THE JOURNAL

The Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church met in its fifty-first annual session in Macedonia Church, Leonard, Arkansas. Rev. I. A. Love, pastor, October 31, 1930, to November 3, 1930, inclusive, at 10 o'clock a.m.

The conference was called to order by the President, the Rev. W. R. Clower, who conducted the devotional exercises as following:

Song: "Have Thine Own Way." Scripture lesson, Revelations 1:9. Brief remarks on "The Churches"; sentence prayers by members of the conference.

Roll call and corrections made. By motion the bar of the conference was fixed to include the third window to the left and second to the right. The following visitors were brought forward and introduced to the conference: Reverends A. E. Clower, S. G. Rutlege, W. H. Barnes, C. B. McKay, S. J. Runyon.

The programs were then distributed and by motion was adopted and made the order of the day as far as possible.

A resolution regarding to fixing the president's salary was read by the Rev. W. W. Fincher and referred to the Committee on Finance

The hour for preaching services having arrived, the conference took recess till 1:30 p.m.

MORNING SERVICES

Song "How Firm a Foundation." Scripture lesson Psa. 34. Prayer. Sermon by the Rev. J. M. Stevenson. Text: John 6:68. Benediction by the Rev. W. R. Clower.

NOON

Dinner served on the lawn by the ladies of the community.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The conference was called together promptly at 1:30 by singing "How Firm a Foundation." Devotional services were conducted by the Rev. J. E. Hughes by reading the 13th chapter of First Corinthians and prayer. The committee on credentials made its report, which was adopted. The president made his report which was adopted; see report A. The secretary of the conference exhibited a dummy for the annual conference minutes proposed by Dr. Straughn, and by motion it was adopted. The committee on Itinerancy and orders made a partial report which

was adopted; see report B. The time for the election having arrived the Rev. W. R. Clower and the Rev. I. A. Love were nominated.

The Rev. J. A. Wade, the Rev. W. O. Tisdale, and L. M. Wilson were appointed as teller; W. R. Clower was elected president on the first ballot and by motion of I. A. Love, the election was made unanimous. By motion of W. W. Fincher, the secretary was authorized to cast the unanimous ballot for Rev. I. Love as secretary of the conference. Rev. J. W. Simmons and Mr. W. R. Sanders were nominated for treasure, and J. W. Simmons was elected, and by motion of Rev. W. A. House the election was made unanimous.

The Rev. S. G. Rutlege asked the privilege of making a few remarks which was granted, and asked for a letter of standing. By motion of the Rev. W. A. House and seconded by the Rev. J. T. Goldsmith it was granted.

By motion the Rev. J. B. Blackburn and the Rev. W. W. Fincher were elected on the Committee of Itinerancy and Orders to take the places of the Rev. D. W. McGinnis, the Rev. J. T. Goldsmith, respectfully, to run to 1933.

Mr. O. M. Sweatman was elected on the Council of Religious Education to take the place of W. T. Gray. By motion, Mr. W. R. Sanders of Haynesville, Louisiana, to serve on the New Century Service Commission. A motion was made by J. T. Goldsmith and carried to elect the old standing district committee with L. M. Wilson of Magnolia, Arkansas, in the place of W. T. Gray of Cave City, Arkansas.

The Rev. W. W. Fincher made a motion to rescind the action of the last annual conference with reference to grading the pastors' reports, which was carried. The president appointed the Rev. J. T. Goldsmith, the Rev. J. W. Simmons, and Mr. O. M. Sweatman as an Auditing Committee, conference took recess till Saturday morning at 8:30 o'clock.

Faiday Evening Service

Prayer service conducted by the Rev. S. N. Adams. The Rev. W. A. House brought a very fine message from the Text: for we are labours together with God, First Cor. 3:9.

Saturday Morning Session

Conference was called to order promptly at 8:30 o'clock by singing "I am Thine, O Lord." Devotional service conducted by W. W. Fincher. Scripture lesson 116th Psalm.

Preyer by the Rev. Fincher.

Roll called and corrections made. Minutes of the previous days' session read and adopted. The chairman of the church extension board made its report which was referred to the committee on church extension.

The chairman of the council of Christian Education made his report which was referred to the committee on young people's work.

