May we be obedient to the leadership of the Spirit, so we can say I have not been disobedient to the heavenly vision.

SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO. 3

Report of the President of the Church Extension Board.

To the Fifty-fifth Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church, the Board of Church Extension desires to make its report.

The newly elected Board was called together immediately after election during the sitting of our last Annual Conference and organized by electing Rev. C. A. Calhoun as President, and Mr. J. M. Hudson, Secretary-Treasurer. The Board adjourned until such business as would justify a call meeting.

On or about Jan. 20th, 1934, I received an application from the church at Magnolia for a loan of \$200.00 to assist said church with its pressing indebtedness and save foreclosure on the property. I submitted the application to the Board through correspondence which resulted in two votes cast for and one against, and one voting for orally. The final vote stood three to one. I therefore instructed the Treasurer to grant said loan—\$186.71.

During the month of July I received a bid for an old church building which I was told had been abandoned for five years and was formerly called "Hickory Grove," and "White Spring". I submitted this proposition to the Board by correspondence. Two members invested in me the authority to use my own judgment in the matter, one stated he doubted that the Board had any jurisdiction over the property, another voted orally for the disposition of it. I went out to the church and called as many of the old members as I could get together and inquired about said church, and they all consented that it should be disposed of and the money placed into the Church Extension fund due to the fact that the roof had fallen in and all the lumber in a decaying condition. I, then, submitted to a bid for the material of the building and received \$10.00 as the highest bid. We considered this an extravagant price. The money was placed in the Church Extension fund.

During the month of August I investigated the property at Junction City. I found some amazing facts. I secured several witnesses to testify that a certain Mr. Byron, (since deceased,) spoke freely to them with regard to this property, that, he was going to gain possession of it or "bust". He proceeded to cause the property to be assessed for taxes and without knowledge by the Board of Church Extension, the property was sold for its taxes, Mr. Byron being the purchaser. Shortly after Mr. Byron died his son gave a

Mr. Pepper, a member of the town Council at Junction City, the authority to tear down and sell the material of the building and defray such expenses for demolishing as accrued and forward the balance to him. This was done, and Mr. Byron received \$10.00 for his profit. I then went to Farmerville to investigate the deed. I found a perfectly good deed to the church, and it was the opinion of the clerk and an attorney that the tax deed and tax sale were invalid. I then made a proposition to young Mr. Byron to return what money he had received from the sale and relinquish his hold upon the property by giving a quit claim deed. He has not consented as yet and should he refuse I am of the opinion that suit should be filed immediately.

About the sixth of October I requested the resignation of the Secretary-Treasurer because of irregularities and upon the request of Bro. Wade. This he tendered Oct. 15th. I have appointed, by the consent of the Board, Bro. Rowe Clayton, of Magnolia to fill this vacancy.
