### JOURNAL

#### MORNING SESSION FIRST DAY

The Fifty-Seventh Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church convened with Union Grove church, Leonard Charge, Rector, Arkansas, at 10:00 a.m., October 30, 1936, Rev. D. G. Hindman Conference host.

Dr. J. E. Butler, President of the conference, conducted the devotional services by reading a part of the 8th chapter of the book of Romans, and offering prayer, after which the conference was declared opened and ready for business.

The Secretary, Rev. W. O. Tisdale, called the Ministerial roll, noting those present and absent.

By motion of Dr. J. A. Wade, the names of Rev. J. T. Goldsmith, Rev. E. L. Hogue, and Rev. G. A. Mouser were transferred to the Memorial roll.

By motion of Dr. Wade the bar of the conference was fixed to include the third window back to the left, and the rear window on the right.

Dr. R. L. Shipley, D. D., Editor of the Methodist Protestant Recorder, was introduced to the conference by the chairman of the committee on Fraternal Relations. Dr. Shipley spoke briefly explaining the plan of visitation of the General Conference official to the annual conference, and announced that he would be with us throughout the session of the conference.

The program for the conference prepared by the president of the conference and chairman of the pulpit committee was distributed, and after amendment, calling for the opening sessions each morning at 8:30 instead of 8:00 o'clock, and the afternoon sessions at 1:30 instead of 1:30 o'clock, was adopted as a general plan for the working of the conference.

A resolution calling for the stationing of the President was read by Rev. J. D. Huff, and was referred to the committee on Resolutions, with a request that the said committee report immediately upon resumption of business after lunch.

The Committee on Credentials was asked to make its report immediately after lunch.

By motion, conference recessed till 10:55 a.m.

Mrs. A. R. Corn offered prayer for Mrs. J. E. Butler, who was in the Methodist Hospital at Memphis.

#### ELEVEN O'CLOCK SERVICES

Conference was called together at 10:55 by the singing of "How Firm a Foundation."

Rev. S. N. Adams offered prayer.

Dr. J. A. Wade read John 3:14-18 for the Scripture lesson, and brought the conference sermon from John 3:16.

At the close of the sermon, Dr. A. R. Corn led in prayer, after which a song was sung and all joined in a good old handshake. The benediction was pronounced by Dr. Wade.

#### NOON

The ladies of the church and the surrounding community spread lunch on the tables prepared for the same on the church lawn.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

The Conference was called together at 1:30 by the singing of "Take Time to Be Holy." The Devotional was conducted by Rev. J. R. Diffee, who read the 13th chapter of I Corinthians, after which Dr. R. L. Shipley offered prayer. The congregation sang "Trust and Obey." The President called the conference to order, and the Secretary read the Lay Roll as a report of the committee on Credentials. (See the Lay Roll.)

The Committee on Itinerancy and Order made a partial report, recommending Jewel Linam for ordination. The report was adopted.

The President read his report which was adopted as read. (See Report A.)

The Committee on Resolutions made a partial report, and, after quite a bit of discussion, it was finally adopted. (See Report B.)

The time having arrived for the order of the day, the President appointed Dr. J. A. Wade, Rev. J. E. Hughes, Rev. S. W. Mooty, Rev. W. O. Lynch, as tellers for the election.

By motion of Rev. W. O. Lynch, the Secretary of the Conference was authorized to cast the unanimous ballot of the conference for Dr. J. E. Butler for President. The Ballot was cast, and Dr. Butler was declared elected President of the conference. Upon his election, Dr. Butler made a few remarks, and Mrs. A. R. Corn offered prayer.

The Secretary was then authorized by motion of the conference to cast the unanimous ballot of the conference for Dr. J. A. Wade for Secretary of the conference. The ballot was cast and Dr. Wade was declared elected Secretary of the conference. Motion carried that the Secretary cast the unanimous ballot of the conference for Rev. W. O. Lynch as Treasurer of the conference. The ballot was cast and Rev. Lynch was declared elected.

The following were elected on the Standing District Committee:

Rev. W. W. Fincher, Rev. T. W. Nunn, Rev. A. R. Corn, Ministers; W. C. Wingfield, Joe Ben Foster, A. H. Hunt, Laymen.

