeannie Pope will lead us in the theme "The Life and Teachings of Jesus." It is to be held at Camp Tanako, beginning at 6:30 p.m., July 17 and concluding after lunch July 18. en's Division. She is presently the President of the North America Area World Federation of Methodist Women. Our theme is "Partners Working Together for God," and we plan to extend special invitations to women of the AME, AME Zion, and the CME churches in our conference.

We are always involved in what is going on around us. This will continue into the future and it is only by faith we are able to achieve our goals.

Rev. John Lindsey has presented to this Annual Conference the new boundaries of each district, and these changes will make each district stronger. I am working with the District Presidents to make the change as easy as possible. The District Officers will finish their obligations through their Fall Meetings. We will try to set separate dates so everyone will be able to attend the Fall Meetings in the New District. The treasurers will be asked to remit their monies to the treasurer in their new district for the third and fourth quarters. Our main concern for 1987, will be to see that each unit has remitted their pledge to the District Treasurer. We will be sure all areas are represented on District Nominating Committees. I now the Fall Meetings will be exciting, as we make new friends, and begin working together. The Board of Trustees of The Little Rock Conference submits the following recommendations for action by the 1987 session of The Little Rock Conference:

That the Liberty United Methodist Church in Hempsted Co. property be leased to the non-denominational church now using the property for a period of five years at the rate of one dollar a year. if the property is sold, the non-denominational church will be given first opportunity of purchase. The non-denominational church shall be responsible for fire and liability insurance.
4. That the Old Carolina Church building and furnishings be donated to the Prescott-Nevada County Chamber of Commerce and the Nevada State Park Association. The church will be moved to Prescott with cost being paid by the Chamber of commerce and Association. The Conference will retain ownership of the land.
5. District Superintendents are encouraged to obtain copies of deeds for all property within their Districts. It is recommended that a copy of all deeds be filed with the Conference Board of Trustees.

Report Of The Publishing House

Bishop Wilke and members and friends of the Little Rock Annual Conference, your publishing house is having an exciting and fruitful year in terms of: 1) the variety and quality of projects published, and 2) the positive response of people to these projects.

Our goal is to become the leading Christian publisher in the world. In moving toward that goal, some of our most notable projects this year have been:

- Serving our United Methodist people with powerful books by authors such as Bishops Wilke, Hunt, and Underwood; Bill Hinson, Will Willimon, Lyle Schaller; Dick Murray; and George Hunter

- Addressing societal issues with books such as Tipper Gore's *Raising PG Kids in an X-Rated Society*.

- Joining the British Methodist Publishing House in launching *The International Christian Digest*, a magazine for Christians who desire summaries of the best global Christian thinking today.

- Organizing a new video unit and producing eleven outstanding studies on video cassette, including a beautiful presentation of the ministry of Paul.

- Continuing our work with the Hymnal Revision Committee to assure our church of the finest hymnal to be published in this country.

- Working with the Council of Bishops to publish all the resources related to the bishops' call *In Defense of Creation*.

- Preparing the most ambitious adult Bible study in the history of our House. Entitled *Disciple: Becoming Disciples Through Bible Study*, the good impact of this video-based approach to learning will be with us for years to come.

- Reorganizing the Cokesbury system with more toll-free lines, better-run stores, a growing sensitivity to your needs, and more stores on seminary campuses — all of this to better serve the church.

These are just some of the accomplishments of your publishing house in recent months, accomplishments made possible by scores of people all over the world.

The publishing house is an agency that must financially sustain itself and if by good management the House has revenue left over, after bills are paid, the Discipline directs the Board of Publication to put aside a reasonable amount for product development, capital improvements, and emergencies — and then to allocate the balance to the pension funds of the various annual conferences under a formula provided by the General Board of Pensions.

This year the General Board of Publication is distributing \$1,000,000 for pensions. The Little Rock Annual Conference is receiving \$8,118.15. And, I am pleased to present this check to you, Bishop Wilke.

