and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.





Bullying Defined

- Intentionally aggressive
- Usually repeated
- •Power difference between the young people involved
- •A problem among youth 18 and under




About Bullying





Bullying Statistics in US Schools



Statistics and Reality

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According to the American Academy of Child and Adolescent *Psychiatry*:


• Close to half of all children are bullied at some point while they are at primary or secondary school

• At least **10 percent** of children are bullied *regularly*



How Many Young People Have Been BULLIED?

28% of U.S. students in grades 6–12 experienced bullying 20% of U.S. students in grades 9–12 experienced bullying





How Many Young People Have BULLIED Others?


Approximately **30%** of young people admit to bullying others in surveys





How Many Young People Have Witnessed BULLYING?

70.6% of young people say they have seen bullying in their schools **41%** witness bullying once a week or more When bystanders intervene, bullying stops within 10 seconds **57%** of the time



Online Statistics and Reality




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- •Girls are somewhat more likely than boys to be involved in cyber bullying Why?
- •More than 1 in 3 young people have been threatened online
- •The average 8-year-old is exposed to some form of media 56 hours a week

What happened to Shelby?



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6% of students in grades 6– 12 experienced cyberbullying 16% of high school students (grades 9– 12) were electronically bullied in the past year 55.2% of LGBT students experienced cyberbullying



What Middle School Students Experience

- name calling (44.2 %)
- teasing (43.3 %)
- spreading rumors or lies (36.3%)
- pushing or shoving (32.4%)
- hitting, slapping, or kicking (29.2%)
- leaving out (28.5%)
- •threatening (27.4%)
- stealing belongings (27.3%)
- sexual comments or gestures (23.7%)
- e-mail or blogging (9.9%)

State of Children – Poverty



Despite great wealth, the U.S. has one of the highest rates of child poverty among industrialized countries.

*Annual income below \$23,492 for a family of 4



State of Children – Gun Violence

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U.S. children and teens were 17 times more likely to be killed by a gun than children in 25 other high-income countries combined



State of Children – Education



66% of all public school eighth graders are unable to read or compute at grade level



How are relationships developing?

- Children learn to treat themselves and others as objects, leading to more **bullying** and acting out.
- They seem fine when they are side-by-side with remote controls, but when they have to interact they lack skills to interact and self-regulate.
- They lack compassion, and it is not their fault.
- They learn meanness early because they have not learned to connect to another child's feelings.

For CHILDREN, what are the stressors of today?

- Information overload from diverse media sources
- Lack of quality time with family
- Over Scheduling
- Lack of skills that help them "live in the tension"



Faithful Response to Bullying

Loving God and Neighbor is not just a slogan...



and loving yourself is key!



Do bullies love themselves?

- View violence positively as the solution to most problems
- Show aggression toward adults as well as other children
- Need to **dominate** others and **control** situations
- Show little sympathy to others who are being bullied, or who are having problems



Some Risk Factors for Aggressive Behavior

- Previous aggressive or violent behavior
- Being the victim of physical abuse and/or sexual abuse
- Exposure to violence in the home and/or community
- Exposure to violence in media (TV, movies, etc.)
- Use of drugs and/or alcohol
- Presence of firearms in home
- Combination of stressful family socioeconomic factors poverty, severe deprivation, marital breakup, etc.



How do we identify child who has been targeted?

- Becoming withdrawn from activities
- Showing fear in specific situations
- Avoiding certain individuals
- Decline in participation
- Speaking of another child with fear
- Noticeable decline in how the child sees him or her self
- Signs of physical altercations, such as bruises, scrapes and other marks