The following were elected as members of the Board of Church Extension:

Rev. A. R. Corn, Rev. W. O. Tisdale, Rev. W. O. Lynch, Ministers; J. U. Wells, L. L. Sherman, Luther E. Green, Laymen.

Dr. J. A. Wade was elected to take the place of W. W. Fincher on the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders, and Rev. J. W. York was elected to succeed himself.

Rev. J. W. Simmons was elected on the Council of Religious Education to take the place of Rev. E. L. Hogue deceased.

A motion that the Secretary have the minutes of the last quadrennium bound together with a copy of the General Conference Journal, and that the conference pay for the same was laid on the table.

Rev. Alvin McElvane, minister in the Presbyterian U. S. A. church, was introduced to the conference and invited to an honorary seat.

A resolution introduced by L. L. Sherman, J. D. Huff, calling for the election of an Executive Committee was read and the following were elected as members of the Executive Committee:

Dr. J. E. Butler, Dr. J. A. Wade, Rev. W. O. Lynch, Ministers; L. L. Sherman, W. B. Cheatham, Laymen.

After the chairmen of a number of the committees made announcements concerning the meeting of their respective committees, a motion to recess till 8:30 o'clock Saturday morning prevailed.

#### FRIDAY EVENING SERVICES

The devotional was in charge of Rev. G. C. Bailey.

The Evangelistic Services were in charge of Rev. W. O. Tisdale.

The singing was in charge of Rev. Jewel Linam.

Prayer was offered by Rev. T. W. Nunn.

The Scripture Lesson read: Exodus 6:1-13; Heb. 11:24-26.

Theme: "The Forks of the Road."

Rev. Tisdale brought a very inspiring message from the timely theme chosen.

#### SECOND DAY

#### Saturday Morning

The Conference was called together by singing of the hymn, "Draw Me Nearer."

Dr. R. L. Shipley made a brief talk on prayer and the twenty-third psalm, after which Rev. J. W. Simmons led in prayer.

Dr. F. W. Stephenson was introduced and asked to take the chair. The roll was called and corrections made.

The minutes of Friday's session were read and, after several corrections, adopted.

The motion that the Secretary have the minutes of the last quadrennium bound was taken from the table and passed.

By motion made by Rev. W. O. Lynch, eleven o'clock was set to hear Dr. R. L. Shipley.

The Church Extension Board made its report, which was received and referred back to the new Board to get in final form. (See Report C.)

Dr. Stephenson turned the chair over to the President, Dr. J. E. Butler.

The President of the Young Peoples Work made his report, which was received and referred to the Committee on Young Peoples Work. (See Report D.)

Rev. W. O. Lynch made a talk in interest of the Young Peoples Work and distributed copies of "The Penny-a-Day Covenant." Dr. F. W. Stephenson, Dr. J. A. Wade, and Dr. J. E. Butler made brief talks in interest of the Young Peoples Work.

The Committee on Missions made its report, which was adopted as read. (See Report E.)

The President asked Dr. R. L. Shipley to take the chair while he met with the Stationing Committee. The members of the Stationing Committee were excused to meet with the President.

By motion, Dr. Shipley was asked to make his official address at that time instead of 11:00 o'clock. He consented to do so. He spoke in interest of the Church paper, and closed by making some timely remarks in interest of Church union.

A motion to recess for committee work carried.

#### NOON

The ladies of the church and community spread a bountiful dinner on the church lawn.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

The conference convened at 1:30 by singing the hymn, "Blessed Assurance." Prayer was offered by Rev. W. O. Lynch.

Dr. R. L. Shipley was asked to take the chair while the President met with the Stationing Committee.

The Committee on Education made its report, which was adopted as read. (See Report F.)

The Committee on Young Peoples Work made its report, which was adopted as read. (See Report G.)

The Board of Church Extension made its report on the report which was referred back to it, which report was adopted as amended. (See Report C.)

The Committee on Temperance made its report, which was adopted as read. (See Report H.)