Commission On Religion And Race

In our efforts to reach local churches the goals of the Commission and some excellent program ideas for various workareas have been made available to the churches through district representatives. Because all churches do not have Commissions, individuals interested in inclusive programming are encouraged to see your district reps for ideas for activities.

Two of the three bodies identified for monitoring last year have been monitored. The Commission thanks the Missional Priority Coordinating Committee and Nominations and Personnel for their cooperation. We found the Missional Priority, though behind in their work, making a concerted effort to reach the goals established. The MP is also working intentionally to identify ways to make the EMLC an integral part of the Conference after the Priority ends in 1988. Nominations and Personnel was found to be very receptive and willing to work with the Commission to identify ways to ensure ethnic participation in the Committee's work. Monitoring for the Cabinet in consultation with the Bishop, is planned for later this year. Dialogue continues with the Conference Office regarding participants for the Convocation on Racism in September, 1987.

Goals for 1988:

1. Continue monitoring process, choosing three additional bodies to monitor.
2. Continue efforts to reach local churches to further the goal of inclusiveness.
3. Serve as advocate for those bodies, individuals and/or churches who feel excluded from the system.

Committee On Review

In response to the assignment given to this committee by the 1986 session of the Little Rock Annual Conference, we recommend the discontinuation of the Area Office on Cooperative Parish Ministry/New Church Development at the Annual Conference session in June, 1988.

We rejoice in the establishment of Cooperative Parish settings that are effectively working at this time and acknowledge the usefulness of this model of ministry for the churches involved. Furthermore, we are keenly aware of the continual need for resourcing the ministries of local churches, especially those with small membership.

We recommend that the Little Rock Annual Conference approve a new position to be designated as Associate Director of Congregational Development, effective at the Annual Conference Session of June, 1988. The Associate Director, who may be either laity, diaconal, or ordained, shall be responsible to the Director of the Conference Council on Ministries.

The OBJECTIVES for this position shall be:

1. **CHURCH SCHOOL** — Provide leadership and direction by identifying resources available (human and material) for assisting small membership churches in the varied areas of church school growth. Initiates appropriate contacts with local churches to deliver this information.
2. **LEADERSHIP TRAINING** — Develop and implement training events designated to strengthen the ministry of lay and clergy in specific areas identified through Needs Assessments events within the districts of the annual conference.
3. **OUTREACH** — Assists individual congregations with the identification and development of ministries (programs) to address community identified needs, i.e., Senior citizens activities, health services, tutoring programs, etc.
4. **COOPERATIVE PARISH SETTINGS** — Encourage and implement Cooperative Ministry settings among churches with small memberships.

5. **STEWARDSHIP** — Develop and implement the resources of small membership churches (including time, talent and money).

The Committee on Review shall present, in writing, at the 1988 session of the Annual Conference a job description for this position.

