## JOURNAL OF THE DAY'S PROCEEDINGS.

Clow, Ark., January 22, 1903.

The twenty fifth session of the Little Rock Conference, Methodist Episcopal Church, met in Wiley chapel at 9 o'clock a. m., Bishop John M. Walden, D. D., LL. D., in the chair. The bishop read the scripture lesson, the conference sang "Amazing Grace, How Sweet It Sounds," and B. J. Griffin lead in prayer.

Roll Call—The secretary of the last conference called the roll and fifty-three members and four probationers answered to their names.

Organization—H. P. Strong was elected secretary. He nominated L. G. Hodges and W. S. Sherrill as his assistants and they were elected. J. W. Jackson was elected statistical secretary. He nominated J. J. Freeman, G. T. Saxton, J. W. Burns and C. W. Whitehead as his assistants and they were elected. H. P. Coulter was elected treasurer. He nominated W. H. Morris, Silas McDonald, Waiters McIntosh and D. H. E. Harris as his assistants and they were elected.

Conference Bar—The bar of the conference was fixed so as to include the seats in front of the stove.

Meeting and Adjournment—The time of meeting was fixed at 9 a. m., the first half hour to be given to devotional exercises. The time of adjournment was fixed at 12:30 p. m.

The bishop then addressed the conference on the importance of the annual gathering.

Thirteenth Question—Was the character of each preacher examined? was taken up. The name of W. R. H. Duncan, presiding elder of the Little Rock district, was called. His character passed and he reported his district. The report showed improvement on all lines.

W. H. Higgins, presiding elder of the Pine Bluff district was called. His character passed and he reported his work. The report showed material and spiritual progress.

The name of B. J. Griffin, presiding elder of the Forrest City district, was called. His character passed and he reported his district with progress on all lines.

The name of T. R. Wamble, presiding elder of the

Clow district, was called. His character passed and he reported his district with advances over last year.

The name of M. N. Langston, presiding elder of the Fort Smith district was called. His character passed and he reported his district. The report showed that he had been abundant in his labors that tell in results.

T. R. Wamble then read a list of the standing committees nominated by the presiding elders and they were constituted.

The auditing committee was constituted a committee to audit both treasurer's and presiding elders' accounts.

The superannuated and the supernumary preachers, the probationers of the second year, and those for admission on trial, were referred to the committee on conference relations.

And to the same committee were referred the following effective preachers: W. E. Pruitt, J. B. Brown, John L. Bryan and J. M. Aerhart.

Introductions—Dr. George, of the Sunday school union, was introduced and he addressed the conference in the interest of the cause he represents.

The hour of 11:30 having arrived the bishop, assisted by the presiding elders and the officers of the conference, administered the sacrament of the Lord's supper. The services were a spiritual uplift to all present. The conference then adjourned until 2:30 p. m.

The doxology was sung, the bishop pronounced the benediction.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION.

The conference reassembled at 2:30 p. m., Bishop Walden in the chair. W. R. R. Duncan conducted the devotional exercises.

After which the bishop called the roll of charges and the following reported:

Clow District—De Queen, Nashville, New Lewisville, Texarkana and White Cliffs.

Forrest City District—Augusta, Batesville, Brinkley, Brinkley Circuit, Bledsoe, Forrest City Circuit, Jonesboro, Marianna, Marked Tree, Newport, Palestine and Sulphur Rock.

Little Rock District—England, Hensley, Hot Springs, North Side, Rock Street, Wesley Chapel, White Chapel, Little Rock Circuit, Marche, Roland and Sweet Home.

Pine Bluff District—Alzheimer, Avery, Camden, Clarendon, Dumas, Fordyce, Lunar, Monticello, New Edinburg, Pine Bluff and Pine Bluff Circuit.

Fort Smith District—Caddo Gap, Danville, Fayetteville, Mallalien, Morrilton, Solgohachie and Van Buren.

Introductions—Dr. T. C. Iliff, of the church extension society, Dr. J. B. Scott, of the Southwestern Christian Advocate, and Mrs. H. M. Nasmyth, of the Adline Smith Industrial Home, were introduced.

The bishop then asked Dr. Cox to preside so as to allow him time to meet the cabinet to attend to business.

Dr. Cox took the chair and presented Dr. Iliff who addressed the conference in the interest of the cause he represents.

The bishop returning, and assisted by Dr. Iliff, conducted a Pentecostal service. All were revived.

The secretary then read the list of the standing committees; they made their announcements. The pastor announced that Dr. Iliff would speak tonight.

The conference then adjourned until tomorrow at 9:30 a. m.

#### SECOND DAY

Clow, Ark., January 23, 1903.

Conference assembled at 9 a. m., bishop Walden in the chair. He read II Peter, 1st chapter. The conference sang "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing." H. P. Strong and B. J. Griffin lead in prayer, after which the conference sang "Love Divine, All Love Excelling."

Reading of the Journal—The secretary then read the minutes of yesterday's sessions and they were approved.

