The second main purpose of the AR-CCCM is to **EQUIP** people in local congregations who have been called to ministry with children.

"They needed somebody and I used to be a kid once so—here I am, Lord. Of course, I have no idea what I'm doing..."

Sound familiar? Many times, especially in smaller congregations, church volunteers serve out of default (there's no one else to do the job) but have no particular specialized training in how to work with children. AR-CCCM is here to help! Each year, we sponsor a children's ministry leadership conference at the end of January. This is an affordable, hands-on opportunity close to home to show leaders how to guide children and families in their faith formation. Additionally, we help children's leaders connect with free national online training events which deal with topics pertinent to ministry with children. AR-CCCM also is involved in working with our children to become leaders in their churches and communities. We award VBS mini-grants to churches and camping scholarships to individuals so they may experience God's amazing grace in a variety of settings. We conduct hands-on Destination: Mission trips each year for 3rd-6th graders helping children live out their faith through service. We are currently involved with transitioning children to youth ministry with an annual day with the Bishop event for older elementary aged students.

Children's ministry leaders are busy. It's hard to keep abreast of all the latest family faith formation discussions, curriculum ideas, continuing education opportunities and Arkansas Conference programs for children.