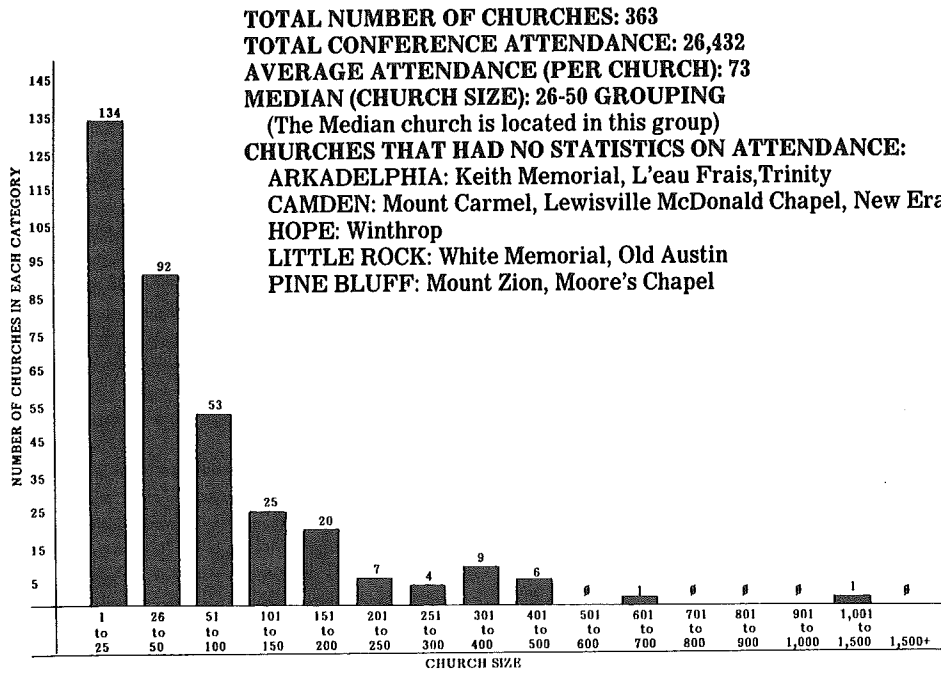
This position shall be established for a time period of three years, to be reviewed annually by the Committee on Review. At the conclusion of three years, the Annual Conference shall decide by vote whether to continue this office. Staffing for this position shall follow the guidelines set forth in the Conference Structure for the Conference Council on Ministries.

We recommend that the financing for this office shall not exceed \$40,500.00.

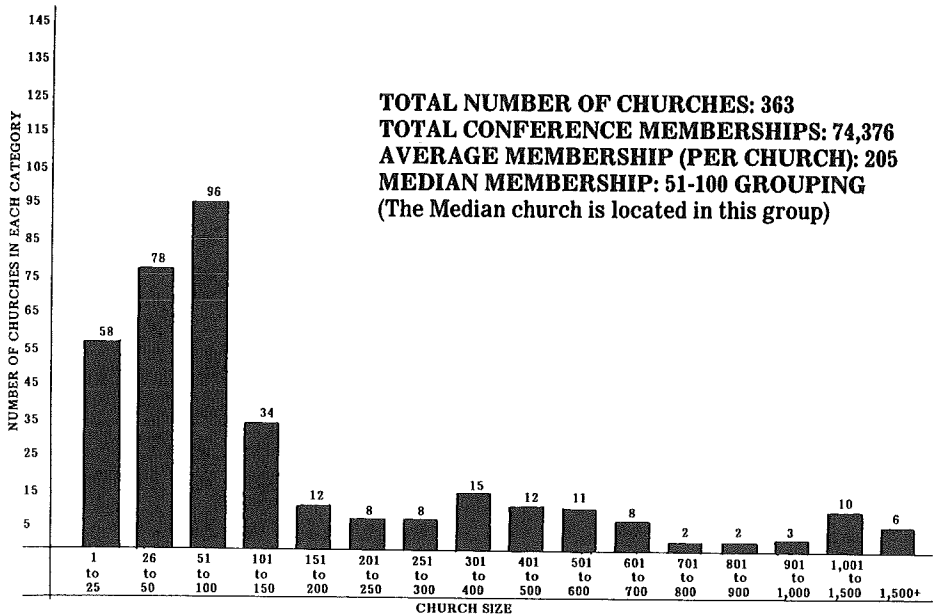

Camp Aldersgate, Inc.

Henri Nouwen in his book, *The Wounded Healer*, makes the statement that if you are seeking the Messiah, you will find him at the Gate of the Village binding the wounds of the wounded. Based on the belief that the church is called into a ministry of service to others, one place you will find The United Methodist Church ministering to these needs is at Camp Aldersgate. It is here you will find the Spirit of Christ binding wounds.

Camp Aldersgate is a love story that keeps on growing. It stretches its arms to encircle people who suffer in body, mind, or spirit. In a beautiful, natural 115-acre setting, all who enter the gates are inspired. Its ministry is especially dedicated to the isolated, lonely, and those with handicapping conditions.