By motion the secretary was authorized to transfer the names of the Rev. I. J. Ursery and the Rev. A. V. Savage, deceased to the Memorial Roll. The hour having arrived for filing resolutions, Mrs. J. E. Butler of Haynesville, Louisana, submitted a resolution on world war and peace, which was referred to the committee on resolutions. Another resolution was submitted by Mrs. Butler in regard to the distribution of apportionment of the Woman's Missionary Work, which was referred to the Finance Committee. By motion conference took recess till 10:30 o'clock a. m. Conference called together again at 10:30 o'clock by singing "Since Jesus Came into my Heart." At this time the hour was given over to the denominational day program. The following were brought forward and introduced to the conference: Dr. Jas. H. Straughn, Executive Secretary-Treasurer for promotional work, Dr. Frank W. Stevenson, Executive Secretary of the Board of Education, and Dr. G. W. Haddaway, Executive Secretary of the Board of Missions.

The hour was given to Mrs. J. E. Butler who brought a timely message on the theme, "The Women of the Church." The time for the presenting of the denominational day buttons having arrived Dr. Straughn took charge. The buttons failed to arrive and only two could be found. Dr. Straughn presented them to the two most important persons in the conference who were the Rev. W. R. Clower, president of the Arkansas Annual Conference and Mrs. J. E. Butler, president of the Women's Auxilliary of Arkansas and an explanation made which was very fine.

Dr. Stevenson then brought an inspiring message on the subject "The Educational Privileges of the Church."

Conference took recess for lunch. Benediction by Dr. G. W. Haddaway.

Saturday Afternoon Session

Conference called together by singing "Amazing Grace." Devotional service conducted by the Rev. Ben W. Pierce, prayer by Dr. Butler. The hour was given over to Dr. Straughn, who gave a very fine lecture on the subject "How it Comes and Where it Goes," a presentation of the new century service. At the close of the message the congregation was asked to stand and sing "Love Lifted Me." The floor was given to Dr. G. W. Haddaway, who brought a message on the subject: "Telling the Whole Wide World." After this timely message Dr. Straughn gave the people a chance to ask questions (on Ways and Means). Conference took recess till 7.00 o'clock p. m.

Evening Service

Devotional service led by the Rev. J. T. Goldsmith. Song No. 137 "Right Will Always Win." Scripture lesson 24th Psalm Prayer by the Rev. Goldsmith. Sermon by E. A. Baker from the subject "Seeing Jesus." After the sermon a great manifestation of the spirit among all resulting in a friendly hand shake. Benediction by the Rev. J. A. Wade.

Sunday Morning Session

Sunday School at 10:00 o'clock. A very great interest was manifested. Ordination sermon by Dr. J. H. Straughn. Song "Have Thine Own Way". Scripture John 3:7. Subject "New Birth." After this great message was delivered the following brethren were ordained, the Rev. J. W. Simmons, the Rev. N. B. Elackman, the Rev. J. D. Huff by the president and assisted by the Reverends Jack Glass, A. E. Clower. Benediction by Dr. Stevenson.

NOON

Dinner was served on the church lawn by the ladies of the Community.

Afternoon Session

Memorial service at 3:00 o'clock, led by Rev. J. M. Stevenson in memory of the deceased Rev. I. J. Ursery, Rev. A. V. Savage, and Mrs. J. R. Tatom. After a timely talk by Brother

Stevenson, others following were I. A. Love, J. T. Goldsmith, J. B. Blackburn, W. A. House and S. N. Adams. The shortness of time made it impossible for all to talk. A proposition was made for the congregation to stand to show their respect for the deceased. Benediction by W. A. House.

Evening Service

Devotional service led by W. O. Tisdale. Hymn "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes." Scripture Matt. 6. Prayer by J. B. Starnes.

Sermon by the Rev. T. W. Nunn. Scripture Eph. 3:20. Hymn, a special number was rendered by the following Revs. J. E. Hughes, E. L. Hogue and I. A. Love. A very fine message was brought by Bro. Nunn on the subject, "The Power of God." A great Spiritual interest was manifest of the congregation by responding to a friendly hand shake. Benediction by W. R. Clower.

Monday Morning Session

Conference opened Monday morning at 8:30 a. m. Devotional service led by J. W. York. Hymn "I am Thine, O Lord." Scripture lesson St. John 15th chapter and prayer by the Rev. York. Roll call and minutes of the previous sessions read and adopted. The committee on Itinerancy and Orders made its final report which was adopted; see report B. Treasurer's report was read by the Secretary and was adopted; see report C. Committee on superannuates made it, report which was amended by motion and second to strike out first clause in regard to finance in the report and that this clause be referred to the committee on finance, and with this amendment the report was adopted, but the Rev. D. W. McGinnis made a request in open conference for his name to remain on the ministerial roll thus making the report null and void and will not appear in this minute. Committee on education made its report and was adopted; see report D. The committee on church extension made its report which was adopted; see report E. At this time the Rev. W. A. House made his report which was adopted. Finance committee made its report and it was adopted; see report F. Conference took recess till 11.00 a. m.