Roll Call—The secretary then called the roll of the absentees and four answered to their names. On motion of J. W. Jackson that the further calling of the roll be dispensed with.

Thirteenth Question—Was the character of each preacher examined? was resumed. The names of the following were called, their characters passed and they reported their work:

Little Rock District—H. C. Dunlap, W. S. Sherrill, J. C. Adams, J. H. Reed, J. J. Freeman, J. H. Greer, J. A. Hamilton, J. M. Cox, H. P. Strong and M. F. Strong. M. F. Strong was excused from attending the session of the conference on account of sickness.

Pine Bluff District—D. H. E. Harris, B. J. Lewis, C.

W. Whitehead, T. J. Thompson, D. B. Harston and L. J. Preston.

Fifth Question—Who have been continued on trial? The name of William A. Smith was called, his character passed, the committee on examinations reported him as having passed in the studies of the first year. The presiding elder recommended and he was continued on trial and advanced to the studies of the second year.

Eighth Question—What members are in the studies of the third year? The names of the following were called, their characters passed, and they reported their work: Samuel J. Brown, Zachariah R. Fields and William M. Speed. Further action was then deferred.

Ninth Question—What members are in the studies of the fourth year? The names of the following were called, their characters passed, and they reported their work: The committee on examinations reported them as having passed in the studies of the third year, the presiding elders recommended that they be advanced to the studies of the fourth year. Robert B. Henry, Prince W. Webb, Archie R. Ray, Geo. T. Saxton and Aaron S. Johnson.

Samuel M. Cam was continued in the studies of the third year. William Green was continued in the studies of the third year and given credit for two studies in which he passed.

Tenth Question—What members have completed the conference course of study? Henderson C. Crump and Aaron S. Johnson were called, their characters passed, and they made their reports.

The committee on examinations reported them as having passed the examination. The presiding elder recommended, they were elected to elders ordered.

Aaron S. Johnson was not present at the conference of 1902, on account of sickness. He was allowed to take the examination in two year's studies.

Dr. Scott, of the Southwestern, and Mrs. H. M. Nasmyth, of the Adline Smith Home, then addressed the conference in the interest of the causes which they represent.

Thirtieth Question—Where shall the next conference

be held? Pine Bluff, Morrilton and Little Rock were placed in nomination and represented by Rev. D. H. Horston, Rev. M. H. Foster and Dr. J. H. Reed, respectively. A vote was taken resulting in the selection of Pine Bluff.

On motion of J. H. Greer, the secretary send to Morrilton and Wesley Chapel, Little Rock, greetings, thanking them for their kind invitation to hold the next session in their church.

The Restoration of Credentials—The recommendation of William Lewis for the restoration of credentials was referred to the committee on conference relations.

The president of the conference missionary society announced that D. B. Harston would preach the missionary sermon tomorrow afternoon.

The list of standing committees was read; they made their announcements.

The bishop then addressed the conference in a forceful manner upon the necessity of raising the full amount apportioned to each charge for the support of the conference claimants.

Introductions—Prof. I. G. Penn, assistant secretary of the Epworth League, was introduced to the conference.

The committee on public worship announced that Prof. Penn and Mrs. H. M. Nasmyth would speak tonight.

The doxology was sung, and Dr. Scott pronounced the benediction.

### THIRD DAY.

Clow, Ark., January 24, 1903.

The conference opened at 9 a. m. Bishop Walden conducted the devotional services. He announced the hymn, "O Bless the Lord, My Soul." W. H. Morris and T. R. Wamble lead in prayer. After which the bishop read Hebrews, 12th chapter. The conference sang "My Faith Looks Up to Thee."

Reading of the Journal—The journal of yesterday was read and approved.

Communication—The bishop presented a communication from the book committee which was read by the secretary and referred to the committee on books and periodicals.

Eleventh Question—What others have been elected and ordained deacons? William H. Hebrew and J. Tag-

gart were recommended from the Pine Bluff district. They passed in character and in examination and were elected to deacons orders, as local preachers.

The presiding elders were allowed to withdraw the recommendations of William M. Dickerson, Ambrose N. Edgerson and Richard Harris.

Dr. Scott asked that J. A. Hamilton be appointed to assist in the collection of the book accounts. It was done.

Seventh Question—Was resumed, the class was called forward and after prayer was addressed by the bishop on the general work of the ministry. The following were admitted into full membership: Zachariah R. Fields, Samuel J. Brown and William M. Speed.

The committee on conference relations was excused to finish up their work.

Tomorrow afternoon was fixed as the time for the ordination and memoirs service.

Introductions—Dr. W. P. Thirkield, secretary of the Freedman Aid and Southern Educational Society, Prof. A. D. Jacques, president of the State Epworth League, Mr. J. W. Whitfield, president of the Little Rock District League, and Mr. R. L. Irwin, a citizen of Clow, were introduced.

An afternoon session was ordered at 2:30 p. m.

Twenty-third Question—Who are the superannuated preachers? The name of G. W. Taylor was called, his character passed. He made his report and was continued in this relation.

