JOURNAL

FRIDAY'S SESSIONS

Morning

The Fifty-Fourth Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church convened at 10 a. m., November 3, 1933, with New Prospect Class, Union Charge, Rev. S. N. Adams, pastor-host.

Rev. J. W. Simmons, President, conducted the devotional services, as follows:

Song, "Crown Him Lord of All." Scripture Lesson, II Corinthians 6:1-10.

Prayer, Rev. D. W. McGinnis.

Business

The Ministerial Roll was called with notations made of those present.

A motion carried that the name of Rev. J. L. Nabors be transferred to the Memorial Roll; and that the name of Dr. J. E. Butler, lettered, be dropped.

The Bar of the Conference was fixed to include the third window from the pulpit.

The following visitors were introduced to the Conference: Rev. L. M. Lawhorn, of the Texas Conference; Dr. W. H. Betz, President, Dr. C. R. Greene and Rev. N. B. Blackman of the Iowa-Missouri Conference, and Rev. J. W. Tomlin of the M. E. Church, South.

A program prepared by the President of the Conference and the Pulpit Committee was adopted as the order of the day.

Following the singing of a song, Conference recessed for ten minutes, Rev. Jack Glass pronouncing the Benediction.

Morning Services

The order of the morning Evangelistic Services was as follows: Song.

Scripture Lesson, Romans 1:14-18.

Prayer.

Sermon Theme: "The Believer's Relation to Christ as shown by the Pauline Church Epistles", Rev. J. A. Wade.

Song, "He Is Coming in the Clouds." Benediction, Rev. D. W. McGinnis.

Noon

During the noon recess the ladies of the local community served lunch on the church lawn.

Afternoon

The Conference was called to order by the President at 1:30 p. m. Devotional services were conducted by Rev. D. W. McGinnis.

Business

The Commmittee on Credentials made its report, which was adopted.

Rev. D. W. McGinnis presided while the President, Rev. J. W. Simmons, read his report. After discussion, the report with an amendment was accepted. (See Report No. 1)

By request of the Conference the song, "Blessed Assurance", was sung by the following visiting ministers: Dr. C. R. Greene, Dr. W. H. Betz, Rev. N. B. Blackman, Rev. W. W. Steinmetz, and Rev. J. W. Tomlin. Rev. J. A. Wade played the instrument.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders made a partial report, which was adopted.

A motion carried to retain the present District Committee.

By a prevailing motion, Rev. J. W. York and Rev. W. W. Fincher were re-elected on the Committee of Itineracy and Orders.

Rev. E. L. Hogue was elected to serve as a member of the Council of Religious Education for one, year, and Rev. T. W. Nunn to serve on the same Committee for two years.

Rev. C. A. Calhoun, Rev. J. M. Stephenson, Rev. S. N. Adams, Mr. J. U. Wells and Mr. J. M. Hudson were elected as the Church Extension Board.

The hour for the election of officers having arrived, Rev. Jack Glass, Rev. E. L. Hogue and Mr. Roy Nipper were appointed Tellers of the election.

Rev. J. W. Simmons was re-elected President on the first ballot, and a motion carried to make the vote unanimous.

Rev. W. O. Tisdale was re-elected Secretary-Treasurer.

Rev. C. R. Greene in response to a request addressed the conference. His speech was enjoyed. Also a helpful talk was given by Rev. N. B. Blackman.

A motion carried that Conference adjourn for committee work.

Rev. E. L. Hogue pronounced the Benediction.

Evening Services

Devotional was conducted by Rev. G. B. Pixley, who read for a lesson the Twenty-Third Psalm, and led the Conference in prayer.

After a series of songs and prayers an old-fashioned testimony service followed.

The sermon was delivered by Rev. Noah Wilson from the subject, "Losing the Christ."

At the conclusion of the sermon, Bro. S. N. Adams asked that the Conference engage in prayer, led by Bro. Wade for Mrs. Adams who was ill.

Benediction-The Doxology, Rev. W. W. Steinmetz, Leader.

SATURDAY'S SESSIONS

Morning

Conference convened at 8:30 a. m.

Rev. J. D. Huff conducted Devotional.

A song was sung and prayer led by Rev. J. W. Simmons. Scripture Lesson, John 1:1-13.

Business

The Secretary being absent, Rev. J. A. Wade was appointed Secretary pro tem.

Roll was called.

The Church Extension Board made its report. Report was referred to the Committee on Church Extension.

The report of the Treasurer of the Church Extension Board was read by Rev. J. A. Wade. Report was accepted. (See Report No. 2).

A motion was made and carried that Conference adjourn for committee work until 10:30 a. m.

