It is especially crucial in this moment of your life when you need Jesus' turning everything upside down resurrection reality to enter right smack dab in the middle of your life that has been turned upside down by the COVID-19 pandemic. Now more than ever, you need to experience how Jesus' resurrection victory, resurrection hope and resurrection living are not confined to those times when everything is good, but are at their most powerful when everything is falling apart.

I know this may be a difficult Easter because you will not be able to worship in the sanctuary that means so much to you with the people who mean so much to you. But this difficulty also provides you with the wonderful opportunity to experience how the reality of Jesus' resurrection transcends time and space so powerfully that you will be able to celebrate as you've never celebrated before even as everything in your life has been turned upside down.

In other words, the greater the struggle, the deeper the tragedy, the more disrupted your life is – the more you can experience how Jesus' resurrection brings you right into the middle of what God is doing up close and personal. I believe this so strongly that I will be praying every day during Holy Week that your COVID-19 Easter will be the most transformative Easter you have ever celebrated in your life.
