FRIDAY

Morning

The Fifty-Ninth Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church convened with Salem Church, Drew Charge, Wilmar, Arkansas, Rev. G. C. Bailey, Pastor, and Conference Host, on the 28th day of October, 1938, at 10.00 a.m.

Dr. J. E. Butler, President of the Conference, conducted the Devotional.

Song: "Bringing in the Sheaves" was rendered by the congregation, after which Dr. Butler read the Twenty-Fourth Psalm and offered prayer.

Business

The President declared the 59th Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference open for business.

The Secretary called the Ministerial Roll, and noted those present.

The bar of the Conference was fixed to include the space from the pulpit to the second window from the rear of the church auditorium.

The Secretary brought forward and introduced Rev. S. G. Rutledge, and Rev. I. A. Love, pastors in the M. E. Church, South; Dr. H. B. Vaught, Presiding Elder of the Monticello District, M. E. Church, South; and Mrs. Nina McIntosh, of the Fundamental Ministerial Association. Miss Mary Holifield, an honorary delegate of the Young Peoples Work in the Northern end of the Conference, was brought forward and introduced.

A previously prepared Program, was distributed, and adopted as the order of the day, to be varied from when necessary.

By a prevailing motion Conference took recess until 11 o'clock.

Eleven O'clock Services

Conference was called to order at 11 o'clock by the singing of

a hymn, Dr. A. R. Corn led in prayer.

The Scripture lesson was read from the Eleventh Psalm, and Revelation 2:8-11.

The Conference Sermon was delivered by Rev. W. O. Tisdale, from the text "Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life."

The services were closed by singing, and a fellowship of handshaking.

Noon

Lunch was spread on the church lawn by the ladies of the local church and community.

Afternoon

The Conference was called to order at 1:30 o'clock.

Rev. S. W. Mooty had charge of the devotional.

Song, "O happy Day" was sung by the congregation.

The First chapter of James was read.

Prayer was offered by Rev. I. A. Love.

Business

The President took the chair and declared the Conference in session.

The Committee on Credentials made its report which was adopted as read (See Lay Roll).

The President asked Dr. A. R. Corn to preside while he read his report. The President's report was accepted. (See Report No. 1).

The hour having arrived for the election of officers, the President appointed as Tellers, Dr. A. R. Corn, Rev. W. O. Tisdale, E. L. Vestal, and L. L. Sherman.

Dr. J. E. Butler was re-elected President on the first ballot.

Rev. W. O. Tisdale was elected Secretary on the second ballot.

Rev. W. O. Lynch was re-elected Treasurer on the first ballot.

The following Boards and Committees were elected.

The Church Extension Board was re-elected, with W. T. Mc-Kennon in place of Luther E. Green.

The District Committee was re-elected with Dr. J. A. Wade in place of Rev. T. W. Nunn.

Rev. A. R. Corn, and Rev. W. O. Lynch were re-elected to serve as members of the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders.

The Council of Religious Education was re-elected with Rev. D. G. Hindman in place of Rev. J. W. Simmons.

The Executive Committee was re-elected with Rev. W. O. Tisdale in place of Dr. J. A. Wade.

The Board of Christian Education was re-elected.

The Secretary read a letter from the President of the General Conference in regard to the method of electing delegates to the Uniting Conference, which is to convene in Kansas City, the 26th day of next April.

The Conference elected as Delegates to the Uniting Conference;

Ministerial, Dr. J. E. Butler; Layman, L. L. Sherman.

First Alternates: Ministerial, Rev. W. O. Lynch; Layman, Henry Whitley.

Second Alternates: Ministerial, Dr. A. R. Corn; Layman, Roy Nipper.

Rev. J. A. Wade mentioned having received letters from Rev. T. W. Nunn, and Rev. Alvin McIlveene, expressing regrets that they were unable to attend the Fifty-Ninth session of the Arkansas Annual Conference.

Following announcements Conference took recess until 8:30 o'cleck Saturday Morning.

Evening Services

The services were begun by singing.

Devotional was in charge of Rev. A. N. Stonecipher, who read

the 13th Chapter of I Corinthians and offered prayer.

