Harris, and others, have filed in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Pulaski County their constitution or articles of association in compliance with the provisions of the law, with their petition for incorporation, under the name or style of "LITTLE ROCK ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA," they are, therefore, hereby declared a body politic and corporate, by the name and style aforesaid, with all the powers, privileges and immunities granted in the law thereunto appertaining.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

Little Rock Annual Conference, Charter and Articles of Association of the Methodist Episcopal Church of the United States of America.

ARTICLE

That J. W. Jackson, L. G. Hodges, W. McIntosh, W. B. Harris, A. Gray, J S Nelson, D H E Harris, N Darby, J. G. Webb, Charley Charles, Mrs. H. M. Nesymth, Mrs. A. C Freeman and others, with such other persons as may be from time to time appointed to succeed them, are hereby created and constituted a body politic and corporate under the name and title of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church of the United States of America, within and of the State of Arkansas, and they and their successors such as shall be duly elected members of said corporation, shall remain and be a body corporate, with power to sue and be sued, to plead and be impleaded, to hold purchase and convey, as well as mortgage or hypothecate property, real, personal and mixed in any sum. To receive grants, bequests, devises, and annuities, to be held in trust for said Association. To have and use a common Seal and to alter the same at pleasure. To make and alter from time to time such laws and by-laws as they may deem necessary for the government of said Association and its officers, not in conflict with the Constitution and Laws of the United States for religious and educational purposes. Diffusing the blessings of Christianity, Benevolence, Fraternalism, to all men.

ARTICLE II

There shall be a Board of Trustees, not less than three nor more than eighteen, to be elected by ballot, at the First Session of the Conference after the granting of this Charter. One-third to be elected for one year, one-third for two years, and one-third for three years, and thereafter one-third each year for a term of three years. Trustees shall consist of both ministers and laymen. In all cases of dissatisfaction among the Trustees, the matter may be taken to the Annual Conference for final decision. The Secretary of the Board shall report all business transacted by the Board to the Annual Conference at each session of the Annual Conference. In all special meetings a majority shall be a quorum to do business and a majority shall control.

ARTICLE III

The officers shall be a President, Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary. These shall be chosen from the whole number of Trustees by the Board. They shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified. A member will be disqualified for neglect or refusal to perform the duty of his office, and for malfeasance in office.

ARTICLE IV

This Society shall be subject to the provisions of the Discipline, laws, usages and ministerial appointments of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America, as from time to time may be

authorized and declared by the General Conference of said church and the Little Rock Conference. That the secular affairs of said corporation shall be managed and controlled according to the provisions of the Discipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church. All property shall be deeded to the Society in its corporate name.

ARTICLE V

Let all deeds under which the church acquires property, whether designated for church or parsonage purposes or other uses be made to the Trustees, naming them and their successors in office, in trust for the use and benefit of the ministry and membership of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America subject to the Discipline, laws, usages and ministerial appointments of said church, a from time to time, authorized and declared, and if sold the proceeds shall be disposed of and used in accordance with the provisions of said Discipline.

ARTICLE VI

In all conveyances let the forms required by law be strictly observed, and that the Trustee to said premises and houses shall at all times permit such ministers belonging to the Methodist Episcopal Church as shall from time to time be duly authorized by the General Conference of our Church or by said Annual Conference to preach and expound the word of God, to execute the Discipline and administer Sacraments therein according to the true meaning and purpose of our deed of settlement.

ARTICLE VII

Whenever for any cause local church property is not used or is vacated for the time being, said property shall be deeded to the Annual Conference Board of Trustees to be held in trust for the said congregation or it may be disposed of as the Conference Board may direct with the approval of the Annual Conference.

ARTICLE VIII

The members of the Annual Conference or any number of them may unite themselves into a preachers' benevolent aid society for the purpose of defraying the expenses of members in their funerals and sickness. Any Christian minister and the wife of any minister may become members, but to maintain his membership he must retain his license to preach.

ARTICLE IX

The Secretary of the Annual Conference Board of Trustees shall keep his office in Little Rock, Ark., as directed by the Board of Trustees, and there transact the business of the society during the interval of the Annual Conference, the Conference Board shall control property that has been abandoned and all property of every kind that shall or may be held for the Little Rock Annual Conference in trust by said Board of Trustees. But in all causes of dispute, the matter may be taken to the Annual Conference for final settlement, except the Conference Aid Society shall be governed by such members as shall, from time to time, pay their membership dues.

The Bishop shall be ex-officio member of the Annual Conference Board of Trustees, each local society shall have a board of trustees as now provided by the Discipline of the Methodist Church by act of

the General Conference of 1912, who shall control their property in the name of said local society as may be, from time to time, declared by said Discipline.

