FIRST DAY--Morning Session.

Cotton Plant, Ark., Jan. 17th 1907.

The Twenty Ninth Session of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, convened at Taylor's Chapel, Methodist Episcopal Church, at 9 O'clock A. M.

Presiding Bishop.—Bishop Henry W. Warren D. D., L. L. D., of University Park, Colorado, present and presiding
RELIGIOUS SERVICES.—The devotional service was conducted by the Bishop by reading a part of the 11th and 12th chapters of the 2nd Corinthians. The Bishop led in a most fervent prayer. Brother H. C. Dunlap delighted the Conference by singing the spiritual songs of our Fathers.

ROLL CALL.

The Bishop requested the former Secretary of the Conference to call the roll. The Secretary came forward and called the roll and 52 members and probationers answered to their respective names. The Secretary read a very feeling letter from Bro. W. H. Higgins who was sick and he was instructed by the Bishop to note Bro. Higgins as being sick.

ORGANIZATION.—D. W. Nelson nominated J. W. Jackson for re-election as Secretary and M. H. Foster nominated J. L. Wilson. Standing vote was taken and J. W. Jackson was elected.

ASSISTANTS.—On motion of the Secretary G. T. Saxton, D. W. Nelson, W. A. Smith were elected as assistants Statistical Secretaries.—Silas McDonald nominated W. McIntosh. B. J. Griffin nominated J. L. Wilson and H. C. Dunlap nominated J. J. Freeman. A standing vote was taken and J. L. Wilson was elected and on his motion J. J. Freeman, B. J. Griffin, A. D. Jacques, J. W. Burns, D. W. Boatner, P. W. Webb and W. McIntosh were elected as assistants.

Treasurer.—T. J. Thompson and C. W. Whitehead were nominated for treasurer; by a standing vote T. J. Thompson was elected and on his motion G. W. Jackson Wm. White, D. H. E. Harris, Z. R. Fields, Wm. Speed were elected as his assistants.

HOUR OF MEETING

On motion of L. G. Hodges, the hour of meeting was fixed, at 8.30 A. M., the first half hour to be devoted to devotional services.

Standing Committees.—The Presiding Elders through their Secretary nominated the following standing committees which were ordered.

Bar of Conference.—On motion of Silas McDonald the Bar of the Conference was fixed to include all the seats between the Altar and the Third window.

The Bishop read a letter from B. J. Lewis stating that he was in school and asked to be left without an appointment to attend one of our schools. The Bishop was requested to leave M. F. Strong without an appointment to attend one of our schools, agreed to

INTRODUCTION.

The Bishop introduced to the Conference The Rev. J. W. E. Bowen D. D. P. H. D., President of Gammon Theological Seminary, who addressed the Conference in a most logical and eloquent manner on the needs of the Ministry.

D. W. Boatner introduced a resolution concerning Dr. Bowen's presidency which was on motion of D. W. Boatner adopted.

Response.—The Bishop responded to the address of Dr. Bowen, giving the history and organization of Gammon Theological Seminary. Rev. R. E. Jones D. D., Editor of the Southwestern Christian Advocate, was introduced to the Conference and spoke to the Conference concerning his work and the mission of the Southwestern and the Grand Old Church. The Rev. R. E. Gillam D. D., one of the Commissioners on Aggressive Evangelism was introduced to the Conference who spoke concerning the work that lies near his heart.

Resolutions.—J. L. Wilson introduced a resolution concerning the Southwestern and the labors of Dr. R. E. Jones which was adopted.

Mrs. M. C. B. Mason was introduced to the Conference. Notice was given that the Woman's Home Missionary Society would meet on this afternoon in this Church at 3 P. M.

Rev. H. B. Hart of the Upper Mississippi Conference was introduced to the Conference.

D. W. Boatner moved that a committee on Aggressive Evangelism be appointed and D. H. E. Harris, J. W. Jackson, B. J. Griffin, M. H. Foster and C. W. Whitehead were appointed.

On motion of M. N. Langston we adjourned. The Doxology was sung and the Benediction was pronounced by the Bishop.

Afternoon Session

The Conference met at 2 p. m. Bishop Henry W. Warren present and presiding,

Devotion—The devotion was conducted by the Bishop by singing "A Charge to keep I have." Prayer by the Bishop.

The Statistical Secretary, Dr. J. L. Wilson, with his assistant, J. J. Freeman and T. J. Thompson, treasurer called the roll of the charges and circuits and the brethren submitted their reports. On motion of W. McIntosh that the Board of Stewards pay over to the Editor of the Southwestern Advocate \$5.00 for S. B. Davis, 15, for Wm. Fuller, H. M. Renfro, 6.00, G. W. Taylor, 1.00. The Bishop stated that the presiding Elders would meet him in cabinet session and requested Dr. J. W. E. Bowen to preside during the remainder of the afternoon session. Then President, Dr. Bowen introduced to the Conference Rev. C. M. Hollet, presiding Elder of the Little Rock District of the Arkansas Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, who addressed the Conference in a most excellent manner. Mrs. H. M. Nasmyth was introduced to the Conference, On the motion of B. H. Johnson the Conference adjourned.