The ministries at Camp Aldersgate have mirrored the issues of our times. Founded forty years ago this year, those who bought this land and established Camp Aldersgate as a mission of The United Methodist Church in West Little Rock, did so with the challenge to "meet and fulfill human needs, whenever and however they exist." This is a difficult task to undertake, but we have been doing so now for these four decades.

One of the great highlights of our existence has been the completion of a new building, appropriately called "The Caring Center." This new facility houses our Respite Care program for children with handicapping conditions as well as Woodlawn Therapeutic Child Care Center for abused and neglected preschool children. The new building was completed with a grant of \$500,000 from the Women's Division, Board of Global Ministries. We stand on the threshold of exciting new opportunities for service. Now we can provide better care for the children we currently serve, and can also reach out into new areas of service: to challenge those needs of which we have been aware, but unable to meet.

The progress continues for improving, updating, and modernizing the camp buildings and equipment. With the help of many churches, United Methodist Women's organizations and individuals, we are maintaining the pace established the last few years. Mrs. Julia Kitchens

Wilke and the Book Committee, who had *Trick-em On Gooch Creek* by C. B. Kitchens republished, have literally covered the state selling books and presenting programs about Camp Aldersgate. They have been very successful in both endeavors. These special friends of Camp Aldersgate have told our story wherever people would listen, and sold books where two or more were gathered. They have raised \$18,000 in contributions for Camp Aldersgate. For this kind of leadership and dedication our Board selected Mrs. Wilke as the "Volunteer of the Year" for 1986. We are most grateful to her for this effort. Dr. Kelsy Caplinger and Med Camps, Inc. gave us a grant this year of \$10,000 for improving two of our older cabins, and Mrs. Jim Linder of West Helena gave over \$50,000 for furnishings and equipment for the new Caring Center. There have been numerous other groups and Sunday School classes and businesses who have also assisted in these projects. Help from these sources has been strong and meaningful to us. Again we could not have made it without their support.

We are currently operating on an annual budget of just a little over \$400,000. We must have approximately 25% or \$100,000 from the two Arkansas Conferences in order to cover our basic corps costs of insurance, utilities, salaries, and everyday operating expenses. During this past year, we received a total of only \$42,000 from the churches of both conferences. From the North Arkansas Conference an apportionment of \$18,500 and from the Little Rock Conference a "Fair Share" giving of \$23,500. This comes to only 10.5% of our budget needs instead of 25%. We desperately need your help to change this so that we may have a stable cash flow from the Churches in order to meet our monthly operating expenses. True, many churches and individuals have caught the vision and spirit of the ministries of Camp Aldersgate and have come to our aid. We need this, but it is vital that we have a broader base of support from all churches.

We could never operate on the scale we do without the help of volunteers who contribute so much to our programs. Last year alone volunteers contributed over \$100,000 in labor, figured at minimum wage.

The need for help to the people we serve continues to grow. The asking for assistance is ever increasing. But the money from the churches has not kept up with these needs. This past year we have been on C.O.D. with some of our suppliers so often that it is embarrassing. I appeal to you to please help us to change this. Frankly, I don't know who to say "No" to a man out of work who asks for food and clothing. I don't know how to say "No" to a mother who is at the point of breaking and asks for help in taking care of her handicapped child for a Respite Care weekend. I don't know how to say "No" to a Senior Citizen who wants to come to Aldersgate for a well balanced meal and socialization. I don't know how to say "No" to a young family who wants to come to the clinic for free medical help and medication. I don't know how to say "No" to a father who wants his "special child" to attend Med Camps in the summer. I don't know how to say "No" to abused or neglected children who need the attention and love they find at Camp Aldersgate.

This is our ministry. These are the people we serve.

For these people Camp Aldersgate is a way to "touch the hem of Christ's garment." And just like Christ, we touch the lives of many, many people. Last year persons came to us from 56 of the 75 counties here in Arkansas.

These people are too important to ignore.

The solution we have is too good to withhold.

The God we serve is too great to deny.

The mission we have is too exciting to miss.