The hour for adjournment having arrived, the announcements were made and the benediction was pronounced by Dr. Thirkield.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION.

Conference reassembled at 2:30 p. m. Bishop Walden in the chair and conducted the devotional services.

Reading of the Minutes—The minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The conference voted to allow the presiding elder the privilege of withdrawing the recommendation for orders of Fletcher Smith and Richard Harris.

Twenty-second Question—Who are the supernumerary preachers? The following were called, their characters passed, and they were continued in the same relation: C. C. Wallace, J. W. Cunningham and G. W. Thompson. D.

W. Nelson was placed on the superannuated relation and asked to locate.

Walters McIntosh and J. W. Burns were made effective.

The twenty-third question was resumed. The names of the following were called, their characters passed, and they were continued in the same relation: W. H. Crawford, Elza Roberts, S. J. Johnson, B. H. Johnson, D. W. Johnson, Washington Brooks and W. M. Fuller.

On motion of W. H. Higgins the secretary was ordered to send the greetings of the conference to the superannuated brethren who were not in attendance at the conference.

The presiding elder was allowed to withdraw the recommendations of William M. Dickerson, Ambrose N. Edgerson, Chas. Howell, Allen Fields, Aaron J. Taggart and William H. Hebrew, for admission on trial.

On motion of J. W. Jackson that the presiding elders be allowed to employ any of the above named if they see fit.

The committee on conference relations reported in the following cases: J. M. Arehart be exonerated and his character pass; J. B. Brown be placed in the supernumerary relation; the presiding elder to employ him if necessary.

W. E. Pruitt's character pass and that he settle the debt against him. The report was adopted.

Twenty-first Question—What other personal notations should be made? G. W. Davis, a deacon, and Alexander Hardman, an elder from the A. M. E. church, had their orders recognized.

Introductions—Rev. L. M. Webb, of the Baptist church, Clow, and Mr. R. J. Jacques, of Lockesburg, were introduced.

The hour for the preaching of the missionary sermon having arrived, the bishop turned the meeting over to the president of the conference missionary society, he and the cabinet retiring. Hymn, "Jesus Shall Reign Where'er the Sun," was sung. W. H. Crawford lead the prayer. "A Charge to Keep I Have," was sung. The speaker for the occasion was then introduced, Rev. D. B. Horston, pastor at Pine Bluff, and preached a powerful sermon to the edification of all present.

The committee on public worship announced that Dr. Thirkield would deliver the address at the Freedman Aid and Southern Educational Society anniversary tonight.

The announcements for Sunday's services were made, the conference adjourned.

## FOURTH DAY.

Clow, Ark., January 26, 1903.

Conference reassembled at 9 a. m., Bishop Walden in the chair. Rev. S. T. Cooper conducted the religious worship. L. G. Hodges and W. H. Simpson lead in prayer.

Reading of the Minutes—The journal of Saturday's sessions was read and approved.

First Question—Who have been received by transfer and from what conference? William White, an elder from the Okaneb conference.

On motion of L. G. Hodges, the draft on the chartered fund for \$22, and one on the book dividend for \$197, be ordered paid, and the secretary and presiding elder of the Little Rock district be authorized to distribute same on the basis reported by the conference board of stewards. Carried.

Reports from committees were then taken up. The following reported: (See reports.)

Sunday school union, stewards, Freedman Aid and Southern Educational Society, auditing, Bible cause, state of the church, Epworth League, temperance, periodicals and books, episcopal fund, church extension, Sabbath observance, missions.

Resolutions (see resolutions), statistical secretary (see tabulated statement), treasurer (see tabulated statement), missionary appropriations (see tabulated statement).

Mrs. L. J. Johnson, corresponding secretary of the Woman's Home Missionary Society, made her report.

Publishing the Minutes—On motion of J. W. Jackson that the presiding elders withhold \$1.25 from each charge to which missionary money is appropriated, and collect \$1.50 from each self-supporting charge for the publication of the minutes. Carried.

Adjournment—On motion of J. W. Jackson that after the reading of the minutes and the reading of appointments the conference adjourn sine die.

The bishop made a few brief remarks and read the appointments.

At 10:30 Bishop Walden announced hymn "Alas and Did My Savior Bleed?" Dr. W. P. Thirkield read 145th Psalm and lead in prayer. He then read Hebrews, 1st and 2nd chapters. The congregation then sang, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing."

The bishop then announced as his text, Romans 7: 32, from which he preached an edifying sermon.

At 3 p. m. the bishop conducted the devotional services.

The secretary then presented Wm. H. Hebrew and Aaron J. Taggart to be ordained as deacons, and Henderson C. Crump and Aaron S. Johnson to be ordained as elders. After prayer H. P. Strong read the epistle, C. W. Whitehead read the gospel. The bishop then set apart those named to the office of deacon, assisted by the presiding elders he then ordained those present as elders.

The ordination services were impressive and highly spiritual.