SECOND DAY—Morning Session.

Friday Jan., 18th 1907

Minutes.—The minutes of the forenoon and afternoon sessions were read and approved.

Drafts on Chartered Fund.—The Bishop Henry W. Warren presented a draft on the Chartered fund for \$22.00 in favor of the chairman of the Board of Stewards, for the Little Rock Annual Conference, which on motion of M. N. Langston was ordered paid.

Draft Book Dividend.—The Bishop presented a draft from the dividend of the Book Concern, of the Methodist Episcopal Church, for \$567.00 in favor of the Chairman of the Board of Stewards, for the Little Rock Annual Conference which on motion of M. N. Langston was ordered paid.

Absentees.—The roll of absentees was called by the Secretary and nine members answered to their respective names.

Delinquent Charges.—The Roll of delinquent Charges was called by Statistical Secretary and nine members handed in their reports.

The 13th Q.—The Thirteenth Question was called by the Bishop. Was the character of each Preacher examined? The Forrest City District was called. L. G. Hodges, the presiding Elder, was called, his character passed and he reported his work on the district. The following effective Elders were called, their characters were passed and they reported their work viz: J. M. Clark, S. M. Cain, A. T. Stephens, W. A. Smith, G. N. Johnson, H. C. Dunlap, J. W. Jackson, J. T. Hawkins, F. J. Jacob, Wm. Speed, S. J. Brown, J. M. Clark and G. N. Johnson not making any report.

Fort Smith district was called and M. N. Langston, presiding Elder of the district was called, his character passed

Response.—The Bishop responded on behalf of the Conference in a most fitting and eloquent manner.

Resolution.—Dr. D. W. Boatner introduced a resolution con-

cerning Dr. G. Logan and foreign mission, (see resolution) adopted. The Clow District was called and D. B. Harston, Presiding Elder of the District, was called, his character passed and he reported his work on the District.

INTRODUCTION—The Bishop introduced to the Conference that Elect Lady, Mrs. H. M. Naysmith, Supt. of Adline Smith Home, who spoke to the Conference in behalf of Philander Smith College, her work in the Adline Smith Home and the Woman's Home Missionary Society. Announcements were made, the doxology was sung and the Benediction was pronounced by the Bishop.

THIRD DAY--Morning Session.

Cotton Plant, Friday 18, 1907.
The Conference met at 8:30 a. m. with Bishop Warren in the chair,

Devotion—The devotion was conducted by T. R. Wamble by reading for a scripture lesson Romans 12. H. C. Dunlap delighted the Conference by singing one of the songs of our fathers, prayer by J. H. Greer.

The Bishop addressed the Conference.—The minutes of the second days' session were read and approved.

Thirteenth Question continued—The Clow district continued and effective Elders on the District were called and their characters passed and they reported their work viz. C. A. Taylor, D. H. Harris, H. Bright, B. H. Johnson

G. W. Thompson, David Hall, Lee Nelson, L. J. Preston E. M. Alexander J. C. Izard, G. A. Hall, G. B. Donnelly.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.—

The Following Standing Committees submitted their respective reports which were adopted—Committee on Temperance, State of the Church, Foreign Missions, Home Missions, and Church Extension. G. N. Johnson made his report.

Wallace, their names were called their characters passed and they were continued in the same relation. and, On motion of D. B. Harston, C. C. Wallace was requested to locate

W. E. Pruitt was reported as desiring to withdraw, and, on motion of D. B. Harston, he be allowed to withdraw.

The 23rd Question—The Twenty Third Question was called by the Bishop. Who are the Superannuated Preachers?

Samuel J. Johnson, M. H. Foster, Washington Brooks, Elza Roberts, D. V. Johnson and William Fuller were called, their characters passed and they continued in the same relation.

10th Question—The Tenth Question was called by the Bishop. What members have completed the Conference course of study? William Green was called his character passed and he reported his work. The Registrar reported and on motion of L. G. Hodges he was discharged from the course of study and elected to Elder's orders.

5th Question—The Fifth Question was called by the Bishop. Who have been continued on trial? Charles L. Kyles was called, his character passed and he was continued in the First Year. A. D. Jacques and Benjamin F. Young, their characters passed and they reported their work. The Registrar reported and they were advanced to the studies of the Second Year.

7th Question—The Seventh Question was called by the Bishop. Who have been admitted into full membership? James Stokes was called, his character passed and he reported his work. The Registrar reported and he was advanced to the studies of the Third Year and, elected to Deacon orders; William B. Smith and G. W. Jackson, their characters were passed and they reported their work. The Registrar reported and they were advanced to the studies of the Third Year they having been elected and ordained Deacons previously and on motion of M. N. Langston, G. W. Jackson be elected to Elders orders under the Seminary rules.

The class was called forward. The Conference joined in singing "A Charge to keep I have." The Bishop led in a most fervent prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Bishop Warren read as a scripture lesson Jonah Third. He addressed the class in accordance to the discipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and the class was admitted.