Sermon—Theme: "Leave It Alone" was brought by Rev. J. H. Smith, and was based on the Scripture lesson read from the 13th Chapter of Luke.

By request, following the evening sermon, the Cook Trio. composed of Miss Irene Cook, Miss Fern Cook, and Brady Cook sang two special songs.

Rev. J. H. Smith pronounced the Benediction.

SATURDAY

Dr. A. R. Corn conducted the Devotional.

The Roll was called and those absent noted.

The Minutes of Friday's Session were read and approved.

The Secretary read a letter from Rev. T. W. Nunn.

A motion was made and carried that the Secretary be instructed to write Rev. T. W. Nunn a letter expressing our sorrow that he is unable to attend the Conference.

The President of the Church Extension Board read his report, which was accepted, (See Report No. 2).

By vote of the Conference the Magnolia church's debt to the Church Extension Board was cancelled.

The President asked Dr. A. R. Corn to preside and was excused to do committee work.

The Treasurer made his report, which was adopted. (See Report No. 3).

Conference took recess to do committee work, until 11 o'clock.

The Conference came to order at 1:30 o'clock by singing. Rev. Noel Cross had charge of the Devotional Excercises; and read as a Scripture lesson the first six verses of the Fifth Chapter of John.

The recommendation of the Committee was accepted.

A motion prevailed that the name of Mrs. E. L. Hogue be added to the Superannuate Roll.

The report of the Committee on Morals and Official Relations was made and accepted. (See Report No. 12).

A motion carried that the Committee on Resolutions be given permission to finish writing its report and hand same to the Secretary.

The President, and the District Committee were given the right to locate the place and set the time for the next session of the Annual Conference.

The Secretary was authorized to publish 800 copies of the Minutes for distribution on the charges of the district.

Market Birth to a color

Chosen as an Appreciation Year Committee were the President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Conference; the President of the Women's Work; Dr. J. A. Wade, Rev. D. G. Hindman, and Roy Nipper.

Following prayer, by Dr. J. E. Butler, the Committee on Appeals was appointed in the persons of Dr. A. R. Corn, Rev. J. R. Diffee and W. E. Flaherty.

The Stationing Committee's report was read, by the President, and adopted as read. (See Report of Stationing Committee).

By vote of the Conference the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders was excused in order to supplement its report.

The supplementary report of the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders was accepted.

An offering in the amount of \$12.60 was made to the Super annuates and the Superannuate beneficiaries of the Conference.

The Secretary read the Minutes of the last day's session of the Conference, which were approved.

A motion carried that the 59th session of the Arkansas Annual Conference, of the M. P. Church, adjourn.

Dr. J. H. Straughn pronounced the Benediction.

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

To the Fifty-Ninth Session of the Arkansas Annual Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church assembled at Salem Church, Drew circuit.

Greetings:

It was not witout a great deal of misgivings I entered upon this past year's work. I was conscious of the difficulties that lay out before me. I was sure that the pastorate of Magnolia Church would bring of position as it has always done to any pastor that may be sent there so long as the opposition is carried on by remote control. Nevertheless, there are those in that church who are as true and loyal as you will find in the world. Another, was the union of the three churches which was debated pro, and con, throughout the Conference. Both pastor and people seem to be waiting with expectancy as to what the union will bring forth, therefore, relaxing their energies.

We are praying that the work of this Conference will be carried on without fear or favor, and that the committee on morals and official relations will do its work in the fear of God, and stop this wanton violation of duty, and obligation to the church, and the powers that be,

Official Acts

- 1. On Jan. 29, 1937, I released J. A. Wade for half time from Village Charge.
- 2. On Nov. 9, 1937, I released Rev. W. C. Smith from the Hickory Valley Charge, and on the same day I loaned him to the M. E. Church.
- 3. On Dec. 31, 1937, I released Rev. W. W. Fincher from Pine Grove church on Mt. Vernon Circuit and on the same date appointed him to Shiloh church on Oak Grove Circuit.