Morning Service

11.00 o'clock evangelistic service. The Rev. E. L. Hogue brought a great and an inspiring message from the subject "The Christian's Race." Scripture lesson Heb. 12: 1-2. Benediction by W. R. Clower.

NOON

Lunch served on lawn.

Afternoon Session

Conference called together promptly at two o'clock. Devotional service led by J. W. Simmons. Scripture 23rd Psalm. Song "Take my Life and Let it Be." Prayer by the Rev. McGinnis. Committee on boundaries made its report which was adopted, see report G. Committee on young people's work made its report which was adopted; see report H. The Auditing Committee made its report which was adopted; see report I. Committee on promotional work made a report, which was referred back to the committee for rearrangement. Commttee on official relations made its report by motion and second. The report was referred back to the committee, the time having arrived for the fixing the place for the next annual conference the place was not fixed. A motion by J. M. Stevenson and seconded by J. T. Goldsmith for the fifty-second session of the Arkansas Annual Conference meet not later than Friday before the first Sunday in November, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-one.

Committee on promotional work made its report which was adopted; see report J. By motion and second the Secretary was authorized to have eight hundred copies of minutes printed and to send them to each pastor C. O. D. Committee on official relations made its report which carried; see report K. Conference took recess till four p. m.

Conference called to order with the Rev. J. W. York in the chair. The hour was given over to Dr. Butler who made a talk on doing more mission work and organizing more churches which was very timely, and was confirmed by Brother Stevenson. A motion was made by the Rev. D. W. McGinnis and seconded by the Rev. J. E. Butler that any preacher coming into the Arkansas Annual Conference by letter shall not be given a letter of standing by this conference until he has served three years unless he shall go another conference of our own church. A resolution of thanks was presented by W. W. Ficher was adopted (see resolution No. 1). Committee on resolutions made its report which was adopted (see Report N). A motion to fix the secretaries and treasurers' salaries. The secretary's salary fixed at \$50.00, the treasurer's salary at \$30.00 for the ensuing year.

Committee on missions made its report which was adopted (see report L). Stationing committee made its report which was

adopted (see report M). A motion to adjourn prevailed. The conference closed its fifty-first session. Benediction by the Rev. J. W. York.

NEW CENTURY SERVICE PROGRAM FOR 1930-1931 FOR ANNUAL CONFERENCE CONSIDERATION

Dear Brethren:

The meeting of the General and Annual Conference officials held in Baltimore last May considered and approved the following program in behalf of New Century Service and I was authorized to submit it to our Conferences at their annual meetings this Fall. It is not a complicated plan but one which if followed through should be productive and satisfactory. I am therefore asking you to give this paper your earnest consideration and approval.

- 1. The Conference is requested to authorize a visitation of all the churches within its district, under Conference direction and soon after adjournment, for the presentation of the question of the annual and general Conference benevolences; to discuss with the officials of the churches particularly the occasion and need of these budgets and to secure a definite decision on the part of the churches of their cooperation.
- 2. In order to make this visitation the Conference is further asked to raise up a Committee or Commission, with the President as chairman, to direct the activities necessary. This may be the New Century Service Commission, the Budget Committee or a special Visitation Committee as the Conference may prefer. This Visitation is to be made by the ministers and laymen of the Conference selected by the directing committee.
- 3. The New Century Service office in Baltimore will be prepared to put into the hands of the committee further definite plans for Conference organizations for this Visitation as well as plans for the local churches. These of course may be supplemented or amended by the local groups.
- 4. The Secretary of the Conference is requested to notify my office as early as possible the action of your Conference and to send me the names, with addresses, of the members of the Conference Committee.
- 5. I enclose herewith a form for the arrangement of the Conference Minutes which also was approved at the Officials' Conference. It is part of an effort to secure a uniform arrangement for all our Conference Minutes. There is now a great di-

versity. Your Conference is asked to adopt this general outline which is sufficiently flexible to accommodate itself to all annual Conference requirements.

I trust your session may be blessed of the Lord and that your coming year may bring great fruitage to the Kingdom.