Conference came to order at the appointed hour by singing.

The Treasurer made his report, and with an amendment the report was adopted. (See Report No. 3).

The report of the Committee on Iteneracy and Orders was read and accepted. (See Report No. 4).

A motion prevailed that the Chair appoint a Committee on Nomination to nominate delegates to represent the Conference at the next session of the Southwest Group Conference. Rev. J. A. Wade, Rev. C. A. Calhoun and Rev. W. O. Tisdale were named as the committee.

Conference recessed for preaching.

Morning Services

The eleven o'clock services were in charge of Rev. W. W. Fincher, who brought the message.

Scripture Lesson, II Corinthians 4:1-8.

Theme: "Enthusiasm".

Benediction, Rev. W. W. Fincher.

Afternoon

Conference was opened by singing at 1:30 p. m.

Devotional was led by Rev. J. E. Hughes, who read as a lesson the 92nd. Psalm.

The song, "God's Love," was rendered by Brady, Irene, and Fern Cook. In response to an encore the singers sang "Vacation Time."

Dr. W. H. Betz, President of the Iowa-Missouri Canference, addressed the Conference.

Rev. W. W. Steinmetz of the Iowa-Missouri Conference also brought a message to the Conference, following the singing of a song and the reading of the Thirteenth Chapter of I Corinthians on the theme, "Love."

The Cooks sang, "I Dreamed I Searched Heaven for You."

Rev. C. A. Calhoun spoke on Missions and the need of our churches organizing Ladies' Auxiliaries.

Rev. C. A. Calhoun read a Resolution relative to a union of the southern half of the Arkansas Conference with the Louisiana Conference. The Resolution was referred to the Committee on Resolutions and Fraternal Relations.

Announcements were made and Conference adjourned until 8:30 a. m., Monday.

Saturday Evening

The program consisted of Singing; Prayer, Rev. L. M. Lawhorn; Reading, Doris Dean Nipper, and a Play.

They play, "Living Monuments of Westminster College," written by Rev. W. O. Tisdale, was given by young people of Barge's Chapel and Emerson churches.

Rev. J. W. York and Rev. T. W. Nunn made introductory statements of the play.

The Benediction was pronounced by Rev. T. W. Nunn.

The Ordination Service was made impressive by singing appropriate songs and shaking hands with the young man ordained.

Prayer, Rev. E. A. Baker.

Dr. Greene pronounced the Benediction.

MONDAY'S SESSIONS

Morning

Conference assembled in the auditorium of the church at 8:30. Rev. A. N. Stonecipher had charge of the devotional exercises. A hymn, "My Faith Looks Up to Thee," was sung, Rev. Jewel

Linam, leading the singing.

Scripture Lesson read was the Sixth Chapter of Isaiah. The prayer was offered by Bro. Stonecipher.

Business

The President declared the Conference open for business.

The Audit Committee was appointed in the persons of Rev. C. A. Calhoun, Rev. J. A. Wade, and Mr. O. L. Walker.

A motion prevailed to discontinue with the order of the day for Dr. Frank W. Stephenson to address the Conference in the interest of our Connectional Work.

Rev. Lee E. Hearn of the Texas Conference, representative of Westminster College, was introduced to the Conference, and followed Dr. Stephenson's address with a message concerning the needs of Westminster College.

A Resolution was read by Mr. Leon Wilson, changing the date of the meeting of the Conference. The Resolution was passed. (See Resolution "A")

The Secretary read the Recommendations of the Southwest Group Conference to the Annual Conferences of the Southwest. The Recommendations were referred to the Committee on Resolutions and Fraternal Relations.

The President of the Young Peoples Work made his report. Report was adopted. (See Report No. 6)

A motion carried to dispense with the reading of the Minutes rutil the afternoon session.

The report of the Committee on Official Relations was read and accepted. (See Report No. 7)

The report of the Committee on Finance was read. The report was referred to the Committee on Resolutions and Fraternal Relations.

The report of the Committee on Boundaries was called for, read, and received. (See Report No. 8)

The Committee on Education's report was called for by the Chair. The report was read, and by request it was re-read and voted on by separate items. With amendments the report was adopted. (See Report No. 9)

The Committee on Young Peoples Work made its report. Report was adopted as read. (See Report No. 10)

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was read, and with an amendment, adopted. (See Report No. 11)

Conference adjourned to meet again at 1:00 p. m.

Noon

During the noon hour the ladies of the New Prospect community served lunch on the church lawn, as they had done each day previous during the sessions of the Conference.

Afternoon

Conference came to order at 1:00 p. m.