- 4. On Jan. 7, 1938, I appointed Rev. Henry Carpenter, as pastor of Hickory Valley Circuit.
- 5. On Jan. 31, 1938, the quarterly conference concurring I released Rev. S. N. Adams for half time from Prescott circuit, with the understanding that his wife would fill in the time.
- 6. On Jan. 7, I received Rev. Norman Purvis by transfer from Miss. Conference; and on October 15, gave him a transfer back to the same Conference.
- 7. On Jan. 12, I appointed Rev. B. H. Simms to Pine Grove church on Mt. Vernon circuit.
- 8. Some time in June Rev. T. W. Nunn being compelled by illness to give up his work on Columbia Circuit and asked to be released which was done; and by the wishes of Barges church on this circuit I appointed Rev. W. O. Tisdale to give them an afternoon service on the 2nd. Sunday in each month. I appointed Rev. Beverly Bond to keep up appointments at the other places until he left for school.

Recommendations

I am calling your attention to three recommendations which I offered last year and which were voted by the Conference.

- 1. That every pastor shall take the church paper.
- 2. That every pastor shall be held accountable for carrying out resolutions passed by this Conference.
- 3. That neither the Stationing Committee, nor the President in the interim of Conference, shall be required to supply a circuit or station where it is known the charge failed to pay its pastor, or the benevolences, because they did not like the pastor.
- 4. That this Conference shall cooperate to the fullest extent with the General Conference Executive Committee in carrying out what is known as the, Appreciation Year Campaign.

Finally

Despite the difficulties that were in the way I did my duty as I saw it without fear or favor, and wherein I have failed has been

an error of the head and not of the heart. I have traveled over the District some 8,000 miles, preached 200 times; made three rounds in the Northern part of the Conference, and three in the Southern part, with the exception of three circuits; held three revivals and some fine get-together fellowship meetings. In most instances the pastors have been very kind and courteous, and with these I have held as fine quarterly conferences as I have ever held.

Incorporated in this report is a summary of the Minutes of the Acts of the Board during the conference year of 1937-38, as recorded by the Secretary. Told which

The Board met by a call of the President, at Magnolia, Ark., Jan. 12, 1938.

Officers elected for the ensuing year were: Rev. W. O. Tisdale, President; Rey. W. O. Lynch, Secretary-Treasurer.

Rev. W. O. Tisdale reported that the church property located about six miles Southeast of Village, Ark., and known as Emerson's Chapel had been sold for the sum of \$40.00, and a deed to the same executed on Dec. 21, 1937. The President was authorized to deliver to the purchaser the deed, and collect the money.

Dr. J. E. Butler made application to the Board for loans to Magnolfa church, as the Board was in position to grant loans to this church; and asked that the sum of \$20.00 spent by Dr. Butler, on a trip to Alabama in the interest of Magnolia church, be included in the loan. A motion prevailed that the loans to Magnolia church be granted.

Rev. W. W. Fincher, Mr. J. B. Foster, and Mr. J. D. Hanson as representatives of Mt. Vernon church, of Mt. Vernon charge, offered to buy the Board's interest in a certain 40 acres of land near the Mt. Vernon church building. The Board voted to sell its interest in said property to Mt. Vernon church, and was paid for same the amount of \$135.00 less \$2.00 cost of executing deed.

On January 22nd, the Treasurer made to Magnolia church a loan of \$130.00. On May 11, 1938 the Trustees of Magnolia church were granted an additional loan of \$25.00.

I recommend that this Annual Conference, by request of the Fourth Quarterly Conference of Shongaloo charge, declare the property of Potter's church on the said charge, to be extinct; and I further reccommend that the Church Extension Board be given the right to sell the same.

We, your Executive Committee of the Council of Religious Education, submit the following report:

There has been no Church School held the past year in the conference. Two Leadersip Training Schools were held this year. One in our church at Haynesville and one at Rector in the Northern District.

The Training School in the Southern District was small but good work was done. Not having received any report from the District Chairman from Southern District the details of the school have not been received.

The report from District Chairman Northern District shows that a good Training School was held with an attendance of 28 students taking the courses. Much interest was mainifested, and fine prospects for a Training School next year are apparent. Three new Christian Endeavor Societies have been organized in the Northern District with prospects for new societies this year.

In order to cooperate with the Leadership Training Schools in training youth for church leadership, we recommend that responsibility be put upon the local churches to hold church schools for the purpose of training leaders.