The church cannot afford to say "No." Somehow we must find a way to finance this ministry and meet these needs. We know that people we serve will be there seeking help. We know our volunteers will be there offering love in so many different ways. Can we count on the churches to be there with us also? Who will be with the Messiah, binding the wounds of the wounded, if our own church is not?

We lose members by Death and Transfer, but fewer than we receive by Profession of Faith and Transfer. This is true of each of the 13 years in this analysis. Therefore, we would always show a Net Gain comparing Lines 2, 3, 4 with Lines 6, 7, 8.

A Net Loss shows up only when we include Line 5 (Charge Conference Action/Withdrawal. Over the 13 Year Period (1974-1986) our Net Gain would have been 5,083. This was wiped out by Line 5 for a real Net Loss of 8,704.

Line 5 Losses came to 13,787 during the 13 Year Period: a yearly average loss of 1,060.5.

Jess Taylor — “An Old Pastor”



It was stated by a military officer, “Old Soldiers never die, they just fade away,” but what can be said of preachers? Surely this cannot be their fate, merely to fade into infinity. Get ready to go with Him.”

We laid an old preacher to his rest on that blue November day. The stone will bear his name for all to read in years to come. Yet for those of us who loved him, he will never fade away, for truly the Reverend Jess Willard Taylor lives eternally with the God and Savior he served so well.

Arnold Melvin Simpson



Arnold Simpson was born at Cherry Hill, Arkansas December 30, 1918. He joined the Church Triumphant November 7, 1986.

As the earthly ministry of our Lord began, He called 12 men to be His Disciples. Since that time, He has called millions of men and women to His ministry.

The Lord reached into an humble home in the mountains of Mena, Arkansas to find there a young man. He called to him, "Come out from the mountains and be my disciple." With that, Arnold Simpson left his home and loved ones to follow his Lord in loving service. From that day forward, Arnold followed his Master with eager and unswerving steps. His ministry covered a span of 41½ years in the Little Rock and North Arkansas Annual Conferences.

Early in his ministry, the Lord knew that Arnold would need some helpmate in his ministry. As a young boy at Cherry Hill, Arnold would play in boyish fashion with the neighborhood boys. There was a little girl who was always pestering the boys who were older and was always getting in the way. She seemed to pester Arnold more than the other boys. In strained tolerance he tried to not hurt her feelings. At long last, Arnold went off to school to become a Boy-preacher. After an absence of a couple of years, he came home to attend church at Mena where his father was pastor. His gaze fell upon one of the most beautiful girls he had ever seen. The little girl had grown up and Arnold lost his heart to her. He never got it back — Verona still has it firmly in her possession.

Arnold came into my life about this time. His uncle, The Reverend James Simpson, was my pastor at Waldo. Arnold came to be a summer Youth Director of our church. Our friendship has grown and ripened over the years.

There are three things that I have learned and admired about Arnold Simpson. These comprise his legacy to those who knew and loved him.

I. Arnold Simpson loved life. His enthusiasm and optimistic outlook were contagious. As he moved about from place to place, there was a bounce in his step that was distinctive. It was not a swagger, it was a mountaineer's stride designed to get from one place to another in the shortest length of time. Along with this walk, there was an ever-present tune being whistled. Sometimes it had melody — other times it was just whistling for the fun of it. The uplifted eyebrows and the ready half-smile all spoke of someone in love with life itself. You would almost expect him to break out in some Irish jig.

Arnold had a great appreciation of the beauty about him. The colors of Fall foliage, the scenes of Spring and Summer — all these did not go unnoticed. He had a great sensitivity about God's Creation.

When he retired from the active Ministry, he vowed that he would do some traveling that he could not do during the times when he was serving a church. His curiosity about this wonderful United States called him forth. With great delight, he and Verona set out to see the sights he longed to know. He was still enjoying this life-long dream when death came upon him very suddenly. However, Arnold had the last say in the matter. He was doing that which he chose to be doing at the time of death — expressing his great love of life.