REPORT OF BOARD OF YOUNG PEOPLES' WORK

As Chairman of your Board of Young Peoples' Work, I wish to make the following report:

After complying with the request of our Executive Secretary Dr. Little with reference to re-organization of the Young Peoples' Work under the name of Council of Christian Education, we immediately outlined the work for the past year, and have endeavored to carry out the plans of the Council the best we could under the circumstances and with what means we had at our disposal to do it with.

Our first school of methods was at Rector last February where we offered a course in one of the Standard units, "The Old Testamen.t" There were twenty-seven who enrolled for the work and took the credit.

Our next school was at Village, Arkansas, where we offered two units in the Young Peoples' Department and one Standard unit. We had forty-three enrolled in the school there all of whom secured credit. About twenty of who were in the Standard unit class.

Our regular summer conference which we planned to hold at Pettit Jean Mountain, was held at Magnolia instead, because the attendance or promise of enrollment was not sufficient to justify us carrying it to Pettit Jean. We had only 26 to enroll for this school on account of a quarintine which had been lain upon one adjoining community because of an outbreak of infantile paralysis. Three units were offered in this school in the Young Peoples' Department, and one Standard unit. In all we

have held three schools with 125 enrolled pupils all of who, I believe, received credits.

This effort this year has well justified the sacrifice and expenditure, besides revealing the fact that if we are ever to have a trained leadership among our people we must take the training school to the community. We trust that some means can be provided whereby we may be enabled to hold a number of such school all over the conference another year.

The financial statement of the Board will be given in the report of the Treasurer.

We made an estimate of the pine timber on this land at the time we estimated the oak timber, also took into cognizance the value of the land. We have some valuable timber on this land, and it is a forty that would be suitable for cultivation when the timber is removed.

REPORT A

To the Members of the Fifty-first Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church assembled in Macedonia Church, October 31st.

Dear Brethren in Christ:

In the name of Him who said, "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world," I greet you. At His command you have gone into the various fields of labor. Now we meet again in annual session to give an account, in a small way, of our stewardship, and to formulate plans for another year. In all our deliberations may we be conscious of His presence, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name," said Jesus, "there am I in the midst of them." Whoever may be absent, Jesus will be present.

CALLED TO THEIR REWARD

Our ministerial ranks have been invaded by the enemy, death. Rev. A. V. Savage has gone to his reward; we shall miss him, but our loss is only his gain. Our hearts go out in sympathy to Mrs. Savage and children.

Dr. Davis, editor of the Methodist Protestant Recorder, departed this life to be with Jesus. He belonged to us all, and the church has suffered a great loss in his going. However, we must bow to Him who "doeth all things well."

OFFICIAL ACTS

September 1st, I released the Rev. N. B. Blackman from Rector Station at his request.

October 22, I gave the Rev. L. M. Lawhon a transfer to the Texas Conference at his request.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That each pastor organize a missionary society in each church on his charge, if possible. This will not only mean an increase in New Century Service, but it means that the church will grow along all lines. I do not know of a more progressive move than to organize the women of our conference.
- 2. That the Church Paper Campaign be continued until it reaches every Methodist Protestant home. How can we be intelligent Methodist Protestants without reading our church paper?
- 3. That our own literature be used in all of our Sunday Schools. It compares favorably with any literature, and is the best for Methodist Protestants.

4. That we cooperate in every way possible with Dr. Straughn, Promotional Secretary, in bringing the General Conference Program to our people. And especially do I urge your cooperation in the "Visitation Campaign," scheduled to take place immediately after the close of this session, and which is to be made in the interest of New Century Service. A committee has been appointed to work out details.

SUMMARY

During the year I have preached 135 times, assisted in Young People's Training Schools, held many quarterly conferences, and most all of the fourth quarterly conferences, called four group meetings of pastors, mailed out 361 letters, and traveled about fifteen thousand miles.

I may have come short of your expectations, but I have tried to the best of my ability to carry out your program, "Taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; neither as being lord over God's heritage, but being an ensample to the flock." "And when the chief Shepherd shall appear," I hope, with the rest of you, to "receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away."

"Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you perfect in every good work to do his will, working in you that which is well pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen."

That our people be urged by their pastors to read the church paper in order that they may be better informed as to the interests and activities of our denomination; and that each church having one-fourth, one-half, three-fourths and full time send in during the conference year, two, four, six, and eight new subscriptions to the "Methodist Protestant Recorder."

- 5. That pastors on circuits settle with the president quarterly and stations monthly if possible.

Butler, conserving the apportionment for Woman's Missionary funds referred to this committee for consideration by the conference, and recommend that the \$355 be apportioned as following to the several charges with the general and annual claims.