A motion to fix the place for the next annual conference prevailed. An invitation from Ebenezer church on Ebenezer circuit was extended through the delegate, Harper Wells. The place was placed in nomination and unanimously accepted by the conference.

A motion to hear Dr. F. W. Stephenson prevailed. Dr. Stephenson spoke in interest of Christian Education, and the Christian Ministry, closing with some timely remarks in favor of church union.

The Committee on Finance submitted its report, which was adopted after being amended by the conterence. (See Report I.)

The Committee on Moral and Official Relations made its report which was adopted after being amended by the conference. (See Report J.)

The Committee on Itinerancy made its report which was adopted item by item after the ministers and preachers whose names appear in the report were asked to retire from the building until action could be taken on the report. (See Report K.)

The Treasurer made his report which was adopted together with the Auditor's report which accompanied it. (See Report L and M.)

The Boundary Committee made its report, which was adopted as read. (See Report N.)

A motion to adjourn till Monday morning, 8:30 o'clock, prevailed.

#### SATURDAY EVENING SERVICES

The Saturday evening services were given over to the Young People's Christian Endeavor Society of Macedonia church, Leonard Circuit, who rendered a very impressive and interesting pageant, "Possessions," to a packed house. Many complimentary remarks were heard concerning the impressiveness of the pageant.

#### SUNDAY SERVICES

#### Morning

Rev. A. R. Corn preached the Ordination sermon to a capacity house Sunday morning at 11:00 o'clock, after which Jewel Linam was ordained.

#### Afternoon

The afternoon services Sunday were held in memory of Reverends, J. T. Goldsmith, E. L. Hogue, and G. A. Mouser. Dr. J. A. Wade was in charge of the services, which were as follows:

Song: "How Firm a Foundation"; Prayer, Rev. A. R. Corn.

Scripture Passages read by J. A. Wade, who made a few comments.

Talks made by the following: T. W. Nunn, S. N. Adams, J. E. Hughes, Wm. Beal, S. W. Mooty, W. W. Fincher, A. R. Corn, Mrs. Collier, Mrs. Chambers, and Mrs. Sexton.

Song: "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone."

Benediction: Rev. J. W. York.

#### Sunday Evening

Sunday evening services were in charge of Rev. W. O. Lynch and Rev. F. L. Gibbs, who spoke in interest of the Young Peoples Work. There were capacity crowds at each of these services.

Services were held at Leonard and Rector Methodist Protestant churches Sunday. Rev. W. O. Lynch preached at Rector at the morning hour, and Dr. R. L. Shipley preached at the evening hour. The Secretary was not informed who preached at Leonard.

#### MONDAY

#### Morning Session

The conference was called together at 8:30 a. m. by the singing of a hymn. A number of the brethren led in prayer, asking God's blessing upon the day's session and upon Dr. and Mrs. Butler.

Dr. Jas. H. Straughn, President of the General Conference, was introduced and asked to take the chair.

The conference roll was called, noting those present and those absent.

The minutes of Saturday's session were read and, after several minor corrections, were adopted.

By common consent, the Secretary was allowed to include a report of the evenings' and Sunday's programs in the minutes.

Dr. Straughn asked Rev. D. G. Hindman, pastor of the local church, to occupy the chair while he addressed the conference on the question of Church Union. Dr. Straughn spoke at length on the Union, pointing out many reasons why the conference should adopt the overture sent down to it from the General Conference. After Dr. Straughn finished his address, he opened the subject for questions. A number of questions were asked Dr. Straughn concerning the Union, all of which were answered very satisfactorily.

The overture favoring the Union with the Methodist Episcopal Church, the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and the Methodist Protestant Church was then officially presented to the conference. A motion was made by L. L. Sherman and seconded by Revs. W. O. Lynch and J. R. Diffee that the overture be adopted. Rev. W. O. Tisdale made a motion, seconded by J. D. Huff, that the vote be made by acclamation and without debate. The motion carried, and the vote was taken. There were twenty-seven who stood favoring adoption of the overture, and none against it. The vote was then declared to be unanimous by Dr. Straughn.

