FRIDAY'S SESSIONS

Morning

The Fifth-fifth Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church convened with Macedonia Class, Leonard, Arkansas, at 10:30 a. m., Nov. 2, 1934. Rev. E. L. Hogue, pastor-host.

Devotional

The Devotional was conducted by Rev. J. W. Simmons, in the following order:

Song, "Love Lifted Me," led by Rev. Jewel Linar.

Scripture, Psalm 107.

Prayer, Rev. S. N. Adams.

Business

The President, Rev. J. W. Simmons, declared the Conference open for business, and asked Dr. J. C. Broomfield, Pittsburgh, Pa., President of the General Conference, to take the Chair.

The Secretary called the Ministerial Roll, noting those present.

The Secretary, by consent, transferred the name of Rev. W. A. House to the Memorial Roll and dropped the name of Rev. W. R. Clower, who had been transferred by the President to the Kansas Conference.

The Bar of the Conference was fixed to include from the Pulpit the fourth seat on either side, and the fifth seat in the center of the church auditorium.

The following visitors were introduced to the Conference: Dr. Frank W. Stephenson, Pittsburg, Pa., Secretary of the Board of Christian Education of the Methodist Protestant Church; Dr. C. A. Sutton, Tehuacana, Texas, President of Westminster College; and Rev. Hollis Bowen, of the Ft. Smith-Oklahoma Conference.

A program prepared by the Pulpit Committee and the President of the Conference was adopted as the order of the day, with an amendment that variations be made when necessary.

Two Resolutions were read by the Secretary, which were without discussion referred to the Committee on Resolutions.

The Committee on Credential's Report was made and accepted.

During the noon recess the ladies of the local church served lunch on the church lawn.

Afternoon

Conference came to order at 1:30 p. m. by singing.

Rev. M. H. Gathright led the Devotional.

The 123rd Psalm was read and prayer offered by Bro. Gathright.

Business

Conference opened for business, with Dr. J. C. Broomfield, presiding.

The hour for the election of officers having arrived Dr. Broomfield asked Rev. J. W. Simmons, President of the Conference, to appoint Tellers of the Election. Rev. S. W. Mooty, and Rev. G. B. Pixley were appointed.

Rev. J. W. Simmons was nominated for President, and a motion prevailed that the Secretary cast the unanimous ballot of the Conference for Bro. Simmons for President.

A motion was made and carried that the President cast the unanimous ballot of the Conference for Rev. W. O. Tisdale for Secretary-Treasurer.

Conference took recess to hear the following speakers:

Dr. C. A. Sutton, in the interest of Westminster College; Dr. Frank W. Stephenson, concerning the general interest of our educational work; Dr. J. C. Broomfield, on the Denominational Connection and Program.

Dr. J. A. Wade was asked by Dr. Broomfield to explain to the Arkansas Conference why he had opened a school at Magnolia,

Arkansas. Some time was consumed in the discussion of the said school and Dr. Broomfield, as the President of the General Conference, requested the Arkansas Conference, which was done, to vote its approval of the action of the Executive Committee of the Board of Christian Education, disapproving of the school at Magnolia, Arkansas, and recognizing Westminster College at Tehuacana, Texas, as the only Methodist Protestant educational institution in the Southwest.

A motion carried that Conference adjourn for the day.

SUPPLEMENT TO REPORT NO. 3

Report of the President of the Church Extension Board.

To the Fifty-fifth Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church, the Board of Church Extension desires to make its report.

The newly elected Board was called together immediately after election during the sitting of our last Annual Conference and organized by electing Rev. C. A. Calhoun as President, and Mr. J. M. Hudson, Secretary-Treasurer. The Board adjourned until such business as would justify a call meeting.

On or about Jan. 20th, 1934, I received an application from the church at Magnolia for a loan of \$200.00 to assist said church with its pressing indebtedness and save foreclosure on the property. I submitted the application to the Board through correspondence which resulted in two votes cast for and one against, and one voting for orally. The final vote stood three to one. I therefore instructed the Treasurer to grant said loan—\$186.71.

During the month of July I received a bid for an old church building which I was told had been abandoned for five years and was formerly called "Hickory Grove," and "White Spring". I submitted this proposition to the Board by correspondence. Two members invested in me the authority to use my own judgment in the matter, one stated he doubted that the Board had any jurisdiction over the property, another voted orally for the disposition of it. I went out to the church and called as many of the old members as I could get together and inquired about said church, and they all consented that it should be disposed of and the money placed into the Church Extension fund due to the fact that the roof had fallen in and all the lumber in a decaying condition. I, then, submitted to a bid for the material of the building and received \$10.00 as the highest bid. We considered this an extravagant price. The money was placed in the Church Extension fund.

