## *Journal of the Daily Proceedings.*

### FIRST DAY--MORNING SESSION.

FORT SMITH, ARK. Feb. 6, 1902.

The Twenty-fourth Annual Session of the Little Rock, Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church met in Mallieu Chapel at 9 o'clock A. M., Bishop C. H. Fowler, D. D., L. L. D., in the chair.

The Bishop announced the hymn, "And are we yet alive" which was sung by the conference and the Bishop led in prayer. Assisted by the Presiding Elders, the Bishop proceeded to administer the Sacrement of the Lord's Supper.

**ROLL CALL.** The Secretary of the last session called the roll, and forty-eight Members and twelve Probationers answered to their names.

**ORGANIZATION.** H. P. Strong was re-elected Secretary. He nominated L. G. Hodges, W. S. Sherrill and J. H. Greer as his assistants and they were elected.

J. W. Jackson was re-elected Statistical Secretary, and nominated C. W. Whitehead, D B Harston, J J Freeman, as his assistants and they were elected.

H. P. Coulter was re-elected Treasurer, and nominated, W H Morris, C A Taylor, A T Stephens as his assistants and they were elected.

TIME of MEETING and ADJOURNMENT. The time of meeting and adjournment was fixed 8:30. a. m. and at 12 m., respectively.

BAR. Conference Bar was fixed to correspond with a line drawn so as to include the second windows.

WELCOME ADDRESS. Rev A. H. Hill, B. D., pastor of the A. M. E. Church delivered the welcome address, Response by J. H. Reed.

THIRTEENTH QUESTION. Was the Character of each preacher examined? B. J. Griffin presiding elder of the Forrest City District was called. His character passed, he made his report. The character of the following effective elders passed and they made their reports. J. W. Clark, W. H. Morris, S B Davis, S T Cooper, L G Hodges, S. M Stokes, C. son, G. B. Donnelly, Phillips Owens, L. J. Preston.

T. R. Wamble, presiding elder of the Hot Springs District was called, his character passed and made his report. The character of the following elders passed they reported: L. D. Daniels, H. P. Coulter, G. N. Johnson, David Hall, T. J. Thompson, H. P. Strong, G. A. Hall, H. Bright, Lee Nelson. J. W. Kilpatrick was reported as having withdrawn.

W. R. R. Duncan, presiding elder of the Little Rock District, was called, his character passed, he reported the dis-

A. J. Hamilton and J. B. Brown were referred to committee on Conference Relation. W. H. Higgins presiding elder of the Pine Bluff District was called, his character passed. The following characters were passed and reported. B. J. Lewis, M. F. Strong, D. B. Harston, H. C. Dunlap, A. T. Stephen was referred to the Committee on Conference Relation.

THIRTIETH QUESTION. Where shall the next Conference be held? Fayetteville, Clow, Forrest City and Newport were nominated, Forrest City and Newport were withdrawn. The vote was taken and Clow was selected.

INTRODUCTIONS. Dr. M. C. B. Mason, of the Freedman Aid and Southern Education Society, R. E. Jones of the Sunday School Union and W. F. Waters Ass't. Business Manager of the Southwestern Christian Advocate were introduced and each presented the cause which he represents.

Rev. S. M. Ballard of the C. M. E. Church, and Prof. L. W. Futrell of the Clow Seminary were also introduced.

W. R. Duncan presented the Book concern.

The bishop made the following appointments: D. B. Harston, to conduct the devotional services of the statistical session, Mr. M. N. Langston to conduct the devotional services tomorrow. A statistical session was ordered the Bishop appointed Dr. Cox to preside. The committee on public worship announced, B. J. Lewis to preach at three. Dr. M. C. B. Mason to speak tonight.

The invitation of Principal Jones to attend the public school was read.

The list of committee was called, the chairman appointed the time and place of meeting.

The long meter doxology was sung benediction by the Bishop.

## AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference reassembled at 2:P. M. in statistical session. Dr. Cox in the chair. D. B. Horston conducted the devotional services. The roll of the charges was called and the reports were handed in.

#### FREEDMAN'S AID AND SOUTHERN EDUCATION.