The Annual Conference reserves the right to alter, change or amend these articles of association at any regular session of said Annual Conference by a two-third vote one years' notice having been previously given by resolution passed by a majority of its members published in its minutes.

To the Honorable Circuit Court of Pulaski County, Arkansas:

We, the undersigned Trustees of the Little Rock Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the United States of America, herewith request the granting of the above Charter and ask for a certificate as by law required.

DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Daily proceedings of the 48th Annual Session of the Little Rock Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, convened at Texarkana, Arkansas, December 17th-20th, 1925, at 9:00 a. m. with Bishop R. E. Jones, D. D., L. L. D., presiding. The devotion was conducted by the Bishop after which he proceeded to administer the Lord's Supper calling to his assistance the District Superintendents. The secretary called the roll with 62 presents and 14 absent. The secretary called the names of the ministers who had died this session. The name of J. A. Swift was called. W. S. Sherrill led in prayer. The bishop then asked who will you have as secretary nominated as his assistants B. F. Neal and B. F. Young nominated W. C. Rivers, who were elected. Dr. J W E Bowen nominated M. F. Strong, and W. C. Rivers, who were elected. Dr. J W E Bowen nominated S. McDonald as secretary of the Seminary was introduced and spoke on the subject "The Trained Ministry". The bishop asked who will you have as statistician? J. S. Stokes and S. McDonald were nominated, on the third ballot W. C. Rivers, who were elected. S. McDonald was elected and nominated as his assistants, M. McCroskey, W. A. Swift, M. H. Thompson and B. F. RESOLUTIONS BY THE LITTLE ROCK CONFERENCE ON THE ENDOWMENT AND EXPANSION CAMPAIGN FOR PHILANDER SMITH COLLEGE

At no time in the history of Philander Smith College has the institution had greater success than at this time.

The student body numbers 343 and of this number 73 are in the college department.

The institution is recognized by the State Board of Education of Arkansas. In every respect it is in the public favor as never before.

This makes for the college its greatest opportunity for enlarged service.

Whether it shall be able to take advantage of the opportunity now open to it, depends upon funds available for expansion in buildings, equipment, faculty and endowment.

THEREFORE RESOLVED:

FIRST—That the Little Rock Conference hereby re-affirm its action of a year ago authorizing an endowment and expansion campaign for the institution covering a period of five years, amounting to \$150,000.

SECOND—That in this campaign each pastor of the Conference agrees to try and secure from his charge a minimum of one dollar per member, per year, for the endowment and expansion of the institution and also that in conjunction with the Board of Education and the college, as large subscriptions as possible be secured, payable in quarterly payments, covering a period of two years and a half, also the collection of subscriptions already made.

THIRD—That the campaign be committed with power to the Trustees of the College and District Superintendents to prosecute plan and arrangements already in operation or any new plans that may be necessary in the future.

FOURTH—That the pastor appoint a committee in each Church of sufficient size deemed necessary by him to help him in the collection of the minimum of one dollar per member and subscriptions of larger amounts. That the delegates from the charge present or elected to the Lay Electoral College be a member of the committee, since the Lay Electoral College is asked to approve these resolutions.

FIFTH—That all cash collected by forwarded to the President of the College, as Treasurer of the Fund, who in turn will forward same to the Treasurer of the Board of Education and by him invested for the institution, if the amount is to be credited to endowment.

Sister Laura Henry aged 24, daughter of Rev. J. H. Henry, lived a beautiful life and called on in the bloom of her life honored the sermon without fear not thinking of the life here, but that she had prepared here to live with God in a more beautiful world of eternity.

Mrs. Clair the wife of our beloved Bishop Clair was called to her heavenly home in the year 1925. She was a bright star in the moral and spiritual realm of life. She shone at home while her husband shone abroad, and is now in the gloryland.

The Methodist minister has no home except the Conference, all his labors of love and sacrifices must be done through his Conference. It is to be regretted that more space cannot be given to the dead heroes, but it seems a matter of impossibility on the account of the limited amount of funds. Among the faithful members of our conference who have gone to their reward none were more faithful than Brother J. A. Swift, who has self sacrificing and helpful than Brother J. A. Swift, who has crossed the stream of death during the year 1925. May we say with bowed heads, peace be to his ashes, he has gone to his reward, he has heard the loving voice of our heavenly father "Well done thou faithful servant, enter into the joys of thy Lord."

Sister Eliza Bryant, the beloved wife of Brother Bryant, crossed the dark stream of death, April 2nd, 1925.