Introduction—The Bishop introduced to the Conference Dr. Edwin M. Randall, of Chicago, Illinois, Secretary of the Epworth League, Methodist Episcopal Church, who addressed the Conference concerning the Epworth League.

Aggressive Evangelism—The Committee on Aggressive Evangelism submitted their reports. Dr. Gillam spoke

to the report and it was adopted. Dr. E. M. Jones of the Sunday School Union was introduced to the Conference. Prof. R. C. Childress, Secretary of the International Sunday School Commission. Dr. I. L. Thomas, Secretary of the Home Mission and Church Extension Society of the Colored Conferences of the Methodist Episcopal Church and I. G. Penn, Assistant Secretary of the Epworth League of the Colored Conferences of the Methodist Episcopal Church, were introduced to the Conference.

Board of Stewards.—The Chairman of the Board of Stewards made their report and the consideration was postponed until Monday morning.

Eleventh Question.—The Eleventh Question was called by the Bishop. What others have been elected and Ordained Deacons? Alfred Z. Mitchell, Charles W. Sampson, Lucious C. Dawkins, Archie Harris, Frank Jones, Fletcher Smith, Jackson Hatchett, Robert M. Pegues were called and introduced to the Conference. The Registrar reported and they were elected to Deacon Orders.

Sunday Service.—Notices for the Sunday Service were announced as follows, viz: Love Feast at 9:30. At the conclusion of the Love Feast the Ordination of Deacons followed by preaching by Bishop Henry W. Warren D. D. L. L. D. of University Park Colorado. At 2:30 P. M. Ordination of the Elders by the Bishop assisted by the Presiding Elders, followed with the memorial Services. At 7:30 P. M. preaching by Rev. Dr. I. G. Penn of South Atlanta Ga. The Doxology was sung and the Benediction pronounced by the Bishop.

FIFTH DAY--Morning Session

The conference met at 8:30 Monday, Jan. 21st 1907. Bishop Henry Warren in the chair.

Devotional exercises were conducted by the Bishop. The minutes of the Third day Session were read and approved.

Twenty Fourth Question.—The Twenty Fourth Question was called by the Bishop. Who are the triers of Appeals? B. J. Griffin, David Hall, W. R. R. Lilean, W. A. Smith C. A. Taylor.

The Board of Church extension.—The Bishop appointed the following as the Board of Church Extension:

J. M. Cox, pres. J. L. Wilson Sec R. C. Childress, vice-pres. G. W. Ingram, treas. W. C. Rivers, D. W. Nelson and the presiding Elders Ex Officio.

Preach Missionary Sermon.—The Bishop appointed A. T. Stephens to preach the missionary sermon and Z. R. Fields as alternate.

Board of Examiners.—The old Board was reappointed with M. B. A. Cain in place of B. J. Lewis.

Fourth Question.—The Fourth Question was called by the Bishop. Who have been received on trial? Jackson Hatchett, Charles W. Sampson, George W. Weir, Archie H. Harris, Lucious C. Dawkins, Charles H. Royston, William J. S. Donaldson, John W. Williamson, Samuel J. Saxton.

21st Question.—The Twenty First Question was called by the Bishop. What other personal notation should be made? William J. S. Donaldson, John Williamson Deacons of the African Methodist Episcopal Church and J. R. Wilson, Wesley Lewis, Deacons of the African Methodist Episcopal Church were recognized.

Reports of Committees.—Bible Cause, Epworth League committees made their reports. I. G. Penn spoke to the report of the Epworth League.

Introduction.—Dr. I. L. Thomas D. D. of the Board of Home Mission and Church Extension was introduced to the Conference and spoke to the delight of all present. M. N. Langston moved that the presiding Elder of the Fort Smith District be authorized to sell the lot belonging to us in Alma Ark. and the President and Secretary of the Con. sign the declaration of authority to sell, agreed. M. N. Langston moved that the proceeds of the sale be turned over to the presiding Elder of the Forrest City District for the benefit of the Church in Marianna, agreed to.

W. S. Sherrill moved that the acre of land 5 miles northwest of Batesville be sold by the presiding Elder of the Little Rock District and the proceeds of the sale be donated to the Church at Marianna.

Board of Stewards.—The chairman of the Board of Stewards made his reports which were adopted, and on motion of W. S. Sherrill that the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board of Stewards send the money to Conference Claimants not present.

The committee on Freedmans Aid and Southern Educa-

tion made their report which was adopted and the Bishop appointed the presiding Elders to carry into effect the recommendation. The committee on Missionary Cause reported and the presiding Elders were appointed.

14th Question.—The Fourteenth Question was called by the Bishop. Who have been transferred and to what Conference? A. M. Brooks to the Tennessee Conference.

First Question.—The First Question was called by the Bishop. Who have been received by transfer and from what Conference? H. F. Thomas from the Atlanta Conference.

The Statistical Secretary submitted his report which was adopted.

The Treasurer submitted his report which was adopted. J. L. Wilson introduced a resolution of thanks to the General Officers which was adopted.

M. N. Langston moved that the case of E. M. Alexander be referred to the presiding Elder of the Clow district for investigation.