Devotional services were led by Rev. G. A. Mouser.

Songs Nos. 251 and 289 in Colksbury Hymnal were sung, Rev. Jewel Linam, leading.

Scripture Lesson and prayer by Bro. Mouser.

Business

Rev. W. V. Walls, Baptist minister of Strong, Arkansas, was introduced to the Conference and invited to an honorary seat.

The Committee on Resolutions and Fraternal Relations made its report. Report with amendments was adopted. (See Report No. 12)

A motion carried that the next session of the Arkansas Annual Conference meet with Macedonia Church, Leonard Charge.

The Finance Committee made its report. The report was referred back to the Committee,

The Audit Committee gave its report. The report was adopted. (See Report No. 13)

A motion was made and carried that 800 copies of the Minutes be published, and that the cost of publishing same be paid out of the Conference funds. The Secretary was given permission to solicit advertising to be carried in the Minutes to help defray the printing costs.

A motion prevailed that the Secretary-Treasurer pay his own salary for the Conference year of 1932-33.

The Secretary extended Greetings from Rev. W. R. Clower of Kansas City, Kansas. Also read a letter of Greetings from Dr. J. C. Broomfield, President of the General Conference.

Bro. Adams brought Fraternal Greetings from Rev. S. G. Rutledge, formerly a member of the Arkansas Conference.

The Secretary was authorized to send letters of Greeting to Rev. Clower and Dr. Broomfield.

Conference went into the election of Fraternal Delegates to the Texas and Louisiana Conferences.

Rev. J. A. Wade and Rev. T. W. Nunn were elected Fraternal Delegates to the Texas Conference, and Rev. C. A. Calhoun and Rev. Ralph Clayton Fraternal Delegates to the Louisiana Conference.

A motion prevailed that Rev. W. A. House be donated \$25,00 out of the Contingent Fund.

The salary of the Secretary-Treasurer was fixed at \$75.00.

The President was empowered with authority to issue license to administer the Ordinances of the Church to under-graduate ministers of the Conference serving appointments.

The Committee on Finance made its report. Report was accepted, with two Amendments added. (See Report No. 14)

The President, Rev. C. A. Calhoun presiding, read the report of the Stationing Committee. The report was adopted. (See Report No. 15) Following the reading of the report of the Stationing Committee, Rev. S. N. Adams asked for the song, "A Charge to Keep I Have."

The Minutes were read and approved.

The Secretary was elected Press Reporter.

A motion carried that Conference adjourn.

The song, "God Be With You Till We Meet Again," led by Rev. E. L. Hogue, with Mrs. Lilla Chambers at the instrument, was earnestly sung. The last moments of the Conference were filled with deep emotions on the part of the preachers and delegates as they were shaking hand with, and saying good by to each other, the local pastor, and his good people who had entertained the Conference.

Rev. A. N. Stonecipher pronounced the Benediction.

November 7, 1932, I supplied Camden Circuit with Rev. E. L. Hogue, Silver Hill and Liberty; Rev. G. C. Chambers, Red Hill. March 15, 1933, I released Rev. J. B. Starnes from Hot Springs Circuit. May 1, 1933, I appointed Rev. M. H. Gathright as paster of

Blanchard Springs and Black Grove Churches. May 7, I released Rev. Clyde A. Calhoun from Magnolia church and appointed Rev. Ralph Clayton as full-time pastor to the same. May 7, I granted Rev. J. E. Butler D. D. a letter of standing. May 15, I appointed sister E. Mooty assistant pastor to Rev. Jewel Linam on Prescott circuit. August 1, I appointed Rev. Washington Cook as pastor of Summerfield and Mineral Springs churches. August 15, I appointed Rev. J. M. Stephenson as assistant pastor to Rev. Lasater, Drew Circuit. Oct. 15th, I received Rev. C. A. Calhoun's letter of transfer from the Mississippi Conference.

Recommendations

- 1. That our church paper be placed in the home of as many church members as possible.
- 2. That our own literature be used in all of our Sunday Schools. It is as good as any, and is better for Methodist Protestants.
- 3. That each circuit and station obtain one of our new Registers to replace the old one, and that each pastor keep a complete record of members received, marriages, funerals, baptisms and etc.
- 4. That the church purchase some Disciplines and present one ± 0 each new member.
- 5. That the old time altar service be reestablished in our churches, and that repentance and consecration be stressed in our preaching. We have too many church members that have no Christian experience.
- 6. That there be a page in our minutes for an honor roll, and all churches paying the pastors, president's salary and as much as 50% of the conference claims be placed on this honor roll.