II. Arnold Simpson loved people. In all the churches he served, he was a faithful pastor who loved and visited his people. Their hurts were shared and their joys were celebrated. Although there was a basic timidity in Arnold, he entered into the life of his community.

One of the most delightful talents that God gave Arnold was the ability to tell stories. He could tell of happenings in such a way as to knock one off his chair. However, he was very careful to tell his stories on himself. He never would make fun of anyone nor embarrass anyone else. The laugh was always on himself. Nor have I ever heard him criticize someone or defame anyone's character. He loved people and was sensitive to their feelings and their needs.

Arnold loved his home in the mountains. He felt a very strong heritage in the mountains around Mena. There were times when he got discouraged and grew tired of all the stress and strain of the ministry of caring. He would retreat to the hills and would be refreshed with the strength of the mountains and lakes of his childhood. Then, like his Lord, he would enter with renewed vigor into his calling. His earthly remains were cremated and scattered along his beloved mountains of home.

III. Arnold Simpson loved his Lord and loved his Church. He always felt a deep humility in the fact that he had been called into the Methodist ministry. He served some of the very small churches as he began his ministry, but gave himself completely in that service. Later on, he served some of our stronger churches with the same dedication. He served faithfully and joyfully on the Boards and Agencies of the two Annual Conferences in Arkansas.

Upon retirement, Arnold was determined to retire from preaching also. It didn't work out that way. He served as Interim Pastor and found himself preaching almost every Sunday somewhere. His District Superintendent gave him the title of "Designated Interim Pastor" of the Little Rock District.

The motivating thought that sustained Arnold may be expressed by Katherine Hankey in her lovely Hymn:

I love to tell the story;
 'Tis pleasant to repeat
 What seems, each time I tell it,
 More wonderfully sweet.
 I love to tell the story,
 For some have never heard
 The message of salvation
 From God's own Holy Word."

"Well done, good and faithful servant, Enter into the joy of your Master."

X. Miscellaneous

The organization of the Little Rock Annual Conference is defined in the Statement of the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Conference as printed in the 1986 Journal, pages 182-185.

The Standing Rules are subject to the Discipline of the United Methodist Church and the Organizational Structure of the Little Rock Annual Conference.

THE STANDING RULES

I. Conference Organization

1. **Number of Districts.** There shall be six districts in the Little Rock Annual Conference.
2. **District Conference.** There may be a district conference held annually in each district, composed of those members provided for in the current Discipline, and one additional member from each pastoral charge, provided however, in charges of more than five hundred members there shall be one additional member for each five hundred members or fraction thereof.
3. **Nominations.**
 - (a) The Conference Nominating Committee shall be composed of the District Superintendent and one lay person from each district. The Bishop shall serve as chairman.
 - (b) The Conference Nominating Committee shall nominate six members (three lay and three clergy) at large to achieve an equal balance of lay and clergy members, alternating by districts as follows:

 - (c) The Conference Nominating Committee will nominate all members of the Annual Conference quadrennial and annual boards, commissions and committees and Conference Council on Ministry boards, committees and commissions except as otherwise provided. The Nominations shall be made available to Conference delegates on the opening day of Conference to be voted on not sooner than the following day. Each District Nominating committee will complete its list of qualified nominations by December 31. All nominees shall be consulted regarding their nomination.
All boards and agencies of the Conference shall be inclusive to ethnic minority representation.
 - (d) Terms of office of the Nominating Committee shall be for four years beginning on January 1 following the session of the Annual Conference in the middle of the quadrennium.
4. **Lay Members.** Lay members of the Annual Conference shall be elected annually and their names and addresses shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
5. **Youth Membership.** Each District Council of the United Methodist Youth shall elect annually two youth members of the Annual Conference, and their names shall be sent to the Conference Secretary by the District Superintendent ninety days before the opening day of Annual Conference.
6. **Board Service.**
 - (a) Elective membership on any board, agency, committee of the Little Rock Annual Conference may not exceed a maximum of eight consecutive years, excepting ex-officio membership on the Conference Council on Ministries. Membership begins upon election. Date of election shall be listed beside name in Conference Journal.
 - (b) There are two types of membership on Annual Conference boards, committees,

commissions and councils; at large and ex officio. A person may serve in only one at-large and/or one ex-officio capacity.