Dr. Straughn then read a second overture relative to the boundaries and status of annual conferences amending Article 9, Section 3, of the Constitution. A motion was made to approve this overture. It also carried.

The time of the next annual conference was then fixed. Friday morning at 10:00 a. m. before the first Sunday in November, 1937, was set.

Dr. J. A. Wade read a resolution calling for a questionnaire to be prepared by the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders for the undergraduates, which was adopted by the conference. See Resolution No. 2.

The Arkansas Board of Missions made its report through the two District chairmen, which was adopted. (See Report O.)

A motion to recess till 11:30 a.m. for committee work prevailed.

The conference was called together again at 11:30 a. m. by the singing of the hymn, "Just As I Am."

Dr. Straughn resumed the chair.

The Committee on Superannuates made its report which was amended and then adopted. (See Report P.)

The Committee on Fraternal Relations made its report which was adopted as read. (See Report Q.)

The Committee on Pastors' Reports made its report, which was adopted after several amendments, (See Report R.)

The Committee on Resolutions made its report, which was adopted as read by a rising unanimous vote. (See Report S.)

A motion made by Rev. A. R. Corn to have 200 copies of financial charts made for the churches, and paid for out of the Annual conference funds, carried, after being amended to have the pastors pay for the same.

A motion prevailed to fix the Treasurer's salary at \$50.00 per annum instead of \$25.00.

A motion to reconsider the Finance Committee report prevailed. A motion to amend said report so as to read, in item (a) "That the present outstanding indebtedness and payment for this year's conference minutes be taken care of before the distribution of the proceeds of the annual conference.

A motion to have 800 copies of the minutes printed and the same to be paid for by the Treasurer out of the annual conference funds prevailed.

The Stationing Committee made its report, which was adopted as read. (See Report T.)

The Minutes of Monday's session were then read and adopted. A motion to adjourn carried, and the conference was dismissed by a fervent prayer offered by Dr. R. L. Shipley. And so closed the fifty-seventh annual session of the Arkansus Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church.

Preached 330 times; made 3 and 1-2 rounds over the conference; held three meetings, and between 35 and 40 Quarterly Conferences; dedicated three churches, Beech Grove on Junction City work, Ebenezer church on Ebenezer work, and Mt. Vernon church on Mt. Vernon Charge.

# REPORT OF YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK Report (D)

The young people's work of our conference is not what we would like for it to be, although as president of the work, I have done the best I could. Early in January, I mailed letters to all

pastors, putting before them the work of our conference, as regards our department. I urged them to observe Young Peoples Day, and to report to me their success. To what extent this day was observed, I do not know, as no reports were returned.

I have urged the pastors to hold local Leadership Training schools. This could be easily done, through the office of Rev. F. L. Gibbs, but only two such schools were reported, one at Haynesville, La., and one at Ware's Chapel.

There were two L. T. S. held this year; one at Wright's Chapel in the N. District, and one at Haynesville, La., in S. District. Both schools were small in attendance, but a high quality of work was reported by both schools. One encouraging feature of the schools was decision night, when 42 young people came forward and signed life service declaration cards, for part time or full time service. What a challenge for the ministers of this conference to lead the way, and open the door of service to the youth of our church.

This conference is not behind the program of our Y. P. work, as we would like to see it. Our council, as requested by the last annual conference, placed in our curriculum courses to meet the needs of our ministers, and especially those taking the conference course of study, but only two preachers attended the schools and took courses for credit.

The time that our schools are held does not seem to suit our people, therefore, we would like for this conference to set the time to snit the larger majority.

A place to hold these schools is another problem. We have to beg for a place to hold the schools. Brethren, this ought not to be.

I am calling upon this conference to get behind the work and let's go forward in the name of Him, who said, "Suffer the little children to come unto me and forbid them not." Will you join me in a prayer and penny a day covenant for this great work. If we can get enough to join in this covenant we hope to conduct a number of local L. T. classes during the coming year.

We, therefore, ask this conference to continue the 15 per cent of the annual conference budget for the support and promotion of the Y. P. work.

This committee shall be designated as the Board of Christian Education of the Arkansas Annual Conference.