Summary

During the year, I have preached one hundred and fifty times, held many of the quarterly conferences, helped in four revivals with good success, mailed out about two hundred pieces of mail, traveled about fifteen thousand miles.

I may have come short of your expectations, but I have tried to the best of my ability to carry out your program. I have done my best to help both the charges and the pastors. Not for money or for honor but that I might please Him who died for me.

Now may we present our bodies a living sacrifice, wholly, acceptable unto God, which is our reasonable service.

- 4. That each pastor endeavor to qualify to offer at least one course in Christian Missions to his people during the year.
- 5. That our Ministers and laymen attend our Methodist Portestant Institutions of Learning, and that they patronize same by securing both students and funds for them.
- 0. That a Minister's Institute be established and held at some convenient time during this year—such time to be determined by a curricula committee of three ministers which will be elected by this Annual Conference, said committee will also arrange to offer such courses that may be helpful to our ministers in devising constructive programs for their respective churches and to select competent teachers to offer same.
- 7. That each Minister give his hearty support to this Institute, and the Leadership Training school to be held within the district of our Conference.

SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO. 11

Report of the Church Extension Board

We, your Church Extension Board, wish to submit the following report for the year, 1932-33.

We have held two meetings, but at neither did we have a majority of members of the Board present, however letters of proxies enabled us to transact the business of the Eoard.

Early in the spring we had a bid from a lumber company to purchase the pine timber on the 40 acres of land which the Board has in Columbia county for \$200.00. We immediately got in touch with the members of the Board and secured authority to close the deal.

We had no more than secured the authority to act until we had a letter from Brother York making applications for the timber to assist in erecting, or rebuilding the Mt. Vernon church on Oak Grove Circuit.

We then immediately took the matter up again with the members of the Board, asking whether to donate the timber to the Mt. Vernon Church or sell for \$200.00. The majority of the members thought it best not to make an appropriation, but to sell the timber for the \$200.00 and let the Conference act in the matter of making the appropriation. So we sold the timber for the \$200.00.

Late in the summer we received a letter from our President asking us to make investigation of the property at Junction City, in which letter he also reported that the old church building had been condemned by the city of Junction City, and that the city had given away to have it torn down. Having already made investigation and reporting to the Conference two years ago the status of this property, and not being given authority to spend more in clearing it up, we have made no further investigation. We do not have a deed to that property, although one was once made, but was never recorded, and is now lost. We perhaps could secure the property by taking it to law and establishing our rights to it. We have not felt that we should do this unless the conference so authorizes.

Our Sec-Treas, will make a financial report of the Board.

We are almost powerless to do anything for the Church because we have practically no funds to do with. If we are to be of any service to the Arkansas Conference, there must be some provision made to bring something into the treasury of the Board.

One project a year with all efforts directed toward it might be of sufficient encouragement to induce those with funds to invest in the Board. There are a number of inviting fields, but we can do nothing toward entering them without funds.

- 3. That we hereby express our appreciation to Reverends, Betz, Blackman, Steinmetz, and Greene of the Iowa-Missouri Conference for their visit with us during this annual session, and for the splendid fellowship and inspiration they brought us from their conference.

Recommendations passed by the Southwest Group Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church in session at Magnolia, Arkansas, May 19, 1933.

We, your Committee on Findings, wish to submit the following recommendations:

- 1.—That local quarterly conference examining committees be required to give comprehensive examination, as prescribed by our discipline, to every applicant for license to preach. Under no conditions should a candidate be recommended to the Annual Conference until he has actually proved himself worthy and capable.
- 2.—That each conference faculty of instruction, regardless of recommendations, satisfy itself with the spiritual and moral qualifications of the applicant and adhere, at least to the literary, Biblical and Theological requirements of the discipline.
- 3.—That each conference faculty be very guarded in recommending those of other denominations for acceptance and more especially

when it would leave one of our own men without work.

- 4.—That the conference seek to reduce the charges to one or two churches and require the pastor to give full time service to the work. If this work is such that it can not be built to care for a pastor, abandon it and spend our efforts where opportunity exists.
- That in some way a closer check be kept upon the efficiency of each itinerant.
- 6.—That hereafter no candidate for ordination be received who does not have at least a junior college education or its equivalent.
- 7.—That every pastor endeavor to some time during the year carry on some special educational work with the various departments of his church.
- 8.—We recommend that a committee be appointed by this Group Conference to work out plans either for a Ministerial Institute or a gathering similar to this for another year. Time and place to be decided by consultation with the presidents of the Annual Conferences.
- 9.—That our heartiest appreciation is expressed by this Conference for the kindness and hospitality of the people here.