- (c) The membership of the Committee on Review and Evaluation; the Committee on Planning and Research; the Committee on the Annual Conference; and the Episcopal Committee shall be exempt from the provisions of (a) and (b) of Review and Evaluation.
- (d) No person from the Little Rock Conference, clerical or lay, shall serve as an elected trustee of more than one United Methodist related institution within the bounds of the Arkansas Area at a time. "Within the bounds of" these United Methodist related institutions are understood to be the following: Hendrix College, Philander Smith College, Aldersgate, Methodist Children's Home, the Methodist Foundation of Arkansas, the Wesley Foundations, Little Rock Conference Camp Tanako, and Mt. Sequoyah Assembly. This is to take effect during the year 1979, as each institution could possibly have its timetable of elections on a different schedule. Trustees presently serving are allowed to complete their present terms.
- (e) All Councils, Boards, Committees and Commissions of the Conference shall be made representative. Special consideration shall be given to placing women, youth, and minority persons on the membership of these conference agencies.
- (f) Beginning with the 1984 Quadrennium no member of the Annual Conference shall be eligible for the chairmanship of a board, committee, commission or council of the Annual Conference who has served as chairman of a board, committee, commission or council for the preceding 8 years.

II. Financial Administration

1. **Fiscal Year.** The fiscal year of the Annual Conference shall run from January 1 to December 31.
2. **Financial and Statistical.**
 - (a) The District Superintendents shall furnish the treasurer with all apportionments to the churches on, or before January 15. These figures shall be official.
 - (b) All Conference assessments and reports of collections shall be made in whole dollars; with no column for cents.
 - (c) Each pastor shall make a statistical report to the District Superintendent who shall submit the reports to the Conference Statistician. The Pastor's financial report will be audited and checked by the Final Data Processing Print-Out. Where there is discrepancy, the amount recorded on the Print-Out will prevail.
3. **Administrative Fund.** The Council on Finance and Administration shall recommend an assessment for a Conference Administrative Fund. All clerical work of the Conference, the expense of publishing the pre-conference report, the expense of publishing the Journal and preserving the records of the Conference, the expense of preparing and printing the Worship Booklet for the Annual Conference, the expense of auditing the accounts of the several boards, the expenses of the Conference Secretary and Statistician, the expenses of committees raised by the Conference shall be paid from this Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall be the custodian of the Fund. Payments for unbudgeted claims on this fund shall be made on vouchers signed by the Chairman of the Council on Finance and Administration or the Conference Secretary.
4. **Program Budgets.** Budgets for expenditures for program for the District and the Conference shall be coordinated by the Conference Council on Ministries. The Conference Council on Ministries shall make recommendations to the Council on Finance and Administration which shall make a final recommendation to the Annual Conference.
5. **Conference Treasurer.** The Council on Finance and Administration shall set the salary and provide for the expenses of the Conference Treasurer and make arrangements for paying the same, subject to the action of the Annual Conference. The

Annual Conference shall assign the duties, responsibilities, and the headquarters city, of the Conference Treasurer, on recommendation of the Council on Finance and Administration, in keeping with the provisions of the Discipline.