During the month of August I investigated the property at Junction City. I found some amazing facts. I secured several witnesses to testify that a certain Mr. Byron, (since deceased,) spoke freely to them with regard to this property, that, he was going to gain possession of it or "bust". He proceeded to cause the property to be assessed for taxes and without knowledge by the Board of Church Extension, the property was sold for its taxes, Mr. Byron being the purchaser. Shortly after Mr. Byron died his son gave a

Mr. Pepper, a member of the town Council at Junction City, the authority to tear down and sell the material of the building and defray such expenses for demolishing as accrued and forward the balance to him. This was done, and Mr. Byron received \$10.00 for his profit. I then went to Farmerville to investigate the deed. I found a perfectly good deed to the church, and it was the opinion of the clerk and an attorney that the tax deed and tax sale were invalid. I then made a proposition to young Mr. Byron to return what money he had received from the sale and relinquish his hold upon the property by giving a quit claim deed. He has not consented as yet and should he refuse I am of the opinion that suit should be filed immediately.

About the sixth of October I requested the resignation of the Secretary-Treasurer because of irregularities and upon the request of Bro. Wade. This he tendered Oct. 15th. I have appointed, by the consent of the Board, Bro. Rowe Clayton, of Magnolia to fill this vacancy.

2. It would supercede the rights of our Woman's Missionary work.
3. And the pastor's hands would be tied and his rights and privileges taken away.

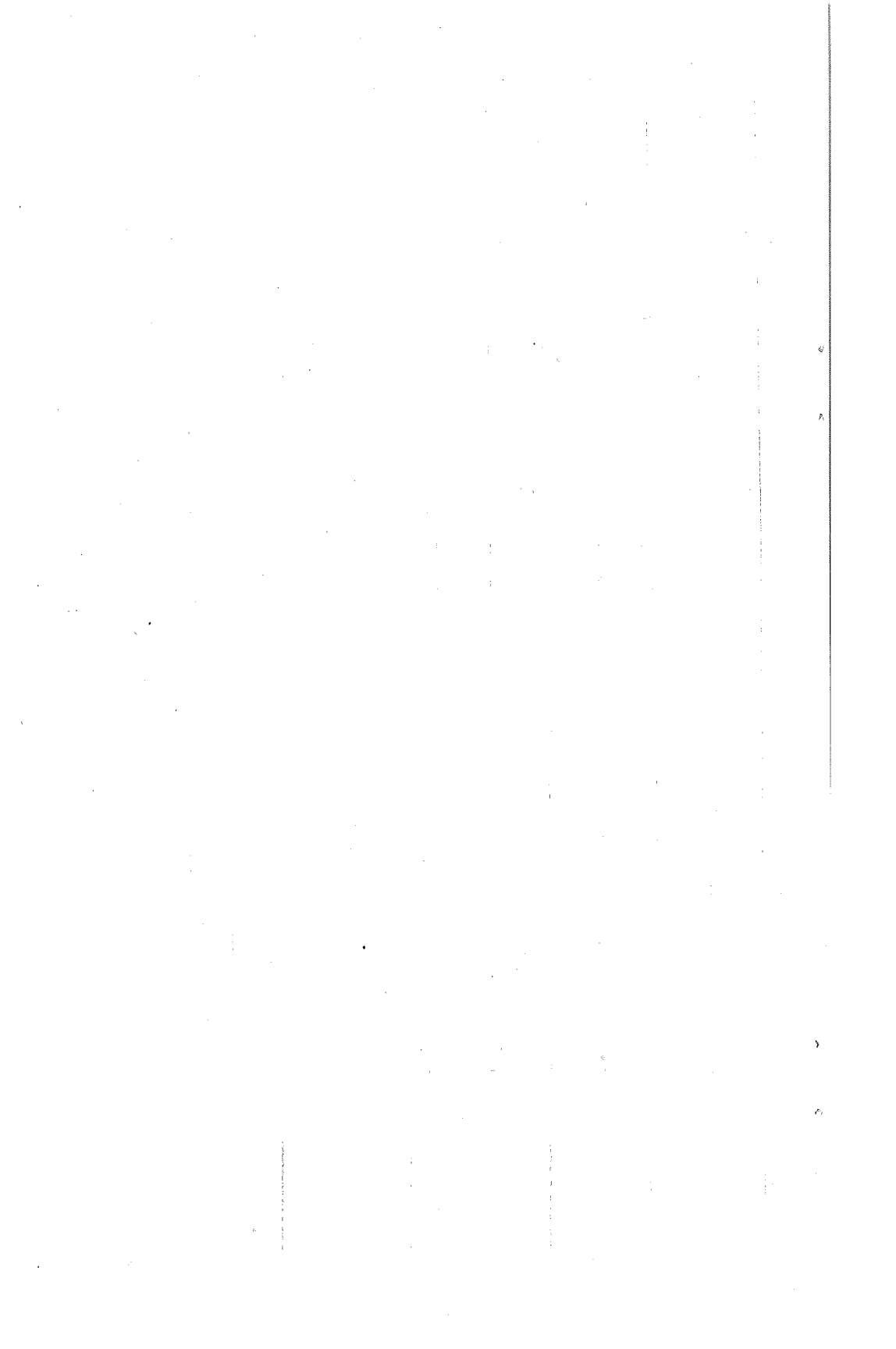