6. **District Fund.** The District Stewards shall estimate and allocate to the several charges an amount necessary for district parsonage and other necessary district expenses. The District Stewards shall elect a treasurer who shall be custodian of this fund and pay it out on order of the District Superintendent. The treasurer of the district fund shall report to the District Stewards annually, showing receipts and disbursements. Funds budgeted by the District Council on Ministries will be paid by the District Treasurer upon action of the District Council on Ministries and the approval of the District Superintendent.
7. **Apportionments Based on Pastor's Salary.** On all items apportioned to local churches by means of a percentage of the minister's salary, such percentage shall be understood to apply to all ministerial members of the local church staff serving under the appointment of the Bishop and District Superintendent, including ministers in full connection, ministers on trial, and full-time Lay Pastors.
8. **Requests for financial support by the Conference, when not presented to the Conference by the Council on Finance and Administration, shall lay on the table for twenty-four hours prior to a vote being taken. This rule may be suspended by a $\frac{3}{4}$ vote of the Conference. It does not preclude a Council on Finance and Administration recommendation being amended.**

III. Conference Procedure

1. **Rules of Order.** The Rules of Order shall be Roberts Rules of Order revised.
2. **Reports and Resolutions.** There shall be a pre-conference report which shall contain reports of all the boards and agencies of the Conference. This report shall be mailed to each member of the Little Rock Conference at least 30 days before the annual session. The Conference Secretary shall be the editor of this publication, in the pre-conference reports shall be typewritten, in triplicate, on special forms furnished by the Conference and obtained from the Conference Secretary. In the event editing of a report is deemed necessary by the Conference Secretary and Chairman of the Board involved, permission is hereby granted.
3. **Conference Expense Fund.**
 - (a) Registration fees and offerings taken at the Annual Conference shall be administered by the Conference Treasurer and shall be used to defray the expenses of the session.
 - (b) The Conference shall meet on a self-entertainment plan, except that the entertainment of the retired ministers shall be paid from the Conference Expense Fund. The Conference Treasurer shall pay a per diem for days actually in attendance directly to the retired ministers and be reimbursed from the Conference Expense Fund. Eligibility shall be determined by the Conference Board of Pensions.
 - (c) Any deficit in the Conference Expense Fund shall be made up from the Conference Administrative Fund.
 - (d) The Conference Expense Fund shall be administered by the Committee on the Annual Conference.
4. **Un-sponsored Resolutions.** Any resolution not sponsored by a regular board or standing committee of the Conference must lie over for twenty-four hours before being debated and acted upon, provided, however, immediate debate and action may be ordered by two-thirds vote of the Conference present and voting.
5. **Memoirs.** There shall be published in the Journal a memoir of each deceased clerical member of the Conference, containing date and place of birth, date of admission on trial, to whom married and date, names of children, charges served, and place of burial. A picture of the deceased shall be published with the memoir. The same shall be done for probationary members, associate members and lay pastors. Like-

wise, a memoir of wives or widows of the above shall be published in the Journal. The District Superintendents shall report to the Sub-committee on Memoirs the death of any of the above mentioned and be responsible for the submission of memoirs not later than thirty days after the death occurs. The names or memoirs of deceased laymen who have been active in the Conference sessions, or served on Conference Boards or as officials of Conference institutions may be published in the Journal. The District Superintendent shall be responsible for securing the memoirs for laymen whose memoirs shall be published. It shall be the duty of the District Superintendents to report to the Chairman of the Conference Board of Pensions the death of any conference claimant that occurs in their respective districts.

6. **Historical Material.**

- (a) The Library at Hendrix College shall be the depository for all historical documents and artifacts of the Little Rock Conference. The College Librarian shall be the custodian of these historical materials.
- (b) The Commission on Archives and History shall be responsible for securing a group picture of each class admitted into full connection for publication in the Journal and also two small pictures of each clerical member at the time of his retirement.

7. **Unbudgeted Expenditures.** When any proposal is submitted to the Annual Conference which involves the expenditure of funds not included in the established budget, such a proposal shall be referred for advice and recommendation to the Council on Finance and Administration and brought back to the same session of the Annual Conference for a vote to be taken by the Conference.

8. **Campaigns.** All Conference-wide campaigns to raise funds shall be voted on by secret ballot of the Conference.

IV. **Amendments.**

These rules may be repealed or amended by a majority vote of those present and voting in any annual session of the Conference, provided the proposed change is presented to the Conference in writing one day before the vote is taken.
